





MEMORANDUM FOR THE ATTOMNEY GENERAL

RE- PRACTIVATION OF THE CAPONY ONG

In the course of the above investigation, we have ascertained that Benjamin "Bugsy" Siegel, notorious racketeer with underworld connections on the west and east coasts and Las Vegas, Nevada, will again visit the latter city within the next few days and reside at the Last Frontier Hotel there in Suite 401. As previously pointed out, we are desirous of following Siegel's widespread activities and, therefore, are requesting authority to place a technical surveillance on his telephone at the Last Frontier Hotel which will be Las Vegas 1800.

At this time, I also with to point out that Siegel, because of his far-flung interests, is almost in constant travel status, thereby making it extremely difficult at times to follow his activities and anticipate his movements. It is recommended, therefore, that authority be granted to cover any hotels, residences, or places of business which might be used by Siegel in his journeys throughout the country. I strongly feel that this type of coverage is necessary if we are to establish his racketeering connections.

The Salt Lake City and Los Angeles Offices, in addition to obtaining Bureau authority for any further technical surveillances which may be desired to Siegel, should keep the Chicago Office as the office of origin currently advised with regard to installations both contemplated and put into operation.





MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION - CRIME SURVEY

Bureau File No. 62-81903

Reference is made to a teletype from the Bureau, dated July 3, 1916, addressed to the Los Angeles, Chicago and Salt Lake City offices, wherein a request was made that the Los Angeles office make certain that the Bureau and Chicago are in possession of all pertinent data not previously forwarded concerning BENIAMIN Rugsy V SIRGET. This resume is taken from the Crime Survey Memorandums and other files in the Los Angeles office.

BENNY SIEGEL, his wife and family have resided in the Los Angeles area at different times since 1937 when he moved here from New York City. Shortly after his arrival in Los Angeles, he was arrested and charged with the murder of AL GREENBERG, a local charagter, who was prominent in the motion picture labor rackets. SIEGEL,

were ultimately dismissed on these charges. The allegation has been made that SIEGEL was a direct associate of LOUIS LEFKE, New York mobster, who was recently electrocuted in New York State. Through his association with LEFKE, SIEGEL was identified with the notorious Murder, Incorporated which had received considerable publicity in the press.

SIEGEL has been having marital difficulties for some time and the thought of divorce was always distasteful to him because he did not want to injure the reputation of his two children. He has received considerable publicity in the Los Angeles press, particularly in connection with his arrest for bookmaking which is a felony in the State of California when he was picked up in company with GEORGEYRAFT

SINGEL each pled guilty and were fined \$250.00 each.

While he lived in Los Angeles he maintained a palatial residence at 250 North Delfern Drive in Holmby Hills.

SIESEL is supposedly operating as a front for this group which is sighening funis into the hotel business through Kirkeby Hotels which is the subject of an investigation in the Los Angeles Office, entitled "Reported Interest of Racketeers in the Purchase of Hotels." Alletations have come from several sources to the effect that SIRRET had acquired the Beverly-Wilshire Motel in Severly Mills which is affiliated with the Kirkeby chain. SIBNEL is supposed to be very friendly with FRANK COSTELLO and JONADON'S, prominent mobsters in New York Tity, and the allegation had been made that SIE EL recently negotiated for the jurchase of a large ranch in Mexico, acting in behalf of CHARIES "Lucky LUCIANO. The exact location of this ranch is not known although informants state that it is near the California border, but not located in Tijuana. SIETEL is supposed to have purchased this residence in January or February of this year while LUCIAN was still in Italy. It will be recalled that LUCKY had been dejorted; allegedly, LUCIAN has been seen in Los Angeles within the past ninety days, and the opinion has been expressed that MCIANO would have little difficulty in running his former synthesis from Mexico using SIENEL as his main connection. SIR EL currently spends a considerable portion of his time in Lac Vegas where he has gambling interests and where he is correctly building a large hotel in partnership with Indications exist at present which point to the fact that some difficulty may come up and SIBSEL

SIEGEL is referred to by underworld informants of this office as the man in control of the Western States and he is referred to as a person who can put his friends in touch with the underworld boss of any city in the United States. He acquired his title of BUGSY because many of the associates in the old days considered him as "going bugs" when he got excited in that he acted in an irrational manner. There seems to be no doubt in the fact that he seems to be generally respected and feared by underworld characters because he is supposed to personally have killed at least thirty different individuals. Allegedly, SIEGEL is a pleasure smoker of opium, but he does not have the habit.

In connection with the case entitled "Reactivation of the Capone Gang" the reference has been made by informant that SIEGEL is instrumental in the attempt of the Chicago mob to take over the wire service currently operated by JAMES RAGEN. Approximately one and one-half years ago SIEGEL attempted to move in on the wire service in Los Angeles and at that time SIEGEL made the statement to several people that he would soon be operating the service.

Along these lines it follows that the MAFFIA, operating through its New York headquarters, where FRANK COSTELLO and JOE ADONIS, using SIEGEL as a front, have put themselves into the hotel business through SIEGEL and which the trade name of the Kirkeby Hotels. Also, this same mob is attempting to take over the wire service and if they are successful in so doing will extort tribute from every bookmaker in the United States. It has been pointed out that the MAPFIA operates through "fronts" who are usually of Jewish or Irish extraction.

SIEGHL according to local informants was a power in New York gangland and considerable information concerning SIEGEL's past activities can undoubtedly be obtained by the New York office. He allegedly likes California and considers it his home and for that reason confines his activities to other parts of the country simply coming here to visit.

SIEGH. is registered at Local Draft Board #245 in Westwood Village, California. He originally registered for Selective Service while in the custody of law enforcement officers at the Los Angeles County Jail on a murder charge. His Order Number is 2127-A and at that time he resided at 250 North Delfern Drive, West Los Angeles. He was born February 28, 1906 at New York and married his wife, ESTIEM, at 332 Rogers Avenue, Erocklyn, New York, on January 28, 1929.

Brooklyn, New York: The Local Draft Board by letter, dated March 10, 1944, asked the State Director of Selective Service for the waiver of an age limit in order to request SIEGEL to report for induction, but by letter, dated March 15, 1944, State Director refused the waiver. There was a communication in the file from the legal firm of Pacht-Pelton-Warne & Black, signed by N. JOSEPH ROSS, dated September 8, 1941. Judge ISAAC PACHT has been SIEGHL's attorney for some time and it is known that this firm has represented him as early as 1941. The Del Mar Race Track near San Diego, California, has recently been acquired by interests allegedly representing SIEGEL. has been in company with various hoodlums and gamblers in Los Angeles and does not bear a good reputation because of his association with certain underworld characters. If as has been pointed out SIEGEL actually represents the mob attempting to take over the wire service, conclusion follows that the RAGEN interests will not be successful in obtaining racing information from the Del Mar track because SIECEL will control this information for the benefit of the new service which has already rented its quarters in the Ferguson Building in Los Angeles. Following are additional excerpts from subject's record which are being set forth as being of possible interest in connection with any current investigation of him.

"On November 9, 1932, SIEGET, while attending a meeting of the organization in the Hard Tack Social Club at 547 Grand Avenue, New York City, suffered rather severe head injuries as the result of a bomb explosion. He and some other members of the mob were taken to a hospital for treatment. An Italian named FABRIZZO had lowered a bomb down the chimney, but failed to take into consideration that the chimney had a right-angle offset which caused the bomb to become stuck before reaching the proper elvation. FAPRIZZO was shot and killed on 11/20/32 for this attempt on the lives of the mob. SIEGEL still has the scars on his head caused by the flying bricks. One of these scars, about 12 inches long on the upper side (left) of his head, is visible through his thinning hair.

"In 1933, SIEGEL was arrested when the New York Police conducted a raid on a suite of rooms in the Hotel Franconia. In this raid, he and eight other men were surprised during a 'conference' of the mol attended by 'LEPKA' BUCHALTER and his partner 'GARRAH' JAYL CHALIRO. This raid occurred two months before 'LEPKE' and 'GARRAH' formed their syndicate known as MURDER, INC.

"In 1939, while LEPKE SUCKALIER, was hiding to avoid arrest on a Federal indictment, SIECHL net him and was informed by LEPKE that he, LEPKE, was being subjected to blackmail by 'FIG GREENE'/FIGHERERS,

a former henchman. GRINLEDING was threatening to go to District Attorney Dewey's office. SIRBL agreed that GRIEDING must be killed. SIRBL then returned to Los Angeles and make plans for the killing of GRIEDING. Thereafter two guns were flown to Los Angeles by

Informants stated that the gambling houses had direct lines to these tracks and a running description of the races was given, together with results and prices. On August 8, 1946, Supervisor A. E. Ostholthoff of the Los Angeles Division advised that the Los Angeles Office has just received) information to the effect that a "stop order" has been issued against Siegel and his associates in connection with the construction of the Flamingo Hotel at Las Vegas, Nevada by the Civilian Production Administration, dated August 7, 1946.

Mr. Ostholthoff stated that he wished to advise the Bureau of the issuance of this order if it were not already known and also wished to be informed by whether it would have any effect upon the instructions which he received from the Bureau yesterday, August 7, 1946, which authorized the initiation of immediate and appropriate investigation into all aspects of reported irregularities dealing with the construction of the Flamingo Hotel at Las Vegas, Nevada.

Mr. Ostholthoff further advised that the original information received by the Los Angeles Division concerning bribery allegations involving and Senator McCarran were furnished by

of Los Angeles, California. He said apparently received his information from an individual by the name who was described as the head of the Investigative Division of the Civilian Production Administration in Los Angeles.

It is also of interest to note that on August 5, 1946, the Clark County Commissioners at Las Vegas, Nevada temporarily denied the application of Siegel and his associates for a gambling and liquor license at the Flamingo Hotel. As result of this denial, it was determined that Siegel, accompanied by one of the principal investors in the Flamingo Hotel, had decided to appear personally before the County Commissioners at Las Vegas with regard to the denial of bzthe same. Informants in Los Angeles and Las Vegas have advised, however, that this is only a temporary denial and that these licenses will be granted to Siegel and his associates at a later date.

ACTION TAKEN

Mr. Ostholthoff was requested to proceed with the investigation authorised by the Bureau on August 7, 1946, and in full compliance with existing instructions and was also informed that in the event any pertinent information concerning the issuance of the "stop order" by the Civilian Production Administration in Washington was developed that the same would be furnished to him. It was again suggested that the inquiry concerning Senator McCarran be handled in a most discreet manner.







Reference is made to my letter of July 30, 1916 which sets out sertain confidential information received from Los Angeles concerning rumors to the effect that "BUGS" SIECOL and his asseciates in the construction of the Flaminge Hotel paid a bribe in order to secure Civilian Production Administration authority to proceed with the construction of the Flamingo Hotel in Las Vegas.

For the LAS VEGAS TRIBUNE, dated August 1, 1946, which contains a front-page deditorial criticizing the construction of this second and the contains a front-page when materials are badly needed by veterans for the construction of homes. It would appear that at this point we have jurisdiction to investigate the construction of the Flamingo Hotel in connection with the bribery investigation concerning the C.P.A. Official at Reno, Nevada. It would also appear that we would have jurisdiction on the theory of Fraud Against the Government since it was probably necessary to furnish false information to the Civilian Production Administration in order to obtain the permit to proceed with construction of the Flamingo Hotel. While I do not have available here the legislation ereating the Civilian Production Administration and the rules and regulations promulgated by that organization, generally, from information carried in the press the C.P.A. was organized in order to channel building construction into homes rather than commercial enterprises. Also, I am not aware whether the C.P.A. has an investigative staff or whether violations of the rules are within the Bureau's jurisdiction. Certainly, it would appear that furnishing false information to this agency would be our jurisdiction under the Fraud Against the Government Statutes. t is requested that the Bureau operais through the Department what jurisdiction we might have in compatition with a violation of the C.P.A. regulations.

SIEGEL is making arrangements through GUNAGREENBAIM to obtain a \$500,000 loan

SIEGEL also stated that the Utah Corporation had made him a \$350,000 loan and the Cortez Hotel is also going to make them a \$600,000 loan on the Flamingo Hotel. This would indicate that SIEGEL and his associates have already put up all of their available cash. An investigation of this matter under the Fraud Against the Government Statute would permit us to examine witnesses under oath. It would also give us an opportunity, through detailed examination of books and records, to trace back all of the money invested in the Flamingo Hetel, which should, in turn, show exactly how much SIEGEL has invested in this and it could possibly reveal a violation of the Income Tax Laws. Independently of our special investigation of SIEGEL's activities in general, it would appear that the article in the LAS VEGAS TRIBUNE is of such a nature that it might bring about a public demand for an investigation either by the F.B.I. or some other Government agency. No open investigation will be undertaken concerning the Flamingo Hotel until advice is received from the Bureau, We will make a preliminary check into public records at las Vegas to ascertain the date that construction was started on the Planingo Motel and such other information as can be discreatly ascertained in an effort to substantiate the information that the construction of the Flamingo Hotel had gotten no further than "a few stakes being driven in the ground" when the freeze order regulating all commercial building under Civilian Production Administration came into effect, ------

Mr. Ostholthoff. Los Angeles Division, advised that at Los Angeles is very friendly towards the Bureau and on occasion furnishes confidential information. On July 30, 1946, advised the Agents that he had obtained information from a highly confidential source, whose identity he did not reveal, that the construction of the Flamingo Hotel had not progressed much further than having the stakes driven in when the Civilian Production Administration issued the "freeze order" on the construction of buildings of this type.

stated that construction on the Flamingo Hotel was temporarily stopped on the basis of this "freeze order" but that arranged to have funds made available to Senator Pat McCarran the construction of the Flamingo Hotel was permitted to continue. Mr. Ustholthoff stated that indicated funds made available to Senator McCarran were in the nature of a bribe probably originating from Siegel. The indicated that the official in charge of the construction division of the Civilian Production administration at Reno, Nevada, was involved in the deal and that the construction records of the Flamingo Hotel were falsified to show that the construction was farther along than it actually was. Thus enabling the CPA to authorise the completion of the construction.

NEWSPAPER PUBLICITY: An editorial in the Las Vegas Tribune, a weekly newspaper, prominently placed on the first page of the issue dated August 1, 1946, complains of the fact that the Federal authorities are permitting the construction of the Flamingo Hotel while the veterans are homeless due to a shortage of building materials. The editorial comments on the fact that it is difficult to prevent men of great financial means, such as Benjamin Siegel and Harry Mothburg, from engaging in such building activity.

FINANCIAL DIFFICULTIES OF SIEGEL AND ASSOCIATES: Information obtained from the technical surveillances was to the effect that Benjamin Siegel claims he and his associates have spent \$1,162,500.00 to date on the Flamingo Hotel and that Siegel is at the present time in rather strategic financial circumstances. Siegel at the present time is endeavoring to make arrangements through the freenbaum to obtain a \$500,000 loan from a Utan corporation, the identity of which is being determined as it is known that Siegel previously borrowed \$350,000 from the same corporation on a similar loan in connection with the construction of another hotel.

ACTION TO BE TAKEN: Mr. Ostholthoff points out that the Bureau now has allegations of both a Bribery and a Fraud Against the Government and if considered advisable would be in a position to make open inquiries in connection with the construction of the Flamingo Hotel. A discreet preliminary check is presently being made to determine the date the CPA "freeze order" was issued and the extent to which the construction of the Flamingo Hotel had progressed on that date.

OBSERVATION: The Fraud Against the Government violation could be investigated on the basis of the editorial in the las Vegas Tribune and statements under oath could be obtained from all persons interviewed. The initiation of the investigation might result in stoppage of construction on the Flamingo Hotel and the resultant financial embarrassment to Siegel and associates might bring their activities out into the open. The allegation of a bribe payment to Senator Pat McCarran is rather nebulous. Information concerning same could be developed incidental to the Fraud Against the Government investigation. In connection with this investigation many of the individuals who would be interviewed under cath unquestionably are not involved with the racketeers and there is a possibility some information of value concerning the operations of Siegel and his associates might be obtained. If such investigation is authorized the desirability of suggesting to the Department the assignment of a Special Assistant should be given consideration it being anticipated that it will be necessary to issue subpoenaes for the examination of books and records in some instances and the potential witnesses may have local political connections and affiliations.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the initiation of Fraud Against the Government investigation in connection with the construction of the Flamingo Hotel be given favorable consideration.
