The following is a brief summary of pertinent developments which occurred in the New York Field Division in the above entitled matter since the submission of the last weekly letter on October 4, 1946:

BENJAMIN "HUGS" SINGEL

SIECEL arrived in New York City on October 5, 1946 and registered in the early morning of October 6, 1946 at the Roosevelt Hotel.

During the period from October 5 to October 10, 1946 it was determined from confidential sources that he had been in telephonic communication with FFATE COSTELO and who is unknown to the New York office. He also communicated with numerous other individuals who used only their first names and whose identities have not been determined as yet.

morning of October 10, 1946 he received two calls from VIRGINIA HILL in Chicago. At the time these conversations took place VIRGINIA HILL advised that she was residing at the Edgewater Hotel under the name of VERA HARDING.

During the time that SIEGEL was under physical surveillance, he was observed meeting FRANK COSTELIO at the Copacabana Night Club where, he also talked to several unknown individuals who, from their appearance, were undoubtedly racketeers of some sort. He spent one entire morning at the Park Lane Hotel and it was subsequently determined that he had been in conversation with it is believed that is a resident of the Park Lane Hotel.

He was also observed entering the offices of the Mastan Company, Inc., 350 Fifth Avenue, New York City, at which time no was carrying what appeared to be a bundle of floor or building plans. He was

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observed to enter the office of this company and remained there for a considerable period of time.

That SICH was observed entering this establishment with what was probably the plans of the Flamingo fotel, it is makinged he approached this empany for the purpose of obtaining a local to carry on the completion of his Flamingo Hotel in Las Vegas, Nevada.

From information previously submitted from the Los Angeles office, the principal reason for SIEGEL's visit to New York was to obtain a loan of a million and a half dollars. It was also ascertained from a confidential source that SIEGEL anticipated leaving New York City on October 15, or 16, 1946, after which he would travel to Chicago and pick up VIRCINIA HILL and then proceed to the west coast. However, in view of the Bureau's telephonic instructions of October 10, 1946, the physical and technical coverage of SIEGEL was discontinued on the afternoon of this date.

WEYER LAMSKY 211 Central Park West, New York City

As previously set forth, close association was reported to exist between NEVER LANSKY and REMARKH "PMOS" STECH. It was believed that possibly some of STECHL's funds in the erection of the Flamingo Hotel at Las Vegas, Nevada might have had their source in LANSKY. In view of STECHL's arrival in New York City on October 5, 1946, spot surveillances were maintained at the residence of MEYER LANSKY, 211 Central Park West, and at his business enterprise, the Emby Distributing Company, 525 W. 13rd Street. However, LANSKY was not observed during the time of these surveillances nor was it ascertained that STEGEL contacted or attempted to contact LANSKY in New York.

Investigation has been continuing concerning the activities of the Emby Distributing Company and their activities in the distributions of juke boxes under a franchise from the Rudolph Wurlitzer Company, Tonawanda, New York. Full details concerning the corporate set-up of the Emby Distributing Company will be set forth in report form.





He stated that last Priday, counsel of the CPA, had called at his office with some representatives of the CPA and they were perturbed over Drew Pearson's broadcast concerning the Flamingo Hotel. Their representatives had furnished him with information concerning the hearings and furnished him with a transcript of the hearings and had given background information to him. The rumor was that the FBI was also investigating a certain phase of the case called merely to find out whether he could pick up some "loose straws" to find out what this thing was about. 





Mr. Ostholthoff also desired to be advised as to whether he should continue his investigation concorning this matter.

In the event that the Bureau deems it advisable for this investigation to be continued at this time, Mr. Ostholthoff suggested that instead of interviewing all of the principal witnesses and principal subjects simultaneously, es previously planned, that it might be more desirable to interview

simultaneously but in different cities. If nothing affirmative was developed as a result of these two interviews, Mr. Ostholthoff expressed the belief that nothing tangible would be developed as a result of simultaneous interviews with Dthe remaining principal witnesses and principal subjects. If possible, Mr. Ostholthoff requested to be informed of the Bureau's desires concerning the future handling of this case in the Field today.
