### VIRGINIA HILL TRIES SUICIDE, POLICE SAY

Friend of Slain Bugsie Siegel Reported to Be Hiding in France From Los Angeles Gunmen

NICE (France) July 15 (U.B. Virginia Hill, friend of the lately juidated Benjamin (Bugsie) Siegel, tried to kill herself at an sclusive Monte Carlo beach hotel where she was in hiding from a Angeles gunmen sent to shoot her also, police said tonight.

Miss Hill swallowed a full tube of sleeping tablets in the attempt, police said, but hotel employees found her in her room and she was sent to the Villa Albert I Clinic, where she recovered.

Discharged Later

She was discharged from the clinic, operated by the Monte Carlo Hospital, last Friday, two days after the attempt, it was said.

Miss Hill had come to France the week before Siegel was shot to death June 20 through a front window of her Beverly Hills home in which he was staying.

#### Second Bugsy box located

Another safety deposit box held by the late Bugsy Siegel has been succeeded. Atty. Gen. Fred N. Hewser disclosed today, in obtaining special letters of administration to the gangsters estate. Investigators for the State Debarrent of Justice departed im-

Investigators for the State Department of Justice departed immediately for Beverly Hills to open the box, located in the Security-First National Bank branch at 469 N. Canon Dr.

Investigators were not conerned primarily with the question. If whether the box held any assets of the perforated gangster, slain last June 20, but whether it might provide clues to his slayers.

Howser filed a petition in Superior Court late today asking the special letters be granted to Raymond F. McCarthy, a special agent.

He asked the court to appoint Ben Brown, public administrator, as special administrator of the estate.

Superior Court Judge Newcomb Condee immediately signed the necessary papers which gave Brown the additional power to open the box—necessary because it was held in joint tenancy with Bugsy's sister. Miss Beth Siegel, a resident of Beverly Hills but who now is in New York City.

The petition for letters of administration said Siegel left property in Los Angeles County which netted income of less than \$10,000 HEREIN annually, including a half interest in a hotel and other properties.

Another safety deposit box was inearthed early in July by statingents, but it failed to providing vital information as to who might have killed Siegel in the palatial home of Virginia Hill.

# SIEGEL CASE PROGRESS TOLD

Howser Says Racetrack Wire Service Possible Death Motive

Attiorney General Fred N. Howser said yesterday that his office had made "aignificant" progress into blame for the death of gangster Bugsy Siegel.

Without naming the killer, Howser said:

"We think we know who had the best motive."

The Attorney General said investigations by Walter H. Lentz, of his office, have indicated Bugsy most probably was slain because of his racetrack wire service.

Bugsy, Howser said, represented Trans-America wire service.

#### TOOK OVER'—

"He muscled his way into Las Vegas with the service," said Howser, "then took over all of Nevada.

"Later he tried the same strongarm methods in both Northern and Southern California."


Howser said that on June 13, seven days before Bugsy's death, Trans-America sent out the following wire to bookmakers it services:

"Due to circumstances beyond our control, we are compelled to discontinue our business after the last race of Saturday, June 14. We appreciate the cooperation you have given us."

Howser indicated this hasty decision may have been the result of a direct threat to Siegel. He said the circumstances were so peculiar as to demand a complete investigation of all racetrack wire services.

Only a small insurance policy for his mother, Mrs. Jennis Siegel, and a few pieces of jewelry were found in the gangster's Beverly Hills safety deposit box, Howser said. The box was opened yesterday after County Public Administrator Ben H. Brown was named special administrator of the gangster's estate.





# Police Skeptical on Siegel Tip

Telegraphic information from Chief Inspector Martin J. Brown of the New York Police Department that a man describ-ing himself as Prince Alexis Orlon surrendered to police with the story that he "knew all about" the Benjamin (Bugsie) Slegel slaying aroused little interest here among officers investigating the gambler's murder.





Describing the lead as "a good one," Anderson said the letters came from Illinois.

The one to his office was 10 pages in length and said that Siegel, who "muscled" the service into Nevada, owed the two

other gangsters \$25,000.

"According to the letter. Slegel was handed down a throat a week before his death. He was told to 'pay up or else,'" the chief of police stated.

Anderson declined to name the two ex-Capone men listed, but said that Ray McCarthy has been assigned by Walter H. Lentz, chief investigator for the Attorney General, to work with his office in checking out the lead.

Please be advised that while in Waurika. Oklahoma, recently an Agent of this office was informed by Assistant County Attorney, who recently surrendered to the Sheriff of Jefferson County at Waurika, had informed the Sheriff at that time that he possessed br information regarding the identity of SIEGEL'S murderer. This information regarding surrender and his reported information regarding instant murder was immediately brought to the attention of the proper authorities in Los Angeles, who subsequently disclaimed statement and were somewhat critical of the fact that they had been bothered with such information. expressed bitter criticism of the manner in which the Los Angeles Police Department publicized criticism toward the Sheriff's Office regarding statement to officials of Jefferson County.

further advised that immediately preceding the time was transferred from the County Jail at Waurika on August 12, 1947, to Bolivar, Missouri, to answer charges pending against him for car theft. a final oral statement, which stated he was not going to report to the Los Angeles police because of the objectionable attitude that was shown by the Los Angeles Police Department. 

# Hoover Hits Siegel Case Glamorizing

F.B.I. Director Says Lionizing of Bugsie Helps Spread Crime

By a Times Staff Correspondent WASHINGTON, Sept. 29. The danger of more widespread criminal violence is typified by the way in which Bugsie Siegel and "his criminal scum were lionized," F.B.I. Director J. Edgar Hoover today warned 500 graduates of the National Police Academy.

Unless the American public is aroused, the country is liable to experience a far more serious crime wave than that which has caused so much recent concern, he declared in deploring the "shortsighted, provincial viewpoint" of many citizens toward law enforcement agencies. However singled out Siegel as an example of the way in which riminals have been glamorized.

Grime Stage Set

"It is no surprise that the outbreak of crimes of violence that started before the cessation of hostilities has not abated. Actually, I am surprised that we have not had greater violence," Hoover said.

"The stage nevertheless is set for this to occur in the future unless the spirit of our citizens can be aroused to the impending menace."

"Blaring headlines announced the assassination recently of the infamous Bugsie Siegel. The circumstances surrounding his career in crime tell the story better than words.

Siegel Castigated

"Here was an individual whose life was a constant challenge to common decency. Yet he and his criminal scum were itenized and their favors sought after in so-called respectable social circles. The glamour that surrounded his life in all its wile implications was shockingly disgusting, but Siegel was a symbol. He 'fronted' for more sinister and despicable characters—the 'untouchables' who hire mercenaries to do their dirty work."

Crime could be greatly reduced, particularly sex offenses, if law enforcement agencies were given active public support, the F.B.I. chief maintained uvenile delinquency is due argely to "neglect of our youth,"

# Heiress' Broken Roma With Slain Siegel Disclosed

### Brother of Girl Tells of New Car and Sister's Plans

Virginia Hill, Alabama heiress, and Benjamin (Bugsie) Siegel were "romantically inclined," but the romance went awry before the gangster was slain last week in the helress' Beverly Hills mansion.

This was disclosed yesterday by Charles Hill, 21, brother of Miss Hill, when he was questioned in the District Attorney's office by Chief-Dep. S. Ernest Roll and Chief Investigator H. Leo Stanley.

The youth, with Miss Hill's secretary, Jerri Mason, and Al Smiley, Hollywood sports figure and friend of Siegel, was in the Moorish residence at 810 N. Linden Drive at the time of the slaying.

### Romance Disclosed

He said that his sister, now in Paris, and Siegel had been romantically inclined and that when Miss Hill lay unconscious in a Las Vegas hospital after taking sleeping tablets in Siegel's Flamingo Club, Siegel told him that he wanted to marry Virginia, according to Roll.

"And I am sure my sister was also in love with him," he was quoted by Roll as saying.

But the romance faded, Hill said his sister and Siegel had concluded that both were "too nervous" to get along and had agreed to split up. She had planned some time before to go to Paris. At first Siegel was against the trip but, after the agreement to part, advised her to go ahead. In their "split-up" there was no violence, the brother said.

Boofs Voisch, besutiful onetime sweetheart of Buggy Siegel, was hunted by police today for an answer to the Siegel murder mystery. She disappeared last Sunday

She disappeared last Sundays morning shortly after police learned she was ready to sing about Bugsy's assailants.

The statuesque redhead was last seen by a friend as she left a Vallejo restaurant. She was clad only, in thin pajamas and muletype slippers. She had a light, summer weight cost thrown over her shoulders.

Boots was said to have had a sandwich with a friend, described as a small, paunchy man with broken nose and cauliflower ear. She left him in the restaurant, but never returned to her nearby apartment, police were told.

She is known to have had what the Siegel mob would describe as "interests" in California, Nevada and Arizona and authorities in these three states are now attempting to find some frace of her.

The disappearance of the girl came a short time after she is said to have threatened to tell all she knew of the Siegel murder unless, said an acquaintance, the remnants of the Siegel mob stopped pushing her around.

Boots is known to authorities to have been acting as a sort of personnei manager and collector for Siegel in his prostitution operations on the West Coast.

It was an effort to force her out of this lucrative spot, the informant said, that caused her to break with the mob

had taken over the prostitution operation after Siegel, becoming Hollywood-conscious some years ago,







# Sleep Pills Are Getting To Be A Hab

By Ernest Mancinelli

It's getting to be a habit with 21-year-old Virginia Hill, heiress and girl friend of slain Mobster-Gambler Benjamin (Bugsy) Siegel, who turned up in Good Samaritan Hospital today—again with an overdose of sleeping tablets.

Police Chief Earl L. O'Clair's newly-organized hoodlum detail reported that the thrice-married Miss Hill checked in last Nov. 24 at swank Paradise Inn.

Virginia has kept her activities here, as everywhere else, well-cloaked in secrecy, but according to Sheriff Cal Boies she apparently made an attempt to end her life here—the fifth time she has suffered an overdose of sleeping potions.

"We are satisfied that she is Virginia Hill despite her attempts to hide her identity," O'Clair said, "but what we are nore interested in are her assocates in the Phoenix area."

O'Clair said his officers were barred from the woman's guarded hospital room here when she threatened to sue the institution if her privacy was invaded.

#### 'Had No Authority'


"We had no legal authority to demand admission to her room," O'Clair said.



Miss Hill was taken to the hontal a week ago Wednesday after she was found unconscious by a maid on the floor of her room at the Paradise Inn.

Robert T. Evans, manager of the inn, said Miss Hill did not return there. He said all of her luggage had been sent to the hospital and her car disappeared from the inn parking lot the day following her hospitalization.

It was the fourth time Miss Hill has been hospitalized after taking overdoses of sleeping medicines since Siegel was gunned to death last June 20 in her Beverly Hills mansion.

Her first overdose was tak n in Paris, the next two in Florid.

## 'Bugsy's' Estate

Brother Given Control by Court

Maurice Siegel, Los Angeles physician, yesterday was granted control of the estate of his brother, Benfamin "Bugsy" Siegel, erstwhile gambling king who was shot to death last June 20 in the Beverly Hills home of a girl friend, Virginia Hill.

Dr. Siegel asked Superior Judge Newcomb Condee for letters of administration to the dead gambling czar's estate which has been controlled since "Bugsy's" death by Public Administrator Ben H. Brown at the request of Attorney General Fred N. Howser, who was investigating Siegel's murder.

Judge Condee granted the doctor's petition so the slain gambler's estate could be distributed to his heirs.

Principal heirs are "Bugsy's" daughters, Millicent, 16, and Barbara, 14, living in New York City with their mother, Mrs. Estelle Siegel, who had divorced their father. Other heirs were Siegel's mother, Mrs. Jenny Siegel, and two sisters, Mrs. Fred Fahn and Ethel Siegel, all of Brooklyn, N. Y., and another sister, Mrs. Bessel Soloway, Beverly Hills.

Besides assets in Brown's Possession, the petition stated "Bugsy" left personal property in California worth \$10,000.


# Different Continuent of the Co Subject, The Killing of Benjanin Bucky Siegel


