The nurse on duty last night re-ported that "Mrs. Hall" was visibly upset when the two men identifying themselves as private detectives called to warn the staff of her danger.

The two private detectives told the chief nurse that a "good riend" of Mrs. Hall's had been tilled recently. They added that Mrs. Hall was in a "highly ner-ous state."

One of the "detectives" sicentified himself as a "Mr. Murray." Good Samaritan officials a that their patient was evidently "rell off" as she had had a nurs deposit \$1200 in new bills upon regaining consciousness

She refused to talk to reporters today and told one that "I don't like newspapers." However, her bed was covered with newspapers, local and Los Angeles.

Virginia Hill had been the victim of numerous previous overdoses of sleeping pills both in Europe and this country since Siegel's death.

Draw tight secrecy knot around eastern hoodlum

A man police said they believed was Bugsy Siegel's killer was put under wraps in Glendale's city jail last night.

One of the lightest knots of secrecy ever drawn on a prize prisoner was pulled on one Cony Brancato, described as a hoodlum from the East, and carried on the police blotter aimply as:

Booked on suspicion of rob

But Glendale's Chief of Police ernon Rasmussen admitted the prisoner was delivered personally by H. Leo Stanley, chief of the district attorney's Bureau of Investigation.

Brancato was trought in the afternoon, said Rasmussen, "by Stanley and one of our men" and has been subjected to some intensive questioning.

But the law's tightlip policy held from the Beverly Hills precincts where Siegel, ganglord of the underworld, was rubbed out by carbine fire last June 20, to the lowest detective, bureau authority in Glendale.

But reliable sources said this is the one the law believes is "it" the man who pulled the trigger on the carbine which must have been filed down so finely it rattled like a sub-machinegun from the driveway next to Virginia Hill's Reverly Hills manse.

While the cops/were mum about Brancato's role in the Siegel rubout, they admitted a man with that name had been fingered earlier as trigger man in an armed robbery at Fresno.

Last Jan. 6 the teletypes out of Fresno droned out the bulletin that Brancato was wanted by the DA there for armed robbery.

The suspect is a squat, swarthy, black-haired man, 34 years old and brown-eyed, according to the Fresno description. He was de-

The fact that police were so hush-hush about Brancato they tried to tuck him away incommunicado in Glendale emphasized the point they were convinced they had the triggerman.

Break' Predicted in Siegel Mystery

Beverly Hills Chief Says He Knows Killer but Needs More Evidence

There may be "startling developments" in the next few days possibly leading to a solution of the 16-month-old aurder of gangster Benjamin (Bugsie) Siegel, Beverly Hills Police Chief Clinton H. Anderson told The Times yesterday.

Anderson, who Saturday related in New York that he and the Beverly Hills Police Department have known for some time the identity of Siegel's slayer, arrived here yesterday morning with no explanation as to why he chose to divulge this information 3000 miles from home.

He said the information was perfectly true. And while he relaxed on a couch in Miss Hill's named no names and promised no immediate arrests, he said that his investigation and the "tapping of underworld sources" had reealed the killer "beyond the hadow of a doubt."

Needs More Evidence

No arrest can be made or the tiller named, Anderson continued, until sufficient evidence has been uncovered "to wrap this case up." He did have this much to say

about the slaying:

Siegel was killed on orders from an "international underworld syndicate" because "he threatened to talk and sell the cyndicate out to the police."

The threat was made in order that Siegel could get the "big hots to kick through with more ioney" to support his Las Vegas ambling resort, the \$6,000,000 lamingo Club, which was flourdering financially.

Put on Spot

Gunmen were planted in th shrubbery around the Bever Hills martion of Virginia Hil Siegel's girl friend, and Bloge was taken to that house by friend and guided to the couch on which he was slain from a livingroom window, it was said.

Siegel was killed by a fusillade of high-caliber rifle bullets as he home, 810 N Linden Drive, on June 20, 1947.

An eyewitness to the shooting was white-haired Allen Smiley, a close Siegel associate long suapected of wide gangland connections.

Smiley on Trial

Smiley is at present a defendant in a deportation trial in U.S. District Court here, He is a Canadian citizen,

Siegel came to Los Angeles in the late 30s with a reputation as a top eastern underworld figure. Here he was believed to have immediately taken control of gangland activities. There were a few dissenters, principally Harry (Big Greenie) Greenberg, who was a and killed Nov. 22, 1939.



Here today Anderson unveiled two more facets of his drive to "make this an air-tight case" before making any arrests.

Anderson told The Evening Herald and Express today he would:

1. Ask federal authorities to grant immunity to Allen Smiley, white haired "sportsman," currently on trial here on perjury charges in connection with his asserted illegal entry into the country, if Smiley could—and would—reveal the inside story of Bugsy's slaying;

Despite Anderson's asserted knowledge of the killer's identity he promised no immediate arresi, pointing to the recent court ruling that mere implication by an accomplice, uncorroborated by any other witness, is unsufficient for a conviction.

Siegel was put on the spot, said Anderson, by an "international underworld syndicate" as the price for his threats "to talk and sell out the syndicate to the police."

"Bugsy," it appears, sought to "get the big shots to kick through with more money" for his \$6,000,000 gambling resort, the Flamingo at Las Vegas.

With one or more "trigger men" lying in ambush in the shrubbery, Siegel was taken to Miss Hill's rented palace and steered to the couch facing an open window. A moment later Bucsy was sprayed with a fusillade of 30-30 carbine bullets.

Just before the execution Bugby and three friends had had dinmer at a beach cafe. These companions, who returned with him to what was to be his murder, were:

Smiley, intimate of Siegel's and long suspected of extensive underworld connections:

Charles Hill, brother of Siegel's sweetheart, Virginia Hill; (Miss Hill, incidentally, is believed to have been tipped off about the impending killing and was en route by air to Paris,)

Jerri Mason, Miss Hill's secretary and currently Mrs. Charles Hill.

New York homicide detectives are curious about the source of Smiley's income, which made it possible for the white-haired "sportsman" to live in a \$1000 a month suite.

TOP UNDERWOBLD 'BRASS'

When Siegel "moved into Los Angeles" some 15 years before his slaying he had the reputation of being one of the top brass of the eastern underworld. He was sent here, police believe, to capture control of gangland activities. Among his few opponents was one Harry Big Greenie" Greenberg, who was slain Nov. 22, 1933, in Hollywood. Indicted for the killing, Hugsy beat the rap.





Benjamin (Bugsy) Siegel announced, immediately on being freed of the charge of murdering a hoodlum named Harry (Big Greenie) Greenberg, that he was becoming a gentleman.

He was no longer to be addressed as Bugsy.

Furthermore, he was going to go legitimate in his business activities. He had the looks, the manner and the personality to have done it.

But it was as hard for him to go legitimate as it was for him to lose the underworld-conferred tag of Bugsy.

There were too many years of gangdom in his blood.

His entire background has not been brought to light. It is known that he grew up in New York and that one of his close boyhood friends was George Raft, later to become the movie star.

One of his earlier ventures was trucking business and while hus occupied he got married and athered two daughters.

Became Rum-Runner

From trucking it was easy enough for him to get into rumhauling and from that to graduate into the flourishing New York rackets of the late twenties,

Shapiro, Mendy Weiss and Abe (Kid Twist) Reles.

His special niche, it was said, was as triggerman or "torpedo" for Charles (Lucky) Luciano, the New York prostitution czar.

In the late thirties the then district attorney Thomas E. Dewey began his rough-on-rats warfare against New York racketeers. Bugsy took the hint and moved out here, 3000 miles away from ewey.

To Hollywood and Beverly Hil ircles Bugsy's background w ot generally known. His u doubted charm, his looks and his nee hand with money quickly ined him entree. He lived rigally, occupying a 35-room home if Holmby Hills. He gained the tag "well-known sportsman."

The edifice crumbled a little



The bullet-punctuated saga of Harry (Big Greenie) Greenberg is not so much a murder mystery as it is a commentary on the American scene and the underworld empire we have allowed to grow up in our midst.

Big Greenie was a Russian immigrant, a burly and uncouth man who never learned to speak better than broken English and who, apparently, had not a very high IQ.

He did have, however, brute force, a certain cunning and an entire lack of scruples.

The combination made him valuable to an organization which eventually became known as Murder, Inc., of Brooklyn, N.Y.

At the time the organization was making a modest start by furnishing strongarm squads for Manhattan's Industrial disputes. Fur and garment workers, bakery workers and others were slugged and kept in line.

Later it added a new and profitable activity-homicide.

A really important killing could be bought for around \$500 to \$1000. Lesser jobs went as low as \$100.

Paid \$50 to \$100

For any kind of a killing the triggermen got \$50 to \$100 apiece. The heads of the slaying syndicate, Louis (Lepke) Buchalter, Emanuel Weiss and Jacob Gurrah, took the rest.

Around this time Big Greenie got picked up in a labor slugging charge, was turned over to the Immigration authorities and deported to Poland.

Then on the night of Nov. 22, 1929, a burly man who used the pame "George Schachter" drove his car to the corner of Hollywood and Vine, as he did every night, bought a paper and headed for his home at 1805 Vista Del Mar Ave.

He pulled to a stop in front of the house. Here accounts differ. Witnesses said he was shot by two men in a dark sedan. Later information was that the killer stepped from the shadows of a hedge, fired and escaped in a car driven by a second man.

Whichever way it was, he was dead with three bullets through the head.

Information from his widow, Ida, led to New York and within 24 hours "Schachter" had been identified as Big Greenle.

New York sources also supplied the motive—in writing to Lepke he had not only said he wanted \$5000 but had threatened to talk to the law about Murder, Inc., if he didn't get it.

At this point a Hollywood "playboy and sportsman" named Benjamin (Bugsie) Siegel was first introduced to a public other than the celebrities and sports figures he had been chumming with.

Bugsie a Contrast

Bugsie was a contrast to Big Greenie in all ways but one. He was smoothly dressed, handsome, wave and fairly well educated. But, like Big Greenie, he was tied in with Lepke.

Police announced they planned tol question Bugsie. Apparently, bowever, they did not at that particular time. It was not until Aug. 14, 1946, nourly a year later, that officers descended on Bagnie's 25-room Holmby Hills manston, found him hiding in the attic and dragged him off to jail on a murder charge.

The arrest had been brought about by the "singing" before a grand jury of two Lepke pals, Al Tannenbaum and Abe (Kid Twist) Reles. Reles later won fame as the "singer" who sent Lepke to the chair in New York and aided the break-up of Murder, Inc. He also later fell "accidentally" from the top of a New York building and died.

The hoodlums' story was this: siegel had promised Lepke he ribout of Big Greenie. Tanner thum had been the courier bringing the murder guns from New York to Hollywood.

Murder Team

On the murder team had been Bugsie, Frank Carbo, a West Coast fight manager, and Harry (Champ) Segal, owner of a Hollywood barber shop which was the hangout of sport figures. Bugsie had driven Carbo to the spot in a stolen car. Segal had followed in Bugsie's car to "crash" any pursuit that started.

Carbo had been the man behind the gun.

The case against Bugsle seemed open and shut, and, the law had the extra advantage of having him safely behind bars.

Carbo and Segal were being sought.

However, there appeared an unexpected legal hurdle.

Dist. Atty. William J. O'Dwyer of Brooklyn, now New York's mayor, announced they could not allow Tannenbaum and Reles to come to Los Angeles to testify.

They were too busy convicting Murder, Inc., partners.

Dismissal of the indictment against Bugsie resulted. Harry (Champ) Segal promptly surrendered and had his indictment washed out.

Frank Carbo, the fight manager, was not prompt enough. When he surrendered, O'Dwyer had changed his mind and was ready to send Tannenbaum to the coast to testify.

The grand jury immediately reindicted Bugsle, and he and Carbo went to trial for the murder of Big Greenie.

Haliway through the trial the court dismissed the charge against Bugdle because the only evidence connecting him with the murder was the story of Tannenbaum. Carbo's trial went on

but resulted in a hung jury.

The murder of Big Greenie went back on the unsolved list.

Benjamin (Bugsie) Siegel went on to an inevitable finish.



Las Vegas at \$8353. The appraisers iisted 220 shares of Flamingo atock, held by Siegel, as of no value. The present corporate setup of the Flamingo was reorganized after Siegel's demise.

Listed by administrator Siegel as Bugsy's heirs are, in addition to himself, daughters Barbara and Millicent Siegel, of New York City; sister Bessie Soloway, of Beverly Hills, sister Esther Falm, of Brooklyn, sister Ethel Siegel, of Brooklyn, and mother Jennie Siegel, of Beverly Hills. Ex-wife Estelle was not included among the heirs.

Another claim filed against the estate was that of Harry C. Westover, tax collector for Uncle Sam, who set forth in his notice that \$19,519 is due on Siegel's income for 1943, 1946 and 1947.

Westovers office also served nitice that \$7907 is due from "lather Siegel, also known as Eitelle Siegel," and that they arpet to collect it before any settlement of the estate is made.
