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
BACKGROUDID OF BENJAMEN "RUGS" STEGRE

Tapper and ability to earry out threats had assumed leadership of a group of them shall-time handlums in New York. He had previously eligned himself with the underworld and the prohibition bootlegging racket and had climbed repidly because of his rutillessness and his ability to handle men. About this time he associated himself with MEYER LAMBET and their gang skyrocketed into preminence and underworld respect as the BUGS and MEYER Hob. SINGEL acquired his nickname of BUGS because he was regarded by his intimate acquaintances as insane along certain lines.

An open gang warfare broke out among the New York gangs and the BUGS and MEYER Mob was responsible for the killing and removal of many powerful rival gangdom figures. SIEGEL and LANSKY shared the distatorial powers of the gang, but SIEGEL was responsible for the terroristic practices of their groups. They had many gunmen at their command who were who were motivated both by fear and because of the money and process on SIEGEL and LANSKY could give them to obey the

At the time of the GREENDERG killing, mentioned above, SIRGEL was arrested on a charge of harboring LEPKE-BUCHALTER. This charge was dropped as was the GREENBERG charge when ABE RELES fell or was pushed from the 5th Floor of a building in New York.

allegations have been made to the effect that SIRGEL is prominent in the management of the Beverly-Wilshirp Hotel, which has been recently acquired by the KIRKERN Interests. The KIRKERN chain is allegedly backed by hoodlum money and supposedly LONGIE ZWILLMAN is one of the main investors in this sensorm. CALIFORNIA:

The informant said that SIEGEL actually has nothing in California that "you can put your finger on." Although he is the recognized leader on the West Coast of all activities of New York, Chicago, Detroit, and other major cities' gang activities, they do not control gambling in the Los Angeles area. SIEGEL likes California and has made his home there for several years for that reason. He does not want to become too involved in illegal activities in California because he is attempting to enjoy a "good" reputation there. He prides himself on the fact that he has never been convicted of a criminal offense of a major nature, and is ashamed of his one felony conviction of bookmaking in Los Angeles about a year ago. He was convicted at that time with and was fined. However, bookmaking is a felony in California.

CHICAGO AND DETROIT:

SIEGEL, COSTELLO, ADONIS, and LANSKY do not actually control any gambling activities in those cities, but, by agreement, work "hand in glove" with underworld elements there. As previously reported, they have a working agreement with the CAPONE element in Chicago, and informant feels that the CAPONE group is now getting most of its support from these men until it can again successfully function alone without their active support.

With reference to SIEGEL's conversation relating to the article appearing in the Las Vegas Tribune, an examination of this weekly newspaper reflected that the principal article appearing on the first page of Volume 3, Eunber 28, for the week ending August 1, 1946, was captioned "Camble Palaces Versus Houses for Veterans." This article in full read as follows:

The Flamingo, giant gambling resort now under construction on highway 91 at a cost estimated to reach the three-milliem-dollar mark, promises to be the biggest and most slaberage slab in the country. Under norman conditions, construction of this type may be tolerated and by many weldomed as an additional enterprise to put las Vegas en the map. At present, however, the construction of another gambling resort of such magnitude is causing much unfavorable comment, especially emong veterans who have been trying vainly to purchase building materials for homes they feel they are entitled to build for their families.

"Contractors and building supply houses claim they do not have any materials to build homes. But, somehow, builders of gambling clubs seem to have no trouble whatsoever getting anything they want. The same builders who have no time to build city jails, swimming pools for the children or homes for the veterans and working men are ready to bend over backward to build gambling clubs and other unessential buildings. The very last thing las Vegas needs at this time is another gambling club. Our magnificent resent hotels have been able to take care of our tourists in a fine manner. What las Vegas needs is homes—and more homes.

"Let us build the homes first. After that is done and the demand for housing is filled, we can build all the gambling clubs the traffic will stand. He realise that enterprises such as the Flaminge club are marked by men of great means. In the case of this particular club, for instance, it is hard to match the capital of men like Sugaio Siegel, Earry Rethberg and others who are ready to spend a fortune to make another fortune in Las Vegas.

"No doubt the Flamingo will attract many people to this area. It is reported that the Flamingo will cater to men who bet \$1000 chips with the same ease as you and I would play the nickel slot machine. In the casinos of the Flamingo, fortunes will be won and lost. Won by Bugsie Siegel and his associates and lost by the wealthy gamblers from Hollywood and elsewhere.

Today, the construction of the Flamingo will increase the belligerent feeling of the populace toward the gambling element which has been engendered during the past few years. The man who earmot find a few feet of soil pipe for his little home and who witnesses the material he so sorely needs go into the construction of gambling clubs is not likely to be in favor of the continuance of the present laws. He feels that the gamblers are using their easy money to deprice him of a place to live.

"The public will tolerate gambling only as long as gambling will subjugate itself to the welfare of the people of the community. We doubt that the man who seem to be in the saddle and control the gambling interests have enough sense to see 'the handwriting on the wall.' -- Richard King."

Accompanying the article were photographs of a pile of sewer and soil pipe on the premises of the Flamingo Hotel, a photograph of the partially finished hotel, and a photograph of new homes in the Biltmore tract of las Vegas, with the accompanying comment that more homes like those appearing in the photograph are needed rather than elaborate gambling palaces.

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advised Special Agents of the Los Angeles Field Division on July 30, 1948, that he had received some information from a highly confidential source which was given to him in confidence and which he would make available to agents with the understanding that the agents would treat it in the manner in which it was being given. He mentioned that he had received this information as gossip in that he personally had no knowledge of the facts involved, nor could be wouch for the source of his information, but he was making the information available for what it is worth. In connection with the Flamingo Hotel, which SIEGEL are building in Las Vegas, informant stated that construction on this hotel had not gotten any further than "a few stakes being driven in the ground when the freeze order regulating all commercial building under CPA came into effect. When this order came through, the Flamingo Hotel had not progressed far enough to qualify for the granting of a permit for its continuance, so

certain funds were made available to Senator PAT McCARRAN of the State of Nevada, and shortly thereafter construction was authorized under CPA regulations permitting the construction of the Flamingo. The key person in this transaction is allegedly a CPA man in Reno, Nevada,

Informant went on to say that in addition to collusion on the part of certain contractors who falsified records, persons in las Vegas must undoubtedly be aware of the fact that the hotel itself did not even have its concrete foundations poured when allegedly the permit was granted to continue its construction because work had progressed to a point where further constructions could be authorised under the CPA.

The second possibility of proving a violation at the present time is SIEGEL's harboring who is the subject of a case involving Unlawful Flight to Avoid Prosecution in which New York City is the office of origin.

The investigation looking toward the location of will be coordinated with the SIEGH investigation in order that we will be able to develop the Harboring violation should one exist. A difficulty in proving this violation is the fact that was made a Pederal Fugitive only within the past few weeks and it is doubtful that if at this point it could be proven that SIEGH is aware of status as a Federal Publication.

From several confidential informants in the Los Angeles area, information has been received that SIEGEL is a user of opium. It has not been determined as yet whether he is a narcotic addict or whether he is a so-called "plea sure smoker," who uses opium from time to time. The possibility of developing information along these lines will be kept in mind.

In connection with this latter information. Special Agents ascertained only today from

Los Angeles, that in 1939 the United States Customs conducted an investigation concerning SIEGEL and pursuant to a search warrant conducted a search of his residence in Los Angeles in an effort to locate narcotics and

valuable perfume which apparently had been smuggled into the United States. This search was a failure because apparently SIEGEL was tipped off that the search was to be conducted.

It is noted has stated that STEGET is suilty of murdering one GREENBERG at Los Angeles in 1939

Records here indicate that STEGEL was indicted for the GREENBERG murder, but was not tried.

While we shall confine our investigation principally to SIEGHL's current activities to ascertain what Federal violations he has committed, we plan to have available as much information as possible concerning murders attributed to SIEGEL in order that Agents might be alert in this investigation to develop evidence of SIEGEL's guilt for these murders. In regard to this, I am addressing a separate communication to the New York office, requesting that office to secure either from the files of the New York office or the facts surrounding murders of which SIEGEL is suspected in the New York area.

During the interview with today by Special he mentioned that he had received some informa-Agents tion from a highly confidential source which was given to him in confidence that he would make available at this time concerning SIEGEL with the understanding that the Agents would treat it in the manner in which it was being given. He stated that this information was gossip in that he personally had no knowledge of the facts involved, nor could be wouch for the source of his information, but he was making the information available for what it is worth. In connection with the Flamingo Hotel, which SIEGEL building in Las Veras. Nevada mentioned that construction on this hotel had not gotten any further than "a few stakes being driven in the ground" when the freeze order regulating all commercial building under C.P.A. came into effect. When this order came through the Flamingo Hotel had not progressed far enough to outdify for the granting of a permit for ita continuance, so

certain funds were made available to Senator PA McCARREN (phonetic) of the State of Nevada and shortly thereafter construction was authorized under C.P.A. regulations permitting the construction of the Flamingo. The key person in this transaction is allegedly a C.P.A. man in Reno, Nevada, who is head of the Construction Division of this Governmental Agency. After the above arrangement was made, construction records were falsified to show that certain portions of the contract had been fulfilled. Certain affidavits on the part of contractors and others were handled by the C.P.A. and a permit was granted to continue construction.

to collusion on the part of certain contractors who falsified records, persons in Las Vegas must undoubtedly be aware of the fact that the hotel itself did not even have its concrete foundations poured when allegedly the permit was granted to continue its construction because work had progressed to a point where further constructions could be authorized under the C.P.A.

In connection with the actual payment of the money to of the opinion that the mame was mentioned rather than SIEGEL's, but he qualified this by saying that he was not positive. However, he did know of the SIEGEL hook-up and at the time the information was given to him he classified in his own mind the fact that this was a bribery on the part of SIEGEL to some C.P.A. executive in Reno, Nevada.

In connection with the above information, it is noted that on July 25, 1916, SIEGEL was in communication with GUS GREENBAUM at Las Vegas concerning the construction of the Flamingo Hotel and GREENBAUM mentioned that a civilian production administration man, was around. SIEGEL asked what the C.P.A. can do and GREENBAUM stated that they can make an investigation. SIEGEL said, "Let them make it because everything is all right." SIEGEL said, "There is no way to stop us because I showed the C.P.A. what I am doing and the C.P.A. gave the o.k. on it. Resides he already has all of the material necessary."

The above would indicate a possible bribery or Fraud Against the Government case and this will be gone into thoroughly.

The Eureau will be promptly advised of all developments and a detailed report will be submitted to the Eureau in the very near future.

To advise you that I discussed with of the Training Division the facts concerning the hearing held in San Francisco on the construction of the Flamingo Hotel. is of the opinion that the facts do not warrant sufficient information to base a successful prosecution for perjury.

BACKOROUND

Per your instructions, the writer on September 3, 1946, discussed of the Training Division the facts concerning the Benjamin "Bugs" Siegel case and specifically the building of the Firmingo Hotel in Las Vegas, Nevada. was advised that the construction of the Flamingo Hotel was halted by a CPA order dated March 26, 1946, which was a general order issued by the Civilian Production Administration on all commercial construction. was advised that after the freeze order of March 26 was issued, Siegel and his associates communicated with the Regional Office of the CPA and contended that the general freeze order issued by the CPA did not effect further construction of the Flamingo Hotel inasmuch as construction had started prior was advised that the architect for the construction of the Flamingo Hotel was granted permission to proceed with the construction of the hotel until a hearing was held which hearing was commenced on August 13, 1946, at San Francisco, California. The point of issue at the hearing was whether plans of the Flamingo Hotel were for one building or a group of buildings, was advised that present at the hearing were in addition to three Benjamin Siegel and attorneys for Siegel. It was pointed out to

that the testimony at the hearing in San Francisco was not under oath; however, before the hearing who was appointed to conduct the hearing advised commenced, all of the witnesses that it would be a violation of law for them to make false statements at the hearing, however the Commissioner did not specify the statute which he had in mind.

OPINION OF

was of the opinion that inasmuch as the witnesses who appeared before the hearing in San Francisco were not placed wider oath there could not be sufficient grounds to consider a perjury charge against any of the individuals testifying.

You have expressed an interest in the possibility of successfully in prosecuting the above-named subject for perjury or subornation of perjury as a result of the testimony before the Commissioner of the Civilian Production * ministration at San Francisco, California.

It has been ascertained from the San Francisco Office that the witnesses who testified were not placed under oath, and Siegel did not testify. The Commissioner, however, informed all of the witnesses that it would be a violation of law for them to make false statements at the hearing.

Section 231, Title 18, U.S.C.A., the Perjury Statute, clearly provides that the taking of an oath before a competent tribunal, officer, or person is a condition precedent to a perjury violation. Therefore, from the facts as determined at the present time there could not possibly be successful prosecution for perjury or subornation of perjury.

Section 80, Title 18, U.S.C.A., however, is a very broad statue and prowides that the making of or the causing to be made a false or fraudulent statement in any matter within the jurisdiction of any department or agency of the United States is a violation with a penalty provision of ten years or \$10,000, or both. It appears the facts in the present case may constitute a violation of this section.
