On September 30, 1947, [redacted] telephoned that he did not want to provide an argument or get into any difficulty with the Bureau, but that he is rather uneasy about the unfavorable newspaper publicity which has been emanating from the Director with respect to the Rutensia (Baker) Signal case and gangster activities in general.

He was asked for specific statements to which he objected and he said he had nothing along that line, but the newspaper publicity on September 30, 1947 with respect to your talk before the FBI National Academy Retraining Session in the local papers played up your remarks with respect to glamorizing Siegel. He said he also had brought back to his mind statements reported by the press on your recent trip to Los Angeles. I pointed out to him that the press had made some inaccurate statements and that you had not directed criticism against any particular local police department. [REDACTED]

The attached newspaper clipping appearing in the Washington Post today reflects that Virginia Hill, paramour of the late Benjamin "Bugs" Siegel, is presently recovering from an over dose of sleeping pills.

Considerable newspaper publicity has been given to the previous excessive use of sedatives by Hill. This last attempt appears to be the fourth time Hill has been found in an unconscious condition as a result of excessive use of sleeping pills. You will recall that just prior to Siegel's murder Hill had an argument with him at Las Vegas, Nevada and shortly thereafter was found in a drugged unconscious condition. The next occasion occurred immediately after the Siegel murder while Hill was in France. Shortly after the second attempt, Hill returned to this country and, while residing at her residence at Miami Beach, Florida, again was found in an unconscious and drugged condition.

EARLY BACKGROUND

Benjamin Siegel was born in New York City on February 28, 1906. His parents were Max and Jeannie Siegel, 1719 67th Street, Brooklyn.

Siegel has described himself as a "Betting Commissioner" and "Investment Broker" with an income of \$50,000 per year. He stood 5 feet 9 inches tall, was a dapper dresser and weighed 157 pounds.

While a youth in "Hell's Kitchen" in New York, Siegel made kid-gang contacts which later were to prove extremely useful with Frank Costello, Meyer Lansky, Charles "Lucky" Luciano, Joe Adonis, Jacob Shapiro, Louis "Lepke" Buchalter and Abraham "Longie" Zwillman.

CRIMINAL ACTIVITIES IN NEW YORK CITY

During the time that Siegel was in his teens, bootleg racketeering became a major activity for the underworld. Siegel formed an alliance with Meyer Lansky, a boyhood friend, and they formed the "Bugs and Meyer" Gang to convoy liquor between New York and Chicago. Because of the raging fits of temper which Siegel was capable of displaying at the slightest provocation, he became known to his associates as "Bugs", a nick-name which he hated.

In addition to hauling and guarding liquor for other people, Siegel and Lansky also branched out into bootlegging interests of their own. They started running in from England expensive White Horse liquor and they also began muscling into the operations of the "Waxey" Gordon Gang which controlled liquor outlets in Metropolitan New York. Siegel is credited with promoting the infiltration of the "Waxey" Gordon territory which was principally achieved through a series of gangland killings. Following such murders the Bugs and Meyer Mob would take over territory as well as personnel relinquished by the Waxey Gordon Gang. Moe Sedway, who had been an important front man for Waxey Gordon's liquor business because of his legitimate contacts in the hotel and entertainment fields, was taken over by Siegel with the dissolution of the Waxey Gordon Gang just as other assets of that Gang were absorbed. By the time Prohibition was repealed Siegel and Lansky had reached the summit of their New York criminal careers and allied themselves with certain

other mobsters becoming known as "The Big Six" or "The Combination". This group included in addition to Siegel and Lansky who took care of bootleg liquor interests, Charles "Lucky" Luciano, who handled prostitution and narcotics, Abe "Longie" Zwillman, who handled gambling and Buchalter and Shapiro who organized the first large-scale kickback and shakedown rackets in legitimate business and industry.

TRANSFER OF OPERATIONS TO CALIFORNIA

Following the repeal of Prohibition, the Siegel-Lansky operations in The Big Six began to lose their former importance and the large distillers and liquor distributing agencies which had been built up during Prohibition were eventually sold by Siegel and his crowd to legitimate and semi-legitimate interests. Siegel left New York for California leaving Lansky in charge of the remaining liquor operations of The Combination. Siegel first operated in California from his sister's home at 721 N. Doheny Drive in Beverly Hills. This sister's husband "Sol" Soloway was taken in as a Siegel mobster. From the beginning of his activities in California, Siegel exchanged money and counsel with The Combination leaders back East.

Among Siegel's early activities in California was the investment of funds in various hotels, restaurants, and real estate. Part of this money came from The Combination and Siegel utilized gangster tactics in muscling in on the profits of other restaurants and night clubs. Siegel was also believed to have handled narcotics during his residence in California. During the war Siegel also took over a legitimate manufacturing plant which he named The Mercury Engineering Company and successfully obtained aircraft war contracts amounting to approximately \$20,000 per month. At the end of the war Siegel disposed of the plant and liquidated the assets.

AFFAIRS WITH [REDACTED] VIRGINIA HILL

Siegel's wife left him during their residence in California and later obtained a divorce. Following the split with his wife, Siegel sold his mansion in California and began living in exclusive apartments and hotels. He carried on an open affair [REDACTED] until he grew tired of her and moved from her apartment to the former estate of Rudolph Valentino called The Falcon's Lair, #2 Bella Drive in Beverly Hills, where he took up residence with Virginia Hill.

Virginia Hill apparently had unlimited funds some of which came from three prior marriages and in addition to being a dope addict has been described as vulgar and obscene. [REDACTED]

Virginia Hill is reputed to have taken an interest in some of Siegel's enterprises during their relationship, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] both Siegel and Hill were involved in narcotic and prostitution operations. b7c b7d

Early in June, 1947, Siegel had a violent quarrel with Virginia Hill at which time he allegedly beat her so badly that she still had visible bruises several weeks later. Immediately after the beating she took an overdose of narcotics in a suicide threat and was taken unconscious to the hospital. Upon recovery she immediately arranged to leave for an extended trip to Europe.

Siegel, earlier in his residence in California, had an affair with [REDACTED] and according to Newsweek Magazine Siegel accompanied [REDACTED] on a trip to Europe where she introduced him to the most prominent aristocracy of Italy as an "important American". b7c

EXTENSION OF ACTIVITIES TO LAS VEGAS

Among his other activities, Siegel had organized the bookmakers in Southern California and was most anxious to obtain the West Coast franchise for the Continental Race Horse Wire Service owned by James M. Ragen, Sr., in Chicago. [REDACTED] b7c

[REDACTED] Siegel then joined the Combination in a fight against Ragen in an effort to take over Ragen's wire service and in this connection he pushed a rival service called Trans-American News.

Following his entry into Las Vegas [REDACTED] Siegel rapidly expanded his activities to include the operation of night clubs and restaurants. His usual technique was to obtain a cut in the profits through intimidation. b7c

In California Siegel had allied himself with [REDACTED] and had used this means of extorting money from key figures in the movie industry by threatening to expose their criminal connections [REDACTED] In 1945, immediately after the end of the war, Siegel [REDACTED] planned the building of a \$3,000,000 hotel in Las Vegas where the principal interest would be a gigantic gambling casino. b7c

Other partners in the Flamingo Hotel project included [REDACTED] b7c

[REDACTED] The hotel was completed at a time of acute material shortages despite pressure for veterans' housing and restrictions of the Civilian Production Administration. The gambling casino opened on December 26, 1946, but attendance was disappointing and a second opening night was staged two days later. Siegel had arranged to have a number of movie stars present but despite his activity the project appeared to be a financial failure from the start.

KILLING OF SIEGEL

On June 19, 1947, Siegel left the Flamingo Hotel and went to Virginia Hill's newly acquired mansion in Beverly Hills. He went out for dinner with

After dinner Siegel and [redacted] were alone in a downstairs room at the house when someone fired nine bullets into the room through a window. Siegel was killed.

The killing appeared the work of a professional and experienced killer who had used a light-weight semi-automatic carbine rifle. Two bullets had struck Siegel in the head. Siegel was buried by his brother, Dr. Maurice Siegel at a small funeral and his assets all disappeared.

The killer has not yet been identified, but California authorities are conducting an investigation based on the following theories:

1. That [REDACTED] had "put Siegel on the spot".
2. That Virginia Hill's brother had killed Siegel because of his treatment of Virginia Hill.
3. That the Criminal Syndicate killed Siegel because of loss of money on the Flamingo Hotel.
4. That Moe Sedway and Gus Greenbaum killed Seigel over an argument concerning the racing wire service.

GENERAL CRIMINAL ACTIVITIES AND ASSOCIATES

Siegel has been responsible directly or indirectly for at least 30 murders. Among those with which he has been linked are the murders of Harry "Big Greenie" Greenberg, a top member of the Louis Buchalter Gang, Murray Marks, Harry Meyers and Bill Weisman.

this case concerning SIV NIE connection with
the narcotic traffic on the West Coast was furnished to Federal Narcotic
Agent of the Federal Narcotic Bureau, Federal Building, Los
Angeles, who has been our contact in this and similar cases. took
extensive notes and advised that he would make the information furnished
available to his organization. He said, however, that the present policy
of the Federal Narcotic Bureau is to place emphasis upon the minor viola-

Reference is made to the attached communication which was received from Walter Winchell and which reflects information received by him from an unidentified informant to the effect that one [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] caused the murder of Benjamin "Bugsy" Siegel, because Siegel took movie actress [REDACTED] on a week-end trip to Las Vegas, Nevada, during the time Siegel was having an affair with Virginia Hill, notorious Cafe Society habituant, and according to Winchell's informant, [REDACTED] *b7*

It will be recalled that the Bureau has previously been advised of the association of Siegel and Hill and of Siegel's interest in movie actresses [REDACTED]. The background of Virginia Hill was fully developed during the Bureau's investigation of her following the report of Former Newspaper Columnist [REDACTED] to the effect that she had cashed a large check from Former Attorney General Francis Biddle in a Los Angeles night club. During this investigation, it was ascertained that Virginia Hill left her home in Bessemer, Alabama, at the age of 16 and went to Chicago, Illinois, and while dancing at the World's Fair, [REDACTED]. Hill subsequently had many other paramours, including [REDACTED] and gangsters Joe Adonis, notorious member of the Eastern Criminal Syndicate and Benjamin "Bugsy" Siegel, leading West Coast gangster. Adonis, [REDACTED] is reported to have considered Hill as merely a "bedroom date", but through him she reportedly came to know Frank Costello and other syndicate leaders. Hill later became Siegel's paramour and lived with him in Los Angeles. [REDACTED] *b7*

[REDACTED] (62-68739 sec. 3 ser. 81 & 83)

No information was developed in this investigation to indicate that Hill was ever associated with anyone named [REDACTED] who are leading racketeers in the Chicago area.

It will be recalled that approximately a week before Siegel was murdered he and Hill engaged in a serious argument at the Flamingo Hotel in Las Vegas, Nevada, over Siegel's alleged attentions to a cigarette girl [REDACTED] *b7*

After this altercation, Hill threatened to commit suicide and subsequently took an overdose of sleeping tablets from which she later recovered after a short period of hospitalization. Hill left immediately for Los Angeles after this fracas and later went to New York where she arranged passage to France. At the time of Siegel's death, she was in Paris. *b7*

One of the theories of Siegel's murder was that Virginia Hill, while in New York en route to France, may have informed Adonis and other members of the syndicate concerning Siegel's actions. However, no factual information was ever developed which would tend to verify that Hill took such action or that Adonis or the syndicate was responsible for Siegel's murder. (62-81518 ser. 461)

CONCLUSION

It appears that Walter Winchell's informant has furnished garbled information and that the reference to [REDACTED] may have been intended to refer to Joe Adonis. It is noted that the attachment bears the notation, "This reads wild". bx

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Los Angeles Division be advised of the receipt of the above information and directed to furnish the same to the appropriate police department. It is also suggested that no investigation be undertaken in connection with this matter, but that the Los Angeles Division be requested to ascertain if possible from its files the identity of the person who reportedly occupied the penthouse next to Siegel and who furnished the information mentioned above.

If you approve, the attached letter will be sent to the Los Angeles Division.

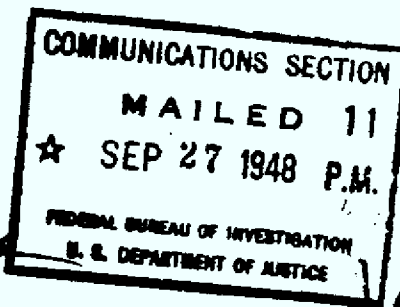

A check of Los Angeles files failed to reflect any person who occupied a penthouse at the Chateau Marmont Apartments, 8821 Sunset Boulevard, Hollywood, California, next to that in which BENJAMIN "BUGSY" SIEGEL and VIRGINIA HILL previously resided.

[REDACTED] has advised that there was no adjoining penthouse next to that of VIRGINIA HILL at this apartment house. The only apartment on the same floor as VIRGINIA HILL's penthouse was a very small apartment which has been occupied for many years by [REDACTED]. This apartment is far removed from the penthouse and not within hearing distance. However, the terrace adjoining that of the penthouse is public and available to any apartment house resident or outsider who is desirous of using same. It is possible that any house guest or other person using this terrace could have overheard conversations between SIEGEL and HILL while they were on the terrace of their penthouse.

DEFERRED RECORD

On January 3, 1949, an informant of this office advised that while frequenting barrooms, etc., and contacting members of the underworld, he had been tipped off that the killer of BENJAMIN "BUGSY" SIEGEL was [REDACTED]

This information came to the informant from several underworld sources, one source stating that [REDACTED] delivered a package" for [REDACTED] who are alleged to be well known racketeers on the West Coast. The informant further advised that [REDACTED] is a friend of [REDACTED] leader of the gambling syndicate in New Jersey, and as such, a national figure in the underworld in this country, as the New Jersey syndicate controls to a large extent the gambling activities throughout the country.

The indices of this office fail to reveal any information on [REDACTED] The Crime Surveys of the Los Angeles and San Francisco Divisions which are available to this office were checked for information [REDACTED] with negative results.

It is understood that the information naming [REDACTED] as the killer of SIEGEL was furnished to the Bureau by the Newark Division by letter dated December 9, 1948.

Reference is made to my letter of January 7th, entitled as above, indicating the possibility that [redacted] was the killer of BUGSY SIEGEL. On January 10, 1949, [redacted] was again informed that this Bureau has not and is not investigating the BUGSY SIEGEL case. It was, however, suggested to him that he may wish to bring this information to the attention of police authorities on the west coast. He advised that he had contemplated doing this and was going to arrange through reliable contacts of his in the New York Police Department to relay this information to reliable authorities in the Los Angeles Police Department. [redacted] pointed out that he realized that none of the information he furnished in this matter pertains to a violation within the jurisdiction of the FBI. Nevertheless, he thought it would be of value to us from the standpoint of general knowledge of criminal conditions. [redacted]

For the further information of the Bureau and the Newark office, on the morning of January 10, 1949, [redacted]

[redacted] personally called to see SAC Scheidt. In substance he advised that his attention had been drawn to the fact that more or less open gambling was going on in the City of Rahway under the auspices of individuals who appeared to be New Yorkers rather than local characters. Because of his faith in the integrity of the FBI, he desired to know whether the FBI could conduct an investigation leading to the cleaning up of the City of Rahway from the standpoint of this gambling. SAC Scheidt informed [redacted] that this matter did not come within the jurisdiction of the FBI and consequently it would not be possible for us to conduct an investigation. He suggested that [redacted] bring this information to the attention of the constituted authorities of the City of Rahway. [redacted]

By letter dated August 27, 1947, this office transmitted three carbine cartridge cases obtained from [redacted] then of the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office, who had received these cartridge cases from an officer of the Beverly Hills Police Department. It was stated that these cartridge cases were found on the grounds at the scene of the murder of captioned subject in Beverly Hills, California on June 20, 1947. The Laboratory was requested to examine these cartridge cases for possible comparison purposes at a later date with firearms of the same caliber.

By letter dated October 2, 1947, the Bureau advised that an examination had been made of these cartridge cases and it was determined that marks on the cases were not sufficiently distinct for comparison with test specimens from suspected carbines. A few similarities were found between the extractor marks on two cases but they were of such a nature that it was not possible to identify these cases as having been loaded into or extracted from the same weapon. It was stated that it may be possible to identify the extractor marks on these cases from tests of suspected weapons. It was then requested that additional cartridge cases be forwarded to the Laboratory for examination from the scene of this murder and by letter dated January 21, 1948, the Bureau advised that as no additional specimens or test cartridge cases had been received in the Laboratory for comparison in this matter, the three cartridge cases previously examined and temporarily retained in the Laboratory were returned to this office and they were subsequently delivered to the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office.

The murder weapon in the SIEGEL killing has never been identified. Special Agent A. E. OSTHOLTHOFF telephoned from the Los Angeles Field Division at 5:30 P.M., August 9, 1946, advising that there is a special investigation being conducted concerning the subject and he is coming to San Francisco either Sunday night or Monday night. The Attorney General has authorized technical and microphone surveillances of this subject.

He is building the Flamingo Hotel, Las Vegas, Nevada, and it is believed that actually this hotel is to be operated by a gambling syndicate as a gambling house, and it is alleged that there is a CPA violation in the construction of this building because the priorities on the building materials are obviously not being made available for the construction of such building at this time. There is an allegation that he received the necessary materials by bribery.

After this inquiry was begun, the CPA at Washington, D.C., sent out an order stopping construction of the hotel, and SIEGEL, of course, is interested in continuing the construction and he is to be given a hearing in San Francisco on Tuesday before CPA. He will be represented by [REDACTED] from Las Vegas. Two others who probably will be in attendance are [REDACTED] of the Dell Webb Construction Company who have the contract to erect the hotel building. Advice has been received that [REDACTED] is making reservations for SIEGEL and himself at least at the Palace Hotel. *b7c*

A check should be made through contacts at the Palace Hotel to determine if the reservations have been made and for the exact time and dates. Thereafter, if technical or microphone surveillances become feasible, the Bureau should be phoned for authority to make such installations on SIEGEL. No surveillances of any of these men are desired, and no contact should be had by this office with CPA. The only thing to work on is to determine if contact or microphone surveillances can be made.

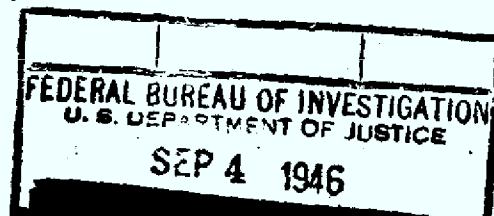

Mr. OSTHOLTHOFF said that while he doubted SIEGEL would leave this area for the time being, in view of the Flamingo Hotel situation, it might well be that VIRGINIA HILL would go. In this regard he stated that, of course, if SIEGEL left, we should place him on a plane and wire ahead to the proper offices to discreetly cover his contacts, and further if VIRGINIA HILL leaves, we should also place her on a plane and wire ahead to the appropriate offices so that a discreet physical surveillance can be placed on her to determine her activities and contacts, in view of the fact they might be pertinent to this matter.

Mr. OSTHOLTHOFF called from Los Angeles at 4:45 PM today advising that information had been received from a reliable confidential source at Los Angeles that SIEGEL is planning to leave Los Angeles this evening, probably on a 6:00 PM plane, for San Francisco, in order to be in San Francisco tomorrow to attend the CPA hearing in connection with the Flamingo Hotel project.

Mr. OSTHOLTHOFF stated that the Los Angeles Office will endeavor to place SIEGEL on the plane and will call this office as soon as it is known just what plane on what airline he is traveling. Mr. OSTHOLTHOFF stated this office should endeavor to give SIEGEL the same coverage on his visit on this occasion as on his previous visit. In this regard he said there is no information available as to what hotel he will stay in in San Francisco, although he recalled that SIEGEL and members of his group stayed at the St. Francis and Palace Hotels during their last visit.

He stated that in the event microphone coverage is placed, of course the Bureau should be advised, even though the Bureau has given blanket authority to make such coverage.

Mr. OSTHOLTHOFF further stated that information has also been received from a reliable confidential source that an individual named [REDACTED] who is apparently an investigator employed by the CPA from Washington, is supposed to have arrived in San Francisco this morning by Western Airlines plane from Las Vegas and Los Angeles and is presently dictating his report on inquiries made by him at Las Vegas concerning the Flamingo Hotel project. He says that SIEGEL has reportedly indicated to an informant at Las Vegas last night that he was trying to figure out some way to get to [REDACTED] b7c
