VERGINIA RILL is a girl who for the past four or five years has received considerable newspaper publicity and notoriety because of the expensive parties she has given and the large amounts of money which she has apparently spent very freely. She has been variously known as "the female Rex St. Gyr" and "the balle of the Bistros". She has been sometimes referred to as a gangster's moll, a Georgia oil heiress, and the paramour of many wealthy and prominent men. It appears, however, from investigation conducted in her home town, Marietta, Georgia, that as a young girl she caused her parents considerable trouble and was constantly being referred to the juvenile authorities.

Around 1940 or 1941 she first came into prominence as previously stated because of the notoriety she began to receive for entertaining lavishly and insisting on paying all the bills at the night clubs. Newspaper accounts have linked her with many prominent movie stars and she is supposed to have received at one time more fan mail than GARY COOPER or BARBARA STANWYCK. As an example of her reputation for spending, several newspapers have carried accounts she has spent over \$70,000 a year in night clubs alone.


