There are enclosed herewith two copies of the affidavit of the information of the Bureau and one copy for the information of the Washington Field Office.

being duly sworn, make the following statement:

On February 28, 1951, Mr. G. Burgess, Secretary of Embassy, of the British Embasy of Washington, D. C., requested me to drive him to Charleston, South Carolina. He advised me that he did not have to be in Charleston until Noon March 1, 1951. We left Washington, D. C. about 9:30 or 10:00 A. M. February 28, 1951, with Mr. Burgess driving a 1941 Lincoln Continental with DPL174 license plates.

Just beyong or South of the Highway Department weighing station at Woodbridge, Virginia, we were stopped by a Virginia State Trooper, whose name I do not know, and he advised Mr. Burgess that we were driving 90 mph. The Trooper recognized Mr. Burgess' immunity and allowed him to continue on with the request that he stay within the speed limit.

When we got about 8 miles North of Ashland we were passing an Army Convoy and were stopped by another Virginia State Trooper and he advised that he had checked us at 80 mph. Again Mr. Burgess' immunity was recognized and we were allowed to proceed with a warning to stay within the speed limit.

We stopped at Ashland and had a Coco-cola and he requested me to drive. I did, and we proceeded South through Petersburg on Route 301. When we were about 10 miles South of Petersburg we were stopped by County Officer County Officer, of the Prince George County police, and being the driver I was charged with speeding at 80 mph.

All during the time Mr. Burgess kept on telling me to step on it. On several occasions I told him that we were going too fast and if we were caught I would have to take the consequences. He told me each time that he would take the responsibility and he had Diplomatic immunity, and all the police would do would be to ask me to slow it down, and we would go on our way.

I am making this trip with Mr. Burgess at his expense. I have been knowing him a long time, several years in fact, and I drive and tow motor cars for Gilbert's Motor Sales, Patterson, N. J. I didn't have anything to do for a couple of days and agreed to go with him on this trip.

We have had numerous calls from English correspondents in the United States and from the wire services on the visit of Sir Percy Sillitoe to the United States. Investigation has reportedly disclosed that the handwriting on these wires was not that of MacLean or Burgess.

Information developed by investigation both in the United States and abroad reflects these men were homosexuals. Guy Burgess, while in the United States, was well known as a homosexual to his associates.



Donald Duart VacLean was born Nay 25, 1913, in England. He is the son of the late Liberal party leader, Sir Donald VacLean. Donald Duart MacLean entered the British Foreign Service on October 11, 1935, serving in the British Foreign Office in London until September 24, 1938. He was then attached to the British Embassy in Paris until June 18, 1940. He thereafter remained in the Foreign Office in London until May 1, 1944, at which time he was transferred to serve in the British Embassy in Rashington, D. C. He remained in Rashington until September 1, 1948. Thereafter he served from November C, 1948, until May, 1950, in the British Embassy in Cairo, Egypt. After allegedly recovering from a breakdown in Cairo he served from October, 1950, until his disappearance on May 25, 1951, with the Foreign Office in Lonion, as the head of the American Department.

With respect to his breaklown in Cairo, Egypt, it has been reported that from about January, 1950, until May, 1950, WacLean was irinking heavily in company with a journalist, In May, 1950, the two men broke into the apartment of two American girls in Cairo and this resulted in MacLean being recalled to London. In London he was under the care of a woman psychiatrist of German origin.

was born July 25, 1916, in the United States and she married Donald Duart MacLean on June 16, 1940, in Paris. She and her mother, Mrs. Melinda Dunbar, are presently in England.

Guy Francis De Moncy Burgess was born April 16, 1911, in England. He attended Cambridge University, reportedly being a Communist while there. From 1934 to 1935 he lectured in history at Trinity College, Cambridge, England. From 1935 to 1938 he was with the British Broadcasting Company engaged in anti-Nazi propaganda work. From 1939 to 1941 he was employed by the British Intelligence organization, From 1941 to 1944 he was again with the British Broadcasting Company. From 1944 to 1946 he had a temporary appointment in the News Department of the Foreign Office in London and was thereafter employed in the private office of the Vinisher of State, Hector DacNeil, until 1948. He then worked from 1948 to 1950 in the Far Eastern

Department of the Foreign Office, and in August, 1950, was transferred to the British Embassy in Washington, D. C. in the Far Eastern Affairs Department. He left the United States on transfer back to England on May 1, 1951. After his return he was called before a board and informed that all chances for further promotion in the British Foreign Service were over. This is reportedly tantamount to dismissal procedure. Burgess' recall from the United States grew out of a letter dated Narch 14, 1951, from Governor Battle of Virginia to the State Department. this letter Covernor Battle called attention to the fact that during Karch, 1951, Guy Burgess and an individual by the name of had been arrested and brought before Judge Binford on a charge of reckless driving.
