

This certificate reflected that GAMBINO was suffering from a heart condition. stated that because of this medical certificate, INS postponed the hearing until October 2, 1958.







Subject appeared before INS Hearing Board 10/2/58 and 11/3/58. During 11/3/58 hearing, subject complained of chest pains and was taken to Flower - Fifth Avenue Hospital, Fifth Avenue and 101st Street, NYC. Subject since the 11/3/58 hearing has not appeared before Immigration officials. Subject's attorney EDWARD J. ENNIS has indicated that he would be willing to go ahead with subject's deportation hearing without subject actually being present. Information regarding subject's brothers JOSEPH and PAUL GAMBINO set forth. Because of poor health, subject has not returned to his employment and will not do so until mid-January, 1959.

#### PERSONAL HISTORY AND BACKGROUND

#### Citizenship Status

Investigative Unit, Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS), 70 Columbus Avenue, New York City, advised on October 2, 1958, that the subject's scheduled INS hearing was indefinitely postponed. According to the subject was admitted to Flower-Fifth Avenue Hospital, New York City on September 29, 1958, with a cardiac condition. According to the subject's doctor, ALPHONSO A. LOMBARDI, told that the subject was "a sick man" and would be in the hospital at least ten days. On November 4, 1958, advised that during the INS hearing on November 3, 1958, the subject complained of chest pains. that because of the subject's past heart condition, an ambulance was ordered by Immigration officials. Oxygen was administered to the subject by an ambulance attendent upon its arrival at INS. went on to say that the subject has been in and out of the Flower-Fifth Avenue Hospital with his heart condition since early November, 1958.





Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) reportedly obtained on November 25, 1957, a warrant for the arrest of Carlo Gambino charging him with violation of Section 241Al of INS Act of December 29, 1952, with an order to show cause why he should not be deported and charging Gambino as being a National of Italy who entered the United States on December 23, 1921, at Norfolk, Virginia, as a stowaway on the "SS Vincenzo Florio." Gambino was served with a deportation warrant on August 6, 1958, and posted a \$10,000 bond. He was released until September 3, 1958, when INS scheduled a hearing, but on that day the hearing was postponed because of Gambino's health. (INS)

An article entitled "Apalachin Figure is Ill At Hearing," appearing in the "New York Times" of November 4, 1958, reports that Carlo Gambino was taken ill at the start of his INS deportation hearing, November 3, 1958. The article relates that Gambino was taken in a wheel chairfrom the hearing room at INS, 70 Columbus Avenue, New York City, to an ambulance and was subsequently admitted to the Flower-Fifth Avenue Hospital, New York City, where he had previously been treated for heart trouble.

The "New York Daily Mirror" of November 15, 1957, contains an article wherein it states that "62 top leaders of the dreaded Mafia, ruling crime syndicate of the US, were on November 14, 1957, during a top-echelon conclave called to deal with mounting official pressure on their lucrative strangle hold on the nation's purse." According to the article, the meeting was held at Apalachin, New York, and Gambino was present at this meeting.

John T. Cusack, District Supervisor, Bureau of Narcotics, testified before the New York State Joint Legis-lative Committee on Government Operations on January 9, 1958, at Albany, NewYork, regarding the meeting held at Apalachia, New York, on November 14, 1957. He testified relative to Carlo Gambino and his brother, Paul (Gambino), stating, among other things, that in 1948 the Gambinos were reported to exercise control of the narcotic smuggling activities between the Pafia element in Italy and in the United States on behalf of Salvatore Luciano.

It was reported that Gambino's son, Thomas, is married to the daughter of Thomas Luchose, also known as "Three Finger Brown," a well-known New York hoodlum. (Subject's INS file 5451526)

EVERETT STRAPP, Assistant Chief Investigator, Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS), 70 Columbus Avenue, New York City, advised SA on December 6, 1957, that CARLO GAMBINO entered the United States on December 23, 1921, at Norfolk, Virginia, as a stowaway aboard the SS VINCENZO FLORIO.

According to Mr. STRAPP, a warrant of arrest was issued on November 13, 1936, against GAMBINO, charging entry at a port subsequent to July 28, 1935, at which time he was not in possession of a visa. On January 21, 1937, the warrant which was issued on November 13, 1936, was cancelled by an authorized officer.





## C. Associates

The "New York Daily Mirror" of November 15, 1957, contains an article wherein it states that "62 top leaders of the dreaded Mafia, ruling crime syndicate of the United States", were grabbed by Federal Agents, State Police, and County officers on November 14, 1957, during a top-echelon conclave called to deal



with mounting official pressure on their lucrative stranglehold on the nation's purse. According to the article, the meeting was held at Apalachin, New York, in Tioga County. There were present hoodlums from New York, New Jersey, Ohio, California, Puerto Rico, Cuba, and other points. CARLO GAMBINO was present at this meeting.

JOHN T. CUSACK, District Supervisor, Bureau of Narcotics, testified before the New York State Joint Legislative Committee on Government Operations on January 9, 1958, at Albany, New York, regarding the meeting held at Apalachin, New York, on November 14, 1957. He testified that the Bureau of Narcotics became particularly interested in this meeting as reports from Apalachin indicated that at least three narcotic violators of major importance were present.

The following is an excerpt of a portion of CUSACK's testimony concerning GAMBINO:

## "CARLO GAMBINO

"FBI number 334450, New York City Police Department B Number 12876.

"CARLO GAMBINO and his brother, PAUL (GAMBINO), have long been known to the Bureau of Narcotics as important leaders in the Mafia and intimate associates of SALVATORE LUCANIA, with alias, 'Lucky' Luciano.

"During the spring of 1948, reliable information obtained from a Bureau of Narcotics source indicated that CARLO GAMBINO travelled clandestinely to Palermo, Sicily, where he joined his brother, PAUL (GAMBINO), who had fled to Italy to avoid prosecution in a Federal alcohol tax case. The GAMBINOS were reported to exercise control of the narcotic smuggling activities between the Mafia element in Palermo and the United States on behalf of SALVATORE LUCANIA and during 1948, both GAMBINO brothers met with LUCANIA at the home of their relatives in Palerm Sicily.



"Investigation conducted by the Bureau of Narcotics after 30 some odd Sicilian aliens had been smuggled into the United States aboard the SS Panormus at the Port of Philadelphia during May, 1948, disdosed that CARLO GAMBINO was involved in the smuggling of these aliens and that some of these aliens in turn had smuggled substantial quantities of heroin into the United States as payment for being brought into the country.

"Investigation further developed the information that among those interested in the smuggling of these aliens was a representative of the Santo Sorge Trading Company, 196 First Avenue, New York City. This company is operated by Santo Sorge, an intimate associate of SALVATORE LUCANIA, and it will be recalled that immediately prior to his apprehension at the Apalachin meeting JOSEPH BONANNO was observed at Palermo, Sicily, in the company of Santo Sorge".

### D. Criminal Activities

## 1. Illicit Alcohol

On January 17, 1958, Widener Building, Alcohol Tax Tobacco Unit (ATTU), Widener Building, Philadephia, Pennsylvania, made available to SA their file on the subject reflecting that he was arrested for violation of Internal Revenue Laws of the United States involving the sale of non-tax paid alcohol.

The subject was arrested with nine other individuals and their Criminal Docket Number 7607, in United States District Court, Federal Building, New York City, a reflected that the subject was tried, found guilty May 1, 1939. On January 31, 1940, United States Court of Appeals reversed the judgment and ordered a new trial.

On June 9, 1941, subject was again tried, was found guilty on June 12, 1941, sentenced to pay fine of \$1,000.00, sentence of one year suspended, probation five years June 17, 1941. The sentence was amended for imprisonment of term eleven months and 29 days suspended.

The files of ATTU, New York City, as reviewed in December, 1957, under case number 4215M, reflected that the subject and 29 others were indicted in the Eastern District of New York, in connection with a bootleg alcohol operation. The indictments were subsequently dismissed on February 7, 1940, when it was conceded by the United States Attorney that the indictments were based on wire tapping evidence.



ATTU file 1798M reflected that in 1947, the subject was involved in a civil case in the Eastern District of New York, in which the United States was suing the subject and others to recover over a million dollars in unpaid taxes on alcohol manufactured illegally during the years 1931-1933.

### DETAILS:

#### Present W..ereabouts

On April 18, 1961, Hearing Examiner, Immigration and Naturalization Service, New York City, that the subject had advised SA returned to New York City from a Florida vacation on March 16, 1961, and was residing at his home, 2230 Ocean Parkway, Brooklyn, New York.

advised SA On May 22, 1901, that the subject continues to reside at 2230 Ocean Parkway, Brooklyn, New York, however, GAMBINO has purchased a summer home at 34 Club Drive, Massapequa, Long Island, and he intents to reside there during the summer months.

#### Status of Health

On April 14, 1961, made available to SA the following medical records for the subject which had been prepared by GAMBINO's physician ALFONSO A.-LOMBARDI, M.D.:

### Department of Radiology

Part Examined: <u>Carvical Spine</u> November 28, 1960

Examination of the carvical spine was made in multiple projections. There is noted diffuse hypertropic changes throughout the carvical spine, particularly at the level of the sixth and seventh carvical vertebrae. The intervartebral disc spaces are normal, as well as the interpedicular distances. There is no other evidence of osteal or periosteal pathology. There is noted some straightening of the normal carvical lordosis.

### Electrocardiogram: November 2, 1960

Sinus rhythm, rate 74.

Grade I AV Block: PR-2 equals 0.24 sec.

Right BB Block of broad Sl type with some right axis deviation. There are typical changes including evidence of late activation in the chest leads on the right. Also the R waves become smaller from V2 to V3 till finally they are quite small and low in position in V4. This would suggest ischemic damage which is presumably interior but an old condition.

Evidence of myocardial abnormality: 2 plus to 3 plus. Infarction: A coronary background is probable as noted before: see above.

Electrocardiogram: November 3, 1960

Sinus rhythm, rate 80-82. As compared to the record of November 2, 1960: In the earlier record there is a slight degree of Grade I AV Block with PR-2 averaging 0,24 sec. Today I find one complex with a PR interval as short as 0.20 sec. but others vary up to 0.26 sec. and seem to average 0.22 sec. I believe that AV conduction is subnormal and the condition is about the same.

Again there is right BB Block of broad Sl type with some right axis deviation and again these features seem about the same, as they were before. Again there are low R waves in V4 particularly which strangly suggest a coronary background as I do not believe these can be explained as incidental to the zone of transition although that could be a factor. The patient is getting digitalis but I do not note any changes due to the drug which can be identified specifically. Evidence of myocardial abnormality: 2 plus to 3 plus. Infarction: A coronary background is probably as noted before but I am unable to see changes which might suggest an active process. However we must remember that any form of BB Block might mask such a process.

### Electrocardiogram: November 9, 1960

Sinus rhythm, rate 82-85. There is a moderate degree of right axis deviation. Heart block of 2 kinds is present: Grade I AV Block as PR-2 equals 0.22-0.24 sec. This might be due in part to digitalis but has been present earlier and suggests some damage in the septal region. Right BB Block of broad Sl type was first recorded in this series of records on July 12, 1960. The preceeding record of March 2, 1960 did not slow right BB Block. However the previous records do give evidence of arteriosclerotic heart disease with coronary changes and a diagnosis of antaroseptal infarction was made at one time in 1959.

Some damage in the septal region is probably involving both the main stem and the Right BB Branch. However the presence of right axis deviation with a right BB Block is further abnormality and might be evidence of some tight sided strain. As compared to November 3, 1960: I believe there is a little more sagging of the RS-T segment in II and again in AVF which presumably is a digitalis effect. Chest leads show minor differences but the overall pattern is about the same. Evidence of myocardial abnormality: 2 plus - 3 plus: Heart block of two types due to degenerative arteriosclerotic diseases including coronary changes.

### Electrocardiogram: November 16, 1960

Sinus rhythm rate 66-70. There is no definite axis deviation. PR-2 equals 0.22 sec. Grade I AV Block: Right BB Block of broad 31 type. Some evidence of a digitalis effect, presumably responsible for instances for the lowering of RS-T Also the drug probably makes some of the T waves a little smaller than they otherwise would be. Chest leads from the right show the characteristic evidence of late activation of the right ventricle. Beyond this the chest leads on the left show a little more depression of RS-T and T in V5 and V6 which is presumably a drug effect. Infarction: A coronary background would appear probably but cannot be proven by this record. Evidence of myocardial abnormality: 2 plus - 3 plus.

### Electrocardiogram: November 22, 1960

Sinus rhythm, rate 90. AV conduction is normal; PR-2 equals 0.20 sec. which may be relatively long for this dominant rate but still is technically within the normal range. There is right axis deviation with right BB Block of broad Sl type.

As compared to the last record of November 16, 1960: In the standard limb leads the R wave is smaller in II and the S wave broader with a different type of slurring and lowering of the RS-T segments. However, the patient is getting digitalis which might account for this RS-T depression. Two ventricular extra-systoles are recorded in III.

The augmented limb leads do not show any new change except in AVF where the QRS group is smaller and the RS-T segment still depressed and here again we may suspect digitalis.

In the chest leads we do note changes with more definite elevation of BS-T in V2 and V3 although in V3 the T wave is more definitely upright. Beyond this the broad S waves are seen in V5 and V6 but are simply characteristic of the right BB Block. Depression of RS-T in V6 may again be due to digitalis.

- The BB Block in this case developed some time between March 2nd, 1960 and July 22, 1960 and this development during a period of observation is strong evidence of degenerative heart disease and not the simple benign type of Right BB Block which we find in routine health examinations in subjects otherwise apparently normal. Depression of the T waves in chest leads from the last is of course incidental to the BB Block of this type. Also elevation of RS-T seems to have been a fairly constant feature in V2 and V3 and this series and is not a fresh development since November 16, 1960 although it seems to be getting more marked. This has a rather coronary appearance and might point to subandocardial or anterior ischemic damage but as it is not entirely a new finding, we must be cautious in assigning significance to it.
- 3. The low RS-T segment would rather suggest coronary insufficiency or subandocardial ischemia but here we are dealing with digitalis administration which could well account for this change.

The record is changing and seems to be coming more slurred with lower amplitude in some leads and this gives the impression of an acute degenerated change. Nothing is entirely typical because largely of the BB Block but an acute process which probably is chiefly anterior is suggested. Evidence of myocardial abnormality: 3 plus to 4 plus. Infarction: An acute coronary process would appear quite possible if not probable and may well be anterior in location.

Electrocardiogram: November 28, 1960

Sinus rhythm, rate 82-85.
Grade I AV Block: PR-2 equals 0.23 sec.
There is a little right axis deviation.
The overall appearance of this record is fairly similar to the last one of November 22nd and includes particularly the changes due to right BB Block of broad Sl type. At present we may note the following:

The PR interval was normal on November 22nd and is now prolonged up to 0.23 sec., a slight degree of Grade I AV Block. However PR time of 0.22 sec. Was noted on November 15th. In any event this could well be a digitalis effect but the patient is getting more digitalis day by day and actually prolongation of PR up to 0.24 sec. was seen earlier in this series. Therefore a damage in the septal region would appear probable.

Today depression of RS-T in II seems less marked although this was apparently a drug effect and would be expected to continue.

In the chest leads from the right side from the characteristic changes due to right BB Block we note that less elevation of R3-T especially in V2 but also in V3. This would suggest that we are dealing with a coronary change that is improving, presumably some anterior or subandocardial ischemia. Beyond this the T waves are rather smaller than they were in V5 and V6 with a low RS-T in V6 but here again of course digitalis would account for what we see.

We are dealing with degenerative heart disease including:

- A. The appearance of right BB Block under observation as noted before.
- B. Changes in AV conduction which seem to vary although digitalis has been given constantly and therefore some damage of the septal region would appear probable.
- C. Changes in the RS-T level in chest leads from the right which hardly can be accounted for by other conditions although digitalis might confuse the issue here but some anterior ischemic condition would appear probable.
- D. A drug effect which in general is rather less now than before except in V5 and V6.

Electrocardiogram: December 5, 1960

Sinus rnythm, rate 72. Grade I AV Block: PR-2 equals 0.22 - 0.24 sec.

There is a tendency to right axis deviation.

As compared to November 25th, 1960.

In the standard limb leads we still see the broad S waves in I and II related to the right BB Block observed before. In the augmented limb leads the general contour is the same as it was.

In the chest leads we have a typical of late activation in VI and beyond this. There is still some elevation of RS-T in V2 and even in V3 but less than it was on November 22nd, and here I suspect that we are dealing with a coronary change. Whether or not it has come down as the result of digitalis or natural evolution cannot of course be determined but as noted, I have suspected some ischemic damage anterior in location. Beyond this the chest leads seem to be fairly similar to what they were and the same remarks apply to this record as noted in regard to the preceeding one. Evidence of myocardial abnormality: 2 plus to 3 plus.

Electrocardiogram: December 13, 1960

Auricular rate 83 ventriculare rate 83 sinus rhythm PR-0.22 QRS-0.12

Abnormal deflections: Q waves: Q in V1, V2, V3 and V4. T waves:

lead I broad S in I, II AVL, V4 through V6. lead II T positive in I, II, AVL. Flat or inverted in other limb leads.

lead III T inverted in V1 through V4, Diphasic in V5 and V6.

Evidence of myocardial abnormality: 1. Atrial ventricular block. Prolonged PR-1st.

2. Right BB Block.

3. Anterior septal wall infarction, most probably old.

Biochemistry: November 2, 1960 transaminase 30 units. blood glucose 117

Sedimentation rate: November 2, 1960 one hour 10 min.

The records further reflected that on November 1, 1960, Mr. GAMBINO was readmitted into the Flower and Fifth Avenue Hospital because of chest pain. A rather extensive study was done to determine the etiology of this chest pain and serial electrocardiograms demonstrated definite impairment to the circulation in his heart with progressive damage to the muscles of his heart indicating degeneration in his general cardiac status. The patient was treated in the same fashion that one would treat an acute occlusion, however, this probably was more of a slowly progressive sclerotic obliteration of his left coronary vessal. He was dismissed on December 17, 1960, and advised to continue with his extremely restricted physical program.

On January 9, 1961, he was seen again in the office at which time his condition had shown some further improvementand he was advised to spend his winter in a warmer climate. The patient left for Florida at that time. At present, he is still there and I am sure that his condition isstill one necessitating a guarded prognosis as to the future.

also furnished the medical report prepared by the United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare, Public Health Service Hospital, Staten Island, New York, were GAMBINO was admitted for cardiac evaluation on August 18, 1960. The report reflects the following:

#### Diagnoses in this case are:

- 1. Arteriosclerotic heart disease
- 2. Congestive heart failure, compensated at present
- 3. Angina pectoris syndrome
- 4. Diabetes mellitus, controlled by diet

Regarding your questions about whether Mr. GAMBINO can take part in deportation proceedings; it is our opinion that he may be served papers and interrogated without much risk to the patient. It is possible that under the condition of emotional excitement, Mr. GAMBINO will have episodes of angina pectoris pain. These can be readily controlled by the patient taking nitroglycerin tablets. We suggest that the hearings be neld as informally as possible and that the questioning period be no more than 20 to 30 minutes in length with a short rest interval between each questioning period. If Mr. GAMBINO would take a nitroglycerin prior to the questioning period he may have less difficulty with his anginal pain. A very small risk does exist that if the patient were to become severely agitated, he might have a myocardial infarction.



On May 22, 1961, advised SA that Doctor LOMBARDI, the subject's physician, had advised against recalling GAMBINO before an Immigration and Naturalization Service hearing board. Doctor LOMBARDI's statement in part is as follows:

Considering Mr. GAMBINO's generally poor condition, I would strongly advise against any such readmission and reinvestigation. As you know, he apparently was thoroughly investigated for quite some time at the Public Health Hospital only recently in August, 1960. After his discharge from the hospital after that investigation, his chest pain, cardiac status and general condition worsened to a degree requiring further hospitalization soon after, under my care, at the Flower and Fifth Avenue Hospital for a period of almost two months until December, 1960.

For a time during this cardiac attack, the outcome as far as his life was concerned was in doubt. My previous reports to you have indicated that his prognosis is poor and his life expectancy is indeed very limited. His poor condition can be easily affected by any emotion or physical strain.

It is my opinion that any such readmission for reinvestigation should be avoided if at all possible, as it would increase his anxiety and possibly cause further physical deterioration or harm.
