 Carlo Gambino, Federal Bureau of Investigation number 334450, New York City Police Department number B-128750 was born September 1; 1902 in Sicily, and currently resides at 2230 Ocean Perkway, Brooklyn, New York, and 34 Club Drive; Massapegua, Long Island, New York: He has an sarrast record dating back to 1930 which includes arrests for violations of the sicohol tax laws and confidence game: he was an attendee at the 1957 Apalachin assting of notorious hoodlums. On October 8, 1963, Joseph Valachi in public testimony terore the Fermanent Subcommittee on Investigations of the Committee on Government Operations, United States Senate, stated that Carlo Gambino was the "boss" of one of the New York "femilies" of "La Cosa Nostra."

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

BUSINESS LEADERS USED MAFIA FIRM

Gambino Has Third Share in Labor Relations Concern

By CHARLES GRUTZNER

A new investigation of the dealings of Carlo (Don Carlos) Gambino, head of a major Mafia group here, has found that some industrial and business companies are clients of a labor relations firm of which Gambino owns a third.

The other partners in S.G.S. Associates, Inc., which operates out of a small office at 141 East 44th Street, are Henry H. Saltzstein, a convicted burglar and bookmaker, and George Schiller, about whom little is known,

Among the clients and former clients are Wellington Associates, owners of the Chrysler Building and the largest acquirers of real estate in the metropolitan area in recent years; William J. Levitt, most of whose massive building operations have been with nonunion labor; Flower and Fifth Avenue Hospitals, Howard Clothes, Bond Clothes, and the Concord Hotel at Lake Kiamesha, N. Y.

Other clients here and in New Jersey, Pennsylvania and other parts of the East have brought S.G.S. billings to an estimated \$500,000 a year.

The current investigation of 8.G.S. Associates by the Federal Bureau of Investigation is an outgrowth of two continuing inquiries by United States Attorney Robert M. Morgenthau. Two Federal grand juries are questioning witnesses about the five local Mafia or C. Nosila, Tambies here. A time

is <u>delving</u>, into <u>labor-manage</u>ment racketeering.

Several S.G.S. clients, who confirmed that they had been questioned by F.B.I. agents recently, said they had been unaware that the G. in the firm name stood for Gambino. They said they had ended their contracts, or were about to do so, after learning of the Mafia connection.

Most of those interviewed said they had dealt with Saltzstein. Some described his role as "adviser on labor policy," and said he had negotiated with unions when strikes occurred or were imminent.

Mr. Morgenthau, asked about the new inquiry, said only that, he was "continuing to explore all phases of Mafia activity and of labor racketeering by management or unions." He declined to comment on the specifics of the S.G.S. investigation.

There have been at least five investigations of S.G.S. by Federal, state and local agencies in recent years, none of which resulted in criminal charges against the corporation or its principals.

Investigations were conducted by District Attorney Frank S. Hogan, the F.B.I., the Senate rackets investigating committee headed by John L. McClellan, Democrat of Arkansas; by former United States Attorney Paul W. Williams, and by the New York-New Jersey Waterfront Commission.

Gambino Expected to Quit

The renewed Federal interest, including an investigation by the Internal Revenue Service, is understood to be one reason for the expected early resignation of Gambino as a partner and treasurer of S.G.S.

The other reason is the worsening of Gambino's heart ailment, which has brought him a succession of delays in deportation proceedings.

Born in Palermo, Sicily, in 1902, Gambino entered the United States illegally as a stowaway in 1921. The Government

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began deportation proceedings in 1957 after Gambino achieved national notoriety as a delegate to the convention of underworld leaders at Apalachin, N.Y.

The latest report on Gambino's health was received this week by the Immigration and Naturalization Service from the United States Public Health Service Hospital at Stapleton, S.I., where the gang chieftain underwent examinations and observation from March 29 to April 9.

Sol Marks, deputy district director of the immigration service, said the hospital report said Gambino's life would be endangered if he had to attend depor-

tation hearings.
"The decision is not to go ahead with hearings at this time," said Mr. Marks. Another medical examination may be required in about six months.

Anastasia's Successor

Some police officials expressed the belief that the Mafia boss, who will be 63 on Aug. 24, broken in health and tired of repeated investigations, would retire also from active leadership of the crime family he inherited from Albert Anastasia his predecessor, in 1957. Yesterday the name "Carlo

Gambino" remained in gold let-ters between those of Mr. Schiller and Saltzstein under the legend "S.G.S. Associates Public & Labor Relations" on the door of Room 1002 at 141 East 44th Street. The office was

closed all day.

William Levitt, the builder, said through a spokesman: "We learned about a month ago that the 'G.' in the firm name was Carlo Gambino. We have since been informed that Mr. Gambino will sever his relationship in the very near future.'

Mr. Levitt, one of the bestpaying customers of S.G.S., has been dealing with Saltzstein since 1952 and reportedly is paying \$7,000 a month. Mr. Levitt once said in an interview: "I'm not against unions, I just think we can build houses faster without them."

Alfred S. Levitt, a brother, who operates separately, is a former client of S.G.S. Morton Wexler, vice president of Levitt House, Inc., Alfred Levitt's latest development in Central Islip, L. I., said his company had first hired S.G.S. as labor on sultant during construction of the original Levitt House (serve sols and renamed Le Havre) in Beechhurst, Queens,

This 62 year old white male was admitted for medical evaluation at the request of the Immigration Service. Patient has a long

history of arteriosclerotic heart disease with anginal episodes since 1948. Myocardial infarctions have occurred in 1949, 1954, 1955, 1958, and 1963. In 1957, the patient had an internal mammary artery ligation for relief of his auginal symptoms while at the Flower Fifth Avenue Hosrital. Since that time. the patient has had several episodes of documented congestive heart failure with severe angina. He was first evaluated in this hospital in August 1960. In 1962, while at this hospital, his medications included disbetic oral hypoglycemic agents, in addition to his digitalis and diuretic therapy. The patient's anginal symptoms increased in 1963 with symptoms appearing after walking 1/2 block. In addition, the patient stated at that time he had frequent nocturnal angina. This pain was associated with shortness of breath and bilateral arm radiation and was relieved by nitroglycerin tablets. During the patient's last hospitalization in Sept. of 1963, he developed precordial chest pain while waiting for an EKG to be taken. This was followed by EKG evidence of currents of injury with transaminase elevations occurring one week later. Impression of suspected acute myocardial infarction was made at that time, although there were no Q wave changes. Patient states that he presently has anginal symptoms occurring after walking and nocturnally. Patient has symptoms after eating a meal, at which time he is unable to walk for approximately 1-14 hours. Anginal pains also occur nocturnally and after the patient walks several blocks slowly unassociated with meals. Some intermittent ankle edema has been noted. At present, the patient is taking approximately 10-15 nitroglycerin tablets per 24-hour period, with relief of his symptomatology.

PHYSICAL EXAMINATION:

Well nourished, well hydrated white male in no acute distress. The patient is noted to ambulate slowly. Blood pressure 130/70; pulse

86 per minute, regular; respirations 16 per minute. H.E.R.N.T. - Pupils equal and respond to light and accommodation. Sclerae were clear. No lid lag or nystagmus was present. Fundi were physiologic with minimal AV nicking present. The thyroid was not enlarged. There was no cervical vein distention or cervical adenopathy present. Lungs were clear to auscultation and percussion, except for some decreased breath sounds in the left base posteriorly. Heart revealed a regular sinus rhythm. A Grade I/VI ejection systolic murmur was present at the sortic area with no radiation. The PMI was not palpable. There was no cardiomegaly to percussion. Heart sounds were generally decreased. A2 was greater than P2. Abdominal examination

was physiologic with no masses or viscoromegaly apparent. Bilateral flank scars were noted. There was no CVA tenderness on examination of the back. Genitalia examination was normal. Extremitics revealed good radial and dorsalis pedia pulses bilaterally. Posterior tibial pulses were fir bilaterally. There was no pretibial edema, clubbing, or varicosities present. Neurologic emamination was physiologic, except for some decrease in vibratory sensation over both lower extremities.

LAB AND X-RAY EXAMINATIONS:

Hematocrit 47, WBC 10,900, sedimentation rate 11. Serum electrolytes included a CO2 of 34.5 meq/L. Chlorides 95, sodium

140, potassium 3.8, calcium 10.2, phosphorus 2.9, and uric acid 6.7. Urinalysis was unremarkable. Serology was non-reactive. Serum cholesterol was reported as 301 mgmZ. Liver function studies were essentially normal. Chest x-ray was unchanged from previous admission. EKG was essentially unchanged from previous tracing taken at this hospital on 2/7/64. The present EKG showed evidence of a right bundle branch block with, old anterior myocardial infarction. In addition, a first degree AV block was present. Non-specific ST and T wave changes of ischemia and/or digitalis effect were also apparent.

COURSE IN HOSPITAL:

The patient continued to have recurring episodes of angina, requiring approximately 10-20 nitroglycerin teblets per day. At no

time during the hospitalization did he appear to be in acute distress. The patient did state on one occasion experiencing moderate anginal pain shortly after another patient on the ward had suffered from an acute myocardial infarction with cardiac arrest. During that episode, patient was present while the other patient was having external cardine massage and resuscitation attempted. All the other patients, including Mr. Gambino, were asked to leave the ward at that time. It was only later in the day that the patient stated he had experienc precordial chest pain during the episode. It was felt that the rationt had reached maximm evaluation & this time and was fit for discharge.

- 1. Arteriosclerotic heart disease.
- 2. Anginal syndrome, secondary to \$1.
- 3. Diabetes mellitus.
- 4. Chronic congestive heart failure.

Dear Mr. Esperdy:

Mr. Carlo Gambino was hospitalized at this facility from March 29, 1965 to April 2, 1965 for medical evaluation. A copy of the hospital surmary will be forwarded under separate cover.

With regard to your request in letter dated February 2, 1965, as to "the precautions and safeguards that may be set up in order to permit the alien to testify with minimum danger to his life," the following recommendations are made:

- 1) Hearing time should be limited to one or two hours per week.
- 2) The hearings should be as informal as possible and interrogation should be carried out for no more than 20-30 minutes at a time, with rest periods between questioning.
- 3) The preliminary use of nitroglycerin by the patient is advised.
- 4) Oxygen should be available.
- 5) If the patient experiences symptoms during the proceedings, interrogation should be discontinued.
- 6) A physician should be in attendance during the hearings.



Carlo Gambino was born September 1, 1902, Palermo, Sicily, Italy, to Tommaso and Felicia Castellano Gambino, immigrated to the United States in December, 1921, as a stow-away, and re-entered in July, 1935. He has resided in the New York City area since that time. The Immigration and Naturalization Service of the United States Department of Justice obtained warrant for the arrest of Carlo Gambino on November 25, 1957, charging that he show cause why he should not be deported. He is free on bail at the present time and deportation proceedings have been held up due to the state of Gambino's health.

He was examined by the United States Public Health Service Mospital, most recently on September 27-30, 1965, at which time his final diagnoses indicated arteriosclerotic heart disease, angina pectoris, diabetes mellitus, and chronic congestive heart failure.

He presently resides with his wife, Kathryn Gambino nee Castellano, at 2230 Ocean Parkway, Brooklyn, New York, but also maintains a residence which is used primarily in the summer months at 34 Club Drive, Massapequa, Long Island, New York. He was last employed as a labor relations consultant for the partnership, S.G.S. Associates, 141 East 44th Street, New York, New York.

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Carlo Gambino

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Federal Bureau of Investigation Number 334-450, has an arrest record dating back to 1930, including arrests for confidence game, violations of the Alcohol Tax Laws, and for attendance at the Apalachin conclave in November, 1957, of notorious hoodlums.

He has been described as the "boss" of one of the New York "families" of La Cosa Nostra and successor to Vincent Mangano and Albert Anastasia in this position

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
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
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
