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In connection with the above-mentioned Abco Vending Company, the "Newark Star Ledger" on December 19, 1957, carried an article stating that CARMINE GALANTE, a Brooklyn racketeer, had a direct line from the Abco Vending Company to the West New York Police Headquarters. In connection with this allegation, Police Chief FREDERICK ROOS of the West New York Police Department stated, "I know it (the line) doesn't exist now and I never knew of it existing." He did state there was a burglar alarm system from Abco to Police Headquarters when he was a Captain. ROOS stated the alarm had been discontinued

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since the firm moved out of West New York some six months ago.

The Newark Office advised that it had been determined that Abco had moved from West New York and was now known as the Star Novelty Company, 501 New York Avenue, Union City, New Jersey, telephone number Union 6-6575.

A local newspaper reported that CHARLES A. DOWD of the New Jersey Bell Telephone Company testified before the NJLEC that the burglar alarm connecting the Abco Vending Company with the West New York Police Department was a non-talking hookup, but admitted that a signaling device could be placed at either end.

It was [REDACTED] opinion that GALANTE was responsible for the murder of TRESKA and that investigation was being continued in hopes that sufficient evidence might be obtained to bring this matter to trial.

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On September 7, 1955, United States Treasury Agent [REDACTED] made inquiries at the New York State Parole Office concerning GALANTE. They were attempting to verify a suspicion that he was engaged in operations giving him particularly large income and thus invalidate his income tax reports which had been submitted.

This official was quoted as saying, "We have every reason to believe that GALANTE may be planning to move into the operations of Havana's Sans Souci gambling concession".

In the "New York Daily Mirror", dated January 11, 1958, an article appeared in connection with the investigation being conducted by the New York Legislative "Watchdog" Committee. It was reported that investigators had said that GALANTE had been reported to have left the United States for Italy, but that the Interior Ministry at Rome had said an extended check had failed to show his entry.

The "New York Herald Tribune", dated January 8, 1958, carried an article stating that GALANTE was believed to have fled to Italy, where he could enlist the aid of LUCKY LUCIANO for whom he used to run narcotics in Harlem.

The "New York Times", on January 11, 1958, reported that GALANTE was reported to have fled from the Apalachin meeting, possibly to Italy, but that Interior Ministry sources in Rome had said an extended check had failed to produce any evidence that he was in that country.

X. ARMED AND DANGEROUS

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b7D On [REDACTED] Brooklyn,
New York, advised SA [REDACTED] that he became acquainted
with GALANTE in 1930, at the time of GALANTE's arrest for an
attempted holdup. He stated that two other individuals were
also involved in this holdup, and GALANTE stayed behind and
shot it out with arresting officers, permitting the other two

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individuals to escape. He stated that from his experience with GALANTE at this time and the information he has learned since then, he considers GALANTE to be a vicious killer with no emotions whatsoever. He added that since GALANTE's involvement in the murder of CARLO TRESCA and the fact that he refused to talk concerning this, he began his rise in the criminal underworld to where he now occupies the position of a trusted lieutenant.

He stated that GALANTE is the type who would be given such an assignment as the murder of ALBERT ANASTASIA, which was committed in October, 1957. He based this opinion on the fact that no matter what illegal activities GALANTE might be caught in or charged with, he has the reputation of not talking.

IN VIEW OF THE FACT THAT GALANTE IS KNOWN TO HAVE CARRIED FIREARMS IN THE PAST, TO HAVE SHOT AT LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS ATTEMPTING TO APPREHEND HIM, AND IN VIEW OF HIS LONG CRIMINAL RECORD FOR ASSAULT AND ROBBERY, HE SHOULD BE CONSIDERED ARMED AND EXTREMELY DANGEROUS.

In view of conflicting information as to Galante's background as shown in rerep, additional investigation should be conducted to definitely resolve his date and place of birth. He uses the first name of Carmine but the birth record found by you is under the first name of Camille. Although such a situation is not unusual, it may be possible that the subject is claiming a birth record not his own but may be of a deceased younger brother. It is noted that at age 28 he made a statement appearing in parole records that his family had been in this country 24 years. Also if his 1910 birth record is correct, he would have been sentenced to Sing Sing Prison at age 17 for a crime committed when he was 18. This is also possible but in view of the fact that the State of New York had in existence at that time reformatories and other detention places for youthful offenders, the situation indicates a possibility that subject was older than his claimed birth date would indicate.

In conducting further investigation, it is suggested that complete records be obtained, if available, of the entry of subject's parents into this country showing the children, if any, accompanying them. School records may also be obtained to determine statements made with regard to the subject's age and place of birth at the time he entered school. You may also desire to make a further check of Vital Statistics records to determine if there is a death record of a Camille Galante, born 2/21/10.

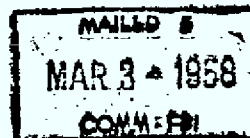

On page 41 of rerep, information is set out with reference to a note found on the person of the late Salvatore Tornabe when he was in attendance at the meeting at Apalachin, New York, 11/14/57. Certain analyses have been made of the significance of this note at the Bureau and in your office. From deductions made by you, it appears that the beginning words indicate that Tornabe was to call [redacted] and then was to get together with or in touch with the subject on Monday, November 11, 1957, possibly by telephone at the home of Joseph Barbara, Apalachin. Then it appears that subject may have gone to the airport motel to provide transportation for [redacted] and [redacted] on Thursday morning, 11/14/57. Also it is possible from the note that [redacted] Newark top hoodlum [redacted] was to have provided transportation for two individuals designated in the note as [redacted] and [redacted] that appears to be a telephone number, [redacted] [redacted] the name [redacted]. It is possible that Tornabe was to tell [redacted] that the latter was expected to take [redacted] and [redacted] to Apalachin. The last item on the note was for Tornabe to get in touch with one [redacted] on Saturday, possibly 11/16/57. New York Office is presently conducting investigation on the possibility that the [redacted] to be contacted by Tornabe was identical with a person at one time in business with [redacted]

Because of the nature of the note, mentioned above, logical investigation requires first that some speculation be given as to the note's significance. It is believed that investigation should be conducted on the basis of the analyses made and the theories expressed. It is pointed out to you that [redacted] when located and interviewed may be able to furnish information with regard to Tornabe's attendance at the Apalachin meeting, perhaps some information as to the purpose. Also investigation should be conducted to identify [redacted] and [redacted] with the same purpose in mind. Since Tornabe is no longer living, you should consider the desirability of contacting members of his family, any employees he may have had, or other persons in a position to give any information of value as to the possibility that Tornabe was given "assignments" with regard to the Apalachin meeting. Efforts should be made to develop the identity of the person from whom Tornabe received the information or instructions which caused the notes in his possession to be retained.

BACKGROUND

Subject, a New York Top Hoodlum, has a criminal
record dating back to 1921, which includes arrests for
larceny, assault, robbery, homicide and liquor violations.
In 1926, he was convicted on an assault charge and
in 1930, he was convicted on charges of attempted robbery
and attempted grand larceny. The New York Police consider
him a prime suspect in the shooting of CARLO TRESCA,
controversial anti-Fascist newspaperman, in New York, in
1943. He is reported to have attended the Apalachin,
New York, meeting of hoodlums on November 14, 1957, and to
have escaped without being apprehended by the New York

It is noted that the New York Office also received unverified reports that Galante was at the Apalachin meeting and thereafter fled to Italy via Cuba for the stated purpose of conferring with Joe Adonis. Subsequently unverified reports have been received that [REDACTED] and Galante have been together in the Dominican Republic. It is noted that [REDACTED] is known to have previously been involved in an attempted shipment of arms and ammunition to a Cuban revolutionary movement.

The circumstances and timing of Bonanno's and Galante's trip to Italy and their alleged attendance at the Apalachin meeting point out a possibility that some of the hoodlums at the Apalachin meeting may have been there for the purpose of discussing possibility of investments under the guidance of the FERA. Should individuals such as those at Apalachin become interested in considerable number in such an operation as the FERA, it would be difficult to imagine that those operations or at least their participation in the operations would be conducted in an entirely legitimate manner.

With regard to Carmine Galante's alleged attendance at Apalachin [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] However, it is known that in the past he had visited Joseph Barbara in Apalachin in the company of other individuals, now carried as top hoodlums, including Joseph Bonanno. Fragmentary notes found in the possession of the late Salvatore Tornabbe, one of the persons at Apalachin, indicate a definite possibility that Galante was at Joseph Barbara's home a few days prior to 11/14/57.

b7C The New York Office should intensify its investigative coverage of Carmine Galante with particular reference to the Latamer Shipping Company, and develop further his association with [REDACTED]. 

If Galante's presence there is established, of course, complete investigation should follow concerning his contacts and any communications, including telephone calls that may have emanated from him.

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All offices receiving copies of this letter should be alert in connection with investigations of Galante, Bonanno, and other Apalachin hoodlums for the possibility that hoodlum groups are connected with the FARA for illegal purposes.

b7C On February 18, 1958, [redacted] Clerk, Clinton Prison, made available the record of subject.

The record reflects that he was sentenced January 3, 1931, by Judge CONWAY, Kings County Court, Brooklyn, New York, on his confession to attempted robbery, first degree, unarmed. He was ordered to serve 12½ years in a state prison, plus 2 years, 3 months, and 22 days delinquent time on a Sing Sing Prison confinement from which he was released January 18, 1930. He was eligible for parole on May 31, 1941. The robbery for which he was sentenced involved \$4,000.00, which was not recovered. Two co-defendants were not apprehended.

Subject served his delinquent time first, and was then paroled to start service of the 12½ year sentence on October 3, 1932. He appeared before the Parole Board on April 12, 1939, and was paroled May 1, 1939. He was received at Sing Sing Prison as a parole violator on November 23, 1943, and met the Parole Board which ordered him held for his full maximum which would expire March 20, 1945. He was transferred to Clinton Prison, Dannemora, New York, on January 22, 1944.

In February, 1944, the Warden of Clinton Prison wrote to the Commissioner of Correction, Albany, New York, to ascertain the date that subject should start serving the 12½ year sentence, in view of the Ingenito Decision. The Warden indicated that subject should only have been charged with 1 year, 10 months, and 10 days delinquent time on his return to prison on January 13, 1931. The basis of this inquiry is not shown, but [redacted] stated that the Ingenito Decision provided that parolees were to be credited with sentence time served while serving parole time, where the original sentence was prior to July 1, 1928, and many records were being reviewed at that time to adjust inmates' time owed.

b7C The record reflects that THOMAS P. DOUGHERTY and MARCUS L. FILLEY of the law firm Dougherty and Madden, 201 Cannon Building, Troy, New York, contacted subject in May and July, 1944, and prepared an Application for Writ of Habeas Corpus, July 8, 1944, under which the then County Judge of Clinton County, Plattsburgh, New York, F. CLAUDE O'CONNELL,

ordered that the Warden of Clinton Prison produce CARMINE GALANTE in that court on July 17, 1944, in that:

On December 12, 1925, GALANTE pleaded guilty to assault, second degree, and on December 22, 1926, was sentenced to an indeterminate sentence in State Prison, minimum 2½ years and maximum 5 years; credited with 26 days jail time;

On January 18, 1930, GALANTE was admitted to parole, at which time he owed 1 year, 10 months and 9 days. On December 24, 1930, he was arrested, charged with robbery. On January 7, 1931, he pleaded guilty and received a definite sentence of 12½ years in state prison; received credit for 13 days jail time.

On his return to state prison he was informed by the Parole Board that before starting his 12½ year sentence he must serve what he owed on the maximum of his commitment of December 22, 1926, from the date of his release on parole, January 18, 1930. He was again admitted to parole May 1, 1939. On January 12, 1943, he was returned as a parole violator.

That his imprisonment was illegal; the decision of the Parole Board that GALANTE, following conviction on another felony, while on his first parole, must serve the balance remaining on his first commitment, from the date of his release on parole, January 18, 1930, is contrary to law, under Chapter 736 of the Laws of 1926, amending the then Prison Law. That GALANTE was entitled to be credited with the time on parole from January 18, 1930, to December 24, 1930, and should have been released May 11, 1944.

This writ was dismissed at the Special Term of Clinton County Court in July, 1944, and GALANTE was returned to the custody of the Warden of Clinton Prison.

Notice of Appeal from the order of Judge O'CONNELL was filed in the office of the Clerk of Clinton County on August 24, 1944. On November 15, 1944, the Appeal was denied at a Term of the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court of the State of New York, Third Judicial District, Albany, New York.

An Appeal to the Supreme Court of the State of New York was filed by Attorney THOMAS F. DOUGHERTY December 6, 1944, on the basis that GALANTE's prison time was not properly computed, in that the time of his release on parole was not credited to him as provided in Chapter 736, Section 211, of the Laws of 1926, amending the then Prison Laws. That under Section 219 of the Correction Law, Chapter 485, Laws of 1928, the Legislature specifically provided that forfeiture of parole time should not apply except to convictions of persons sentenced on or after July 1, 1928, and confined to a state prison. That GALANTE was convicted December 24, 1926, and, under the decision in People ex. rel. Ingenito v. Brophy, 267 A.D. 293, affirmed 293, N.Y., relief was requested. The Appeal further related that the case on which Judge O'CONNELL's decision was made, and affirmed by the Third Judicial Department of the Appellate Division (Dayas v. Morhous, 267 A.D. 851), was overruled by the Court of Appeals in its recent decision in the Ingenito case.

On December 21, 1944, at a Special Term of the Supreme Court of the State of New York, held in Clinton County, Plattsburgh, New York, before Justice ANDREW W. RYAN, ROBERT C. BOOTH, Assistant Attorney General, was asked by the court if under the Ingenito Decision, subject had completed service of his prison time. Mr. BOOTH replied that under that Decision, subject had. Justice RYAN stated it appeared to the Court that the entire maximum sentence for which GALANTE was committed had been served, and ordered his release from Clinton Prison.

It is to be noted that there is a copy of a letter in the file at Clinton Prison by Assistant Attorney General ROBERT C. BOOTH, attorney of Plattsburgh, New York, to the Attorney General of New York State, in which he stated that he could see no basis for appealing the case as prison officials were then reviewing all cases under the Ingenito Decision to recompute time owed by inmates.

It is to be noted that the above data relating to subject's release was obtained from his Clinton Prison file and from the records of the New York State Supreme Court, Clinton County Clerk's Office, Plattsburgh, New York, on February 19, 1958.

Subject's file contains correspondence with the Warden of Great Meadows Prison in 1938, wherein subject requests that the Warden reconsider the imposition of three years additional sentence imposed on subject while at Great Meadows in connection with the death of Inmate JOSEPH DEL GAIS, Number 11756, who died as a result of knife wounds. Subject apparently was not directly involved, and also suffered knife wounds, but would not name his assailant, and all persons involved were sentenced to loss of all good time, which in subject's case, amounted to three years. After considerable correspondence, the Warden of Great Meadows Prison recommended to the Warden of Clinton Prison that it was his belief that subject was not responsible and leniency might be afforded him. Subject's minimum had been increased from December 29, 1938, to January 14, 1942, but he was paroled on May 1, 1939, as a result of that action.

The subject's file reflects that he was friendly with [redacted] Clinton Prison Number [redacted] and [redacted] Clinton Prison Number [redacted] who was paroled to New York City.

The file contains correspondence from Attorneys NICHOLAS P. IANUZZI of 2 Lafayette Street, New York City, Mr. ROSENBERG of Slade & Ohringen, New York City, and Attorney FRANK DELLI PAOLI of New York City, relating to the commutation of subject's time, but such correspondence does not reflect any action beneficial to subject prior to his release on parole May 1, 1939.

The file reflects that on February 1, 1944, shortly after his arrival at Clinton Prison from Sing Sing Prison, the prison psychiatrist diagnosed the subject as normal with psychopathic traits.

A clipping in the February 20, 1958, issue of the
"Knickerbocker News," printed at Albany, New York daily,
reflected that Governor HARRIMAN on February 19, 1958, released
a report from his Acting State Investigation Commissioner,
who said he had been told that NATHAN WEINSTEIN, Albany liquor
dealer, instigated some of the inquiries made after GALENTE's
arrest in 1956.

It was indicated in this article that Commissioner
ARTHUR L. REUTER had stated that VINCENT MACRI, of Albany, who
called himself a legislative consultant, told him that WEINSTEIN
had asked him to get information about GALENTE's arrest. This
article went on to relate that GALENTE had been picked up at
Windsor, near Binghamton, in October, 1956, after attending a
small underworld meeting that police say was held by JOSEPH
BARBARA, SR., also host to the Appalachian gangland convention
last November 14.

The article went on further to state that a number
of influential persons, including employees of the State
Division of Veterans Affairs and four assemblymen, have admitted
looking into the case.

The article went on further to state that REUTER
advised that MACRI told him he went to LEONARD L. SCHIEFFELIN,
Deputy Director of the State Division of Veterans Affairs, and
asked SCHIEFFELIN to find out about GALENTE's request. The request
was relayed to other division employees -- THOMAS MANNING, an
area director, and JOSEPH M. SHEEHAN, Binghamton area counselor.
SHEEHAN learned that the charge was more serious than speeding
and that GALENTE's record was a bad one and he is in prison.
MANNING. Mr. MANNING passed the information along to Mr.

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SCHIEFFELIN, who in turn transmitted it to MACRI, REUTER's report said.

The article went on further to state that REUTER's report did not offer any explanation of WEINSTEIN's interest in GALENTE. This article went on further to state that one JACK WILSON, an employee on duty at WEINSTEIN's liquor store, said the manager of the store is STEPHEN T. SCEPKOWSKI, an administrative assistant in the Albany Office of Secretary of State CARMINE G. DE SAPIO. SCEPKOWSKI is a member of the court-appointed committee handling WEINSTEIN's affairs. SCEPKOWSKI is an assistant to DE SAPIO's executive deputy, BARNETT J. NOVA.

An article in the March 5, 1958 issue of the "Knickerbocker News" reflected that the Watchdog Committee on March 5, 1958, linked D. MALLORY STEPHENS, a close political associate of former Governor DEWEY, and State Senator OWEN BEGLEY, Schenectady Democrat, to the CARMINE GALENTE traffic case. In this article, Committee Chairman WILLIAM F. HORAN made public testimony that Mr. STEPHENS and Mr. BEGLEY both sought to obtain lawyers to defend GALENTE. This article went on further to relate that Assemblyman GEORGE L. INGALLS, Binghamton Republican, said Mr. STEPHENS asked him to undertake the case but that he demurred after learning of GALENTE's record.

This article went on further to relate that DONALD W. KRAMER, former Democratic mayor of Binghamton, who acted as GALENTE's lawyer, said he did so at the request of Mr. BEGLEY. This article stated further that Mr. HORAN said Mr. STEPHENS' inquiry was traced through another man to IRVING ELLIS of Montreal, who was described as the reported head of a far-flung gambling racket that operated from Maine to California.

This article went on to describe GALENTE as a lieutenant of ELLIS. This article further related that Mr. BEGLEY -- who was not a senator at the time -- said that some men asked him to represent GALENTE but he told them he was too busy and that it would be too expensive because of the distance from Schenectady. The article went on further to relate that Mr. BEGLEY stated he could not recall the names of the men but said he called Mr. KRAMER and referred these men to him. In this article it was indicated that Mr. BEGLEY advised he believed one of the men was related to GALENTE.

This article reflected that Mr. HORAN disclosed an affidavit from DONALD J. FERRARO of Lake Mahopac, who stated ELLIS had raised the GALENTE matter at a business meeting about scrap metal in New York City. Mr. FERRARO said he went to Mr. STEPHENS, the Republican leader in his district, and asked him if he could do anything. This article went on to describe Mr. STEPHENS as a former chairman of the Assembly Ways and Means Committee with residence in Putnam County.

This article went on to state that Assemblyman GEORGE L. INGALLS, a Binghamton Republican, had stated that he had received a telephone call from Mr. STEPHENS shortly after GALENTE was arrested, asking him to represent the man in the traffic case. This article said that INGALLS advised he did not know of GALENTE's criminal record at the time but learned of GALENTE's background when he went to the Broome County District Attorney's Office to look into the matter. This article went on to state that INGALLS said he was also told at this time that GALENTE had given a false identity to the arresting state trooper. This article went on to state that INGALLS reported the circumstances back to Mr. STEPHENS and stepped out of the case.

This article went on further to state that Mr. HORAN also read statements that the committee had taken in an executive session from three other assemblymen who had inquired about GALENTE. They were described as Assembly Majority Leader JOSEPH F. CARLINO, Long Beach Republican; Broome County Republican DANIEL S. DICKINSON, JR., a member of the Watchdog Committee; and WILLIAM F. PASSANNANTE, Manhattan Democrat. This article went on further to relate that all three said that as soon as they learned of GALENTE's background, they rushed their word of the case.

This article went on to state that Mr. CARLINO said a New York City lawyer, MICHAEL KOSES, asked him whether he knew a competent attorney in Broome County to represent GALENTE. This article stated that Mr. CARLINO said he contacted Mr. DICKINSON, who said he would inquire into the case and let Mr. CARLINO know. This article further stated that Mr. CARLINO said Mr. DICKINSON informed him later of GALENTE's record and he told Mr. DICKINSON to drop the matter. This article indicated that Mr. CARLINO stated that Mr. KOSES was a law associate of BERNARD H. REICH, former corporation counsel of Long Beach. This article went on further to state that testimony from Mr. KOSES was that he had been approached by a client who called himself EDDIE CROSS of Manhattan, who KOSES said was an employee

or official of Carve Queen Corporation. This article stated that Mr. KOSES said Mr. CROSS' real name was EDDIE JOSEPH THAL. This article stated that he died last April.

An article in the "Knickerbocker News" issue dated March 6, 1958, reflected that one REMO A. ALLIO, an Endicott attorney, had denied before the Legislature's Watchdog Committee that he tried to keep mobster CARMINE GALENTE out of jail by offering a \$500.00 donation to the favorite charity of the judge handling the case.

This article stated that Justice of the Peace RICHARD B. KLAUSNER of Windsor, had repeated his story of the offer before the committee. This article stated that KLAUSNER testified that ALLIO made the offer after the justice indicated he had decided to send GALENTE to the Broome County Jail. This article went on further to state that KLAUSNER said ALLIO told him GALENTE had a very poor boyhood and would like to do something for boys. It was indicated in this article that KLAUSNER said ALLIO told him that GALENTE would donate \$500.00 to a youth group of KLAUSNER's choice if he went free. This article went on further to state that KLAUSNER testified he replied to the offer in language that "wasn't so good."

This article stated that ALLIO said KLAUSNER misunderstood his proposal. This article went on further to state that ALLIO told the committee he had suggested to the Justice that GALENTE be fined \$500.00 rather than jailed and that he, ALLIO, argued that the community would profit more from such a fine than it would by incarcerating his client.

This article went on further to state that ALLIO denied under repeated questioning that he mentioned any contribution to a charitable organization.

THE SUBJECT SHOULD BE CONSIDERED ARMED AND EXTREMELY DANGEROUS IN VIEW OF THE FACT THAT HE IS KNOWN TO HAVE CARRIED FIREARMS IN THE PAST, TO HAVE SHOT AT LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS ATTEMPTING TO APPREHEND HIM, AND IN VIEW OF HIS LONG CRIMINAL RECORD FOR ASSAULT AND ROBBERY.
