




The other officers at that time were, and still are [REDACTED] CARMINE GALANTE, Secretary-Treasurer, and CARMINE's wife, HELEN GALANTE, Vice-President. SAM invested no capital in this business; however, he has an oral agreement with CARMINE and HELEN that he owns one-third interest in Rosina. CARMINE and HELEN own the remaining two-thirds interest, having one-third interest each.

Mr. GALANTE [REDACTED] handled all of the operations of Rosina since November, 1957, and has made all of the necessary decisions [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Rosina is a union shop and all of the employees belong to the International Ladies Garment Workers Union (ILGWU), American Federation of Labor Congress of Industrial Organization (AFL-CIO). The majority of the employees belong to the Italian Local Number 89. Rosina belongs to the United Popular Dress Manufacturers' Association, Incorporated. The Business Agent who contacts Rosina is ANTHONY GAROFALO. JENNIE CEPALU is the chair-lady of Rosina, who represents the Rosina employees and meets with a representative of the union and a representative of a dress manufacturers association to agree on prices to be charged the manufacturer.

On March 26, 1958, [redacted] Export Section, United States Customs House, Bowling Green, advised SA [redacted] he was unable to locate any record of the Latamer Shipping Company as being authorized forwarding agents or exporters. He advised he also had contacted the Customs Office at Idlewild Airport and could locate no record for the Latamer Shipping Company for exporting shipments by air. He advised it was possible that someone else was acting as broker or forwarding agent for this company and that the name Latamer might possibly not appear in the records. He stated that the United States Department of State, Division of Munitions, Washington, D. C., might have some record of the company since certain concerns were required by law to register with the Department of State if they were exporting certain items such as aviation equipment, guns, and munitions.

On March 26, 1958, [redacted] Chief of the Ship Operations Branch, Atlantic Coast District, Maritime Administration, 45 Broadway, New York City, advised SA [redacted] he was unable to locate any record of the Latamer Shipping Company as being a registered freight forwarder. 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
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
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


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On April 15, 1958, the identification record for [redacted] was received from the FBI Identification Division and is set out as follows:

DI PALERMO, was also being sought by the police in connection
with this case.

In an article appearing in the New York "Daily
News" dated November 16, 1957, written by HOWARD WANTUCH and
SIDNEY KLINE, the possible reasons and the agenda of the
Apalachin meeting of November 14, 1957, were discussed.
They were of the opinion that the possible reasons for this
meeting were to place someone in charge of dope peddling in
the New York metropolitan area and that this assignment
had, at one time, been given to JOSEPH DI PALERMO, 245
Elizabeth Street, New York City, described as an ex-convict
who had graduated to narcotics after his dealings in alcohol,
counterfeiting, and possible murder. This article stated
that JOSEPH DI PALERMO was wanted on both Federal and
local warrants for conspiracy to violate the narcotics
statutes but that he had reportedly left the country several
months ago with another man's wife and both were believed to
be somewhere in Italy.

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
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
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IV. CRIMINAL ACTIVITIES

A. LOCAL ACTIVITIES

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An article appeared in the "New York World Telegram and Sun" dated February 4, 1958, concerning the New Jersey state probe by Deputy Attorney General CHARLES S. JOHNSON who had obtained indictments against four West New York, New Jersey police officials on misconduct and conspiracy charges. This indictment reportedly charged ERNEST S. MODANEJIA, West New York Public Safety Commissioner; Police Chief FREDERICK J. ROOS; Detective Captain CHRIS COEGERMANN; Detective Sergeants PETER POLICASTRO, and a man called only as "JOSEPH JOE," who was described as a man of dark complexion formerly employed by the ABCC Vending Company in which CARMINO GALANTE allegedly had an interest. It is believed that "JOSEPH JOE," mentioned above, is identical to [redacted]

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In the New York "Herald Tribune" dated February 27, 1958, an article appeared concerning the identity of the Albany, New York, man who intervened for CARMINO GALANTE concerning his 1956 traffic arrest. This person was identified by Acting State Investigation Commissioner, ALBERT I. RIT, as being NATHAN WEINSTEIN. It was reported that VINCENT MARCI, who was described as a Legislative Consultant, had been asked by Mr. WEINSTEIN to get information concerning the arrest of CARMINO GALANTE. WEINSTEIN was described as being an Albany liquor dealer who was presently in a semi-conscious state in an Albany hospital and had been recently declared judicially incompetent about five or six months ago.

He added that a passport is not required of United States citizens, and upon the individual's personal declaration of citizenship, a tourist card is issued by the airline to visit the Dominican Republic. No record is kept of these tourist cards issued; however, INS requires each United States citizen to complete a Form 194 at the time of departure from the United States. One copy is retained by INS when departing and a duplicate copy is retained by the passenger to submit at the time of his return to the United States.

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VI. CURRENT ACTIVITIES

This unknown individual was described as a white male, 50-55 years of age, approximately 5'7", 145-150 pounds, with graying white hair close cropped, smooth shaven, sharp-featured with a slender, tanned, healthy appearance. At approximately 2:02 P.M., [redacted] was observed to enter a stationery and soda shop at 578 Ninth Avenue. The unknown individual departed the vehicle and walked on Ninth Avenue to the Port Authority Terminal at which time the surveillance was discontinued on him. [redacted] was observed to enter the Lincoln Tunnel and proceed to New Jersey at which time the Newark Office took over the surveillance at approximately 3:10 P.M.

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[redacted] approximately 7:38 P.M. on April 2, 1958, Special Agents of the FBI observed two unidentified males depart the Alrac Hotel and enter a 1957 cream colored Plymouth sedan, two-door, 1958 New Jersey license EL 1312, later determined to be registered to [redacted] Bayonne, New Jersey. This vehicle departed the hotel and proceeded east on 64th Street at which time it was observed to have three male occupants in the front seat. At approximately 10:00 P.M. this vehicle was observed parked in the

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11 vicinity of the L'Amorique Restaurant at 54th Street and Second
12 Avenue, New York City. At approximately 8:15 P.M., CARMINE

27 to Manhattan and were observed parking in the vicinity of
28 Henry and Clinton Streets and were observed to enter an
29 apartment building in this area at which time the surveillance
30 was discontinued.

33 Shore Parkway in an effort to further determine any subse-

VIII. ARMED AND DANGEROUS

On January 28, 1958, [redacted]

Brooklyn,

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[redacted] advised SA [redacted] that he became acquainted with GALANTE in 1938 at the time of GALANTE's arrest for an attempted holdup. He stated that two other individuals were also involved in this holdup, and GALANTE stayed behind and shot it out with arresting officers, permitting the other two individuals to escape. He stated that from his experience with GALANTE at this time and the information he has learned since then, he considers GALANTE to be a vicious, killer who has no emotions whatsoever. He added that since GALANTE's involvement in the murder of CARLO WILSON and the fact that he refused to talk concerning this, he began his rise in the criminal underworld to where he now occupies the position of a trusted lieutenant.

He stated that GALANTE is the type who would be given such an assignment as the murder of ALBERT ANSELMI, which was committed in October, 1957. He based his opinion on the fact that no matter what illegal activities GALANTE might be caught in or charged with, he has the reputation of not talking.

IN VIEW OF THE FACT THAT GALANTE IS KNOWN TO HAVE CARRIED FIREARMS IN THE PAST, TO HAVE SHOT AT LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS ATTEMPTING TO APPREHEND HIM, AND IN VIEW OF HIS LONG CRIMINAL RECORD FOR ROBBERY AND BURGLARY, HE SHOULD BE CONSIDERED ARMED AND EXTREMELY DANGEROUS.
