CESAR CHAVEZ

on August II, 1975, advised that on August 10, 1975, Cesar Chavez, United Farm Workers Union, President, addressed a rally and fiesta at the Merced County Fairgrounds on August 10, 1975. This rally and fiesta was attended by approximately 1,200 persons, and they were predominantly farm workers. Chavez stated that the United Farm Workers Union now has a better chance to challenge Teamsters Union contracts because they have been granted access to Gallo winery ranches in Modesto, California, and Livingston, California.

Chavez spoke entirely in Spanish and the speech that he gave was reportedly basically the same one he had been giving during the course of a 1,000 mile walk through California.

A Merced Police Department permit for this gathering was issued for the fairgrounds from 1:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. The band refused to stop playing at 7:00 p.m., and Merced, California Police Sergeant declared the gathering at the fairgrounds illegal after the 7:00 p.m. deadline and ordered the crowd to disperse. Cesar Chavez mounted the fairground bandstand and ordered the band to continue playing. Chavez told Sergeant that the gathering was a private party and the officers had no right to break it up. After Chavez ordered the band to continue, electrical connections for the musical instruments were discontinued and police reinforcements were called to the fairgrounds to disperse the crowd. During the time the crowd was being dispersed at the fairgrounds, police officers received notification that approximately 60 to 70 United Farm Workers were gathering and demonstrating in the lobby of the Merced Police Department. During this time, a brick was thrown into a window at the Police Station and, in addition, a glass door was broken.

A source, who has Jurnished reliable information in the past, advised on November 13, 1970, that Cosar Chavez, the leader of the National Farm Workers Association (NFWA), would be in Chicago, Illinois on November 14, 1970, to lead a picket demonstration of the National Tea Company, 740 West Diversey Avenue, Chicago, starting at 10:00 A.M., November 14, 1970, to protest the sale of non-union picked lettuce by the National Tea Company.

The source further advised Chavez would speak before Operation Breadbasket, the economic arm of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, on November 14, 1970, to solicit the support of Operation Breakbasket of the NFWA's boycott of non-union picked lettece.

On November 14, 1970, the weakly meeting of Operational Broadbasket was broadcast on radio Station WVON, Chicago, Illinois. In this broadcast, which was monitored by a Sprofit Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the following statements were made:

Cesar Chavez, who was introduced by Jesse Jackson, National Director of Operation Breadbasket, stated the NEWA sponsored strike against the grape growers brought a union to the farm workers. Chavez stated now the battle continues in other areas, boycotting Jettuce, because these workers need the same protection that only a union can give them. Chavez stated the "poor must fight together" and called upon Operation Breadbasket to support the NEWA picket of the National Tex Company.

Arizona, area protesting prices paid immigrant workers, on 9/9/74 approximately 2500 individuals gathered outside Yuma city limits. Physical violence was used by groups in attempt to gain support of workers in the field. On arrival of law enforcement agencies, one of the demonstrators attempted to set fire to a stack of orange crates. Attempts to arrest suspect resulted in the assault of a Yuma County Sheriff's Deputy who was disarmed and shot at with his own weapon. Mexican alien immigrants, members of the UFW, had been arrested by Yuma County Sheriff's Office deputies for Trespassing and Disturbing the Peace after a rock throwing incident at a labor camp near Yuma, Arizona on September 16, 1974.

Advised no injuries resulted from the rock throwing.

Stated after the arrest, a group of 250 UFW members

Stated outside the Yuma County Jail protesting the arrest.

Stated that conversation overheard by deputies revealed that the group contemplated going to the U. S. Border Patrol Office, Yuma, to protest the lack of arrest by immigration authorities of illegal aliens entering the United States near Yuma. U. S. Border Patrol, Yuma, was advised of this information on this date.



Southern Group, National Park Service,
Phoenix, Arizona, telephonically contacted the Phoenix Office
of the FBI and advised as follows:

A representative of Cesar Chavez's UFW union, who is leader of the UFW, had approached a National Park Service officer at the Organ Pipe National Park on the Arizona-Mexican border. This union representative stated that the union is currently concerned over the illegal influx of Mexican farm workers into Arizona. He stated the border in the San Luis-Yuma area has been "pretty much tightened up" and very few illegal entries are occurring in this area. The

individual stated the union believes a large number of illegal aliens are crossing the border into Arizona through the Organ Pipe park. The individual further stated in an effort to stem these illegal entries, the union plans to begin covering the border in the Organ Pipe park commencing September 20, 1974. The union advised the park service their intention of having five automobiles with four representatives in each car patrol the park, and when they come across a person they believe to be an illegal alien, they will talk to him and convince him to return to Mexico. advised the U. On September 25, 1974, and advised 58 Mexican males belonging to UFW were arrested by Yuma County Sheriff's Office for Unlawful Assembly near Yuma, Arizona. Arrests were made after

court order prohibiting more than 50 individuals to be assembled at one time at one locale. Advised local law enforcement agencies "had reached the end of the rope" and would not take any direct violations of the court orders. All 58 subjects were arraigned before Justice of the Peace Bill Steen, Yuma, on September 25, 1974, and the majority of the individuals had a bond of \$330 placed for the violation.

Advised that the expected more trouble September 25, 1974, from the union and stated he had hired additional personnel.


On October 7, 1974, advised a ban of no picketing was lifted by order of Superior Court, Yuma, allowing UFW to have 25 pickets per field. Isolated incidents of vandalism and arson had occurred in the Yuma area. Arson also occurred in the San Luis, Arizona, area where two vehicles belonging to farm workers were burned. Stated that a bus used to haul workers to the fields was also burned on October 3, 1974, in Yuma. All the incidents of arson were being investigated by local authorities with no suspects developed. 



On January 29, 1973, we received a telegram from Cesar Chavez, United Farm Workers, Keene, California, which indicates possible violations of 29 U.S.C. \$530 and 18 U.S.C. §241.

Chavez alleges that the offices of United Farm Workers in Delano were dynamited during the week of January 22, 1973, that their Terra Bella office in Tulare County was destroyed on January 28, 1973, and that their Poplar office was attacked recently. Chavez further alleges that Union members have been threatened with bodily harm.

We request that you conduct a preliminary investigation to determine if there has been any violations of 18 U.S.C. \$241 or of 29 U.S.C. \$530.
