MIMORANDUL FOR THE DIRECTOR.

Confirming telephonic request of Lr. Peterson today, I beg to inform you that the following is the criminal record of Charles Arthur OFloyd:

Subject as Charles Arthur Floyd, #22318, arrested PD, St. Louis, Mo., September 16, 1925, charge - highway robbery; sentence - 5 years State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Missouri.

As Charles Floyd, #29078, received State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Missouri, December 18, 1925, from St. Louis City, crime - robbery 1st degree; sentence - 5 years.

as Charles \mathbb{R}^{O} Floyd, F16950, arrested PD, Kansas City, Kissouri, Karch 9, 1929, charge - investigation; disposition not given.

As Charles Floyd, "3999, arrested PD, Kanses City, Kansas, May 6, 1929, charge - vagrancy and suspicion - highway robbery; released 5-7-29.

As Charles Floyd, #887, arrested PD, Pueblo, Colorado, May 9, 1929, charge - vagrancy; fined \$50.00 and 60 days in jail.

As Frank Mitchell, \$19983, arrested PD, Akron, Chio, March 8, 1930, charge - suspicion; pending.

As Charles Arthur Floyd, #21458, arrested PD, Toledo, Ohio, May 20, 1930, charge - suspicion; disposition not given.

The following information appears on our records:

"Arrested Mansas City, Mo., 4 other times, all cases of investigation of holdups, and was released each time. WANTED: As Charles Arthur Floyd, alias Frank Mitchell alias Pretty Boy\Smith, 11-24-30, sentenced 12 years Ohio SP., (bank robbery, Sylvania, Chio), 12-10-30, escaped en route to Penitentiary. Motify Ohio SP., or Comm. Bowling Green, Ohio.

STILL WANTED: As Charles Floyd, murders and bank robbery. Notify PD, Hansas City, No., and SO, Bowling Green.

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
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

THE PAY OF CIT. MACSACRES

On the merging of June 17, 2933 there occurred in front of the Daise Railway Station in Reseas City, Riscouri one of the most brutal, preseditated mass marters recorded in the annals of American law enforcement. The killings, which took the lives of four peace officers and their prisoner, are now known as "The Estates City Massacre."

The facts currently this terrible cries involve the lives of four naturious criminals, all of when not their deaths in trying to hive by illegal muses.

"The Econes City Message" was in part perpetrated by Charles Arthur Flayd, economic known as "Fretty Rey" Flayd, Fernan Miller and Adma Richetti, in their attempt to liberate Franklikash, a Pederal prisoner, from the eventory of several has entercomes afficers, the tere on that date reterring hash to the Deltai States Positurtiary at Leaveston's, Esnate, from this: institution he had escaped on Ostober 19, 1930.

Frenk Mach, whose intended release brought shoul this terrible srise, was originally sentenced on March 1, 1924 at Oklahema City, Oklahema, in the United States Matrick Gourt, to serve teemby-live years upon senviotion for accounting a mail sustedion. He was required at the United States Peritertiany, Jeavesmorth, Ranges on March 3, 1924 to serve this sentence, but was successful in effecting his seeaps on October 19, 1930.

The Federal Eurem of Investigation immediately launched an intensive search for Mash which extended ever the entire United States and parts of Canada, in order that his apprehenden might be offeeted. Evidence was gathered by Special igents of the FEI which indicated that Mash and assisted in the escape of seven prisoners from the United States Punitentiary at Leavenmenth on Lecember 21, 1921. As a result of intensive investigation Mash was apprehended by Special Agents of the FEI at Hot Springs, Arkaness on June 16, 1923, and it was while he was being returned to the Federal penitentiary at Leavenmenth that the mase marker economic.

During the course of the FRI's investigation for Rush, it was learned that he had electly a secretard with Prencis LX Recting, Thomas Malden, and several other well-known genera who had participated in a number of bank retheries throughout the middle west. Easting and Halden were apprehended by Special Agents on July 7, 1932 at Rannas City, Missouri, while playing calf on the Old Mission calf course. The apprehension of these and greatly facilitated the capture of Rush, for it was learned that Rush had many underworld contacts and was receiving protection in Not Springs, Arkansas subsequent to his econe and prior to his apprehension.

Among other friends and those whe communited to being about Mach's liberation were Richard Tallman Calatas, Herbard (Farmer, "Doo" Louis (Sacot), and Frank Sacotlar. In pursuance

of this compirecy to obtain the freedom of Back after these individuals had heard of his apprehension in Het Springs, Vernon Miller while at the Herneshoe Tavern of Frank Mulley's in Kansas City, Miscouri, made a number of telephone calls to several of his criminal associates for assistance in carrying out this scheme. It was at this time that "Protty Boy" Floyd and Adam Richetti, two known gumen, arrived at Kansas City and after meeting Miller, accompanied him to his home at 6612 Migevale Avenue, Kansas City, Miscouri, where they remained that might until the merning of June 17, 1933, which was the day of the messagere.

Prior to the arrival of Floyd and Richetti in Eansas City, however, investigation disclosed they had been Setained at Bolivan Hissouri, when the ear in which they were riding became disabled. It was while they were waiting for their our to be repaired in a local garage that Sheriff Just Millingsworth entered the garage unexpectedly and was immediately recognised by Richetti who seized a machine gua and held the Sheriff and the garage attaches against the wall in a defenseless position. Floyd assisted in this when he drew two .45 caliber automatic pistols and ordered all of the parties to remain motionless while they effected their escape. Flord and Richetti then ordered the Sheriff into another sytomebile into which the argenal of the two bandits was transferred. The two sen with their priseser then proceeded to Desputer, Missouri, where that car was cheadqued and another automobile belonging to a selemen, Mr. Valter Griffith, was commundered. After releasing the Sheriff they finally arrived in Kansas City, Elescuri about ten P. H. on June 16, 1933, when after driving around the streets for some time, they abandomed this extomobile and stole another our in that city. All of their begange and firearms were accordingly transferred, and an the same evening, in some menner, they not Vernou Miller, who acquainted them with his plan of obtaining the liberty of his friend, Frank Manh.

Acting in accordance with their preconceived scheme, the following morning, June 17, 1933, Willer, Flayd, and Richetti proceeded to the Union Railway Station in a Chevrelet sedan and took their respective positions to swait the arrival of Mash and the peace officers who were assigned to escort and guard him. Hash, with the efficers, was to exrive at the Union Station in Easses City by train and was to be thereafter transferred to an automobile parked across the street where he would be taken to the penitentiary at Leavementh, Easses.

Frunk Bash was essected by the Read of the FRI's Eannas City Office, together with "pecial Agent Baywood J. Caffrey, two other representatives of the FBI, and Otto Book. Chief of Police of the McAlester, Oklahoma, Police Department. Police Officers W. J. Grooms and Frank Hermanson of the Kansas City, Missouri, Police Department, were also given important posts of essignment for this transfer. Frank Mash, upon being removed from the train, was impediately taken to the waiting automobile of Special Agent Caffrey where he was placed in the left front seet in order that the efficers might eccupy the rear seat. At this instant two Special Agents took positions in the rear seat with Chief of Police Otto Reed. Police Officers Grooms and Hermunson together with the Head of the PBI's Kameas City Office, were standing on the right side of Agent Caffrey's automobile during the time Special Agent Caffrey was walking around the ear preparatory to entering the driver's seat. It was when Agent Caffrey approached the left door of this automobile that the three assassins surprised the efficers from a point in front of and about fifteen to twenty foot to the west of the automobile. These men were observed carrying machine guns and other weapons and in approaching the automobile shouted, "up, up. In instant later the voice of one of the gunnen was heard to may "Let 'am have it." Immediately a famillade of gunfire came from the weapons of the attackers. Shots were fired from the front and from all sides of agent Caffroy's car. Police Officers Grouns and Kermanoss were instantly killed in the positions where they stood. Chief of Police Otto Rood was also instantly killed. One igent was severely wounded by bullets which entered his back, and he was confined to bed for several months. Special Agent Caffrey was instantly killed by a bullet which passed directly through his head as he steed beside the car. The prisoner, Frank Bash, was also killed by a misdirected guashet that entered his skall, thereby defeating the very purpose of the conspiracy to gain his freedom. The other Special Agent escaped injury,

while the Head of the FBI Office received a wound in the arm. Apparently the assassins started at the front right-hand side of the car and at least two of them proceeded around the automobile, making a complete circle and firing recklessly as they went.

Immediately following this daring crime which shocked the metion, the FBI instituted an intensive investigation to identify and apprehend these meddened games. Following months of painstaking work, with all of the facilities at its disposal, the FBI uncovered positive evidence that this scheme was executed by Vermon C. Miller, Adam C. Richetti, and Charles Arthur Floyds also that this conspiracy was eraceived and engineered by Richard Tallman Galatas, Herbert Farmer, "Doc" Louis Stacci. and Frank B. Mulloy. Through subsequent investigation Galatas, Farmer, Stacci and Hulley were apprehended in connection with this grime and were indicted by a Federal Grand Jury at Kausas City, Missouri on October 24, 1934 for conspirecy to cause the escape of a Federal prisoner from the custody of the United States. All of those individuals were found guilty on January 4, 1935, and on the following day each was sentenced to serve two years in a Federal penitentiary and pay a fine of \$10,000, which was the maximum populty allowed by law.

Buring the FBI's investigation to locate Vermon Miller, his body was found on the outskirts of Detroit, Michigan on the morning of Movember 29, 1933. Through information received from a confidential source it appears that Miller was shot to death by heachnen of Longie Zwillman. From available information it seems that Miller first entered the racket picture as a hired gumman of Louis Buchalter, whose apprehension on August 24, 1939 by the FBI ended a two-year search for this autorious criminal. Buchalter was reported to have taken steps to shield Miller following the Kansas City Massacra and likewise expended considerable money to protect Vivian Mathias, the permour of Vermon Miller. Investigation disclosed that Vivian Mathias was closely associated with Betty Buchalter, the wife of Louis Buchalter, during the time Special Agents were looking for her as a means by which Vernon Miller might be apprehended.

From the information developed through a confidential source, it appears that Vernon Miller, while intoxicated, became involved in an alternation with a heachuan of Longie Zwillman in

Nevert, New Jersey, and during this angusent Miller shot one of these individuals. It was following this occurrence that one of the alloged associates of Mrilluma retaliated by taking the life of Vernen Miller near introit, Michigan. It is significant to note the way the underworld operates on a matienal scale as indicated by the fact that Miller's contact in New York City was the notorious lasts Machalter.

Generaling the personal life of Verson Miller, is interesting to note that he enlisted in the United States Amy during the Berld For and received extensive training as a makine genera. Pollowing his release from the United States Amy he appeared at Haron, South Dalets where he tald strongs stories of his haroism in the World Yer. He left the impression with the temposphe that he had been decounted for browny by the French Covernment though no can ever son this decoration. During this time Miller decountrated to the city efficials that he was a cruck shot, following which he was elected to the position of policemen in 1920. Two years later he was elected as Sheriff and was recominated, but before the election he disappeared and thereafter entered upon his server of orime.

In connection with the identification of Flayd and Richetti in this case, it is interesting to note that in Ame, 1973, while Special Agents of the FMT were conducting a said upon the residence of Miller in Ranges City, several bear bottles were located. Photographs were made of the intent fingerprint improvedent appearing on the bottles, which were being forwarded to the FMT's Tochnical Indecedory were convoked through the files of the identification Division and definitely identified with the known fingerprints of Adea Richetti, resitive evidence of Michetti's having been in Miller's home during that time was consequently established.

Subsequent to the death of Flayd, and as developed by investigation it was learned that early in September, 2003 Flayd and Richetti and Soulah and Rose Enire at Taledo, Onio. At that time they proceeded to Buffalo, New York, where an September 21, 2933 Flayd and Boulah, using the same of Hr. and Mrs. George Senders, and Richetti and Rose, using the same of

Mr. and Mrs. Rd Brennan, rented an apartment in that city. Questioning of the remaining occupants of this apartment building by Special Agents disclosed they considered the Sanders and Brennam families as very mysterious in that they solden left the apartment, especially the men. Investigation disclosed that Fleyd and Richetti together with their female accepanions remained in this apartment for approximately thirtoen months until Outober 20, 1934. Puring this time Ployd walked from the front to the rear of the apartment almost continuously. This activity saused considerable surjectly on the part of the other occupants of the apartment building. It appeared that they mever visited with any of their neighbors though they were friendly with the neighborhood children who were sometimes permitted to enter the apartment, and they often threw money from the windows to the children playing in the street.

On October 20, 1934 it was agreed that they would return to their home state, Oklahoma, and in pursuance of this plan Bose Baird was given a sum of money with which to purchase a Ford twior ceach sedan. It was in this automobile that Floyd and Richetti, alternating at the wheel, planned to drive to Oklahoma. However, Floyd, when driving, skidded the automobile into a telephone pole near Vellsville, Ohio on the early morning of October 21, 1934. At that point Floyd and Richetti took from the eart their firearms and remained on the outskirts of the city while Rose and Beulah Baird succeeded in taking the wrecked automobile into a Vellsville garage for repairs.

On the day of this wreck Floyd and Richetti were identified by local officers who found them resting in a wooded tract of land near Fellsville. After a gum bettle Richetti was taken into custody but Floyd escaped. Insediately upon receiving this information concerning the escape of Floyd, Special Agents of the FBI were ordered to the scape and there conducted a thorough and exacting search for the clusive Floyd. On the following day, October 22, 1934, "Pretty Bey" Floyd was located by Special Agents of the FBI accompanied by officers of the East Elverpool, Onic Police Department, on a farm situated between

Agreevals and Clarkson, this. This resisting arrest Floyd was seriously injured and died before he sould be taken to a baseltal for medical attention.

It was while hose and hould haird were in the garage at willsville attending to the repair of the wreshed extensive that they evertaers the discussion of Richetti's being taken into custody. They accordingly left immediately for fences City, Masseri, and later went to the home of Playd's family in Ballians, Chiaran, where they attended the funeral of Charles Flayd.

It is interesting to note that at the time Flagd was killed there was found on his person a watch and feb examinating of a "lunky piece." On the watch in three different places, and also on the "lunky piece" there were found groups of ten noteties which had apparently been carved by Flagd as an indication of the number of non he had billed.

Adam Picketti, following his approbancies, was returned to Escase City, Piccourt for trial, and a March 1, 1935 was indicted in four courts by the Jankson County Oracl Jury for worder in the first degree. The trial of Richetti, predicated on the indictment charging him with the nurser of Frenk E. Hermanen, one of the peace officers killed during the Kansas City theomete, started in Hanne City, Missouri on June 10, 1935, and on June 17 the Jury returned a vertical of guilty with a recommendation that the death prealty be imposed. On the day of his sentence the Court ordered Richetti to be hanged.

Subsequently, Michetti's attorneys alleged Richetti to be insume, and a heering was held thereon at which time his samity was clearly established. He was again sentenced on August 31, 1938, to death in the lethal gas chamber of the Missouri State Pomitentiary at Jefferson Gity, Missouri. This execution was performed on October 7, 1938.

The criminal records of Hiller, Floyd, and Richsti, as maintained in the files of the FEI, alearly indicate the criminal and lawless characteristics of these mem.

Vermon C. Willer, with aliases, was arrested on April 4, 1923, for embessionent of public funds and was received at the State Penitentiary at Sioux Palls, South Dakota, to serve from two to ten years and to pay a fine of \$5,200.00. His criminal record further reflects that he was wented by the Hinnespolis, Himnesota, Police Department for assault with intent to kill, and also at Sioux Falls, South Dakota, for violation of the Mational Prohibition Act.

Charles Arthur Floyd, with aliases, was arrested an aumerous occasions, the first being an September 16, 1925, for highway robbery by the St. Louis, Missouri, Police Department. He pleaded guilty to this charge an December 8, 1925, and mas sentenced to serve time in the State Penitentiary at Jefferson City, Missouri. Floyd was discharged from the Penitentiary on March 7, 1929, being thereafter arrested by the Eanses Sity, Missouri Pelice Department on March 9, 1929, for investigation and on May 6, 1929, for vagrancy and suspicion of highway robbery. He was released in both instances. On May 20, 1930 Ployd was agrested by the Toledo, Chie, Police Department, on a charge of bank robbery, and on Nevember 24, 1930, was sentenced to twelve to fifteen years in the Chie State Penitentiary. Floyd encaped on route to the penitentiary and was not apprehended until October 22, 1934 when he was killed while resisting arrest.

The criminal record of Adam C. Richetti, with alianes, perfects that he was first arrested on August 7, 1928, at Hammond, Indiana, by the Police Department for a holdup, being thereafter

sextended to serve from one to ten years in the State Reformatory at Pundleton, Indiana. He was paroled from this institution on Sctober 2, 1930, and on September 23, 1931, he was discharged from his parale. Richetti was next arrested on March 9, 1932, at Sulphur, Oklahoma, for bank robbery, and on April 5, 1932, was received at the State Penitentiary, Scalester, Oklahema, for safekeeping. His eriminal record, however, discloses that he was released from the State Ponitentiary on August 25, 1932, by a Court erder and placed on bond which he thereafter ferfeited. The criminal record of Richetti shows that he was subsequently unated at Tishamingo, Oklahoma, for robbery and for jumping the \$15,600 bond which he had posted upon being released from the State Penitentiary. As a result of Richetti's participation in the Eansas City Massacre, he was received at the State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Missouri, on September 2, 1938, at which place he was executed on October 7, 1936.
