## Kettering Dies; Top Inventor

DAYTON, Ohio, Nov. 25 (UPI). Charles F. Kettering, 82, inventor of the automobile self-

starter, died at his home at nearby Ketter-ing today as a result of a stroke suffered Sunday night.

The condition of Kettering, k nown affectionately as "Boss Ket" during his career at General Motors, had wor-sened steadily

s in c e the stroke. Ketter- ing's only son, Eugene, was at the bedside of his father.

A DIRECTOR and former vice president of General Motors and former general manager of the General Motors Research Laboratories, Kettering was born on a farm near Loudonville, Ohio, on Aug. 29, 1876.

Kettering's innovations ranged from puntling the ethyl in gaso-line, to building a fever machine that promises relief from many human ailments.

Doctors listed the cause of death as a cerebral hemorrhage. Kettering never regained con-sciousness after suffering a second stroke early today and falliing into a coma.

The towering Slean-Kettering Institute for cancer-Research, founded with his long-time General Motors boss Alfred P. As you recall, Mr. Hoover received on April 28, 1958, from the U. S. Chamber of Commerce, one of the "Seven Great Living Americans" awards. Ceremonies were held at the Sheraton-Park Hotel in Washington. One of those so honored at the time was Charles F. Kettering who died today. Others were Miss Calla Varner

4-year-old-school teacher:

Mr. Kettering died at 82 in Dayton today. His home address is Ridgeleigh Terrace, Dayton, Ohio. (According to the Associated Press, his wife died in 1946 and his only son, Eugene Kettering, resides at Hinsdale, Illinois.)
