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that the advertisers control the newspapers and that he made true reports but that had nothing to do with what was actually printed.

McWILLIAMS came onto the platform with a large searchlight and said that if there was any heckling he would shine the light on such persons so that the police, who seemed to have bad eyesight, could remove the hecklers from the crowd. McWILLIAMS said that now that the American Destiny Party had been driven to the streets he would give the "Eskimos" and the administration plenty to worry about as he expected to get two more covered wagons and hold three meetings every night. At this point a heckler shouted that HITIER was paying for the covered wagons, and the police removed him.

McWILLIAMS praised HITIER and MUSSOLINI for the interest they have in their nations and said he believed Ireland would soon be free and England would be crushed. He said that unless you praise England and France which are controlled by "Eskimos" you are called a Fifth Columnist.

On July 3, 1940, a meeting of the Christian Mobilizers was held at Ebling's Casino. About 150 persons were present.

LOUIS HELMOND was chairman. Chief NET HOON stated that the Jews were running the government and that, of 3800 persons employed in one section of the Census Division, on a Jewish holiday 3300 of them were off. He said the gold in the hills of Kentucky was owned by Jews and Americans were paying heavily to protect this Jewish wealth.

JOSEPH McWILLIAMS spoke and mentioned that he had received two letters from different states. One of these was signed "JOHN HAMILTON" and came from Massachusetts. HAMILTON is alleged to have stated that we need a man in this nation like HITLER. McWILLIAMS spoke of the coming presidential election and said that while he would not come out completely for WENDELL WILLKIE at this time he did believe he was better than ROOSEVELT. McWILLIAMS did not seem to be able to get himself straightened out on WILLKIE inasmuch as one minute he was praising him and in the next minute criticizing him.

A meeting of the American Destiny Party was held on July 5, 1940, on the street at 85th Street and First Avenue. LOUIS HELMOND was chairman. About 400 persons were present.

DONALD SHEA, leader of the National Gentile League, Washington, D. C., spoke of conditions in Washington. He urged the election of McWILLIAMS to fight side by side with THORKELSON and WHEELER.

JOSEPH McWILLIAMS spoke and accused England of being the greatest war-mongering country in the world and trying to involve The United States in the present war because she is standing on her last leg. He said England went so far as to sink her own ship, the Athenia, which was bringing American citizens to this country as they thought it would arouse the American people to speak of nothing but war. He said he thought the bomb which exploded at the World's Fair had been planted by the British in order to gain the sympathy of the American people. He stated that certain people call FORD and LINDBERGH Fifth Columnists, and that if these great men were Fifth Columnists he was proud to be in their class. He said that when he was taken to court for his speeches it cost him one thousand dollars in trials but that he got at least ten thousand dollars' worth of publicity from them. He predicted that when he was elected to Congress he would blow the lid off the administration in Washington.

A meeting of the American Destiny Party was held on July 6, 1940, on the street at 73rd Street east of First Avenue. About 600 persons were present. DONALDYCASANOVA was chairman. The speakers platform was on a covered wagon.

JAMES DOWNEY spoke and stated that President ROOSEVELT was a failure and should step aside and allow someone else to have a chance of solving our problems. He said the British are traitors because they allowed Poland, Czechoslovakia, and France to fall. He claimed the Internationalists (Jews) were trying to involve us in the war and would do so unless we support men such as RUSH HOLT, Senator WHEELER, and McWILLIAMS.

DONALD SHEA, Washington, D. C., spoke and blamed the sufferings of the Americans on the manipulations of the government in the value of gold. He claimed that a certain element was trying to take away the right of free speech to real Americans. He praised Senator WHEELER, RUSH HOLD, Congressman THORKELSON, and McWILLIAMS.

JAMES STEWART spoke and stated that an indication of the intolerance used against persons who fight for Christian ideals was that he was arrested and brought to police headquarters at 12 o'clock at night and questioned regarding the bombing of the World's Fair and claimed that he had never been arrested in his life and had fought and been wounded defending this country.

In answer to Pelley's query, the "good tidings" leaped from mouth to mouth among U. S. Nazis last week that "Lindbergh is our leader, our Man on Horseback!" This strategy of lifting the ex-Colonel into the subversivist saddle differs little from the procedure employed when Fifth Columnists placed their hopes in Major General Smedley D. Butler -- and later in Major General George van Horn Moseley -- as strong man in the Nazi circus. The fruits of these first attempts spelled failure. Butler refused to be bribed into the position of a "patriotic traitor". When Moseley was ready to mount the charger, the bridle slipped because of his exposure at the hands of the Dies Committee.

In 1933, according to the testimony given by General Butler before the McCormack Committee, several individuals, including Gerald C. MacGuire, employed by Grayson M. P. Murphy and Company, and R. S. Clark, a banker, tried vainly to create a vast Fascist movement of which Butler was to be the "Man on Horseback . Butler's steadfast adherence to the principles of democracy, despite gobs of money offered by these agitators, was the answer to this attempt ed underhanded betrayal of the nation. Passages from the printed hearings of the McCormack Committee, indicating the viciousness with which these plotters laid their plans, are reproduced on page 3.

This was the clue for such Nazi sympathizers were tooking. Immediately, plans were launched to use the General, who had spoke so approvingly of National Socialism and Fascism, as the nucleus around whom would rally all the various groups which were then operating independently of each other. Moseley is powerful enough, it was argued, to force all the jealous, little, would-be Führers to give up their own claims to leadership.

Blueprints were drawn up for the unification. Important personages, whose names are well known in the United States, were to be pillars of the movement. Some were consulted, others were in complete ignorance of the plot. Congressman Martin Dies himself was to be one of the mainstays, but when Dies demonstrated his disinclination to cooperate by having Moseley subpoensed to appear before his Committee, Mrs. Leslie Fry, one of the originators of the plot, "spilled the beans" and revealed the entire scheme in the July, 1939, issue of the "Christian Free Press", organ of the "Militant Christian Patriots".

Mrs. Fry's article, covering three and a half pages and captioned "Sinister Farce - The Hellish Conspiracy", gave all the details of the scheme. The most important paragraphs, containing the names of the men who were to head the movement under Moseley's generalship, are reproduced on page 2. The majority of these names are known as those of well known Nazi agitators.

The Bundits, of course, fell in line with the campaign and circulated window stickers (illustration on page 2) advocating the election of Moseley to the Presidency of the United States. At the same time, the Deutscher Weckruf und Beobachter, official organ of the Bund, on December 22, 1938, declared in a leading front-page story that Moseley was THE man of the hour, captioning the article (illustration on page 2): "General Moseley vs. War Makers -Scores Baruch's Warnings of War as a Crime".

Almost two and a half years later, on May 1, 1941 to be exact, the Deutscher Weckruf und Beobachter once again announced (illustration on page 3) that a new "Man on Horseback" had arisen: Charles A. Lindberghi

As though sensing with clairvoyant powers, a year previous (on July 1, 1940), Father Coughlin's "Social Justice" appeared on the stands with an article (illustration on page 3) in almost an exact parallel to the "Moseley for President" drive. This article urged the election of Charles A. Lindbergh as Vice President, the Presidency being tendered to Wendell L. Willkie, who was at that time still a question mark in the eyes of all Nazi sympathizers.

Los Angeles Bundits went even further. They wanted to see the flying Colonel ensconced in the White House. On September 10, 1940, a mass meeting (11lustration on page 3) was held at the Embassy Auditorium in Los Angeles, under the auspices of the "True Americans", headed by Harold A. Sparling, subversivist par excellence. In his speech, Sparling cried for the drafting of Lindbergh for the Presidency and Senator Burton K. Wheeler for the Vice-Presidency

As if to tie together attempts of former years and those of the present, Pelley, in his "Roll-Call" of April 14, 1941, named Lindbergh with Henry Ford, Senator Wheeler and General Moseley as the new leaders of the nation (illustration on page 3), gathering together in a neat bundle the Four Horsemen of the present Apocalypse.

The question today, in view of the endeavors being made to unite under Lindbergh, resolves itself into whether Lindbergh will follow the honorable example set by General Butler, or allow himself to become the Fihrer of the foes of Democracy by following in the footsteps of General Moseley. Butler refused to be knighted a traitor; Moseley's actions speak for themselves. Does the Lone Eagle yearn to become a Pegasus?

foreign born, have tried for many years to find a basis upon which all subversive groups in this country could be brought together. Realizing that such a movement demands an outstanding personality at its head, these elements conducted a continuous search for one who could emerge as the "Man on Horseback".

The nation-wide publicity, resulting from the Roosevelt-Lindbergh controversy, has given new hope to Nazi sympathizers who are looking for a leader in order to unify all subversive groups.

NRS herewith presents a factual report on happenings taking place at present in Los Angeles. Developments which are unfolding hourly in this locale are strikingly similar to incidents in other cities, according to reports received from several sources. An expose of activities in Los Angeles, therefore, will serve as a blueprint of related operations in other parts of the country.

The Research Supplement accompanying this release gives background information and documentary evidence throwing into bold relief the parallelisms between present movements and attempts made in years gone by to produce a "Man on Horseback".

On March 16, last, at the Los Angeles Embassy Auditorium, Verne Marshall, of the now defunct "No Foreign War Committee", addressed the "Save America" First" group, headed by T. W. Hughes, well known to NRS readers. Marshall's audience was largely composed of Nazi Bundits who were discouraged by vain efforts in the past and who felt that they were too small for the huge task they had set for themselves. Inherently, they knew that a large movement, embracing all groups of a similar nature, was needed.

The "No Foreign War" leader's speech, one of many presented in the heat of the campaign to prevent passage of the Lend-Lease Bill, differed little from other Marshall addresses delivered during the course of his cross-country tour. But there was one exception which aroused his audience of Nazi listeners from lethargy. There was one remark, in fact a pronunciamento, which rekindled the dying flame of hope in the hearts of those who heard him say, in part:

We must continue our work. We must not be disheartened by apparent setbacks. We must stick together, for a leader will arise at the opportune time, who will unite all people who think as you and I do; who shall impose the will of the people upon the Washington administration.

Investigation by NRS r end that this particular it ment by Marshall was uttered deliberately, llowing on the heels of a seting held in secret by subversive leaders in Southern California. These militant generals have remained very much in the background, and their names are unknown to the large masses of super-patriots who, knowingly or unknowingly, follow the bandwagon of subversivism.

While these hangers-on were kept in ignorance, it was openly avowed at this secret session that "Colonel Lindbergh will be our Man on Horseback". When the controversy between President Roosevelt and Colonel Lindbergh hit the front pages and the air lanes, these behind-the-scene wire-pullers deemed the time ripe to inform the masses of their decision as to the new "Man on Horseback".

At a meeting similar in background and audience to that addressed by Marshall, the stage was dramatically set for this important revelation. On Sunday, May 4, Ellis O. Jones, who frequently acts as chairman at meetings of the Hughes followers, announced the formation of the "National Copperhead Association", whose purpose it would be to line up behind the leadership of the now ex-Colonel Charles A. Lindbergh. This news was received with exultation and unanimous approval by the 1200 Nazis and Nazi sympathizers who attend these conclaves weekly.

In order to identify full-fledged members, buttons reading "I'm a Copper Head" (illustration on page 1) were made available in large quantities, at small cost, to those in attendance. Instructions were given to the faithful to go out into the field, in the manner of crusaders, to enlist more adherents to the holy cause.

Every evening during the past week, the German propaganda film, Blitzkrieg im Westen was shown, this time at the Deutsches Haus in Los Angeles. In the theatre, many were observed wearing the telltale "Copperhead" buttons. Kenneth Alexander, Southern California Silver Shirt leader, has been strenuously urging the members of his group to wear the "Copperhead" in their lapels. Then, to crystallize the growing movement, the Los Angeles chapter of the America First Committee, exposed in earlier issues of NEWS LETTER, distributed telegraph blanks to those in attendance at the regular meeting, with the instructions that messages be sent to Lindbergh immediately, telling him that "we patriotic Americans are behind you and urge you to come to Los Angeles to speak. We promise you the most gigantic rally you have ever seen!"

Last Saturday, the telephone squads of all known Nazi organizations went into action. Every person who had enrolled in one of the subversive organizations or had indicated his sympathy with them, received an urgent telephone message: "Be sure to tune in your radio today when Lindbergh speaks from Minneapolis....Get all your friends to listen in....Come to the Embassy Auditorium on Sunday to hear prominent speakers analyze the words and thoughts of this great American patriot."

On the following day, at the Embassy Auditorium, Lindbergh's address was referred to by Hughes who was the main speaker of the evening. Special emphasis was laid on Lindbergh's statement, "I do not know how much longer free speech will be allowed in this country", implying that soon meetings such as those held by the "Save America First" group would be banned by the Washington Administration, which "is more dictatorial than any European government". Spontaneous applause accompanied such statements as: "Democracy has died because its bloodstream has been poisoned by the international financial system", and demands were made to impeach the President of the United States. The lines in the Blueprint for America prepared by the Fascist wire-pullers are becoming daily more clear.

A poll of Congress disclosed that it is overwhelmingly sgainst maintaining a large standing army.

Congress should remain in session all the rest of the year so that these shortzes and lack of proparedness can be not with a comprehensive plan. They should also remain in session to put a check on the urse for power and more power that the Chief Executive has always had-but never quite exhibited it so plainly as he has within the last few days. 

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

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NO FOREIGN WAR COMMITTEE INTERNAL SECURITY - G.

The following information was received at the Bureau from an outside unknown source.

The alleged "peace" campaign which had been receiving wide publicity virtually disintegrated the first week of January when Verne Marshall, leader of the No Foreign War Committee, revealed that his organization was linked directly to Hermann Goering, second in command of the German government.

At the same time he refused to express a preference for a British victory over Germany stating that the terms which his colleague and financial backer William Rhodes Davis, an official Nazi agent in the western hemisphere, had secured for the United States from Herr Goering were fair bases for a negotiated peace.

None of Marshall's supporters have repudiated him although many among them are closely identified with Socialist Party official peace fronts. Linked directly to the No Foreign War Committee is Senator Burton K. Wheeler, who has not only given the committee moral support but early this fall cooperated with Marshall's lieutenant, O. K. Varmstrong, member of the Foreign Relations Committee of the American Legion. Mr. Armstrong is a charter member of the Marshall group.

Last summer he and Wheeler joined in what

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they termed an American Anti-War Crusade" under the auspices of the Keep America Out of War Congress.

This relly was endorsed by Maynard Kreuger, Norman Thomas' running mate in 1940, Harry Fleischman, the Illinois State Secretary of the Socialist Party, and other leading members of the Socialist Party. There is no indication that these men are pro-Nazi. They are reportedly sincere isolationists, but in their efforts to secure "peace" they have been willing to work with other ostensibly sincere "peace" organizations, only to find that they have become part and parcel of a Nazi offensive.

This was the case when C. Hartley Grattan found himself writing the introduction for what turned out to be the German "White" paper, when Harry Elmer Barnes wrote favorable letters to a Dr. Auhagen who was later exposed as one of the chief Nazi agents here; when A. J. Muste, Harold Chance, Frederick Libby and others connected with the Socialist Party peace outfits attended a Washington conference and found themselves with Charles Lindbergh, Nerle Thorpe of the magazine, "Nation's Business", and others. Chance has remained on the sponsoring committee of No Foreign Wars, and Libby his endorsed "Scribners Commentator". The editor of "Uncensored" has become the publicity director of America First".

At a meeting in Chicago's Auditorium Theatre on June 30, 1940, 0. K. Armstrong and Senator Wheeler, among others, talked for forming a "new and great entiwar party". At that time Wheeler and John Lewis were involved in political negotiations which received wide publicity. It was subsequently revealed by Kenneth Crawford, Washington Correspondent for P.M., that it was John Lewis who arranged the contact between William R. Davis and Mexican Communist Labor chief Lombardo Toledano so that Davis could consumate an oil deal between the Mexican and German governments. Lewis'

daughter and close associate Kathryn is a member of the Executive Board of "America First".

In addition to revealing that Mr. Davis was one of the moving spirits and financial backers of the No Foreign Wars Committee, Mr. Marshall's statement showed that his group was the result of negotiations conducted during the Republican nominating convention among members of the GOP-Ford-Hoover-section of the isolationist bloc. The Committee was first thought of by Mr. Marshall, who was one of the speakers at the GOP convention, and two other delegates, George Eggleston and Douglas Stewart, now associated with Scribner's Commentator.

This magazine has become the appeasement mouthpiece of Henry Ford and Charles Lindbergh. Marshall came to New York at Eggleston's invitation and then was taken to a private dinner at which he met Lindbergh. It is reliably reported that some members of Senator Wheeler's Congressional isolationist bloc were present.

New York members of the German American Bund were discovered the first week of January, distributing on street corners thousands of white blueedged buttons reading, "No Foreign Wars". The Deutscher Weckruf und Beobachter has officially endorsed Mr. Marshall's committee.

William Rhodes Davis' interest in the No Foreign War Committee is hardly altruistic. He is today the largest individual oil operator in the world; he operates oil refineries in Germany and has for years been close to the German economic ministry, as its oil purchasing agent abroad. He was responsible for bringing to this hemisphere his friend, Joachim HX Hertslet, one of the top Nazi agents in North America.

FRAUD AGAINST THE COVERNMENT

It will be recalled that in December, 1935, this matter was referred to the Washington Field Office of the Bureau by Assistant United States Attorney Harry H. Holt, Jr., at Morfolk, Virginia, who requested an investigation in regard to information furnished by

ber 20, 1935, the matter was referred to Colonsi F. H. Lincoln, Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department, Washington, D. C., who on February 10, 1936, furnished information to the effect that the National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics was an independent Governmental agency not under Army supervision and, for that reason, no investigation was conducted by G-2. After receiving this information, the matter was referred to Mr. Joseph B. Keenan, who on February 28, 1936, authorized the Bureau to make an investigation.

The Hational Advisory Committee for Aeronautics was created by an Act of Congress, approved March 3, 1915, for the supervision and direction of the scientific study of the problems of flight. The law creating the Committee provides that the Committee shall supervise and direct The scientific study of the

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problems of flight, with a view to their practical solution, and to determine the problems which should be experimentally attacked, and to discuss their solution and their application to practical questions. This Committee is also authorized by law to direct and conduct research and experiment in aeronautics. The Committee's laboratories are located on a portion of an army field assigned to this organization by the Secretary of War and are under the direct control of the Committee. The MACA was consequently an independent Governmental Agency, operating under an appropriation allowed to it by Congress each year, it being noted that its appropriation for the fiscal year 1937 was \$1,177,550.00.

The active management of the MACA was under the direction of Dr. George W. Lewis, Director of Aeronattical Research, and John P. Wictory, Secretary, and E. H. Chamberlin, Assistant Secretary. The MACA maintained an office in the Navy Department in Washington,

D. C., and the Laboratory at Langley Field, Virginia, the Laboratory being under the direct charge of H. J. E. Reid. Other positions held by persons mentioned hereafter in this memorandum, and their identities, are as follows:


The NACA operated a clubhouse located at Back River, Virginia, on property leased by officials of the MACA from Effic X Decker of Hampton, Virginia, the lease having been executed on July 29, 1932, by George W. Lewis, John F. Victory, Henry J. E. Reid and E. H. Chamberlin as lessees. The NACA had previously leased this same property from the same lessor. This clubhouse was the subject of the present investigation. The evidence secured in the case disclosed that Government owned material and Government labor had been used in improving, enlarging and maintaining this clubhouse. Donations of money and equipment were also made by NACA employees, and employees had on occasions worked on their own time at the clubhouse in keeping it in repair. The NACA maintained an entertainment fund to which the employees subscribed, and the money actually paid for the annual rental of the grounds upon which the clubhouse was situated came from the entertainment fund.

The purposes of the NACA camp as expressed in a memorandum dated July 28, 1923, to the NACA Committee on Personnel, Buildings and Equipment were, first, "to provide an inducement for governmental officials to visit the laboratories of the Committee and become familiar with the work of the Committee; second, to provote the morale of our own employees at Langlay Field." Officials of the NACA

justified the maintenance of the camp as a morale activity by pointing out that Langley Field was in a relatively isolated location, and opportunities for amusement were rather limited in that locality. Dr. Lewis, in discussing the purposes of the camp with the investigating agents, stated affirmatively that one of the purposes of the camp was to provide an inducement for Congressmen, particularly members of the Appropriations Committee, to go to Langley Field so that they might observe work which was being done by the Laboratory. These officials advised the investigating agents that the NACA was anxious, of course, to secure the services of young college graduates in their research activities, and that, consequently, they must compete with employers offering more inviting surroundings than those of the MACA Research Laboratories, and that consequently the clubhouse was considered desirable and even necessary to place the NACA in a more advantageous position in dealing with its exployees.

The clubhouse was a structure of about 60' in length by 25 in width, equipped with a large screen enclosed perch, which was used for sleeping quarters, and was otherwise equipped as a country camp. Assigned to the NACA at Langley Field was a 45\* motorboat, the property of the United States Government, known as the "Retriever", which was used for official business, and investigation showed that it had also been used by Congressional parties and other Governmental officials for transportation to and from the clubbouse and for fishing parties. While the boat had in the past been used by NACA employees for fishing parties, a charge of \$4 was made to the employees for such use, out of which amount the bait and tackle were purchased, and whatever amount remained was put into the general clubbouse fund. Ho charge was made to the Congressional guests and other Governmental officials for the use of the "Retriever" and clubhouse. The Congressional parties and other efficial guests did, however, pay for the food actually consumed by them at the clubhouse, this payment being made directly to the WACA Exchange.

### APPEASERS BOO F. D. R. AND ALLIES IN MEETING HERE

Cheer McCormick, Huey Long and Lindbergh: Laugh at 1st Lady.

Britain and Russia were booed last night, China's war supply needs made a subject for laughter and America's commander in chief ridiculed at a meeting of William G. Grace's revamped Citizens' Committee in session at 32 West Randolph street.

Before Pearl Harbor it was the Citizens' Keep America Out of War Committee. Grace now has reorganized with the shorter name.

As principal speaker the Rev. Gerald L. K. Smith, Detroit spell-binder, chairman of what he calls the Committee of a Million, cajoled the crowd for almost two hours. A crowd of some 500 filled the 12thfloor meeting hall,

The crowd cheered and applauded the names of Chanjes A. Lindbergh; Col. Robert R. McCormick, the Chicago Tribune, Senator C. Wayland Brooks, the late Senators Huey P. Long, Senator Geral P Nye, Representative Clarence Day, and "America First."

#### Hit Treason Charges.

A great chorus of enthusiastic attacked Representative Raymond McKeough's charge in Congress of treason against McCormick. The resolution endorsed "most heartily" the Tribune and its "editorial policy," and paid tribute to the "patriotism" of McCormick.

All but a few in the audience were middle-aged or elderly. Faces of most were stern as they entered. No men in uniform were seen,

As in similar meetings before Pearl Harbor Lindbergh's name above all was magic with the crowd. Its first mention by Smith brought the house down with cheers, high shricks of women, long hand-clapping. To that Smith came

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ponded with a r ing cheering ovation. Lindbergh's was tumultuously cheered again when Smith said that for real "unity" Nye should be brought into the cabinet, Senator Robe Reynolds of North Carolina made Secretary of War and Lindbergh appointed head of a new air arm.

"Frank Knox should resign be-fore midnight," shouled Smith waving his arms. He is a stocky dark-haired orator, whose gesture range from arm-swinging to squat-

First titters at the President's expense came when Southard, who spoke before Smith, declared that Washington and Lincoln were "isofationists" and that Lincoln made his position clear "again and again and again." Smith repeatedly Smith repeatedly brought similar titters with slurring references to the President and Mrs. Roosevelt. There were appreciative giggles, too, when Southard read a reference to China's dissatisfaction because she is not getting what she wants in lend-lease aid.

Audience Ends a Sentence.

In one of many attacks on Britain Smith said: "The dagger that's sharp enough for the kidneys of Australia is sharp enough to pass through the kidneys of —and women in the audience finished it with him-"of America."

The house came down when Smith said America First should not have disbanded and when he extolled his old intimate, Huey "the Lincoln of the Long, as South."

Smith declared he was for "vic-tory" in the war, but that "victory" meant different things to different people. He didn't want a "victory" that would "make Eleanor president," said the preacher.

"The only defeat for America would be that which destroyed the independent destiny of America," he proclaimed. "The only victory, would be that which preserved it." Throughout his speech Smith re-

iterated that what he wanted was victory for a "Christian America," nor did the cheering crowd misunderstand his implication regarding the Jewish citizens of America.

He painted the horrors of the war and said that if his "6-foot son comes back to his beautiful mother and myself in a wheelchair or blind or in a casket I pray to God let it be a victory for us, not Russia, not Britain, not the interna-tional bankers." The Reds as "Union Now" he chastised repeat-

SMITH says that the secretary of the Civil Rights Federation is JACK RASKIN who is a Communist formerly active in a sabotage strike at the Bohn Aluminum Company before the entry of the United States into the war.

On July 30, 1942, SMITH advised of Radio Station WJR, Detroit, Michigan, that SMITH had a conference with and other rubber experts of the Ford Motor Company who told him that if they are permitted, they can produce enough tires for all industrial workers in Detroit by Christmas and every industrial worker in Michigan within a year.

SMITH was preparing the report of his expenses in connection with his primary political campaign and told political campaign and told political leader, "I want to make sure that it is good enough but still don't want to make it too good." SMITH then arranged to get BERNARD'S comments on his campaign report.

Shortly before the primary election on September 15th, to be exact on the night of September 11th, 1942, a broadcast was arranged over radio station WJR in which WILLIAM POWER MALONEY spoke on the evils of seditious propaganda and closed by referring to the indictment of twenty-eight persons for sedition in Washington, D. C. The Civil Rights Federation was to follow immediately and mention that one of the seditious publications mentioned in the indictment was "The Cross And The Flag", which is published by GERALD L. K. SKITH.

Advised SMITH of this contemplated program but said there was nothing he could do to change it since the facts as stated were accurate. It should be stated here that the Civil Rights Federation is known to the Detroit Field Office as a Communist Front Organization. The broadcast was actually made as planned.

On September 13, 1942, as the primary campaign was drawing to a close SMITH commented to that the smear campaign against him was not as bad as it might have been because he thought they would by have run articles about his connection with WILLIAM DUDLEY PELLEY, who is now serving fifteen years for sedition. SMITH explained that many newspapers were hesitant to carry such information because they feared a decrease in circulation.

persisted in attempting to contact CHARLES A. LINDBERGH at the Ford Willow Run Bomber Plant. To date it is not believed that SMITH has contacted LINDBERGH but he has succeeded in having a two-hour conference with of Ford Motor Company, on September 23, 1942. At the conclusion of the conference, SMITH informs his wife that the men at the Ford Motor Company were panic stricken and were open to suggestion.

SMITH directed his secretary, to make out two separate financial reports for his political campaign, one in the name

the feelings of the British rubber monopoly.

On October 8, 1942, according to information received from SMITH had a political meeting in which he attempted to answer the argument of his enemies that he was a lieutenant of HUEY LONG. SMITH announced that HUEY LONG was a great man and that the only times he made mistakes was when he was under the influence of liquor. SMITH also said, "Before we will submit to being city-slicked by another WENDELL WILKIE or any of his Michigan stooges, we will start a new party and nominate CHARLES LINDEERGH for President."

All of SMITH'S radio addresses have been received by the writer under an arrangement as previously described. It is noted, however, that practically all of SMITH'S recent speeches have been devoted entirely to political propaganda aimed at securing his nomination as Republican Candidate for the office of United States Senator from Michigan. The following speeches made by SMITH are being retained in the files of the Detroit Field Office and are not being reported verbatim because it is felt that they pertain exclusively to political propaganda: August 30, 1942, September 9, 11, 13, 14 A.M., 14 P.M., and 15, 1942.

September 15, 1942. On September 20, 1942 SMITH explained to his friends over the radio the reasons for his defeat as being newspaper opposition, professional politicians of the Republican Party and New Deal politicians encouraging the Republican Party to nominate the Republican Candidate who would be not easily defeated by the Democrats. In his speech SMITH addressed the successful Republican Nominee Judge HOMER FERGUSON and criticized him for having not discussed the real issues of the campaigns. SMITH said that the Republicans will want to know how you stand on WENDELL WILKIE's Post-War Plan to make us part of an international empire. The people want to know whether you think the Baruch Committee on rubber is an intelligent attempt to solve this problem or merely an attempt to save the monopolies. The balance of this speech also is deemed to be purely political and is, therefore, not being quoted in full.

SMITH'S radio address on September 28, 1942 was also purely political in which SMITH suggested that he was seeking the advice of his followers to determine whether or not they thought he could run as an independent Republican Candidate. This speech also is being retained in the file of the Detroit Field Office and is not being quoted verbatim herein.
