

THE CASE OF "COUNT" ANASTASE VONSIATSKY

Disclosures of international significance are likely to come out of the Federal Grand Jury probe into the activities of Anastase A. Vonsiatsky, which is now taking place in Hartford, Connecticut, under the guidance of Thomas J. Dodd, special assistant to the Attorney General.

For years Anastase Vonsiatsky, head of the Russian National Fascist Revolutionary Party and until recently editor of The Fascist; has been weaving a net of international intrigue from his estate near the little town of Thompson, Connecticut. Himself an agent of the German and Japanese High Commands and a ringleader of the fascist White Russian fifth column in America, Vonsiatsky has been conspiring not only to overthrow the Government of the Soviet Union but also to bring about a fascist coup in the United States. Working closely with key representatives of Germany and Japan, he has helped smuggle spies, saboteurs, and terrorists into Rus sia, whose duties have included assassinating Soviet leaders. During the last ten years, he has frequently visited Berlin, Rome and Tokyo. He ran arms to Franco-Spain to aid the Axis-inspired uprising in that country. He aided in the organization of a fascist White Russian Army on Japanese soil which is now awaiting orders from Tokyo to launch an attack against the Soviet Union. On his Connecticut estate, he maintained an elaborate arser al of rifles, machine guns, tear gas equipment, etc; and he trained score: of uniformed swastika-wearing young men in preparation for the day when Fascism would come to America.

For carrying on his multifarious plottings, the former Czarist officer had at his disposal the immense fortune of his wife, nee Marion Ream, who inherited a one-seventh share of the \$40,000,000 Ream estate in Chicago. The American heiress and the penniless Russian emigre met in Paris in 1921, and were married shortly afterwards. At the time he was twenty-three and she was forty-five.

Vonsiatsky Exposed in The Hour in 1939

On July 30, 1939, The Hour carried an article, entitled "Fritz Kuhn's Week-End Host Participated in Murders," which exposed Vonsiatsky's fifth column activities in the United States. Our report also brought to light a confession he had written many years before, describing a series of torture-murders in which he had participated. We urged in this article, and in subsequent reports, that the U.S. authorities conduct a thorough investigation of Vonsiatsky.

When the Federal Grand Jury hearings started this week in Hartford, one of the first witnesses to be summoned was The Hour reporter who assisted in preparing our articles on Vonsiatsky.

DETROIT FIFTH COLUMNIST REFRINTS ENDORSEMENT BY SENATOR REYNOLDS

Current Issue of Smith's cross and Flag Also Announces Smith's Candidacy for U. S. Senate

The May issue of The Cross and The Flag, the seditious magazine being published in Detroit by Gerald L. K. Smith, ex-Silver Shirter No. 3223, devotes its entire back page to a promotional article based on an endorsement received from Senator Robert R. Reynolds of North Carolina (see The Hour for April 18 and May 2). At the top of the page are several lines of bold type reading: "United States Senator Robert R. Reynolds, Chairman of the Military Affairs Committee, said, when interviewed by the Associated Press concerning THE CROSS AND THE FLAG: ..." The item then proceeds to quote Senator Reynolds' statement endorsing Smith's subversive sheet which, in the Senator's words, stands "for the things I have stood for for many years." The article also quotes from a personal letter received by Smith from Reynolds, congratulating the Detroit fifth columnist on the first edition of The Cross and The Flag. Smith proudly remarks, "This is merely one of the thousands of testimonials that have come in, favorable to this crusading, patriotic journal."

Emboldened by the support he is receiving from congressmen such as Senator Reynolds, Gerald L. K. Smith strikes out with increasing venom against the Administration in his current issue. In his characteristic demagogic style, he attacks the "bureaucrats and politicians" in Washington for their supposedly incompetent prosecution of the war. The temporary setbacks suffered by the U. S. armed forces in the Pacific are pictured by Smith as "bloody circumstances" brought about by "boondoggling bureaucrats and racketeers in Washington, who not only should be fired but should be locked in jail for the duration." The Government investigation of Father Coughlin's pro-Nazi activities is represented as a "communist" plot to persecute the Royal Oak priest. Two pages are given over to reprinting an attack by Congressman Martin Dies on Vice-President Henry Wallace.

Some individuals, however, come in for hearty praise in the latest issue of Smith's seditious journal. They are Charles A. Lindbergh, the Naziphile flyer who so energetically strove to prevent this country from being prepared to face the Axis onslaught; Father Charles E. Coughlin, until recently Goebbels' foremost U. S. spokesman; Father Edward Lodge Curran, eastern Fuehrer of the Christian Front; Elizabeth Dilling, notorious anti-Semitic propagandist; Dr. Gerald B. Winrod, Kansas pro-Axis agitator; Col. Robert McCormick, publisher of the Chicago Tribune; Col. J. M. Patterson, publisher of the New York Daily News; Eleanor Patterson, publisher of the Washington Times-Herald; William Randolph-Hearst; Congressman Martin Dies; and Senator Robert R. Reynolds. The traitor Smith, who once boasted to his jailbird boss Pelley of forming the first Silver Shirt stormtroop band in the United States, describes the above-mentioned individuals as "fearless Americans who have exposed the subterranean operations of the Red revolutionaries without mercy."

Smith's Political Plans

The feature article in the current issue of The Cross and The Flag is entitled "My Hat's In the Ring." In it Smith announces he will be a candidate in Michigan this fall for election to the U. S. Senate. The sort of backing he hopes to get is obvious. "I will be supported by the old-fashioned, Christian, American people," he says. He makes an open bid for the support of Christian Front, German-American Bund elements by including this plank in his program:

"I shall defend the right of free speech and free press for Father Charles E. Coughlin. The treatment that this minister of Christ is receiving at the hands of the bloodthirsty Reds is unbelievable."

With the United States engaged in a life and death struggle against the Axis powers, the seditious, disruptive propagandizing of this 20th Century Benedict Arnold constitutes an ever-increasing danger to the American people. The Hour therefore urges that the Department of Justice immediately suppress The Cross and The Flag and conduct a thorough investigation of the treasonable activities of Gerald L. K. Smith, examining with particular care his ties with certain members of the Congress of the United States.

DETROITER CALLS FOR PRO-AXIS "PEACE"

Robert S. Aspinwall of Detroit, who describes himself as "President of The Lincoln Manufacturing Company -- Specialists in Flourescent Lighting," is currently distributing seditious literature through the United States mails. This literature is in the form of a small, neatly printed pamphlet, entitled Our One Hope of Peace, which contains defeatist, pro-Axis propaganda.

Camcuflaged as a pseudo-economic tract which presents the "solution" of the world's present problems, Aspinwall's booklet contains such spurious comments as the following:

"In the first world war we used a number of slogans to give popular expression to the object for which we were fighting. We were told this was 'The war to end wars' -- that we were fighting for 'The preservation of freedom and democracy.'

"But to those of us who carefully study and analyze the situation there are many questions, many puzzling facts that do not seem to be clearly nor adequately explained by such simple and obvious reasons.

"Certainly we are called upon to defend ourselves against attack but on further reflection the people of the attacking nations are not a particularly warlike type."

Why then, asks Aspinwall, is the United States fighting the Germans and the Japanese? Hainly, he answers, because this country's harsh economic measures against Berlin and Tokyo forced the war on these nations. The Detroit pamphleteer then reasons:

Thus it seems that the United States through a lack of understanding and commonsense has been jockeyed into a position of fighting for a cause that is both unjust and detrimental to civilization ... Of course the nations in question , with which the U. S. is at war have adopted a brutal and barbaric method of accomplishing their aims but there seemed to be no other way for them to achieve their desires, for the U.S. had made it definitely clear that every effort would be made to protect home industry. Further than that the United States in company with other nations made it clear that if any attempt was made by force to expand the sphere of influence of these [fascist] nations that every help short of war would be given to any nation on whom force was used. ... this war might be brought to a reasonable conclusion by acknowledging our error and by the promise of cooperation when their the Axis process are offered in payment for things they need." (Italics ours)

Times Advertises Aspinwall's Book

Interestingly enough, on April 26 and May 3 the New York Times carried advertisements for Aspinwall's pro-Axis booklet. Both advertisements, which were headed "Our One Hope of Peace," read as follows:

"This war is a struggle for the control of raw materials and the issue can never be settled by fighting. A lasting peace can be achieved by free trade — free trade not only between nations but between ourselves as well. Send ten cents for booklet, 'Our One Hope of Peace,' Robert S. Aspinwall, 2630 Erskine St., Detroit, Michigan."

It seems that the advertising department of the New York Times should exercise greater care in checking the sort of literature it promotes. Aspinwall's above characterization of this war as a "struggle for the control of raw materials ... which can never be settled by fighting" should alone have been sufficient to arouse the suspicions of any copy reader familiar with President Roosevelt's definition of this conflict as "A War of Survival."



CONGRESS WAITS FOR THE VOICE OF THE PEOPLE

Senator Bennett Champ Clark of Missouri, who, together with Charles Lindbergh on Saturday at the America First mass meeting expressed himself against the participation of America in the war, appealed to the citizenry to write or wire now to their representatives in Congress that they should take a stand against the war, against convoys and against all measures that lead to war. 'The great majority of the people is against war and Congress has to follow this sentiment' quoting Clark.

According to his experiences on his speaking trip the great majority of the people, who are against the war policies, would write to their Congressmen, if they were not in fear that the FBI in consequence would investigate them. Senator Clark called that a false opinion and told those people as well as the audience that in such cases they should address themselves to him, and he would then investigate the FBI. !

Lindbergh Bitterly Attacks U.S. Alliance With Russia

SAN FRANCISCO, July 7 Russia was fighting Finland, (AP)—Charles A. Lindbergh the interventionists demanded bitterly denounced Russia at an anti-war mass meeting Tuesday night and declared "I would a hundred times rather see my country ally herself with England, or even with Germany with all her faults, than with the cruelty, the godlessness, and the barbarism that exist in soviet Russia."

"An alliance between the United States and Russia should be opposed by every American, by every Christian, and by every humanitarian in this country," Lindbergh said in an address prepared for delivery at a civic auditorium meeting sponsored by the America First committee.

Lindbergh's talk was broadcast over the National and Mutual networks.

The longer this war in Europe continues, the more confused its issues become," Lindbergh said. "When it started, Germany and Russia were lined up against England and France. Now, less than two years later, we find Russia and England fighting France and Germany. Winter before last, when the interventionists demanded that we send all possible aid to Finland. Now, when Russia is fighting Finland again, they demand that we send all possible aid to Russia.

Ex-Enemies Now Allies

"The murderers and plunderers of yesterday are accepted as the valiant defenders of civilization today; and the valiant defenders of yesterday have become the wicked aggressors of today. Finland and France are now our enemies; Russia our friend. We have been asked to defend the English way of life, and the Chinese way of life. We are now asked to defend the Russian way of life.

"Judging from Europe's record, if we enter this war, we can't be sure whether we will have Russia or Germany for a partner by the time we finish it. We don't even know whether we will end up with France or England on our side. It is quite possible that we would find ourselves alone fighting the entire world before it was over.

"The only sensible thing for us to do is to build an impregnable defense for America and keep this hemisphere at peace.

The America First Committee is reported to be financed solely by voluntary contributions by those interested in the organisation. The Committee conducted a radio broadcast on October 21, 1940, at which time the radio announcer requested his listeners to send anything from dimes to dellars to the America First Committee, Board of Trade Building, Chicago, Illinois, and this same request was made following numerous other broadcasts.

The Committee has also issued a card salled "America First Committee Contribution Card," bearing the following:

"I am convinced that we can preserve our American Democracy only by keeping out of foreign war. Therefore I am contributing 5 to support the Nork of the America First Consittee."


On October 21, 1940, Booke Carter was sponsored in a transcription program of Station NHAC, Chicago, Illinois, by the America First Committee. In this broadcast Carter explained that the Committee was dedicated to aid America first and later to aid Britain. Following the transcription, the announcer suggested that the listeners write their congresseen and senstors demanding that they prevent the United States' intervention into the war and

that they arm America before aiding Britain and also requesting the audience to send in anything from dimes to dollars to the America First Committee, Board of Trade Building, Chicago, Illinois.

A confidential informant stated that the america First Committee was started by General Wood in cooperation with the other members of the Committee and that although the Committee's viewpoints in connection with the United States' present policy in foreign affairs is different from that of the administration, he is of the epinion that the Committee originally had a few persons in it who were what he termed "left-wingers" and according to him are not to be considered Communistic.



On December 18, 1940, the America First Committee sponsored a rally in Orchestra Hall, Chicago, Illinois, at which rally 3500 persons attended and several thousand were turned away.


Information received from a confidential source, reveals that on January 16 the office of the America First Committee was opened on Wilshire Boulevard, Los Angeles, California, and it was observed that the automobile of Dr. Georg Gyssling, German Consul was parked in front of the building during that day. The informant related that this car had never been seen there previously and has not been seen there since that time.

The America First Committee has published an enormous amount of propaganda literature concerning the aims of the Committee and has circulated this literature throughout the United States. The apparent object of the literature is to crystallise American opinion to prevent the entrance of the United States into European wars and to villify the foreign affairs program of President Roosevelt. The numerous pamphlets published by the Committee state that 86% of the people of the United States are opposed to the United States intervening in foreign wars. These pamphlets fail to make any explanation as to how the figure of 86% was arrived at. This literature also makes an appeal to American mothers to aid the Committee for the purpose of preventing

their sons from being embroiled in another European war. The foreign program of President Roosevelt is termed "the road to war" by the literature emanating from this committee.

Friends of Democracy, Incorporated, L. M. Birkhead,

published a pemphlet entitled the "America First Committee, the Maxi

As you were previously advised, Attorney General FRANCIS BIDDLE requested me, when on the West Coast, to have the: meeting of the AMERICA FIRST COMMITTEE at which Senator BURTON K. WHEELER was to speak in Los Angeles, attended for the purpose of furnishing him with a report.

This meeting was held at the Olympic Auditorium in Los Angeles at 8:00 p.m., October 2, 1941, and the auditorium was filled to capacity. There was an estimated attendance of slightly .000,8 revo

The hall was well-decorated with American flags, bunting, and various signs bearing slogans such as "NO A.E.F.," and "Keep Our Factories Humming for National Defense, But Keep Our Boys in the United States. While the auditorium was being filled, community singing was engaged in, and at 8:10 p.m., Senator WHEELER and his party, including a woman dressed in a costume as the Statue of Liberty and an Indian in full costume including a feathered head dress, mounted the speaker's platform. From the ovation extended the Senator at that time, it was obvious that the audience was very sympathetic and friendly towards the AMERICA FIRST COMMITTEE and Senator WHEELER. At this time the crowd rose to its feet and afforded the senator a demonstrative reception. There was applauding, screaming, and much waving of handkerchiefs then and at various other times during the meeting. There was a vocal number of the AMERICA FIRST COMMITTEE song and the song of the Gold Star Mothers of America, both of these following the playing of the national anthem.

grandmother had presented him with a Liberty Bond, stating it to be a token that the last World War was one waged for righteousness and it was her investment in his future, made in the hope that he could live in a peaceful, free, and democratic world. After the Treaty of Versailles, his grandmother stated to him that she had been deluded, and that the treaty was one which would only lead to more wars. He continued by stating the Government, in order to pay the bond and its indebtedness, which is evidenced by the bond, actually taxed him in order to pay the debt which was due him.

He stated, therefore, that the collection which would be taken up that evening was an investment, and that the cost of any future war would essume staggering proportions in so far as it would relate to any individual. He added that any money which was contributed might well be regarded as an investment to protect the people against future greater debts. It was his opinion that the minimum cost per citizen—should we enter this war—would be \$2,000, and approximately \$7,000 per bread-winner. At this time the ushers passed up and down the aisles taking a collection. It is not known at this time how much was obtained.

Senator WHEELER was introduced by JOHN STEVEN McGROARTY, who referred to the senator as a lifelong friend. McGROARTY is referred to as the poet laureate of California, and was at one time a member of the United States Congress.

The theme of Senator WHEELER'S speech was conerning the fact that there are many people in America today who were against this country's entry into any war, but were afraid to speak. He is too frequently met with the response, "We Are in business," meaning that people were not in a position to express their views as they were in business and were actually against entry into war but were afraid to express their opinions. He stated he was unalterably opposed to America's entry into any foreign war and was now trying to force the President to keep the promises made to the American people when he was seeking their votes to re-elect him to a third term. against war, and he defined war as meaning shooting. He also quoted President ROOSEVELT'S pledge that American boys would never be sent outside of the Western Hemisphere. He then stated that President ROOSEVELT had broken these pledges inasmuch as he had ordered the American Navy to shoot and also that he had occupied Iceland after consulting the Parliament of Iceland without consulting the Congress of the United States, and that he had stationed American soldiers in Iceland under command of British officers. He added that Iceland is situated in the Eastern Hemisphere and that "Not even a magician like WENDELL LAWILLKIE could bring it back into the Western Hemisphere."

Senator WHEELZR launched an attack upon President ROOSEVELT'S statement that religious freedom in Russia is the same as in America. He quoted figures as to the number of priests, bishops, and other clergymen who had been killed by Communist overlords, and then gave as his source for these figures the title of a book, volume, and page number, the book being one written by WINSTON CHURCHILL. This statement was met with wild applause and enthusiastic cheering.

He then stated that from this fact, it might well be assumed that American soldiers would shortly be fighting side by side with Communist soldiers for the protection and preservation of Communist Russia. During the course of the speech, Senator WHEELER also stated he was against Nazi oppression and mentioned a tour he had made through Germany and the persecution he had witnessed there.

He referred to the present cooperation between England and Russia, and stated it was an "Unholy Alliance." The Senator launched an attack against the motion picture industry, and stated that the people in attendance at this meeting had not been attracted by glamorous movie stars, Bingo, bank night, and so forth. He attacked the industry as spreading war propaganda and stated that in years to come, the motion picture industry would the stated that in industry was attempting to build up a war spirit, resulting in active participation in the war. In speaking of the motion picture industry, he referred to the stand which

is being taken towards the Jewish race, adding that this is the reason this industry is putting forth every effort by way of propaganda pictures. He stated Jewish refugees have come to this country and are presently being feted and living in luxury and attempting to have the United States fight the war for them and for their cause. He criticized the regiment of British actors who are serving the present war from Hollywood Boulevard, and stated he was aware that not all of the producers were engaged in war propaganda, adding that the Senate investigation is directed against those who are.

During his talk, the senator stated that he was not anti-British, that he greatly admired the British people for being smart people, and he always admired smart people. He sarcastically outlined the role played by Great Britain during the last war, stating that that nation first requested America for money, which was furnished; then they requested a small token army to boost the morals of the allies, and a token army was given, which was followed by the A.E.F. He stated we did this because the smart people in England had told America it was fighting her war. He stated that when the war was over and after many of the men sent over failed to return, when America tried to collect her war debt, the smart people of England characterized America as "Uncle Shylock."

He then drew a parallel in present day events in the Lend-Lease Bill and the transfer of bombers and ships, and stated that shortly the President was contemplating introducing a bill authorizing the arming of American merchant ships. He stated that prior to the last war, a bill authorizing the arming of merchant ships was passed, and 21 days later America was in war.

The senator did not refer to Germany and Italy to any extent, only stating that the world has no room for dictators and dictatorships, and that Americans will continue to live in a democracy by supplying England with materials to carry on her war against the Rome-Berlin Axis.

He also mentioned CHARLES LINDBERGH as being a true and loyal American citizen who puts heritage above all, and he is being supported by all real Americans. This statement was received

with great enthusiasm by the audience.

The meeting was generally orderly, with only two incidents being noted by the observers. Upon launching his attack against the movie industry, one person in the audience rose and called Senator WHEELER a liar. It was a minor disturbance, and this individual was ejected by the police. A middle-aged woman stalked down the aisle on the main floor of the auditorium to inspect the Indian at close range, stating she did not believe he was a real Indian. There was no violence with this incident, and the entire thing was greeted with laughter by the audience.

In general, the audience was very attentive and receptive, and the applauded the speaker most loudly when he referred to statements about keeping America out of the present war and keeping American boys at home. Although his accusations against the President of not keeping his 1940 campaign promises, and his jests of WENDELL L. WILLKIE drew applause from the audience, at no time was there hissing or booing at the mention of the name of the President or that of WENDELL L. WILLKIE. Before, during, and after the meeting, pamphlets and papers were passed out and copies of two of them are being attached to this communication. The Los Angeles press reports that 11,000 persons were in attendance at the meeting.

Lindbergh Fears Loss of Liberties

Tells Fort Wayne Rally

Be My Last'

FORT WAYNE, Ind., Oct. 3.—
(INS)—The administration has shown by "many signs" that it may clamp down on free speech and end free government in America. Charles Ay Lindbergh declared tonight in an address which he said "may be my last."

In the first speech he has given since the one in Des Moines for which he has been under fire, the aviator hinted that he believed the end of free elections was in sight. "The time has come when we must consider even that," he said.

Lindbergh opened his address before an America First rally with

Sees Many Signs

"How much longer free speech will be possible in the United States, I do not know. But I do know that an administration which can throw this country into undeclared naval war against the will of our people and without asking the consent of congress can by similar methods prevent freedom of speech among us.

There are many signs that such action may be taken in the near future, with as little warning as accompanied the occupation of Ice-

If free speech ends in this country, it means that we are no longer a free people. It means that we are about to enter dictatorship and probably foreign war. It means that we will be forced to do this against the will of the people just as we have been forced into an amdeclared naval war against the will of our people.

Dangers Sketched

Sketching the dangers he said America now faces, Lindbergh continued:

The interventionists claim we have reached our present position by taking steps which the majority of the people approved of, and that, therefore, the will of the people has prevailed. The fact is that we reached the recommendation of the interventionists and our administration in Washington. Not one step the administration has taken in these last two years has been placed honestly before our people as a step toward war.

"Instead of seizing every opportunity to draw us further from the war, the president and his administration have not missed a single chance to push us closer to it. Instead of avoiding incidents of war, they have created them. Instead of following our mandate to stay out, they have, by subterfuge and dictatorial procedure, led us in.

They have not only turned their backs on their campaign promises but they have been treating our congress more and more as the German reichstag has been treated under the Nazi regime.

"Congress, like the reichstag, is not consulted."

Gleomy Picture Given

Fointing to the consequences of
entering the war, Lindbergh saserted that it would be necessary to
turn America into an armed camp,
create a military force strong
enough to cross the Atlantic and invade the continent and survive a
coming wave of prostration, famine
and disease.

The aviator charged that administration leaders have not presented a fair picture of these consequences.

"It is essential for us to realize that what we used to call representative government, American andependence and the American and of life is rapidly becoming a thing of the past," he said.

"Recently—no one will ever know the exact date—we began following a road which involved the abandoment of our most fundamental customs and traditions... We must face the fact that you and I and our generation have lost our American heritage. It is no longer a case of defending it. It is a case of rebuilding it.



Btill another America Pirst backer, the so-called National Workers League of Detroit winers inherited the dregs of the notorious Black Legion, wrote this in a recent issue of its confidential bulletin: "Fellow citizens! Don't you often feel a primitive urge to get your hands around the throat of one of these 'democrats' who believe in Union Now with England? It seems murder does have some patriotic values."

Lest it be believed that these are but the expressions of crackpots or of a lunatic fringe, it should be known that these groups now backing America First are in turn backed, supported and encouraged by men within the

The following information concerning the above organization was obtained from an outside unknown source dated at New York, New York, on August 4, 1941.

This organization was originally planned by R. Douglas Stuart, Jr., 24 year old law school senior in 1940 at Yale University. He is the son of the first vice president of the Quaker Oats Company. The first person contacted when the committee was formed was Col Lindbergh, and another was Early Browder. These people met with Stuart and later on General Robert Wood, head of Sears-Roebuck Company, Edward L. Ryerson a director of Inland Steel; Mrs. Jeanette Ayer Fairbanks, a wealthy woman; and Chester Bowles, chairman of Benton and Bowles, an advertising agency, made up the picture. Secretly there was a tremendous Jewish group backing the America First until just recently. JOYNSON, Auditorium Manager, permitting the meeting in the Auditorium. This article further reveals that Lindbergh notified the America First Leaders that he would speak on mair power" anywhere the appearance can be arranged. On August 28, 1941 the Daily Oklahoman published an article stating that the Sandlot Baseball Park 3200 N. W. 10th Street had been rented for the America First Committee's rally to be addressed by CHARLES A. LINDBERGH and BURTON K. WHEELER on August 29. On a day later, August29, 1941 CARL J. STEWART, Managing Editor of the Daily Oklahoman and Oklahoma City Times published the following letter which was delivered to Charles A. Lindbergh upon his arrival in Oklahoma City August 28, 1941. The letter reads as follows:

"It has been announced that Friday you will speak in this community for the cause of isolationism. Of all the persons advocating this idea, you are perhaps its most persuasive sponsor. I think I have read carefully every press report of your recent utterances. Almost without exception, I find them negative. They abound in "shall nots" without, as I see it, offering any valid alternatives.

Perhaps in your mind there are alternatives. If that is the case you should, in all honesty and candor, state them also.

To focus your attention upon the gaps that appear to me in your platform for America, and doubtless to millions of other Americans, I submit to you the following 10 questions, together with my sincere recommendation that frank and responsive replies to them can hardly fail to serve

a very useful purpose at this time:

1 -- Did you not, prior to lend-lease express the conviction that Britain alone never can defeat Germany?

- 2 -- Did you not also publicly oppose the lend-lease bills?
- 5 -- If your answer to these questions is "yes" does it not necessarily follow that you would rather see a peace on Germany's terms, than to see the United States take any action to prevent such a development?
- 4 -- Do you think "Germany's terms" would be anything less than complete political and economic domination of the entire European continent?
- 5 -- Do you think such a peace would be telerable to the United States?
- 6 -- Do you think a democratic western hemisphere could do business with a totalitarian eastern hemisphere on any other basis than slave-labor competition and an armed truce?
- 7 -- Would you, as an American, rather face the prospect of making and maintaining the United States as an armed camp for the next 50 years than to take any steps to help insure the defeat of Germany?
- 8 -- You said recently that as between Germany and Russia, you would rather see the United States allied with Germany. I assume this statement was made with due regard to the realities of the situation, and that it means that you would rather ally the United States with Germany against Britain, than with Russia against Germany. Is that your position?
- 9 Does your view of the course the United States should take in this world revolution arise out of a personal belief that democratic framework of government have been cutmoded and that the only nations that will be able to compete in the world of the future must be organized as a totalitarian pattern?
- 10- Are you prepared to recommend this view to the American people?

I await your reply when you are here Friday.

Former Governor MURRAY said he was present at the meeting because he believed that in the Capitol city of his Sate the right of free speech was in danger and that he felt it his duty to attend. The writer attended the rally of the America First Committee on 8-29-41 at Sandlot Park in which CHARLES LINDBERGH and Senator BURTON K. WHEELER spoke on behalf of the America First Committee.

Following is the speech of CHARLES A. LINDBERGH as deliwered in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma on August 29, 1941:

"As you all know, I stand with the men and women in America who oppose our entering this war in Europe. There are many reasons why I believe we should not enter the war. I have discussed these reasons freely and openly in articles and radio addresses during the last two years. I have said that I did not believe it was within our power to control the wars, or to solve the problems that have existed in Europe since European history began. I have said that we were hot prepared to wage war abroad successfully at this time, and that we would not be prepared to do so for months if not for years to come.

I have said that our participation in this war would simply add to bloodshed and prostration in Europe, and bring confusion to our own country. I have said that the United States is strong enough and able enough to protect itself, and that we in America do not have to depend upon any foreign country for our security and welfare.

To these statements and beliefs, I hold as firmly today as I have at any time in the past. Developments since the war started have already partially proved them correct; and I think that by the time the war ends, you will find I have in no way misled you.

But tonight, I am going to lay aside the broader issues of the war, and talk to you about air power, its capabilities, its limitations, and its consequences. I have selected air power as my subject for two reasons. First, because of its great military importance; and second, because aviation has become a symbol of this modern, scientific and mechanized era in which we live. Germany has used aviation to change the entire technique of warfare both on land and on the sea. England is using aviation to strike back at a continent she is unable to invade. The American interventionists are using aviation to justify the occupation of Iceland, to prepare the way for an accupation of Africa, and to add to the general hysteria of the war. The capitalists are using aviation to make money, and the taxpayer is finding aviation a more and more expensive item on his bill.

I spent many years of my life surveying and laying out air routes in North and South America, and across the Atlantic and Pacific oceans One of the greatest problems I encountered in those years lay in the difficulty of persuading people that aviation was actually a practical from of transportation; that, some day, this country would be spanned in a single night by passenger carrying air-liners -- and that, eventually, even the oceans themselves would be flown on regular schedule.

That was only a little over 10 years ago. Now I find myself in the novel position of arguing that aviation has certain limitations as have all of the other inventions of man. Ten years ago, I was trying to donvince the government and the people of this country that transoceanic

passenger carrying was not only possible, but also practical. Today, I am trying to assure our government and our people that while transceeanic bombing is possible, it is not practical, and that the damage it could do on wartime standards would be slight.

I find the same people who scoffed at transatlantic air routes 10 years ago, now telling me that if the British empire does not win this war, the United States of America will be conquered by air invaders from Europe. They say that the world's two greatest oceans are no barrier to bombing planes, and that at any moment we may find trans-oceanic parachuse troops raining down on the streets of our major cities.

Our own president has talked about air invasions by way of icecapped Greenland, and about others based on the jungles of Central and South America -- incidentally, at cruising speeds that are far higher than any racing plane has yet attained. Well, 10 years ago, those of us who believed in aviation set out to make this country "air minded." We seem to have succeeded, and now I suppose it is our job to get its feet safely back onto the ground. Now that we have become "air minded," our next problem is to learn how to operate aircraft to our best advantage.

But from what I say here, do not gain the impression that aviation has reached its ultimate development. It has still far to go both in commerce and in war. The bombing plane will become more destructive, the pursuit plane more effective, and the commercial plane more efficient than they are today. It is even possible that the discovery of new sources of energy will permit us to build rocket planes in the future which will outperform the mythical bombers of our present day politicians and interventionists. With unlimited energy available, one can conceive of speed limited only by the acceleration the human body can withstand. In that case, our descendants may some day accelerate halfway across the ocean, and "decelerate" the rest of the way across. If new sources of energy are discovered, the power of explosives will also increase. And then, in some future generation, fifty, or a hundred, or a thousand years from now, the United States may be as vulnerable to attack from Europe as England is today.

Now, I am sure that many interventionists will feel that since we may some day harness the atom and travel in rockets, we should go to war immediately to make the world safe for whatever system of government exists in that unknown and distant time. But I am among those non-interventionists who feel that we have enough problems to solve in our own generation; and that if our grandchildren insist on splitting atoms and building rockets, it must be upon their own responsibility. I believe that our generation will have accomplished its duty if we pass on to our children a free and independent imerican heritage that is not too greatly burdened with the debts of war. And so, for the present at least, I am willing to pass the atom and the rocket plan over to the interventionists, to hold in trust for generations of the future.

In discussing air power, we should start with the realisation that man's conquest of the air will bring revolutionary changes to the entire

world, and that the changes which take place in one portion of the world are bound to affect in some degree all other portions. Whatever affects America affects Europe and Asia; and, conversely, whatever affects Europe and Asia is bound to have more or less effect on America.

. . .

Possibly we can appreciate the significance of air power better by considering the effect that sea power has had on the relationship and fortunes of nations. The comparison is not exact, but it is enlightening. And one must remember that aviation has developed as much in a generation as shipping developed over a period of centuries.

Now when great changes in methods of warfare take place, history shows that empires and nations fall, and other rise instead. The important problem for us in this country to solve, is how to turn the changes of this modern era to our adventage and how to avoid having them used against us. If we use air power intelligently, we can increase our national safety, add to our standard of living, and improve the quality of our civilization. But if we do not use air power intelligently, if we expose ourselves unnecessarily, if we fail to understand its limitations as well as its advantages if we allow some foreign nation to turn the developments of modern warfare against us we may find our national safety in jeopardy, and our standard of living far lower than it is today. In fact, air power if unintelligently handled, could bring the downfall of the very civilization which created it.

After a careful study of this problem, both in America and Europe, over a period of years, I was forced to the conclusion that France and England were not in a position to win a war against Germany, and that the dominant position in Europe had shifted from England, as a sea power, to Germany as a land and air power. The same study brought me to the conclusion that while aviation greatly strengthened our position in America from the standpoint of defense, it greatly weakened our position from the standpoint of attacking Europe.

I based these conclusions upon many observations and facts, there is not time to outline all of them tonight, but I would like to bring some of the most outstanding to your attention:

It was obvious, even before this war started, that air power made it costly, if not impossible, for naval forces to operate within effective bombing range of an enemy coast adequately protected by aircraft. This meant that troops could not be landed and maintained on any coast where an enemy had strong supremacy of the air. These facts have been confirmed by the results of naval and air battles off the coast of Norway, in the Skagerrak, in the North Sea, off the coast of Greece, and in the vicinity of Sicily and Crete, Wherever sea power and air power have clashed during this war, there is not a sigle instance where sea power has won.

It was obvious, before the war started, that Germany had by far the strongest air force in Europe, and that air power could strike across the English channel and behind the Maginot line, regardless of the strength of the British navy or the French Army. These facts, too, have been confirmed by the developments of the war.

It was obvious that aviation, and the mechanization of ground forces, among other elements, placed Garmany among others in a stronger position under Hitler than France was in under Napoleon.

It was obvious that England lay within idea bombing range of aircraft based on the continent of Europe, and that her sea lanes could be harassed both by submarines and bombing planes. German objectives, on the other hand, were farther removed from bases in the British Isles; so that even if England and Germany had equal numbers of fighting planes the advantage would still lie with Germany.

It was just as obvious that the great distance across the ocean placed America outside the effective bombing range of European aircraft, and that even if it were possible to establish European air bases in South America which I beli3ve we can prevent, the United States would still be outside of their effective bombing range.

After I had traveled through the various nations of Europe and Asia, I came to the conclusion that there were two, and only two, great and natural air powers in the world at this time -- the United States, in the western hemisphere, and Germany, in the eastern hemisphere. I was convinced that neither was in a position to attack the other successfully across the ocean unless an internal collapse preceded an invasion. It seems clear to me that the quickest way for Germany to lose the war would be to attack America and that the quickest way for America to lose a war would be to attack Germany.

By way of illustration suppose we should follow the lead of the interventionists and enter a war against Germany. In that case, we must send the great bulk of our armies, and supplies, and fuel, across the Atlantic ocean on ships - ships that would have to be built, for there are not enough in existence today. The vulnerability of the shipping to bombing planes, raiders and submaries, has already been shown by British losses. Our conwoys would be harassed in the Atlantic by Germany, and possibly in the Pacific by Japan at the same time. And under this harassment by bombing plane, raider and submarine we would have to find some way of forcing a landing, on a hostile coast. We would have to force a landing against the prepared positions of the same army and air force that broke the Maginot line and overcame the British, French and Belgian armies combined. We might easily find ourselves fighting, at one and the same time, the military forces of Germany, Italy, France, Spain, Japan and other nations, with the natural resources of Bussia available to them. And it is not at all inconceivable that before this war is over, England herself may turn against us, as she has turned against France and Finland. Reasons are always found to justify whatever action a nation takes in time of war. It was no more improbable in 1939 that England would turn against Finland and France, than it is today that she will turn against us if

it becomes expedient to her welfare in the future. If you question my words now, I ask only that you read a history of the relationships between the United States and England during the last hundred and fifty years, and that you combine with this a re-reading of the pledges of everlasting loyalty that took place between England and France less than two years ago. If you will do this, I believe you will agree with me that we must depend upon ourselves and ourselves only, for our security in the future.

Now instead of following the lead of the interventionists, suppose we concentrate on our own defenses, as I have advocated, since long before this war began. I have maintained that if we attend properly to our own defense, no European or Asiatic power will dam to attack us; and that if we attend properly to our own affairs, none will desire to. But suppose that the fears of the interventionists come true, and we are attacked. In that case it would be our enemy, and not we, who would have to force a landing on a histile coast. It would be our enemy, and not we, who would have to maintain supply lines across the ocean against the harassment of our bombing plane our submarines, and our battleships. In that case, we could use our own aviation to the utmost advantage, concentrating it within a few hours at any point on our shores, and basing it on established and well-equipped air fields. If the British navy with its bases strung out from Alexandria to Scapa Flow if that navy with Gibraltar and Malta to assist it, cannot remain within bombing range of the European coast, then how can any navy, or any combination of navies, cross the ocean, and without a single base in this hemisphere, land an expeditionary force on American shores?

Instead of reducing the value of the Atlantic and Pacific oceans from the standpoint of our security, aviation makes them more important than ever before. Air power practically removes the danger of attack by sea; and the oceans themselves prevent effective attacks by air.

Let us take advantage of this fact. Let us take advantage of the changes that aircraft and this modern era bring to nations and to men. Let us use these changes to our advantage, and not permit them to be used against us. They can either strengthen our American independence, and add to the quality of our western civilization, or they can take us back into the endless wars and quarrels of the old world. The nation that makes use of these advantages will survive, and the nation which fails to understand them is certain to fall. The choice is the test of America, and the way of life we have built up in this new world.

We have the most perfect defensive position of any nation. We have highly developed industries, and an entire hemisphere full of natural resources. Here in America we have developed new standards of life and a new civilization; and our forefathers fought for the right to do so. Our entire national tradition is based on independence. Shall we now give up the independence we have won, and crusade abroad in a utopian attempt to force our

ideas on the rest of the world; or shall we use air power, and other advances of modern warfare, to guard and strengthen the independence of our nation; Shall we sell our American birthright for the mess of pottage that is offered us in Europe and Asia today; or shall we preserve for our children the free and independent heritage that our forefathers passed on tu us?

The America First Committee is an organization of men and women who stand firmly opposed to merging our future with that of any foreign
land. We stand for a united nation behind an impregnable defense and an
independent destiny for America. We stand for American traditions -- for the
right of free citizens to meet, and to discuss the issues that confront their
nation; for the right to know about, and to vote upon, the fundamental policies
of our government. We stand for the right of those who will do the paying and
the dying to also have a voice in the deciding.

If you stand with us, we ask you to join our committee. Our strength is growing in every section of the country. But we need your assistance here in Oklahoma. We need your assistance that freedom and independence and representative government, may continue to live in this nation.

Senator BURTON K. WHEELER reiterated his opposition to active participating in the present war and scorned alleged propaganda, "jus like that used in the last war." Senator WHEELER attacked the action of the City Council and stated, "I am glad the people of this state don't feel about CHARLES LINDBERGH as your city council does. There isn't a more honest, decent, patrictic man in America." Turning to haticnal affairs the Senator declared himself, "opposed to every kind of "ism' except Americanism, even if you must call it New Dealism." WHEELER further declared "our boys would have to be sent to all parts of the world, to police India, China and other places and I am not in favor of sending American boys to die on the battle-fields of Europe or Asia. If we go to Europe to save democracy again, we are likely to lose it in this country. "Membership cards were distributed in this rally by the America First Committee, 408 Perrine Building, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. On the back of this membership card are the principles of the local organization;

^{1.} Our first duty is to keep America out of foreign wars. Our entry would only destroy democracy, not save it. "The path to war is a false path to freedom."

Z. Not by acts of war abroad but by preserving and extending democracy at home can we mid democracy and freedom in other lands.

^{5.} In 1917 we sent our American ships into the war zone and this led us to war. In 1941 we must keep our naval convoys and merchant vessels

on this side of the Atlantic.

- 4. We must build a defense, for our own shores, so strong that no foreign power or combination of powers can invade our country by sea, air or land.
- 5. Humanitarian aid is the duty of a strong, free country at peace. With proper safeguard for the distribution of supplies, we should feed and clothe the suffering and needy people of England, the other democracies and the occupied countries.

On August 50, 1941, LOUIS EVERETT MCEIROT, \$103 Ransey Tower Building, Oklahoma City advised that he had been one of the members of the American Legion to appear before the City Council protesting the use of the Municipal Auditorium for use by CHARLES A LINDBERGH on behalf of the America First Committee. McELROY further advised that the City Council is composed of the following members:

A. P. VAN METER, JOE C. CAMPBELL, SALTY FULLERTON HARLAN GERS, LEONARD H. DICKERSON, L. I. BAKER PERCY JONES, G. A. STARK:

Mr. McEIROY stated that Mrs. W.K. McKEEVER was the only person to appear before the City Council who spoke in favor of granting the use of the municipal auditorium to the America First Committee. McELROY further stated that Councilman JOE CAMPBELL inquired of all those persons who were protesting the use of this auditorium to LINDBERGH if they had considered the possibility of getting the situation reversed and of giving to LINDBERGH additional favorable publicity by denying him the right to use the auditorium. McEIROY said that A. P. VAN METER, Councilman was opposed to LINDBERGH's using the auditorium because of the tenor of LINDBERGH's previous remarks which indicated a tendency toward subversive activities. A motion was made that the Mayor be instructed to deny the use of this Municipal Auditorium to LINDBERGH for the purpose of making a speech which might be considered subversive in nature. Mayor R. A. HEFNER, inquired as to whether the motion should be voted upon in secret or openly; since there was no reply to this inquiry Mayor HEFNER stated all those who would vote in the negative would sifnity their intention and since there was no indication of any negative votes being cast, Mayor HEFNER stated that all the votes would be cast in the affirmative to deny LINDBERGH the use of the municipal auditorium on the occasion of August 29,1941.

TICE T. JOHNSON who had rented the auditorium was instructed to return the rental fee to the America First Committee, according to the statement that McEIROY made. McEIROY related that HERBERT K MYDE, who is chairman of the America First Committee in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma is a republican seeking much publicity. MCEIROY further related that he had been secretary to former senator W. V. PIHE of the State of Oklahoma and later

through the influence of PINE was made USA. McEIROY recalled that HYDE as United States Attorney had prosecuted the URSCHEL case. Mr. McEIROY believed that HYDE was radical in his ideas and had noted that he had been constantly opposed to the administration policies.

"A reliable source has repried that German groups around, New York have received instructions to advise parentsof men serving under the Selective Service Draft to tell their sons to prepare petitions to SENATOR WHEELER, protesting against their retention in the armed forces more than the a year period. (Presumably refers to newspaper statements by MAJOR GENERAL CLIFFORD POWELL, in command of the 44th Division, Fort Dix, N. J.) The groups meet in taverns in the prosperous suburbs around New York, in Westchester County & and Connecticut. Active support for the AMERICA FIRST COMMITTEE is also advocated. It is known that the AMERICA FIRST COMMITTEE leaders are nervous over the shortage of operating funds, which has recently resulted in paid workers being laid off. The support of the German organizations and the funds they provide is therefore of vital importance to the AMERICA FIRST COMMITTEE and gives them prestige and power in this work.

That the AMERICA FIRST COMMITTEE is being used, consciously or otherwise, to do the work of German interests in obstructing the national defense effort is indicated by the above and other items of information. One of these items is that the GERMAN LIBRARY OF INFORMATION mailing list has been made available to the AMERICA FIRST COMMITTEE and used for their purposes.

On July 2, 1941 the Tulsa Tribune published an article which stated that DON LOHBECK scheduled a meeting for the Tulsa Chapter of the America First Committee at 8:00 pm July 11, 1941 in room 211 of the Albany Hotel. In this article it is further stated that LOHBECK had said that and Senator GERALD P. NYE of North Dakota who had spearheaded the Committee's program of non-interventionist in the European war probably will come to Tulsa to address a mass meeting to be planned by the local committee. On August 21, 1941 Rev. O.A. PANKEY acting chairman of the America First Committee, 18 Tulsa, attempted, with the assistance of W. S. FOULIS, to make arrangements with the Mayo Hotel for operations to contend a meeting of this committee, but such arrangements were unsuccessful. On August 25, 1941 the Tulsa Tribune published an article that CHARLES LINDBERGH might be booked for a peace leoture while in the state for his Oklahoma City address. This article further: stated that Reverend PANKEY, Temporary chairman, advised: (1) The sommittee . had abandoned efforts to secure a room in the Mayo Hotel for the meeting and obtained permission to use one of the district court rooms instead. (2) Dis blaimed any intention of serving as promised chairman permanently for the In the article America First Committee with the statement "I don't have time."

Reverend PANKEY is quoted as stating that some forty Tulsans had been invited by telephone to attend the meeting which will be purposely 22 for the business of electing permanent officers. The tulsa World on August 26, 1941 published an article which stated that MACK SHRODES former republican Police and Fire Commissioner was elected chairman of the America First Committee, Tulsa Chapter, at a meeting at the court house Monday night. This article relates that only about 30 persons turned out for the meeting that A. out of these thirty, fourteen signed up for membership in the America First Group. In an article appearing in the Tulsa Tribune August 50,1941 MACK BHRODES. Chairman, Tulsa America First Committee is quoted as saying he would like to secure Senator BENNETT CHAMP/CLARE for a meeting in Tulsa on September 17. SHRODES is further quoted as saying in this article that CHARLES LINDBERGH and Senator BURTON K. WHEELER were invited to speak there but were forced to a decline due to the other many engagements which they had. In the Tulsa Tribune on September 2, 1941 is an article which states that the America First Committee may stage a membership campaign in Tulsa on following up the cards 🛞 signed at Tulsa meeting and by Tulsans at the CHARLES A LINDBERGH speech in The Oklahoma City on August 29, 1941. This article also stated that MACE SHRODES, Committee Chairman will, go over new organization records tonight with Mrs. ELLA KESSEL and EUGENIAKPOWER, Secretary and Treasurer. SHRODES 1s quoted further as stating that W. S. FOULIS, Chicago Secretary and Organizer would be here soon to help outline the committee's program.

whose identity has been previously furnished to the Bureau supplied the following information concerning the activities of the America First Committee in Tulsa, Oklahoma:

July 14, 1941 meeting of the America First Committee was held tonight at 8:00 pm in the Baldwin Methodist Church, 2200 Block on Borth Frankfort, with about 45 women and seven men attending. Among this group there were four men with the Reverend SMITH group and three men from the A.P.M. and later two married couples joined the group. DON LUBBOCK St. Louis organizer opened the meeting stating that his committee group had intended forming a chapter in Tulsa and raising funds to get the Hon. Senator WHEELER there for an open air meeting. LUBBOCK then introduced attorney MEED of the Oklahoma City Branch. MEAD asked for funds several times and although no money was offered he reiterated his former statement that the "best insurance against further war is to finance this committee." Mrs. COOKE of the Tulsa Peace Council, Reverend MINKEY and Miss ANY CONSTOCK from the pro-American group not present. In all instances "they are out of town," with excuses. The literature distributed in these meetings was the usual type, carried in the general stock of the America First Committee.

A.P.M. meetings in New York and had been a delegate to the Emergency Peace Conference in Chicago last fall when the A.P.M. was organized and the reason for his not remaining with the A.P.M. was not the fact that they are too radical but that he had been offered a position with the America First Committee and toked this as there is a direct livelihood while the A.P.M. was financially was

substantial at that time and it could not offer him even the most essential expenses while the America First Committee had the necessary finances to carry on. He further stated that there may be some communists. even among the America First Committee and said that Oklahoma City has its share of this class of people and as long as they are not taking advantage. of the general membership there is no cause to be complaining against thems, and they will retain them as bonafide members as the America First Committee is not taking any responsibility for the many other activities of its members but only the peace angle. In further conversation LUBBOCK made specific mention of the CIO oil workers union, stating "I have had several minor conferences with Mr. HAYS on the Washington Side here and was promised that active cooperation directly from the union was impossible as they are divided on this peace conference but they are doing everything in their power to encourage and have memberships for joining our committee and I look for a look satisfactory response among the oil workers." The meeting concluded at 10:00 pm with PERRINE remaining in conference with MEAD who had been invited by him to his home on their return from Bartlesville in order to further the interest of the Peace Tendency Movement. Even DON LUBBOCK seemed to take & great interest in this movement.

July 18, 1941.

A close search for DON LUBBOCK, Organizer for the America First Committee was of no avail because neither he nor MEAD were in town. Miss HOWARD said she was not contacted at all by them as promised and a call to Mrs. A. E. COOKE, President of the Tulsa Peace Conference disclosed that she had received a letter from LUBBOCK asking that she attend the meeting last Monday but she had a previous engagement and was not interested in the America First Committee. Mrs. FERGUSON the columnist for the Tulsa Tribuns evening paper said through a telephone conversation that she will be willing to act as Chairman if Senator WHEELER will come and speak but she doesn't want to line herself in the open with any specific group. Mrs. FERGUSON further stated that while she is willing to work for peace she likes to do it through her own efforts and her column and not through the dictates of any organization.

ferences as LUBBOCK had requested that the A.P.M. members be present when selecting an executive committee. The Rev. PANKEY said, "There were no real conferences held so far except that he was called upon to act as chairman pro tem in the coming meeting and the Reverend PANKEY said that "Reverend TETRICK and Reverend SMITH had accepted the honor to sit on the stage with me so that I will not look like the sponsor of this movement." PANKEY said that "Miss HOWARD agreed to act as secretary pro tem so that notes will be made and there shall be no hitch in stating the meeting and we certainly hope to get a larger crowd than we got in church on that Monday night and hope to have you there with the rest of the A.P.M. members."

Later in the day was about to get in touch with PERRINE to get a statement from him concerning the America First Committee and PERRINE admitted that he had been contacted last week by the group but not for the purpose of offering him some position in the executive committee but only for the purpose of getting a good speaker in Tulsa. PERRINE was asked to try and get one of the AMERINGERS from Oklahoma City to attend this meeting. PERRINE stated that he had first written his father and asked his advice regarding the America First Movement and got a very favorable reply. In fact, his father had urged him to turn all his power and influence to further this organization which is backing their "Pure Democracy Issue."

PERRINE further stated that he went to Oklahoma City and found that OSCAR AMERINGER is still too ill to appear in any program while young AMERINGER (the son) is away from the city and is not expected back until the last of the month.

PERRINE advised that he had notified the Reverend TETRICK with whom he is on friendly terms of those conditions and was told that no speaker will be necessary, to get all the people to the meeting he can however, in order to make a showing and he promised even the B.I.A. to attend and has personally communicated with LARKIN and TOWNSENDITES groups to attend and got in touch with FROSS to urge the largest attendance possible at this important meeting.

Mrs. DORIS WEST came into the picture today with an announcement that she will attend the Oklahoma City Youth Legislature meeting on Labor Day and incidentally mentioned the America First Committee, the Rev. PANKEY as being holy pacifists, Rev. TETRICK as one who has no stand at all, Rev. SMITH as anti-semetic who has no peace stand at all and that Wari sympathies are without bearing on the general peace situation. Mrs. WEST further announced, "If the American First Committee, including General WOOD has so many different aims among the leaders there is certainly no future for them and the names of those honest leaders whose sacrifices are holding up the committee are bound to fall when the crucial moment arrives." She also spoke of the A.P.M. mentioning the last release she had received from the national office urged that immediate material be sent to Russia to relieve the strain of the Russian production of war materials. This infuriated Mrs. WEST and she wrote to them to discontinue sending her material for distribution. She lauded, however, their efforts and would aid them in any way possible to

make a weak movement stronger in Oklahoma despite the protests of her husband who had resolved to give up all activities along these lines.

August 26, 1941.

The schedules meeting of the America First Committee was held on the second floor of the county Court, Corner of 6th & Boulder with only the guests present which included 34 people of whom only nine were women. The Reverend PANKEY, GEORGE FOULIS, Special representative of the Chicago Chapter of the America First Committee and Rev. SMITH were on the platform: when PANKEY opened the meeting explaining briefly that the America First Committee is exactly what the word stands for; namely to defend America first. PANKET went into a lengthy history of his family, as well as his own personal history, making it look like an alibi for his presence at the meeting. He then introduced FOULIS who went into a lengthy explanation as to what the America First Committee stands for and what they have accomplished and stated that they earnestly hope to keep this country out of any foreign entanglements. including war. He sulogized LINDBERGH and WHEELER as those who are sacrificing their career and their futures in order to accomplish the sime of this committee. He then went into lengthy plea for support of this committee in Tulsa and finally asked for the nomination of a permanent chairman. Both Rev. PANKEY and Rev. SMITH who were nominated declined in favor of MACK SHRODES and promised support from them if he would accept the nomination which he did after a brief discussion with FOULIS. SHRODES made an acceptance speech expressing confidence in the movement and asking for cooperation for all those present. Included in the audience was RAYMOND ANDERSON, who butted into the speech that FOULIS made asking how the America First Committee stands on supporting the Russian Peace in defense of their country. FOULIS explained that they are for aiding all democracies in Europe and they would have no love for any Mazi, Fascist or any other didactic or dictatorial power, however, he sidestepped the real question of Anderson's. Very conspicuously the U.Y.L and the A/P.M. members have been absent from the meeting although Miss HOWARD said that all of them have been called on the telephone asking them to be present at the meeting tonight and that she expected about 50 people to be present allof whom she had called. The following permanent committee was elected:

There was much discussion about going to Oklahoma City on Friday to hear the address by CHARLES A. LINDBERGH and a delegation was announced from this chapter to be accompanied by others who were willing to go. He comment was had from anyone present regarding this meeting and most of those present as shown had a rather optimistic view regarding the success of the

movement in Tulsa. There is some dissention existing already among those who have favored the America First Committee as the following statement will show. A fellow named JACKSON who has an insurance office in the Thompson Building, said, "I would have opposed the presence of Reverend SMITH at this or any other meeting of the America First Committee because he has been identified with the KKK and the Silver Shirts and every other radical movement including Anti-Semitiam. Although I have no real love for the jews I don't try to persecute them and I don't go around preaching against them. In this case I don't think that Reverend SMITH at this or any other time should be included

in any official capacity because that is going to hurt more than any good he

may expect to do and I doubt that I ought to be in it with him.

() 医环境等的最后还不同一种,一种特殊的最高的最高的特殊 Another fellow named PARKS expresses similar sentiments regarding this Reverend SMITH and PARKS added that he, SMITH, has been very anti-labor and and that it therefore, will be hard to interest the laboring classes in this movement. PARKS further stated that the working men in the Tulsa District are determined to follow the lead of the City Administration which is far from being pacific or far from having any peace tendencies, for the population according to PARKS is strongly pro-British, therefore, it is going to be a real problem to put the America First Committee on the market there.

On August 30, 1941 at 7:30 pm there were 47 persons in the hall at a meeting of the Oklahoma Youth Legislature including four negroes; with the arrival of MACK SHRODES at 7,50 pm the meeting was called to order by BOB STONE with the introduction of four participants in the symposium. Miss DOROTHY WURDOCK representative of the fellowship of reconciliation, was the first. GEORGE CHURCHILL, leader of the Bundles for British group was second. MACK SHRODES, Tulsa Chairman of the America First Committee was the third, and IRNORE WOLFE, Executive Secretary of the OYL was the last speaker. MACE SHRODES. explained that he was not prepared to make an address but asked permission to read GEORGE WASHINGTON's address and asked those present to get a copy of it and read and study it and they would find that this country has no moral right to intervene in Europe's affairs. At this Oklahoma Youth Legislature meeting it was found that there occurred a heated argument regarding LINDBERGH and his recent Oklahoma City speech in which he failed to mention anything about the Nazis. MACK SHRODES now head of America First Group in Tulsa defended LINDBERGH, WHEELER and others claiming that their stand is the stand of the majority of American public, and reiterated the much publicized statement that 80% of the American public does not want any European intervention. He then left the meeting stating he had another engagement to keep.

The writer ascertained from KATHRYN MANTON, Secretary of the State's Office, Oklahoma State Capitol, Oklahoma City that the America First Committee is not registered, incorporated, or licensed in the State of Oklahoma.






The League is in possession of copies of a Christmas greeting folder printed with the signature the "Loyal Copperheads of America", headed by a former active "America First" worker. This folder was sent out during the first few days of this week as a Christmas greeting to former active members of the "America First" Committee in New York. Persons receiving this Christmas card, the League revealed, had been previously active in "America First", though never members of the "Copperheads".

The name "Copperheads" was adopted last fall by a group composed of followers of Charles A. Lindbergh. On the West Coast it is known as the "National Copperheads" headed and founded by Ellis O. Jones, a writer for the <u>Deutscher Weckruf und Beobachter</u>, now defunct organ of the German—American Bund, who was recently under investigation by the Department of Justice after he had made a speech, following the declaration of war, violently assailing President Ecoasvelt. The <u>Deutscher Weckruf</u> on several occasions urged its members to join the Copperheads. Copperhead literature was widely distributed at many "America First" meetings, earlier in the year.

Photostate of the card and envelope have been sent to Attorney General Biddle. Excerpts from the wire to Biddle follow:

The respectfully urge that you institute an investigation of how the mailing lists of the now dissolved "America First" Committee were disposed of and in whose possession they now are. We have reason to believe that these lists are still being used by some individuals and groups, possibly to lay a groundwork for future guerrilla conflict on the propaganda front in America.






dislanded and dissolved by its leaders, we feel that an investigation at this juncture is called for. The Loyal Copperheads, headed by a former "America First" official, is composed of followers of Charles A. Lindbergh. On the West Coast, under the name of the National Copperheads, the group has consistently cooperated with open Nazis and is still active. Its founder is Ellis O. Jones, recently arrested and released by your Department! Jones, as you know, was a writer for the Deutscher Wockruf und Pecbachter, the organ of the Nazi Pund, which, incidentally, on several occasions urged its members to join the Copperheads."







Miss Gertrude Lawrence, star of "Lady in the Dark" has refused to accept a medal proffered by the Finnish government through Finnish Relief Fund headed by ex-President Herbert Hoover becauthat government "is now the vassal of Nazi Germany", Fight for Freedom learned today.

Miss Lawrence sent a copy of her letter to the Finnish Relief Fund, Inc. to Bishop Henry W-Hobson. Her letter of refuse follows:

October 14, 1941

Finnish Relief Funt, Inc. 420 Lexington Avenue New York City

Gentlemen: -



The Finnish Government, through your organization, has offered me a medal because I helped to raise money for the relief of the Finnish people in 1939--1940.

There are few things that I would rather have than a medal from those brave, simple folk. It makes me sai that I must refuse this offer made in their name, but in reality made by a Government which is now the vassal of Nazi Germany. For I cannot help being convinced that it is one more case in which the Government of a small country is being used by the Nazis in an attempt to make people of good will and humanity appear to endorse the actions of the Nazi regime. My creed has always been that expressed by my Prime Minister, Winston Churchill when he said, "Any man or state that fights against Naziism will have our aid. Any man or state that marches with Hitler is our foe."

LINDB_RGH's speech are compared with selected excerpts from German short-wave broadcasts. Reference to a few of these comparisons indicates that there is necessarily some common ground on which conscientious students of current history are likely to meet. For example, we find the concept that the present conflict

concerned the division of territory and wealth between mations'

and the pitiful materialism of the Peace of Versailles. At all events, the present fortunes of the war are being availed of, at least, to adjust to the successful belligerent's ideas,

the division of territory and wealth.

Again, there is no way to prevent german propaganda agencies quoting Washington's advice to 'beware of foreign entanglements', or reminding us that that is a traditional American policy. We may resent their saying it at this juncture, but we should be fair to our own citizens who still believe it is sound advice, and apply it, irrespective of its implications.

Again, that America should put forward a peace program, as Col. LINDBERGH put it -

'a plan for the progress and protection of the Western civilization of which they and we each form a part'

has been a sentiment entertained by many of the most intelligent and active public men of our time, particularly those closely associated with international commerce.

Each of these concepts has, in fact, been woven into the fabric of Nazi propaganda from time to time. None of them has any permanent part in it, but may serve the purpose of introducing some argument, or combatting some Allied propaganda. Then they have served their purpose, they will presumably be discarded without apology by the Nazi philosophers.
