

MEMORANDUM FOR THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

I have received a copy of the letter which you addressed to the Vice President under date of July 3, 1941, and the reference communication, consisting of an unidentified letter addressed to Mr. Wallace from Port au Prince, Haiti, complaining concerning the use of franked envelopes bearing the name of Congressman James C. Oliver for the transmission of reprints of the testimony of Charles A. Lindbergh before a United States Senate Committee. I am incorporating this information in the files of the Bureau, but in the absence of a specific request I will initiate no investigation. Since the subject matter of this complaint relates to an alleged irregularity on the part of a member of Congress I do not believe the Bureau should initiate any investigation in the absence of specific Departmental instruction to do so.

I am returning herewith the letter of July 8, 1941, from the Vice President and the enclosure mentioned therein, copies thereof having been retained in the Bureau files.

Dear Sir:

In a recent issue of the New York Herald Tribune I notice that your attention has been drawn to the apparent abuse by certain congressmen of their "franking" privileges, and in that connection I think the following statement may be of interest.

Two or three months ago I received a franked envelope bearing the name of James C. Oliver, Congressman, enclosing long reprints of the testimony of Charles A. Lindbergh before a Committee of the U. S. Senate. I had never heard of Mr. Oliver and was at a loss to know how he happened to have my name and address. I noticed that the post mark was New York, not Washington and that the address was by "sticker" such as is used by publications to which one subscribes. My name and address were correct but the expiry date did not seem to correspond with any publication to which I subscribe regularly. After looking over my checks in payment of my subscriptions I found that this sticker was normally attached to copies of the "Commentator". When Lowell Thomas was editor of this magazine I was a subscriber, but when it was taken over by Scribner and I found that it was pro-Nazi, I told them to discontinue sending copies to me. It would appear, therefore, that these franked envelopes were turned over unaddressed to the "Commentator" and that they used the mailing list of their subscribers to spread the doctrines of Lindbergh and his kind.

I have been told that when the "Commentator" changed hands, Lindbergh was the prime mover and that it was understood that the paper would be a medium for airing his views and those other anti Americans whose superior wisdom and knowledge make about 90% of their fellow countrymen ignoramuses, according to them.

Being British, I do not love Lindbergh and threw the reprints of his testimony in the waste basket. I have marked this letter "confidential" as I do not wish to have my name mentioned but the subject matter is at your disposal. I may say that I am Auditor of an American Company here.

**MEMORANDUM FOR HONORABLE J. EDGAR HOOVER,
DIRECTOR, FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION**

This refers to your memorandum of July 18, concerning Marvin E. Rutherford of Abilene, Texas, who claims that he sent plans for a bullet-proof non-inflammable airplane gasoline tank to Colonel Lindbergh, and that such a tank was found on a German airplane shot down in England. Rutherford suspects that Colonel Lindbergh may have transmitted his plans to a foreign government.

The facts set forth in the complaint contain no evidence of a violation of a Federal criminal statute. No investigation should, therefore, be made.


Dear Sir:



SUPER MAN

If Charles A. Lindbergh must discard his attitude of modesty in the interest of "keeping America out of war," why not send him to Germany and Italy to do his talking. There is nothing on record to indicate that he has ever offended Hitler or Mussolini. On the other hand his unfriendliness to Great Britain is obvious to the world. His willingness to let German military power gradually envelop the world is evident in his repeated claims that England would be defeated and that the United States had better keep out of the mess.

If Lindbergh is truly in earnest and believes that the United States alone in a world dominated by Germany, Italy and Japan victorious over Great Britain and Russia, could retain its democratic independence, let us send him to Berlin to intercede for peace "for the United States."

Let Lindbergh tell Hitler on some plan to convince loyal Americans that once he has conquered all of Europe and Africa he will not include South America, Central America, Mexico, Alaska and Texas" in his plan for reforming the world according to Nazi standards. Better still, let Lindbergh ignore Hitler, for the sake of letting the German war lord remain neutral in the matter, and go direct to the American people with his message. No doubt Hitler will be glad to permit Lindbergh "free speech" in Germany and throughout conquered Europe, to talk about negotiated peace.

It is not enough for Lindbergh to tell intelligent American citizens that Hitler has no designs on them. If he wants a negotiated Hitler-peace, he must first tell the top-ranking peace-making-by-force ruler on how such a peace could assure those few unconquered nations of the world that later on a restored and revitalized Germany might not want to extend its protection to the German, Italian and Japanese minorities within their borders.

Instead of trying to tell an educated American public into a false feeling of security that their unposed public is confused by his statements, Lindbergh had best go to Berlin and speak to Hitler.

cause the isolationists in Congress fought efforts to maintain a strong army, navy and air force starting back in 1919, and continuing in spite of the fact that certain prominent isolationists visited Germany and had a chance to see for themselves just what Germany was doing, would sooner or later threaten our national safety.

PRIVILEGE!

With all due respect to the loyal American citizens of Oklahoma City, it does seem undemocratic to deny Lindbergh the right to speak in their auditorium. While the great majority of Americans are pro-British, realizing that it is good for us to be allied with the great English-speaking and peace-loving democracy that stands between the United States and the aggressor nations, actually we are not at open war.

It follows that some Americans are pro-German and yet they may be loyal to our nation in the final showdown.

If Lindbergh is granted the right of free speech something also permitted in England but long denied to citizens of Hitler's Germany, and then if the American public draws the conclusion from Lindbergh speeches that he is pro-Hitler, that is a citizen must bear.

What Americans think of him is determined by what he says, and it is a matter of record that blames Britain for entering the war, even Poland for resisting Germany, but never since he criticized Hitler for having plunged the world in the agony of the present bloodbath.

Yes, if the American public gets the idea Lindbergh is pro-Nazi, it is because he has had an opportunity to exercise his democratic privilege "free speech."

An American in Germany (or in Russia) who for that matter would have a much harder time trying to tell the citizens of that country how the pro-American he might be.

Let Lindbergh talk. If in our democracy a majority is finally convinced that a Hitler-directed peace and a Nazi-controlled world is best for us, it may be hard to take, but here the majority rules, and we know that majority is anti-Lindbergh. So let the democratic privilege,

superman. Perhaps Lindbergh is the man for the job.

Certainly Hitler, if yet half of his peace proposal that would guarantee that Sooth or later in Germany fat and strong as the result of conquest, and with its military and naval forces greatly strengthened during a few months or a few years of inactivity, would not again turn its forces of destruction upon that small portion of the world then resisting his policy of world reconstruction.

We know what a mighty military force Hitler built for Germany during seven lean years, years of bitter depression, years of sacrifice, years of hunger, years of treaty-breaking, years of international suspicion. Give him another seven years of peace, and with the resources of conquered Europe, Africa and parts of Asia, he will, indeed, come close to being the very first man to rule the entire globe, Japan and Italy notwithstanding.

Lindbergh may see all of this, but he may still believe that even under such circumstances, it would be much better to take the chance, than to waste American lives trying in vain to stem what may seem to him an impossible and overwhelming tide.

It could be that he has "something." Just what, we do not see clearly. He knows that Americans desire peace, but not peace at any price. If it is peace and security for the American people that he wants, and he really feels that Germany is invincible, then it would seem that he could best serve the citizens of the United States by going direct to the man who started all of this bloodshed, Herr Hitler, and there plead for some assurance that would guarantee individual, personal, political, social and economic independence, to those nations yet unconquered, in a world otherwise controlled by a much stronger and better armed nation than even Germany is today.

Americans are an intelligent people. This is unfortunate for Hitler. They see through his scheme to ride the world by playing one nation against another, until, one at a time, he can gradually take them all under his protective custody. Any one, isolationists or otherwise, who tries to say that Germany is not a threat to the independence of the United States insults the native intelligence of millions of American citizens.

Americans are now awake to the fact that the United States must arm heavily and in expensive confusion in a few months time to offset seven years of intense preparation for war by Hitler, simply be-

As an American citizen and a veteran of the world war, I claim the right to frankly criticize that laxity on the part of our Federal Officials which permits Charles A. Lindberg to broadcast the most flagrant German propaganda in the guise of well-intentioned effort to keep the people of the United States out of war.

An examination of his latest broadcasts, made at a time when the moral of the American and English nations and their complete cooperation is so vastly important to the successful conclusion to activities which may determine the future of our nation, leaves no doubt as to the dangerous nature of Mr. Lindberg's real aims.

The strongest proof of his disloyalty is found in his most recent utterances. He states that England will turn against the United States before this war is over if it proves to her interest to do so, and he attempts to prove this by a statement that England has turned against France.

Any intelligent American Citizen, and also Mr. Lindberg, knows that England did not turn against France, and that the activities of England against the Territory Occupied by France has been necessary because it is used by Germany for military purposes. The same holds true in all cases where England and any French interests have been placed in juxtaposition.

He states that in the future the two great victors of the air will be Germany and the United States. This is only another way of stating that Germany will win the present war.

These utterances of Mr. Lindberg, made at this time, open to serious question the propriety and dignity of his activities even before this war commenced. Why did he establish a residence in England when he did when before cites the last 150 years of history to prove his statement that England is not a loyal and responsible nation in world's affairs?

The nature of his reports at the time of his visit to Russia which antagonized the officials of that country would also come under question, as would his continued leaning toward Germany which has culminated in broadcasting to the American people a near praise of Germany's outrageous use of force.

There is no question that the propaganda contained in his recent broadcasts is highly welcome to Mr. Hitler and his cohorts and there is no question that Mr. Lindberg has sufficient intelligence to know it.







Approximately 700 letters, telegrams and postcards have been received by The Standard-Times, Mercury in Gladwyne, on the editorial, "Farewell to Lindbergh," written by Stephen Darrow, publisher. The editorial, which appeared in these newspapers Sept. 26, called for aid to the Lindbergh boy.

So that "knowledge of elements of history" which you attribute to Mr. Lindbergh seems to have invaded your editorial spectrum—Great Britain and France rightfully could have been called "interventionists" in Poland and Czechoslovakia ever since the close of the World War—but it was the joining of those two nations which supported the two smaller countries in order to build a ring around Germany and, inadvertently, they set the stage for the present war.

I admit we accepted help from France in the War of Independence, but we were intelligent enough to stay out of another war at a later date, although France did make many claims for aid on the basis of her aid during the Revolution. Our leaders at that time were gifted with a sense of statesmanship, in addition to being Americans.

Abraham Lincoln did not "intervene" in the War between the States—he acted at the head of a great nation—had Andrew Jackson been living at that time, the action would have been swifter, the language more salty.

Regardless of how small a wealthy percentage of the population of this country, its actors, playwrights, propaganda agents of every breed may pant for war, these four points remain undisputed on the American scene:

THAT WE were led blindfolded into the last war, and now we have nothing to show for our participation but white crosses, broken bodies and minds, a vast desolation, a huge load of debt and the contempt of our former allies.

THAT A war-minded clique is using press, radio, lecture platform, and movies to get us into another war which 80 percent of the American people don't want.

AFTER THIS European war is over, you can still trade with the rest of the world, no matter who winds up on the top of the heap of this present dog fight in the Old World, for no proof to the contrary ever has been presented that we then would be isolated. You've done business with all the world on the terms dictated by Great Britain ever since you were a country—you even fought a second war with them to get a decent break in that regard.

THAT WE are loaded with debt now—the burden will become greater, all in the name of spreading the four freedoms, and any participation on our part in this war will fill more graves, more hospitals, more institutions, and we then will beg

for help from the same countries which we are now aiding. It is over when history is written that describes how German aggression seems to like to bully England and France. Marshall's suggestion has been followed only back after Ambassador Kennedy, who appears to be nothing but a pawn from Europe to him, and Roosevelt returns to him one other than himself—possibly Churchill or Stalin.

Please, Mr. Brewer, do not worry about Mr. Lindbergh being played for a sucker. Mr. Lindbergh is capable of taking care of himself.





I have read your editorial, "Farewell to Lindbergh," with profound sorrow. Whatever else may be said about Mr. Lindbergh, I and thousands of others like me, believe that he is motivated by the single unshakable desire to keep his country clear of the disastrous consequences of参战ing in Europe.

I submit that his English, his grammar and his rhetoric are not proper subjects for criticism as relating to his views on foreign and domestic affairs.

It is true that Major de Seversky has challenged some of Lindbergh's views on aviation; but an honest difference of opinion does not prove Lindbergh wrong and Major de Seversky right or vice versa. I have the impression that Al Williams, writing for the Scripps - Howard newspapers, would incline towards Lindbergh's views on aviation; and he is presumed to be an authority on aviation also.

The American people lifted Lindbergh to his present position after he flew the Atlantic in 1927. I, for one, never believed that Lindbergh deserved the acclaim that he received for his great solo flight. Alcock and Brown, who first flew the Atlantic non-stop in an airplane, deserved the plaudits that went to Lindbergh; but who remembers those two intrepid pioneers in trans-ocean flying? That, however, has nothing to do with Lindbergh's present views.

Lindbergh's father opposed our entry in the World War and was "scorned and egged for his pains." Isn't it rather generally agreed that we made a grave and costly error by entering that conflict? Doesn't every authoritative American historian agree that we actually had as much cause to fight England as we had to fight Germany? Isn't it a fact that the Allies pleaded with us to save them and then ridiculed our efforts and called us "Uncle Shylock" when the war was nearly won for "Democracy"?

Was Lindbergh wrong when he called our New Deal Administration extravagant, imprudent and visionary theorists? Do you practice the emotional, hysterical propaganda emanating from the pro-war group designed to arouse the fear of the American people while in the same breath criticizing Lindbergh for an emotional appeal endeavoring to bring home to the American people the horrors of war?

Lindbergh has been criticized for wanting a medal from the Red Cross. You know, as any good anti-interventionist person, I consider myself a patriot. I am a member of the American Legion, and a member of the American

Is it logical to believe that he would urge the English to prepare themselves to combat a powerful German air force? Just because the English refused to heed his warning is no reason to criticize Lindbergh for his efforts to awaken them from their complacency.

You say: "He prophesied that Britain would fall within 30 to 60 days after Dunkirk." Didn't most of us? And then Mr. Shirer, in his "Berlin Diary," gives us the possible explanation for Lindbergh's and our error. Mr. Shirer says that Hitler did not try to defeat Britain after Dunkirk. He says that Hitler thought Britain would be willing to negotiate a peace very favorable to Germany, thus enabling Germany to "win the war without invading Britain." Shirer says that this delay by Hitler very well may have been a fatal error which cost Germany victory. If Shirer is correct, why blame Lindbergh for his inability to read Hitler's mind? Had Hitler acted promptly to invade Britain immediately after Dunkirk, Lindbergh's prophecy might well have been true.

It is my own view that we have now gone so far on the road to war that it is too late to turn back. The die is cast and, like it or not, as good Americans we must stand together. I hope that Mr. Lindbergh soon will reach this conclusion, but whether he does or not I cannot condemn him for his efforts to keep us out of what is bound to be a most disastrous venture, even in victory. Instead of a "Farewell to Lindbergh," I think you may hear much more of this courageous writer than in the next few years when we all will be looking for patriots instead of politicians.

You have reinforced my personal service to our country by your statement, "Farewell to Lindbergh." It is a clear, fair and thoughtful statement of the case.

I often have wondered, however, what effect Mr. Lindbergh's statements to family and friends, and on the numerous

newspapers and radio stations in the course of his travels, have had on the American public. I am sure that the American public has been influenced by Mr. Lindbergh's pronouncements as to his country's neutrality and Germany's neutrality. I do not know to just what extent he has had to his few discussions, however, we have been behind the scenes and have influenced him.

Finally, as I stated, based on information I gained behind the scenes, he seemed to believe that the rest of the world would follow him, but that they didn't do so. The American, as we all know, would have nothing to do with him, believing, naturally, that he, having passed, was now trying to get Germany, France and England involved in a stupid war—and then, incapable as she was, came in and dominated the situation.

Who said Britain was innocent, and Germany usurper? Why, Mr. Lindbergh—and I know because he did not know what either country said.

Mr. Lindbergh has much to answer for, but nothing so much as this underrepresentation to the world that he knew what the Nazis had. My own impression is that Lindbergh is far outside the psychological disturbance due to his father's experience. His wife have been affected in their wide travel, especially in low standards of living abroad. He has shown that he has no confidence in the normal democratic process to solve these problems and he, therefore, believes in their solution lies in this German efficiency that he is admiring which he no doubt is forced mentally to live under.

Material Shortage Is Felt in Northeast

BOSTON, Oct. 22 (UPI)—New England industrial operations continue at peak levels in most industries but some non-defense divisions are experiencing an acute shortage of raw materials, Dan and Bradstreet Inc., reported today.

Dan and Bradstreet said the machine, steel, chemical, shipbuilding and metal plants with defense orders operated at full capacity during the past week. Manufacturers of jewelry, however, reported a "critical shortage of metals." Pacific operations remained at virtual capacity but in this industry as well as others, the "general sold-out condition of many plants continued to materialize."

Island Home Brings Peace To Lindbergh

Special to The Christian Science Monitor
EDGARDOWN, Mass., Nov. 19—

Charles A. Lindbergh, happy in the solitude of a "civil wilderness," today moved "over the hill" from the farm in which he has been spending a vacation into a winter home, the estate of the late Harvard Dean Nathaniel S. Shaler.

Mr. Lindbergh took a summer residence in Martha's Vineyard last August, settling on Seven Gates Farm, a semi-co-operative estate sprawling over scores of acres of the lonely North Shore of the Island. He was one of several tenants.

The flier, with his wife and children, has now leased the old Shaler residence, an Island show-piece for many years, and moved in for several months.

How long they will stay after the first of the year is not known. Their movement attracts little attention here, largely because of their desire to remain out of public view.

Dean Shaler bought the Seven Gates estate in the late 1900s and lived there until his passing in 1906. Henry Beetle Hough, editor of the Vineyard Gazette and author of "Country Editor," explained today. The Harvard Dean, he said, insisted that the terrain be left natural, unspoiled, "tamed" enough to enjoy, but still a "civil wilderness."

Only a few scattered homes dot the rough landscape, lonely with broad fields, sand dunes, sheep pastures, and scraggly brush. There is room to ride, room to take long walks, room to be alone. It is here that the isolationist leader has settled after unsuccessfully searching for solitude in many parts of the United States and in England.





MEMORANDUM FOR MR. LADD

Colonel J. T. Bissell of MID advised the writer that in 1937 while Charles A. Lindbergh was on duty in the War Department shortly after his return from Germany a civilian had sent to Lindbergh a complete set of plans for a self-sealing gas tank. Colonel Bissell stated that shortly after this plan was received the Germans appeared with a self-sealing gas tank for airplanes at the time when the United States Army Air Corps had no such apparatus.

Colonel Bissell stated that MID had investigated this matter and has come to the conclusion that Colonel Lindbergh received the plans but that no record is contained at the present time in the War Department files. He stated that the Air Corps has written to Lindbergh requesting the plans or an explanation as to the disposition of them.

Colonel Bissell advised that he was reporting this for the information of the Bureau.

While talking with the Attorney General at this time I told him that we are attempting to obtain an interview today with Henry Ford.

I advised the Attorney General that if Ford gives us the information concerning Lindberg, who is the source of Ford's information, my idea is to have two of our best men see Lindberg and call upon him to give us the information he has. If he refuses to do this, we will confront him with the fact that he gave Ford the name of an officer from whom he got his information. If Lindberg confirms this or refuses to give us any information we can then give consideration as to whether he should be called before a Grand Jury. I said that I believed he should either be made to put up or shut up.

The Attorney General stated that he believed if we could get a strong report on this it might give the President a chance to clean out some "brass hats". I told the Attorney General that the trouble there would be the same as in the story of the "Hull - Lakes fight" which was reported in the Washington Merry-Go-Round, the information coming from a Cabinet officer. I stated that this presented a very bad feature in connection with the problem.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR

Mr. Bugas called from Detroit and advised that, pursuant to my additional instructions, he had been able to arrange an interview with Mr. Henry Ford. Henry Ford stated that he asked Colonel Charles A. Lindberg to come out to Detroit and to visit him at the plant because he wanted to talk to Lindberg about Lindberg's attitude toward the Jews. Henry Ford told Bugas that he had heard a speech which Lindberg had made several nights before, and Ford did not like some of the things which Lindberg had said about the Jews. Accordingly, he asked Lindberg to come out and see him so that he could give some views on that score. Lindberg was out there about four weeks ago, and while Ford did not know the exact date, he stated he would check his files and advise Bugas.

Henry Ford stated that Lindberg had stayed overnight and that the conversations were principally about Jewish matters. Henry Ford does not recall any conversations on the part of Lindberg with regard to Lindberg's obtaining or securing information from the War Department. Specifically asked, Henry Ford stated that he did not recall Lindberg's talking about obtaining any information from any Army officer or making any other statement with respect to the Army or armed forces. Ford stated that, in addition to not recalling any such statements, he does not believe that any such statements were made.

While Lindberg was in Detroit, he and Henry Ford were in Harry Bennett's office for several hours. During this period Bennett and Lindberg were alone together several times and Ford was in and out of the office.

Bugas accordingly contacted Bennett again, and Bennett claims that, in thinking over the matter and trying to recall some of the details of it, he has been unable to recall Lindberg's mentioning the name of the man he contacted in Washington frequently, but stated that Lindberg told him that, because of some apprehension over contacting his regular source of information within the War Department, he had frequently on recent occasions been seeing a Major Biggs, who is an aide to General Arnold. Bennett could not

be sure that Higgs was a Major, but was certain that he was an officer of some kind. Bennett believes that Higgs would know the name of Lindberg's principal contact. Bennett also suggested that possibly Major Lanphier might know who Lindberg's contacts are, Bennett believing that Lanphier and Lindberg used to be very close although Bennett understands they have quarreled recently. Bennett further suggested that Eddie Clements and Major Cunningham, Ford representatives in Washington, might know something about Lindberg's contacts.

I am asking Colonel Bissell to get a line on Higgs. I remember Major Lanphier, having met him during the early stages of the Lindberg kidnaping. I will endeavor to locate him and will try to interview Higgs and Lanphier if the basic information obtained justifies this.



I am enclosing herewith an article which appeared in the Minneapolis Star-Journal on Sunday, January 4 of this year, which I think is of enough importance to warrant your possible glance.

The article is self-explanatory. However, I would like to add that my personal view would be that, in case the Army would consider Mr. Lindbergh, in any kind of service, that they look into this angle of the matter in regard to Mr. Lindbergh. I do not mean to infer that you should peremptorily reject the services offered by Mr. Lindbergh to the Army, but I do say that you should investigate all possible sides of this question, before you come to a decision, as the good of the Army and incidentally the good of the this dear old P. S. A. should come above any group or individual who professes to slap you in the face one moment and then kiss you the next. Please note the old adage, "A leopard does not change his spots ever night."

I would like to add that from the point of view of actual service to the Army, I think that there are hundreds of fliers in this country today who are better equipped to render that service from this point alone; namely that Mr. Lindbergh has not really done any flying since about 1928, which is 13 years, and in that time things have changed considerably not only in the field of aviation but in almost any other field of endeavor.

WASHINGTON MERRY-GO-ROUND

Washington, Charles Lindbergh, who came back into the limelight by offering his services to the flying corps, recently was doing some "pre-war" talking.

The ex-colonel spoke at a secret meeting of former America First officials in New York on December 17, 10 days after the Pearl Harbor attack.

Lindbergh arrived late at the gathering and at first said he did not care to speak. But finally, he took the floor and talked for nearly an hour. In his extemporaneous speech he made it clear that the events in the Pacific had not caused him to change his mind regarding his previous public charge that the president's foreign policies would involve the country in war.

Lindbergh told his associates that Britain was responsible for the war; also that Britain should have joined with Germany in destroying Soviet Russia.

Then, he opined, we would have been in a much better position to fight Japan in the Pacific.

The ex-colonel also counseled his listeners to keep in the background for the present. He indicated belief that there would be plenty of opportunity later for renewed activity and criticism of the "America First" type.

Note: G. L. K. Smith, Detroit isolationist leader, is quietly trying to line up former America First leaders to help him in a nationwide campaign to petition congress to demand that ex-hero Lindbergh be made head of the United States' air forces and Senators Wheeler and Nye be appointed members of the cabinet.
