



He is a prolific letter writer On April 2, 1973, the facts involved in this matter were discussed with Assistant U. S. Attorney John F. Penrose, Eastern District of Pennsylvania, for the purpose of obtaining a prosecutive opinion. Mr. Penrose declined authorization of prosecution based upon investigation to date reflecting a long history of such activity by the subject. There was no indication of any overt acts and no local rrrest record. It was noted that he has been a prolific letter writer without any known harmful or apgressive activity. 

On September 16, 1971, a letter was received by mail at the Atlanta Office of the FBI in an envelope addressed to the FBI, Atlanta, Georgia. The envelope directed to the FBI contained a letter addressed to "Mrs. Martin Luther King (Coom), Atlanta Vaiversity of Jews and Niggers, Atlanta, Georgia (Jew. A.). The envelope bears return address "Alexander Deaz" and bears postmark "Pembroke, North Carolina."

The letter enclosed in the envelope begins "Coretta Coon, " and is signed "Alexander." It contains obscenities and a threat to kill the recipient of the letter.

Mrs. DGRA McDONALD telephonically advised that she is Personal Secretary to Mrs. CORETTA KING, the recipient of this letter, and stated that she had opened the letter and then forwarded it to the FBI by mail in view of the threatening nature of the letter.

Miss McDonald stated that sometime around September 8 or 9, a letter was received addressed to Mrs. MARTIN LUTHER LING, JR., and the employe centained a reference to Jews and Miggers. She opened this letter and noted that it contained threats and obscene Language. She stated that she showed this letter to leave and Miggers and Total an afficial of the Southern Leadership Conference, and Total suggested that the letter be made available to the FBI.

The letter begins "Coretta Coon" and contains numerous obscene references to her and her deceased husband. The letter also stated "I'm going to slit your womb out before I kill you in Washington some 20 years from now. Coastta Coon, then I'll kill your family before your eyes." The letter also makes reference to the Ku Klux Klan and also contains the statement "You will die Gonatta Coonbecause we will kill all the Goddamn Jour Machingers." Miss McDUNALD stated that Mrs. KING receives Tamerous erank letters, including letters offering propagate of marriage. She stated that she did not even let Mrs. Miss read this letter and that Mrs. KING is not sware of the identity of Mayone who would write such a letter. Miss McDUNALD added that meither she nor ANDREW YOUNG has any suspects.



William M. Aitcheson, 22, told Judge Solomon Liss he was "very sorry to have caused this trouble," adding, "I'm confident it won't happen again." Judge Liss sentenced him to 30 days in jail and four years of probation.

Aitcheson pleaded guilty to two firearms charges in Howard County Circuit ! Court yesterday and to a cross burning charge in Prince Georges County Circuit Court earlier.

The former University of Maryland

student was sentenced in federal court to 90 days in a jail or psychiatric treatment center for mailing a letter threatening to kill Mrs. Martin Luther King, Jr., widow of the slain civil rights leader, if she spoke at the university campus.

# Judge refuses to cut \$500,000 bail in Klan case

By PATRICIA A. ROUZER . Westminster Bureou of The Sun

Westminster—A Carroll County District Court judge refused vesterday to reduce the \$560,000 bail set for William M. Aitcheson, 22, the reported Ku Klux Klan member who was charged here Wednesday with illegally possessing explosive materials.

Judge Donald M. Smith refused to reduce the bond set by a county District Court commissioner, saying he felt if Mr. Aitcheson were released, there was a "substantial risk" that he would not return for trial on the two misdemeanor counts against him in Carroll county. The defendant was being held tast night at the Carroll County Jail in lieu of the bail.

At the time of his arrest at his parents' home near Clarksville in Howard county, Mr. Aitcheson also was charged by Prince Georges county authorities in connection with six cross-burnings in that county and sending threatening letters to Coretta S. King, widow of the Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr., the slain civil rights leader. Prince Georges county authorities released Mr. Aitchessen on his own recognizance.

To avoid news photographers waiting in the half outside the courtroom here vesterday, Mr. Aitchessen, a junior at the University of Maryland in College Park, was ushered into the half and crowded courtroom through a side door.

The defendant, a curly-headed young man wearing a bime shirt, jeans and horn-rimmed glasses taped at the temple, showed no emotion as J. Robert Johnson, the public defender representing him, described him as "a boy who talks a lot and who doesn't do a great deal; a boy who talks to look big armong his fellows."

Mr. Johnson's stagement sharply contrasted with testingeny by Frank M. Rauschenberg, a state fixe marshal who infiltrated the Klan. Mr. Hauschenberg characterized the young man as "unstable and extremely dangerous." While on the witness stand, Mr. Rauschenberg identified assembly instructions for a pipe bomb and a molotov cocktail, which he said Mr. Aitcheson had drawn up to train the Klan Beret, a Kinn committee of about seven persons intended to engage in guerrilla warfare. The fire marshal added the group planned to mount a revolution against "blacks and the Communist and Socialist conspiracy."

Mr. Rauschenberg said he had known the young man for more than seven months from attending menthly Klan rallies held at a Gamber (Md.) form. He said that February 26 Mr. Aitcheson had told him he thought the FBI was looking for him.

Mr. Rauschenberg contradicted preceding testimony by the young man's father, who said his son had not been out of state in the past month.

The fire marshal testified. "On February 26 he ithe defendant; told me he had gone to Pennsylvania to visit with friends. He said that if the FBI made any attempt to apprehend him he would flee the state, he would go off and live in the woods.... He told me he had a military backpack and gear, and he also had a year's supply

Thomas E. Hickman, the county state's attorney, questioned Mr. Rauschenberg, a qualified explosives technician, about the defendant's expertise in constructing explosive devices.

WESTMINSTER — A state fire marshal has testified that the purported leader of a Ku Klux Klan klavern operating out of Howard County was constructing pipe bombs to get ready for a revolution.

" He said the leader, a 22-year-old University of Maryland junior, was "dangerous" and "unstable."

The fire marshal, Frank M. Rauscheaberg, spent two years as an undercover agent in the Ku Klux Klan.......

He testified at a bond hearing for William M. Aitcheson, the "exalted cyclops" of a Howard County klavern. Aitcheson has been charged in three counties with crimes relating to his klan activities.

Rauschenberg said he has known Altcheson for the past seven months, during which time Altcheson showed him how to make pipe bombs and discussed with him various klan-related activities

Rauschenberg's testimeny exposed many details of Aitcheson's alleged klan work, including his involvement in an elite "Klan Beret" corps, his sending threatening letters to Coretta Scott King, widow of the slain civil rights leader Martin Luther King Jr., and his involvement in cross burnings.

Carroll County State's Atty. Thomas E. Hickman said Aitcheson was planning a terrorist campaign against blacks, communists and socialists, that he (Aitcheson) was an expert in hombmaking and that he wanted to put toxic chemicals in Washiogton's water supply.

in Prince Georges County authorities have charged Aitcheson in connection a with the King letters.

During the hearing on a possession of explosives charge, evidence showed two letters were sent to Mrs. King. One.

said, "Africa or death by lynching; Take your choice," and was signed "Ku Klux Klan." The other said, "Stay off the University of Maryland campus or you will die," and was also signed "Ku Klux Klan."

Aitcheson, showing anger at times during the proceedings; whispered to his attorney, "Those letters were a plant."

Hickman called the release of such information at a bond hearing "rare.". But he said he wanted to show Aitcheson "is a danger to other people." Aitcheson's public defender, J. Robert Johnson, however, described Aitcheson as a "boy who talks a lot and doesn't do a great deal. He wants to look big

among his fellows."

But District Court Judge Donald M.
Smith said Aitcheson is a risk, and continued the \$500,000 bond.

Rauschenberg testified that Aitcheson, thinking Rauschefberg was a klan member, confided to him that he would run "to the woods" if he thought he would be arrested.

A: Wednesday morning raid on Aitcheson's parents' Howard County home turned up explosive materials, weapons, camping gear and a year's supply of Minuteman food tablets.

Rauschenberg also said Aitcheson find a "good knowledge" of manufacturing bombs.

He testified Aitcheson told him the "bombs were for training for an anticipated revolution."

Rauschenberg said he met with Aitcheson ence—week and sometimes more often during the past seven months. He said most of the meetings were on a farm near Gamber in Carroll County, during weekly Saturday night klan rallies.

He said he learned from Aitcheson the klan was directing itself to "attacks" on military reservation communication centers, abortion clinics and offices of the NAACP.

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



Her father is OBIE SCOTT, who for years was known as an industrious individual and was well respected, however, in recent years, SCOTT has been mistrusted by both whites and Negroes. MOOTY stated that CORETTA KING obtained her college education "up north" and while attending school, she met and married MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. Since KING has vaulted into prominents, OBIE SCOTT, his fatherin-law, has taken advantage of KING's reputation and made trips to various counties outside of Perry County, Ala. and collected funds under KING's name for the alleged purpose of contributed it to KING's movement. This collecting of funds has been suspected by individuals in Perry County of being for SCOTT's own personal use and many Negroes in Perry County/have expressed doubts that the funds ever reach the treasury of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference under Rev. KING.

As to subject, MOOTY advised that she seldom comes to the Perry County area. She has promoted no activities in the area, and apparently is concerned with other areas rather than Perry County, Ala.

On November 29, 1965, Detective Lieutenant George Rollins, Special Investigations Bureau, Detroit, Michigan, Police Department, advised that Mrs. Martin Luther King, on November 28, 1965, spoke at the New Bethel Baptist Church, Linwood and Philadelphia, Detroit, Michigan.

"The Detroit Free Press", a Detroit daily metropolitan newspaper, in its November 29, 1965, edition, on Page 3, Section A, contained an article captioned, "Viet Policy Raked Mrs. King: Peace Warrior". This article, in part, stated, Mrs. King, wife of Martin Luther King, Jr., indicated that she and the civil rights movement may play an increasingly active role in the peace movement. Mrs. King said that she is not sure some American policymakers want a negotiated end to the war in Vietnam.

"I think there are people (in the government) who are sincere in feeling we can win the war with military might. I'm not sure they want it to end in any other way."

The article goes on to state that her appearance here followed her participation Saturday, November 27, 1965, in the March in Washington of 25,000 persons protesting American policy in Vietnam. Mrs. King was quoted as saying, "I was very sympathetic to the march and I share the goals of the peace groups."

Mrs. King further mentions in this article that she is involved in Women's Peace Movements. She stated that her husband's Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) is not yet ready to expand into the peace movement but that a large percentage of the SCLC membership supports it.

"The civil rights movement and the peace movement must work together ultimately, because peace and civil rights are part of the same problem."







Martin Luther King, Jr.; Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) - Racial Matters

On April 17, 1968, a confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past, ascertained that on that date Stanley Levison was in contact with Dora McDonald, Secretary to Martin Luther King, Jr., deceased head of the SCLC, and thereafter Coretta King, wife of Martin Luther King. McDonald told Levison that "Meet the Press" wants Ralph Abernathy, successor to Martin Luther King as head of the SCLC, to appear on this program as soon as possible and Coretta King at a later date. She stated that she had not talked to Abernathy who was still in Memphis. Levison questioned if Martin Luther King had not been scheduled to appear on "Face the Nation" then added that "Meet the Press" was the roughest one. He said he had talked with Abernathy and advised him not to appear on "Face the Nation" at the present time because he believed Abernathy was gambling with his reputation and if Abernathy "falls on his face" he would do so before the whole nation. He said Abernathy agreed. Levison added that as far as Abernathy is concerned, it would be best if he put off any appearance until just before the Washington Campaign (Poor People's Campaign scheduled for Washington, D.C.) and that Abernathy acknowledged that he needs to study up on current legislation and political facts. Levison referred to Coretta King's possible appearance at the major mass anti-Vietnam war demonstration scheduled for New York City on April 27, 1968. He said he had checked with Dave Dellinger's (National Director, National Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam) office and that he, Levison, feels thatit is alright for her to appear on this program and also to participate in the Mothers' March (in Washington, D.C. in connection with the Poor People's Campaign) as long as she does not do anything else.

Levison then told Coretta King that he had checked with Dave Dellinger's office and that there is a good platform so that if she is inclined to participate, they should be promptly advised so they can have the benefit of the publicity. He emphasized that she should not do other things because it would be too much exposure. Comparing her situation with that of Jackie Kennedy, Coretta commented that she believes many people see that her life was not the same, that people understand how she was "in the picture" and have now given her a mandate that she must remain "in the picture". Levison agreed but counselled this should be done gradually and in good taste.

Coretta asked about requests for articles about herself and Levison advised that, as a general principle, proceeds for such articles should go to her because the subject of the articles will command the price. He said if thousands are paid for an article, then a few hundred is all the writer is entitled to.


Levison mentioned that Grosset and Dunlap, an old publishing firm, is coming out with a book, "I Had A Dream", about Martin Luther King which is unauthorized. He said Harper and Rowe are willing to have their lawyers prepare an injunction preventing or stopping the publication and distribution of this book, but a telegram is needed from Coretta to proceed. Levison then read a telegram for her signature and she agreed to have Dora McDonald send it immediately.

Coretta discussed requests she had received for appearances and Levison stated that she would receive many requests but that she will have to be selective and turn many down. He counselled that she should adopt the position that, for the present, she feels that activity in King's behalf has to be toward his memorial and that it would not serve anyone if her name is used by everyone. He added that this says she is using her name in the area she knows would be closest to King, his family and his organization. He said it is important in preserving the strength of a name that it not be overused.

Finally, Levison asked if Coretta wanted him to contact Dave Dellinger. She stated that he should call Dellinger and point out that her exposure must be limited and that she must be protected because she is only doing the things she feels very strongly about, that is, those things that are related to the work of her husband.

A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised in April, 1964, that Stanley Levison was a secret member of the Communist Party, United States of America (CP, USA), in July, 1963. In late 1963, and early, 1964, he criticized the CP for not being sufficiently militant in the civil rights struggle. Levison was described by certain CP leaders as being to the "left" of the CP in his position on civil rights. His differences with the CP, however, are merely tactical and he continues his ideological adherence to Communism (<)

It is apparent that Mrs. King is relying heavily on Levison's advice. At his instruction she has agreed to appear at a mass anti-Vietnam war demonstration scheduled for Central Park, New York, New York, on April 27, 1968. He has also counseled her to appear before the Mothers' march in connection with the "Poor People's Campaign" in the Nation's Capital.

In view of the above, the Atlanta Office should immediately open a case on Mrs. King and conduct a discreet investigation to follow her activities through established informants and sources. You should furnish the Bureau with the results of a file review concerning Mrs. King's background and activities in a form suitable for dissemination.

A source advised on May 1, 1963, that the Women for Legislative Action was formed in 1952, claiming to be an independent organization dedicated to non-partisan participation in legislative and civic activities. Its position in favoring or opposing legislation usually parallels the position of the Communist Party and related groups. It also supports legislation to abolish the House Committee on Un-American Activities. Membership in the Women for Legislative Action does not, of itslef, connote membership in or sympathy with the Communist Party.

Another source advised on May 11, 1967, that the Women for Legislative Action continues to be active in the Los Angeles area.

A source who has furnished reliable information in the past advised on June 17, 1968, that the New York County Freedom and Peace Party (FPP) Committee, held a meeting on June 16, 1968, in New York City.

It was announced at this meeting that Dr. Benjamin Spock had declined to run as the Presidential candidate of the FPP. Those attending the Committee meeting were told that the information concerning Spock's declination should not be mentioned at any of the local clubs of the FPP at the present time.

The source also advised that no wordthad been received from Coretta King, widow of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., as to whether she would accept the FPP nomination for Vice-President.

Subsequently, the source ascertained that Levison advised Harry Wachtel that he had spoken to Coretta King, widow of Martin Luther King, and told her that the SCLC has forgotten what the people who went to Washington for the PPC went for. He said he told her that she does not have the capacity to solve the problems, that he does not believe she should go into the leadership but if she does he will not go with her. Levison mentioned that there is a complete lack of integrity, that if they are not shaken up now nothing but evil will happen. He noted that Andrew Young does not want leadership preferring to be in the second level of leadership but that Coretta King wants the top leadership. He added that both Abernathy and Coretta King are inadequate.

The source learned on June 4, 1968, that on that date, Levison and Andrew Young discussed the SCLC meeting to be held in Washington, D.C. Levison mentioned that the meeting time had been changed because Coretta King was going to a union convention in Miami. He was critical of Coretta accepting this invitation because he had advised against it.

Young explained that he felt Abernathy should attend but was not anxious to have Coretta King in on the negotiations with the international presidents. He said that he had suggested Wednesday, June 5. as a better day for the meeting. Young also mentioned that said that with respect to the SCLC going into a membership campaign that they want to try to guarantee that a good percentrage of their membership would become SCLC members and that they are willing to push a membership drive but want Abernathy to be present.

Levison said he saw no objection for not going along with the meeting or going along with SCLC membership proposal.

Young brought up the matter of Bayard Rustin's statement and said that Rustin wanted him to approve it. Young stated that he would not approve it wouthout a group analyzing it. He said he did not know why Rustin issued it.

Levison attacked Rustin's statement stating he has never seen anything as insulting. He said that the PPC effort in Washington is being sabotaged by the SCLC people in Washington, including Young, by actions such as bringing Rustin in to run the June 19 march. He told Young the SCLC was playing house with Resurrection City, that it had been said at the outset that not much of a city would be needed because once the action began and people went to jail they would be fed there. He said there has not been any campaign and for Rustin to come in as he has, compounds all the confusion about leadership.

Levison brought up the fact that Coretta King wants to be on the SCLC Administrative Committee. He said he told her that the problems are too deep for her to think she can solve them, that she had underestimated the gravity of the problems and overestimated herself. He noted that Coretta is not sure whether she can work on the book she had planned for July because she felt she had to be in Resurrection City and that she has been told she has a duty to the movement. He said he told her that the book represents financial security and warned her against people trying to use her. Levison added that he



believes that Coretta's conceit is such that she could not be afraid of doing the book. He said she resents the fact that they have set up a situation in which she can be financially independent but has to put out effort for it. He said she resents the money coming into the SCLC and thinks the movement owes her a living.

Levison and Young agreed to meet at the Pitt Motel in Washington, D.C. on the afternoon of June 4, 1968.

A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on April, 1964, that Stanley Levison was a secret member of the Communist Party, United States of America (CP,USA), in July, 1963. In late 1963, and early 1964, he criticized the CP for not being sufficiently militant in the civil rights struggle. Levison was described by certain CP leaders as being to the "left" of the CP in his position on civil rights. His differences with the CP, however, are merely tactical and he continues his ideological adherence to Communism (U)


A schedule is currently being worked out for Gus Hall, Herbert Aptheker, Henry Winston and other CP, USA leaders to make speeches on behalf of the candidates.

The CP, USA does not expect its candidates will win. However, it is hoped their participation in the election will greatly assist in electing local Communist Party candidates. Not only does the running of the candidates furnish the CP, USA with a vast amount of publicity and propaganda about its program, which it could not possibly afford otherwise, but it should also help establish in the minds of the American people that this is a legal political party.

It is generally realized among the CP, USA leadership that not all Communist Party members and sympathizers will vote for the CP, USA ticket. Some members are already committed to support the Peace and Freedom Party, which is reading Dr. Benjamin Spock for President and Mrs. Martin Luther King, Jr. for Vice President. The leadership regards the Peace and Freedom Party as being strongest in the eastern United States, but its principal defect is that it does not have any national base or expression.

In addition, there are CP, USA members who are already committed to support the presidential candidacy of Senator Eugene McCarthy. This is particularly true in California.

On July 9, 1968, a confidential source advised some employees of Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) were under the impression that Coretta Scott King, widow of Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr., former President, SCLC, planned to depart the United States on that date or July 10, 1968. Mrs. King expected to be accompanied by Mrs. Benita Bennette, wife of Fred C. Bennette, Southern Director, Operation Breadbasket, SCLC. Benita Bennette currently serves Mrs. King as an assistant and companion. Source could (U) furnish no further details.

On July 11, 1968, source advised that some SCLC employees understood Mrs. King and Mrs. Bennette had left the United States (destination unknown), on July 10, 1968, for a period of twenty six days. Source pointed out that on July 11, 1968, he had learned via the news media that Mrs. King had stated she would be gone from her Atlanta, Georgia residence for several weeks. It was also reported that she would spend this time at an undisclosed secluded location in order to concentrate on the preparation ([[]] of a book regarding her late husband. 👀

With regard to the apparent misunderstading on the part of some SCLC employees as to Mrs. King's (U) intentions, source pointed out that subsequent to the OK

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death of Rev. King that there has been an increasing lack of communication between Mrs. King and most members of the SCLC staff. (U)







COMMUNIST INFLUENCE IN RACIAL MATTERS

Subsequent to the death of Reverend Martin Luther King, Jr., former President, Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC), a confidential source has advised on several occasions that Coretta Scott King, his widow, has had very little association with SCLC or officials of that organization. During this period of time, it has been sources understanding that Coretta Scott King has been largely occupied with the writing of a book, handling matters relating to the Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial Center and generally perpetuating the image of her late husband.

Source advised that as of early December, 1968, Coretta Scott King had engaged Andrew J. Young, Executive Vice President, SCLC, in a consulting capacity in which position he serves in addition to his duties with SCLC.

With reference to the Martin Luther King, Jr.
Memorial Center, the Atlanta Journal, daily Atlanta newspaper
on Page 2A, of its Blue Streak Edition, January 15, 1969,
published an article by lined Harmon Perry and captioned
"King's Widow Tells Of Plans for Center". This article
reflected the Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial Center was
planned as ". . . a tribute and realistic attempt to carry
on the ideals" for which Reverend King lived and died.
A portion of this article is set forth below:

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The center, to be developed in two parts, will be funded by grants from foundations, corporations and private gifts. It will operate under a first-year budget of \$150,000.

. In announcing creation of the Martin Luther King Jr. Momorial Center, Mrs. King said the facility will seek to extend her husband's best hopes and dreams.

Mrs. King said the center will attempt to meet the needs facing black people, but all persons are invited to participate in it in the search for creative ways to liberate the future of all peoples from oppression and fear.

Plans call for the center to be developed in two parts. The first will include restoration of Dr. King's birthplace on Auburn Avenue and continuance of activities at Ebenezer Baptist Church, where he shared the pulpit with his father.

THE SECOND PART of the center will be developed in the Atlanta University complex, and will include an institute for Afro-American studies, a mu-seum of Afro-American life and an institute for non-violent social change.

Both sites are necessary to tell the story of Martin Luther King Jr., Mrs. King said.

The announcement was made at the Interdenominational Theological Center where the Martin Luther King Jr Library pro-ject will operate under the direction of Dr. Vincent Hard-

The library is now seeking an additional grant of \$50,000 to add an oral history section.

A second confidential source advised during the middle of January, 1969, that on January 13, 1969, Coretta Scott King discussed with Stanley Levison the contents of a statement regarding the Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial Center which she contemplated releasing to the news media.

On January 13, 1969, the above source learned that Levison was currently one of the primary trustees of the Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial Center and had participated in major planning therefore.

On January 13, 1969, a confidential source advised he understood that in the near future Coretta Scott King, widow of Reverend Martin Luther King, Jr., former President, Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC), contemplated traveling to India. In connection with this travel, Mrs. King had requested Andrew J. Young, Executive Vice President, SCLC, to accompany her.

Source was unable to furnisheany further details regarding the above except he understood Mrs. King would depart the United States in the very near future.

During December, 1968, source advised he had learned that Young, in addition to his position with SCLC, was employed by Coretta Scott King as a consultant.

On January 15, 1969, The Blue Streak Edition of the Atlanta Journal Daily Newspaper, Atlanta, Georgia, on Page 12B, in a column entitled "Names in the News", published the following item datelined New Delhi, "The widow of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Mrs. Coretta King, will visit India for five days beginning January 21 to receive on behalf of her husband the \$13,333.00 Jawaharlal Nehru Award for international understanding."



Mrs. King and her father-in-law informed Abernathy they were greatly upset over "reports" they had received indicating that SCLC contemplated holding a "moral court" in Memphis, Tennessee, during the latter part of March or early April, 1969. Coretta King told Abernathy she would be embarrassed to participate in such an activity and acidly inquired why her opinion had not been solicited prior to SCLC deciding upon such a course of action. Ku

Abernathy explained to Coretta and Reverend King, Sr., the idea of the "moral court" was simply one of several proposed activities which had recently been discussed by the SCLC staff to be held on or about April 4, 1969 in commemoration of the assassination of Reverend King, Jr. He said a firm decision on these proposals had not yet been reached with one exception. That exception Abernathy assured Coretta was a definite decision that SCLC would not conduct a "moral court" in connection with any activity on or about April 4, 1969.

On March 9, 1969, a confidential source advised Stanley Levison and Harry Wachtel discussed the content of a statement which Wachfel was preparing for use of Coretta Scott King, widow of Martin Luther King, Jr., in the event James Earl Ray, alleged assassin of Reverend King, pleaded guilty.

According to source, Levison and Wachtel agreed on the language of this statement which when completed, in part, read as follows:

"to the family of Martin Luther King there is a sense of emotional relief, for the moment. We have been spared the trial which would compel us to re-live the fearfully tragic event of his death. But we realize this is but a respite. This plea of guilty must not becallowed to close the case, to end the search for the many fingers which helped pull the trigger. We shall press the State of Tennessee and the Federal Government to continue until all who are responsible for this crime have been apprehended. Not until then can the conscience of the nation rest".

### CORETTA SCOTT KING

The Atlanta Constitution, daily Atlanta newspaper, on the front page of its March 11, 1969 edition, published an article captioned "Widow Says It's Not Over". This article referred to the plea of guilty by James Earl Ray on March 10, 1969 in Memphis, Tennessee. It set forth comments of Coretta Scott King regarding Ray's plea which in part were as follows.

(Ray's plea) - - "cannot be allowed to close the case, to end the search for the many fingers which helped pull the trigger". For her family she said "there is a sense of emotional relief". "For the moment, we have been spared a trial which would compel us to relive the fearfully tragic events of his death". "But we realize this is but a respite". According to Coretta Scott King "all concerned people must press the State of Tennessee and the U. S. Government to continue until all who are responsible for this crime have been apprehended". "Not until then can the conscience of the nation rest".

On 3/20/69, FFO advised of receipt of information had recently asked RALPH D. from an informant that ABERNATHY to step aside as President of SCLC and that ABERNATHY was increasingly fearful of assassination.

The 3/18/69, issue of <u>The Atlanta Journal</u> carried an article by JACK NELSON of the Los Angeles Times News Service referring to an interview with RALPH D. ABERNATHY. article refers to ARERNATHY's position as President of SCLC being shaky and Mrs. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. taking a more active role in the organization which implied that Mrs. KING would replace ABERNATHY.

In response to the above article, ARERNATHY sent a telegram to the Los Angeles Times News Service and at the same time sending a copy of the telegrap to the Atlanta Journal, which telegram was published in the Atlanta Journal on 3/21/69. In the telegram ABERNATHY refers to gross errors of fact and incorrect opinions is WELSON's article and emphatically denied saying anything to MELSON remotely suggesting his leadership as President of SCLC needed solidifying or that it was shaky. ABERNATHY further stated that reports of dissension in SCLC were malicious rumors and deliberate attempts to bring about division between him and Mrs. KING.

It is noted that advised on 3/25/69, that he is in receipt of no information to indicate that plans are actually in the making to replace ARERNATHY as President of SCLC with Mrs. CORETTA KING.

As the Bureau is aware, periodically various offices abise Atlanta of receipt of anonymous threats against the life of AEERNATHY. In the past Atlanta has not furnished such information directly to AEERNATHY, but has followed the policy of immulately passing the information on to an appropriate official of the Atlanta Police Department, who in turn advises AEERNATHY. This policy was established several years ago, when MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. was President of SCLC, due to the fact KING was traveling extensively and was not cooperative when efforts were made to locate him in Atlanta for the purpose of advising him of threats against his life.

It now appears that some advantage may be gained by changing the existing policy of informing ABERNATHY regarding receipt of information relating to threats against his life. It is felt that by notifying ABERNATHY directly upon receipt of information relating to threats against his life, some rapport may be developed with him at this particular time when the possibility exists of him being concerned about his possible assassination as well as his position as President of SCLC being shaky and the possible taking over of his position by Mrs. CORRTTA KING.

Another strong factor of a counter intelligence nature to consider in changing the existing policy to notify AMERNATHY directly would be the disruptive effect of confusing and worrying him by reminding him of continuous threats against his life.

It is recommended that in the future upon receipt of such information, Atlanta notify ABERNATHY directly and in turn notify appropriate officials of the Atlanta Police Department.

On 3/9/69, STANLEY LEVISON and HARRY WACHTEL discussed the content of a statement which WACHWEL! was preparing for subject to use in the event JAMES EARL RAY pleaded guilty. Atlanta Constitution, daily Atlanta newspaper on the front page of its 3/1/69 edition, published an article captioned "Widow Says It's Not Over". This article referred to the plea of guilty by RAY on 3/10/69 and set forth comments of subject which paralleled very closely the language prepared by LEVISON and WACHTEL on 3/9/69.

On 4/18/69, LEVISON stated he had been working with subject on her book which had to be completed by 4/19/69 and had managed to include in it some matters which the publisher desired to keep out. Two of these things he said were the Vietnam War and the fact that KING, JR., did not have a one dimensionalist negative attitude toward black militants and black nationalists but rather that they had a mutual respect.

On 4/29/69, subject traveled from Atlanta to Charleston, S. C. to participate in the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) ractivity on behalf of atriking hospital workers in Charleston. Subject was accompanied by STANLEY LEVISON on her departure that date from Atlanta.

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On 5/2/69, STANLEY LEVISON recommended to ANDREW J. YOUNG, Executive Vice President, SCLC, that subject return to Charleston, S.C. approximately ten days after her 4/29/69 visit there. LEVISON said her reappearance should be solely for the purpose of indicating her continued support of the strikers in Charleston.

STANLEY LEVISON told subject on 5/20/69, he was not in favor of her being the key note speaker at the 1969 SCLC Convention. LEVISON said subject should not place herself in a policymaking position at the convention but should rather limit her participation to cultural matters at this affair.

STANLEY LEVISON and HARRY WACHTEL on 6/13/69 discussed the content of a letter to be sent as of that date by subject to President NIXON dealing with the matter of the Federal Government sponsoring a proposed Martin Luther King, Jr., Memorial Center.

Subject on 6/20/69 discussed with STANLEY LEVISON her conversation that date with ETHEL KENNEDY regarding the recent news media controversy pertaining to KING, JR. Subject said this controversy did not change her friendship with the KENNEDY family. Subject told LEVISON she planned to meet with ETHEL KENNEBY. LEVISON said he felt this could be fruitful and suggested he and the subject discuss such a meeting before it takes place.



### Gentlemen:

Shortly after King's death, the enclosed photo began circulating among the white employees in our office. Most were afraid to check it out. I brought it home and am just now writing to ask whether this is propaganda or true. I am also enclosing a column I clipped from the Tulsa morning paper concerning King.

I belong to the Tulsa branch of American Association of University Women which has headquarters in Washington, D. C. # MARTIN LUTHER KING...AT COMMUNIST TRAINING SCHOOL



The above picture was made by an employee of the State of Georgia, at the Highlander Folk School in Monteagle, Tennessee during the Labor Day week-end of 1957. The photographer was sent to the Highlander Folk School by the Georgia Commission on Education. The Highlander Folk School was abolished by an act of the Legislature of the State of Tennessee at a later date.

Those numbered in the picture are:

- 1. Martin Luther King, Jr., of the Montgomery boycott and the Birmingham riots. Kerl Prussion, a counterspy for the FBI for twelve years, charges that Martin Luther King belongs to sixty Communist-front organizations more than any Communist in The United States.
- 2. Abner W. Berry of the Central Committee of the Communist Party.
- 3. Aubrey Williams, President of the Southern Conference Education Fund, Inc., The Transmission Belt in the South for the Communist Party.
- 4. Myles Horton, Director of Highlander Folk School for Communist Training, Monteagle, Tennessee.

These "Four Horsemen" of racial agitation have brought tension, disturbance estrices and violence in their advancement of the Communist doctrine of "racial nationalism."

# Review of Bureau Files

We have never investigated Mrs. King. Our files contain numerous references to her in connection with her husband's activities and her own activities in pacifist organizations such as the Women's International League for Peace and Freedom.

## Book Review

In her acknowledgment at the front of the book Mrs. King stated that Stanley Levison had read the entire manuscript and had offered many useful suggestions. She also acknowledged the valuable legal and personal assistance she got from Harry Wachtel. Later in the book she said Levison and Wachtel were two of King's dear friends and that King sought their advice and used them as sounding boards for his ideas. She said Levison always worked in the background and his contribution was indispensable. She added that Levison and Wachtel were two of the most important supporters of her husband's work and that they continued to assist her in many valuable ways to this day.

OTHER O/S

Levison, a white attorney, is identified as a secret member of the Communist Party (CP) as late as 1963. He did not think the CP's program on civil rights was sufficiently militant and his break with the CP was tactical rather than ideological.

Wachtel's wife was a CP club chairman in 1944 and Wachtel's name was also contained in CP records although his relationship with the CP is not known.

In April, 1969, one of our sources reported that Levison said he was busy working with Mrs. King on her book. He said that because it was completed just before the deadline he was able to get some things into it that the publisher wanted to keep out. He said two of the things he got into the book were Memorandum to Mr. W. C. Sullivan

an attack on the Vietnam war and the fact that King did not have a "one-dimensional, negative attitude" toward black militants and black nationalists but that there was mutual respect with these people.

Mrs. King's treatment of the incidents contained in the book must be read as that of a wife writing about her dead husband and about her impressions concerning his activities... a widow's epitaph. A lack of objectivity and a biased report overemphasizing the importance of these activities are to be expected in such a book and are present in this book. Mrs. King's book depicts, page after page, a saintly couple, with saintly children, surrounded by saintly associates. She compares King with Christ on a number of occasions. Also on one occasion she makes the statement that "taking the world as a whole, his (Martin Luther King, Jr.) influence may even be greater than that of the Pope."

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

Concerning Mrs. King's pride, conceit and materialistic outlook one of our sources in June, 1968, reported that Stanley Levison commented that Mrs. King was resentful of the money the Southern Christain Leadership Conference (SCLC) was currently receiving from donations following King's death and appeared to feel the civil rights movement owed her a living.

Our sources also reported that, according to Levison, Mrs. King wanted top leadership after King's death. Levison told her she did not have the capacity to solve problems and that she underestimated the gravity of the problems and overestimated herself. Levison expressed the opinion in June, 1968, that Mrs. King's conceit was such that she could not be afraid of writing the book.

The book is full of incidents, described in mythlike goodness and light, which in reality were far, far from it.



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One such incident was the description by Mrs. King of the actions of King's entourage in a hotel in Oslo, Norway, prior to his receiving the Nobel Peace Prize in December, 1964. They arrived in Oslo on 12/8/64 and King was awarded the prize on 12/10/64 and left for Stockholm, Sweden on 12/11/64. The evening in the Oslo Hotel was described by Mrs. King as one of hymn singing and a gathering together in simple fellowship and the warmth of oneness.

In the epilogue to her book Mrs. King thanked the people who sent checks to continue her husband's work and those who sent checks specifically to the children and herself. She said she had used these gifts to assist her in setting up and maintaining a staff and an office to handle the large volume of mail and "the myriad requests made of me."

This selfless, magnanimous, decorous attitude is belied by Mrs. King's actual shrewd, calculating, businesslike activities. In August, 1968, following King's death in April, 1968, Levison and Harry Belafonte, the Negro entertainer, conferred of Belafonte's concern over a request by Mrs. King for fifty percent of an SCLC fund. Levison said her request, which amounted to about \$200,000 was for fifty percent of the Martin Luther King Fund which was established with the understanding that it would be shared with her. A confrontation between Mrs. King and the SCLC leadership was imminent over this matter and many other things. Levison, Mrs. King's devoted friend and protector, told Belafonte that only about half the money that had been collected for the Martin Luther King Fund had been put into that fund. Therefore, if Mrs. King's request was granted, she would still only receive about twenty percent of the fund.

On page 245, in writing\_about the death of President Kennedy Mrs. King mentioned the courage of Mrs. Kennedy and added that for all their philosophical explanations and their deep faith in God, she and King were still personally in a dark abyss of sorrow for "this gallant, compassionate and wise man." She indicated that in a way President Kennedy was King's best friend.

Sullivan OTHER USDC court order RE: MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. 100-106670 b7C Mrs. King in the book recounts how in the Summer of 1965 King went to Chicago for an SCLC drive and decided not to stay at a hotel but to rent a slum apartment in order to share with the people of the ghetto the kind of life that was imposed upon them daily by the system. She said he was almost like a Messiah to these ghetto dwellers. On page 339 Mrs. King states "Xernona Clayton - a woman of many talents - performed the task of assembling many dresses for my period of mourning, from which I chose the6 dresses I wore at the funeral." On page 57 of her book Mrs. King said her husband had, of course, read Karl Marx who, he said, convinced him that neither Marxism nor traditional capitalism held the whole truth but each a partial truth. She claimed he said "I could never be a communist."

This is a variance with the appraisal of Stanley Levison who in 1962 passed the word to Gus Hall, General Secretary of the Communist Party, USA, that Wing is a whole-hearted Marxist who has studied it (Marxism), believes in it and agrees with it, but because of his being a minister of religion, does not dare to espouse it publicly.

# References to the FBI

On page 227 she mentioned that when King was in jail in Birmingham, Alabama, in April, 1963, she feared he was being held incommunicado. After trying to reach President Kennedy, he called her back and told her "We sent the FBI into Birmingham last night. We checked on your husband and he is alright." At the request of Assistant Attorney General Burke Marshall the Bureau did interview the chief of police in Birmingham on 4/14/63 who said King was in good health and was not being held incommunicado. In fact he had conferred with four attorneys on 4/13/69.

On page 247 she mentioned that the FBI had found the bodies of the three civil workers slain in Philadelphia, Mississippi.

On page 265 she tells about the march from Selma to Montgomery, Alabama, in March, 1955. During this march there was a rumor that King was to be assassinated by a man disguised as a minister. She then said "while we maintained unarmeded guard, we understand the FBI was on hand guarding Martin all the time." This statement, while reported only as an understanding on her part, is a complete falsehood; we never guarded King.

WASHINGTON. (A) — Amid the jostling and the crushing, the lights and photographers, Coretta King walked with head high, face serene and hands cradling a candle to symbolize peace.

And in front of the house where Richard Nixon lives as President of a troubled nation, the widow of Martin Luther King paused, bowed her head, and touched the candle to a much bigger one on a brass stand and for a moment was herself a symbol.

And when she moved on, 35,000 — some say more — came after her as if she were a Pied Piper for Peace.

"We still have a choice," she said earlier to those thousands as they sat in the autumn chill on the grassy slopes beneath the Washington Monument. "We can have nonviolent coexistence or violent annihilation. My friends, which will we chose?"

The choice, to this crowd, was clear. After the speech-making was done, they too lit candles and walked, silent and sorderly, to the White House to petition their President for beace.





Mrs. Martin Luther King, Jr., who is also known as Mrs. Coretta King, was born on April 27, 1927, at Heiberger, Alabama.

She is the widow of the Reverend Martin Luther King, Jr., to whom she was married on June 18, 1953. Mrs. King has not been the subject of an investigation by the FBI. However, our files reveal that she has been extremely active in making speeches and appearances throughout the United States concerning civil rights matters.

In addition, the FBI has received information from a source who has furnished reliable information in the past that Mrs. King, since the death of her husband, has continued to held conferences with Stanley Levison, former principal advisor to Martin Luther King, Jr. Our files reveal that Mrs. King has sought Levison's advice and counsel concerning her finances. personal appearances and speeches, and in connection with her book "My Life With Martin Luther King, Jr."(笑) 人。

A confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised in April, 1964, that Stanley Levison was a secret member of the Communist Party (CP). Levison has been described by certain CP leaders as being to the "left" of the CP in his position on civil rights. (A)

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

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

Scott, Jr., had been appointed First Executive Director of the MLKMC replacing Doctor Vincent Harding who previously had also been in charge of the Library Documentation Project, and the Institute of the Black World (IBW), 87 Beckwith Street, S. W., Atlanta, another facet of the MLKMC. Harding, the article said, would henceforth direct the IBW.

The Atlanta Journal and Constitution on Page 14A of its August 17, 1970, edition published an article captioned, "Prospects of King Center Shrunken by Tight Budget", bylined Bill Montgomery. This article related that the Library Documentation Project of the MLKMC was currently \$81,000 in debt.

In addition to information previously furnished the White House on January 26, 1970, on captioned individual, our files reveal the following.

In March, 1970, information was received from a confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past indicating that at a commemorative service held for Martin Luther King, Jr., in Atlanta, Georgia, under the sponsorship of the Martin Luther King, Jr., Memorial Center (MLKMC), a program was distributed which revealed that Mrs. King was the President of MLKMC and 19 other individuals made up the Board of Directors, including Stanley Levison, Harry Wachtel, and C. T. Vivian. Prior Communist Party (CP) connections and/or sympathies on the part of these individuals have been established by the FBI.

Our files also reveal that Mrs. King continues to rely on and confide in Levison and allegedly has become more dependent on Harry Wachtel's advice. Wachtel is a New York City Attorney who was a member of the Board of Directors of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC). His name appeared on a list of names in a local CP headquarters in Brooklyn, New York, in 1944.


Mrs. Martin Luther King, Jr., who is also known as Mrs. Coretta King, was born on April 27, 1927, at Heiberger, Alabama.

She is the widow of the Reverend Martin Luther King, Jr., to whom she was married on June 18, 1953. Mrs. King has not been the subject of an investigation by the FBI. However, our files reveal that she has been extremely active in making speeches and appearances throughout the United States concerning civil rights matters.

In addition, the FBI has received information from a source who has furnished reliable information in the past that Mrs. King, since the death of her husband, has continued to hold conferences with Stanley Levison, former principal advisor to Martin Luther King, Jr. Our files reveal that Mrs. King has sought Levison's advice and counsel concerning her finances, personal appearances and speeches, and in connection with her book "My Life With Martin Luther King, Jr."

A confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised in April, 1984, that Stanley Levison was a secret member of the Communist Party (CP). Levison has been described by certain CP leaders as being to the "left" of the CP in his position on civil rights.

This morning I attended the Deputy Attorney General's weekly conference, it being noted that this is the first conference he has had in three weeks.

In attendance other than Deputy Attorney General Kleindienst were Assistant Attorney General Will R. Wilson of the Criminal Division and Assistant Attorney General Robert C. Mardian of the Internal Security Division. Inspector George C. Moore, Section Chief of the Racial Intelligence Section, Domestic Intelligence Division, accompanied me and gave those present a rundown of the highlights of the overall racial extremist picture in the country today.

Mr. Kleindienst stated he was quite impressed with the intelligence the FBI was developing in the black extremist field and certainly recognized the threat that these political terrorists represented especially as to kidnapings, assassinations, and other such acts which could shake the country. In this regard, he specifically voiced his concern as to the current racial undercurrents which could spontaneously erupt into riots if provided with catalytic action similar to that of the assassination of Martin Lufley King in 1968. 62-108052-68

Mr. Kleindienst further took note of the fact that Mrs. Coretta King likely would appear as a speaker before the forthcoming massive peace demonstration here in Washington, D.C., on April 24, 1971, and if she is not given adequate security, extremist elements could be provided with a target which could kick things off. Mr. Kleindienst thereupon instructed Mardian to make certain that the Department's overall plans regarding the April 24th demonstrations provided for adequate police protection of Mrs. King.



She makes frequent public appearances and speeches in behalf of legitimate civil rights movements and activities and is active in collecting funds for the Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial Center in Atlanta.

In view of the above, Atlanta is closing the case concerning Mrs. KING. In the event information comes to the attention of Atlanta concerning her, wherein further action should be taken, the Bureau will be advised and appropriate action will be taken.

Captioned individual, who you advised is affiliated with the Martin Luther King Center for Social Change, 671 Beckwith Street, Southwest, Atlanta, <u>Georgia</u>, was the subject of White House name checks in 1970 and T971. Copies of the PBI memoranda dated January 26, 1970, and February 1, 1971, each concerning the captioned individual (62-108052-57, 67)are attached.

Since that time, our files reveal the following information concerning the captioned individual:

The National Peace Action Coalition (NPAC) and the Peoples Coalition for Peace and Justice (PCPJ) sponsored a series of demonstrations in Washington, D.C., during the period of April 24 to May 5, 1971. The NPAC is an umbrella antiwar organization with an objective to involve masses including labor unions, G.I.'s, and the black community to effect the immediate withdrawal of all U.S. forces from Southeast Asia and abolition of the draft. The PCPJ described itself as comprised of over 100 organizations whose purpose is to combat the issues of racism, poverty, repression and war. On April 29, 1971, the Spring Demonstration Against Poverty, War and Repression as sponsored by the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC), was held at Washington in conjunction with the NPAC and FCPJ demonstrations, and featured Ralph D. Abernathy, President of SCLC, leading a mule train to the U.S. Capital. With Abernathy calling for a guaranteed annual income of \$6,500 for a family of four, other speakers at the Capitol rally included Bella Abzug, National Student Mobilization Committee Secretary Debra Bustin, Senator Vance Hartke, and Coretta S. King. In her speech, Mrs. King spoke of the trouble in America, of churches and schools having been napalmed by those who seek personal profits, (our) cities are dying from bankruptcy, having mass murders, fear exists everywhere and the Dep. AD Adm. - war is the cause of all this. She said the war is an enemy

of black people and that it rids the nation of all its useful resources. She posed the question, "Why can't people of the United States and Southeast Asia make peace?" She said people should make peace and that We should declare that the war is over, that the march of hunger and poverty is over and added that the only trouble is that Nixon and Agnew hope to keep this national crisis to maintain control of the people.

Mrs. King said her husband maintained there must be a radical revolution in the form of a personal revolution in order to change the society and that racism and militarism have to be put down. She concluded by saying, "You - people - let us make the peace."

In November, 1972, it was known that Mrs. King continued to be a member of the Board of Directors of the SCLC while making frequent public appearances and speeches in behalf of legitimate civil rights movements and activities. She is also active in collecting funds for the Martin Luther King, Jr., Memorial Center in Atlanta, Georgia. (62-108052-72)

On November 30, 1974, Mrs. King led a march sponsored by the Committee for Integrated Quality Education in Boston, Massachusetts, to support busing for integration of the schools. She was one of the speakers listed for a rally in connection with the march. (157-6-5-A Daily World, 11/30/74.

The central files of the FBI, including the files of the Identification Division, contain no additional pertinent information concerning captioned individual based upon background information submitted in connection with this name check request.

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At 3:30 p.m. on March 10, 1975, I met with Assistant Attorney General Scalia, Office of Legal Counsel in the Department; William Hoiles, Counselor to the Attorney General; Harry H. Wachtel, attorney for Mrs. Coretta King and the estate of Martin Luther King, Jr.; Congressman Andrew Young (D-Ga.); and District of Columbia Delegate Walter E. Fauntroy.

Mr. Wachtel said that he represented Mrs. King personally and the estate of Martin Luther King, Jr., in an effort to determine the best course of action concerning certain file material believed to be in possession of the FBI regarding Martin Luther King, Jr. He introduced Congressman Young as the principal spokesman for their group.

Mr. Young said that he is personally acquainted with the King children and his principal concern is to protect the reputation of their late father. He said that during the years in which the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) was active under the leadership of Martin Luther King, Jr., Young was a national coordinator and Fauntroy SCLC head in the District of Columbia. Young said that his interest is in preventing in any way disclosure of information that might be derogatory concerning King. He said that he is particularly concerned about the possibility that the Senate Select Committee and the House Select Committee on Intelligence might subpoena FBI records concerning King with the result that material could be leaked to the press. 67-108057

He said he is also concerned about reports appearing in the press recently which alleged improper activities concerning the FBI. He gave as an example the allegation in the 'New York Times" of March 9, 1975, that the Bureau had ordered handwriting samples of Young to be obtained in order for his signature to be forged. Young said that he is not interested in helping the press attack the FBI by having the Bureau's files concerning King made available because he has personal knowledge that the press, in the early 1960's, was aware that FBI Agents circulated false reports concerning members of the SCLC and doing other things to disrupt their activities. He said that at that time he and others had requested the press to identify the Agents involved, but they consistently refused to do so and now he saw no reason to aid the press in their current efforts against the FBI.

Mr. Wachtel said that he was aware that they could ask for materials under the Freedom of Information Act and that they could sue for damages for improper activities by the Bureau, but they have decided that it would be more useful to protect the privacy of the King family to attempt to resolve this matter without the publicity that would be attached to such requests or a suit. He asked what our general policy is concerning the release of information to Congress and our policy concerning the protection of privacy of individuals who might be mentioned in our files.

I told him that the FBI is not in favor of making Bureau files available for review by members of Congress and that we are most concerned about the protection of personal privacy of individuals. I pointed out that in most cases the FBI's position under the FOIA is that material should not be released even in those situations where the Department is of the opinion that the material must be released pursuant to the statute. Assistant Attorney General Scalia supported me in that position and said he well understood the policy of the FBI to be a careful concern for the privacy of individuals.

Congressman Young said that their interests could be served if they could be made aware of the nature of the information in Bureau files on King and he requested consideration be given to granting them

access to file material concerning King. He explained that they could not take appropriate steps to protect the privacy of King and his surviving family against publication by Congress or leaks to the press unless they knew what the material was. Young suggested that it might be possible for any material on King to be transferred to the King Memorial Library to be held free from inspection for future historical purposes. I reminded Mr. Young that such a move would not protect the material from Congressional subpoena and I suggested to him that if material exists in FBI files concerning King, it would have greater protection in the custody of the FBI because of the opportunities available for the Executive Branch to deal on an equal basis with the Congress, and therefore to deny access to the material in the face of a Congressional subpoena.

Mr. Young agreed that he had not considered that aspect of his proposal.

Mr. Wachtel asked for a specific timetable for the preparation of the Attorney General's proposed guidelines and asked whether any specific arrangements have been made to date with any of the Congressional committees that might involve material on King. Assistant Attorney General Scalia told him that no specific timetable has been set for the development of guidelines but the Attorney General has indicated that they must be developed at an early date. He said that no arrangements have been made with any Congressional committees concerning file material on King.

Mr. Wachtel and Congressman Young requested an opportunity to meet again to discuss this matter further and indicated that they would call and request another meeting. Mr. Scalia then advised that he would present to the Attorney General the request for them to have access to the file material if any exists on King and indicated that he would advise Mr. Wachtel by March 17, 1975, of the developments concerning the Attorney General's proposed guidelines.

It was indicated that there was no request made under the FOIA. The purpose of the meeting was to attempt to find an informal way of disposing of material that might exist concerning King of a derogatory nature. After the conference had concluded, I discussed

with Mr. Scalia the steps he might take in resolving this matter and I requested him to keep me advised as to any decisions that might be made by the Attorney General. Nothing additional needs to be done by the Bureau at this time concerning this matter.

At 3:20 p.m. on March 4, 1975, William Hoiles, Counselor to the Attorney General, called me and advised that the Attorney General had just received a telephone call from an attorney representing Mrs. Martin Luther King, Jr., requesting a conference with the Attorney General. The attorney proposed that he would be accompanied by Congressman Andrew Young (D. -Ga.) and District of Columbia Delegate Watter E. Fauntroy. Hoiles said that instead of having the Attorney General meet with the Congressman, Mr. Fauntroy and the Attorney representing Mrs. King, it had been proposed that Hoiles meet with them accompanied by Assistant Attorney General Scalia of the Office of Legal Counsel of the Department, and he requested me to attend as well.

Hoiles said that the meeting would be held at 1:00 p.m. on the afternoon of March 5, 1975, in the office of Mr. Scalia.

It appears that the request to meet with the Attorney General is intended to provide an opportunity for a request to be made for information concerning Martin Luther King, Jr., under the Freedom of Information Act. In the event such a request is made, it will be made clear that the Bureau will receive the request and it will be handled appropriately under the statute.

At 4: 15 p.m., Mr. Hoiles's secretary advised that the attorney representing Mrs. King would be Harry H. Wachtel.

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

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## A Plan to Overcome Racism at the FBI

Credit FBI Director William S. Sessions with doing the honorable thing. Without waiting for the outcomes of pending law-suits that accuse the Federal Bureau of Investigation with discrimination against, and racial harassment of, minority employees, Mr. Sessions has instituted an aggressive affirmative action plan to correct inequities in his agency.

Judging from testimony in the legal proceedings so far, there is much to be corrected. A suit filed by 311 Hispanic agents charges discrimination in the assignment, promotion and discipline of Hispanic agents. An action by a black agent in Philadelphia accuses supervisors and agents of racial harassment. Several of the agent's complaints have been upheld by the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission.

Of 9,597 FBI agents, fewer than 10 percent are black or Hispanic. Only 417 are black; 439 are Hispanic. This even though blacks and Hispanics make up more than 20 percent of the U.S. population and despite the fact that a number of the bureau's cases require work in minority communities. Such cases would seemingly benefit from the in-

volvement of minority agents.

In any event, Mr. Sessions, who says he has wanted to improve the bureau's treatment of minority employees since he took over the agency, has apparently realized the difficulty of trying to change an entrenched bureaucracy whose members' attitudes may still be influenced by the less enlightened policies of the J. Edgar Hoover years.

Over the next five years, the FBI will aggressively recruit women and minorities, and not just for "traditional" minority jobs. Mr. Sessions said minority members will be sought for crucial job categories such as linguist, lawyer, engineer, computer scientist and accountant. An advertising agency has been hired for that purpose and several of the agency's top employees will be asked to serve as recruiters.

Career development and training programs are being improved and promotion and complaint procedures are being reviewed. Mr. Sessions' actions are welcome. They indicate he is serious about his vow to stamp out racism and discrimination in the agency — an accomplishment that will benefit the bureau and the nation.

My thanks and sincere appreciation for your kind and most generous letter of March 6. 1989. Your support of Martin's Federal National Holiday and the efforts of the Federal Commission to comply with the mandate of the Congress to make the holiday the "time for Americans to reflect on the principles of racial equality and nonviolent social change espoused by Martin Luther King, Jr. is to be commended. I am especially delighted and encouraged by your belief that using FBI personnel to work with the MLK Ir. Federal Holiday Commission could be a beneficial relationship for your employees.

I have every reason to believe that with the support of the President and the Congress that the Federal Commission will be extended beyond April 20, 1989 and that we will be in a position to take advantage of your interest in furthering the work of the Commission.

In the meantime, I would like to use this opportunity to express my concern about a good friend and supporter of Martin, The King Center and the Federal Commission, Congressman Walter Fauntroy. As you know, the FBI has been investigating Congressman Fauntroy for several months after very public and politically damaging allegations which originated with an Associate Press reporter.

I understand that the FBI completed its investigation and that the evidence assembled for the record, reflected no violation of law. I now understand that the FBI has been requested to extend its investigation of Congressman Fauntroy for another two months. which leads me and Civil Rights leaders to fear that an apparatus which was operated in the decade of the 60's against Martin is being reactivated as a results of the regulation issued by former Attorney General Messe on the last day of his tenure at the Department of Justice. I sincerely hope this is not so.

I know that your sense of fairness and justice would refrain the FBI from any involvement in efforts designed solely to discredit the reputation of a member of the Congress for political and partisan purposes. I hope we can close the chapter on the allegations and investigation of Congressman Fauntroy, so that he can get on with providing the essential leadership to which so many of us have come to expect and to depend upon. 62-108052-78
