

Foreign Relations Council Head Urges Cooperation at Dinner of Dominion Society Here

Establishment of a Federal agency to be known as a Commission on Internal Security that would guard against the invasion is of "Soviet communism" here was urged last night by Allen W. Dulles, president of the Council on Foreign Relations.

He warned the annual dinner meeting of the Canadian Society of New York, at the Biltmore Hotel, that Soviet leaders had not abandoned their plans to advance communism whether their hopes to a severe depression materialize or not. The former wartime chief of the Office of Strategic Services in Switzerland maintained that Saviet leaders in Moscow had pat eside temporary "disappointment": and wire playing a "waiting

He suggested that the proposed security commission be patterned after Canada's Royal Commission
that recently exposed and helped
envict members of a spy ring.
Such a commission could in

vestigate the practices and policies of Soviet communism stemming from abroad but operating here and fanning out in various channels to threaten our democratic in-stitutions," Mr. Dulles asserted. "In fact, it could show how they use and abuse these very institu-tions of liberty to destroy liberty," he added.

He explained that the commission would not prosecute crimes nor invade the field of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. It would merely unearth facts, Mr. Dulles poted

The commission would use the light of publicity where this would contince "soft-headed people who, in the relative security of North America, still believe in communism as a beneficent force in our body politic and these who still body politic, and those who still look upon Chinese and other Communists as mere land reformers, 

He warned that the "non-Com munist world is the subject of a by tematic program of penetration by skilled artisans of world-wide revolution. Their leaders have a faratic faith in their cause and supreme confidence in ultimate success." Mr. Dulles said.

Both Canada and the United States are being subjected to long-range attacks under a policy that the Soviet Union followed success fully in the Far East and Czecho-slovakia, Mr. Dulles maintained. "Whenever they run against the existence of sound economic conditions, they play a waiting game.

"Even Moscow has not been able to hide its disappointment due to the miscalculation of the strength the miscalculation of the strength of our economic system. Here we were scheduled to have a serious depression within a year or two of the end of the war. So far we have fooled them. But that means that the Soviet has postponed certain of their planned measures. They have not abandoned them, "In pulles asserted.

In another address Vincent Massey, Chancellor of the University of Toronto, told the audience that "one thing alone can give us peace," the array of force on the side of right."

He said that negotations with dictators can only be conducted on a basis of "negotation from" a basis of "negotation from strength," as stated by Anthony Eden. Chancellor Massey added that "freedom is a practical business, something to be fought for." "It is an urgent matter, too," he said, "for in some parts of the world today, in the continent of Asia for example, liberty is now

Asia for example, liberty is now in metreat. A nation must be judged by a triple test—by its belieft in freedom, by its practice of freedom, by its willingness to defend freedom."

DETAILS

For your further information the article "Stalin On Revolution" by
Historicus, carried in the January, 1949 issue of Foreign Affairs, pages 175-214,
was studied at the Central Research Desk, It was then referred by this Desk to
the Overthrow and Destruction of Government Desk where a copy was incorporated
in the Communist Party Brief file. It is to be noted that while this article,
"Stalin On Revolution," is excellently done, it contains nothing of either an
evidentiary or informative nature which is not already in the Brief.

This article "Stalin On Revolution" has been retained at the Central Research Desk awaiting the reaction of the Communist press, following which a short memorandum will be prepared analyzing, comparing and contrasting both the position taken in the article and the Communist attack on it. The first notable Communist press reaction has just occurred in "How 'Historicus' Caricatures History" by George Siskind, Political Affairs, February, 1949, pages 28-36. This issue arrived at the Bureau a few days ago and it is expected other Communist press reactions will soon be forthcoming, following which the aforementioned analysis will be made.

It will be observed on reading the article "Stalin On Revolution" by Historicus that the author draws copiously from Voprosy Leninizma (which translated means "Problems of Leninism") by Joseph Stalin, Russian Edition. Through the Central Research Desk there has been purchased recently an English translation of this same book, entitled "Problems of Leninism" by Joseph Stalin, published by the Foreign Language Publishing House, Moscow, 1947. A copy of this book is now in use at the Central Research Desk and another copy is available in the Bureau Library.

Dear Sirs,

Several items have come to my attention recently about which I am very confused.

To begin with "What Can I, as a parent, homemaker and concerned citizen, do to fight Communism? What do you propose as the intelligent course to follow to help our country? A good many of our friends are beginning to talk about Communism and they are attending meetings held in various homes, listening to some tape recording which they have purchased regarding Russia and her plans to engulf the world, writing their Congressmen on what they believe and generally becoming highly excited about the situation. Is this the way to fight Communism? At first their reaction was one of quiet disbelief, but now this is being replaced by the feeling that they must do something. I want to do something too!, but before I do, I want to be sure that what I do is right, because from the limited amount I know about Communism I believe it is quite easy to become a pawn of Communism unwittingly. So again, What can I do, overtly, to fight Communism?

Number 2, What is the Council on Foreign Relations? When was it organized? How does it function? Who are it's members?

Thirdly, I had a friend call yesterday and tell me that Resolutions 7936 thru and including 7984 are to be brought before the House of Representatives this week, (now referred to as H. R. 9118 & F. B. 2180) And that it is their understanding that these resolutions are to establish an agency called "Peace Agency" for the purpose of Disarmament. And that if adopted these resolutions will subject our weapons and all type of protection to the jurisdiction of the World Court for International Law, in complete disobeyance of the Connolly Amendment to the United Nations Charter. Is this true? EX 100 acc.

I realize I may have directed these questions to the wrong Federal group, if so would you kindly refer me to the proper one.

Hoping your advice will clear things up and put me on the right path.

September 28, 1961 Dear Your letter dated September 19, 1961, has been received, and I appreciate the interest which prompted your communication. Title Tuppect to your question as to what you, as an individual, can do to counter the communist threat, I have always encouraged our citizens to educate themselves to the true nature and methods of the communist moven ment in order that they may intelligently resist the zealous efforts of its adherents to destroy our form of government. This knowledge helps to avoid the danger of confusing communism with legitimate dissent on controversial issues. We cannot use vigilante action in combating communism, and it is the responsibility of people to report information to the proper authorities. May I suggest you consider my book, "Masters of Deceit," which relates to the story of communism in America and how Americans can fight this menace. It should be available to you at your local libraries or bookstores. It is not possible for me to furnish you information about the organization you mentioned in your letter since data in the files of the FBI must be maintained as confidential through a regulation of the Department of Justice. Please do not infer that our records do or do not contain anything pertaining to your inquiry. I am unable to offer a source as to where you can obtain the information you seek. In connection with the other matter you presented, this is a legislative matter, and I have followed the policy over the years of not injecting the FBI into situations involving local or Federal legislation. 



With respect to your inquiry concerning the Council on Foreign Relations, the FBI being an investigative agency of the Federal Government neither makes evaluations nor draws conclusions as to the character or integrity of any organization, publication or individual. I regret I am not in position to comment along the lines you have requested and it is hoped that you will not infer either that we do or do not have data in our files relating to this group.

In regard to the latest statistics on the communist conspiracy, the enclosed pamphlet, "The Current Communist Threat," discusses the legal action against the Communist Party, USA. Since this was published, on December 17, 1962, the Party, as an organization was found guilty on all twelve counts of the indictment. On the same day, the court sentenced the Party to pay a fine of \$120,000. The Party has filed an appeal.

In addition, based on information and witnesses supplied by the FBI, the Attorney General filed petitions with the Subversive Activities Control Board requesting that twenty-seven members of the Communist Party, USA, be ordered to register as members of the Party. Twenty of the hearings have been held



To fully understand the political situation in this country we must have knowledge of the COUNCIL ON FOREIGN RELATIONS (CFR). There have been several books written on the subject, all in 1962. One of the best is Mary M. Davison's "The Secret Government of the United States". This is a book that everyone should read. It costs only a dollar and can be had from The Greater Nebraskan, 1330 Turner Boulevard, Omaha 5, Nebraska.

Since Nelson Rockefeller has become a leading contender for the Republican nomination for the Presidency in 1964 and is a great power within the party; and since he holds equally great power within the Democratic Party, through his control of the Council On Foreign Relations (shared with a few others), the citizen who does not understand the intricate, hidden web of political and financial influence within the CFR is completely in the dark about Nelson Rockefeller.

When Rockefeller said, a short time ago, that he was for the conservatives, the liberals, and the progressives, he was telling us that he stood for no political principle. He stood for the CFR. He could run on either ticket, Democratic or Republican. It really makes little difference to him whether he is elected or whether John F. Kennedy, who is also CFR, is elected. In either case, Nelson Rockefeller (and the other small group of members of the CFR who control it) would control the government.

What it amounts to is that we now have a one-party system. In the Federal Government, highranking positions are held by members of the CFR, no matter to which party the President nominally belongs. This is illustrated by the fact that such persons as JOHN J. McCLOY, CHRISTIAN HERTER, JOHN FOSTER DULLES, DILLON, ALLAN DULLES, DWIGHT D. EISENHOWER, NEL-SON ROCKEFELLER, and many others, have held high office under both Democratic and Republican administrations. Even Thomas E. Dewey held city, county and state political positions, sometimes in Democratic administrations and sometimes in Republican. The list is long. What then, at national levels, is the difference between the two parties? There is none. All of the above are members of the Council On Foreign Relations. All have promoted the objectives of the Council On Foreign Relations. We have, in effect, a one-party system, and that one party is the Council On Foreign Relations.

Are there other countries with one-party political systems? I will name a few. Russia, Jugoslavia, Poland, Hungary, Rumania, Albania, Outer Mongolia, North Korea, Ceylon, Indonesia, North Vietnam, China, Cuba are some of them. They have open, one-political-party systems. In this country, the general public are not yet aware of the fact that we have a one-party system.

This trend is not good. For, in a one-party system, the people have nothing to say about how the government is run and what the policy of the government shall be. No matter how they vote, they get the same results. There might be a slight change in personnel, a slight shift in positions, such as Assistant Secretary of State Dillon in the Eisenhower administration shifting to Secretary of the Treasury in the Kennedy administration. But that is all.

No matter whether the President calls himself Democrat or Republican, he directs affairs so as to continue the one-party system; and he follows the policies set down by the Council On Foreign Relations.

Is it any wonder, then, that the United States Government continues to assist the other oneparty system governments --- that is, the Communist governments --- in every way possible? We assist them with money, training their soldiers with military equipment and supplies, with food, with industrial equipment, with know-how, with education.

We assist them in every way we can. Particularly when they are in political difficulties, we come to their rescue with political support and even military action. WE ARE NOW SUPPORTING THE CONGO AGAINST KATANGA. WE ARE ASSISTING CASTRO BY SUPPORTING HIS CO-CON-SPIRATOR, JUAN BOSCH, IN THE TAKE-OVER OF THE DOMINICAN REPUBLIC.

Is it any wonder that the United States Government supports the United Nations in cooperation with the Communist governments?

The objective of the United Nations is a World Wide Socialist Dictatorship, A one-party system of government for the entire world. That, also, is not good. For, even if the people are allowed to vote, it will make no difference how they vote. The same party---the only party---shall continue to rule. The same individuals at the top will hold the power. They will deal out to the people only what they wish them to have. Freedom will disappear and tyranny shall prevail over the entire world,

If we are to return to the traditional American mode of government, we will have to strengthen our two-party system. Then, the people will have a choice.

There are, in fact, two distinct and opposing lines of political thought. There are the misnamed 'liberals', who would permanently establish a one-party system by supporting the type of government we have had for the past several decades. The other principle is that of the conservatives, who believe in a limited Constitutional Republic, in which the people control the government and not the other way around.

I am confident that if the public can be brought to realize that our government is on its way to becoming a one-party system, the conservatives shall recognize the danger and will take the steps. required to bring about the necessary reform. WE MUST HAVE CONSERVATIVE CANDIDATES, AND NO MATTER WHETHER THEY CALL THEMSELVES DEMOCRAT OR REPUBLICAN, THEY MUST BE ELECTED TO OFFICE. ENCLOSURE 62-5256






