Paper claims hijack talk

SEATTLE (UPI) —The Seattle flag, a biweekly newspaper just five editions old, has published what it asserts was a transcript of a taped interview with hijacker-extortionist "D. B. Cooper."

The newspaper said in Monday's edition it paid \$1,000 for the interview conducted by an anonymous "ordinary looking man of 20 years plus" and signed "an agreement of confidentiality." Part of the agreement, said the Flag, required destruction of the tape after transcription.

Asked about the Flag report, special FBI Agent J. Earl Milnes at Seattle said, "We have absolutely no comment."

D. B. Cooper was the name used by the man who hijacked a Northwest Airlines 727 on a Seattle to Portland, Ore., flight last Nov. 24. The hijacker extorted \$200,000 from the airline, then ordered the plane to fly from Seattle to Reno at 10,000 feet altitude.

The hijacker escaped by parachute during the Seattle-Reno flight.

The newspaper, staffed primarily by persons in their 20s, said it agreed to buy the interview after the anonymous reporter showed a photograph of a \$20 bill which had a serial number identified as among those in the marked bundle of \$20 bills given to "Cooper."

He stated that the letter was passed from Department to Department for about two weeks and was handled by a number of clerks and editors before he received it approximately ten days ago. He declined to estimate the number of people who handled the letter adding that it would be impossible to determine the number or identities of those people. b6 b7C

[redacted] continued that [redacted] no present plans for publication of the letter. He advised that a photocopy of the letter was forwarded [redacted] in the San Diego, California area. He named [redacted] California, telephone [redacted] explained that [redacted] determined from the letter's postmark that the letter had been mailed within a one hundred mile radius of San Diego but outside San Diego's city limits. 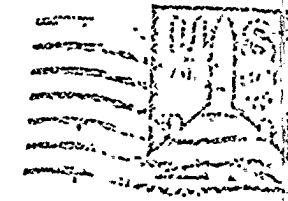

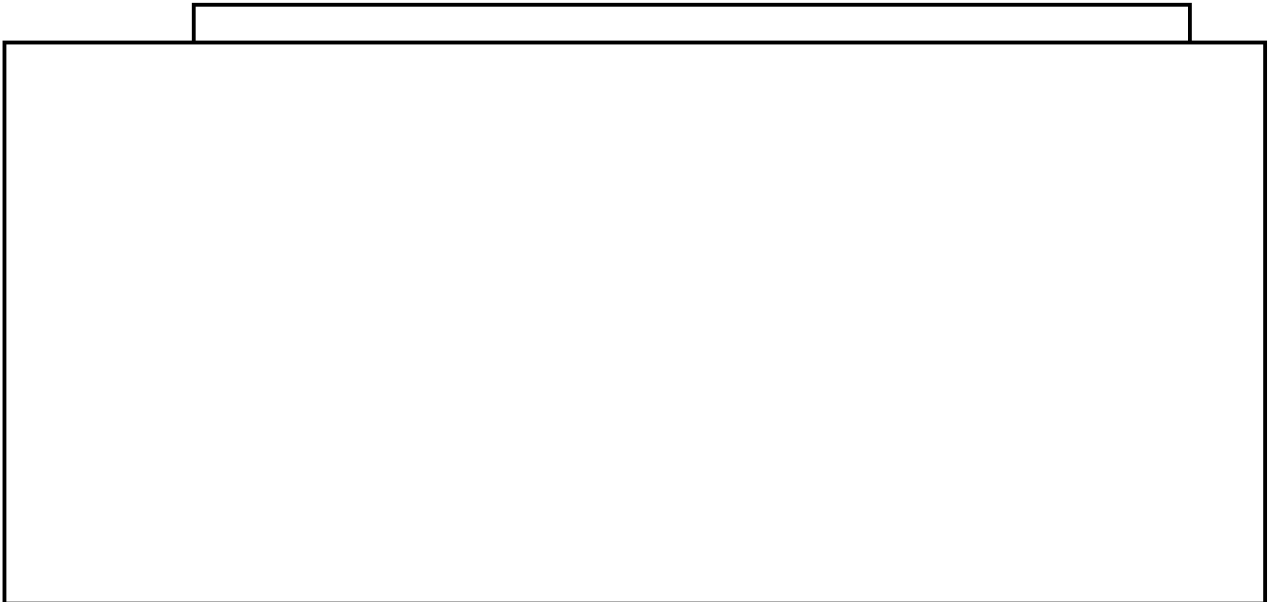

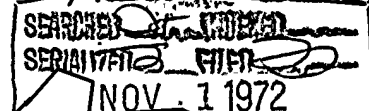
Result of examination:

There's almost no chance that Dan Cooper, who parachuted from an airliner with \$200,000 strapped to his body, is still alive.

But if he is, the statute of limitation for his skyjack runs out Thanksgiving eve.

reunions, turkey dinners, long relaxed conversations and perhaps a traditional game of bridge or Monopoly later.

But one didn't.

Dan Cooper paid cash for his ticket, then, clutching a paper sack, boarded the Boeing 727 for the 30-minute flight.

A few minutes after the plane nosed into the storm, he made his move. He showed the stewardess what he said was a dynamite bomb and demanded four parachutes, \$200,000 in \$20 bills, and "no funny stuff."

All the passengers but Cooper got off at Seattle, unaware that anything was amiss.

The money and parachutes were put on board and the jet, with only the crew and Cooper aboard, headed for Reno on Cooper's orders. Then somewhere over southwest Washington, Cooper, with the 21 pounds of money strapped to him, bailed out. He hasn't been heard from since.

If he's alive — and that's a big "if" — the five-year statute of limitations runs out this Thanksgiving eve, Nov. 24.

Or does it?

"We're going ahead on the assumption that the statute doesn't apply, because when he did what he did, capital punishment was a possibility. There's no statute on capital crimes," says FBI agent Ralph Himmelsbach.

Himmelsbach, who has worked on the case from the start, concedes that recent court decisions have muddled the question of whether capital punishment would, in fact, have been applicable.

"We're continuing to process suspects," he said. "Of course, it has slowed down a great deal."

He says chances are good that Cooper is dead.

"Not one of the 10,000 bills has shown up, and we know the serial number of every one of them," he said. And Cooper apparently knew nothing about skydiving.

In a business suit and street shoes, he jumped from the rear door of a jet going 197 m.p.h. at 10,000 feet. At that elevation it was seven below zero that night, with a wind-chill factor of 69 below zero.

"On top of that, he probably lost his shoes (from wind shock) as he jumped," Himmelsbach said.

The plane was in clouds. "Up looked like down to him. He had no visual reference. He couldn't have possibly known where he was."

Himmelsbach wonders if he cared.

"In another 30 minutes he could have been over the Willamette Valley, and almost any place he jumped would have been safe to land," he said. Instead, Cooper picked some of

the roughest country in the Pacific Northwest.

He took two of the four parachutes

with him when he jumped: One was a small emergency chute of the type used by stunt flyers. Under ideal conditions, someone who knew what he was doing might break an ankle or leg with it.

The other was a training chute used for demonstrations. The panels had been sewn shut. It wouldn't have opened.

The next night the FBI re-enacted the skyjacking using the same plane, crew, fuel load, speed and altitude. The test helped flight engineers and meteorologists to compute the probable drop zone to be a trapezoidal area covering about 25 square miles.

It has been searched and researched in vain. In April, 1972, 200 Army troops from Ft. Lewis, Wash., spent 18 days in the area. All they found was the victim of a homicide, a case unrelated to Cooper's.

What would it take to find Cooper's remains, assuming they are there?

"I'd say it might take 5,000 men five years. I mean, how do you search a blackberry thicket higher than your head?"

The area contains part of a reservoir, steep hills and dense forest, much of it far from roads or trails. Experienced hunters can and do get lost up there every year.

Loggers who work in the area agree that coyotes or wild dogs would make quick work of a body. After five years, they say you might find a scrap of bone or two, if that.

Nevertheless, for a while Cooper was a folk hero of sorts.

He was macho. He was daring. He didn't hurt anybody, but he ripped off a big corporation. And he beat the fuzz.

There were Cooper T-shirts and Cooper bumper stickers. There were songs about Cooper. Two men were arrested for trying to bilk Newsweek magazine of \$30,000 for an interview with "Cooper."

And there were imitators. Around the world, there were more than a dozen skyjacking attempts patterned after Cooper's. Cooper is the only one not known to have failed.

With increased airport security and modification of the Boeing 727 so the rear door wouldn't open in flight, the fad stopped.

The flow of clues, hints, and tips from the public about Dan Cooper has slowed to a trickle now. After checking out more than 1,000 suspects, the FBI says it knows little more about Cooper than it did on that stormy night when he leapt into history.

What kind of a man would do what Cooper did?

An ex-convict with no ties to people outside prison? A drifter who wouldn't be missed if he dropped from sight? A man with ties to family or friends who says, "I'm going to Libya to drill for oil. I won't write but you'll hear from me eventually?" An expatriate? A nut?

All every possible, says Himmelsbach.

"Our society is so open, with its rights to come and go. It's so uncontrolled that it is possible for somebody to leave or drop out and nobody would think anything about it."

For a time it appeared a light plane may have been waiting for Cooper and whisked him from the drop zone that night. This assumes Cooper knew where he was jumping, an idea the FBI rules out.

A small plane did leave the area that night, but the pilot has been cleared.

A theory that the crew was part of the plot also has been scrapped.

Himmelsbach said the whole thing probably was put together with minimal planning and that the bomb was a bundle of relatively harmless highway flares. The bomb was red. Dynamite, isn't it. If the crew members had realized that, they might have called his bluff at the time, Himmelsbach said. "He's lucky he got as far as he did with a plan like that."

Cooper's face, drawn by artists, is not a memorable one. It could be your neighbor, or a fellow bus rider.

"I'm sure a few dingallings will come along after the five years are up and say, 'Hey! I did it,'" Himmelsbach chuckled.

But even if the statute holds up, Cooper will have problems.

The Internal Revenue Service computes his tax debt, including penalties and interest, at about \$198,000. And the Globe Indemnity Co., which had to pay \$180,000 to the airline, may want to talk to him.

So now, what?

"We have to accept the possibility that we may never know," Himmelsbach said. "I guess we can live with that if we have to."

Part of 'D. B. Cooper' Loot Found by Family on Outing

By RONALD J. OSTROW

WASHINGTON—A young Vancouver, Wash., family on an outing along the Columbia River last Sunday suddenly stumbled across 12 stacks of moldering money—part of the \$200,000 that the notorious airline hijacker "D. B. Cooper" made off with more than eight years ago, the FBI said Tuesday.

With the bills now having been traced definitely to the Cooper loot, 30 agents from the Portland and Seattle FBI offices have begun an extensive search of the area for more of the money—and possibly for some sign of Cooper or, more likely, his remains.

The money—"several thousand dollars," according to one official—was found in Washington about five miles northwest of the Interstate 5 bridge that spans the Columbia and separates Washington from Oregon, FBI agent William M. Baker told a news conference in Portland.

Discovery of the money by Harold

Dwayne Ingram, 27, his wife, Patricia, 26, and their sons, 8 and 3, marked the latest twist in the bizarre saga of the now-legendary Cooper, who parachuted from a Northwest Airlines jetliner on Thanksgiving Eve, 1971, never to be seen or heard from again. When found by the Ingrams, the stacks of \$20 bills were bound by decomposing rubber bands, the FBI said. But there was "no trace of D. B. Cooper," according to the agency.

Shortly after the hijacking, a cult sprang up around D. B. Cooper, a name that never has been traced to its origins.

A private club was named in his honor, D. B. Cooper T-shirts were manufactured, bumper stickers were run off and anniversary parties were held.

Baker said in Portland that whether Cooper got away with the rest of the money was an open question.

Law enforcement authorities long

have believed that Cooper died in his plunge from the Boeing 727 because he was wearing only a business suit and street shoes when he jumped into a howling wind and freezing rain in an unreliable parachute. It has been estimated that he hit the ground at a speed of 50 to 70 m.p.h.

The saga began when "Cooper" boarded the jetliner in Portland for an evening flight to Seattle. Once airborne, he demanded that the airline have \$200,000 in \$20 bills and three parachutes on hand when the plane landed in Seattle. He threatened to blow up the plane if his demands were not met.

The airline complied, providing the parachutes and money. However, the FBI said Tuesday that the serial numbers of the bills had been recorded.

Cooper permitted the airliner's 36 passengers to leave the plane in Seattle. He then ordered the crew to take the plane to Reno and told the pilot to fly at a relatively low altitude and to open the plane's rear stairway.

Crew members last heard his voice on the plane's intercom when they

were over the Washington-Oregon border. They said they believe he jumped, using the least reliable parachute.

The decomposed money was found 17 to 20 miles from the jump site by the Ingrams' older son, Brian. The bills were partly buried in sand that the Ingrams were scooping out to build a fire.

"Here's some more wood for the fire, Daddy," the father recalled his son as saying.

"It wasn't wood," Ingram said. "He (Brian) thought he had struck it rich."

Ingram said he assumed the bills might be part of the Cooper money. He turned them over to the FBI, adding with a smile that they were so decomposed, "I couldn't have spent it."

In leafing through the rotting bills, Baker said, the FBI made about "nine or 10 immediate hits"—matches with the numbers of the missing money. The bills were flown to Washington for further analysis and tests by the FBI laboratory.

An FBI official said the packaging and number sequence of the recovered bills indicated they had not been

separated and "are in much the same order as when they were given to the hijacker."

The initial search, confined to an area several hundred yards long and 40 yards wide, turned up "fragments of more money"—nothing more, Baker said. He said the money appeared to have washed up on the bank.

Once that search is completed, probably by this afternoon, a scaled-down number of agents will move upstream, continuing the hunt.

Law enforcement officials in the Pacific Northwest have theorized that Cooper's body is at the bottom of Lake Merwin, 30 miles north of Portland, or that his bones are so entangled in giant wild blackberry bushes that they will never be found.

Ralph Himmelsbach, the FBI agent who has worked on the hijacking since it took place, said the money probably had been washed downstream from a Columbia tributary in Washington. But he said he doubted that it came from the Lewis River, the tributary that flows out of Lake Merwin.

Some Skyjack Loot Found But Trail Still Cold

PORTLAND, Ore. — Children digging in the sand during a family picnic uncovered up to \$3,000 of the \$200,000 taken by D.B. Cooper in a 1971 jet hijacking in which the hijacker escaped by parachute, the FBI said yesterday.

FBI officials said the discovery of the money on a Columbia River beach north of Portland reinforced their long-held theory that Cooper was killed in the daring plunge that has made the aerial bandit a folk hero in the Pacific Northwest.

No trace has been found of the hijacker.

At news conferences in Washington, Seattle and Portland, the FBI confirmed that the money — not counted but estimated at \$3,000 or less — was part of the \$200,000 in \$20 bills given Cooper on demand after he commandeered a Northwest Orient Airlines 727 trijet on Thanksgiving eve 1971.

A man using the name D.B. Cooper boarded the jet in Portland, threatened to blow it up, then forced it to land in Seattle to collect the ransom. He allowed 36 passengers aboard the flight to leave the aircraft, then ordered the crew to fly to Reno. When it landed in Reno, there was no trace of Cooper but the rear exit door under the tail was open.

The FBI theorized at the time that Cooper, dressed only in a business suit and street shoes, jumped from the plane over southwest Washington during a freezing storm.

FBI agent Ralph Himmelsbach, who has been on the Cooper case since the night of the skyjacking, said the discovery of the money reduced to "less than 50-50" the odds that Cooper is alive.

The FBI said it was searching the area for more money and clues as to the fate of Cooper.

The FBI displayed twelve weathered stacks of \$20 bills during a meeting with the press.

"This clue is the first we've had since the night of the occurrence," said Bill Baker, assistant special agent in charge of the Portland FBI office.

He said wads of the money, bound by rubber bands, were found Sunday while Harold D. Ingram, his wife, Patricia, and their 8-year-old son, Brian, were preparing to build a picnic fire along the Columbia River five miles northwest of the Interstate 5 bridge linking Portland and Vancouver, Wash., where the Ingrams live.

Ingram said at a news conference here that the money was found about 20 yards from the river's edge under a thin layer of sand.

"My son ran up and said, 'Wait a minute, Daddy,'" Ingram said. "He raked a place out in the sand and there it was. There were three bundles" of money.

"I thought it was play money," said Denise Ingram, 5, of Vancouver, Wash., in an interview with United Press International. She said she and her cousin Brian "both found it. It was buried in the sand."

Denise's mother, Crystal Ingram, said in Vancouver there was no bag for the money.

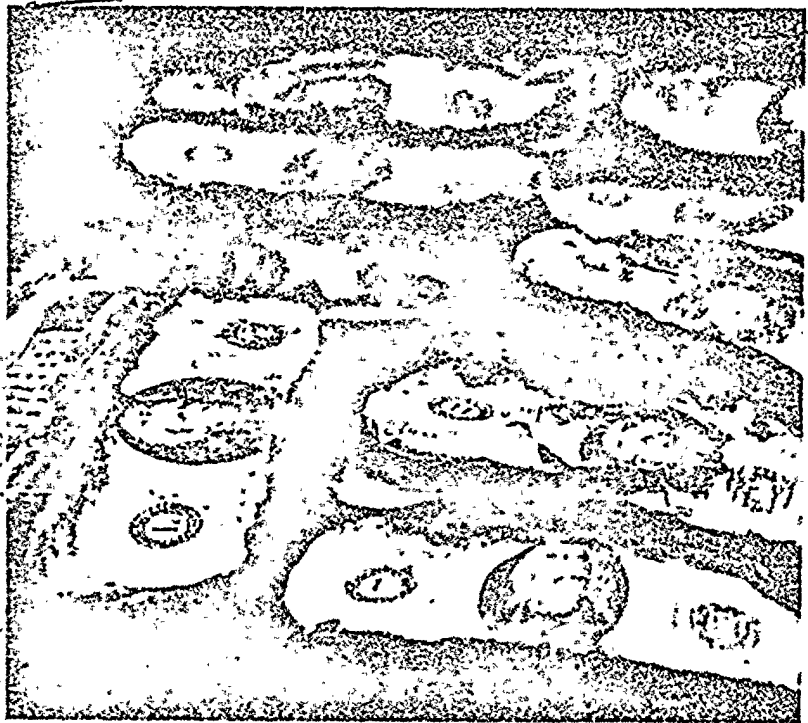
"We put it in a plastic bag from our bread," she said. "One of us did mention that it might have something to do with D.B. Cooper, but we kept on going with the picnic."

Harold Ingram later took the money to the FBI.

Baker said officials estimated there were several thousand dollars in the wads, but it was impossible to make an accurate estimate because of the deteriorated condition.

Officials have called the commandeering of the Boeing 727 jetliner the only known unsolved hijacking.

In 1977, just to make sure the hijacker did not escape prosecution via the statute of limitations, he was indicted on federal charges in absentia.

PORTLAND, Ore. (UPI) — Children playing in the sand along the Columbia River found tattered remains of part of the loot paid to skyjacker D.B. Cooper. The find has triggered a search for more of the \$200,000 ransom.

Discovery of the money was the first break in the case since Cooper bailed out of a plane into a rainy night in 1971.

FBI agents dug up more fragments of wet \$20 bills late yesterday along the river on the Fazio Ranch five miles west of Vancouver, Wash. Agents continued the search today.

FBI agent Ralph Himmelsbach, who has been on the case since the Thanksgiving Eve hijacking, said the finding of the money reduces to "less than 50-50" the odds that Cooper is still alive.

Cooper's case is the nation's only unsolved aerial hijacking for ransom. Since then, 13 persons have

tried the same thing; three were killed and the others were captured, the FBI said. were as deep as 3 feet beneath the surface.

that were part of Cooper's loot. The serial numbers showed they matched the \$200,000 Cooper extorted from Northwest Airlines in 1971. The partially decomposed clumps of money were being sent to the FBI laboratory in Washington, D.C., but agents on the case were sure all of the bills found were from the loot. FBI agents continued searching today at the beach on the Fazio Ranch where agents found bits of bills in the same area where the families had found the money in the sand Sunday. The hijacker, who actually used the name Dan Cooper on boarding the plane, told a stewardess he had a bomb in his briefcase and demanded \$200,000 and four parachutes and to be flown to Reno, Nev. He allowed the other passengers to leave the plane at Seattle where he got the money and chutes.

"They're very small pieces of money, about the size of a nickel," said FBI agent Tom Nicodemus. He said some of the pieces of money

More \$20 Bills

Found, Tied To D. B. Cooper

PORTLAND, Ore. (UPI) — FBI agents found wadded up \$20 bills yesterday in muck dredged from the Columbia River six years ago and said the money was part of the \$200,000 ransom collected in 1971 by D.B. Cooper before he parachuted into folklore from a hijacked jet-liner.

The first money from Cooper's haul was found Sunday on a sandy beach on the north shore of the Columbia 5 miles northwest of Vancouver, Wash., by children on a family outing. It totaled about \$3,000 and the serial numbers checked matched numbers on the bills given Cooper.

FBI agent Ralph Himmelsbach said more money was dug up by agents Tuesday afternoon and yesterday morning.

"We have the Army Corps of Engineers and geologists out there," Himmelsbach said. "An agent who was out there said it looks like they'll be able to help us out."

One agent at the site said he dug up a formless fist-size clump of money he described "a wadded up bunch of \$20 bills."

Himmelsbach said the geologists and corps scientists probably will be able to determine whether the shore material where the money was found came from the middle of the Columbia River, washed downstream from the Washougal River or was carried upstream from the mouth of the Lewis River and dumped at the site.

The FBI said it had learned that section of the Columbia was last dredged in 1974.

The FBI long believed Cooper parachuted into the drainage of the Lewis River, which empties into the Columbia downstream from Vancouver. The location in which the money was found indicated he landed 20 miles or more away in the drainage of the Washougal River which enters the Columbia upstream from the site.

Before he learned the shore material was dredging spoils from the river, Himmelsbach said the \$20 bills had been buried on the shore "probably for several years."

FBI agents Tuesday, digging three feet deep, found more fragments of bills but no more packets from the \$200,000 given to Cooper at Seattle on Thanksgiving Eve 1971 when he hijacked a Northwest Airlines 727.

Nor was there any trace of the

legendary extortionist who parachuted from the plane somewhere over southwest Washington, an area of rugged mountains and thick forests where a body could remain hidden forever. Many authorities say they think Cooper, whose real identity never has been learned, died in the leap from the plane.

Himmelsbach, the agent who has worked on the Cooper caper since the night it occurred, said he knew of no unidentified bodies, which could be Cooper, that washed up on the Columbia banks in the past eight years.

"We have kept a close liaison with medical authorities on both sides of the river," he said. "If there had been any such body we'd have known about it."

Himmelsbach said when Cooper jumped into the rainy night he had the 21-pound package of money strapped to him with nylon cords from one of three parachutes sup-

plied by the airline at his demand.

Himmelsbach outlined a "possible scenario" which would explain the money's presence on the beach.

"Probably the money (in the bag) came down close to the bank of a stream. When the water got high enough it washed downstream, bumping along the bottom. The bag finally degraded.

"Perhaps it could have burst on impact but that is not likely. We think finally, tumbling down the river bottom, it broke open and the money was carried on, wearing off little bits and pieces around the edges, grinding it down like it had been ground with sandpaper or a file, leaving the center portion."

The first money was found in three packages, all bound together, by Brian Ingram, 8, and his cousin, Denise Ingram, 5. Brian's parents, Harold and Pat Ingram of Vancouver, turned the money over to the FBI Monday.

Bills' clues may end D.B. Cooper enigma

PORTLAND, Ore. (UPI) — River engineers and geologists analyzing the mud around a wad of tattered bills may be able to pinpoint the spot where hijacker D.B. Cooper and at least part of the \$200,000 ransom he collected nine years ago parted company, the FBI says.

The first trace of the money Cooper took with him when he parachuted out of a hijacked Northwest Air-

lines jetliner on a rainy Thanksgiving Eve in 1971 was found Sunday by a picnicking family.

FBI agents Tuesday and yesterday found additional fragments of bills nearby, in dredged-up material on the north shore of the Columbia River.

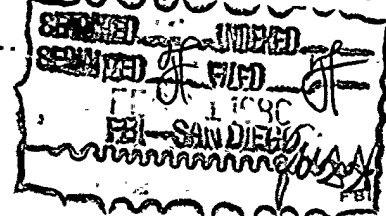
The river was last dredged in 1974, FBI agent Ralph Himmelsbach said. He said Army Corps of Engineers scientists and geologists will probably be able to determine whether the shore material surrounding the bills came from the middle of the Columbia River, washed downstream from the Washougal River or was carried upstream from the mouth of the Lewis River and dumped at the site.

"We have the Army Corps of Engineers and geologists out there," Himmelsbach said. "An agent who was out there said it looks like they'll be able to help us out."

The money found Sunday on the north shore of the Columbia River, about 5 miles northwest of Vancouver, Wash., was bound in packets with crumbling rubber bands. It totaled about \$3,000 and the serial numbers checked matched numbers on the bills given to Cooper at Seattle when he hijacked a Northwest Airlines 727.

The money's location indicates the hijacker landed in the drainage of the Washougal River, which enters the Columbia upstream from the site.

Before learning the shore material had been dredged from the river, Himmelsbach said the \$20 bills found by the children had been buried on the shore "probably for several years."

Search For Hijacking Money May Be Halted After Today

VANCOUVER, Wash. (AP) — The search along a Columbia River beach for more money from the D.B. Cooper hijacking eight years ago probably will be suspended after today, FBI officials said yesterday.

Meanwhile, the FBI said a geologist concluded that several thousand dollars found Sunday by an 8-year-old boy on a family picnic was deposited on the beach in the past year or two.

FBI agents continued to dig for more of the \$200,000 that Cooper took with him when he bailed out of a plane on Thanksgiving Eve in 1971.

The search began Tuesday along the river's north shore, about three miles southwest of downtown Vancouver. Additional scraps of money were found on Wednesday.

A man whose passenger list was signed "Dan Cooper" left a Northwest Airlines plane that was bound for Reno from Seattle after he displayed what appeared to be a bomb and obtained a package of \$20 bills and three parachutes.

FBI agents believed he left the plane, during a storm, about 20 miles northeast of where the crum-

bled and weathered bills were found.

It is the nation's only unsolved hijacking.

"We'll work today and tomorrow and probably knock it off and bring my troops back up here and reassess the situation," said Jack Pringle, assistant agent in charge of the Seattle office which took over the search operations.

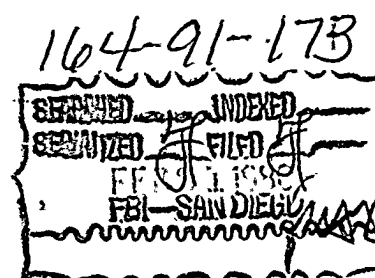
"Some of the area is inaccessible and there's no way we can search the whole river," Pringle said.

He said geologist Leonard Palmer of Portland State University concluded that the dredging operation in 1974 did not put the money onto the beach, because the bills were found above clay deposits put on the banks by the dredge.

Brian Ingram, when scooping out a place for a campfire, found the money, tied together by rubber bands in three clumps, under a thin layer of sand.

The bills were matched to the Cooper loot by serial numbers.

The FBI speculated the bills could have washed into the Columbia from a tributary and were studying flood records.

More Pieces of 'D. B. Cooper' Loot Found

Hunt Delayed by Uncertainty Over How Money Got to Site

From Times Wire Services

PORTLAND, Ore.—FBI agents Wednesday found more fragments of money from the \$200,000 airline hijacking loot of the legendary "D. B. Cooper," but the mystery of what happened to the man appeared no closer to solution.

To complicate matters, agents learned Wednesday that all the cash found so far on a sandy beach of the Columbia River may have come from material dredged from the center of the river in 1974.

"We don't know what that means," FBI agent Ralph Himmelsbach said. "We have the Army Corps of Engineers and geologists out there. An agent who was out there said it looks like they'll be able to help us out."

The first money from Cooper's haul in the 1971 hijacking was found Sunday on the north shore of the Columbia 5 miles northwest of Vancouver, Wash., by children on a family outing. It totaled about \$3,000 and the serial numbers matched those on the bills given to Cooper.

Himmelsbach said a number of additional fragments were dug up by agents Tuesday afternoon and Wednesday morning, some of them from as deep as 3 feet. One agent at the site described a formless fist-size clump as "a wadded-up bunch of \$20 bills."

Himmelsbach said the geologists and corps scientists probably would be able to determine whether the material on the shore in which the money was found had come from the middle of the river and had been washed downstream from the Washington River or carried upstream by dredges from the mouth of the Lewis River and dumped at the site.

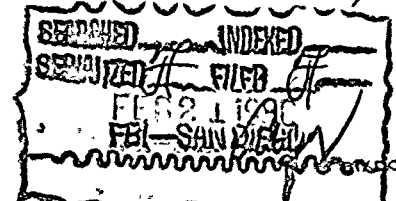
Until such a determination is made, agents planned no widespread search of wooded areas connected to the river by streams.

A man who signed in as Dan Cooper left Portland, Ore., on Thanksgiving eve in 1971 aboard a Northwest Airlines jet. Once the flight was in the air, the hijacker displayed what appeared to be a bomb and demanded \$200,000 and parachutes.

The passengers and two flight at-

tendants were let off in Seattle and the remainder of the crew was locked in the cockpit. Somewhere over southwest Washington, the man who has come to be known as "D.B. Cooper" disappeared out the back entrance with the money and a parachute.

The incident is the only unsolved hijacking in the nation.

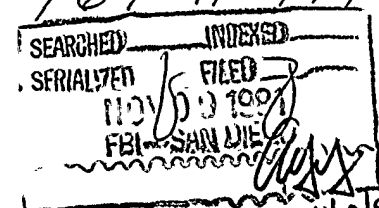

On November 24, 1971, a lone white male boarded Northwest Orient Flight #305 at Portland, Oregon. At approximately 3:22 PM while the flight was en route to Seattle, Washington, he indicated to the stewardess that his briefcase contained a bomb which would blow up the plane unless his demands were met.

The hijacker demanded \$200,000 and four parachutes in exchange for the safety of the 36 passengers aboard the plane. When the aircraft landed at Seattle, Washington, Northwest Orient Airlines complied with his instructions. After he received the parachutes and the money, the hijacker allowed all passengers and two airline stewardesses to deplane..

He then ordered the remaining crew members into the first-class section of the aircraft and informed them he desired to fly to Mexico City. The hijacker instructed that the plane proceed in a southerly direction and fly at a low altitude and slow speed which would enable the rear door of the plane (Boeing 727) to be opened during the flight.

The hijacker apparently bailed out somewhere between Seattle, Washington, and Reno, Nevada, where the plane landed to refuel. It was determined the hijacker, two parachutes, and the ransom money had disappeared when the plane was inspected at Reno, Nevada.

Artist conception drawings of the aircraft hijacker were prepared by the Federal Bureau of Investigation Exhibit Section and are considered a reasonable likeness. The black and white composites were prepared initially, and some time later the color composites were prepared to depict the hijacker's complexion and age more graphically.

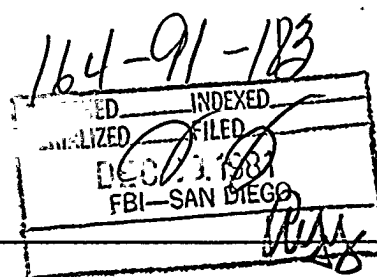

Comparison of the enclosed driver's license photograph does not disclose any marked resemblance to the artist's conception drawing of "D.B. Cooper".

On 1/25/82, [redacted] California, telephone number [redacted] was contacted relative to the information furnished in his letter to the Seattle Office referred to above. [redacted] stated that he was prompted to write the letter after viewing an "In Search Of" episode on television concerning "D.B. Cooper" in the captioned hijacking. In [redacted] estimation, the artist's conception drawing of "Cooper" reminded him of Clemens. He had no other reason than this believed resemblance to consider Clemens a suspect in the captioned matter, but believed that Clemens was a retired airline pilot, although he did not know for which airlines Clemens had flown. Clemens had never [redacted] of any paratrooper-type experience and was fairly tight-lipped regarding his personal life. [redacted] believed that this could be accounted for, possibly by the fact that Clemens was in apparently failing health due to a terminal disease resulting ultimately in his death.

If not for my inherent procrastination you might have gotten this letter a year or two earlier, and if not for the urgings of many of my friends you may not have received it at all. You may not be the best person to contact, but I lifted your name from the [redacted] Seattle P I Sunday Northwest magazine section. To shorten what otherwise could be a long story I will say that it is possible I may know the real name of the man called "Cooper."

My friends have urged me to contact the FBI and tell the same story I have told them. They labor under the delusion I'll get rich from all ^{the} rewards. But reward or not I will relate to you, or some other agent, what I know (and do not know) if you can do what you can to keep my name confidential.

I have no need at all for a homicide bent, revenge crazy crook on my trail sometime in the future!

I lost track of this man sometime in 1964, but from what little I know of the hijacking case everything fits. The composite sketch is not a likeness, but two of the features are certainly his.

I haven't said anything up to now for two reasons.

1. The nagging fear I could be causing an innocent person a lot of trouble, and
2. should I be right the guilty party would not look to kindly on me.

I say something now for a number of reasons. Unlike my friends who are positive I once knew the man who was to become D. B. Cooper, I am not sure. I guess I'd like to know too.

Please feel free to have an agent or yourself contact me. Maybe you will agree with my friends.

'DAN COOPER',— STILL AT LARGE, MAY HAVE WRITTEN A PAGE OF HISTORICAL FOLKLORE

It has now been three years since "Dan Cooper" parachuted from the Northwest Airlines jet he hijacked with \$200,000 in ransom money, and, for good or ill, wrote himself into the folklore of the Pacific northwest. In two more years the federal statute of limitations on the crime will run out and Dan Cooper will be home free — if he's still alive.

According to the U.S. Department of Transportation, Cooper is the only person to ever hijack a domestic airliner who has not been killed or brought to justice. "We know nothing more about him today than we did at 11 p.m., Wednesday, Nov. 24, 1971," said Julius Mattson, special agent in charge of the Portland, Ore. FBI office. "I just wish we had something to go on. We don't have a thing. Just a big zero."

These are the events of that Thanksgiving Eve hijacking as authorities have reconstructed them:

A man who gave his name as Dan Cooper bought a one-way ticket at Portland International Airport to Seattle aboard Northwest Airlines flight 305 which originated in Washington, D.C. No antihijacking measures were in operation as the 36 passengers boarded the Boeing 727 for the 25-minute flight.

In the air, Cooper handed stewardess Tina Mucklow a note saying he had a bomb. Following Cooper's orders, Miss Mucklow sat beside him and wrote down instructions to the pilot. Cooper wanted 10,000 \$20 bills to be delivered to him at Seattle in a laundry sack, along with two sets of parachutes. Otherwise, he said he would blow up the plane.

Airline officials and FBI agents complied and Cooper allowed the passengers and two of the three stewardesses to disembark at Seattle. Then he ordered the plane to fly south to Reno, Nev., at 200 miles per hour, at 10,000 feet, flaps down. The crew was to stay in the cockpit.

After takeoff from Seattle, a red light flashed in the cockpit indicating the plane's rear boarding ramp had been unlatched. Nothing was heard from Cooper for about 20 minutes. At 8:10 p.m. as the plane crossed the Lewis River in Southwestern Washington, Capt. William Scott thought the

hijacker was having trouble with the ramp and called back over the plane's interphone:

"Anything we can do for you?"

There was no answer.

Then another light flashed to show the ramp was fully extended. A few seconds later Cooper came back on the interphone:

"No."

That was the last anyone ever heard of him. When the plane landed in Reno, the rear ramp was down and Cooper was gone. The 21-pound sack of money was gone. One set of parachutes was gone. The hijacker, who had carefully reclaimed his note to the stewardess, had left no fingerprints.

But FBI has doubts Skydiving Cooper looks like Portland skyjacker

WASHINGTON — The FBI is discounting the possibility that a Northern Virginia man named Jerry A. Cooper may be the Dan Cooper who parachuted from a 727 jet over southwestern Washington four years ago and disappeared with a \$200,000 ransom.

The Virginia man, an experienced skydiver who bears a striking physical resemblance to the police artist's conception of the hijacker, voluntarily approached the FBI Monday for questioning after he learned of the investigation.

Later, he told The Oregonian he had never been in the Pacific Northwest, and urged the real hijacker to "come out of hiding and get me out of this."

Michael A. Morrow, the assistant special FBI agent in charge of the Alexandria, Va., office, said, "We feel very certain that he is not D.B. Cooper, but until we're 100 per cent sure we'll keep checking."

(The hijacker signed a flight manifest "Dan Cooper" but the FBI at first released the name "D.B. Cooper," which has survived in press accounts.)

Morrow said the FBI is investigating Jerry Cooper's whereabouts at the time of the 1971 Thanksgiving eve incident, and added the issue is "almost resolved."

The FBI began its investigation after an anonymous caller told Fairfax County, Va. police he had seen \$15,000 cash in Jerry Cooper's apartment and suspected him of being the elusive hijacker.

The caller directed police to Cooper's sister-in-law, Carol Wood. After she was questioned by an FBI agent she told her brother-in-law who "voluntarily came into our office and was most cooperative," Morrow said.

Cooper said, "If I had \$15,000, I'd be out fishing somewhere."

"I'd seen the picture (of the hijacker) before, but I never really noticed it," Jerry Cooper said Tuesday. "You come right down to it, the guy is almost the same as me. The same weight, same height, same complexion."

The skyjacker was described by witnesses as about 6 feet tall, 180 pounds, with dark hair and complexion.

"You put glasses on that man and look at me four years ago and you're pretty close," Cooper said. "My hair was shorter, then. The ears are the same. It's scary."

To make matters worse for Cooper — a 30-year-old heavy equipment operator — he had been a sport skydiver for about eight years until he gave it up five years ago.

Moreover, in 1967 he worked as a fueler at Washington National Airport, where the hijacked Northwest Orient flight originated four years ago, and is familiar with commercial aircraft.

The man who used the name Dan Cooper commandeered the jet after boarding it during a Portland stop. He collected a bag full of \$20 bills from the airline, released 36 passengers and two stewardesses, and ordered the pilot to fly at 200 miles per hour, 10,000 feet over Oregon and Western Washington.

When the plane landed for fuel in Reno, Nev., the man was gone.

Jerry Cooper said he believes the hijacker is still alive.

"There's no reason a man can't make it jumping out of a 727 jet that's going 200 miles per hour at 10,000 feet. It was probably a little cold that time of the year, but I imagine he was dressed for it."

Cooper said he couldn't recall exactly where he was at the time of the hijacking, but suspects he was hunting with friends or family in Augusta County, Va., as he usually does near Thanksgiving.

"Can you remember where you were on Nov. 24 four years ago?" he asked.

Cooper's sister-in-law said she was almost certain he had joined the family for Thanksgiving dinner at her house the day after Dan Cooper leapt from a plane on the other side of the country.

FBI says man clear

WASHINGTON — The FBI said Tuesday it has ended its investigation of a Virginia man who has a lot in common with the elusive "Dan Cooper," who parachuted from a hijacked jet four years ago with a bag full of ransom money.

Robert G. Kunkel, FBI agent in charge of the case, said the agency is convinced Jerry Cooper, an ex-skydiver with a knowledge of commercial aircraft, was hunting with friends in Virginia while his namesake was extorting \$200,000 in the Pacific Northwest.

The FBI began its investigation after an anonymous tip, and found that Jerry Cooper, a 30-year-old heavy equipment operator, bears a striking resemblance to an artist's sketch of the hijacker.

But Kunkel said friends confirmed the man's hunting alibi.

"We've concluded that he was not involved," Kunkel said.

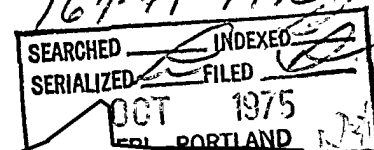

These Agents remained on the site the night of 10/8/75 and resumed search at sunrise 10/9/75. They were joined by nine U. S. Marine Corps personnel equipped with Marine Corps metal detectors and entire area depicted on map was searched three separate times. Numerous metal items, such as nails, horse shoes, beer cans, etc., were located below the ground surface and dug up, however, again no ammunition cans or loot was located. Additional photographs of area were taken and are being processed. From explicit directions originally [redacted] it is obvious that this is the area he was describing. It is also apparent that he is completely familiar with the area. The only discrepancy in [redacted] is that there are seven concrete slabs located in the parking lot instead of five as [redacted] originally stated.

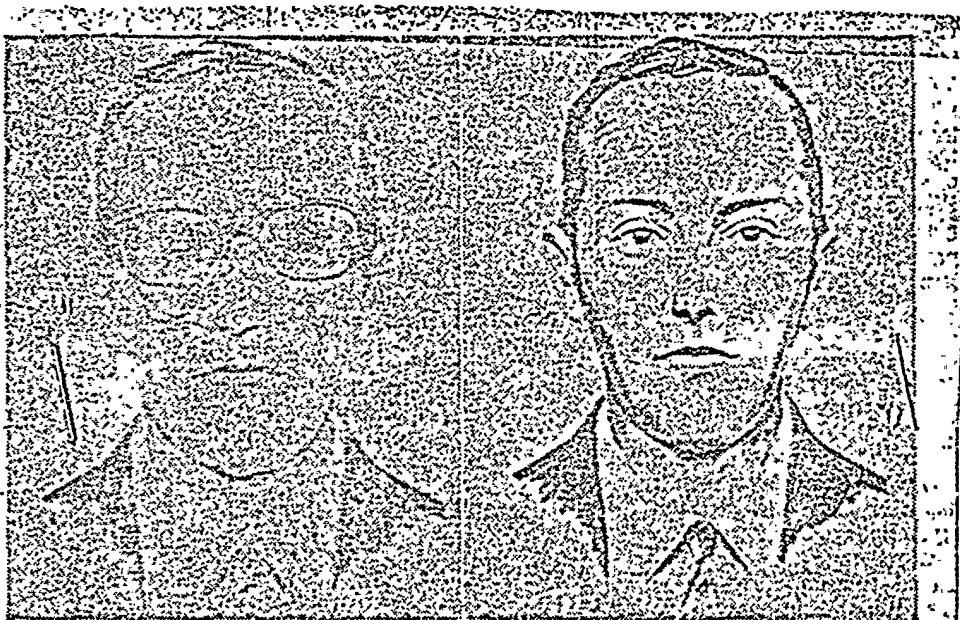

Portland, Ore. — AP —

Two years after parachuting from a Northwest Airlines jet with \$200,000 in ransom money, the plane hijacker known as Dan Cooper remains a folk hero and a mystery.

He is, according to the U.S. Department of Transportation, the only person ever to hijack a domestic airliner who has not been killed or brought to justice. He may be dead, but...

"We really know nothing more about him today than we did at 11 p.m. Wednesday, Nov. 24, 1971," says Julius Mattson, special agent in charge of the Portland FBI office.

Authorities said this is what happened on that Thanksgiving Eve:

A man who gave his name as Dan Cooper bought a one way ticket at Portland International Airport to Seattle aboard Northwest Airlines Flight 305 which originated in Washington, D. C.

No antihijacking measures were in operation as the 36 passengers boarded the Boeing 727 for the 25 minute flight.

Handed a note

Once in the air, Cooper handed stewardess Tina Mucklow a note saying he had a bomb. Following Cooper's orders, Miss Mucklow sat beside the skyjacker and wrote down instructions to the pilot.

He wanted 10,000 twenty dollar bills to be delivered to him at Seattle in a laundry sack, along with two sets of parachutes. Otherwise he

threatened to blow up the plane.

Airline officials and FBI agents complied with his requests and Cooper allowed the passengers and two of the three stewardesses to disembark at Seattle.

Then he ordered the plane to fly south to Reno, Nev., at 200 miles per hour, at 10,000 feet, flaps down. The crew was to stay in the cockpit.

After takeoff from Seattle, a red light flashed in the cockpit indicating the plane's rear boarding ramp had been unlatched.

Nothing was heard from Cooper for about 20 minutes. At 8:10 p.m., as the plane crossed the Lewis River in southwestern Washington,

Capt. William Scott thought the hijacker was having trouble with the ramp and called back over the plane's interphone:

"Anything we can do for you?"

There was no answer.

Light flashes again

Another light flashed showing the ramp was fully extended. A few seconds later the hijacker came back on the interphone: "No."

That was the last ever heard of him.

When the plane landed in Reno, the rear ramp was down and Cooper was gone. The 21 pound sack of money was gone. One set of parachutes was gone. The skyjacker, who had carefully reclaimed his note to the stewardess, had left no fingerprints.

Authorities believed Cooper jumped from the plane near Woodland, Wash. The town was transformed into a bustling command post for a small army of newsmen and dozens of FBI agents, police and soldiers from Ft. Lewis, Wash.

With planes, helicopters, jeeps and track dogs, they combed the vast, densely wooded region northeast of Woodland. Much of it was rugged terrain, thick with freshly fallen snow, and virtually impassable.

The hijacker left the plane

clad only in a light business suit and street shoes. He parachuted into the blackness of a raging thunderstorm, into a 200 m.p.h. hour wind and temperature of minus 7 degrees.

He could not have survived, police reasoned. They said they were simply looking for a body and a bag of money and that could wait

until the spring thaw. A week later the army of searchers was disbanded.

In the ensuing months, Cooper became a legend in the Northwest — pictured as a lone Robin Hood who stole from a giant corporation, hurt no one and got away. A song extolling his feat became a hit. "D. B. Cooper, Where Are You?" T-shirts sold by the thousands.

The media had erroneously identified the skyjacker as D. B. rather than Dan Cooper.

Then, late in March 1972, 300 soldiers from Ft. Lewis searched the thawing terrain for 18 days. They found not a trace of Cooper. "Although we did find a body and cleared up a local murder," says FBI agent Mattson.

"We investigated every report and so far have proved that the various men reported to be Cooper could not have been the man on Flight 305," Mattson says.

No evidence

"We have no physical evidence to go on except the \$20 bills," he said, adding the numbers of all 10,000 bills were circulated to banks in a 34-page booklet. None has turned up.

Northwest Airlines, which offered a \$25,000 reward

for recovery of the ransom, has canceled the offer.

But last week, on the second anniversary of the hijacking, the Oregon Journal newspaper offered \$1,000 to anyone who could produce one of the \$20 bills. There have been no takers.

Mattson says a number of FBI agents have worked on the case, to no avail.

Is he convinced Cooper is dead?

"No. The terrain is just too rugged... to be thoroughly searched. And there is still the possibility he may have landed in Lake Merwin, which is 30 miles long, a mile wide and too deep to drag or be searched by divers."

"We are keeping an open mind for lack of evidence either way — that he is dead or alive. We are still working as hard on the case now as we were two years ago."

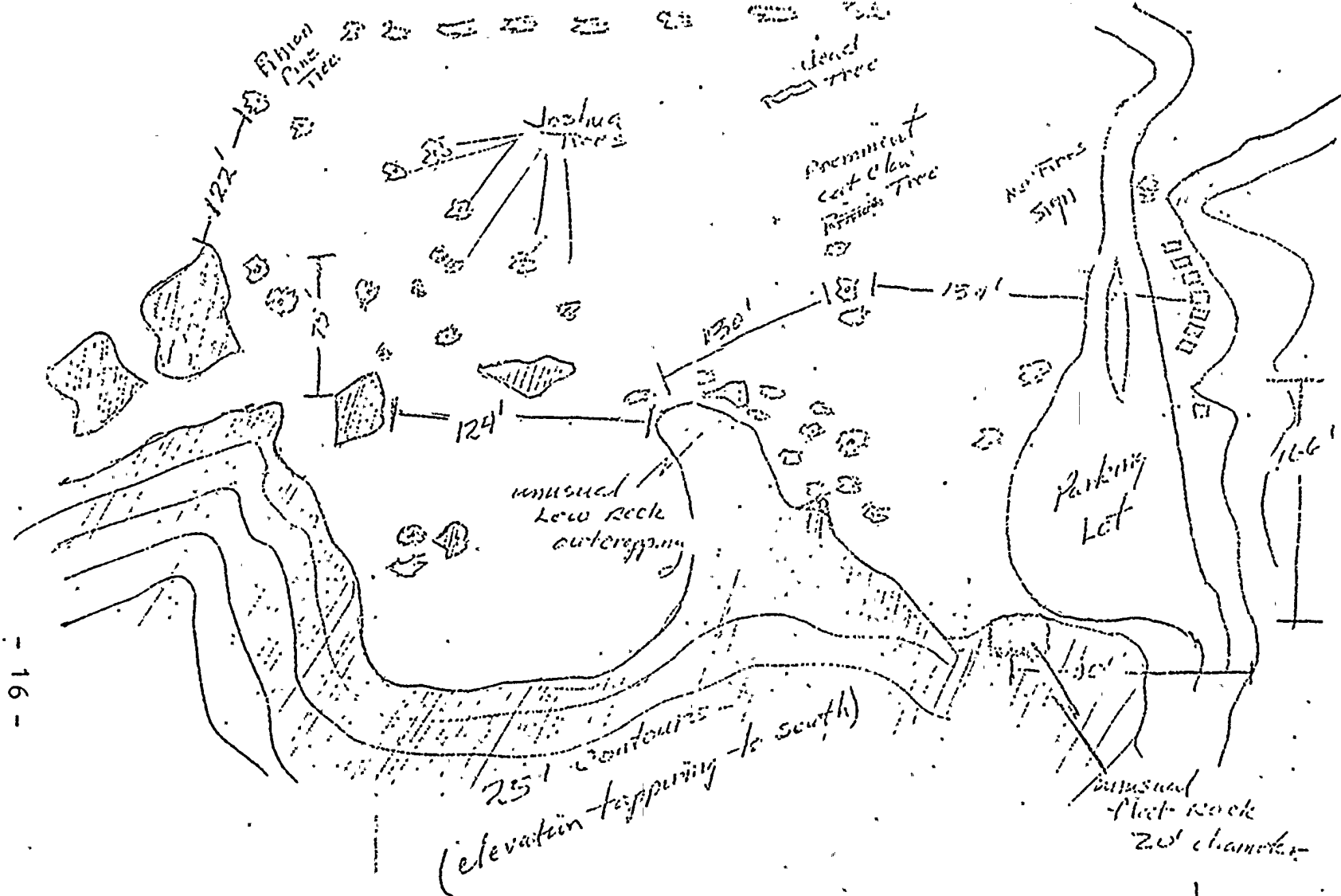

D. B. Cooper: Another Year --And He's a 'Bye-jacker

PORTLAND, Ore. (UPI) — Just one more year and D.B. Cooper will be home free.

Thanksgiving begins the 365 day countdown for Cooper—the nation's first and only successful parachuting skyjacker—who used highway flares as a bomb threat to extort \$200,000 from Northwest Airlines.

The statute of limitations on the hijacking charge against Cooper is five years. The phantom figure vanished after parachuting from a Northwest Airlines 727 with his loot on Thanksgiving eve, 1971.

Whether he survived the jump or his body is down at the bottom of a deep lake, hung in a tree or his remains scattered by ani-

mals are some of the intriguing questions left unanswered by the extensive investigation thus far.

"It's a very much active investigation," said a senior FBI agent who has spent many hours on the case. "We have run down literally thousands of leads, and eliminated hundreds of people as suspects."

"My personal guess is that there is just a 50 per cent chance that he is still alive."

The sheer lack of distinguishing characteristics about Cooper and his ability to move unobtrusively before the hijacking has balked the FBI's intense efforts to determine how he arrived at Portland In-

ternational Airport that wet, squally night.

He paid cash for his flight from Portland to Seattle, then spent 50 minutes in an airport waiting area before boarding without one fellow passenger remembering him.

Shortly after takeoff, Cooper handed a note to a stewardess that said, "I have a bomb in my brief case."

The FBI agent said the stewardess described what she thought was the bomb as wires attached in Cooper's attache case to eight sticks of dynamite, the same red color as her uniform.

"Dynamite is not color coded this way. She was describing highway flares," the agent said.

The agent said there was doubt Cooper was an experienced parachutist since when he jumped he took the two worst possible choices of the four parachutes given him at the Seattle-Tacoma Airport where he obtained the \$200,000 in \$20 bills.

He said the chest chute he took was one that was sewn together for use in a parachute-assembling class and could not even be used for jumping, and the back chute was much smaller than the large chute he cut up to wrap the money in and tie it to him.

A world champion parachutists was quoted by the agent as saying "no amount of money" could induce him to make the jump Cooper did.

Jumping from 10,000 feet into heavy rain clouds, there was no way Cooper could have known where he was coming down, according to the FBI man.

But the FBI is positive that Cooper came down about 12 miles north of Portland in an area four miles by six miles.

Despite aerial and ground searches, including one the next spring using soldiers from Ft. Lewis, Wash., no clues to Cooper's disappearance have ever been found.

None of the 10,000 bills in ransom have shown up either, even though the Oregon Journal offered a \$1,000 reward for the first \$20 from the Cooper haul turned in to the Portland newspaper.

DELTA, B.C. — (AP) — About 1,000 ducks have been killed by pesticide spread on a farm in this municipality south of Vancouver, the Canadian Wildlife Service said.

Surveys biologist Gary

Kaiser said Friday that the birds, all greenwinged teals, died after eating crystals of carbo-furan which had been spread on the fields to kill root maggots.

"They died practically

right where they were standing — it's very potent stuff," said Kaiser.

Farmers in the area were warned not to spread the pesticide in areas used by waterfowl, Kaiser said.

Marion Smith, acting Highway Department district engineer, estimated

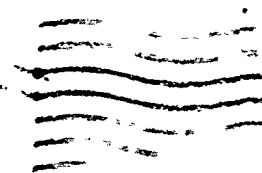

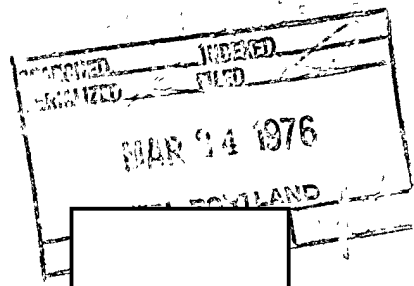

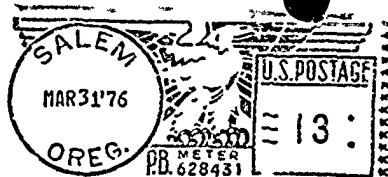
