

CPO On or about currently assigned to Houston, advised the writer that the clerk of the cleaning establishment on Fort Belvoir had told' him that she believed one of the students from an earlier class could possibly have been involved in a successful hijacking. She mentioned to on apperous occasions during the time he was in class that she would like to look at pictures or a class roster to determine the name of the individual whom she said had laid out a hijacking plan to her during his period of attendance at TASOS.

I advised CPO that I would look into the matter and determine if it had sufficient merit for investigation. The matter was not investigated at that time.

Subsequently, the issue of the Philadelphia Enquirer was published and described in detail the specific hijacking of November 24, 1971 and included a composite picture of the perpetrator. The clerk then advised staff member that she was sure the individual she had talked to was the same party as the composite drawing depicted. She further advised CSO that the name of the suspected individual was and the name of the skyjacker was D.B. Cooper as reported in the Enquirer. Unofficial inquiries revealed that a | had graduated from TASOS| and is currently still in the service.

Pursuant to instructions contained in referenced airtel, an extensive file review of captioned case was conducted by the writers from May 22 - 26, 1972. Among files reviewed were main volumes, numbers 1-47, subfiles designated for a particular area of interest, i.e. parachutes, witnesses, course; I-A volumes and numerous suspect subfiles. In addition, physical evidence as available was reviewed for pertinent investigative leads.

Information set forth following the file review has been arranged according to the headings used in the table of contents fund in the report of SA CHARLES E. FARRELL, dated February 16, 1972, with the exception of a brief hijacker profile.

PHYSICAL EVIDENCE

Black Snap-On Tie and Tie Tack

An examination of the tie by the writers revealed noticeable amounts of dust lodged in the inner knot area. In addition to the markings "3 Penneys", two other labels were found as follows: "Snapper Pat. 2972750. It's a snap to snap on"; and "100% Dacron Polyester Washable RN 16484". From writers' experience in Theft From Interstate Shipment cases involving Penneys merchandise, it is known that the RN number is a manufacturer's code. Penneys headquarters will be able to determine where the tie was manufactured, when imported and which stores sold this tie.

Magazine and Notebook Paper

Northwest Airlims, in a search conducted November 25, 1972, of victim airplane, found parts of a magazine and a piece of notebook paper with printing thereon made by a felt marking pm. The Bureau has examined these papers and has found 24 latent fingerprints and 5 latent palm prints of value. It is recommended that since both witnesses and and the

and observed the unsub write with a felt pen, the notebook paper and magazine parts printing be shown to these witnesses. This should be done to determine if the printing is similar to unsub's and if the felt pen color and characteristics are similar to unsub's.

ARTIST'S SKETCH

A review of the testimony of the principal witnesses, including the 3 stewardesses, the 2 Northwest Airline employees (NWA) at Portland, Oregon, and the 5 passengers reflects a general disagreement concerning the accuracy of the artist's sketch. Numerous changes were suggested by these witnesses and some were implimented in making up the final artist's sketch. It is noted that a Bureau artist personally interviewed the three stewardesses at Minneapolis, Minnesota and thereafter prepared a revised sketch of the hijacker showing him with the dark glasses, which he wore on the airplane, and another sketch, but without the glasses. One key witness, stewardess, was very adament in her insistence that the artist's conception was not a very good likeness of the hijacker.

SE 164-81 It is recommended that a Bureau artist be flown to pertinent divisions, including Minneapolis, Seattle and Portland, and spend sufficient time with the key witnesses until an artist's sketch which is agreeable to the majority of the witnesses can be obtained. It is recommended that the Color Selection Guide be used to provide details and depth not ordinarily shown in black and white sketches. It is recommended that the Bureau artist sketch hijacker showing the full face, full face with dark glasses, side profile, and a sketch showing the hijacker in a standing position. All the sketches should be in color. In addition to the facial identification guide, color selection guide, the following items should accompany the Bureau artist and assist him in preparing the sketch: 1. The FBI Lab should provide a color profile from the single hair sample submitted previously by the Las Vegas Division, following its discovery on a head towel presumably used by the unsub. 2. The following photographs of "strong suspects" which witnesses have commented about as having the correct eyes, ears, etc., should be included: b6 b7C Prior to sending the Bureau artist to the various divisions, it is recommended that a letter of appreciation from the Bureau be sent to all pertinent witnesses, expressing Bureau appreciation for their time and effort and indicating desires regarding artist's sketch. Following the obtaining of an acceptable color artist's sketch, widespread use of these should be made in the following ways: 1. Consideration should be given for another general mailing of new sketches to all law enforcement agencies, banks, etc, that received the old sketches in previous mailings. - 3 -DB Cooper-8572

Television and newspaper sources should be recontacted and brought up to date with the new sketches. These sketches, additional news releases, copies of ransom lists as prepared by the Crime Records Division, should be provided to all television and newspaper sources. Space for a color insert in at least one of the major newspapers having daily circulation in Seattle, Portland, Las Vegas, San Francisco and Los Angeles should be purchased. This insert should contain material prepared by the Crime Records Division and include all four new artist's sketches, pertinent background information and other interesting newsworthy developments, in order to promote widespread public interest resulting in new suspects and possible recovery of some of the ransom money. It is noted that expenses for a newspaper format for ransom lists and accompanying background information were estimated at actual costs of \$1,600 for the Seattle Times, Seattle, Washington. Color would, undoubtedly, cost more. Bureau Exhibits Section may be able to cut costs considerably by preparing all material uniformly prior to submission to major newspapers.

As a source of continuing value, it is recommended that display or window space be rented for a period of not less than six months at major airports in Seattle, Portland, Los Angeles, San Francisco and Las Vegas, and that the Exhibits Section prepare hijacking displays, including artist's sketches, photograph models, ransom lists, notices of rewards, etc. It is hoped that this would promote a sense of awareness and develop additional suspects. In view of the fact that this display may be done in such a way as to promote airline security and prevent, or discourage future hijackings, major airlines may wish to share a portion of the expenses. It is noted that traffic at the above major airports would have a heightened awareness of hijackings and would be cognizant of the hijacking problem.

EXPERIMENT WITH AIR STAIRS

MATCHBOOK COVER

Regarding the blue matchbook cover marked "Sky Chef" observed by Stewardess as used by the hijacker, it should be noted that Sky Chef is a chain of restaurants serving airports. It is recommended that Portland determine if there is a Sky Chef Restaurant at the Portland Airport (noting that the Sky Chef Restaurants usually have different names) and Portland should determine if this restaurant gives away blue colored matchbooks with Sky Chef written on them. Unsub may have eaten lunch at the Portland Airport Restaurant prior to boarding Northwest Airlines flight 305 and if so, latent fingerprints may be on a meal ticket (bill) for that day. Portland should determine if these tickets are available for November 24, 1971, and determine feasibility of obtaining latents.

OLIVE OR LATIN COMPLEXION

Key witnesses generally agree that unsub had an "olive or Latin" complexion. One witness indicated a Mexican-American or possibly Indian complexion and characteristics. In addition, unsub expressed a desire to go "anywhere in Mexico".

It is recommended that all divisions having a concentration of Mexican-American extremists, including Chicanos, Brown Berets, review extremists albums. It is further suggested that revised colored sketches, when obtained, be shown to all pertinent Mexican-American sources.

INTERVIEWS WITH KEY WITNESSES

In view of her willingness to cooperate and ability to recall explicit details, it is recommended that be reinterviewed. ______ could be reinterviewed in connection with the Bureau artists' interview, at which time the following questions should be asked:

l. How did the hijacker secure the money? Did he appear to be going to jump while holding the money package by a handle or did he fix a knapsack arrangement:

2. What was the position of the hijacker when last saw him as she left the rear of the airplane for the last time? What did the hijacker have around his waist? Was the hijacker attempting to secure himself to the plane by using parachute cords in an attempt to prevent being pulled out of the airplane when opening the rear door? Did the hijacker express a fear to the stewardess that he would be pulled out of the door prematurely?

Experienced parachutists have advised that attempts to hold the money without adequately securing it would probably not be sufficient. Attempts by unsub to secure himself to the plane prior to openine ght rear door of the aircraft would indicate a fear of being sucked out of the aircraft as the stewardess feared. This would indicate a lack of knowledge about the Boeing 727 and aircraft in general.

3. What was the level of education of the hijacker as measured in terms of speech, grammar, and mannerisms?

COOPER, and It is recommended that San Francisco at Monterey review records of the U.S. Parachute Association for names similar, i.e. DAN COOPER and combinations such as DANIEL COOPER, DAN (middle initial whatever) COOPER, COOPER DANIELS, etc.

Sources to be contacted would be such as construction firms, public utilities using dynamite, hardware stores and police departments and sheriff's offices concerning reports of theft of dynamite. HIJACKER PROFILE Hijacker's clothesamay have been unfashionable, since he was wearing a black thin (out of style) snap-on tie and tie clasp. Hijacker's briefcase was described as "cheap" style. Hijacker's language usage indicates at least a moderate level of education (high school or higher). Hijacker drinks bourbon and 7-Up, and smokes Raleigh cigarettes. Hijacker did not appear to be an experienced professional criminal (reportedly his behavior became childish following receipt of money.) The hijacker was familiar with the Seattle area because of several comments he made, such as "we are over Tacoma now" and "McChord" Air Force Base is only 20 minutes from SeaTac Airport." Hijacker did not provide instructions to control air speed, nor to control the direction by degree of aircraft and, therefore, would inot have been able to control his drop zone. This would eliminate theories involving a pickup by an accomplice. Hijacker began immediately attempting to prepare for jump shortly after lift off at SaTac Airport. Because the money was not in a knapsack and ready for jumping and because of problems encountered in opening rear door, hijacker may have been delayed in making jump. It is possible that the hijacker wished to jump much nearer Seattle or Tacoma. - 7 -DB Cooper-8576 SE 164-81

Hijacker was probably not a sporting parachutist as he relied completely on airline personnel to furnish any type of parachute equipment available. As a result, he was furnished a chute that would open quickly with a good possibility of tearing, a high rate of descent and non-steerable. One chute he jumped with was a dummy chute and would not open. A parachutist with considerable experience would have been more specific in the type chutes requested.

Above suggestions have been set forth in hopes that investigative efforts of this important major case might be implemented and case brought to an early logical conclusion.



Post" called "Secret Witness Line" is sometimes utilized for information.

According to ______ the secret witness line at the "Denver Post" received a telephone call at 9:05 p.m., 4/11/72. The caller stated he received "a call Tuesday night from D.B. COOPER, the plane hijacker." He claimed this individual's real name is ______ who lives in the southeastern United States, possibly Arkansas or Alabama, and claimed he served with "D.B." in the Airborne Division in the service.

This case has been reviewed at the Bureau and the following observations are being made in an effort to assist your office in your investigative endeavors.

The unsub, as Dan Cooper, at 2 p.m., PST, 11/24/71, purchased a one-way coach ticket at the Portland National Airport, Portland, Oregon, for travel from Portland to Seattle, Washington, on Northwest Orient Airlines Flight number 305, which was a Boeing 727 aircraft. Unsub paid for this flight with a twenty dollar bill and had no luggage. He occupied seat number 18E on the aircraft and prior to the time the aircraft taxied on the runway, he purchased a bourbon and 7-un with a twenty dollar bill from Stewardess The aircraft left Portland at 2:53 p.m., PST, however, after it taxied toward the runway for takeoff, unsub turned and handed Stewardess an envelope containing a note written in black felt-tip pen and which was on plain white unlined paper and written in neat, legible handwriting. This note informed Stewardess he had a bomb and instructed her to sit next to him.

Unsub then dictated to her his demands at the conclusion of which he remarked. "No fuss." Stewardess |showed Stewardess| the demand notes and then went to the cockpit where she displayed them to the captain of the aircraft. The unsub retrieved these notes prior to the time the aircraft landed at Seattle, Washington. She thereafter remained in the cockpit where she prepared thirteen pages of notes concerning the hijacking and in which she described unsub as in his fifties. She later said he appeared to be of Latin descent. It will be noted that one

of the aircraft passengers, believed unsub was a Mexican-American. She had a short encounter with the unsub prior to her deplaning at Seattle, at which time she said unsub did not appear to know exactly where he wanted to go after he left Seattle, but spoke of Mexico City, Phoenix, and San Francisco. Stewardess then acted as a communications media between the unsub and the captain of the aircraft until about five minutes after the aircraft departed the Seattle-Tacoma National Airport (Sea-Tac) when she was instructed to go to the cockpit by the unsub.

The aircraft landed at Sea-Tac at 5:46 p.m., PST, at which time \$200,000 in twenty dollar bills, weighing 19 pounds, two back chutes, and two chest chutes were made available to him. The passengers then were allowed to deplane as were Stewardess and another stewardess. This is normally a thirty-six minute flight.

Shortly prior to the aircraft taking off from Sea-Tac at 7:36 p.m., PST, the unsub informed Stewardess that they were going to Mexico City or someplace in Mexico and that the aircraft could stop anywhere in Mexico to refuel, but nowhere in the United States. When unsub was informed that the fuel would not permit the aircraft going to Mexico, unsub compromised and said he would prefer a refueling landing in Reno, Nevada. The last communication had with the unsub was by interphone at 8:05 p.m., PST, and it was felt that the unsub deplaned from the aircraft at 8:12 p.m. The aircraft landed at Reno, Nevada, at 11:05 p.m., PST. An extensive ground search of the area where it was believed the unsub exited the aircraft has proved negative.

When the aircraft landed at Reno, Nevada, a chest pack chute and a back-type chute were found on the plane. The missing chest back chute is a training pack "dummied up" to look like a good one. The missing back pack chute, sometimes referred to as an emergency chute, is non-steerable and anyone utilizing this type chute would have no chance of slowing down or picking his spot on which to land.

Also located in seat 18E of the aircraft at Reno, Nevada, was a black clip-onitie which contained a tie clasp described as yellow gold in color with a white pearl circular stone in the center. The label in the tie bore the

name "Towncraft" and bore store #3 Penneys. The label in this tie showed it to be a "Snapper" patent type tie. gation at Las Vegas indicated that this type sold for about a dollar and a half, that it was about a year to a year and a half old, and it was a favorite item for individuals such as waiters, busboys, and bartenders. Stewardess said that this tie was probably the unsub's and other witnesses have indicated that he wore a similar type tie.

Located in the ashtray utilized by the unsub were eight cigarett butts, seven of which have been identified by the FBI Laboratory as Raleigh filter tip cigarettes, and the eighth cigarette is probably the same. These cigarettes are sold in a "soft pack."

During the period Stewardess was with the unsub and in her conversations withhim she related what appeared to be keen observations concerning him, and which are as follows:

- 1) He impressed her as being an executive because of his dress, special mannerisms, and consideration that he exhibited for her while on the aircraft.
- In one of the conversations she had with him, she remarked that the parachutes were coming from McChord Air Force Base at which time he remarked that it was only about twenty minutes from McChord to the Seattle-Tacoma airport and which was apparently an accurate estimate.
- 3) While the aircraft was in a holding pattern and prior to its landing at Sea-Tac. the unsub looked out of the window and remarked, "We are over Tacoma now," although no mention of this had been madeogyer the interphone of the aircraft.
- 4) He displayed an extensive and technical knowledge of this aircraft and seemed particularly well informed as tothe refueling procedures and flying in general. He apparently was aware of where the oxygen bottles were and Stewardess felt this information was normally known only by the crew personnel. The only function of the aircraft that he did not appear to be fully aware of was the procedures involved in the opening of the rear door and the extending of the stairway. He likewise appeared to be completely familiar with the parachutes that had been furnished to him.

You should place strong emphasis on the fact that the unsub could be possibly a former employee of one of the West Coast aircraft or related industries, particularly Boeing aircraft. These industries have been hard pressed economically, causing a number of lay-offs among professional personnel as well as nonprofessional personnel and from a review of the material available at the Bureau, it is entirely conceivable that the unsub falls in this category. In view of this, the following avenues of investigation should be investigated by both the Seattle and Portland Offices:

- 1) Contact professional placement agencies, counselors. as well as 1 employment contractors hiring temporary professional employees.
- 2) Contact unemployment agencies.
- 3) Identify and contact professional societies or organizations associated with the aircraft industry, being alert for anyone that possibly terminated membership or activity after 11/24/71.
- 4) The age bracket of the unknown subject could probably make him a Veteran of World WarIII, or the Korean conflict and in this regard, you should contact Veteran groups and the American Legion.

On or about 11/11/71, or 12/71, he observed a vehicle parked on behind the RADIO ENGINEERING AND SERVICE COMPANY. This vehicle was a Dodge Van, which pulled in sometime before 5:00 p.m., on 11/11 or 12/71. He was curious as he wondered if these people who had the van were in trouble. He knocked on the door of the van and a man and his wife, who were in the van, said their vehicle had broken down, but they were on their way to the Wise River, Montana, area to do some hunting.

During the investigation of the story appearing in the "Seattle Flag" the microfilm of the ransom money was sent to the FBI Lab via pilot courier on Northwest Airlines flight 78 leaving Seattle at 9:15 a.m. on May 4, 1972 and was to be picked up on arrival at Dulles Airport at 5 p.m. by the Alexandria Office (See 164-81-3181 - daily summary).

The original communication to Alexandria is Seattle teletype dated May 4, 1972, serial 164-81-3076.

In view of the fact that the case against will be going to trial, the Bureau is not being requested at this time to return the film inasumch as certain exhibits might be requested of the Laboratory concerning the \$20. bills in the case.


