Unsub may have made a trial run prior to NORJAK to perfect his skyjack plan, therefore, leads were set out on 7/23/73 to determine the feasibility of obtaining passenger lists for all Northwest Orient Airline flights from Portland to Seattle during the period 11/10/71 to 11/23/71. If passenger lists of flights from Portland to Seattle for above described period can be obtained, then names on this list would be compared to NORJAK indices and other lists currently on file at Seattle, in order to possibly identify Unsub.

Prior to the 1973 hunting season which began in October in the Pacific Northwest, information was disseminated concerning this matter to all Washington State Game Wardens responsible for the area to which Unsub parachuted. The Game Wardens are currently making this information available to all hunters they encounter in this area. As of 11/23/73, no positive results have been obtained. The information being made available to the hunters is as follows:

On the premise that Unsub parachuted successfully into the previously calculated area of Southwest Washington, it is speculated he would have buried the ransom money and his parachute and then hiked to the nearest road or highway. From there, he would most probably have walked to the nearest phone to call a friend or relative for the purpose of being picked up.

Since all the homes in the drop area were checked and no strangers were reported in the area on 11/24-25/71, all the pay phones surrounding the calculated drop area within reasonable walking distance (ie 15 miles) were checked for long distance phone calls; (long distance is the only type of call which records can be obtained). A list was compiled of the numbers called from the pay phones on 11/24/71 and 11/25/71.

The records are not time correlated, however, based on the fact that the weather was cold and rainy during this period and the skyjacker jumped at approximately 8:11 PM on 11/24/71, more significance can be placed on calls made during the end of the day on 11/24/71 or during the beginning of the day on 11/25/71.

The names of all subscribers called during the above-mentioned time period were checked against NORJAK indices with negative results.

The Seattle file review currently in progress at Seattle continues. The purpose of this review is to determine if any new information of lead value can be developed. This review consists of an intensive serial by serial, subject by subject analyzation.

This file review, which commenced 8/3/72, has accomplished the following:

- 1. An intensive investigation has been conducted of the Boeing personnel involved in the 727 air stairs test with negative results.
- 2. A new color sketch has been made and disseminated. The purpose of the change to color was to shown Unsub's age and complexion more accurately.
- 3. Information concerning this matter has been made available to hunters during the 1972 and 1973 hunting seasons. All results to date have been negative, however, the remains of JAMES ANNIS, a hunter lost just prior to NORJAK, were found in the drop area as a direct result of this publicity.

4. A reward of 15% of any ransom money returned or \$25.000.00 total reward has been obtained through contact with of Northwest Orient Airlines.


- 5. Feasibility of conducting an aerial surveillance of the NORJAK flight pattern to locate any articles discarded by Unsub prior to jumping was investigated. This type search was determined not to be feasible.
- 6. A more accurate method of plotting of radar data of the NORJAK flight using a computer was utilized and a new search area was plotted. This new search area was searched with negative results.
- 7. A review was conducted of the magazine and newspaper articles written just prior to NORJAK in an attempt to develop information concerning how Unsub conceived his hijack plan. It was learned that approximately 12 days prior to NORJAK, the first skyjacking involving a parachute was attempted. Since this skyjacking was given a great deal of publicity at that time, it is felt Unsub may have used this event to help him formulate his skyjacking plans.



He explained that he merely recalled recently a bank burglary which occurred in the early 1960's in some small town located between Seattle and Tacoma, in which the individual responsible for the burglary had tunneled into the bank and had made away with some \$75,000 in cash. He added that the individual had to use explosives to gain entrance to the bank and as best he could recall, this individual was also believed to have been employed with United Airlines at the time of the burglary, He stated he could not recall the subject's name nor could he recall the date or location of the bank burglary, and he had no other reason for thinking that this individual might be the unsub in this matter, other than the fact that it occurred to him that this bank burglar must have been a very smart individual as he believed unsub, aka D.
