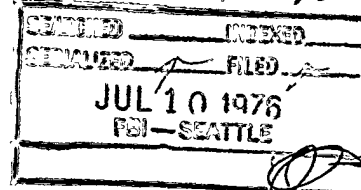

The five year statute of limitations on NORJAK will run in November, 1976. It is suggested that consideration be given to having one or more individuals in the Seattle Division at this time begin familiarizing themselves in a most complete way with all details of this matter. Undoubtedly as the five year anniversary date approaches the Portland and Seattle Divisions as well as other Divisions and the Bureau will begin to receive detailed inquiries on what is to be done to estop the statute.

When the decision is reached on what is to be released all RAs should be advised so that the appropriate answer may be given to inquiries from news media.

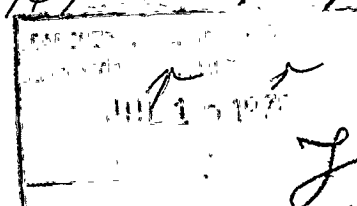

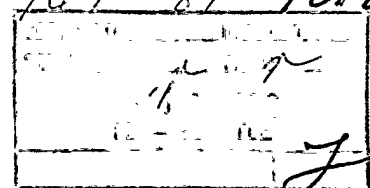
On 6/10/76, a [REDACTED] was interviewed at the Harris County Precinct 2 Ferry Office on the Houston Ship Channel and advised that during the period of the instant hijacking, he was working up in the Washington or Oregon area but he could not recollect exactly where. [REDACTED] advised that as best he could remember, he was either just going on an intracoastal ship or had just come off of one and remembers reading about the case in the papers and could not figure out how anyone could get away with something like that.

[REDACTED] was extremely cooperative and volunteered to take a lie detector test and to be photographed for elimination purposes concerning his similarity to the artist conception described above. The following description was obtained through observation and interview:

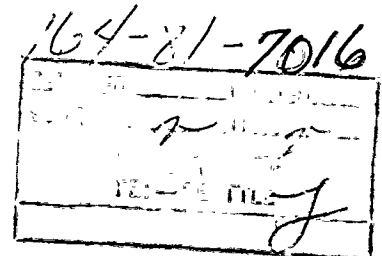

## THE CRIME

On 11/24/71, a lone white male boarded Northwest Orient flight 305 at Portland, Oregon. At approximately 3:22 P. M., while the flight was enroute to Seattle, Washington, he indicated to the stewardess that his brief case contained a bomb, which would blow up the plane unless his demands were met.

The hijacker demanded \$200,000 and four parachutes in exchange for the safety of the 36 passengers aboard the plane. When the aircraft landed at Seattle, Washington, Northwest Orient Airlines complied with his instructions. After he received the parachutes and money, the hijacker allowed all passengers and two airline stewardesses to deplane.

He then ordered the remaining crew members into the first-class section of the aircraft and informed them he desired to fly to Mexico City. The hijacker instructed that

The hijacker apparently bailed out somewhere between Seattle, Washington, and Reno, Nevada, where the plane landed to refuel. It was determined the hijacker, two parachutes and the ransom money had disappeared when the plane was inspected at Reno, Nevada.

Artist's conception drawings of the aircraft hijacker were prepared by the FBI Exhibit Section and are considered a reasonable likeness. The black and white composite was prepared initially and sometime later, the color composite was prepared to depict the hijacker's complexion and age more graphically.

The hijacker is described as follows:

Wearing apparel:	Black or brown suit; narrow black tie (clip-on type); black rain-type overcoat or dark topcoat; dark briefcase or attache case; carried a paper bag 4 by 12 by 14 inches; brown shoes.

THE beginning, it had a kind of eerie, hypnotic charm.

Despite all the best precautions, the man on board the jet had a bomb. And there were 41 other persons sitting around him. For Northwesterners, the scene had a special kind of horror. Friends and family were on board Northwest Flight 305, now sitting ominously mute and isolated on Runway 16R with no visible signs of activity on board.

The atmosphere at the Seattle-Tacoma International Airport was heavy with a suspended, time-in-slow-motion feeling, even as television cameras covered the "event" live from the distant passenger terminal.

The runway lights, dimmed on demand to a faint glow, helped very little in defining the lines of the sleek 727, parked in the cold night in front of the airport's administration building. Even the squatty truck, disgorging the aromatic jet fuel, was almost a silhouette, its lights and rotating beacon extinguished.

Inside, the man in the dark raincoat sitting in the last seat on the starboard side was served up an unusual offering. A white cloth sack and four squat parachutes. The sack held a six-inch-thick rectangular package weighing 27½ pounds. It contained 10,000 \$20 bills.

A minute later, the front cabin door opened slowly and 36 passengers, many puzzled over the delay, were herded away from the plane in small groups, then into a bus which sped toward the terminal.

It was November 24, 1971. The next day was Thanksgiving.

AIRLINE OFFICIALS referred to the flight later as a "puddlejumper" — routinely racing the sun from the East Coast with its last two scheduled stops Portland and Seattle. Today, however, Flight 305 would make one additional stop.

Earlier that afternoon, a middle-aged, ordinary-looking man waited in line at the Portland ticket counter, paid cash for a tourist cabin seat, and sat quietly for 50 minutes in the airport waiting room until boarding time. Later, no one remembered seeing him.

Just after 3 o'clock, Capt. Bill Scott of Minneapolis eased the plane out of a shallow, climbing right turn toward a northerly heading. The seat-belt signs were still on.

In the aft cabin, the swarthy man who had never removed his dark sunglasses beckoned to a stewardess, Tina Mucklow, and quietly handed her a note.

It said he wanted \$200,000 and four parachutes: two backpack type and two front packs.

For added incentive, he opened his ordinary-looking attache case a few inches and showed her the contents: several red cylinders connected by wire.

The long-haired, blond stewardess nodded understandingly and began to make her way up the still sloping aisle toward the locked cockpit door.

Mr. D. B. Cooper had announced his arrival.

As the plane neared, then passed Seattle, passengers began to get

nervous for the first time, but for the wrong reason.

"People began to be concerned when it circled around Whidbey Island for an hour or so," Robert Gregory of Payallup, who sat four seats away from the icy-nerved skyjacker, recalled.

"They thought something was wrong with the plane," he said.

About 5:45, Captain Scott touched the plane down and rolled it smoothly to a stop, but in front of the airport's administration building, a half mile from the passenger terminal. At the same moment, the stewardesses stood up, squarely blocking the aisles and Scott spoke emphatically over the loudspeaker, ordering passengers to please remain in their seats and not to move until told to.

They fidgeted in their seats, muttering. Gregory's seat on the port side was blocked by the stewardess, Tina Mucklow, standing very still.

"What's the problem?" Gregory asked her.

"Don't look back," she cautioned, keeping her eyes fixed on the other stewardess in the forward cabin. Both girls looked "a little green," Gregory recalled.

No announcement was made that anything was wrong, but the plane's back door, for exiting passengers, remained bolted and the passengers remained in their seats, fixed under the glare of the seat-belt sign. No one had seen any weapons.

TWENTY MINUTES dragged by. The crew conferred frequently over the plane's intercom. Then, heads looked up as Ms. Mucklow walked slowly toward the rear of the plane carrying a large white cloth sack. Everyone knew it was a money bag and everyone knew what it meant.

Then, at 6:50 p.m., the passengers and two remaining stewardesses were directed off. Gregory, who had noticed the man earlier on a trip to the restroom, turned as he left and got a good look at Cooper.

"No, he didn't look calm," Gregory recalled. "He was very wary, watching everybody that moved very intently."

It was suddenly very quiet on the airplane. Cooper had told Scott he "wanted fuel out here right now" and he was assured that the

airline would cooperate completely.

The silver-haired pilot was playing it slowly and calmly. So was airline headquarters in Minneapolis.

The company had requested the Federal Bureau of Investigation not to take any action in trying to board the plane or capture the suspect.

J. Earl Milnes, then special agent in charge of the bureau's Seattle office, agreed to comply with the request in every way.

The minutes oozed by. Finally, the plane was fueled but with only 2,300 pounds. Cooper extinguished the last of a series of Raleigh filter-tip cigarettes, then ventured cautiously over to the plane's intercom.

"He just told me he wanted to go to Mexico City," Scott remembered.

"He didn't specify the route. He just wanted to go at 10,000 feet."

The skyjacker also ordered that the 727 fly with flaps down 15 percent, and the landing gear lowered.

"He seemed very rational," Scott said. "Calm and self-assured."



The plane, flying with the wheels and flaps down, would burn a tremendous amount of fuel and could never reach Phoenix, the normal first stop.

A Seattle-to-Reno route would be "a wise choice for a wise hijacker," the tower proposed. Everyone agreed.

The pilot set a commonplace Victor 23 flight plan over Portland, Eugene, Klamath Falls, then southeast toward Reno.

Dinners were cautiously placed on board, Tina Mucklow was ordered to leave her seat next to Cooper, where she had ridden most of the flight, go into the front section and close the curtain. The aft cabin lights were turned off.

At 7:30 p.m., the tower cleared Flight 305 for takeoff, and quietly advised Scott he would "have company" all the way down to Reno with "one plane above and one plane below."

WHEN THE 727 lifted off to become a tiny dot in the sky, radar operators tracked a total of eight additional planes shadowing the three-engine jet. Six jet fighters, one jet trainer and an H-130 rescue plane with emergency gear and jumpers were launched from bases in Washington, Idaho and California. No one was able to maintain constant visual contact.

The 727 was lumbering along at its slowest possible cruising speed, and the other ships kept shooting past and had to backtrack.

The weather was worsening. Rain clouds quilted the ground. As soon as the plane was level, Cooper ordered Scott to open the rear cabin door, which on the 727 was under the tail section, and had stairs. Red lights winked in the cockpit as the pressure dropped,

then adjusted. No more instructions: Just the subdued rush of air.

Then, at 8:13 p.m., slightly more than half an hour after the plane took off from Sea-Tac, one of Scott's panel gauges flopped a few times, then settled.

Passenger Cooper had debarked Flight 305.

"YEAH, I packed his parachutes," said Earl Cossey, 35, of Seattle.

Cossey, a long-time sports jumper, provided the authorities with two of the four chutes delivered.

"They were just emergency backpacks. Really," they're just used for aerobatic pilots or glider pilots or someone who would use a single parachute for a lifesaving event only. It wouldn't be like a sport parachute."

Was Cooper an experienced skydiver?

"Heck, no," said Cossey, "at least, not as far as sports jumping."

Cossey theorized that the hijacker may have been a military paratrooper since he at first turned down parachutes coming from McChord Air Force that would open too soon after jumping. The other factor was his selection of which parachute to use.

"One was more of a sports-type chute with a harness that was really, really comfortable," Cossey explained, "and the other was a military-type with a very uncomfortable harness. And he picked the one that was not comfortable. But they were both equally safe."

In appearances only, as it happened, for one of the other two chutes, hastily borrowed from Linn Emrick of Sky Sports, Inc., was a nonfunctional ground training chute with the canopy completely sewn together.

Cossey said his remaining chute, left on the floor of the plane, was returned to him and is now a treasured souvenir. Officials figured, he said, that Cooper had stripped the nylon from the two other parachute containers, packed them full of money, walked out on the undulating rear stairway of the 727, and dropped into the rain-blackened sky.

Could he have made it?

"Oh, yeah," Cossey insists, firmly. "In fact, there was a time that I had high hopes of making a duplicate jump. The airline wanted to take that same model airplane and go over in the Spokane area where it's very open and let a jumper prove that it could be re-

done. It was all set up but then fell through due to insurance problems. But it's easily done."

Cossey, who has looked at a lot of equipment turned up in the woods by the F.B.I. over the years, feels he can identify his hand-assembled chute if it's found.

"I have a little secret deal with the F.B.I.," he said, with a smile. He told them, "if you ever catch him, I get to talk to him about how he accomplished it."

THE SEARCH AREA was pinpointed with surprising precision from a combination of recording instruments on board the plane, its speed and altitude, the suspect's weight, and the 23-mile-an-hour wind blowing that night from the northwest. The figures were all fed into a computer at Fort Lewis.

"We were able to fix a 'ground zero'," Tom Manning, F.B.I. resident agent at Longview, said.

"Looking at the possibility that the parachute did not open, and allowing for trajectory of the body from the plane and of the free fall and so on, we started at ground zero and then proceeded in a southwesterly direction, angling toward St. Helen's (Oregon)."

The search started off pretty big, Manning recalls, with dozens of agents, sheriff's deputies from both Clark and Cowlitz Counties, volunteers with fixed-wing search planes, and helicopters from Bonneville Power, the National Guard and even The Weyerhaeuser Co.

A diamond-shaped area, roughly 150 square miles, was divided into six sectors for the search teams. It centered in the Merwin Dam area, about 20 miles southeast of Kelso.

The terrain was mainly low hills with heavy underbrush and a lot of first- and second-growth timber. There was some flat terrain along the river bank, but mostly the search concentrated for almost a week in the rugged country between Vancouver and Kelso.

"If a guy isn't too well versed in hitting into those tall trees, he'd get hung up real easy," a Weyerhaeuser forester, Dick Bohlig, said.

Even though the land is cruised occasionally, "you could walk almost right underneath it and unless you weren't looking straight up, you'd never see it," Bohlig said. "If you ever go out and start looking for people in the woods, about the only time you ever find

them is if you practically walk hand in hand."

**THE SEARCH** subsided, then flared up countless times, with Manning's agents checking out an endless supply of leads. At the beginning, tantalizing rumors began to unfold concerning several unidentified aircraft, landing and taking off in the hijack area that day.

The F. B. I. painstakingly checked out all the planes and pilots and cleared them all.

Residents of the two nearby communities of Ariel and View were busy watching each other, sometimes with a smile, and any stranger in the area, especially spending \$20 bills, was sure to be watched closely.

Information sheets were distributed to hunters and campers frequenting the area, detailing the items the F.B.I. was interested in finding.

The word flashed to Seattle. A body had been found just outside Woodland.

"Two sisters looking for antique bottles found it," J. Earl Milnes, then heading the case, said.

The women, poking in an abandoned cistern, uncovered what appeared to be a foot and human limb and deputies were called.

Officials cut an opening in the bottom of the cistern with a chain saw and began to remove the body. When it was identified as a woman, Milnes returned the case to the local authorities.

"I was just waiting for some smart alec to come back with:

" 'How do you know D. B. Cooper wasn't a woman?' "

**WHERE HAD** the elusive Cooper gone?

Seemingly, every place was searched. South of the Lewis River the stretches of flat, open land had been gone over meticulously. To the north, even the heavy blanket of trees had failed to diminish virtually a foot-by-foot search.

The Federal Aviation Administration in Reno pointed out that the plane, on landing, had taxied slowly enough for someone to escape. This possibility was investigated, but finally was dropped.

Letters, purportedly written by Cooper, turned up in various newspapers across the West.

One "confession" said he, Cooper, had committed the crime because he was "in a rut."

Another insisted that he was Cooper, and that he only had 14 months to live.

In late 1972, two Kitsap County men were convicted by a federal grand jury of extorting \$30,000 from a former Newsweek editor for a phony "interview" with the skyjacker.

Northwest Airlines offered a \$25,000 reward for all the money, or 15 per cent of any lesser amount recovered, and The Oregon Journal promised \$1,000 for the first \$20 bill from the loot.

Back in Clark County, one psychic reportedly offered detailed theories to the F.B.I., and even a "water witch" joined the hunt with a forked stick.

Through it all, the real D. B. Cooper never stood up.

Then, last January 12, it seemed the big break had come. Two hunters found a weathered skull 10 miles east of Estacata, Ore. What's more, clothing, human remains and a parachute were found with the skull.

A medical examiner announced the deceased was a male, all right, but at least ten years younger than the suspect.

**SO WHAT'S** the answer? A grown man just doesn't vanish into nothingness. Or does he?

The opinions of those who ought to know, the people who "knew him best," are as far-reaching as the boundaries of the search map. Here are some:

**A senior F.B.I. man:**

"I think he made it. I think he slept in his own bed that night. It was a clear night. A lot of the country is pretty flat. He was flying low and slow and all he had to do was walk out on those stairs, and jump.

"He just could have walked out. Right down the road. Hell, they weren't even looking for him there at that time. They thought he was somewhere else. He could just walk down the road. There's nothing suspicious about that."

Agreeing that no body was ever found, nor any parachute or shrouds, he explained simply, "he could have carried that with him."

**Earl Cossey, veteran parachutist:**

"I have a hard time speculating. I have to divide it into he's either a very small hole in the ground, which means he didn't get the parachute open, or he's laughing at us all. I can't decide which."

**Dick Bohlig, forester:**

"It could very well have been

possible for him to land south of the Lewis River. There's quite a bit of flat, open ground. He could have easily landed in that. And if he did, then he'd be home free."

**Pilot William Scott:**

"Nothing's turned up so I don't have the slightest idea."

**Tom Manning, the F.B.I.'s Longview resident agent:**

"This is strictly a theory. I have no foundation that I can back it up with, but I feel that he's in the lake. Lake Merwin."

Manning explained that prior to the skyjacking, two fishermen capsize their boat in the middle of the lake and their bodies were never recovered. One reason for this, he said, was that the bed of the two-mile-long lake was never

clear-cut of heavy timber prior to the valley being flooded during construction of Ariel Dam at Lake Merwin. Area residents report that heavy windstorms frequently bring up a lot of floaters and snags from the fairly good-sized trees that were left in there.

"My theory—strictly a theory, understand—is that he did hit the lake, and because of the weight of his body, the money, parachutes, and the force of the landing, he

went down and is hung up on a snag."

And the parachute's nylon fabric, being underwater, would not deteriorate, as it would under full sun. Moreover, Merwin is an "extremely cold lake," Manning said, which he felt would prevent the generation of body gases.

"Body gas, as you know, is the thing that forces (the body) to the surface" because of the creation of buoyancy. But Lake Merwin,

Manning said, "would be like putting a man into one of those deep freezes."

**Stan Pitkin, United States attorney:**

"I don't think there's any rational conclusion but that the man is long dead. And both he and the money are probably decomposed."

**DOES THERE** come a time, then, when you finally give it all up?

Apparently not.

John Reed, special agent in charge of the F.B.I.'s Seattle office reports the total number of persons investigated so far on the Cooper caper has exceeded 800.

How many are they investigating now?

"I would estimate," he said, "that around 20 to 30 suspects are involved."

The D. B. Cooper file, he concluded, "is still very much open."

band," Pitkin said, "and it doesn't belong to anyone other than Northwest Air Lines."

Besides, he explained, the long-sought money would be subject to being held as evidence, so any such windfall "would be ill-gotten, and a very serious offense."

John Reed, special agent in charge of the F.B.I.'s Seattle office says:

"If a person leaves the jurisdiction for the crime, and it's a capital offense, the statute never 'tolls'."

Stan Pitkin, United States attorney in Seattle, agrees, adding:

"Although at the time of the offense, there was an uncertainty on the implementation of a death pen-

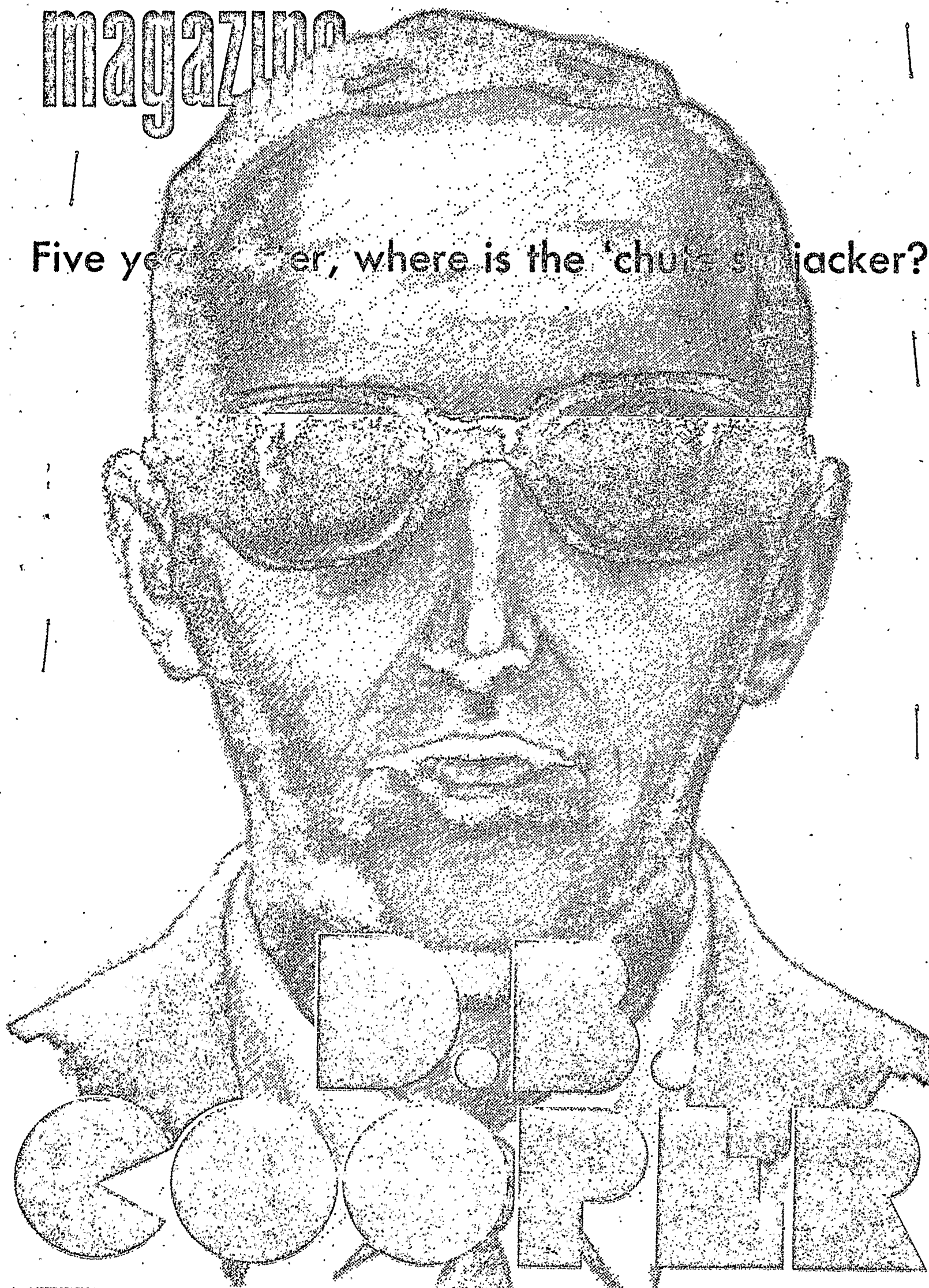
alty, this is, by act of Congress, a capital offense and the statute of limitation does not apply to capital offenses."

SUBJECT: PRESS MATTERS

For the past several years, the FBI, like many other Governmental agencies, has had an "open door" policy with all members of the news media, with the result that each Division now has a Special Agent who operates as that Division's news media relations man. It is his responsibility for establishing and maintaining relations with all news media personnel and to handle all routine inquiries. The Bureau has instructed that whenever an inquiry is received from a newsman, whether or not this particular reporter has or has not written favorable or unfavorable articles about the Bureau, he should be treated as courteously as possible. Naturally, if the person is inquiring about policy matters, the inquiry should be referred to the SAC, or in his absence, the ASAC.

With regard to matters pertaining to pending investigations, future arrests or major cases, there appears to be some confusion, therefore, for the purpose of clarification, I would like to point out the following:

1. Routine inquiries in Headquarters City should be directed to SA ☐ (News Media Representative for this Division), and in his absence the SAC or ASAC.

2. Routine inquiries at Resident Agencies are to be handled by the Senior Resident Agent unless it is a case that has received some notoriety or is going to get an inordinant number of inquiries, then it should be referred to Headquarters City. The Senior Resident Agent is the only person authorized to talk with the press, and he should make certain that any statement is in accordance with current existing regulations.

Whenever a case Agent has an investigation of any consequence or a major incident occurs, i.e. shooting, arrest of well-known figure, it is his responsibility to promptly notify the SAC, ASAC, and SA [redacted] in order that all inquiries can be properly handled. The case Agent should not hesitate to notify the above, even though the incident occurs over weekends, holidays, or after normal working hours.

4. Case Agents are not to offer opinions, statements, or speculations about cases when they are approached by members of the press during or after investigations.

Concerning the above items, it should be pointed out that the D. B. COOPER case is receiving a great deal of publicity because of the approaching anniversary date of the hijacking. In order that the FBI can speak in "one" voice about this case, it is important that all press inquiries be referred to headquarters. This is to avoid inconsistencies such as individual Agents speculating about what might have happened in the COOPER case and these inconsistencies being pointed out by the members of the media.

I again want to point out that the FBI's policy with the press has been established by the Director and has been approved by the Attorney General. This policy is general in nature and common sense should dictate in most instances how a particular incident should be handled; however, the above guidelines are being reiterated at this time. If there is any doubt in your mind about how to handle a particular situation, it should be resolved in favor of immediately notifying the SAC, ASAC, or news media representative.

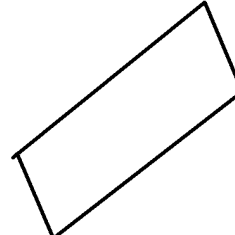

What will undoubtedly be one of the best books—because it's being done by one of the best writers I know—to come out of the incident will be "King of the Midnight Blue," by Seattleite Darrell Bob Houston. And before you ask, the D. B. initials are just coincidence. Our D.B. is much too tall for the skyjacker. Houston's novel based on the incident comes out November 3. "I wrote it as an in-flight movie," he quipped. 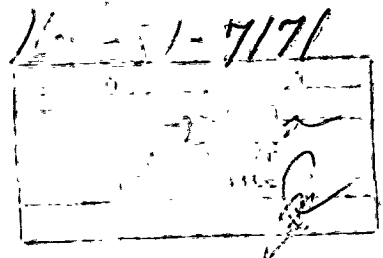

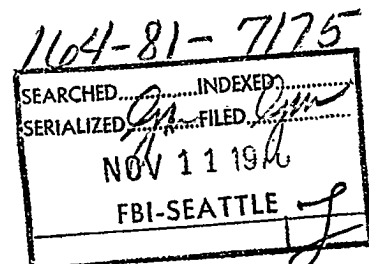

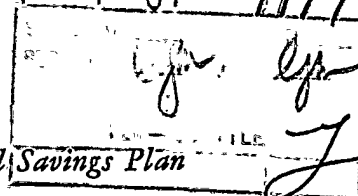

After all, the \$20 bills that have been popping up mysteriously on the streets will

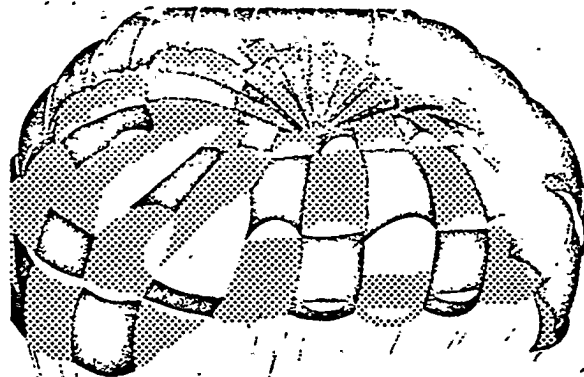

## FBI Steps Up D.B. Cooper Search

The statute of limitations is about to expire on D.B. Cooper and his \$200,000 ransom, and the FBI is willing to pay \$5,000 to the first person to turn in one of the \$20 bills he stole.

Cooper was the man who hijacked a Northwest Airlines Boeing 727 flying from Portland to Seattle on Nov. 24, 1971, by giving a stewardess a note claiming he had a bomb in his suitcase.

Cooper's ransom was \$200,000 from the airline, and he parachuted into a raging thunderstorm from the jet's rear door somewhere between Seattle and Reno, Nev.

No one is sure Cooper survived the jump, and no trace of him has ever been found.

The FBI, aware that statute of limitations will expire at midnight, Nov. 24, 1976, continues the hunt.

A plan has been devised to try and recover the 10,000 \$20 bills, if any have shown up, but it isn't being well received.

The plan involves nationwide publishing of the serial numbers of the bills. The person who turns in the first bill would get \$5,000 reward. Smaller rewards would be given to persons who turned in bills later.

The FBI says, however, that even if Cooper beats the rap, he won't be able to go public. The IRS believes Cooper owes back taxes amounting to \$218,000, which includes interest and penalties, for his plunder.

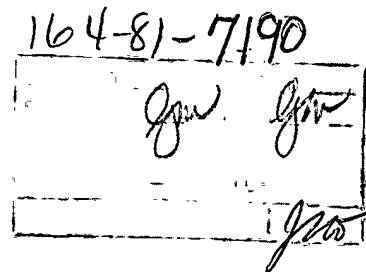

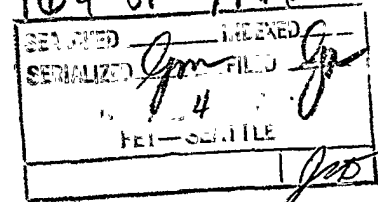

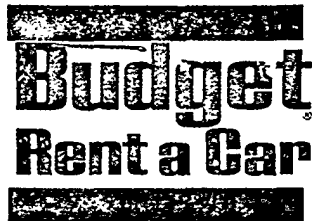

The laundry tag, although it is partially disintegrated contains what is believed to be a complete serial number A-317, however, a portion of this serial number area was disintegrated and there could possibly be an additional digit in front of the 317. In addition, there is writing "one" and the partial letters "MARTI" which [redacted] believes could possibly be the One Hour Martinizing cleaning and would be a good possibility for further investigation regarding the trousers.

The waist on the trousers measures 42" with an inseam of 31".

He stated that the serology examination regarding body fluids is still being conducted and we will be advised of the results when completed. He further stated that there is no way that the Lab can tell as to how long the trousers were in the area but from general appearances it is not believed that they have been there five years, however, there is no test that can be run to give the exact length of time the trousers were in the tree.

[redacted] advised that the Lab report will be forthcoming but he wanted to furnish the above information for our investigative leads.

a. everyone is throughly convinced that mr. Cooper is without a doubt dead.

b. 5 years later still no evidence to indicate that Cooper had indeed jumped. The money is still missing. Not one of the \$20 dollar bills has ever turned up in circulation.

d. Cooper is now made a national hero, the public, and the FBI are still stumped as to the whereabouts of Cooper or the money.

The following information has been abbreviated to indicate our main findings.

A. Flight 305 starts as a routine flight from Washington DC to Portland, then Seattle.

1. Mr. X dressed as himself now leaves DC for Seattle.

a. Mr. or Mrs. X upon arrival in Portland departs the aircraft with the portland passengers, even though his ticket axually reads to Seattle.

b. Mr. or MrsX now changes clothing, and now is ready to re-board the aircraft as a ticketed passenger known as Mr. Dan Cooper.

2. Just prior to touchdown Mr. Dan Cooper hands the stewardess a note indicating her to have the pilot to do the following:

A.I have a bomb in my briefcase have the pilot relay the following:

1. I will exchange all the passengers aboard for \$200,000 and 4 parachutes.

2. The return message came that we will follow your instructions as indicated if you release the passengers first.

B. Passengers were now released as asked to do, in good faith.

1. Before the passengers were released off the aircraft the following took place as scheduled.

a. Cooper now changes back into his original clothing of Mr. X.

1. A crewmember, most likely the 2nd officer puts on the clothing that Cooper originally had on, to complete the second part of Cooper.

2. 35 passengers, plus Mr. or Mrs. X and 2 stewardesses now depart the aircraft, all of these people probably state that they saw Cooper on board the aircraft. (Actually they must have been convinced that the 2nd officer was Cooper at this point.)

3. Actually you have 2 people playing themselves, and Cooper. Mr. X plays himself, then Cooper until the plane lifts off, upon which he resumes his real identity, creating the illusion that there are 5 people on the aircraft upon take off, when in reality only 4 are indeed aboard.

3. Money and chutes are now put upon the aircraft, and the flight now lifts off for Reno Nevada.

A. 8 fighter jets now trail the aircraft all the way to Reno.

1. The aircraft flies at slow speed, and low with the door in the tail open to create the illusion that Cooper would indeed jumpout.

B. On the aircraft 4 crewmembers, not 5 - because there was no Cooper - complete the following:

1. All the evidence aboard the aircraft must be destroyed.

a. The dummy chutes, \$200,000, and any other evidence is now all burned. YES I SAID THAT THEY DID INDEED BURN EVERY LAST 20 DOLLAR BILL OF THE \$200,000. -THE ILLUSION IS NOW COMPLETE- NO COOPER, NO MONEY, NOCHUTES, NO EVIDENCE ARRIVES IN RENO NEVADA. -

4. Upon touchdown in Reno the fighterpilots now state that Cooper did not jump, and that nothing left that aircraft.



2. The FBI and police now engulf the aircraft, certain that Mr . Cooper is aboard. After a through search of the aircraft, and crew, they are convinced that Mr. Cooper had indeed jumped without them detecting his jump.

THE GREATEST MADIGICAL PERFORMANCE EVER HAS NOW BEEN COMPLETED,  
WITH THE LARGEST POSSIBLE AUDIENCE -THE WHOLE WORLD.

1. The crew of this aircraft were nothing but actors that were probably paid very well to put on this fine performance.

2. You must realize that the money was not the motive in this fine madigical feat, the money was no more than a mere stage prop that had to be burned to complete this fine series of illusions.

3. This shows you something about our Mr. or Mrs. Cooper. Cooper has to be a very well to do person, such as an actor, or magician.

4. In 5 years the FBI has been trying to find some evidence to indicate that Mr. Cooper jumped, and in 5 years they have not been able to prove this fact, no body, parachutes, or money has ever been found.

The above information has been presented to you to be notorized and signed [redacted] to represent the research that [redacted] have concluded, that in our opinions may lead to the arrest and conviction of Mr. or Mrs. Dan B. Cooper, and accomplices. Therefore Mr. X also known as Dan B. Cooper, has his name on the passenger list in the FBI files, and we have been denied permission to look at this list by the FBI.

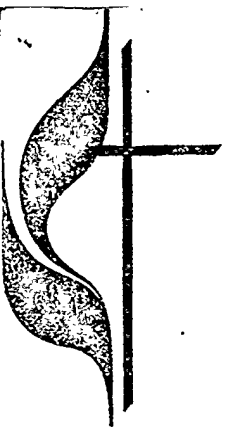

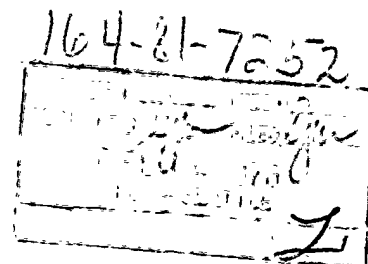
