Having met with [] in the Green Mountain area, southwest of Ariel, Washington, I was directed by [] to an area about [] in a heavily wooded area. He pointed out a pair of tattered pants hanging from a small bush and stated these were the pants he had located about October 22 or 23, 1976, when he was hunting deer in the area.

The pants were identified and placed in a small plastic bag. The immediate area was walked over and examined but nothing was observed except for the debris of the forests. Nothing was seen that would indicate anyone had been in the area as there was no sign of any material in the area.

The sight was marked for future search and the pants were taken to the Portland office of the FBI where they were prepared for shipment to the FBI Laboratory, Washington, D.C.

[redacted] advised he was deer hunting on or about October 23, 1976, about [redacted] and saw a movement in the trees. He said he thought he saw a deer and approached the area, only to notice a pair of pants hanging in the trees. He said it was about 25 feet from the ground and the pants were covered with leaves and fir tree needles. He continued that he obtained a long stick and removed the pants from the branch it was resting on and examined the pockets looking for identification. He said the pockets were empty so he left the pants in the trees.

As you know, we collected from our insurers for loss of the ransom. The insurers may be willing to pay some kind of reward for information leading to the recovery of the money.

While Northwest is interested in having "D. B. Cooper" apprehended, we do not want unnecessary publicity regarding the incident.

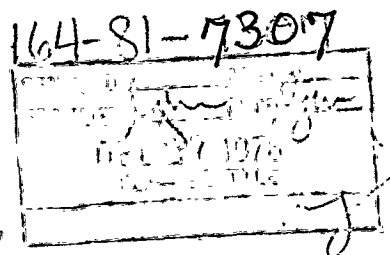

program of the reenactment, with pictures being taken from the control tower at Sea-Tac airport. He stated that they would clearly state in the film that this was a reenactment and was not the actual tapes obtained at the time of the hijacking and would only use certain portions of the transcripts.

I told [] that I felt that I could not let him see the transcripts inasmuch as they were transcribed not from the original tapes, but from tapes dubbed off the originals as the original would be used as evidence in court and some of the transcriptions were not clear and the transcripts were only being used for investigative purposes. I told him I felt that this could possibly jeopardize the case and prior to letting him see the transcripts would have to clear it with FBIHQ.

I then telephonically contacted [] External Affairs, and told him of my reluctance to furnish these transcripts and the reason and he concurred.

On 1/17/77, a check was made with several laundries that specialize in martinizing in the Seattle area, and it was learned that laundry tickets are customarily stapled to trousers and other items as they are received from the customer for cleaning. The number and letters on these tickets correspond with a code which is a sequential numbering system. The first character in the code is an alphabetic letter and the second character in the code is a number, ranging from 1 to 10,000.

When a customer brings in an item for cleaning, such as a pair of trousers, he fills out a cleaning form requesting cleaning and putting his name on the form. The date of pickup and the cross reference number also appears on this form. The number on the form could be A-1 through 10,000 and a corresponding tag would then be stapled to the trousers with that number A-1 through 10,000, so that the trousers could be located in the event the customer does not show up to claim his cleaning items.

Most laundries vary the first letter from A-1 through 10,1000 to B-1 through 10,000, etc., until the end of the year, at which time they normally start over again with A-1 through 10,000; however, this is not a hard and fast rule and with just a number such as found on the trousers in this case, A-317, it would be impossible to determine who the customer was who had the trousers cleaned. It might be possible in some cleaning establishments to determine the customer if the trousers were recently cleaned by checking past ticket

In addition, cleaning establishments do not save their records in a uniform manner as one establishment may save records for five years, another may only save records for three or four months.

Finally it was learned that most laundry cleaning establishments use this system and therefore, it would be impractical to contact all the laundries either specializing in martinizing or not specializing in martinizing, in the State of Washington, and possibly even in the State of Oregon, to determine the owner of the trousers. It is felt that this lead would be unproductive and because of the measurement size, that of a waistband of 42" and an inseam of 31", and also because of the fact that it does not appear that the trousers were in the wooded area for a five-year period, no further investigation concerning this aspect of the case will be conducted at this time.

On 2/22/77, [] Continental Airlines, Seattle, Washington, was interviewed at Portland International Airport by SA [] furnished the following information:

On the night of 11/24/71, during the hijacking in this matter, he, [] a Continental Airlines flight between Seattle, Washington, and Portland, Oregon. He became aware of the hijacking by radio and followed the progress of the hijacking by monitoring the discrete radio frequencies in his own aircraft.

[] advised that he departed Seattle-Tacoma Airport enroute for Portland shortly after Northwest Flight 305, which was being hijacked, and that he followed the same course flown by Northwest Flight 305 but was approximately four minutes behind the Northwest flight when it arrived at Portland.

[] advised that in his twenty-four years flying airliners, he recalls that night of 11/24/71, as being the most rapid and severe weather change in his experience. He said that when he was approaching Portland, along Victor 23 airways flying a course of approximately 166 degrees, he was experiencing a wind directly from 166 degrees at 80 knots of speed at his altitude which was 14,000 feet. at 10,000 feet was approximately 65 knots and from a direction of from 160 to 170 degrees and that when he landed at Portland International Airport, he landed to the east on runway 10 and at that time experienced surface winds of 35 knots coming from 160 degrees. He remembered these figures because they were near the maximum cross-wind component allowable for his aircraft.

[redacted] advised that he has thought considerably about the hijacking in this matter and has concluded that it is not realistic to assume that the hijacker survived the jump. He said that in view of the very dense terrain in the drop zone area, he can understand why the hijacker's remains have not been found. He suggested that one way this might be facilitated would be to place identical equipment to that known to have been in possession of the hijacker, that is, two parachutes, an attache case, and the known clothing on a large open field on a day of warm sunshine. After exposure to the rays of sun for a period of time, the entire field should be photographed with infra-red film. The image on the infra-red film should be distinctive. Then, photographs of the drop zone area could be made with infra-red film after a similar exposure to warm sunshine and the films, when processed, could be examined for an image similar to that made by the "dummy." [redacted] pointed out that in view of the almost complete absence of man-made objects or metal objects in the rugged regions of the drop zone area, there should not be any materials there which would yield similar images.

Information available to Portland indicates the wind believed to be in effect in the drop zone area at the time the hijacker parachuted was coming from the southwest. If that is the case and the Northwest engineers who computed the location of the drop zone and the prime line along which UNSUB presumably fell were using southwest wind information, then the calculations of the location of the drop zone may not be accurate. A shift of wind from the west to the south would push the east end of the prime line to the north in a counter-clockwise direction. It could cause previously unsearched territory to the west of the drop zone to be included in a new amended drop zone.

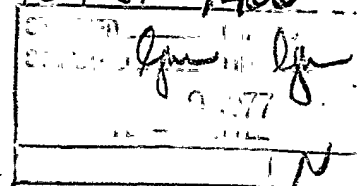

On 2/18/77, [REDACTED] Washington advised he had been contacted by [REDACTED] of Vancouver, Washington and he displayed a colored photograph he had taken at Mount St. Helens in the fall of 1976. He said he viewed the picture and from the distorted background images it appeared that a body lay on the ground. He said based on that a search was made of the area photographed by [REDACTED]. He said nothing was located in the area directed to by [REDACTED] and that [REDACTED] declared he was seeking "bigfoot" and would drive into the mountains and pan an area with a movie camera. He said after the movie was processed, [REDACTED] would look at it through a view finder, frame by frame and when he saw something that might look like "Bigfoot" he would photograph the frame which was enlarged and this was the manner in which he said he obtained the picture.

On 3/4/77 [REDACTED] Vancouver, Washington was interviewed and he said the area he was photographing was located high in the St Helens range. He said he was not able to recall any order at the time he made his picture in the fall of 1976.

It is of the opinion of the writer that the picture submitted to the Bureau as well as furnished to the Skamania County S.O. is not that of any body but an image distorted by light, and enlargement that gave the possible appearance of a body. This area is too far for UNSUB in the NORJAK flight to have drifted from LaCenter, Washington.

Previous efforts to locate and interview [REDACTED] have been made with negative results because of his working in the woods.

On 3/15/77 [REDACTED] Wash-
ington was located at [REDACTED] and stated he had no factual inform-
ation concerning the identity of the UNSUB in this matter. He
stated he recalled that on the night of the incident in Seattle,
Washington he was working in the diamond area, [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] Washington and returned very late. He said the night
was extremely stormy, heavy winds and down pouring of rain.
He pointed he did not hear of the hijacking until he arrived
at his home and [REDACTED] told him about hearing it on the radio.
He stated [REDACTED] and he heard a low flying plane in the [REDACTED]
area and thought it to be a commercial jet because of the loudness
of the motors.

He said on 11-25-1971 he returned to the woods and left his
home about 7:00am. He said he was about eight or nine miles from
his home when he passed a white male walking on the highway, going
westerly, meaning he was going down the mountain highway. He
pointed out he thought this to be strange as it was about 7:20am
or about that time and this person was not dressed as one does
in the woods. He said the man had on a red or dark sweater, dark
pants and no other clothing. Nothing on his head and even though
it was raining this person did not have on any wet weather gear.
He said he drove past and did not see any vehicle on the highway
but stated there were roads, logging roads, off the main highway
and he had no way of knowing if this person had a disabled car off
the main highway. He said he mentioned this at the local tavern
and was laughed at so he declined to notify the FBI or other
authorities as his friends seemed to think nothing of his obser-
vation. He stated he had no other information in this regard
and said the area he saw this unknown person was about 20 miles
from Merwin dam area.

Cooper, a 46-year-old Willow River, Minn., adventurer who once tried to lead a automobile trip across the north pole to Moscow, has pleaded guilty to bank robbery, marijuana and money smuggling, and making illegal gun purchases. He faces up to 24 years in federal prison when sentenced within a month.

Cooper pleaded guilty yesterday to three indictments before U.S. District Judge Joseph Alsop in St. Paul. He admitted smuggling marijuana across the Mexican border, flying some of it across himself. Subsequently, the marijuana was transported to the Twin Cities, mostly by automobile. He also pleaded guilty to taking more than \$100,000 into Mexico without reporting it to customs officers and to buying two revolvers, illegal for a convicted felon. Last week, he pleaded guilty before U.S. District Judge Miles to being involved in the Jar

22, 1974, robbery of the Sturgeon Lake (Minn.) State Bank. Three others have been charged in that crime. None of the \$4,960 taken in the robbery was recovered.

[redacted] was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agents, certain of his Constitutional rights and the purpose of the interview by Special Agent (SA) DONALD H. STEELE. He then read a form entitled, "Your Rights" after which he advised he understood his Constitutional rights as explained on the form but would not sign anything.

[redacted] advised he was unable to determine exactly where he was on November 24, 1971, but believes he was in Fairbanks, Alaska. He advised that he had absolutely nothing to do with NORJAK and that he would be willing to take a polygraph examination should his attorney concur with such activity. He advised that he is currently involved in a lawsuit with the U.S. Government in which he is the defendant and attempts are being made to recover sums of money from him related to an incident which took place while he was [redacted]. He stated that because of this pending lawsuit he doubts very much his attorney would concur in his undergoing a polygraph examination. [redacted] advised that he has never had paratrooper training of any kind and in fact suffers from vertigo which would preclude his jumping from an airplane. He stated that while as a member of the U.S. Air Force for four years he went directly from basic training on approximately May 1, 1952 to the [redacted] at Davis-Monthan Air Force Base in Tucson, Arizona, where he remained until he was terminated from the service on [redacted]. He related that during his entire time in the Air Force he served [redacted]. He furnished to interviewing agents a DD-214 which is a "Report of Separation From the Armed Forces of the United States" showing that he took no major courses and completed no service training courses successfully during his entire four years in the Air Force.

He related that further information regarding his difficulties with the United States Government as [redacted] could be obtained from [redacted] of the Postal Inspector's Office in Seattle, Washington. He stated that the Postal Inspector's Office in Seattle also should have an extensive file on him which would possibly show a contact date of November 24, 1971.

All investigation to identify unsub to date has been negative.

On 11/24/76, a U.S. Grand Jury in Portland, Oregon, returned an indictment charging unsub as JOHN DOE, aka Dan Cooper with violations of aircraft piracy and Hobbs Act statutes. A bond was fixed at \$500,000.

By letter, dated 11/30/76; ROBERT E. THOMPSON, Publisher and Editor of the Seattle Post Intelligencer newspaper, advised that he was withdrawing his previous offer of a \$5,000 reward for the arrest and conviction of unsub, aka D. B. Cooper. THOMPSON stated the reward would be with-

drawn as of 12/31/76.

The Bureau advised by airtel, dated 4/11/77, that a manual search of the missing persons indices at the FBI Headquarters was conducted based on the presumption that unsub may have perished during the jump and a missing persons report may have been filed with the FBI. Twenty-one possible suspects were developed as a result of this manual search and they are currently being processed as suspects at the present time.

On the same date, the Bureau advised by letter that there are eight latent fingerprints connected with this case that were obtained from and around the seat occupied by unsub. The eight latent fingerprints were made by the tip and lower joint areas of fingers and a latent impression, which is a fingerprint or a palm print, was also developed.
