SUBJECT DAILY WORKER INTERNAL SECURITY - C

On October 7, 1948, telephonically referred to the "Daily Worker" of Monday, October 4, 1948, at which time it published the ownership of the paper, which is required by postal authorities. He stated that he had noted two fake names contained in this publication of ownership, management, and circulation, namely, JOHN GATES and JOSEPH ROBERTS.

He stated that several years ago the Post Office caused the "Daily Worker" considerable trouble when they were, as a matter of policy, publishing many fake names in connection with the ownership of the paper. He suggested that possibly the Federal Bureau of Investigation could do something about causing them more trouble through the Post Office.

The Bureau is requested to advise if it desires to take any action et this time on the above suggestion.
