Confidential National Defense Informant [REDACTED] was re-interviewed in connection with this investigation and at that time furnished three cards printed on the back of the Golco Sanitary System price list referred to in reference report, each marked "The Jews are ruining us all". These were apparently printed on the identical printing press which printed the same statement on similar cards as reported in reference report. One of the cards was marked in red pencil with a swastika which reporting Agent observed to be running to the left whereas the Nazi swastika runs to the right. The other two cards were marked in red pencil with a swastika, half completed, left-handed and very similar to a capital "Z".

Inasmuch as the Technical Laboratory already has a plentiful supply of this type of card, these three are being retained in the files of the Los Angeles Field Division.

Informant also furnished a small torn scrap of paper on which was printed the following: "Gentiles Act Kick Jews Out". Examination of this slip of paper disclosed that it was printed by a press using letters very similar to the printed letters on the cards above referred to. This slip is being forwarded to the Technical Laboratory for comparison with previously submitted samples. Informant advised that he had just recently run across these items among a mass of miscellaneous material which he had received in 1939. They were contained in an envelope addressed to [REDACTED]

and postmarked March 27, 1939.

At the same time, Informant gave Agent a handbill put out by the Caroline Cleaners, 7306 Melrose Avenue, advertising the cleaning and pressing done by the firm and containing the statement "All work done by, and under capable, Gentile, management". Informant thought that this might be significant for the reason that the Caroline Cleaners is in the same neighborhood in which the anti-Semitic cards had been distributed in 1939. Informant stated that this handbill had been found in his miscellaneous material received in 1939 and believed that it had probably been received by him during that year.

Upon subsequent interview, Informant gave Agent a small card on which was handwritten in English "Kill all Jews and there will be no more war". This card was in a small envelope addressed to the Jewish Welfare League, Los Angeles, California, and was postmarked January 3, 1943. The

handwriting was observed to be the same as that of the person who wrote the extortion letter, who is the subject of this investigation. This card and its envelope are being forwarded to the Technical Laboratory for comparison with previously submitted samples.

Extensive investigation was conducted at the Los Angeles, Fairfax and Hollywood High Schools with negative results. The principals of the various high schools furnished Agent with handwriting specimens of all students whom they considered as being of the type who might possibly be involved in the distribution of anti-Semitic literature similar to that involved in instant case and Agent observed that all of the handwriting was entirely different than the handwriting of subject of instant case.

At [redacted] it was ascertained that [redacted] b7C did not live there or operate a business there, nor had any individual by that name been there for the past several years. Pursuant to telephonic request, Confidential National Defense Informant [redacted] obtained b2/b7D present address, [redacted]

[redacted] At that address [redacted] was interviewed concerning his telephone [redacted]. At that address [redacted] was interviewed concerning his receipt of cards previously referred to and he stated that it is now his best recollection that he received them during the early part of 1939 when he was in business at 7306 Melrose Avenue. He stated that he arrived at the office one morning sometime between eight and nine a.m. and upon unlocking and opening the door, he found the cards on the floor of the store, obviously having been pushed under the door. [redacted] had no idea as to who could have done this.

b7C A check of the various Los Angeles City directories was made and it was found that no shop was listed under the name "Caroline Cleaners" during 1939, 1940 or 1941. However, the 1942 directory listed the Caroline Cleaners, 7306 Melrose Avenue, as being operated by [redacted]. The 1942 directory also listed both of these persons as residing at Van Nuys, California, and the 1939 directory gave [redacted] address as [redacted] Los Angeles.

A check was made at the Van Nuys Police Station and Post Office but it was impossible to locate any record of either [redacted]

At the Los Angeles Municipal Bureau of Licenses it was ascertained that [redacted] had a license issued for the operation of a cleaning establishment under the name of Caroline Cleaners, 7306 Melrose Avenue, and had been filed by [redacted]. It was observed that her handwriting on the application in no way resembled the handwriting of the writer of the extortion letter.

A check of the indices of the Los Angeles Field Division disclosed no record for [REDACTED] or the Caroline Cleaners.

Accompanied by Special Agent [REDACTED] the writer called at [REDACTED] and interviewed [REDACTED] who stated that she is [REDACTED] residing at [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] stated that the license was issued in the name of [REDACTED] for the reason that [REDACTED] already had a cleaning shop and it was, therefore, easier for her to obtain both licenses at once instead of making it necessary for each of them to go to the license bureau.

[REDACTED] was questioned concerning all of her employees and associates in the cleaning shop and she stated that she had operated the business alone, never having had any employees or other assistants. She stated she had been born [REDACTED] and had resided in Los Angeles for the past fourteen years. Agent exhibited the handbill above mentioned to [REDACTED] and she stated that she had worded the handbill and had arranged to have it printed. She was questioned concerning her reason for advertising Gentile management and she stated that she had thought it would help her obtain the trade of the non-Jewish residents in the neighborhood. She stated she had no intention of criticizing the Jews by so advertising. She stated that she noticed that the Jews advertised Kosher products extensively and could see no reason why a Gentile could not advertise Gentile products. However, she stated that she had so many complaints from her Jewish customers immediately after the handbill appeared that she ceased its distribution and never again advertised her shop as being under Gentile management.

[REDACTED] stated that she presently has very many Jewish customers and that she has nothing whatsoever against the Jews and has never spoken against them or distributed any literature criticizing them. She gladly gave Agent specimens of her handwriting which were observed to be in no way similar to the writing on the extortion letter. However, specimens of her handwriting are being forwarded to the Technical Laboratory for comparison with previously submitted specimens. She was questioned concerning her relatives and she advised [REDACTED] is presently a Second Lieutenant in the Los Angeles Police Department. On request, she submitted extensive samples of his handwriting which Agents observed to be similar in many respects to the handwriting on the extortion letter and samples are, therefore, being forwarded to the Technical Laboratory for identification. It was noted that the envelopes that in March of 1941 [REDACTED]

AT LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA.

At the Los Angeles Police Department, Captain [REDACTED] Head of the Homicide Squad, advised that the Los Angeles Police Department maintains no centralized file of extortion letters and other suspected writings; however, he suggested that Agent might obtain some information from Officer [REDACTED] on the Forensic Squad. Officer [REDACTED] also stated that the Police Department maintained no centralized file of suspected writings, but that each extortion or other threatening letter was kept with the papers in the particular case, and it would be impossible to locate all of them; however, he stated that he had a small file of anonymous and "mut" letters which he made available to Agent. The handwriting on only two communications in this file was in any way similar to the handwriting in the extortion letters of this case. Both of these specimens were given to Agent by Officer [REDACTED]

One of these is a penny post card postmarked Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, August 28, 1938, and addressed to the Hollywood Chief of Police. This card is signed by [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] It deals incoherently with the writer's claim to ownership of K.G.K. STUDIOS and other motion picture problems. The card begins, "I am in Pittsburgh pertaining to other affairs." This might indicate that the writer was then a resident of Los Angeles or Hollywood, and was in Pittsburgh on a business trip; however, a search of the indices of the Los Angeles Field Division, the appropriate City Directories, and the Los Angeles County Registrar of Voters, failed to reveal anyone by the name of [REDACTED]

The second communication is an anonymous threatening letter addressed to former Los Angeles Chief of Police, J.E. DAVIS, and signed "CITIZENS VIGILANTE COMMITTEE." This letter is being forwarded to the Technical Laboratory for appropriate examination and comparison.

Photographs of both of these communications are being retained in the files of the Los Angeles Field Division.

Confidential National Defense Informant [REDACTED] stated he had never heard of [REDACTED] but that he would attempt to obtain any information he could concerning his activities in Los Angeles.

Appropriate Los Angeles City Directories were checked in an attempt to locate [REDACTED] believed to be operating a printing shop in Los Angeles. The only two printing shops listed under the name [REDACTED] were [REDACTED] where it was ascertained that [REDACTED] was connected with the shop, and [REDACTED] where it was reported that [REDACTED] PRINTING SHOP had closed some months ago, after being in business at that address for the past five or more years. This would eliminate the possibility that it is [REDACTED] printing shop, inasmuch as he was [REDACTED] in 1939.

A report dated March 11, 1943, entitled UNKNOWN SUBJECT: [REDACTED] INFORMATION: INTERNAL SECURITY, SEDITION (Bureau File #100-185423) was received from the Technical Laboratory indicating that anonymous communications to the Chief of Police, Mobile, Alabama, and the Chief of Police, Savannah, Georgia, had been identified as being in the handwriting of the writer of the extortion letters in instant case. These communications were postmarked January 3, 1943.

A report dated March 27, 1943, was received from the Technical Laboratory which stated that the card addressed to the Jewish Welfare League, Los Angeles, California, mentioned in referenced report was written by the same person who wrote the extortion letters in this case. The report also stated that the handwriting of [REDACTED] was not identical with the questioned writing in this case; however, certain similarities were noted between the suspected handwriting and the handwriting of [REDACTED] presently in the Army.

The laboratory report also indicated that the rubber stamp printing on the slip of paper "Gentiles act. Kick Jew out," mentioned in referenced report appeared to have been prepared with a rubber stamp outfit manufactured by the same concern that manufactured the rubber stamp printing set used to print other specimens contained in this case and related cases; however, a definite conclusion could not be reached as to whether it was the same set due to the fact that the selections are very short and the operator would have a choice of sixty-eight blocks for each letter, both of which factors tend to decrease the possibility of comparing the various items of printings.

[redacted] Re-treat Mental Hospital, Retreat, Pennsylvania, furnished the file of [redacted] at that institution which reflects that he was originally taken into custody at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, on February 24, 1939. At that time he was placed in the Pittsburgh City Home, at Mayview, Pennsylvania, and detained there because of his mental condition. On April 7, 1939, [redacted] was transferred from the Pittsburgh City home to the Retreat Mental Hospital, at Retreat, Pennsylvania. He has remained in custody at the latter institution continuously since this date. [redacted] advised that [redacted] is subject to possessive illusions, and that [redacted] is continually informing people that he is the sole owner of Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer Moving Picture Producing Company, and that he also owns several moving-picture stars such as SILEVY EDDY, MARY PICKFORD, and DOUGLAS FAIRBANKS, Jr. [redacted] is a prolific letter writer, and since his admission to the Retreat Mental Hospital has written letters to NELSON EDDY and to

[REDACTED] various other individuals connected with the moving-picture industry. [REDACTED] stated, however, that these letters have been censored and, as far as he knows, none of them have been mailed from the institution. He advised, however, that it would be possible for [REDACTED] to furnish the letters and stamps to an attendant at the hospital or to friends who visit him and have them mailed outside of the institution, without the authorities having knowledge of the mailing.

[REDACTED] furnished the author of this report five miscellaneous letters which were written by [REDACTED] and which had been retained in [REDACTED] file at the institution. [REDACTED] stated that, to the best of his knowledge, all of these letters were in the handwriting of [REDACTED]. All of these letters are being forwarded with the above mentioned letter, envelope, and postal card to the FBI Laboratory with a request that the handwriting of [REDACTED] be compared with that of the Subject in this case. The specimens of [REDACTED] handwriting furnished by [REDACTED] are being designated as known specimens K-4 to K-11, inclusive.



DETAILS: FBI Laboratory report dated December 1, 1943, disclosed that known specimens of the handwriting of [REDACTED] suspect, were not identical with the handwriting of the unknown subject in this case.

By report dated November 27, 1943, the laboratory advised that a recent anonymous communication had been addressed to EDGAR HOOVER, Chief of the FBI, Washington, D. C., consisting of a small card bearing messages written in red beginning "Kill all Jews."

An additional communication was forwarded to the Bureau by the Honorable Paul F. Hoffman, under date of August 8, 1943.

The handwriting appearing in the above letters was found to be identical with that of the unknown subject in this case.

As previously advised by letter dated August 16, 1943, Special Agent [REDACTED] of this office, examined the handwriting of [REDACTED] samples of which are in the Los Angeles Field Division, and his examination revealed no similarity to the handwriting of subject in instant case.

The files of Local Draft Board 230, 1044 West Jefferson, Los Angeles, as produced by Clerk [REDACTED] disclosed that [REDACTED] and his brother [REDACTED] were released from San Quentin Prison, California, December 7, 1943, and where they were incarcerated during pertinent periods of this investigation. Examination of their handwriting discloses no similarity to the handwriting of unknown subject in instant case.

The handwriting of [REDACTED] another brother, who is presently residing [REDACTED] was examined. It is somewhat similar in many instances with the exception of the letter "T" which is consistently different from the "T" used by unknown subject. Photographic sample of this handwriting, however, was secured and will be forwarded to the FBI Laboratory under separate cover for a definite decision. It should be noted that [REDACTED] has resided in Los Angeles during pertinent periods when unknown subject forwarded pertinent communications from Los Angeles.
