It should be pointed out that there is some similarity in this writing to that of Unknown Subjects, particularly in the way "Los Angeles" is written. It is also noted that [redacted] consistently makes his letter "r" different from Unknown Subject.

It is not necessary to return the original specimens of [redacted] handwriting to the Los Angeles Office and they may be disposed of by the Laboratory.

It is requested that this handwriting be compared with Unknown Subject's handwriting in this case and a laboratory report covering this examination be forwarded to the Los Angeles Office.

Walter Winchell's column in the New York Daily Mirror, dated 4-4-34, contained a paragraph in which reference is made to the fact that gangsters approach farm houses with a faked Government shield, for the purpose of obtaining hoarded gold. Walter Winchell states he received the information from Eddie Cantor and Benny Holzman, of San Remo Apartments, New York City. Benny Holzman states he never furnished Walter Winchell with information relative to persons wearing fake badges for the purpose of obtaining gold.

DETAILS:

On April 4, 1934 the following item appeared in Walter Winchell's column of the New York Daily Mirror:

"The newest of the rackets I am told has a big-time talk about it... Clever gangsters with a glib manner motor up to farm houses in the rural communities with a faked Government shield near the license plates... They call on the master of the shack and produce a receipt which looks important and very, very Washington, D. C.... "We've brought a warrant to search the place for hoarded gold," one remarks, "or a receipt for it. No charges will be made against you if you turn the gold over to the Government without delay. Give us the gold and here's a receipt for same. You take this to the nearest bank and get the equivalent in paper money or silver" ...The ruse has been working smoothly in the past few months..."

Walter Winchell was interviewed concerning the above item, and he advised that he received the information from Eddie Cantor, who resided at the San Remo Apartments, Central Park West, New York City, and that he also received a portion of the information from Benny Holzman, secretary to Eddie Cantor, and that he thought possibly Cantor could elaborate on the information contained in his column.

Agent interviewed Benny Holzman, secretary to Eddie Cantor, at the San Remo Apartments, 145 Central Park West, New York City, and Mr. Holzman stated that Eddie Cantor is at present located at the United Artists Studio, Hollywood, California, at which place he will be for some time, and that he, Mr. Holzman, never spoke to Walter Winchell with regard to any person or persons wearing fake badges or shields for the purpose of obtaining awarded gold.

Agent interviewed **EDDIE CANTOR**, who stated that on March 17th, 1934, he was in the lobby of a hotel in Pittsburgh, name of hotel not recalled, when some person, unknown to him, recognized him; introduced himself and entered into a general conversation with Mr. Cantor. According to Mr. Cantor, the unknown individual stated that the most recent racket in Pennsylvania was gold collecting; that men called upon farmers in the Western part of Pennsylvania, and other persons living in the rural sections of the country, stating that they were Government officers and were about to search

their homes for hoarded gold; that after a short conversation along this nature, the men would agree to let these people voluntarily turn over what gold they had to them and that they thereupon would give these victims receipts with the words "Washington, D. C." as name, and stating they could take these receipts to any bank and get currency in exchange for the face amount thereof. According to Mr. CANTOR, this stranger, whose name he cannot recall, never mentioned the names of any of these impersonators or the names of any victims defrauded by the alleged impersonators, but the conversation was merely general and no further details are known to Mr. Cantor.

With Mr. CANTOR was BENNY HOLZMAN, mentioned in reference report. HOLZMAN stated that he knew nothing about the matter except what he had heard from CANTOR, as just above outlined.

It is desired that this investigation be pursued vigorously in an effort to identify the individual responsible for sending the anonymous communications to Judge RALPH E. JENNEY. A report is to be submitted during the current month so that it will no longer be in a delinquent status.

Numerous specimens were examined, and it was noted that the handwriting of [redacted] is markedly dissimilar to the handwriting appearing in the extortion letter. [redacted] was not available for questioning in view of the fact that he is presently a member of the U. S. Marines and his present whereabouts are unknown.

One of the visitors who came to the Los Angeles County Jail to see [redacted] at the time of his incarceration there, was [redacted]. Investigation disclosed [redacted] to be the sister of [redacted]. Specimens of [redacted] handwriting were obtained. It was also noted that her handwriting was markedly dissimilar to the handwriting appearing in the extortion letter written by subject in the instant investigation.

The reference report indicates that [redacted]

[redacted] visited [redacted] during his incarceration in the Los Angeles County Jail. A specimen of [redacted] handwriting was obtained from the Lockheed Aircraft Company, Burbank, California, and it was noted that her handwriting was markedly dissimilar to the handwriting appearing in the extortion letter.

A handwriting specimen was obtained from [redacted] who stated she was a friend of [redacted] and had gone to the Los Angeles County Jail in order to take care of his laundry. She readily gave a specimen of her handwriting, and it was noted that her handwriting possessed none of the characteristics of the handwriting appearing in the extortion letter.

[redacted] was interviewed, and she advised that she had attended several meetings at [redacted] and further advised that she had been in the Hawaiian Islands for almost two years previous to the date [redacted] was tried in Los Angeles. She stated that not being fully advised as to the charge against [redacted] she had visited him at the Los Angeles County Jail. She gladly gave a specimen of her handwriting, and it was noted that her handwriting possessed none of the characteristics noted in the handwriting appearing in the extortion letter.

Investigation was conducted in an effort to locate [redacted] a visitor of [redacted] at the Los Angeles County Jail; she gave as her address [redacted]. An effort was further made to locate [redacted] a visitor of [redacted] who gave her address as [redacted]. The investigation disclosed that there were no such street numbers as the addresses given by [redacted] and [redacted] and furthermore, although considerable inquiry was made in the neighborhood, both of these individuals were unknown. An examination of the Los Angeles City Directories for 1939, 1940, 1941 and 1942 failed to be of assistance in locating these individuals.

Another visitor of [REDACTED] at the Los Angeles County Jail was [REDACTED]. An in-
quiry was made at this address for information concerning [REDACTED] and it was learned that [REDACTED] had lived at [REDACTED]. Further investigation disclosed the said [REDACTED] to be a friend of [REDACTED] and his neighbors described him as being a "crack pot" and a possible mental case.

An effort is being made at the present time to locate [REDACTED] who moved from [REDACTED] about two years ago. On June 5, 1944, a letter was forwarded to the Los Angeles Post Office, where in an inquiry was made as to the present address of [REDACTED].

On February 25, 1944, a report was received from the Bureau Laboratory wherein it was stated that [REDACTED], a possible suspect, did not write the questioned handwriting contained in instant matter.

Attention is directed to the referenced report of Special Agent [REDACTED] wherein it was reflected that Federal Judge RALPH E. JENNEY received a handwritten anonymous letter dated July 21, 1942, postmarked at Los Angeles, threatening revenge and reprisal against the United States Government for naming "our leader," [REDACTED]. The letter was signed "Avenger Committee." This report indicated that this letter was written by the [REDACTED].

Attention is directed to the fact that Judge RALPH E. JENNEY presided over the trial of these men and sentenced them to prison. At this point it is noted that all persons who visited [redacted] at the County Jail have been investigated, and some names have been found to be fictitious, while the handwriting of others was obtained and was found to be markedly dissimilar to that appearing in the extortion letter. The elimination of [redacted] who visited [redacted] at the jail, brings to a close this phase of the investigation.

Attention is further directed to the referenced report of Special Agent [redacted] wherein it is set forth that the Bureau laboratory identified the writer of the instant extortion letter with the writer of the threatening letters to the Los Angeles Chief of Police, to Mrs. ELEANOR ROOSEVELT, EDGEE CANTOR, and others.

Although the referenced reports reflect an intensive investigation in an effort to locate the writer of the instant extortion letter, these investigative steps have been taken with negative results.

In view of the fact that all logical leads have been covered, this matter is being closed on authority of the Special Agent in Charge.

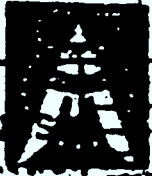

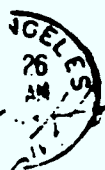

SA O. Collier of the New York office telephoned the Bureau at 12:30 a.m. on the date and advised SA Joseph D. Purvis as follows:

Miss Marylyn Cantor, 29 West 65th street, New York, N.Y., daughter of Eddie Cantor, the radio and motion picture entertainer, telephoned the New York office to report she had received two post cards through the mail on March 13, 1948, from an individual whose name was signed as [REDACTED]

Both cards contained threats to damage her reputation, and the reputation of her father, if the latter did not take his girl friend out of the house at 1852 Broadway, Bronx, N.Y.

Miss Cantor knows no one at [REDACTED] address. She has received several telephone calls lately from a man who "speaks dirty and curses". She cannot give us who the caller might be, but is sure the calls have not been from the prankster friends.

Miss Cantor did not wish to be interviewed last night. She will be interviewed today for details, and the Bureau will be advised.

Information in possession of the New York office indicates [REDACTED] is psychopathic.
