State Teachers College, Indiana, Pennsylvania, in which he encrosed a typewritten notice on plain white notebook paper, unruled, letter size, which he found posted on a bulletin board at the college. The notice is signed in ink by EDWARD ARBEY. It reads as follows:

A LETTER TO ALL STUDENTS AND FACULTY MEMBERS HOLDING DRAFT CARDS:

Tomorrow, the anniversary of Abraham Lincoln's birthday, several thousand American men are going to attempt to emancipate themselves from peacetime conscription by publicly ridding themselves of their draft credentials, either by mailing them to the President or burning them in public bonfires. This sounds like a foolish, crackpot scheme but it's not. It is much worse than that - it is a form of civil disobedience. That's something rather old-fashioned but in times like these, when America's government is diverting the major portion of its expenditures to armaments and our military leaders are trying to fasten permanent peacetime conscription on the nation, then, as Thoreau said, "It is not too soon for an honest man to rebel.

These men are certainly honest and sincere, and they are rebelling, not only against what they consider a violation of personal liberty, but against the slow and deadly drift towards World War III which an international armament race and universal conscription make almost inevitable.





Pennsylvania, in March 1947, made available to the Pittsburgh Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, a typewritten notice on plain white, notebook paper, size 8-1/2" x 11", unruled, which he found posted on a bulletin board at the college.
This notice is signed in ink by EDWARD ABBET, and reads as follows:

A LETTER TO ALL STUDENTS AND FACULTY MEMBERS HOLDING DRAFT CARDS:

Tomorrow, the anniversary of Abraham Lincoln's birthday, several thousand American men are going to attempt to emancipate themselves from peacetime conscription by publicly ridding themselves of their draft credentials, either by mailing them to the President or burning them in public bonfires. This sounds like a foolish, crackpot scheme but it's not. It is much worse than that—it is a form of civil disobedience. That's something rather old-fashioned but in times like these, when America's government is diverting the major portion of its expenditures to armaments and our military leaders are trying to fastem permanent peacetime conscription on the nation, then, as Thorseu said, and it is not too soon for an honest man to rebel.

These men are certainly hobest and sincere, and they are rebelling, not only against what they consider a violation of personal liberty, but against the slow and deadly drift towards World War III which an international armament race and universal conscription make almost inevitable.



The March 11, 1951, issue of the "New Mexico Daily Lobo", a publication at the University of New Mexico, reflects a letter to the editor which is as follows:

WIn this day of the cold war, which every day shows signs of becoming warmer, the individual who finds himself opposed to war is apt to feel very much out of step with his fellow citizens. As an isolated individual he feels desperately inadequate either to check the tide or to make significant contributions which might serve to remove the occasion of wars. He feels, nevertheles the essential wrongness of war and is searching for an alternative.

"On the UNM campus such a group—it includes both students and faculty—has formed to discuss the implications and possibilities of resistance to war. This group has no political or religious affiliations. Although not desiring to create an organization, this group feels the need of informal association. Persons interested in associating with us may get in touch with one of the undersigned."



he demonstrated, as editor of our campus literary magazine, The Thunderbird, a quality of rashness and immaturity which was irritating, to say the least, coming as it did from a man of his intelligence and capabilities. You are in possession of the details, I know, so I shall not repeat them here. I am quite aware that my view of Mr. ABBEY's editorial irresponsibility is what might be termed an "administration" one and that others on the faculty and in the student body may not share it. My own protest concerned the wisdom of his presentation, not his right to the opinion expressed. Students on his staff, I have been told, had displayed sounder and more mature judgment in trying to dissuade him from printing the cover statement. His persistence in pursuing his own somewhat pointless course seemed to me to suggest a





stubborn ego, a taste for shocking the reader, a lack of maturity. I confess to annoyance with the whole affair which leaves my own objectivity in question; certainly I was disappointed in Mr. ABREY's performance as editor.

To me it is of importance principally as it is indicative of instability and poor judgment: Mr. ABBEY may now have outgrown this phase completely.

of it raises an honest doubt in my mind as to Mr. ABBEY's temperamental fitness for the position which he is seeking.

exhibited a copy of the March 1951 issue of "The Thunderbird" which had on the bottom of it the following quotation: "Man Will Never Be Free Until the Last King Is Strangled With the Entrails of the Last Priest." Idvised that he received information that this publication had been printed at the University press and was about to be distributed with an alleged quotation on the front of it that "Man Will Never Be Free Until the Last King Is Strangled with the Entrails of the Last Priest." Stated that this quotation was attributed to LOUISA MAE ALCOTT.

he ascertained that subject was a brilliant individual who had definite possibilities in creative writing and one who was a creditable student at the University of New Mexico. As to why subject did this, he stated that during this particular period in the school year, there was somewhat of a religious crusade at the campus both by the Protestant and the Catholic religions.

Precalled these two crusades were right at the same time. He stated he always thought that this incident was somewhat connected with these crusades and that subject being the individualist that he was, was going his bit to emphasize religion in one manner or another at the time. He also felt that subject was egotistical and that he thought there was nothing particularly wrong with getting his name before the students in this manner.

peace movement started on the campus of the University of New Mexico by a group of individuals who admit they are pacifists and are against war of any type. He stated this group was somewhat started in this venture by a representative of an organization known as the "Fellowship of Reconciliation" which representative came from California. He stated this group worked among students at the University of New Mexico although they did not hold formal meetings on the campus. He stated however, that he knew of no subversive elements that were connected with the group and always considered that they were pacifists who did not believe in war or fighting in any manner whatsoever.

reflected adversely on the loyalty of the subject to the United States. He stated that he exhibited immature judgment in the printing of the quotation on the front of "The Thunderbird". aid that he attributes it to one of those "college kids functions" that usually comes about. He stated that in his opinion, subject used extreme bad judgment.





advised that he was acquainted with subject who was a student at the University of New Mexico in 1950-51.

California, came to the campus of the University of New Mexico as a representative of an organization known as the "Fellowship of Reconciliation." He stated this organization was a pacifist organization and did not believe in war.

stated that subject was interested in the same principles and described him as a pacifist. He stated the organization had a few informal meetings toward the end of the school year and no active organization was formed. He stated that none of the individuals on the campus of the University of New Mexico who were generall associated with Communism, were associated with this organization. He stated that at least he knew of no such individuals.

mentioned the incident in connection with the publication of the March 1951 issue of "The Thunderbird" at the University of New Mexico. He described the incident as one of those things that a young creative writer on a university campus might do at any school. He stated that as far as he knew, subject had no ulterior motive behind the incident whatsoever. He informed that he had no information that would reflect adversely on his loyalty to the United States.

He stated that following his marriage at Albuquerque, New Mexico, it was evident that his individualism might cause a rupture in his marital relations Subject and his wife did not get along too well, he being one who desired to follow his creative writing and she being one who desired a home and association with others explained that subject's wife accompanied him to Scotland but returned four or live months later and secured a divorce in Albuquerque. He stated it was purely incompatability on both their parts.

Concerning subject's loyalty stated that he has no information reflecting adversely on his loyalty to the United States. He mentioned, however, that subject was connected with an incident at the University of New Mexico while subject was editor of "The Thunderbird". He described "The Thunderbird" as a literary publication of the students at the University of New Mexico. He referred to the incident concerning the alleged quotation of LOUISA could figure out concerning this was that subject desired to get his name before the student body and he out the quotation there for that purpose only.

in regard to the incident concerning the campus literary publication "The stated that he was not concerned over this incident might do in campus activities.

He stated that the novel subject wrote was the story of one man who tries to live several lives and consequently fails to achieve any genuine kind of life at all. He stated the theme as expressed by subject is deceptive and betrayal and fraud with variations. DON BRAY teaches high school at Shoshone, California. They moved into the area in about September, 1966. ABBEY lives at the residence with his wife, JUDY. They have no children and their mailing address is P. O. Box 246.

He is employed as a school bus driver for the elementary school at Death Valley, and also serves as maintenance man for the school. He spends a great deal of time working as a free-lance writer on his own. Prior to arriving in Death Valley, ABBEY was employed as a fire lookout at Lassen National Park, California from about June, 1966 to September, 1966. stated that in August, 1966, ABBEY sent a letter requesting employment as a part-time ranger in Death Valley but he was never hired for the job. His wife, JUDY ABBEY, is employed as an elementary teacher at the Death Valley Elementary School.


