[redacted] stated that beginning at noon on Saturday, April 13, 1963, representatives of WSP, FOR, SPU, CNVA, Greenwich Village Peace, and Tompkins Square Peace Councils plan to assemble at Bryant Park, 42nd Street and First Avenue, New York City, from whence they marched in groups across 42nd Street to Hammarskjold Plaza for the peace rally which began at 2:30 p.m.

In addition, [redacted] stated that representatives of [redacted] assembled beginning at noon at [redacted] and 59th Street, New York City, and from there marched in a body to Hammarskjold Plaza, 47th Street and First Avenue, to attend this rally.

[redacted] stated that the principal speaker at the rally was Dr. Homer A. Jack, Executive Director of National Sane, who demanded a nuclear test ban and full disarmament.

In addition to Jack, [redacted] individuals also addressed the rally and expressed the sentiments of Jack:

Dr. Eric Fromm [redacted] described as an author, teacher, and psychoanalyst.

IT IS NOT YET OVER!

ON MAY 13, 1960, 64 PEOPLE WERE HOSED, MAN-HANDLED, AND ARRESTED BY THE SAN FRANCISCO POLICE DEPARTMENT. ON MAY 14TH, FOUR MORE WERE ARRESTED. THEY HAD ALL BEEN ENGAGED IN OPPOSITION TO H.C.U.A. SHORTLY THEREAFTER, 67 OF THE DEFENDANTS WERE FREED BY THE COURTS WITH ALL CHARGES DISMISSED. ONE PERSON, HOWEVER, REMAINS BEFORE THE COURT. WE ARE CONVINCED OF THE INNOCENCE OF ROBERT MEISENBACH, AND ARE DEDICATED TO HIS SUCCESSFUL DEFENSE. FOR THIS, CONSIDERABLE FUNDS ARE NECESSARY. WE ARE CONVINCED THAT ALL PEOPLE WHO SHARE OUR RESPECT FOR AMERICAN JUSTICE WILL WANT TO PARTICIPATE IN THE EFFORTS TO INSURE THAT MEISENBACH RECEIVES THE FULLEST DEFENSE POSSIBLE. WHILE WE ARE CONVINCED OF HIS INNOCENCE, IT IS UP TO THE COURTS TO MAKE THE FINAL DETERMINATION. THEREFORE, URGE ALL WHO ARE CONVINCED OF THE RIGHT OF THE ACCUSED TO HAVE A SUCCESSFUL DEFENSE AND FAIR TRIAL TO CONTRIBUTE TO THIS CAUSE. WE ARE BUT ONE OF MANY GROUPS WHICH HAVE VOLUNTEERED TO RAISE FUNDS FOR THE MEISENBACH DEFENSE, WHICH IS ADMINISTERED AND DIRECTED BY THE BAY AREA STUDENTS' LEGAL AID FUND. The following information is contained in New Haven Office files regarding the George Orwell Forum Yale University:

On 3/14/58, [redacted] advised that according to the minutes of a Young Socialist League, National Administrative Committee meeting on 3/3/58, in New York City, it was reported that sympathizers of the Young Socialist League (YSL) had founded a broad group, the George Orwell Club at Yale University. According to this information, 107 people attended its first meeting and 16 new people joined the Orwell group.

An article appeared in the YALE DAILY NEWS, a daily Yale University campus newspaper, New Haven, Conn., Page 1 and Page 8, entitled "'Puerto Rican Problem' Discussed at Orwell Forum". This article reported that one DAN WAKEFIELD of "The Nation" magazine had addressed a George Orwell Forum (GOF) meeting concerning the "Spanish Harlem" problem in New York City. A photograph accompanied this article which pictured WAKEFIELD with ROBERT A. BONE, Instructor of English at Yale.

On 4/12/58, [redacted] furnished a mimeographed copy of a Young Socialist League (YSL) national communication dated April 1, 1958. This communication reported among other things that at New Haven the morale of the comrades was very high, the GOF had some 25 members and an average attendance of 100 at its meetings. It was reported that there were recruitments prospects among undergraduates but that the best prospect was a senior. It is also

This letter said that the GOF was involved in a protest meeting in defense of BORIS PASTERNAK, the Soviet author. The letter said that it was defending the case of PASTERNAK on the principle of "nonconformity without retaliation".

An article appeared in the YALE DAILY NEWS, issue of 12/5/58, on Page 1, which reported that NORMAN MAILER, an author, would speak before the GOF on the following Monday on the topic "The White Negro". *copy*

On 1/16/59, [redacted], described above, during contact on another matter, advised that the GOF continued activity on the Yale campus during that school year. [redacted] said that ROBERT A. BONE is the faculty man assisting a group called the Yale Student Lecture Committee. [redacted] said that this committee is composed of many students who are or have been members of the GOF and [redacted] commented that BONE is also active in activities of the Orwell group. *b7c*

On 4/7/59, [redacted] Wesleyan University, Middletown, Conn., was contacted. [redacted] is a reliable established source and has requested that her identity be protected. On this occasion [redacted] furnished a pamphlet which announced that the GOF of Yale University would be host for a two-day conference for students from New England colleges, sponsored by a publication called "Dissent". This publication was described as an "independent quarterly of democratic socialist opinion", listing editors such as NORMAN MAILER, ERICH FROMM, NORMAN THOMAS. The GOF was described in this pamphlet as "a Yale undergraduate group which promotes a discussion of democratic socialism on the Yale campus". An article appeared in the YALE DAILY NEWS, issue of 3/22/60, Page 3, announcing that RAYA DUNAYEVSKAYA gave an address the previous evening, sponsored by the GOF, at Yale. The title of the talk was listed as "Must the Afro-Asian Revolutions Go Communist". The article reported that the lecture emphasized her belief that the African *copy*

Revolution did not go Communist but neither did it go Capitalist. The speaker was identified as the former secretary of LEON TROTSKY, who had recently concluded a study of Marxist economics and American democracy.

An article appeared in the YALE DAILY NEWS, issue of 10/4/60, Page 1, announcing that ERICH FROMM would deliver a talk, sponsored by the GOF the following evening. FROMM was described as a noted psychoanalyst and a National Committee man of the Socialist Party-Social Democratic Federation. The title of his talk would be "What is Socialism?".

The above references show all of the information contained in New Haven file concerning captioned group. The organization has not been conclusively identified as a subversive or front club organization. [REDACTED], as above, described the group as "on campus group", composed of Yale undergraduates. b7c

In view of the descriptive information concerning this organization as above, investigation is not recommended at this time in view of the "on campus status" of this Forum. It is felt that investigation of the activities of this organization would have to be conducted almost exclusively on campus of Yale and among the various students and, therefore, would tend to place the Bureau in a potential embarrassing position.

The following is a brief resume of pertinent additional information in Bufiles concerning the sponsors of the Meisenbach Defense Fund:

ROBER NASH BALDWIN

Baldwin, a political reformer, was born in Massachusetts in January, 1884, and received an A.B. degree from Harvard. He served as National Chairman of the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) from 1950 to 1955. Baldwin has been the subject of limited inquiries by the Bureau. A complete investigation of his activities has not been made.

Since October, 1958, Baldwin has come to the attention of the Bureau in connection with ACLU activity. He has been a member of or associated with numerous organizations, many of which have been designated by the Attorney General pursuant to Executive Order 10450. During World War I, he served a prison term for violation of the Selective Service Act. He has been active in directing the ACLU since its inception and has denied association of the ACLU with the Communist Party (CP). (100-49565-70)

ARTHUR KALMER BIERMAN

Bierman is employed as a Professor of Psychology at San Francisco State College. He is one of the leaders and founders of San Franciscans for Academic Freedom in Education, which has been utilized by the CP in its agitation against the House Committee on Un-American Activities (HCUA). (100-432274)

Dukes was born 11-21-94 in Elko, South Carolina. He was considered to be an advocate of communism as early as 1933. He reportedly visited Russia in 1933, and on his return said he was "not so proud of America." During the late 1930's and early 1940's, he was connected with several organizations cited as subversive. He was the subject of a security matter investigation conducted by the Bureau in 1944 based on information that he had addressed a CP meeting in Jackson, Michigan, in September, 1941. Investigation failed to disclose that Dukes was a CP member or that he was active in CP functions. (100-273505)

DR. FRIGL FROMM

Fromm has not been investigated by the Bureau. "Who's Who" of 1958-59 discloses that Fromm was born in Frankfurt, Germany, in 1922. He has practiced psychiatry and lectured at colleges since 1934. In 1943, Fromm was considered as a possible lecturer by the Jefferson School of Social Science (cited by the Attorney General). In 1946, Fromm was friendly with two individuals described by Elizabeth Bentley, self-confessed Soviet espionage courier, as having furnished her information for her Soviet espionage apparatus. (100-391697) *NY*

On 6-2-60, Fromm was elected to the National Committee of the Socialist Party-Socialist Democratic Federation (SP-SDF). In July, 1958, the Independent Socialist League (ISL), a basic revolutionary group was removed from the Attorney General's list and the organization was dissolved. ISL members were invited to join the SP-SDF, and many did join. The SP-SDF has not been the subject of an investigation by the Bureau. (100-429425)

REVEREND FRANCIS GEDDES

"People's World," a west coast communist newspaper, disclosed that Reverend Francis Geddes was one of six clergymen who wrote letters to the "San Francisco Chronicle" on 7-17-59 that were critical of the HCUA. (100-431562) *W.S.*

BS T-1 on November 13, 1965, advised that I. B. ~~TABATA~~, described by an SWP Boston Executive Committee member as a very important African marxist whose writings seem to be Trotskyist in origin, was the featured speaker at a meeting held at the Tremont Street Methodist Church, Boston, on October 31, 1965. Informant advised that TABATA was on tour in support of Dr. NEVILLE ALEXANDER, a Negro South African scholar, and his companions, who had been imprisoned at South Africa for reading marxist literature. Informant further advised that the meeting had been arranged for by the SWP, Boston, and that subject chaired the meeting.

"The Harvard Crimson," an undergraduate newspaper published at Cambridge, Massachusetts, in its November 8, 1965, edition carried an article reporting on the results of the campaign for the City Council in the recent Cambridge elections. The article reported that subject, "a twenty-four year old Boston University student who ran for the Council as a protest against the war in Viet-Nam ran nineteenth out of a field of twenty-four. He polled seventy-seven first place ballots and was eliminated on the first cut."

The "Boston University News," an undergraduate newspaper published at Boston University, in its November 10, 1965, edition carried the following article:

"University Student Join Peace March

"The University Students for Peace (SFP) will join the Nov. 27 Washington march to protest continued escalation of the Vietnam war, according to John Friedberg (CLA '66), president.

"Protestors will call for an end to bombing of North Vietnam, for immediate negotiations, and for a representative government in the South, Friedberg said.

D.E. { "Sponsors of the march include authors Saul Bellow, John Hersey and Arthur Miller; Dr. Benjamin Spock and Prof. H. Stuart Hughes of SANE; Dr. Erich Fromm; entertainers Tony Randall, Ruby Dee and Ossie Davis, and Rabbi Uri Miller.

"Buses will leave Freedom Square in Cambridge at 9 pm Nov. 26. Those who plan to attend should sign up this week at an SFP table in the Union Link.

"SFP passed a resolution opposing 'the danger of militarism and offering to admit all those who oppose militarism, regardless of political beliefs.' The resolution followed a debate on whether the group should admit members of the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA), a Trotskyite group which Friedberg said 'has designs on the peace movement.'

"Friedberg quoted an internal YSA document which said 'YSA is making a turn toward totally integrating itself in the anti-war movement, toward building it and organizing it.'

"The YSAers accused their opponents of red-baiting. Although one member, Gus Horowitz (GRAD) said YSA 'believes the Viet Cong should win, but we don't think the anti-war movement should take this stand publicly.'"

The first source on March 17, 1961, advised that at a meeting of the CP of Illinois State Board recently held in Chicago, Jim West, Executive Secretary of the CP of Illinois, distributed a flyer calling for a 'Conference On Peace, Jobs, and Freedom', issued by the AFSC and six labor officials. The flyer noted that this meeting was to be held on April 14 and 15, 1961. West stated that this is supposed to be strictly a trade union affair. West explained that delegate fees at this Conference are five dollars for those representing an organization and three dollars for individual delegates. He pointed out that individual delegates do not have the right to vote or to be recognized from the floor and that, therefore, all Party members should try to be delegates from their respective unions. West added that there would not be a lot of advertising about this Conference and noted that the Conference would be on television only while it is being held since that is what the trade unions want.

session during the opening session of the conference held on the above date, although they were observed in earnest conversation with various individuals present from time to time. ~~CONFIDENTIAL~~

Following adjournment of the conference until the following day, SAM KUSHNER engaged JAMES WILBURN in conversation during which WILBURN remarked that the speaker of the evening, ERIC ~~FROMM~~ had spoken "over the heads" of the majority of persons present in his analysis and figures concerning the cold war. KUSHNER said this was true, but that FROMM was an intellectual and had given the intellectual approach to the problem. He said that they could probably talk of many weaknesses of the conference, but that one outstanding fact appeared which could not be ignored and that was the fact that the meeting was being held. He said a year ago it would have been impossible to get the people in attendance that evening to come out for a conference on peace and that he felt the mere fact that they were in attendance at the conference in such numbers constituted a major break through for the forces for peace. KUSHNER stated that many weaknesses would undoubtedly show up during the conference, but that concentration should be on the positive aspects of the conference which he felt were far more important. He stated that he had every intention of being in St. Louis on April 29, 1961 to participate in the

A Negro, HILTON HANA, was then introduced. He said he had been sent by PATRICK GORMAN, who could not be present, to read a letter from GORMAN. The letter stated GORMAN was sorry he was unable to attend the conference, but that he agreed with its purposes and wished it all success. 211 N.Y.

BOLLENS then introduced ERICH FROMM as a Psychiatrist From Columbia University who would be speaker for that session.

FROMM stated he was going to talk about the cold war. He then gave a brief historical background of the Soviet Union, stating that up to a certain time officials and representatives of that government worked unceasingly toward world revolution. Then it was decided that conditions in each individual non-socialist country differed greatly and that it would be better to allow each country to choose its own means, related to conditions in that country, to advance its system of government to the ultimate aim of Socialism. He stated at that time State Capitalism had started to develop in Russia and that State Capitalism is the form of government presently existing in Russia rather than Socialism as is believed by many people. He stated that American imperialism was in fact another form

of State Capitalism and that as a matter of practical fact very little difference exists between the current American and Russian forms of government. He stated that both governments aspire to world domination.

He said that both nations were loaded with nuclear weapons. He stated that most people were unable to suppress a feeling of horror whenever they read or heard about human torture carried out in castle dungeons during medieval days, but that such tortures were not comparable to the pain, anguish and terror experienced by the people of Hiroshima and Nagasaki when the American atomic bombs dropped. Such bombs were the equivalent of one thousand tons of TNT. Today's bombs are the equivalent of a million tons of TNT. One dropped over Chicago would kill every living thing within a radius of forty miles.

He said that a statistician named KAHN of Rand Corporation was engaged in preparing figures for the United States Government on the possibility of survival following a nuclear attack on this country. He estimated that, providing fifteen minutes warning was received prior to the dropping of bombs, the nation would escape a single attack with a loss of approximately five million lives. If the attack were to come as a complete surprise, between sixty and ninety million people would die as a result. FROMM said it was his own opinion that even if a fifteen minute warning were received, the vast

majority of the American people would be trampled to death in the rush of the population trying to evacuate the big cities.

FROMM stated that this casual talk of sixty million to ninety million deaths simply had to stop, that the lives of that many people were involved, not just cold figures on a piece of paper. He said that an aroused intelligent people simply would not allow such a holocaust to occur and that our purpose should be the arousing of the people to an awareness of this very real danger and the fearful annihilation which will result if reason is not allowed to prevail.

Then came a question and answer period. A young man, who identified himself as a newspaperman, then asked FROMM what specifically could be done to prevent World War III. FROMM answered that that was why the conference was being held; to work out and put into action specific plans to prevent World War III. Then a man named ROSS, who said he was a member of the Auto Workers' Union at St. Joseph, Michigan, said he had noted FROMM had made quite a point in his speech concerning the Russian desire to dominate the world. He said that there was a clique in Russia which desired greater emphasis on attaining world domination through force and violence, but that KHRUSHCHEV was convinced that the peaceful coexistence road to eventual world Socialism should be followed. He said what he wanted

About 300 students and a hand full of teachers arose and walked toward the doors of the Cathedral.

The negro students did not participate in the walkout, or with few exceptions, in the subsequent demonstrations on campus and in Morningside Park. They have maintained a policy of separatism throughout the protest often declining to join the SDS led demonstrations.

A confidential source at South Bend, Indiana, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on November 9, 1965, that the October 29, 1965, issue of the University of Notre Dame "Scholastic" in an article entitled "Notre Dame Profs in SANE March," stated, in part, as follows:

"No draft cards will be burned, no laws disobeyed, no troop trains halted, but after the March on Washington for Peace in Vietnam, Americans will find it harder to avoid the moral contradictions of the war in Vietnam. Such is the feeling of the March's sponsor, The National Committee for a Sane Nuclear Policy (SANE); and two Notre Dame faculty participants, Mr. Joseph M. Duffy, Jr., a Professor of English, and Reverend Peter Riga, Professor of Theology.

"The faculty members joined a host of prominent individuals--among them Saul Bellow, James Farmer, and Doctors Erich Fromm and Benjamin Spock--last week in Washington for a special March Committee press conference. Committee members announced that the March, 'completely peaceful and legal in execution and creative and affirmative in tone' will step off November 27.....The March will begin at 11:00 AM in front of the White House culminating that afternoon in an outdoor meeting beneath the Washington Monument.
