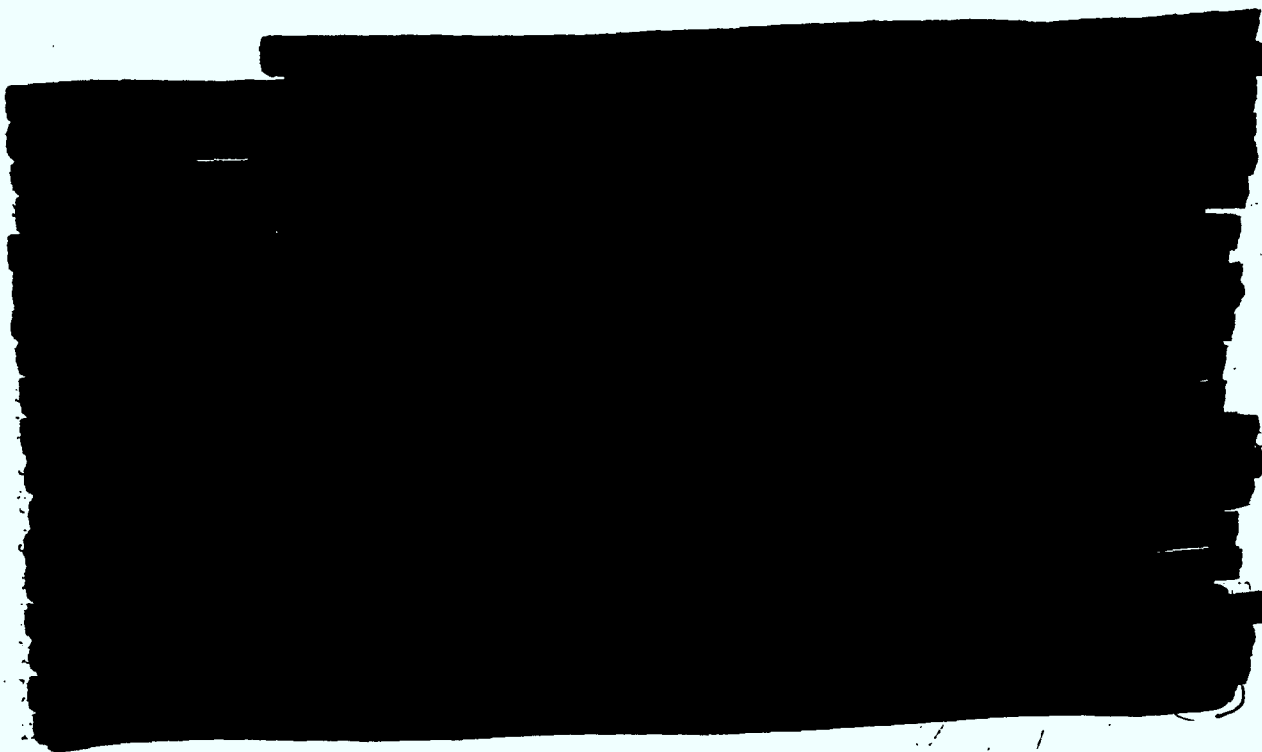

Reference is made to my memorandum dated 4-19-68, captioned as above containing a resume of pertinent information in Bureau files concerning Senator McCarthy. The Director has noted that the previous memorandum did not set forth information to the effect that a communist has exerted influence on Senator McCarthy to enter the 1968 Presidential primaries.



The project on the McCarthy summary was started on Friday afternoon on April 19th on an expedite deadline. The research material maintained in the Crime Research Section for just such occasions and summary-type projects was immediately searched. This includes the materials containing a current

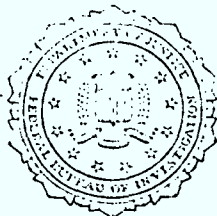

My remarks were not directed to Mr. Hoover particularly, but rather concerned my view regarding the function of the police and secret agencies. It is my judgment that in a democracy those agencies having such powers ought not to be kept under the control of one man in successive administrations to the point where the agency becomes more or less beyond executive and congressional control. This is, as you know, our present national policy with respect to generals of the Army.

SAC Fred A. Frohbose of Miami called at 11:15 a.m. today, 5-18-68, and advised that the front page of "The Miami News" carried a four-column headline story of Senator McCarthy's speech in Miami last night which was entitled, "Gene Assails U. S. Policy, CIA, and FBI." Frohbose advised that the headline was almost the complete story in that the references referred to were fairly well buried in the story. He said that McCarthy was quoted as saying that when he gets into office he will straighten out the CIA, the FBI and draft boss Hershey. No mention was made of the Director in the story. McCarthy's remarks are very similar to his previous criticism in an earlier political speech a few weeks ago.

Frohbose advised that he is sending in a clipping of the story.

## THE AWESOME PYTHON

# Kennedy vs. McCarthy

## TV Meeting Produces No Real Clashes, Underlines Disagreement With Johnson

SAN FRANCISCO June 1 — Sens. Eugene J. McCarthy and Robert F. Kennedy joined in a polite one-hour television discussion tonight that illuminated much more of their areas of agreement than the differences between them.

The eagerly awaited confrontation of the two Democratic presidential candidates produced no real clashes and, in the view of the newsmen who watched, no clear-cut victory.

Instead, it underlined each man's disagreement with the policies of the Johnson Administration on urban problems and emphasized their common view that the American bargaining position at the Vietnam peace talks in Paris is too rigid.

Kennedy accused McCarthy of advocating a "forced coalition government in Saigon—but McCarthy said he was only suggesting that the U.S. Government should not reject a coalition regime, as Kennedy himself had said.

After a discussion that ranged from Vietnam to fiscal policy to the problems of the ghetto and crime, each man was invited to state his claim to the Presidency.

Kennedy, responding first, cited his work on problems of peace, of racial relations and of law enforcement as Attorney General and chief adviser to President John F. Kennedy. He said:

"I believe there is something I can contribute to the cause of peace in Vietnam and peace at home."

He concluded with the statement that whatever happens to him in next Tuesday's California pri-

mary showdown with McCarthy, "I am going to dedicate myself to the betterment of my country and its people."

McCarthy offered his 20 years in Congress—including service on what he called "every critical committee"—as an offset to Kennedy's Executive Branch experience. Then he referred to his pioneering role as the first Democrat to challenge President Johnson and the foreign policy of the Administration in this year's campaign.

"I think this year I saw what the country needs," McCarthy said, "and there is something to be said for a President who can see in advance what the country needs, especially when that is in the area of good and justice."

After the confrontation ended and the candidates were leaving the San Francisco television studio, McCarthy described the encounter as "kind of a no-decision bout with three referees and 16-ounce gloves."

Asked if he wanted a rematch, McCarthy said, "No, we'd get tired of each other."

Kennedy said only that the discussion provided "an opportunity to talk about some things that concerned me."

The format consisted of three American Broadcasting Co. correspondents questioning each candidate in turn. Each candidate was permitted to comment on his opponent's answer.

ABC Correspondent Frank Reynolds said the format was worked out during consultations with representatives of both candidates. McCarthy's national campaign director, Blair Clark, said he had preferred a format that would have provided

ed a "maximum of direct exchange."

The ABC network carried the show to 183 television stations and 825 radio stations.

Occasionally, McCarthy and Kennedy broke away from the prescribed format to speak directly to each other.

In one such exchange, Kennedy complained that a McCarthy newspaper advertisement—which asserted that he (Kennedy) bore some responsibility for the intervention in Vietnam—was a "distortion of the record."

McCarthy said he had ordered the ad canceled. "I think you (Kennedy) had some reason to be" upset, he said.

The two men also expressed differing emphases on whether housing and job programs should be concentrated on helping Negroes in the ghetto or on moving them closer to the school and job opportunities of the suburbs.

McCarthy said that programs aimed only at improving the ghetto result in a "practical apartheid" policy. "We need to get a distribution of the races throughout our society."

Kennedy replied: "I'm all in favor of moving people out of the ghetto."

But he said that "we have to face the fact that a lot of these people are there and we have to do something for them there."

At another point, Kennedy refused to join McCarthy in the latter's insistence that FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover and Secretary of State Dean Rusk be removed from their positions.

Kennedy said he did not want to "deal in personalities." However, he said that he disagreed so much with Rusk's policies that if he were President, "I doubt very much he (Rusk) would want to remain."

...a coalition government should be formed "even before we begin the negotiations."

"I would make it quite clear that we are going to the negotiating table not with the idea that we want them to unconditionally surrender..." Kennedy added.

But McCarthy broke in, "I didn't say I was going to force a coalition government over South Vietnam."

"I said we should make sure we are willing to accept that if the South Vietnamese want to continue the fighting," McCarthy added.

Both men rejected a newsman's suggestion that their criticisms of U.S. policy in Vietnam would encourage the North Vietnamese to think they would fare better if one of them were President.

Speaking about American commitments elsewhere—in Asia, Kennedy said it would be "far more advisable" to meet a new Korean conflict through the United Nations than through unilateral action.

McCarthy said the U.S. had clear obligations to defend Korea, Taiwan, Japan and India. But in the rest of Southeast Asia, he said, "we have a very limited commitment which we must balance against our commitments in other parts of the world... I don't think we have a legal or moral commitment to do what we're doing in Vietnam."

Kennedy agreed and said he would draw a sharp distinction between cases of external aggression against governments with popular support and a murky internal quarrel like "some turmoil in northeast Thailand."

"I don't think we can be the policeman of the world and settle every dispute with American arms," Kennedy said.

Both Senators expressed support for Israel and agreed the U.S. should send jet fighters to that country to offset Soviet aid to Arab countries.

Turning to domestic issues, both Senators advocated Federal funds and training programs to help local police cope with riots.

But both emphasized their belief that law and order can

be guaranteed only if progress is made in meeting the grievances of ghetto dwellers.

Kennedy said that the poor should be guaranteed jobs by using the Government as "employer of last resort," adding that the country must "get away from the welfare system as far as possible."

McCarthy spoke of "a new Bill of Rights"—keyed to a housing program of a million units a year—so that ghetto dwellers can be assured that "in two years, or three years, or five years, you'll be set free from these conditions."

Kennedy expressed skepticism that the housing programs McCarthy was advocating would "be any more satisfactory" than those of the past.

That produced the discussion over whether Federal programs should aim at improving ghetto conditions or moving Negroes out of the ghetto.

They quickly found themselves in argument again, that the President's 10 per cent tax surcharge was too big a bite for present economic circumstances. Arguing for thorough tax reform to close existing loopholes, Kennedy said, "I'd take a tax hike, but 10 per cent is too high and too hard on middle-income families."

McCarthy said he favors a tax surcharge of only "6 to 8 per cent."

The argument over Rusk and Hoover came up when Kennedy was asked about newspaper reports that as Attorney General, he had approved an FBI wiretap on the telephone of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

He said that under law, "I had authority to wiretap in cases where the FBI felt national security of the United States might be involved."

Kennedy said he had never discussed individual cases but wanted to affirm his view that "Martin Luther King" was a loyal, dedicated American who made a great contribution to his country."

McCarthy did not press him for a direct answer, but he said the wiretapping report was evidence that Hoover had been FBI director

too long and ought to be retired.

Kennedy said he had had "my differences" with Hoover, but declined again to discuss personalities in Government. He took the same position when asked about McCarthy's demand that Rusk be removed as Secretary of State.

Calling Rusk a "very dedicated American," Kennedy said, "I happen to disagree with the policies he's espousing... but he's entitled to his opinion."

On May 27, 1968, Walker, who resides at 875A Clayton Street, San Francisco, telephonically advised he was gathering information which led him to believe Senator Eugene McCarthy was a Communist and was making a statement to this office to protect himself against a libel suit.

On May 28, 1968, Walker came to the San Francisco Office and furnished a copy of letters he had written concerning McCarthy to the Los Angeles Times. He stated the San Francisco Examiner had refused to print his articles.

Walker stated he was a medical doctor at Kaiser Medical Center and appeared to be about 55 years old.

On May 29, 1968, he telephonically advised that McCarthy had won in Oregon and apparently feared that McCarthy would win the Presidency. He stated that he "had in mind to assassinate McCarthy" but did not believe he "had the guts." He also indicated he had mailed out the above-mentioned letter to a number of newspapers in California and that he had a history of psychiatric treatment but had been cleared by his psychiatrist. He said he was going to check with his psychiatrist again.

Special Agent Larry Newman, U. S. Secret Service, San Francisco, was advised at 2:15 p.m., May 29, 1968, by Special Agent Gary N. Mavity of the San Francisco Office of the FBI of above information and he stated that his agency would have no jurisdiction in this matter.

Lieutenant Barnaby O'Leary, General Works Detail, San Francisco Police Department, was advised at 2:30 p.m. of the above information and stated that inasmuch as Senator McCarthy is due to arrive in California at any moment prior to next Tuesday's primary election, his department would immediately institute investigation.

Attached is a copy of Walker's two letters to the Los Angeles Times.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

The following may be of use to your readers in considering whether to vote for Senator Eugene McCarthy.

A brochure available from McCarthy for President headquarters in San Francisco refers to the Senator as "a former professor, a world renowned authority on economics". According to "Who's Who in America", he has no more advanced degree than that of Master of Arts. He was a professor for two years (1940-1942), not of economics but of "economic education", at a university I am not sure I have heard of. As to his being a "world renowned authority on economics", I asked a university professor of economics whether Senator McCarthy was an economist, to which he answered in substance that the Senator was not known to him as an economist, but as a sociologist or some similar term.

Also available from McCarthy for President headquarters in San Francisco was a mimeographed essay entitled "The Record is Clean ---- The 'Facts' are Dirty", which seems to consist of a refutation of an advertisement published in a number of college newspapers, concerning Senator McCarthy's voting record versus that of Senator Robert Kennedy.

According to this mimeographed essay, the "Kennedy campaign" bought full page advertisements in "over 2,000" college and university newspapers in which Senator McCarthy's voting record was said to be exposed. According to the Gourman Report for 1967, there are 1167 accredited colleges and universities in the United States. One of the "lieutenants" at McCarthy headquarters in San Francisco to whom I spoke about the mimeographed essay apparently did not know whether all the advertisements were bought, or some donated; nor whether they were actually all ~~1/2~~ full page. On May 22 in San Francisco, Senator McCarthy, as I recall from hearing him speak, said that Senator Robert Kennedy had not repudiated the advertisements, whereas according to the "lieutenant", Senator Kennedy had essentially repudiated the advertisements in early May, 1968. Further, the advertisements apparently were not placed by the "Kennedy campaign", but by an acknowledgedly independent group of supporters of Senator Kennedy. This mimeographed essay was apparently still being distributed by McCarthy for President headquarters on May 22.

Like a rather stupid sheep, I followed the McCarthy procession ~~from~~ in San Francisco on May 22, 1968, from Macedonia Baptist Church in a negro district of San Francisco to the Cow Palace in Daly City. At Macedonia, after the singing of a stanza from "The Battle Hymn of the Republic", there was syrup about an "income floor" and medical care for all: perhaps laudable goals, but also useful in getting votes. I would estimate that the auditorium at Macedonia

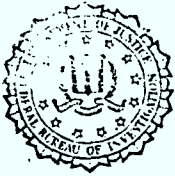

Copies of this memorandum are being disseminated locally to the Army, Navy, Air Force, U. S. Secret Service, San Francisco, and the U. S. Attorney, San Francisco.

[REDACTED] that at 1:11 a.m. on June 5, 1968, one David R. Major, Negro, born December 11, 1949, who resides at 422 Belvedere Street, San Francisco, was arrested for violation of Section 448A of the California Penal Code, arson, and for violation of Section 1291B of the Municipal Penal Code, illegal knife.

[REDACTED] on June 5, 1968, [REDACTED] heard glass breaking. [REDACTED] observed two men running from the vicinity where the noise of the breaking glass was heard. One David R. Major was apprehended and returned to the 1300 block of Fillmore Street. At 1336 Fillmore Street it was observed that a metal trash can was apparently thrown through the plate glass window of a store that was being used by the McCarthy for President Headquarters at that location. In addition, two Molotov cocktails were observed inside burning. Units of the San Francisco, California Fire Department succeeded in extinguishing the blaze. Major had the smell of gas on his hands and either could not or would not explain the origin of this gasoline odor.

During investigation, a carload of six individuals dressed in berets with dark leather jackets and black pants appeared on the scene. This uniform is the uniform of the Black Panther Party (BPP).

A characterization of the BPP, which was formerly known as the Black Panther Party for Self Defense, is contained in the appendix.

One individual in the automobile was carrying a billy club. He was identified as Rene Shepherd. Rene Shepherd was placed under arrest for possession of a billy club, Section 12020 of the Municipal Penal Code.

A source advised June 5, 1968, that David Major on May 24, 1968, who listed his residence as 422 Belvedere Street, San Francisco, visited Huey P. Newton at the Alameda County Jail and listed himself as a "brother".

A second source advised that Rene Shepherd is Branch Captain of the Potrero Hill District branch of the BPP, San Francisco, California.

A source advised that the Black Panther Party for Self Defense (BPPSD) was formed by HUEY PERCY NEWTON, Minister of Defense, and BOBBY GEORGE SEALE, Chairman, in December, 1966, as a militant black nationalist political organization to combat "police brutality," to unite militant black youth, and to determine the destiny of black communities. The political philosophy was taken from writings of Chairman MAO Tse-tung of Communist China and black militant writers.

In March, 1968, the name of the organization was changed to Black Panther Party (BPP).

The official BPP publication, "The Black Panther Party - Black Community News Service," states that the BPP advocates use of guns and guerrilla tactics in their violent revolutionary program to end oppression of black people.

On February 17, 1968, ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, Minister of Information, announced merger of the BPP and Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) and bestowed title of Minister of Justice, BPP, upon H. RAP BROWN, Chairman of SNCC.

SNCC is a militant Negro organization which preaches black supremacy.

NEWTON, aforementioned, is incarcerated in the Alameda County Jail, Oakland, California, awaiting trial on charge of murder of an Oakland police officer.

Headquarters of BPP and Huey P. Newton Defense Fund are located at 4421 Grove Street, Oakland, California.

Special Agent John Durak, General Telephone Company, Santa Monica, California, telephonically advised the Los Angeles Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) at 11:45 P.M. on June 6, 1968, of the following:

At 11:00 P.M., June 6, 1968, a telephone operator of the General Telephone Company at Long Beach, California, received a call from an unidentified male voice which stated, "Both McCarthy and President Johnson will be dead tomorrow." The caller then hung up without saying anything further.

Durak advised that the telephone operator was able to arrange for a trace of the call, and it was established at 11:40 P.M. on June 6, 1968, that the call had been made from telephone number 426-2967, which is listed to Charles and Tina Jensen, 2327 Delta, Long Beach, California.

Durak further advised that he had furnished the above information to Captain Platt, Long Beach Police Department, Long Beach, California, immediately upon receipt of information from the operator.

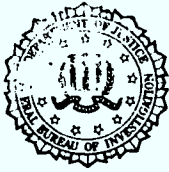

At 11:30 p.m. on June 9, 1968, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] called the Albuquerque Office of the FBI to advise that a threat had been made to the life of Senator Eugene McCarthy. This threat came in the form of a message written on a picture post card of the Downtowner Motor Inn, Albuquerque, New Mexico. This message, in blue ballpoint pen, printed in bold letters, reads as follows:

"YOU NEXT MCARTHY  
BULLETS FOR YOU  
LIKE KENNEDY  
YOU ROTTON S.O.B."

This card was apparently slipped under the door of the McCarthy Campaign Headquarters, Albuquerque, at 215 Central, N.W. The card was discovered by Mrs. E. Ferguson, who opened the Campaign Headquarters at about 9:00 a.m., June 9, 1968. She showed it to about six other volunteer workers who arrived later in the day, all of whom handled it and one of whom tore it into six pieces. Mrs. Ferguson stated they delayed in providing this information to the Albuquerque Police Department because they did not feel it was worth being made an issue.

This information was provided to Mr. Arthur W. Blake, Special Agent in Charge of the United States Secret Service Office in Albuquerque, at 9:00 a.m. on June 10, 1968.

At the same time a call was placed to the Bernalillo County Sheriff's Office and information was provided to Secretary Lisa Holguin.

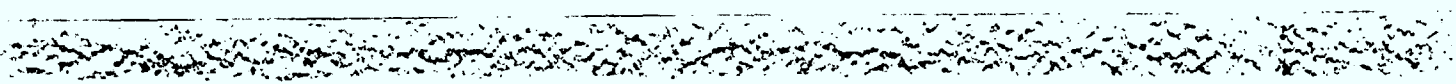

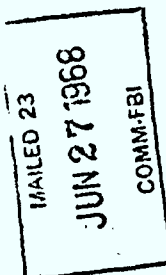

Captioned debate was televised nationally and heard locally through WMAL-TV, Channel 7, at 9:30 p.m. on 6-1-68. Excerpts from this program were published in "The New York Times" of 6-3-68 and are attached herewith. The following is not included in this material and is of interest to the Bureau:

In response to a question, Senator McCarthy commented that he felt FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover had held the position of Director of the FBI for too long a period of time and should be replaced. Senator Kennedy indicated that while he may have had a few differences with the Director at the time he, Kennedy, served as Attorney General, he was not at this time going to play into the hands of those who were attempting to embarrass him politically. He said he would not discuss which individuals he would or would not keep in office should he succeed in his efforts to be elected President.

At another point in the program, Senator Kennedy was asked if he could comment on the matter of wire taps and the late Reverend Martin Luther King, Jr., which had been raised by columnist Drew Pearson. Kennedy's vague answer mentioned the history of wire taps as a tool to protect our Nation's security and noted that the Attorney General had received original authority to authorize wire taps when President Roosevelt was in office. Kennedy said that he had never authorized "bugging"; however, he had, on a limited basis, authorized certain wire taps. He then noted that it would not be proper for him to discuss those individual cases in which he had authorized the placing of

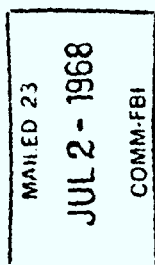

On June 27, 1968, CV T-1 advised that TED DOSTAL would lead the Cleveland chapter of Youth Against War and Fascism (YAWF) in a demonstration at the Cleveland City Hall at 6:30 PM on July 1, 1968. The source stated that this demonstration would be for the purpose of protesting the Cleveland appearance of Vice-President HUBERT H. HUMPHREY because of the latter's adherence to and support of the United States policy with respect to Vietnam.

On September 4, 1966, CV T-2 identified TED DOSTAL as a member of the National Committee of the Workers World Party (WWP).

Characterizations of both the WWP and the YAWF are contained in the Appendix section of this memorandum.

On June 28, 1968, CV T-3 advised that members of the Cleveland chapters of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) and Young Socialist Alliance (YSA) would also participate in the demonstration against Vice-President HUMPHREY on July 1, 1968.

The SWP has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

A characterization of the YSA is contained in the Appendix section of this memorandum.

On July 1, 1968, "The Plain Dealer", local daily newspaper in Cleveland, Ohio, carried an article in which Reverend CHARLES RAWLINGS, chairman of a group known as Clergy and Laymen Concerned About Vietnam, stated that his organization would also demonstrate against the Vice-President during his visit to Cleveland.

Between 6:30 PM and 8:00 PM on July 1, 1968, Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) observed approximately fifty-five (55) persons participating in a picket line at the corner of Lakeside Avenue and East 6th Street opposite the Cleveland City Hall. The demonstrators carried placards bearing slogans opposing the war in Vietnam and Vice-President HUMPHREY's support of this war. The picket line marched in an orderly manner and no incidents were observed. At one point during the demonstration, TED DOSTAL attempted to cross Lakeside Avenue en route to the City Hall, but was restrained from doing so by uniformed officers of the Cleveland Police Department. At the conclusion of the demonstration a representative of the Cleveland Police Department advised that no arrests had been made by his department.

Between 9:30 AM and 10:00 AM on July 2, 1968, a Special Agent of the FBI observed a group of approximately 15 teen-agers demonstrating at the intersection of Lorain Avenue and West 45th Street at the time the Vice-President and his party were visiting the Spanish-American Committee for a Better Community, 4500 Lorain Avenue. The demonstrators were gathered in a small group on Lorain Avenue and were carrying a crudely made paper banner approximately 10 feet long. The banner bore a hand-lettered slogan opposing Vice-President HUMPHREY. At the bottom of the banner was the hand-printed inscription "West Side Kids Against HUMPHREY." Several older youths were observed circulating among the onlookers and distributing a one-page mimeographed flyer, the contents of which are set forth verbatim below:

No incidents were observed in the vicinity of West 45th Street and Lorain Avenue, and a representative of the Cleveland Police Department advised that his department made no arrests at that location.

During the noon period on July 2, 1968, the Vice-President returned to the Cleveland-Sheraton Hotel on Cleveland's Public Square. At 11:45 AM on July 2, 1968, Special Agents of the FBI observed a group of demonstrators gathering on Superior Avenue adjacent to the northwest quadrant of Public Square. At approximately 12:00 noon the entire group, numbering an estimated two hundred twenty-five (225) persons, marched across Superior Avenue and initiated a picket line in front of the Superior Avenue entrance to the Cleveland-Sheraton Hotel. Most of the demonstrators carried placards which were critical of the Vice-President, the role of the United States in Vietnam, the poverty program and President LYNDON B. JOHNSON. One group of three demonstrators, including CAROL MC ELDOWNEY, carried a paper banner approximately 10 feet in length which bore the following inscription: "HHH Equals War, Poverty and Bullshit."

A letter from the Ohio Peace Action Council (OPAC), 66 East 15th Street, Columbus, Ohio, which was widely disseminated in February, 1968, listed CAROL MC ELDOWNEY as one of the speakers available through the OPAC. The letter described MC ELDOWNEY as a recent visitor to North Vietnam and as a "former national officer of Students for a Democratic Society (SDS).

A characterization of the SDS is contained in the Appendix section of this memorandum.

During the demonstration leaflets captioned "Warmakers Don't Make Good Presidents" were distributed to passing pedestrians. A verbatim transcript of one of these leaflets is set forth below:

The demonstration terminated at 1:00 PM when the demonstrators voluntarily dispersed. No incidents were observed during the course of the demonstration and, at its conclusion, a representative of the Cleveland Police Department advised that his department had made no arrests during this activity.

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

The Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. The SDS is an association of young people on the left and has a current program of protesting the draft, promoting a campaign for youth to develop conscientious objector status, denouncing United States intervention in the war in Vietnam and to "radically transform" the university community, and provide for its complete control by students. Gus Hall, General Secretary, Communist Party, USA, when interviewed by a representative of United Press International in San Francisco, California, on May 14, 1965, described the SDS as a part of the "responsible left" which the Party has "going for us." At the June, 1965, SDS National Convention, an anti-communist provision was removed from the SDS constitution. In the October 7, 1966, issue of "New Left Notes," the official publication of SDS, an SDS spokesman stated that there are some communists in SDS and they are welcome. The national headquarters of this organization as of April 18, 1967, was located in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois.

WORKERS WORLD PARTY

On April 17, 1959, a source advised that on February 12, 1959, a Socialist Workers Party (SWP) minority group under the leadership of National Committee member Sam Ballan split from the SWP.

The source stated that this minority group, referred to as the Marcyites, after many years of program and policy differences on varied issues concerning tactics and interpretation of political events, split from the SWP on the grounds that the Party was liquidating itself by departing from the Marxist precepts of Leon Trotsky and retreating from the fight for the world socialist revolution. The final issue which ultimately forced the split was the minority's opposition to the SWP regroupment policy which involved cooperation with the Communist Party (CP) periphery individuals characterized by the minority as petty-bourgeois.

The minority program, according to source, advocates unconditional defense of the Soviet Union and has as its goal the building of a revolutionary party with a complete proletarian orientation for the purpose of overthrowing capitalism in the United States and throughout the world.

On May 12, 1960, the source advised that this minority group had chosen the name Workers World Party.

On May 1, 1967, a second source advised that the Workers World Party, which maintains headquarters at 46 West 21st Street, New York City, supports the People's Republic of China in its ideological dispute with the Soviet Union.

The SWP and the CP have been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

Source related that its activities are aimed toward youth on college campuses and that it claims to be independent of the SWP. It has approximately 28 members.

At approximately 4:25 a.m. on 6-5-68, SA W. Leon Smith, Duty Agent in Domestic Intelligence Division, telephonically advised SA Bowers of the then available information concerning the shooting of Senator Robert Kennedy. Smith also advised that Miss Jean Stack, personal secretary to Senator McCarthy, had called Bureau Headquarters from Los Angeles a short time earlier seeking to contact Bowers.

After advising you (Mr. Bishop) of the foregoing information, Bowers telephonically contacted Miss Stack at telephone number 213 274-2555 in Los Angeles. Miss Stack stated the Senator had instructed her to contact the FBI and she wanted to know what action they should take. Bowers advised her we are in no position to offer advice regarding the safety of the Senator. She was reminded that she had been told when contacted concerning a procedure to handle threats against the Senator on 3-25-68, that the FBI has no authority to provide protection. She was told she would have to rely on local authorities for protection. She then asked who could check the plane on which Senator McCarthy would be flying back to Washington later in the day. She was told this too would have to be taken up with local authorities.

Miss Stack was informed that we have kept her promptly advised of any information we have received concerning threats to Senator McCarthy and she was assured that we would continue to do so. She was told that should she have any reason to promptly contact the FBI she could do so by calling our Los Angeles Office. Miss Stack indicated Senator McCarthy would be returning to Washington later in the day.

The Los Angeles Office was alerted to the possibility that Miss Stack may contact that office.

## STATE RECOVERS TWO UNION FUNDS

### \$4.2-Million Had Been Placed Out of Jurisdiction

By EMMANUEL PERIMUTTER  
Governor Rockefeller announced yesterday that the State Insurance Department had recovered two union welfare funds totaling \$4.2-million that an ex-employee trustee had placed in negotiations he controlled in Liberia and Puerto Rico.

Mr. Rockefeller said that by returning the funds to New York jurisdiction in the interests of 9,000 members of Teamster Local 815 and of the Independent Allied Trades Council would be protected by the state. The ex-employee unions represent workers in pharmaceutical and cosmetics factories.

George Barasch, the employee trustee, had been an officer of the two unions as well as trustee of the funds. At present, he is associated with Churchill Associates, which administers the two funds. The Churchill office is at 1220 Plaza Road, Fair Lawn, N. J., in the same office as the two unions.

Took the Fifth 200 Times

In the summer of 1965, Mr. Barasch took the Fifth Amendment almost 200 times in refusing to testify before the Senate Investigating Subcommittee about the funds. In 1963, a Federal grand jury in Manhattan investigated the funds unsuccessfully.

Mr. Rockefeller passed the State Insurance Department for recovering the \$4.2-million, which, he said, "had been removed out of reach of effective supervision."

The money was returned here after nine months of negotiations between George K. Bernstein, deputy superintendent and general counsel for the Insurance Department, and lawyers for Mr. Barasch.

The history of the welfare funds has been complex and legally tangled. The joint union-employer money was first placed in the Allied Trades Council Welfare Fund and the New York Affiliated Fund, where they were commingled. These funds were succeeded by the Allied Welfare Fund.

#### Funds Placed Out of State

Then the money was placed in the custody of the Crockett Research Foundation, Inc., a corporation chartered in Monrovia, Liberia, and the Crockett Research Foundation of Statute, P.R., both listed as charity units. The two foundations were out of the jurisdiction of the State Insurance Department.

There was nothing illegal about the transfers of the money, which took place in 1960, before the insurance department received the power to supervise welfare funds and to prohibit transfers out of the department's jurisdiction.

If Mr. Barasch, who was 57 years old last December, retires from membership in the unions, he is eligible for pensions of about \$33,000 a year for his services as a past officer. A spokesman for him said yesterday that Mr. Barasch had not retired and that the salary he receives from Churchill Associates "is much less than he can get from the unions."

Mr. Barasch has also resigned as employee-trustee of the Union Mutual Fund, which is the pension fund of the two unions.

Attached hereto is a clipping from the 6/2/66 edition of the "New York Times" reflecting that the New York State Insurance Department had "recovered" union welfare funds of Local 815 of the International Brotherhood of Teamsters.

The article reflects that GEORGE BARASCH had control of these funds and administered them through the Churchill Associates.

BARASCH in 1965, took the Fifth Amendment "almost 200 times" before the Senate Investigation subcommittee when questioned about the funds.

On 7/10/68, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED], who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that while BARASCH resigned as a trustee of the union fund he did maintain control through the Churchill Associates.

According to [REDACTED], BARASCH used the income from these funds for his salary and for "educational purposes". These "educational purposes" consisted holding seminars or small cultural affairs usually at the Americana Hotel, New York City, with a limited number of guests present.

[REDACTED] related that in 1966, after BARASCH had taken the Fifth Amendment as noted above, he (BARASCH) was chairman of a seminar sponsored by the Churchill Associates at which Senator EUGENE J. MC CARTHY (D-Minn.) spoke and for which he was paid a fee of probably \$1,000.00.

Special Agent Anthony Sherman, Secret Service, Los Angeles, California, was advised of the contents of the letter at 3:40 P.M. on June 19, 1968 by Special Agent Leroy W. Sheets of the FBI.

Our investigation in 1963-1964, of George Barasch, former official of Teamsters Local 815 and Allied Trade Council, disclosed he mishandled welfare and pension funds of these unions in an amount over \$4,000,000 and transferred the money to foreign countries, prior to the enactment in 1959 of the Welfare and Pension Plans Disclosure Act, which pertains to such funds. Also, it was revealed Barasch controlled Churchill Associates, a New Jersey organization which administered these welfare and pension funds. In January, 1965, the U. S. Attorney at New York and the Department decided no prosecution could be considered concerning this matter [REDACTED]

In June, 1965, the Senate Committee on Government Operations of which Senator John L. McClellan (D-Ark.) was chairman, conducted hearings regarding this situation. Barasch and others involved in the matter repeatedly refused to testify on the grounds of the Fifth Amendment.

[REDACTED], on 7/10/68, advised our New York Office that Barasch used funds of the Churchill Associates for his salary and for "educational purposes," the latter consisting of small cultural seminars held at New York City. In 1966, Senator Eugene J. McCarthy (D-Minn.) spoke at one of these seminars and was paid a fee, probably in the amount of \$1,000. [REDACTED] considers this as an indiscretion on the part of Senator McCarthy who should have known of the activities of Barasch before a Senate committee.

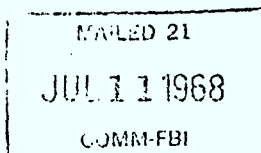
