On July 16, 1968, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] advised the Memphis Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation of the following conversation that he had overheard:

On July 13, 1968, [REDACTED] stated that while at the Starlight Dinner Club in Dickson, Tennessee, he overheard four men conversing and during said conversation he heard the remark that Senator McCarthy will never leave Nashville, Tennessee, alive.

The men also remarked that no party nominee chosen will live to be elected President.

[REDACTED] stated that he recognized one of the men in the group as being a Bob Smith, not further identified.

Other than the above, [REDACTED] could furnish no further information.

Reference is made to a previous communication in this matter captioned as above and dated July 3, 1968, at Seattle, Washington.

On July 11, 1968, [REDACTED] advised that a meeting of the Freedom Socialist Party (FSP) was held in Seattle on July 10, 1968. At this meeting it was learned that JOHN SEVERN would be attending the Washington State Democratic Convention at Tacoma, Washington, on July 13, 1968. He will be attending the convention on Saturday morning with a group from Draft Resistance - Seattle and will attempt to talk the McCARTHY supporters into the "way of thinking" of Draft Resistance - Seattle.

The FSP is characterized in the appendix section.

Draft Resistance - Seattle has been self-described in its own literature in December, 1967, as being an organization which "is instrumental in delaying the induction of from five to ten persons a week. But the situation will soon move beyond individual acts of resistance . . . Demonstrations, fund raising, and educational activity must focus on the most active resistance to American militarism evident in the country today . . ."

On July 11, 1968, [REDACTED] related that contacts with people from Draft Resistance - Seattle and the Seattle Committee to End the War in Vietnam (SCEWV) indicates that the cancellation of the visit of Vice President HUBERT HUMPHREY has resulted in confusion as to the exact plans of both of these groups. According to [REDACTED] the original plans call for picket demonstrations at all convention functions, at the dinner Friday evening, and at a public meeting on Saturday. Also they had planned to rent a loud speaker system to be utilized outside the convention hall.

[REDACTED] advised that it was believed that the picket demonstration would now be largely up to individual protesters and according to [REDACTED], Draft Resistance - Seattle has stated they now have no plans to go to Tacoma as an organized group. Draft Resistance - Seattle, according to [REDACTED], now has no plans for violence or disruptive tactics even in the event Vice President HUMPHREY made an appearance.

On July 12, 1968, [REDACTED] advised that a meeting of some members of the Pierce County Communist Party Section would be held in Tacoma, Washington, on July 13, 1968, in the morning to formulate plans to appear at the site of the Washington State Democratic Party Convention for the purpose of selling literature. According to the source, some individuals would attend this planning meeting from Seattle. No organized plans have been made by this group to form or participate in any type of demonstrations, picket line, or violence.

APPENDIXFREEDOM SOCIALIST PARTY OF WASHINGTON, aka
Freedom Socialist Party (FSP)

In April, 1966, a source advised that the members of the Seattle Branch, Socialist Workers Party (SWP), executed a statement of resignation from the National SWP, dated April 9, 1966, following which they referred to themselves as the Seattle Branch, SWP (Unaffiliated), and temporarily adopted the name Freedom Socialist Party of Washington, aka Freedom Socialist Party (FSP). The group led by RICHARD FRASER, aka Dick Fraser, Richard Kirk, Dick Kirk, formerly a member of the SWP National Committee, and his wife, CLARA FRASER, aka Clara Kaye, Organizer of the Seattle Branch, SWP, were known as the KIRK-KAYE Tendency. Their disagreement with the National SWP was over the questions of the Negro struggle, the colonial revolution, the Vietnamese War, regroupment, women's emancipation, and party organizational principles.

The SWP has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

In July, 1966, this source advised that the above group and others held a convention on July 9, 1966, at their headquarters, Freeway Hall, 3815 Fifth Avenue Northeast, Seattle, Washington, having issued a call to "all signers of the FSP Nominating Petition at the 1964 Nominating Convention and all revolutionary socialists who wished to help build the FSP."

In October, 1964, a second source advised that the name Freedom Socialist Party (FSP) of the State of Washington was used by the Seattle Branch, SWP, in its then current political campaign.

The first source further advised that at the convention on July 9, 1966, the group adopted the name FSP of Washington, and became a membership organization.

In August, 1966, the first source furnished the August 5, 1966, issue of "The Freedom Socialist", self-described as the "Voice of the FSP of Washington." This publication states, "We are a new revolutionary socialism organization," stating that it is comprised of the former Seattle Branch, SWP, "individual independant radicals who were part of the 1964 united socialist electoral coalition which created the FSP," and "A new segment of radical youth who have recently adopted Marxism as their political philosophy."

On February 20, 1967, a third source advised that the current officers of the FSP were elected at a meeting of the FSP on February 5, 1967, and that BOB PATRICK became the Organizer at this meeting.

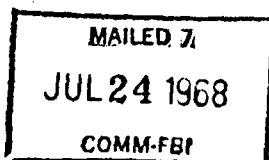

NEW UNIVERSITY CONFERENCE

The July 14, 1968 issue of the "Chicago Sunday Tribune" carried an article on page 18, entitled, "'New Left' Forms Group to Encourage Student Rebellions." The article stated in part as follows:

"Graduate students and young faculty members in leading American universities have founded a new organization to promote revolutionary changes not only in the universities but in the whole social system of this country. It is called the New University conference.

"Robert Ross, a graduate student in sociology at the University of Chicago, is national director of the enterprise. One of its main purposes, he says, is to 'lend organized support to student rebellions.'"

On June 13, 1968, a source who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that Bob Ross was self-described as a founder and former Vice President of Students For a Democratic Society (SDS).

A characterization of SDS appears in the attached appendix.

The article mentioned above continued as follows:

"Discussed by Chaplain.

"Richard Flacks, an assistant professor of sociology at the University of Chicago, asserts in the first issue of the N.U.C. newsletter that the universities, thru their research and training services to government and the corporations, have become closely integrated in the political economy and are 'as indispensable to its functioning as the factory, the bank, and the government.'"

The June 23, 1965, issue of "The Fire Bureaucracy's Voice", an SDS publication, listed Richard Flacks as having been elected as an at large member of the National Council of SDS at the 1965 SDS convention held at Camp Maplehurst, Kewadin, Michigan.

On May 20, 1966, Richard Flacks, Ph. D., Associate Professor of Sociology, University of Chicago, Chicago, during an interview with Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) regarding another matter, advised that he was the leader of SDS at the University of Michigan while attending that institution. Flacks related that since leaving the University of Michigan, he has remained active in SDS, was currently a member of SDS, and had been active in demonstrations on the University of Chicago campus concerning Vietnam and Selective Service System policies.

The article mentioned above continued as follows:

"Alice Widener, a New York writer, reports in her syndicated column that the new movement was discussed at a luncheon given by the Rev. William Sloane Coffin, Jr., chaplain of Yale university, in the Roosevelt hotel in New York City Tuesday, the day before the chaplain was sentenced to five years in prison for his anti-draft activities. Mrs. Widener quoted one of the luncheon guests as saying:

"We're going to take the student movement out of the hands of the undergraduates and put it in the hands of politically sophisticated, better-disciplined graduate students. We have some good ones at Stanford and the University of Chicago. We've brought some good foreign ones in thru Fulbright fellowships."

"Mrs. Widener reported that the guests said that 'phase 1' of the new left revolution was completed with the recent student disruptions, including 'our victory at Columbia,' massive student support of Sen. Eugene J. Mc Carthy in his presidential campaign, and the decision of President Johnson not to seek reelection. Altho they ascribed Johnson's 'abdication' to the Mc Carthy campaign, the young revolutionaries, including two graduate students from Rutgers university, described Mc Carthy as a useful but expendable tool, just a 'throwaway,' Mrs. Widener wrote...

"Schoenbrun Is Speaker.

"David Schoenbrun, former Columbia Broadcasting system correspondent and now a senior lecturer at Columbia university's school of international affairs, was the principal speaker at the Coffin luncheon. He praised 'my friend Ho Chi Minh,' condemned 'American imperialism' and 'immorality,' and called for a coalition with the Communists in South Viet Nam. . .

"Ross was reached by telephone in the San Francisco area, where he had gone to promote the N.U.C. at Berkeley and Stanford. He said the organization is only about six weeks old and already has working groups in the major higher educational centers, including about a dozen graduate students and young faculty members at the University of Chicago.

"'We expect upwards of 1,000 members by fall,' Ross said. 'There will be several regional meetings before the end of the year and a national convention in January or February.'

"Seeks a Dectorate.

"Ross was born in New York City, did his undergraduate work at the University of Michigan, and is a candidate for a doctorate at the University of Chicago. However, he is on a leave of absence while promoting the N.U.C.

"He described the N.U.C. as 'an organization of radical scholars, students, and intellectuals, working to transform the universities and to use them in the movement for social change.'

"'There are a lot of radical graduate students and teaching fellows who are ineffective because they're so isolated,' Ross said. 'They have no stable organization of their own, no way to communicate and act together. Their militance comes from their disgust at the way the universities are run. Of course they also have a deepening critique of society as a whole.'

"Altho the new group will support and provide leadership for student rebellions, it hopes to avoid the ideological arguments and factionalism which have divided the revolutionary Students for a Democratic Society, Ross said.

"Leaflet Is Produced.

"A leaflet introducing the N.U.C. says:

"War overseas and injustice at home are among the defining characteristics of American society, and no institution is free of their stain. This is no less true of the universities, despite their official protestations. Increasingly the giant institutions of the society—government, military, corporations of this society—government, military, corporations, and foundations—call upon the university to supply the experts and expertise of social manipulation and international coercion, and increasingly the university is flattered to comply.

"But if the university as an institution has come to collaborate so intimately with the more vicious tendencies in American life, this is certainly not true of a large part of the university's community. The resistance movement to the war in Viet Nam, the struggle for black liberation, and the radical community organizing projects, for example, led and supported by faculty members, graduate students, and other intellectuals in great numbers."

"The N.U.C. headquarters is at 5810 Woodlawn av.

"The group advocates 'participatory democracy,' a vaguely defined concept which may include participation by students in the administration of a university; participation by workers in the management and profits of a factory..."

The SDS met in the patio at Bachman Hall at 7:30 PM on July 19, 1968. There were more than 50 persons in attendance. The first part of the meeting covered a discussion of the sedition trial in Taiwan of CHEN Yu-hsi, a former East-Western Center Grantee. It was announced that Tim Wong would attempt to journey to Taiwan to observe CHEN's trial on behalf of the SDS. The group also voted to direct a letter to President Lyndon B. Johnson, expressing sympathy for CHEN and asking the aid of the U.S. Government in bringing about his release.

The remainder of the meeting turned into a Eugene McCarthy for President Rally.

Can anyone believe that the present Johnson-Thieu conference is directed toward a peaceful settlement of the war? Are any plans being made to permit a genuine coalition government? Will any American troops be withdrawn or will the US cease its relentless bombing of the North as a consequence of this conference?

The answers are obvious. We can expect nothing other than an increased commitment to continue to solve political and economic problems by military means, regardless of the will of the Vietnamese and American people.

CONFERENCE IS CONSPIRACY

The conference appears to be a conspiracy designed to tighten US military commitment in hopes (by lbj and Thieu) that the next US president will be bound by such a commitment.

That the conference is taking place now while the Paris talks are on-going is significant. Apparently, Thieu wants assurances that lbj won't "make deals" with the NLF behind his back, and he wants it on paper.

Some people may be asking why it has taken the NLF so long to assassinate Vietnam's Benedict Arnolds who previously fought with the French against their Vietnamese countrymen. It should be recognized that the NLF can eliminate Thieu or Ky at will, but have chosen not to do so. The question remains, why?

Perhaps they reason that just as lbj's policies have greatly increased the number of US radicals, the incredible corruption and petty power-grabbing by the so-called "Saigon Government" serves to generate support for the NLF. In short, Thieu and Ky serve as effective symbols of the hated collaboration with the American aggressors. Why should they destroy such useful symbols?

On July 18, 1968, [REDACTED] advised that some time between 5:30 p.m. and 7:30 p.m., on July 15, 1968, the following note was left attached to the door of the Mc Carthy-Logan Democratic Campaign Headquarters at 10th and Main in Hays, Kansas. The note was attached to the door with black rubberized friction tape, is on yellow paper measuring approximately 4"x4", and reads as follows in handprinting:

"I am going to kill Mc Carthy if he comes to town
(Hays) or Logan.

(signed) "The Panther"

[REDACTED] also advised that at approximately 1:30 p.m. the same Democratic Campaign Headquarters, telephone number 628-8913, received a telephone call, on July 17, 1968, to the effect that Logan would be killed if he came to Hays, Kansas, on July 18, 1968. The caller was believed to be a male with a deep voice. Neither Logan or Mc Carthy in Hays, Kansas, on July 18, 1968. Logan's full name is James K. Logan of Lawrence, Kansas, who is campaigning on the Democratic ticket for the United States Senate.

Above described note maintained at Police Department, Hays, Kansas.

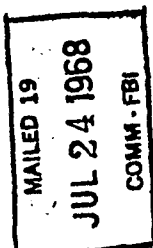

On June 10, 1968, Joseph Willard "Pappy" Luke, owner of Pappy's Stew House, General Delivery, Highway 90, Raywood, Texas, advised he had been attempting to recall more about the man who came into his restaurant on May 23, 1968 and made various claims about the man's intention to kill a senator in California. Mr. Luke recalled the man stated he worked coast-to-coast but he did not mention any person or company names with which he was affiliated. Mr. Luke advised the man may have said he was a food broker rather than being employed by the Broker Food Company.

Luke advised the man was either Syrian, Italian or French. Luke advised he had a nose like a Syrian. The man wore a felt snap-brim business hat, color unknown, low over his right eye. The man was wearing a dark gray business suit, cut of the suit unrecalled. Tie description unknown. The man was not wearing a coat handkerchief or lapel pin to Mr. Luke's recollection. The man was quite nervous, his voice trembled and his hands shook slightly. The man spoke very good English with no accent noted. The man's sentence structure reflected he was well educated. The man had a large brown leather wallet which opened like a book (coat wallet). The wallet was peculiar in that it had a zipper all the way around the circumference of it. It had a ring in one corner and a silver chain which connected the wallet to the man's belt. The man wore the wallet in his right rear pocket and the chain hung straight down and was tied at his right side. The man had a large roll of dollar bills. The man did not smoke while he was in the restaurant and displayed no smoking paraphernalia.

At 4:55 P.M. July 29, 1968, [REDACTED]
[REDACTED], The Mayflower Hotel, Connecticut
Avenue at De Sales Street, N. W., Washington, D.C.,
telephonically advised that Herbert Glenn Hewett, Arab,
Alabama, had been registered in room 721 of The Mayflower
since July 21, 1968, and had run up a bill of \$369.39.
Hotel officials contacted him concerning his account and
he requested that he be billed at the address of registration.

Hewett explained that he intended to stay at
the hotel indefinitely, but was unable to furnish any
nationally established credit cards. Hewett explained that
although no telephone was listed to him at Arab, Alabama,
one is listed to his father D.L. Hewett. Officials noted
in the room numerous papers of a political nature. A card
was noticed concerning a newsletter to be printed by Hewett
in which Hewett gave his address as The Mayflower. A number
of .25 caliber bullets were noted on the windowsill of
room 721 which is directly over the canopy covering the
front entrance of the hotel, and most people entering the
hotel by this entrance may be observed. Hewett is described
as a white, male, 38-40 years, six feet one inch, salt
and pepper hair, slender but strong build, and nice
looking.

[REDACTED] advised that many of the Presidential
aspirants have headquarters or offices at the Mayflower
including Vice-President Humphrey, Richard M. Nixon,
Senator Eugene McCarthy, and Nelson Rockefeller.

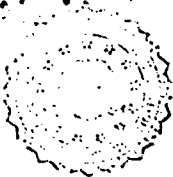

A confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past has described Roslynne Novack Gabrielsky and her husband, Robert Paul Gabrielsky, as "Marxist-Leninists" who work behind the scenes in student agitation in the Washington, D.C. area. On June 21, 1969, Mrs. Gabrielsky stated she had accepted a position with the Institute for Policy Studies (IPS), Washington, D.C., to conduct research in the area of the United States military's role in the economy.

In an article appearing in "The Examiner", a Washington, D.C. weekly newspaper, dated September 24, 1967, and written by Edith Kermit Roosevelt, she described IPS as follows: The Institute for Policy Studies is a Washington-based think factory which has helped train extremists who incite violence in American cities. Educational research serves as a cover for intrigue and political agitation. Through its conferences and seminars, the IPS exerts a continuing influence on the ideology and tactics of the New Left.

Mrs. Gabrielsky went on to say that Senator Eugene McCarthy's daughter, Mary McCarthy, was also working at IPS and "being radicalized" by IPS.

Subsequently on June 21, 1969, Mrs. Gabrielsky stated that John Mulloy, a June, 1969, graduate of American University (AU), and former co-chairman of the AU Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) Chapter, requested Mrs. Gabrielsky to set up a luncheon engagement for him and Mary McCarthy. Mulloy indicated to Mrs. Gabrielsky that he desired this initial contact with

McCarthy to become acquainted with her, so that ultimately he could "bed" her, and in that way "radicalize" her further.

The source indicated that on June 23, 1969, Mrs. Gabrielsky invited Mulloy to have lunch with herself, Mary McCarthy, and other individuals connected with IPS, on June 24, 1969.

APPENDIXSTUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

A source has advised that the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. From an initial ideological posture of "participatory democracy," the current line of the national leadership reveals an adherence to Marxism-Leninism. Michael Klonsky, National Secretary, in March, 1969, called for the building of a revolutionary Marxist-Leninist movement. The program of SDS has moved from involvement in civil rights struggles to an anti-Vietnam war position and finally to its present advocacy of an anti-imperialist line, linking up the oppressed peoples of Asia, Africa and Latin America with the black liberation movement in the United States. China, Vietnam and Cuba are regarded as countries which are leading the world-wide struggles against United States imperialism. On the other hand, SDS regards the Soviet Union as an imperialist power and does not support the policies of that country.

SDS maintains a National Office in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois. Its official paper "New Left Notes" reflects the line of the national leadership and program adopted at meetings of the National Council and National Executive Committee (NEC). Three national officers and a NEC of eleven members are elected each year during a June National Convention.

SDS Regional Offices and university and college chapters elect delegates to National Council meetings wherein program and ideology are debated, but each Region and chapter is autonomous in nature and is free to carry out independent policy and programs reflective of local conditions.
