Bernie D. Shellum, 5109 Upton Avenue South, Minneapolis, Minnesota, home telephone number 926-1360, stated that he is a reporter for the "Minneapolis Tribune," a local Minneapolis, Minnesota, newspaper, and also does part-time work for "Time" Magazine, as well as "The New York Times."

At approximately 1:15 p.m., on Saturday, July 26, 1969, Mr. Shellum was at his residence when a telephone call was received at that location. His wife answered the phone and was asked by the caller if he could speak to Bernie Shellum. Before she could make any reply, a voice cut in, stating, "This is Bernie Shellum." Mrs. Shellum was quite surprised, as she knew her husband was sitting in the same room with her and was not talking on the telephone. Shortly after the unknown individual started the conversation with the caller, Mrs. Shellum handed the phone to her husband.

When Mr. Shellum received the phone from his wife, he heard an individual whose voice he did not recognize giving two telephone numbers to another male voice involved in the conversation. He indicated the first number "is here," and mentioned Area Code 612, and said the second number was in Chicago, Area Code 312. There followed a general discussion as to whether or not there were other people close to Senator McCarthy, who could verify or discredit Drew Pearson's column, which had appeared in the "Washington Post" that morning, alleging that Senator McCarthy was going to be divorced by his wife. The person calling, who was later determined to be Terry Myers of "Time" Magazine in Chicago, Illinois, kept pressing the person who had stated he was Bernie Shellum for additional people, but was told by this individual that he could not help him any further than giving him the two telephone numbers, which had already been furnished. These numbers were not noted by Shellum during the period he was listening to this call.

After listening to the call, as detailed above, Shellum realized there were pauses in the conversation, and he believed the conversation would shortly be terminated, as Myers stated he would try the telephone numbers which he ~~had received, and see what he could get.~~ Shellum then broke

in and asked, "What the hell's going on?" The person who was impersonating Shellum stopped in midsentence, and the sound level of the call changed as much as it would if an extension telephone was hung up. Shellum did not, however, hear any click or any sound, indicating any disconnection from this third person.

Shellum then identified himself, and the person calling also furnished his identity as Terry Myers. Myers has in the past talked to Shellum telephonically and indicated that he felt there was something wrong in this conversation, as he did not recognize the voice of the individual who had identified himself as Shellum. Myers and Shellum then discussed possible explanations for this third party having been on the line, but could reach no conclusion regarding how this may have happened. Myers stated that there was no one else in his office in Chicago, Illinois, who would have access to another telephone instrument, enabling them to cut in on his conversation. Shellum told Myers he would call the Telephone Company and have them check his telephone service.

As soon as the call was terminated, Shellum called the Telephone Company Repair Service, and requested that they check his telephone lines to see if anyone was monitoring or tapping his telephone calls. He checked the telephone service within his residence, as best he could, but could locate nothing to indicate that the service had been tampered with inside his residence.

Mr. Shellum then left his residence at approximately 1:35 p.m., as he had a previous commitment.

Sometime later that afternoon, Sam Iker of the "Time" Magazine in Chicago, Illinois, called the Shellum residence and talked to Mrs. Shellum. He told her he had looked into the situation surrounding the third party in the phone call and tentatively concluded that the tap had been placed at the Chicago end of this call. He called to inform Mrs. Shellum of this in order that she would not worry about her residence telephone.

At approximately 3:30 p.m., the same afternoon, Mr. Shellum called Chicago, Illinois, from another location and talked to Terry Myers. Myers indicated he had called the Chicago, Illinois, number, which the unknown party had given to him, and had talked to a man, who identified himself as a secretary in Senator McCarthy's office in the Chicago area. This "secretary" verified for Myers Drew Pearson's account of the pending divorce. Myers pointed out to Shellum at that time that he realized he had talked to an impostor, as he knew that Senator McCarthy did not have a Chicago office.

Myers then related to Shellum that someone in his office had determined that the telephone number which had been furnished by this unknown individual was listed to AT&T in Chicago, Illinois. Shellum asked Myers what he was going to do, and Myers informed him at that time he was not sure what action he would take.

On the morning of July 28, 1969, Shellum was in telephonic contact with Sam Iker in Chicago, Illinois, and was told that Myers was of the opinion that the individual who spoke to him during the first conversation, when he identified himself as Mr. Shellum, sounded like the same individual who Myers later spoke to in Chicago, Illinois, who identified himself as Senator McCarthy's secretary. Iker also told Shellum that the Minneapolis, Minnesota, number which had been given by this individual during the first conversation was 833-4120.

[REDACTED], Northwestern Bell Telephone Company, Minneapolis, Minnesota, stated that the repair service of the Northwestern Bell Telephone Company had received a call on Saturday afternoon, July 26, 1969, from Mr. Shellum regarding the possibility of a telephone tap on his home telephone. His telephone lines were checked within the hour by the Telephone Company personnel, and they could locate nothing which would indicate that the line was being tapped at that time.

[REDACTED] stated that the 833 exchange in the Minneapolis, Minnesota, vicinity, which is Area Code 612, is located in Buffalo, Minnesota. He checked the records of this exchange and was informed that they had no numbers in use in the four thousand number series, and, therefore, concluded that this latter number was a fictitious telephone number.

JOE MULLEN, San Diego Area Manager, Senator EUGENE MC CARTHY, Campaign Headquarters, San Diego, California, advised that on July 26, 1968, during the evening hours, he received a telephone call from an unidentified individual who inquired concerning Senator MC CARTHY's possible appearance at a fund raising dinner at the Hotel Del Coronado, Coronado, California, on August 11, 1968. The individual talked for about thirty minutes on the telephone, after which another unidentified individual talked for about fifteen minutes. Both of these individuals had anti-MC CARTHY attitude during the conversation, but did not make any kind of overt threat against him. They seemed interested in MC CARTHY's whereabouts and whether he would appear at the fund raising dinner. The dinner will be from 4:00 PM to 7:30 PM on August 11, 1968.

Mr. MULLEN advised that this is the first telephone call of this kind received at the MC CARTHY Campaign Headquarters in San Diego.

CHESTER MILLER, Secret Service, San Diego, California, was furnished this information at 7:10 PM, July 29, 1968.

Pursuant to the approved arrangements contained in my memorandum of August 7, 1968, Miss Ellen McCarthy and her friend, Miss Nancy Stone, appeared in Room 1732 shortly before 10 a.m. for their tour of the Bureau. It is noted that their appointment had been set for 9:30 a.m. SA Stapleton shook hands with the two girls and introduced them to SA Thomas F. Jones, a newly appointed Agent who, before entering training class, was a top-flight tour leader.

Room 1732 is the room to which we refer those having special tour appointments. At the time the two girls arrived, because of their tardiness, this room was quite filled with people having 10 o'clock appointments. As a consequence, when the introductions were made, several of the people then waiting became aware of Miss McCarthy's identity. After she and her companion, escorted by SA Jones, left the room, one of the men waiting inquired if Miss McCarthy was the daughter of Senator Eugene McCarthy. When he was informed affirmatively, he observed audibly, which remark was heard by those in the room, that he thought it was quite ironic that the individual who had stated he would force Mr. Hoover to retire if elected President was now sending his daughter down to the FBI to see its facilities and to learn something about what its responsibilities are. All in the room appeared to be quite amused by this aside, and their laughter plainly indicated on which side their sympathies were in the J. Edgar Hoover - McCarthy matter. Following their tour, SA Jones stated that both girls seemed to be quite interested in what they saw and heard, and Miss McCarthy particularly evinced great interest in the training afforded Special Agents and their duties.

# Mayer Issues Defence of FBI, Hits McCarthy for Criticism

A memorandum in which FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover defended his department against charges by Sen. Joseph R. McCarthy that it operates autonomously and without oversight, was issued today. The memorandum refers to allegations "by a prominent candidate for the presidency of the United States," Hoover said. He stated that the FBI, under his leadership, operates autonomously and without the Democratic party's proper control. "I denote 'no' nomination, but said he would lead a continued effort to take the public or a useful look at the knowledge of our government's system of checks and balances."

Sen. McCarthy, who was a member of the Senate subcommittee on Internal Security, said he would lead a continued effort to take the public or a useful look at the knowledge of our government's system of checks and balances. The memorandum points out that the FBI is the investigative arm of the Justice Department, and is answerable to the attorney general, that its appropriations are under the control of Congress and its expenditures subject to scrutiny by the General Accounting Office.

In a letter to Sen. McCarthy, the memorandum said, "I think we should all recognize the fact that this kind of charge and its continuation, in my view, is an attempt to lead the public or a useful look at the knowledge of our government's system of checks and balances."

"... Americans should view with serious concern the increased intentions and threats by a political candidate elected, to take over and control the FBI to suit his own personal whims and wishes," the memorandum said.

The New Jackson Committee was organized to help coordinate various community agencies in an attack on the community's social problem.

identified one of the individuals as Senator McClellan and after much talking and questioning indicated the possibility that another would be Senator McCarthy, a Presidential candidate, and another "very important person" whom he would not name, but passed on his remarks and actions would have to be Vice President Hubert Humphrey.

Brower advised that he had been previously interviewed by representatives of the United States Secret Service and the Illinois State Police and believed that he discussed this matter with them, but did not go into specific detail concerning his knowledge of this plot.

Brower further stated that he first learned of this plot while working with local authorities to develop information concerning the Blackstone Rangers some time during the latter part of January and first part of February, 1968. He claims that he observed at the headquarters of the Blackstone Rangers, which he believed to be a Sunday School type building of the church of Reverend John Fry in Chicago, Illinois, that he saw plans and diagrams of the Amphitheater, and that he would be able to show local authorities the exact way the killing would occur, the getaway routes, and so forth.

Reynolds was interviewed by Agents of the United States Secret Service on August 14 and 15, 1969. He denied any desire to kill President Nixon and claimed to be in California for the purpose of visiting a girlfriend at Costa Mesa, California. He admitted that he believed the President to be "liberal" in his political thinking and that he thought Senators Kennedy and Eugene McCarthy and Hubert H. Humphery should be eliminated from the United States Government. Reynolds admitted driving with a simulated .45 caliber pistol in his lap in order to scare people and to keep from being robbed by hitchhikers he picked up. He also admitted fabricating stories in order to impress hitchhikers he picked up on the road.

Dear Mr. Hoover:

This afternoon I saw one of our good friends at The Mayflower, [REDACTED], and during our conversation received some information which I want to pass on to you.

In June the hotel got instructions from a high official of the Hotel Corporation of America, which operates The Mayflower, to extend accommodations to campaign representatives of Senator Eugene McCarthy at 40 per cent discount. This has since been done and as of today the McCarthy people have four rooms - one on the seventh floor and three on the third. At the end of June the bill was \$7,500 and by the end of July it exceeded \$20,000. No payment whatever has been received. Initially the hotel was to collect through a Mr. Grossman, but he is no longer around. Now the hotel is looking to a Mr. Friedman, but he does not seem to have any money.

Mr. Corish had no idea what kind of campaign business was going on in the McCarthy rooms but he has observed those who use them are primarily young people, both white and colored. By and large, he said, "they are a pretty crummy bunch." They seem to enjoy room service immensely. REC 6

Mr. Corish did not think Mr. Mack was aware of this situation.

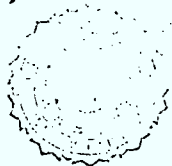

On August 22, 1968, [REDACTED], advised that on Sunday, August 18, 1968, he and his father, [REDACTED], between 2:00 and 4:00 pm, overheard two men conversing over two General Electric walkie-talkie type radios with which they were experimenting. [REDACTED] advised that they were outside of his father's home at the above address when they heard an older man and younger man conversing. The younger man said, "Do you know that they got \$50,000 for the assassination of Robert F. Kennedy. They got \$50,000 for the assassination of John F. Kennedy, too?" Then according to Rowland the younger man also said, "Do you know Mc Carthy is next?" [REDACTED] believes he then said, "Dean Rusk is next in line after him."

[REDACTED] states the unknown subjects then dropped this conversation and discussed Elizabeth Taylor and Richard Burton and other movie stars in general conversation nothing specifically recalled. [REDACTED] advised a woman broke into the conversation and asked some questions of these two men about Elizabeth Taylor going to the hospital.

[REDACTED] advised that they monitored the conversation of these two men for approximately 45 minutes to one hour and felt that they were just rambling on in general conversation and although they did not feel that it was right to talk like this he did not think it serious enough to contact any authorities until discussing it with his parish priest, who

# 'Scarsdale Fats' Paid Sen. Hartke

By Scripps-Howard Newspapers

Robert Brimberg, nicknamed "Scarsdale Fats" in a best-seller, said today he has made around payments for about five years to Sen. Vance Hartke, D-Md.

Sen. Hartke's administrative assistant, Jacques LeRoy, estimated the senator received \$2,500 a year, or a total of \$12,500.

Both Sen. Hartke and Mr. Brimberg, a New York stockbroker, denied that the payments are a "retainer." Mr. Brimberg said they are payments for speeches Sen. Hartke makes "twice a year" to a luncheon meeting of financiers, monetary experts and government economists.

## HOSTED 33 LUNCHEONS

The Brimberg luncheons were described in a chapter entitled "Lunch at Scarsdale Fats" in the book, "The Money Game." Mr. Brimberg said he has hosted about 33 of the luncheons.

Senators filed records with the Senate Secretary this month, listing \$11,000 honorariums paid last year by Mr. Brimberg individually or by Brimberg and Company.

Sen. Eugene McCarthy, D-Minn., received the largest, \$5,000, according to the records, and Sen. Hartke, the second largest, \$2,500.

Mr. LeRoy said Sen. Hartke acted as master of ceremonies or principal speaker at about five luncheon meetings last summer and fall "and you might regard that as \$500 per active participation."

The last luncheon here was March 19 in the fashionable Madison Hotel. Guests included Sen. Russell Long, D-La., Sen. McCarthy, Chairman Paul McCracken of the President's Council of Economic Advisers, and former Indiana Lt. Gov. Robert Rock.

Mr. Brimberg said former Vice President Hubert Humphrey has appeared, as have New York Mayor John Lindsay, Indiana's other senator, Birch Bayh who received \$1,600, "some White

House assistants," and Assistant Secretaries of the Treasury Department.

"I have to be honest," Mr. Brimberg said, explaining that information obtained at luncheons has been useful in advising clients.

From conversation at one luncheon, Mr. Brimberg said he figured that Lyndon Johnson would not seek re-election several weeks before the President announced it.

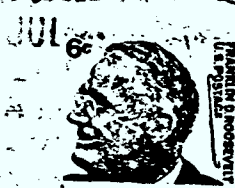

[REDACTED] have advised that George Stanley MOORE, born 13th January, 1929, Halifax, England, visited the United States of America from June, 1968 to April, 1969, as part of a world tour before taking up his appointment as Minister of the Melbourne Unitarian Peace Memorial Church in August, 1969. This Church has been assessed as being influenced by adherents of the pro-Peking Communist Party of Australia, Marxist-Leninist (CPA (M/L)). MOORE is also a Committee member of the CPA (M/L)-influenced Victorian Branch of the Australia China Society.

2. Shortly after MOORE's return to Australia in late July, 1969, an advertisement for a lecture by him claimed that while in the United States of America, MOORE had acted as a Campaign Manager for Senator Eugene McCARTHY, and had also lectured to New Left Students, Civil Rights Workers, and Black Militants. It also claimed that he had toured Eastern Europe, the United Kingdom and Cambodia, lecturing and meeting Freedom Fighters throughout the World. He attended the World Assembly of Peace in East Berlin in June, 1969, where he met representatives of the South Vietnam National Liberation Front and the North Vietnamese Government. Since his return, MOORE has been active in campaigns against Australia's involvement in the Vietnam war and Conscription.

3. I would appreciate your advice as to whether MOORE came to your notice during his U.S.A. visit.

# A Dove at the White House

Henry Kissinger, who is trying to make the White House an open house, for doves, had one to lunch yesterday. He and Eugene J. McCarthy, the 1963 peace candidate, spent a gemütlich hour over trays discussing the movement of history, government institutions and the burden of bureaucracies.

The visit came just 10 days after Kissinger received three peace militants named as co-conspirators in the Berrigan case. It suggests that the President's national security adviser is engaged in a little spring offensive of his own to present himself as a fiendly and reasonable man.

McCarthy, who like his host, is a former professor, reports that the conversation was, as it is apt to be when old academics get together, "quite abstract."

Kissinger extended the invitation a week ago, before the startling news of the previous dove incursion had leaked out. He told his guest, whom he entertained in his West Wing office, that the visit was not the President's idea. This was rather superfluous, as the President is notoriously adverse to receiving dissenters under his roof.

Kissinger told McCarthy he had read with interest the former senator's recent guest editorial in Life magazine, the proposition of

which was that the Vietnam war and other foreign policy disasters have occurred because Presidents Johnson and Nixon have made military decisions rather than the political judgments necessary in such cases.

There was no attempt on either side to proselytize about the war, which was, in fact, not specifically discussed.

### No Mention Of Barb

Nor was there mention of a sharp thrust of McCarthy's about presidential counsellors, made at a recent anti-war teach-in at Harvard, where Kissinger taught history until he became what Sen. Stuart Symington calls "the second most powerful man in government."

McCarthy had told a cheering audience, which included some of Kissinger's old friends and colleagues, that there was "something to be said about the medieval practice of executing or exiling counsellors who give bad advice."

"While I do not advocate this course," McCarthy had said, "I have reservations about certain people, after giving bad advice, being welcomed back to the academic community."

Kissinger is sensitive on this subject. He winces at talk of following in the footsteps of his predecessor, Walt W. Rostow, who was denied re-entry at M.I.T. after service to Lyndon Johnson, and repaired to the University of Texas, working on the L.B.J. memoirs.

### 'Best Generalizations'

Sometimes at dinner parties, Kissinger moans, "I do not think I would be happy at the University of Arizona."

But at the Kissinger McCarthy meeting, "Each of us was using his best generaliza-

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tions and his best quotes," McCarthy said.

McCarthy inquired if Kissinger was aware of the writings of a French intellectual named Michel de Ceteau, who appears in an advanced Catholic journal called "Cross Currents." Kissinger, whose reading material comes largely from the Joint Chiefs of Staff these days, said he had not. McCarthy recommended to him an article called "Revolution against Insignificance."

Kissinger said that such a revolution might lie beneath the general unease in the country.

McCarthy leaves on Wednesday for Israel, and that mention brought on a reflections about Zionism, the Dreyfus case and other matters not immediately related to the present state of affairs.

#### More Talks Wished

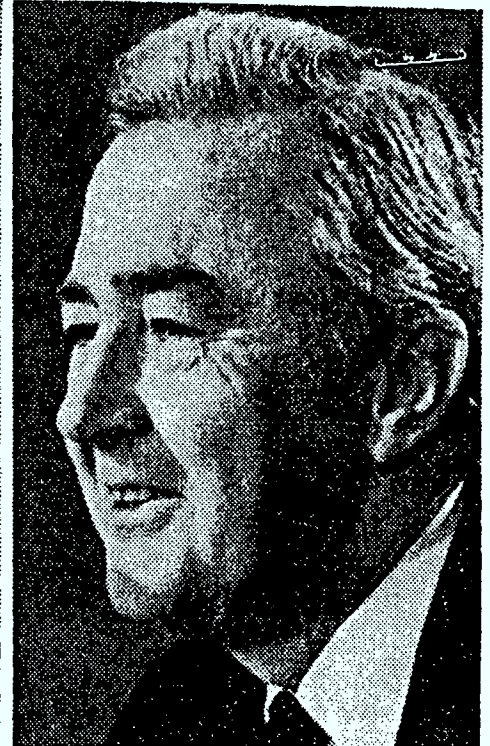
Kissinger said he hoped that he and McCarthy could have more long talks.

What the hard-hats in the administration think about Kissinger's fraternization with the other side is not known. Kissinger conducts his own public relations; just as the President is making herculean efforts to burnish his image, so the national security adviser too may be trying to counter the publicity he receives as a hawk who also is, according to the social pages, a social butterfly.

Since the departure of Daniel P. Moynihan, the only intellectual in the White House simply may get lonely for talk of ideas. The Nixon administration has written off the intellectuals and the young, but they are Kissinger's constituency, and it looks as if he is going to keep the lines open, no matter what John Mitchell and company think about his non-team hospitality.

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# Mayday Charge Dropped

## Prosecutor Frees Son of Ex-Senator

Michael B. McCarthy, son of former Minnesota Sen. Eugene J. McCarthy, and one of those arrested during the Mayday antiwar protests here last month, saw his case thrown out of court yesterday after prosecutors said they were unable to find out why he had been charged.

"They had no case against him whatsoever," said McCarthy's lawyer, Monroe H. Freedman, an assertion that was denied by Corporation Counsel C. Francis Murphy.

Murphy said there must have been a solid basis for the initial decision to prosecute McCarthy. He said documents containing evidence against McCarthy could have been lost between his office and the courthouse and that this could explain the inability of the prosecutor to locate the policeman who had arrested McCarthy.

"I could not determine who the arresting officer was so I was unable to find out what the defendant had done to get himself arrested, Assistant Corporation Counsel Andrew Zuccotti said. He ordered the disorderly conduct charge against McCarthy dropped when the case was called for trial yesterday.

McCarthy was one of only a handful of Mayday cases in which the corporation counsel's office had decided to go ahead with prosecutions in the belief that there was enough evidence to justify a trial.

"It seems clear to me that it was for political reasons that prosecutors decided to go ahead with McCarthy's case at all, Freedman said.

McCarthy's name was culled from a list of 2,400 Mayday defendants who had demanded trials on the charges against them. Only 24 from that list were recommended for prosecution and of that 24, only one has been convicted so far.

Of the more than 7,000 persons arrested here May 3, only 36 remain to be prosecuted. All the others have had charges dropped, forfeited collateral or been acquitted and a handful have been convicted.

About 1,000 persons arrested May 4 in a sit down demonstration outside the Justice Department and another 1,000 arrested the following day on the Capitol steps remain to be processed by the courts.

McCarthy, whose father unsuccessfully sought the 1968 Democratic presidential nomination and ran against then President Johnson in the New Hampshire primary that year, is a junior at Harvard.

He said he was arrested about 9:15 a.m. on May 3 in a police sweep at 20th and M Streets NW.

Protesters that morning had planned to block traffic on the 14th Street Bridge and at other locations around town in an attempt to close down the government.

"But we were unable to reach the target area," McCarthy said and they were returning to Georgetown when police arrested them.

There was no field arrest form on McCarthy and it was not until 4 a.m. the following day at the Washington Coliseum that his arrest papers were filled out and he was informed he was being charged with disorderly conduct, he said.

"I wasn't charged with anything when I was arrested," he said.

Mary Monroe, office manager, McCarthy '76 telephoned SA Richard T. Taylor, Jr., on 10/3/75, advising ex-Senator Eugene J. McCarthy (Minnesota) has recently requested Secret Service protection and anticipates it will be afforded him within the near future in view of recent news articles on assassination attempts and scheduled protection of presidential candidates.

Miss Monroe advised McCarthy '76 headquarters and Senator McCarthy have been receiving bothersome, nettlesome telephone calls from one John Vincent Kaufmann who describes himself as variously residing c/o St. John's University, Collegeville, Minnesota; 4100 Parklawn Avenue, #114, Edina, Minnesota; in care of his brother, Bobby Kaufmann, 3831 Pacific Avenue, D-6, Forrest Glenn or Forrest Grove, Oregon. In Miss Monroe's opinion Kaufmann suffers from a mental disorder as indicated by his incoherent, pointless phone calls. At no time, however, has Kaufmann made any threat, express or implied, against Senator McCarthy nor has he expressed any animosity toward him, according to Miss Monroe.

Miss Monroe said she has furnished the foregoing data to Secret Service Agent Warren Crosby, Washington Field Office, along with a photograph of Kaufmann, which she recently received in a letter addressed to McCarthy '76 headquarters, Washington, D.C. from John Vincent Kaufmann.
