Fugitive's thumbprint on letter, says F.B.I.

Based on a fingerprint on a letter, the Federal Bureau of Investigation said today they believe the revolutionary George Jackson Brigade may be responsible for recent bombings at local auto dealers.

Ray Mathis, F.B.I. spokesman, said the bureau received a letter yesterday claiming responsibility for the bombings, which had the right thumbprint of John W. Sherman, fugitive brigade member.

Mathis said the letter, which appears to be authentic, described the bombs "in great detail."

The letter said the brigade placed bombs at auto dealerships "in support of" the five-month-old strike of Auto Machinists Local 289.

It was also sent to KOMO television, the King County Auto Dealers Association, and B.B.C. Dodge, where a bombing took place Saturday night.

B.B.C. Dodge was the third auto dealer hit in the recent rash of bombings. An explosive device went off at S.L. Savidge Dodge downtown in the early morning of October 13. An unexploded bomb was found at Westlund Buick-Opel-G.M.C. in North Seattle October 7.

Two years ago, the brigade claimed responsibility for bombing a City Light power substation in support of striking utility employes. That bombing caused more than \$200,000 damage and knocked power out in the Laurelhurst area.

The brigade, a small terrorist band with its roots in the prison movement, has claimed responsibility for several bombings and bank robberies in the Northwest since 1975.

Brigade Linked To Bombings

The Scattle office of the Federal Bureau of investigation yesterday received a letter — believed to be authentic — in which the fugitive George Jackson Brigade claimed responsibility for three recent bombing incidents at local auto dealerships.

The spokesman said investigators found the right thumbprint of John W. Sherman on the letter. He has been identified with the brigade for the past

The letter describes the explosive devices used in the three incidents "in great detail," the spokesman said.

The document states that the brigade placed explosive devices at three auto dealerships here because it is "in support of" the five-month-old strike by Auto Machinists Local 289.

It claims the Jackson Brigade sent the letter so that the owners of the dealerships involved in the bombing incidents would know the striking mechanics were not responsible.

It had been rumored that the brigade was responsible for the bomb incidents, but law enforcement agencies had not believed the reports.

The one-page, typed letter arrived in the morning mail at the FBI office. It bore a Seattle post-

Imark, the spokesman said.

Copies were sent to the auto machinists, BBC

Dodge, the King County Auto Dealers Association,
and KOMO television, the spokesman said.

An official of Local 289 said the union was "a-

ware" of the letter but would make no comment on:

"We're not making any comments at this point," said the official, who did not want his name used. He added: "We have been in touch with our attorneys and they told us not to make any comments on

The latest bombing incident occurred late Saturday night at the BBC Dodge dealership in Burlen, and caused damage estimated by the county police

In an earlier incident explosives caused damage to vehicles at the S. L. Savidge agency in downtown

Two weeks ago an unexploded homb was found at the Westlund Buick-Opel-GMC dealership in North Scattle.

Meanwhile yesterday, Bellevue police discovered what they said was at least \$5,000 in slashed, tires at the Foothills Ford dealership in Eastgate.

Police said (0) or more tires on new cars, vans, and pickup trucks were punctured with an "ice pick-like device."

The following newspaper article is from the October 19, 1977 issue of the Seattle-Post Intelligencer, Seattle, Washington (page A-1).

The damage was discovered at 2:45 a.m. by police, a spokesman said. A police dog found a track at the scene but lost it a short distance away, apparently where the person who left the track got into a vehicle, police said.

There have been many incidents of property damage at Seattle-area auto dealerships since the mechanics went on strike, but yesterday's incident seemed to be the largest yet.

Sherman, 35, has been sought by federal and local law enforcement officers since his bloody escape from Harborview Medical Center March 10, 11976.

County police offficer Virgil Johnson was shot!

in the abdomen and critically wounded in that incident. Sherman at the time was being held in connection with a holdup and gun battle at a bank in Tukwila in January of 1976. That robbery was committed by Jackson Brigade members.

It has been about a month since the brigade was held responsible for striking a bank in Skyway, robbing a teller and getting cleanly away. And it has been almost two-and-a-half years since the group emerged out of the remnants of the left-dominated prison reform movements, saying it would steal from the rich ("the capitalist class") and give to the poor ("the masses.")

"They are here, there and everywhere," Seattle FBI head John Reed told United Press International. "They are like Patty Hearst, with a few friends to help them out, probably living in a community where they blend in."

They could have a place way out in the boon-docks," Bellevue Police Chief Donald Van Blaricom; says. "They might have a mile-long driveway with a hundred yapping dogs, or they could be that lovely couple who just moved in next door."

Two devices had been placed on the hood of a vehicle while the third device was placed on a vehicle trunk lid. A small fire was ignited following the explosion, however, most of the damage was done by pipe fragmentation.

Additionally, Seattle LHH dated April 19, 1973, furnished via Airtel same date and captioned "George Jackson Brigade; DS;" 00: Seattle, reflects that on March 23, 1976, the Federal Grand Jury, Seattle, Washington, returned an indictment charging Sherman, Coupez, and Bertram with Bank Robbery, Possession of Unregistered Explosive Devices and Illegal Firearms Devices. However, Seattle did not specify in which cases subjects were charged.



Result of examination:

According to information furnished by your office Q60 through Q78 represent the remains of three incendiary/pipe bombs consisting of one gallon jugs filled with a flammable liquid, possibly gasoline and acid, with a pipe bomb taped to the jugs. Further, you advise the firing system of the pipe bombs included 9-volts batteries and alarm clocks and that two of the devices were placed on the hood of a vehicle and the third device was placed on a vehicle trunk.

The individual components of the incendiary/pipe bomb devices are described in detail hereafter:

PIPE COMPONENTS

Present in each Q63, Q64, Q65, and Q66 is a gabanized metal pipe end cap. A portion of the threaded section of a pipe nipple is present in each cap, and the end portion of the Q63, Q64, and Q66 caps is missing. The Q63 and Q64 caps are 1" pipe size and the Q65 and Q66 caps are 3/4" pipe size.

The threaded sections of pipe broken off inside each pipe cap appear to be the same pipe size as the respective cap. Present in each Q67, Q71 and Q78 is the damaged remains of a galvanized metal pipe nipple. Also present in Q67 is an apparent galvanized metal pipe cap fragment. The Q77 and Q78 pipe nipples are 3/4" standard weight pipe size pipe nipples. The Q67 pipe nipple appears to represent a pipe size approximately midway between a 3/4" and i" pipe size.

What appears to be the "gound" emblem is present in the Q63 and Q65 caps. The "plum" emblem is present on the Q64 cap. The indented fraction "3/4" is also present on the Q65 cap. According to information available to the Laboratory the "gound" emblem is used by Hitachi Metals of Tokyo, Japan, and New York City, New York. The "plum" emblem is used by the San Yang Metal Industrial Co. Ltd., Taiwan, and distributed in the United States only by Maurie Graysen Co., Los Angeles, California. The fraction "3/4" is indicative of the pipe size.

MAIN CHARGE

Partially consumed particles of "tubular" type smokeless powder were observed on Q63, Q64, Q65 and Q66 pipe caps and Q71 pipe nipple. The brand(s) and manufacturer(s) of the smokeless powder could not be determined.

GLASS JUGS

The top portion of a glass jug made to accommodate a screw-on cap is present in each Q60, Q75, and Q77. A handle is evident on the top portions of the two jugs represented in Q60 and Q77.

A screw-on metal cap is attached to the jug fragments in each Q75 and Q77. The following information is stamped on the inside plasticlike surface of the Q75 metal cap:

"M090178"

The following information is similarly stamped on the Q77 metal cap:

"M 0 0 7 A"

The approximate inside diameter of the metal caps is 1 \frac{1}{n} and the approximate outside diameter is 1 5/8".

Additional glass fragments are present in Q68, Q70, Q73, Q74, and Q76. Fragments, which appear to be from the bottom portion(s) of the jug(s) in Q73 and Q76 bear the following raised characters:

"B-35" "34" "E-3534"

Paper label fragments were adhering to some of the other glass fragments in the above specimens; however, the probable source and contents of the container(s) represented by these fragments could not be established by the Laboratory.

MOUID

Specimen Q72 contains Sulfuric scid.

TIMING MECHANISMS

Specimens Q61, Q62 and Q69 contain components of "Travino" series spring-driven travel alarm clocks manufactured by General Time in Tsiwan and marketed by Westolox. Division of General Time, LaSalie, Illinois. The clocks in specimens Q61 and Q62 are the "Travino" series model 44240. The particular model of "Travino" series travel alarm in specimen Q69 could not be ascertained inasmuch as the only variation in models within the "Travino" series is the color of case, which is not present in the specimen. The particular models utilize luminous hands and hour dots.

Modifications made to each of the travel alarm clocks would have resulted in a maximum delay of less than 60 minutes.

BATTERIES

An Eveready, 9-volts, no. 522, "alkaline powercell" battery is present in Q61, Q62, and Q69. The code "CR I" is present on the bottom of the Q61 and Q62 batteries. The same code appears to be present on the Q69 battery; however, the damaged condition of the Q69 battery precludes positively determining the code. The outer metal cases of the Q61 and Q62 batteries are gold, red, white, and black.

BATTERY CONNECTORS

Snap-type battery connectors are attached to the Q61, Q62, and Q69 batteries. The vinyllike battery covers and lead wires appear to have been removed prior to use in the IEDS. The vinyllike covers appear to have been grey in color on the Q61 and Q62 battery connectors. The damaged condition of the Q69 battery connector precludes determining the color of the possible cover.

WIRE

Pieces of single conductor strended tinned-copper wire with red plasticlike insulation are present in Q60, Q61, Q62, Q69, and Q77. The approximate diameter of the wire including the insulation is 0.071.

Pieces of single conductor stranded copper wire with white plasticlike insulation is present in Q61 and Q62. The approximate dismeter of the wire including insulation is 0.109". The following printed information is present on the Q61 piece of wire:

"CAROL 18 AWG 600V TULL MTW OR AWM ---"

TAPE

Pieces of black, 3/4" wide, electrical tape are contained on specimens Q60 through Q63, Q69, Q71 and Q77. Specimens Q60, Q68, Q70 and Q73 through Q77 contain pieces of 2" wide gray duct tape. A 1" wide piece of beige masking tape was contained in specimen Q61. The electrical tape, the duct tape, and the masking tape are suitable for comparison purposes should rolls of similar suspect tape become available.

No tape was contained on specimens Q64 through Q67 and Q78.

MISCELLANEOUS

The glue and solder used in the construction of the IED and present in Q61, Q62, and Q69 are suitable for comparison purposes in the event suspect glue and solder is located.

TOOLMARKS

Impressions typical of those produced by the gripping jaws of some pipe threading machine having four gripping jaws are present in Q67. The jaw width represented is 2". Toolmarks of value for identification purposes are present in one of the impressions.

No other toolmarks of value for identification purposes were observed in the submitted specimens.


