ON MARCH 21 AND 22, 1974, RANDOLPH HEARST, MEMBERS OF HIS IMMEDIATE~~ED~~ FAMILY, AND THEIR ASSOCIATES ENGAGED IN PREPARATION FOR THE NEXT PEOPLE IN NEED (PIN) FOOD GIVE-AWAY PROGRAM WHICH HAS NOW BEEN RESCHEDULED FOR MARCH 25, 1974. HEARST CONTINUES TO INDICATE THAT WHEN THIS DISTRIBUTION OF FOOD IS COMPLETED, THE \$2,000,000 IN FUNDS MADE AVAILABLE TO PIN WILL HAVE BEEN EXPENDED AND THAT HIS PERSONAL FUNDS ARE EXHAUSTED.

IT APPEARS NOW, ACCORDING TO SOURCES CLOSE TO HEARST, THAT HE WILL MAKE A PUBLIC STATEMENT EITHER LATE EVENING MARCH 25, 1974 OR SOMETIME ON MARCH 26, 1974.

DURING EVENING OF MARCH 21, 1974. AGENTS PARTICIPATING IN THIS PROGRAM SUCCESSFULLY FISURED [REDACTED] AND AN UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE COMPANION. [REDACTED] ENGAGED IN NUMEROUS EVASIVE TECHNIQUES AND APPEARED TO BE EXTREMELY SURVEILLANCE CONSCIOUS. SHE FOLLOWED A CIRCUITOUS ROUTE TO AN AREA WHERE THE UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE WITH [REDACTED] DROPPED A LETTER

THEREAFTER [REDACTED] AND HER COMPANION THEN FOLLOWED WHAT APPEARED TO BE A DRY CLEANING OPERATION MAKING SEVERAL U-TURNS AND SUBSEQUENTLY STOPPING AT A TELEPHONE IN A MOBIL STATION, 55TH STREET AND EAST 14TH AVENUE, OAKLAND. HER COMPANION EXAMINED THE TELEPHONE BOOK IN THE TELEPHONE BOOTH, HOWEVER, MADE NO CALLS. THEY THEN PROCEEDED EAST AND WEST ON EAST 14TH AVENUE, AFTER MAKING U-TURNS AND WHAT APPEARED TO BE A SECOND DRY CLEANING OPERATION, AND THEN RETURNED TO THE SAME TELEPHONE BOOTH MENTIONED ABOVE. THE TELEPHONE BOOTH WAS OCCUPIED AND AFTER SEVERAL MINUTES, THE TWO THEN PROCEEDED TO A SECOND TELEPHONE BOOTH NINE BLOCKS AWAY ON EAST 14TH AVENUE, WHERE THE FEMALE PASSENGER MADE A TELEPHONE CALL. THEY NEXT PROCEEDED TO THE SAFEWAY PARKING LOT, 66TH STREET AND EAST 14TH AVENUE IN OAKLAND WHERE THE PASSENGER ENTERED THE STORE AND CONTACTED A MALE CLERK. AFTER LEAVING THIS LOCATION, THEY RETURNED TO THEIR RESIDENCE AT [REDACTED] IT WAS LATER ASCERTAINED FROM THE GROCERY CLERK THAT THE PASSENGER OF [REDACTED] ASKED FOR THE LOCATION OF THE "SON OF MAN TEMPLE" IN EAST OAKLAND.

[REDACTED] ACKNOWLEDGED AN ACQUAINTANCE WITH DE FREEZE DATING FROM 1966 IN THE WATTS SECTION OF LOS ANGELES WHERE HE ALLEGED DE FREEZE AFFILIATED WITH BLACK PANTHER PARTY OR SIMILAR TYPE BLACK MILITANT ORGANIZATION. [REDACTED] MET DE FREEZE IN CMF, VACAVILLE, 1970 - 1971, CONVERSING DAILY WITH HIM. DE FREEZE FREQUENTLY COMMENTED HE WOULD MAKE WHITE PEOPLE PAY FOR HIS IMPRISONMENT, WAS TIRED OF THE SYSTEM IN THE UNITED STATES, AND HAS A CACHE OF HIDDEN EXPLOSIVES. DE FREEZE ALLEGED THAT HE WAS WORKING WITH UNIDENTIFIED INDIVIDUALS IN OAKLAND IN AN ORGANIZATION THAT WOULD BE MORE POWERFUL THAN THE BLACK PANTHER PARTY AS THE ORGANIZATION "WANTED ACTION". THIS GROUP ALLEGEDLY HAD A SECURE LOCATION FOR ITS HEADQUARTERS, BUT LOCATION NEVER REVEALED TO [REDACTED] DE FREEZE ASSOCIATED AT CMF, VACAVILLE, WITH INMATES [REDACTED] WHO HAD SYMPATHIES SIMILAR TO HIS. THESE INDIVIDUALS ARE ON PAROLE AND ASSOCIATE WITH [REDACTED] WHO ALSO SUPPORTS LEFT WING CAUSES AND VISITED DE FREEZE AT CMF. [REDACTED] BELIEVED THAT BOTH [REDACTED] COULD BE AFFILIATED WITH DE FREEZE AND THE SYMBIONESE LIBERATION ARMY (SLA) BECAUSE OF THEIR EXTREMIST PHILOSOPHIES AS COULD [REDACTED] RECALLED

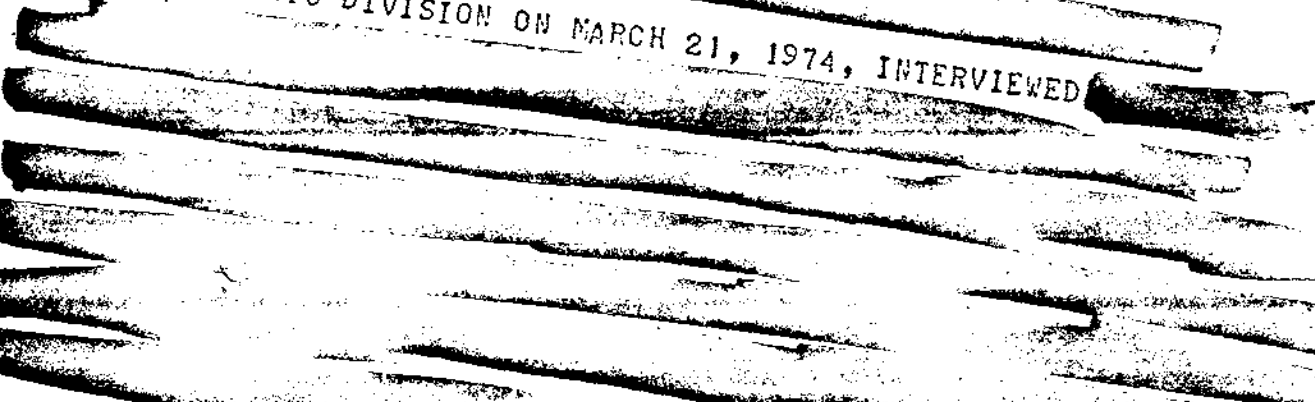

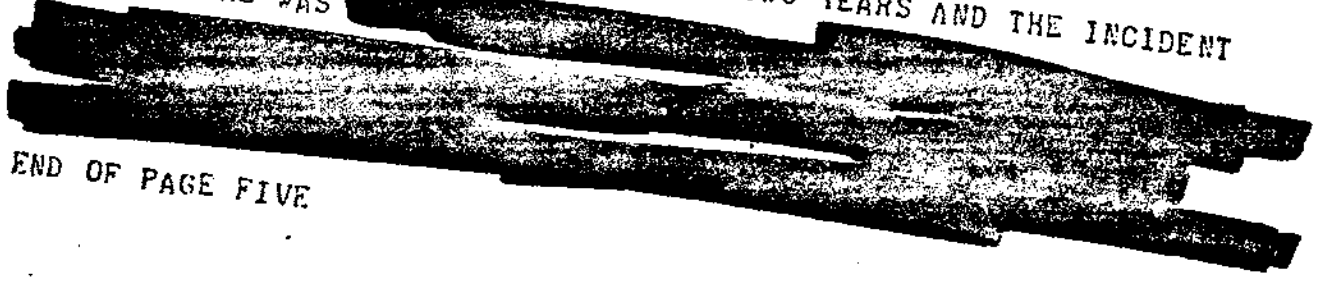

[REDACTED] CHARACTERIZES HIM AS NOT BRIGHT, AMBITIOUS, VOCAL, POWER HUNGRY AND A LONER. SHE RECALLED DE FREEZE SPEAKING FOR THE BLACK CULTURAL ASSOCIATION (BCA) WHEREIN HE SAID HE WOULD KILL ALL WHITES UPON HIS RELEASE. IMMEDIATELY AFTER MAKING THIS STATEMENT HE APPROACHED [REDACTED] AND REQUESTED HER RECOMMENDATION TO THE PAROLE BOARD ON HIS BEHALF. WHEN SHE REJECTED DE FREEZE, HE BECAME QUITE COOL TOWARD HER. SHE HAS NOT SEEN OR LEARNED ANYTHING ABOUT DE FREEZE IN THE LAST TWO YEARS AND THE INCIDENT IN WHICH SHE WAS [REDACTED]

"THE SAN FRANCISCO PHOENIX", AN UNDERGROUND NEWSPAPER OF SAN FRANCISCO, IN THEIR EDITION DATED THROUGH APRIL 4, 1974, CARRIED OVER A PAGE IN LENGTH LETTER ON WHAT THEY TERMED MAY BE AN EXCLUSIVE INTERVIEW WITH THE SYMBIONESE LIBERATION ARMY (SLA). THE ARTICLE EXPLAINED THAT IN THE LAST ISSUE OF "THE PHOENIX" THEY RAN A LIST OF 29 QUESTIONS THEY DESIRED TO ASK THE SLA. A FEW DAYS BEFORE GOING TO PRESS WITH THE CURRENT ISSUE THEY REPORTEDLY RECEIVED THE FOLLOWING ANSWERS. THE PAPER POINTS OUT THAT IT IS IMPOSSIBLE TO BE ABSOLUTELY SURE THAT IT CAME FROM THE SLA BUT THE STYLE

AND CONTENT IS SO SIMILAR TO OTHER COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE SLA THAT THEY CONSIDER IT A DISTINCT POSSIBILITY. THE LONG COMMUNIQUE READS IN PART - "... IT IS THE PRACTICE OF THE SYMBIONESE LIBERATION ARMY TO ACT RATHER THAN TALK AND WE MUST ACT AS THOUGH WE WERE ONE BODY ... WE TEACH THAT SOCIALISM IS AS OLD AS MAN AND THAT THERE ARE ONLY TWO WAYS IN WHICH SOCIETIES CAN BE GOVERNED AND ORGANIZED FOR THE PRODUCTION OF THE PEOPLE'S NEEDS; EITHER THROUGH THE TOTALITARIAN METHODS REPRESENTED BY OUR PRESENT FASCIST CAPITALIST SYSTEM OR BY THE EGALITARIAN METHOD WHICH IS PEOPLE'S GOVERNMENT AND ECONOMICS AND THIS IS SOCIALISTIC, DIALECTICAL AND MATERIALIST... ABOUT THE CRITICISM THAT THE SLA HAS BEEN RECEIVING FROM MANY SO-CALLED 'LEFT' ORGANIZATIONS... THIS KIND OF ANALYSIS IS FROM SO-CALLED LEADERS WHO PRESUME TO SPEAK FOR THE PEOPLE, BUT WHO ARE TRULY COWARDS AFRAID OF REVOLUTIONARY VIOLENCE BECAUSE IT IS A THREAT TO THEIR PERSONAL SECURITY... YOU QUESTION THE APPROPRIATENESS OF EXECUTING OAKLAND SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS,

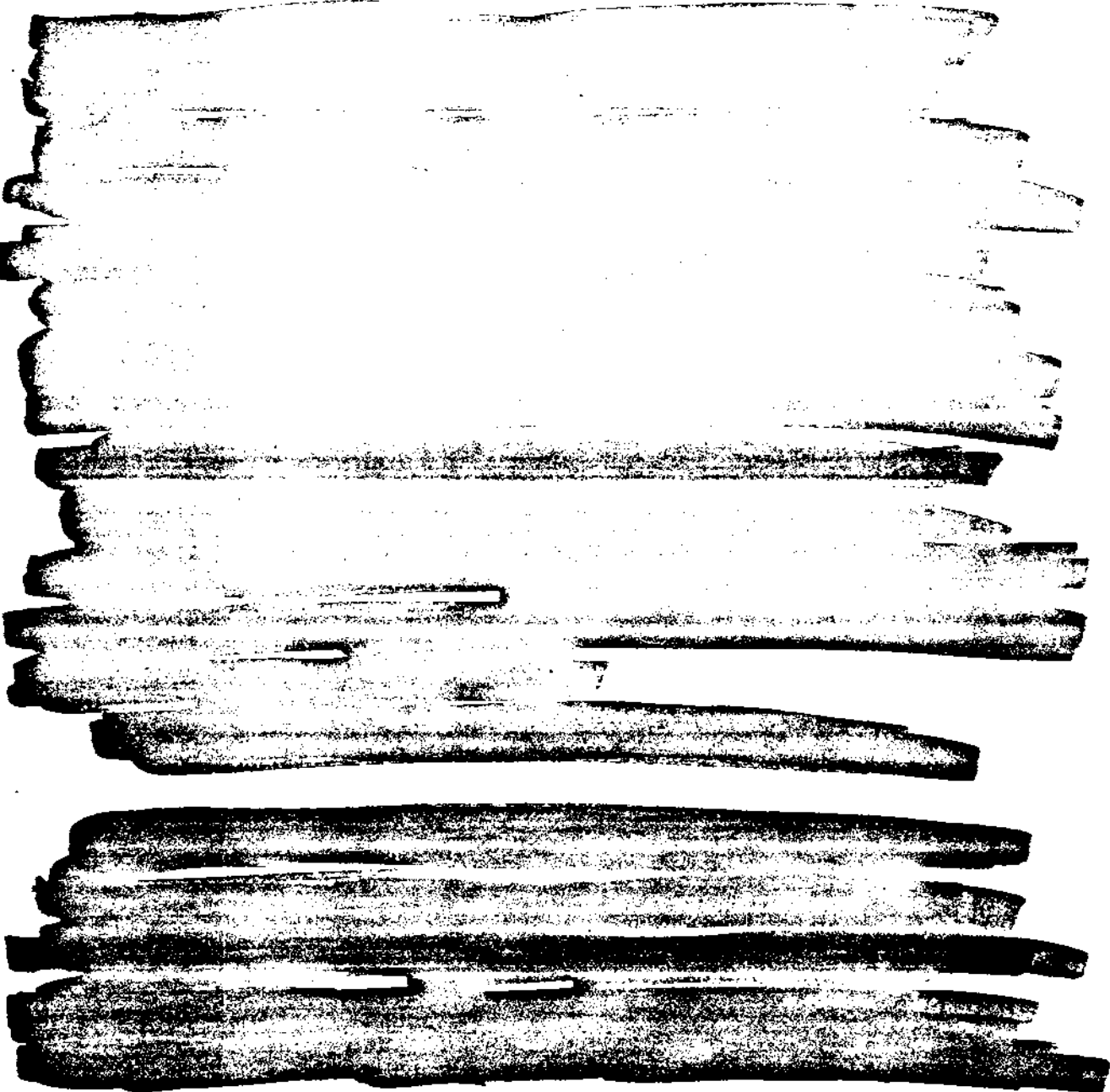

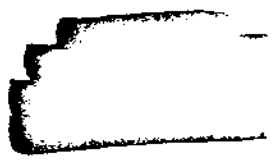

SUBJECT: HEARNAP



Our investigation to date has been limited to activities which would not jeopardize the victim's safety. We have, however, been extremely aggressive as evidenced by the use of

[redacted] and the many other investigative techniques which we have employed. Through our investigation we have identified Donald David DeFreeze, Patricia Michelle "Mizmoon" Soltysik, William and Emily Harris and Nancy Ling Perry as prime suspects in the kidnaping. We have not yet gathered the necessary evidence for warrants to be obtained for these individuals.

It is recognized that our public stance must always be that the safety of the victim is our primary concern. The fact that the victim's father has consistently refused to take a hard stand against the Symbionese Liberation Army (SLA) and has "grabbed at straws" in leaving himself open for negotiations with various individuals and groups has not lent support to our attempting a more open aggressive position. It appears that the pressure being exerted on Hearst by the Foundation and the advice he is receiving from his

[redacted] to the effect that Hearst should make a statement that this matter is out of his control and that the FBI must take whatever action they deem necessary without further consideration of the Hearst family could alter Hearst's current position. It is noted that

Once Hearst takes a firm stand and refuses to negotiate further, it will enable us to take the initiative in the following areas:

San Francisco can subpoena individuals previously contacted who were uncooperative before the Grand Jury. It is anticipated that immunity would be offered some of these individuals and their failure to furnish information to the Grand Jury would result in their confinement for contempt. Likewise it would appear profitable to obtain search warrants for three residences which are presently being afforded 24-hour surveillance coverage. Located at these residences are individuals who we believe could be possibly involved presently as couriers or in other supporting capacities for the SLA. All individuals at those residences would be thoroughly interviewed and if uncooperative would be subpoenaed for Grand Jury appearance.

It is well recognized that the above action would be subject to intensive publicity and is a calculated risk. It is conceivable that searches of these residences could possibly result in no tangible information being obtained as to the location of the victim. However, as her location is our primary objective we must capitalize on any unexplored avenue as it becomes available.

These initiatives are by no means all inclusive and it is recognized that the final recommendation to institute them is by necessity that of SAC Bates, who is in charge on the scene and knows the situation best.

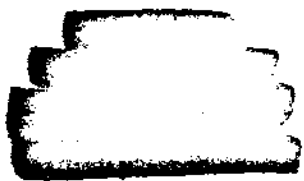

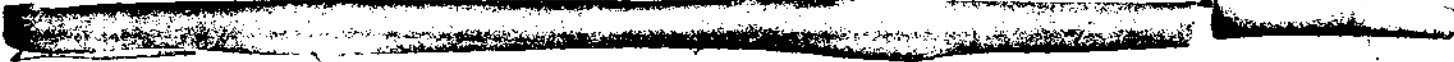

We have identified some known and suspected members of the SLA, and attempted to obtain the Attorney General's (AG) approval to apply to the United States District Court (USDC) in San Francisco for a Title III electronic surveillance on some of these people, in order to attempt to obtain information to break the Hearst kidnaping. The Department of Justice (DJ) replies that we have insufficient information to show probable cause, as required by Title III, that the individuals we seek to surveil are involved in the kidnaping.

The purpose of this memorandum is to explore the possibilities of obtaining an electronic surveillance in this case, without probable cause as traditionally understood, and therefore not under Title III, but as an intelligence surveillance, supported by the language of the Keith decision, by petitioning for approval of the surveillance by a USDC.

Shortly after the Keith decision, the FBI and the Internal Security Division (ISD) of the DJ explored the possibility of obtaining judicial warrants to conduct domestic intelligence electronic surveillances.

In a memorandum from the Assistant Attorney General, (AAG) ISD, dated July 25, 1972, he noted "...this Division indicated that there would be no basis for securing a warrant for the conduct of electronic surveillance in the types of cases covered by the Keith decision, absent new legislation authorizing the issuance of such warrants. After reviewing the relevant considerations, this Division is of the opinion that, at this

time, there is no need to seek such legislation from the Congress." And later "...if future events should indicate that the effect of the Keith decision is to deprive the Department of valuable intelligence information, our present position will be subject to re-evaluation."

The AAG, ISD was obviously talking about his position not to seek enabling legislation at that time.

However, we had also discussed among ourselves and with the ISD, the possibility of attempting to obtain a warrant for domestic intelligence electronic surveillance without new legislation, not under Title III, because of its probable cause and notice requirements, but under some already existing civil or criminal procedure.

In summary, those discussions led us to the conclusion that when we had a proper case, we should attempt to obtain a warrant to conduct a domestic intelligence electronic surveillance under F.R. Cr.P. 41, pertaining to search warrants. The opinion of DJ is F.R. Cr.P. 41 provides only for search and seizure of material things and would not be available for application for an electronic surveillance warrant. Assuming that the objectives of our intended seizure, intercepted conversations, would not fall within the definition of the items or grounds defined in F.R. Cr.P. 41(b) or 18 U.S.C. 3103(a), a judge would have to be convinced that he has inherent power to issue a warrant for such items (telephone or microphone interceptions) and on such grounds that he may determine, in the interest of national security.

The inherent difficulty in attempting to obtain a warrant under F.R. Cr.P. 41 is that, in addition to the fact that its definition of items which can be seized does not encompass intercepted conversations, it also requires a showing of probable cause as traditionally understood, and it requires notice to the party whose property is being seized at the time of the seizure. For a judge to issue an electronic surveillance warrant under F.R. Cr.P. 41, he would have to disregard practically

all of the provisions and guidelines contained in the Rule. While Mr. Dalbey, who advocated the F.R. Cr.P. 41 route, cited U.S. v. Focarile as precedent (use of F.R. Cr.P. 41 by the Bureau of Narcotics to obtain a warrant to place a pen register), it would appear the decision supports a broad interpretation of the items allowed to be seized under F.R. Cr.P. 41, and modifies its disclosure timing, but does not obviate the difficulties of probable cause.

An avenue which might be open to us is simply to approach a USDC with the Keith decision in one hand and an affidavit supporting our reason to believe that the surveillance requested may produce intelligence information which could break the Hearst kidnaping case, and give us an opportunity to thwart future SLA activity detrimental to the national security.

Our argument to the USDC would be that he has authority, under the Keith opinion, to approve our petition for an intelligence electronic surveillance. We would not attempt to cite any particular procedure by which we were making the application, arguing that all Keith opinion requires is interposition of a judicial officer between the President's agents and the person to be surveilled, and that the Supreme Court did not attempt to define the means by which such an application is to be made.

In concluding its Keith opinion, which held that domestic intelligence electronic surveillances were subject to the Fourth Amendment requirement of prior judicial review, the court said:

"Moreover, we do not hold that the same type of standard and procedures prescribed by Title III are necessarily applicable to this case. We recognize that domestic security surveillance may involve different policy and practical considerations from the surveillance of "ordinary crime." The gathering of security intelligence is often long range and involves the interrelation of various sources and types of information. The exact targets of such surveillance may be more difficult to identify than in

surveillance operations against many types of crime specified in Title III. Often, too, the emphasis of domestic intelligence gathering is on the prevention of unlawful activity or the enhancement of the Government's preparedness for some possible future crisis or emergency. Thus, the focus of domestic surveillance may be less precise than that directed against more conventional types of crime.

Given these potential distinctions between Title III criminal surveillances and those involving the domestic security, Congress may wish to consider protective standards for the latter which differ from those already prescribed for specified crimes in Title III. Different standards may be compatible with the Fourth Amendment if they are reasonable both in relation to the legitimate need of Government for intelligence information and the protected rights of our citizens. For the warrant application may vary according to the governmental interest to be enforced and the nature of citizen rights deserving protection. As the Court said in Camara v. Municipal Court, 387 U.S. 523, 534-535 (1967):

"In cases in which the Fourth Amendment requires that a warrant to search be obtained 'probable cause' is the standard by which a particular decision to search

is tested against the constitutional mandate of reasonableness...In determining whether a particular inspection is reasonable - and thus in determining whether there is probable cause to issue a warrant for that inspection - the need for the inspection must be weighed in terms of these reasonable goals of law enforcement."

It may be that Congress, for example, would judge that the application and affidavit showing probable cause need not follow the exact requirements of § 2518 but should allege other circumstances more appropriate to domestic security cases; that the request for prior court authorization could, in sensitive cases, be made to any member of a specially designated court (e.g., The District Court or Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia); and that the time and reporting requirements need not be so strict as those in § 2518.

The above paragraph does not, of course, attempt to guide the congressional judgment but rather to delineate the present scope of our own opinion. We do not attempt to detail the precise standards for domestic security warrants any more than our decision in Katz sought to set the refined requirements for the specified criminal surveillances, which now constitute Title III. We do hold, however, that prior judicial approval is required for the type of domestic security surveillance involved in this case and that such approval may be made in accordance with such reasonable standards as the Congress may prescribe.

The difficulty in the above proposed approach to obtain warrant under no recognizable rule or procedure focuses on the word "and" in the last quoted sentence from the Keith opinion. The issue is whether the opinion requires congressional standards be articulated as a prerequisite to judicial approval of a domestic intelligence warrant, or whether the "and" merely means that Congress may set standards i.e., the decision is just making clear that it does not preclude Congress from setting such standards.

Our approach to the USDC would be that since Congress has not yet acted and there is legitimate immediate need for intelligence electronic surveillance in this case, there is a void in the law, which can only be filled by judicial action.

Our application must also petition that no notice of the surveillance be given to those being surveilled, since this would render valueless the surveillance. Our petition could provide that we would come before the court, in camera, weekly, bi-weekly or whatever, and describe the value of the surveillance, petition for its continuance, and justify the necessity for not disclosing its existence to the persons surveilled. After the surveillance has served its purpose, notice can be given those persons.

Also, consideration must be given to which USDC we will make our application. Ordinarily the USDC with jurisdiction over the location of the telephone or place to be surveilled would be the appropriate court. However, the Supreme Court, in Keith, recognized that the disclosure required by the Government in domestic national security cases to support its affidavit might be so sensitive that only one court should have warrant authority for the whole county, e.g., the USDC or Circuit Court of Appeals in D. C.

Our action in this test case may be referred to as precedent or as guidance in subsequent consideration by courts or Congress. If we seek to limit application disclosure to one jurisdiction we should apply to the USDC, D. C., since it was suggested by the Supreme Court in Keith. Limiting this procedure to one USDC would be beneficial in that a uniform policy could be developed, which would give us fairly good guidelines in considering whether or not to make an application in a particular case in the future.

(Additionally, I think we might well expect a warrant requirement even for our foreign counterintelligence electronic surveillances in the future. Any precedent which could serve to limit the required disclosure in those cases to only one court should definitely be established).

If the court feels it must pass on our application for surveillance, as indeed it must under Keith, but feels that it lacks standards and procedures under which to determine the validity of our application, and therefore refuses to approve or deny our application, we should petition the Circuit Court of Appeals for a writ or mandamus ordering the District Court to act. If the Court of Appeals refuses to do this, we should petition the Supreme Court for a writ. Since approval or denial of a warrant is a matter within the discretion of the USDC based on the facts presented to him we will not be appealing his decision; but rather, in the absence of his decision, we will be requesting an order from a superior court directing him to act, one way or the other i.e., approve or deny the application.

In this manner we will get our surveillance or bring to a head the void in the law created by Keith, and perhaps spur Congress to action in providing a warrant or judicial review mechanism for domestic intelligence electronic surveillances.

I feel that the SLA Hearst kidnaping case is the best case we have had since the Keith decision to employ this tactic. It appears that little initiative will be taken by the DJ to formulate legislation providing for such a mechanism, without the impetus of a celebrated case. I feel that by following the strategy described above, absent judicial action, we can impress Congress with the need for legislation providing procedures for domestic intelligence electronic surveillance, and indicate to DJ, in its own words, "that the effect of the Keith decision is to deprive the Department of valuable intelligence information," and that its present position (not to seek enabling legislation) should be re-evaluated.

RECOMMENDATION:

Divisions Five and Six prepare affidavit to support an application for domestic intelligence electronic surveillances on specified known and suspected SLA members, and request approval of the AG to present the application and affidavit to the USDC, D. C.

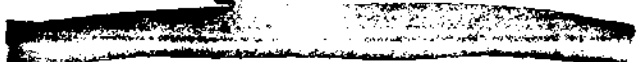

In response to the Director's inquiry concerning the feasibility of using rationalistic-model techniques to assist in selecting courses of action for locating kidnap victim Patricia Hearst, my memorandum of 3/6/74 advised that the limited data then available precluded effective use of these methods.

As a result of Mr. Cleveland's endeavors, on 3/19 the Laboratory representative handling this matter was placed in contact with [redacted] International Business Machines Corporation, who is considered their leading authority on the application and use of gaming and operations research. [redacted] was furnished the known factual data gathered to date, including information gained from the latest tape recording. It is his opinion that we still have insufficient input data to make any effective use of these methods. The Laboratory concurs in this opinion. [redacted] generously offered his continued cooperation and assistance.

We will continue to follow this matter closely. If we reach a point where we have sufficient geographical data to attempt gaming the Laboratory will contact the U.S. Army Engineer Waterways Experiment Station at Vicksburg, Mississippi, which can supply computerized terrain models.

FD-302 reflecting results of interview with [REDACTED] at Memphis 3/20-22/74, containing 24 page signed statement of [REDACTED] completed night of 3/22/74, containing copies of seven drawings of houses and areas in San Francisco and Portland. In this FD-302 [REDACTED] admits that during the interview he had furnished conflicting information and false information, knowing that it was a prosecutable offense to do so but still alleging that he has personal knowledge of a group of extremist individuals whom he alleges are involved in the kidnaping and holding of PATRICIA HEARST at a location in Portland, Oregon.

Also enclosed for Atlanta is a one page handwritten letter directed to [REDACTED] dated 3/20/74, signed by [REDACTED] which letter requests [REDACTED] to deliver to the bearer [REDACTED] his personal effects [REDACTED] account to [REDACTED] is [REDACTED] from which institution [REDACTED] was recently brought to Memphis for arraignment.)



Every effort was made to carefully question the information furnished by [REDACTED] and he admitted in numerous instances having embellished what he described as known facts and in numerous instances he changed his version of a particular story. At the outset, for example, he denied having any personal knowledge whatever concerning PATRICIA HEARST but stated he could furnish information which would lead to the location of a Bureau fugitive, DONALD DAVID DE FREEZE and he

could furnish information regarding the theft of military weapons and ammunition in Ohio. A later version was generally to the effect that the group he described was believed by him to be responsible for the HEARST kidnaping based on the fact that he had seen photographs of PATRICIA HEARST at the "headquarters" in San Francisco, but in this version he still maintained he had never seen or had any type of dealings personally with PATRICIA HEARST.

A later version encompassed his actually meeting and talking with PATRICIA HEARST in San Francisco as outlined in the statement. A still later version shifted the focal point to Portland, Oregon, where he claims he believes PATRICIA HEARST is now being held. After he furnished the latest version, he stated he saw the photograph of HEARST in Portland not in San Francisco as first alleged. There were numerous significant discrepancies of individual situations which he described.

No effort is being made to set forth all these discrepancies inasmuch as he has taken the position that the information in the signed statement is his final version and allegedly is the truth.

Agents made every effort to give him no benefit whatever of information already known to the Agents and after he signed the statement, Agents reminded him of a statement which he had furnished to Agents in Atlanta on 1/29/74, in which he accounted for his activities 1/10-29/74, and which is in great variance with his present statement. [REDACTED] merely shrugged his shoulders and stated that anything in the Atlanta statement that was contrary to the Memphis statement was false. He stated that immediately following his arrest he did not want to furnish any information which might have revealed his "real activities" during the period in question.

In spite of all of the information known about [REDACTED] it is realized that he still might possess information which might be of value. It is recalled that in a Memphis BR case where the Memphis Office had been unable to develop sufficient information to indict a known bank robber, [REDACTED] furnished information which he acquired while confined with one of the bank robbers and as a result of talking with that bank robber he was able to repeat in great detail information

furnished to him by that bank robber and was considered a prime witness in the trial of that bank robber and others. In fact, he was being held as a Federal prisoner in local custody at Marion, Ark., in connection with that bank robbery trial at the time he escaped on 1/10/74.

UACB, no offices, except Atlanta, will conduct any active investigation based on the enclosed FD-302 of [REDACTED] until so advised by the Bureau or San Francisco.

at [redacted] [redacted] to [redacted] After reading and discussing a form captioned, "Voluntary Appearance: advice of Rights," [redacted] advised that he had certain information which he felt was of value to the FBI, stating that his motive in furnishing the information was a desire to receive favorable consideration from the U. S. Attorney's Office as to a favorable recommendation with regard to his sentencing on a federal escape charge and also a favorable recommendation from the appropriate authorities as to his place of confinement after he is sentenced. He stated he desired to be confined in the Federal Correctional Institution at Sandston, Minnesota. [redacted] was advised by SA [redacted] that no commitment of any kind would be made to him by the Agents but that any information of value which he might furnish would be called to the attention of the appropriate prosecutive officials.

[redacted] thereafter furnished information, a part of which was reduced to writing in a 24 page signed statement, a copy of which appears on the pages which follow.

Immediately following the above signed statement will be set forth copies of seven drawings prepared with the assistance of [redacted] three of which drawings relate to what he referred to as the San Francisco "Headquarters" of the group he described, three of which relate to the area of what he described as Nancy Bee's house at [redacted] 6th Avenue in Portland, Oregon, and one of which relates to a body shop in Portland, Oregon where a panel truck was parked. These drawings are self-explanatory.

I, [REDACTED] wish to make the following free and voluntary statement to Special Agents [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] who have identified themselves to me as Special Agents of the FBI.

Through my attorney, [REDACTED] I have requested to talk with Agents of the FBI concerning matters which I believe to be under investigation by that agency.

At the present time I am a Federal prisoner and temporarily I am being held at the [REDACTED] [REDACTED] after being transported from the [REDACTED] [REDACTED] arraignment in U. S. District Court in Memphis after I was indicted by a Federal Grand Jury at Memphis as an escaped Federal prisoner.

At my request, Agents of the FBI met with me in the U. S. Marshal's Office on the afternoon of March 20, 1974, at which time my attorney, [REDACTED] and his associate, [REDACTED], were present. At the outset of this meeting, Agent [REDACTED] furnished to me a form captioned "Voluntary Appearance; Advice of Rights," which

form was revised to reflect that I was being held in the U. S. Marshal's Office at my request, and which form sets forth certain rights to which I am entitled and sets forth a waiver of those rights. I read and executed this form in the presence of the Agents and the two attorneys named.

Let me say at the outset that I know that I have the reputation of being a notorious confidence man, and I acknowledge that I am a confidence man and would point out as examples of my success in this regard the fact that I have been able to walk away from confinement on two separate occasions. My most recent venture in this regard was on [REDACTED] when I talked my way out of custody of local authorities at [REDACTED] where I was being held as a Federal prisoner.

On March 20 and 21, 1974, in the U. S. Marshal's Office, and later at the [REDACTED] which is located at the [REDACTED] I furnished voluminous and detailed information concerning a group of individuals, both male and female, black and white, members of which group have referred to themselves as the "Revolutionary Army" and as "the movement," some members of which have advocated violence in my presence, having made statements referring to "the Fascist Gestapo regime" in the

United States and having made statements to the effect that they intend to overthrow that "regime." In addition, I have information which makes me believe that some members of this group are responsible for the kidnaping of Patricia Hearst at Berkeley, California, on February 26, 1974, and that members of this group are presently holding Patricia Hearst at a location in Portland, Oregon.

I have furnished a number of different stories, some of which I know involve contradictions and conflicting statements. Some of the information which I have furnished has been false, and I have so informed the Agents. Let me state herethat my reasons for having furnished false information include the fact that I did not want to unnecessarily incriminate close friends ~~of~~ myself. In some instances I furnished false information merely as "window-dressing." In other instances I can only say that I furnished false information "out of force of habit."

I am fully aware, from my discussions with FBI Agents and from discussions with my own attorney, that it is a violation of Federal law to furnish false information to an FBI Agent concerning a material fact. I have requested that I be given the opportunity to furnish in writing what is the truth and only the truth, and set forth hereafter is the truth and only the truth.

I would like to state at the outset how I became acquainted with a group of extremist individuals who will be discussed hereafter. I have traveled widely throughout the

United States and have many friends and associates of both races in various cities in the United States. Among these are two black men, [REDACTED] whose home address is [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] but also well known by the nickname of "Honey Bee," and whose home address is [REDACTED] Sixth Avenue, Portland, Oregon. I have known both of these individuals over 10 years and consider them both close personal friends. I have done both of them favors and each of them considers me as a close personal friend. I have had dealings with both over a period of years, the details of which I do not believe pertinent to this interview.

Shortly following my escape from custody on January 10, 1974, I set about to contact [REDACTED]. Let me outline briefly my activities after January 10, 1974.

After "walking away" from the [REDACTED] jail, I traveled to Silver Springs, Maryland, and met with my girlfriend, [REDACTED] commonly called Kathy, at Apartment # 1817 [REDACTED] where she was [REDACTED] with [REDACTED] Kathy and I left Silver Springs, Maryland, in a 1973 white Chrysler New Yorker, Maryland license PG5431, which is registered to [REDACTED] but which

is in fact my automobile. We traveled to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and spent the night at the Downtown Holiday Inn.

On January 11, 1974, Kathy and I traveled in this Chrysler to [REDACTED] Columbus, Ohio, to see my friend, [REDACTED] whom I shall refer to hereafter as Charlie. Upon arriving at this address, we found present Charlie, his wife Wilma, and a black male unknown to me previously and introduced to me as "Cinque" and whose full name was later given to me at the time as Donald DeFreeze.

Kathy, Charlie, Cinque and I left this address and traveled in the above-mentioned Chrysler to a downtown Holiday Inn in Cleveland, Ohio, where Kathy registered as [REDACTED]. We left the downtown Holiday Inn and drove to a house at an unknown address in Cleveland which is the home of [REDACTED] a white male, his wife [REDACTED] a white female, and their child. While at this address, Charlie stated that, "We have big things going for us in California and we are going to San Francisco" the following day. He wanted to know if I wanted to become a member of this group. I told him, "No."

During this general conversation, Cinque on several different occasions would strike the coffee table with his

first and state, "The cobra will strike."

Also during this conversation Charlie furnished me two San Francisco, California, phone numbers, which he stated I could call any time I wanted to get in touch with Charlie. These numbers I do not now recall, but I recorded them in a green address book which was taken from me following my arrest in Atlanta, Georgia, on January 29, 1974. The numbers are recorded in code on the inside cover of this address book.

In addition, Charlie stated that while in California, he would be with another good friend of mine, "Honey Lee," mentioned above, for the next few weeks or months.

While at this address, I noticed stacks of pamphlets and other literature, on the cover of which was the emblem of a seven-headed cobra. I believed this to be radical literature but did not examine it.

Kathy, Charlie, Cinque and I returned to the hotel and upon arriving at the hotel, Cinque and Charlie separated from Kathy and me.

On January 12, 1974, Kathy and I drove the above Chrysler to Toronto, Canada, where we stayed at the Carla Motor Inn, and while there, wired Kathy's mother, who resides at Las Vegas, Nevada, asking for money, and Kathy's mother wired us \$500.

On January 13, 1974, I called Charlie in San Francisco at one of the two numbers he had given me, and Charlie asked if Kathy and I wanted to come to San Francisco. I said, "Yes." Charlie said, "Before you come, will you do us a big favor?" I replied, "Yes," whereupon Charlie gave me the name and address of [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Dayton, Ohio. Charlie stated that [REDACTED] was "our supplier of arms and ammunition and our demolition expert." Charlie asked me to furnish the [REDACTED] any assistance they might need in transporting guns and ammunition from Dayton, Ohio, to Portland, Oregon.

Kathy and I left Toronto in my Chrysler on January 13, 1974, and traveled to Dayton, Ohio, and to the address of [REDACTED]. At approximately 5:15 p.m., [REDACTED] arrived at this address in a green Pinto. Kathy and I introduced ourselves, and I told [REDACTED] I had a message from Charlie in San Francisco and that Charlie had asked me to come to [REDACTED] and give him any assistance he might need in moving arms to Portland, Oregon. Carl advised me that that had been taken care of.

At this point Kathy and I left [REDACTED] and, traveling in my Chrysler, we drove to Cleveland, Ohio, parked the Chrysler in the airport parking lot, and flew to San Francisco, California, arriving at San Francisco at

approximately 2:40 a.m. on January 14, 1974, where we checked into the Hilton Inn at the airport.

Early on the morning of January 14, 1974, I called one of the above-mentioned San Francisco telephone numbers in an effort to reach Charlie. However, I talked to an unknown person who later identified himself as Dennis, and Dennis told me that he would come over and pick up Kathy and me.

Approximately an hour and a half later, a Negro male, who introduced himself to me as Dennis, and a white female, who introduced herself to me as Nancy, arrived at the Hilton Inn in a 1968 black Ford Falcon four-door, which had an unusual over-sized, wrap-around rearview mirror. Kathy and I joined Dennis and Nancy in this car, and with Dennis driving, we traveled to a house on Fourth Avenue, which I believe to be in either the 700 or 800 block and which I will later describe in detail, and which house I will refer to hereafter as "San Francisco Headquarters" of the group in question.

In this house were Charlie, Cinque, "Honey Bee," and a white female whose first name was Dianne, whom I had not met before. This group sat around and drank, and Charlie discussed their "movement." He talked about the "Gestapo regime that is going to feel the bite of death." The group

talked generally regarding "the movement."

Not too long after our arrival at the address on Fourth Avenue, a white female, a white male, and a black female entered this address. I later determined the white female to be Patricia Hearst. Patricia Hearst made the statement, looking at me, "Who's the new stud in town?" Nancy introduced us but without naming Patricia Hearst. Patricia Hearst and I talked generally, primarily about Canada, and a group of us were standing together when I heard someone say, "Look here." I turned and recognized Jean Brewer holding a camera, and as I turned toward her, she took a picture. I believe this picture will show Patricia Hearst and me standing together. I have seen Jean Brewer since that time and she told me the film had not been developed as of the time I saw her.

Let me say here that the entire group was drinking beer and smoking pot on this occasion, and I specifically recall that Patricia Hearst got out a silver cigarette case and gave me one of her cigarettes, which she referred to as her own special brand.

Let me say here that the white male with Patricia Hearst on this occasion was definitely not ^{Steven WARD} ~~Steven Root~~, her boyfriend, whose picture I have seen in the press. The white

male with her was about 30 years of age, 5 feet 11 inches to 6 feet tall, 170 pounds, brown hair which was cut "square," whose name I do not know and whom I have never seen before or since. Let me also state that I do not know the identity of the black female with Patricia Hearst. The latter was about 23 years of age, 5 feet 5 inches, 120 pounds, and had an Afro hairstyle.

During this period, Charlie took me to the basement of this house and showed me a room which Charlie described as being a "prison." I have helped prepare a drawing of both this house and this special room which Charlie called a "prison." In this room referred to as a "prison" I observed at least two tape recorders. I also saw what I thought to be cassette-type tapes and what I will refer to as belts of the type used on Dictaphones. I also saw about four instruments of some kind which I can only describe as resembling some type of meter. These instruments were flat and the dimensions were 10 to 12 inches by 5 to 7 inches by 8 to 10 inches. There was a meter of some type near one end and at the other end there were two leads of different colors. I do not know what these instruments were.

During this period that Kathy and I were in this house, there were numerous other people coming and going.

Kathy and I were driven back to the motel in the above 1968 Black Ford Falcon.

On January 28, 1974, Kathy, Charlie, Nancy and I left the motel in a 1968 Ford Falcon in station wagon, followed by a white 1972 Mark IV Lincoln Continental containing Cinque, Dianne, Gato (a Negro male), and Phelma (a Negro female). We traveled to Portland, Oregon, to an address which I believe to be 1035 Sixth Avenue. I will separately furnish detailed information concerning this address, but let me state here I am not absolutely positive that the name of the street is Sixth Avenue. I immediately recognized this particular address as the home of "Honey Bee" inasmuch as in about 1971 I had lived with "Honey Bee" at this address for a period of about three and one-half months. I shall refer to this location hereafter as Honey Bee's house.

This house is known as the Portland Headquarters of this group, and there is curtailed movement insofar as who can come and go at this house. There are no children at this house, and the following persons have freedom of movement into and out of this house: Honey Bee, Charlie, Cinque, Nancy, Dennis, Gato, Kathy, myself, and two people I have not previously mentioned, namely Larry Swearingin (phonetic) and his wife Linda Swearingin, who actually live in a house directly behind Honey Bee's house. I have assisted in preparing detailed

drawings of Honey Bee's house and other houses in the immediate vicinity, as well as a detailed drawing of a "prison" on the second floor of Honey Bee's house.

In another room on the second floor, shown on the drawing, which I will refer to as the "ammunition room," I observed large quantities of weapons and ammunition, including at least six M-16 automatic weapons, two or more cases of hand grenades, at least eight greenish metal canisters of ammunition for the M-16's, and at least six different hand guns, including two .44 caliber weapons on .38 frames. I saw at least three or four rifles. In the ammunition room there is a rack in which the M-16's are stacked.

The drawing which I have assisted in preparing will show the layout of the various rooms on the second floor and on the first floor, but I would like to point out in particular the following facts:

The door knob on the front door of this house has been wired so that when electrical current is turned on, anyone touching this door knob will receive a severe electrical shock. This door knob is activated from a box located on the wall of the hall next to the den, as indicated on the drawing. In addition, in the living room, as shown on the drawing, there is a section set off by waist-high paneling, which is known as

the "bar and fast-service lunch area." In this area there is a trap door in the floor, which door lifts up. This trap door leads to a tunnel, which is high enough for a person to walk through, the floor of which is concreted, and the tunnel leads underground underneath an alley. The tunnel exits at a point in the basement of the house directly behind Honey Bee's house.

I would like to point out, as noted on the drawing, there are various other security devices, including armament, on various doors and windows of Honey Bee's house.

As depicted on the drawing I helped prepare concerning the address 1035 Sixth Avenue and the houses in the immediate vicinity, I would like to point out that the house at [REDACTED] Sixth Avenue is the residence of [REDACTED], a white female who is connected with this group. The house on the other side of 1035 Sixth Avenue, with an address of [REDACTED] Sixth Avenue, is the residence of Mr. and Mrs. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] a Negro male, is also a friend of the people occupying [REDACTED] Avenue.

In addition, directly across Sixth Avenue from [REDACTED] Sixth Avenue is a house in which a member of this group from [REDACTED] Sixth Avenue has been stationed, with a walkie-talkie, to act as a lookout from 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. each day to warn the occupants of [REDACTED] Sixth Avenue of any potential trouble to them.

Directly behind [redacted] Sixth Avenue, as depicted in the drawing of this area, is a house occupied by [redacted] and his wife [redacted] both of whom are also members of this group. It is from the basement of the Swearingin house that the tunnel, as shown on the drawing, leads underground to 1035 Sixth Avenue.

While in Honey Bee's house, I observed Dennis looking at a group of pictures and at least two newspaper clippings which including pictures, all of which were lying on the coffee table. The caption on the newspaper clippings identified a young white female in the picture as Patricia Hearst and an older white female as her mother. Each of the pictures which I saw depicted Patricia Hearst. At this point Nancy saw Dennis looking at these pictures and said to him, "What are you doing?" Dennis replied, "I'm looking at pictures of the pigeon." Nancy became extremely angry and told him to put the pictures up, which he did.

Thereafter I overheard Kathy and Charlie in a conversation, in which Kathy agreed to drive a "transport vehicle" to San Francisco from Portland. The conversation was to the effect that this vehicle was to be used to "bring the prisoner back."

I took Kathy aside and had an argument with her, telling her that she was "putting her head in a noose." Kathy told me, "What up. I know what I'm doing. I'm tired of this Fascist government and we'll teach them a lesson."

On January 16, 1974, while at [redacted] Sixth Avenue, I saw a 1969 or 1970 dark blue Ford drive up and park in front of this address. In this car were two individuals, one a white male named Gary and a white female named Mary Ann. One of them stated that "we have just come up from headquarters; is Charlie there?" I told them that Charlie was in the house but was busy and invited them to come into the house. They declined. Kathy came and sat in the back seat of this car. I went and got Charlie who came to the car. Either Gary or Mary Ann asked Charlie, "how many more of these dry runs do we have to make?" Charlie advised the people in this car that "it will be only a few more weeks"; that the transport vehicle was at Ann's; and stated "we need to be sure the transport van is in good shape."

Shortly thereafter Charlie and I drove in a 1967 white T-bird convertible which had been parked in front of [redacted] house at [redacted] Sixth Avenue and drove to the home of a white female named Ann who lives on Williams Avenue, exact address unrecalled. At that point we got from the garage at Ann's house what I will refer to as a bread truck.

This is a 1970 or 1971 Ford panel truck, dark green in color having two big reflector-type lights on the top of the cab and having a wire mesh between the driver's area and the rear of the truck. It has two doors on the rear and two spare tires, one mounted on each side of the truck. It also has a door on each side of the cab area. This truck is unusual in that it has a spare tank underneath the rear of the truck and which I was told holds 45 gallons of gas. It is equipped with a switch whereby when the regular tank is empty the gas in the auxiliary tank can be used. Charlie and I drove this truck to a body shop, address unknown, however, we got to this body shop by passing the Congress Hotel on Fourth Street continuing on Fourth Street past the Hilton Hotel where we turned left then down this new street to the Park Highland Hotel where we turned right on another street and continued on this street approximately one and one half to two blocks where we turned to the right into the body shop. Behind this body shop is a large commercial parking lot, name unrecalled, but it's the type of parking lot where an individual parking in this lot puts his payment for his parking in slots on a board. This is a drive-in type body shop and there were three black males inside. One of them was called "Tucker" a black male age about 30-40 with a scar running from a point near his left eye to the corner

of his pants on his left side. There was a second young black male in the garage described as being 6'4" and approximately 20 years of age. The third black male in this garage was under a car and I cannot describe him physically.

There is some additional information which I should furnish you. A couple of days after we arrived in Portland, I came upon Kathy making a recording at which time she was reading from a script and saying something about being a prisoner of the revolutionary army, stating that she was safe and well taken care of. She made a statement that no one should try to catch her or something to this effect. She referred to a large well equipped army and to automatic weapons. She mentioned something about medical units. I asked her what she was doing and she said, "just goofing around." Later on she told me that she was pretending to be Patricia Hearst. I know Kathy is an excellent voice impersonator and she can speak exactly like Patricia Hearst.

Let me also add that I took part in a recording along with Dennis and Cinque. All three of us read from scripts. Cinque identified himself as president of the revolutionary army. Dennis identified himself as the vice

president of the revolutionary army and used the name ~~Oscar~~ Oscar, or some similar-sounding name. I identified myself in the recording only as a general of the revolutionary army, using no name. The material we read included such statements as "the overthrow of the corrupt Gestapo machine that is now bleeding the hearts and pocketbooks of the American people at large." I considered making this tape a joke.

After staying at Honey Bee's in Portland two or three days I "split," leaving Kathy at Honey Bee's. I thereafter flew to Cleveland, got my car, drove twenty miles out of town and spent the night at Grandma's Hotel. The next day I drove to the home of [REDACTED] a friend of Kathy who lives in Takoma Park, Maryland. Susan has nothing whatever to do with "the movement." She is just a friend of Kathy. I discussed with her Kathy's involvement in the movement and Susan agreed to talk to Kathy in Portland. She called Kathy from her house and Kathy agreed that if I would return to Portland she would leave Honey Bee's house and return with me to Baltimore.

I flew to Portland, picked up Kathy and we then flew to Washington, D. C. where we went to her grandmother's,

[REDACTED] at apartment 65, [REDACTED] Northwest. I went to Raleigh, North Carolina, then to Atlanta and was later arrested by narcotics agents in Atlanta, Georgia, on January 29, 1974.

I have been in custody since that time. I have received three letters from Kathy and two letters from Charlie since that time and have talked with Kathy by telephone.

From these letters and from my conversations with Kathy I am confident that Patricia Hearst, as of approximately March 10 to 12, 1974, was being held at Honey Bee's house in Portland. Kathy, in both her calls and letters, has indicated to me that she was personally involved in the kidnaping of Patricia Hearst. In fact, Kathy told me in one of the calls that she took part in the actual kidnaping. In one of the letters Kathy referred to Patricia Hearst as her "stand in." I interpreted her reference to "stand in" as meaning Patricia Hearst in view of Kathy's impersonation of Hearst on the tape as outlined above. In another instance she referred to "babydoll" and I interpreted "babydoll" to be Hearst. The most recent letter is to the effect that her "stand in" is in good health and "will remain so until the final deadline." Kathy also mentioned she was "taking some things out to her,"

the weekend after my appearance in Memphis, which Kathy knew to be March 19, 1974. She has indicated to me she would visit me in the Memphis area after her return from Portland.

In one of the calls from Kathy she advised me that the last demand to be made by the group was for the release of a dozen or more prisoners presently in jails and safe conduct out of the country and when they are safely out of the country Patricia Hearst will be released. It has been generally understood that I would be included among such prisoners. Let me state here I have no intention of becoming involved in any such arrangement.

With regard to the letters which I have mentioned and which I received from Kathy and Charlie after I was arrested January 29, 1974, these letters, along with other personal effects, including my toilet articles, were left in my cell, cell # 4, "Seg 1" (which represents Segregation Unit # 1), U. S. Penitentiary, Atlanta, Georgia, in the possession of [REDACTED] when I was removed from the Atlanta Penitentiary recently to be brought to Memphis for arraignment on the escape charge.

I have read this and twenty two other pages about the two agents [REDACTED] and made [REDACTED]

and all other left hand copies of
each page. This statement is true and
correct to the best of my knowledge
and belief, which I swear to.

This is not other charges

SPECIAL MEMORANDUM, FEB. 23rd, 1974

To: Field Marshal Cinque, Symbionese Liberation Army

Re: Prisoner of War, Ms. Patricia Campbell Hearst

CC's: TV, Radio, Newspapers, and hundreds of other people around the world.

Field Marshal Cinque:

The Universal Youth Defense Association, Inc. (UYDA) is a non-profit, non-partisan, interracial organization, and your non-violent, humane objective commands our attention and understanding.

As a black man, and as Universal Chairman, UYDA, who has personally freed almost one hundred (100) youths, black and white, from reformatories, jails, and mental hospitals by petitions in courts across the Land, I stand ready to assist the SLA in any court. Further, the UYDA stands ready to assist you in the distribution of food to the poor and needy.

On the 5th, Ultimo, the UYDA (corporation No. 649996, Sacramento) declared itself defunct and no longer existing. However, we did not, and now shall not, file the formal application for dissolution with the Secretary of State. The UYDA changed its decision and, therefore, still exists.

We think the Patricia Campbell Hearst affair may not have occurred if the gloomy shadow of race prejudice did not so deeply sabrate our American way of life. But every multi-cultural society on earth has its race or ethnic problems, and this universality proves race prejudice to be a Law of Nature intended to separate kingdoms of life, not humanity.


All our senses, except our sense of sight, deal with the temporary, the transient, the forgettable. If, for example, a woman caresses the hand of her man that is cold, she may remember the occasion of the caress, but she will forget the coldness. If a man kisses a woman after she has drunk peppermint, he may remember the occasion of the kiss, but he will forget (be unable precisely to recall) the smell of peppermint. What we see, however, we tend to remember because our eyes deal with the relatively permanent, the fixed, the constant. Since it is inherent in human nature to reject that which is opposed to, or different from, what we judge to be right or good, a physical difference we constantly see we will not accept. That is the basis of race prejudice all over the world.

The solution lies with science, the organized, universal intelligensia. For the peace and happiness of all people everywhere, an organized, concerted, scientific attack upon race prejudice must be commenced. A Congress of Scientists should be convened for the aforesaid purpose; the study of anthropology in schools should be mandatory from first grade upward, and the First Amendment's guarantee of redress of grievances should be extended to youths by giving young Americans direct access to our courts.

For the gore in our society (race prejudice) has always prevented, and will continue to prevent, freedom for the people. The scientific understanding and arrest of race prejudice will accord freedom, peace, and happiness to all people everywhere.

Predicated upon the foregoing facts, I appeal to the TV, Radio, and Newspapers across the Land to broadcast and publish this Special Memorandum to Field Marshal Cinque, and I join the American Indian Movement in appealing to Field Marshal Cinque to release Patricia Campbell Hearst.

On 3/25/74, *[Redacted]*

[Redacted] met with the Director. Also present were Messrs. Miller, Gebhardt and Morrow. *[Redacted]* indicated that the Board of Directors of the Hearst Foundation was meeting tomorrow in New York and that the victim's father, Mr. Randolph A. Hearst, was going to propose to the Board that four million dollars should be turned over by the Foundation to an unspecified number of individuals who would hold the money in trust. Two million dollars would be paid for the continuation of the food program when the victim is released unharmed and the additional two million dollars would be paid by the Foundation for additional food after the first of next year. *[Redacted]* was concerned as to how the Board of Directors should react to Mr. Randolph A. Hearst's proposal.

[Redacted] indicated he opposed further negotiations and indicated strongly he did not favor agreeing to pay any amount of additional money. Throughout the discussion with *[Redacted]* the consequences of the alternatives that the Board faced in this decision were outlined. *[Redacted]* recognized the final decision was the Foundation's and that the FBI could not dictate a final decision to him or the Foundation, however, our position was made known. It was the consensus that he left the meeting with the Director firmly convinced that his position of no further negotiations or payment of money was correct and had been reinforced through this discussion.

[Redacted] also expressed some concern regarding the possibility of additional kidnapings with prominent families being the victims. This matter was also discussed and it was emphasized to *[Redacted]* that the FBI had a very creditable record in the recent rash of kidnapings which would undoubtedly serve as a deterrent.

After *[Redacted]* had departed it was agreed that the FBI would attend the meeting of the Foundation only if an invitation was forthcoming from the victim's father, Mr. Randolph A. Hearst inasmuch as all our dealings in this matter had been with him.

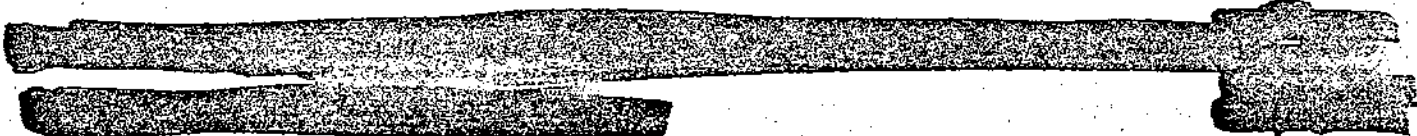

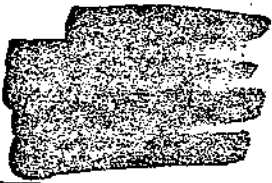

Q1 and Q2 were not identified with with material maintained in the Anonymous Letter File. Copies have been added thereto.

The typewriting on Q1 and Q2 is the same style as the typewriting on items Q41 through Q44 previously submitted in the case captioned "HEARNAP", which was determined to correspond to Laboratory standards for a Setag or Tangens style of type spaced 250 mm per 100 characters and used on typewriters manufactured under brand names including Calanda, Hermes, Japy, Princess, Royal and ABC. Some typewriting differences were observed in comparing the typewriting on Q1 and Q2 with the typewriting on Q41 through Q44 in the Hearnap case; however, due to the lack of a sufficient number of identifying characteristics, a definite conclusion was not reached whether these specimens were or were not prepared on the same typewriter.

No other typewriting on items previously submitted in the Hearnap case or in the case captioned "SYMBIONESE LIBERATION ARMY (SLA) EM" were determined to correspond to the above style of type.

Q1 and Q2 contain no watermarks, indented writing of significance or other characteristics to aid in definitely determining their source.

An eight-cent U.S. postage stamp, torn from a sheet of stamps, is affixed to Q1.

THE MONEY REPORTEDLY IS TO BE HANDLED BY A THREE-MAN COMMITTEE WHO, AS OF NOW, ARE NOT PICKED, AND THE COMMITTEE WOULD OPERATE IN SUCH A WAY THAT THEY WOULD RECEIVE A LETTER FROM THE SLA STATING THAT THE SLA HAD RELEASED THE VICTIM, AFTER WHICH RANDOLPH HEARST WOULD THEN SUBMIT A LETTER TO THE COMMITTEE ADVISING OF HER RELEASE. RANDOLPH HEARST WOULD HAVE NO DECISION IN REGARD TO THE DISPERSAL OF THE FUNDS WHICH WOULD BE LEFT UP TOTALLY TO THE COMMITTEE.

IN ESSENCE, HEARST HAS OBTAINED FROM THE CORPORATION A COMMITMENT WITH NO STRINGS ATTACHED FOR FOUR MILLION DOLLARS, WHICH MONEY, UPON VICTIM'S RELEASE, WILL BE COMMITTED TO AN IRREVOCABLE TRUST, THE TRUST TO BE ADMINISTERED BY THREE INDIVIDUALS WHO WILL HAVE COMPLETE DISCRETION AS TO THE DISPERSING OF THESE FUNDS.

HEARST INDICATED LATE P.M., MARCH 27, 1974, THAT HE MAY HAVE TO POSTPONE PRESS CONFERENCE SCHEDULED A.M., MARCH 28, 1974, SINCE HE HAS NOT WORKED OUT COMPLETE DETAILS. HE WANTS TO BE ABLE

TO ANNOUNCE AT THE PRESS CONFERENCE THE FACT THAT THESE FUNDS WILL BE AVAILABLE IMMEDIATELY UPON VICTIM'S RELEASE AND ALSO DISCLOSE THE IDENTITIES OF INDIVIDUALS SELECTED AS TRUSTEES.

ON MARCH 27, 1974, REVEREND CECIL WILLIAMS ADVISED HEARST AS FOLLOWS:

WILLIAMS STATED THAT IN RECENT CONTACT WITH DEATH ROW JEFF, THE LATTER INFORMED HIM THAT HE HAD BEEN IN CONTACT WITH THE SLA, THAT THEY, THE SLA, IS CONVINCED THE FBI IS AWARE OF THEIR LOCATION AND WILL ARREST THEM IMMEDIATELY UPON VICTIM'S RELEASE. ACCORDING TO DEATH ROW JEFF, VICTIM'S CAPTORS WANT COMPLETE ASSURANCE THAT THE FBI WILL GIVE THEM "RUNNING ROOM" IF THEY RELEASE VICTIM. FURTHER, THAT THEY WOULD LIKE HEARST, WILLIAMS, THE FBI, AND POSSIBLY ATTORNEY VINCENT HALLINAN, RAYMOND PORCUNNIER, HEAD OF CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS, REMIRO, AND LITTLE, TO GET TOGETHER IN A CONFERENCE TO HAMMER OUT SOME SOLID ASSURANCES. AFTER THIS DISCUSSION, IT WOULD BE UP TO REVEREND WILLIAMS, HEARST, AND THE FBI TO GET WORD TO THE SLA REGARDING THE GUARANTEE OF "RUNNING ROOM". JEFF STATED THE SLA IS NOW TIRED, VERY DEPRESSED, AND AT A HIGH POINT OF DESPERATION,

SAC MEETING WITH HEARST THIS EVENING, AND BUREAU WILL BE ADVISED OF PERTINENT INFORMATION.

IT IS NOTED THAT DEATH ROW JEFF, PRIOR TO HEARNAP, CLAIMED THAT HE WAS ONE OF THE EIGHT-MAN ORGANIZING COMMITTEE OF THE SLA

Dear Sir,

The unceasing reports of ransom demands of the people who claim to hold Patricia Hurst in safe custody encouraged me to write this letter and to offer a suggestion which I am confident would almost entirely eliminate any other such kidnappings in the future and it might well result in her safe return to her parents.

History clearly shows that compliance with demands of extortioners is a futile gesture. No sooner is one demand met than a new one is presented.

My suggestion follows: round up all known members of the group which admits to her abduction and detainment. Publicly announce and also directly inform leaders of that organization that unless she is released to the safe care of her parents within 48 hours that one of their members that you hold in custody will be executed and that one more will be executed every 24 hours thereafter until the girl has been returned and that if she is not returned or if she is returned dead or maimed that all the rest of the prisoners will be executed forthwith and that from that time on that any member of the group will be shot on sight; that there will be an open season on them.

Don't make the executions by rank, but by chance. Assign a number to each of them and don't let any of them know what his or her number is. Each day select a number by some chance method such as a roulette wheel or a Bingo cage, then take the chosen victim and execute him without delay.

It is well past time that we begin to reassert our dominion over the non-Aryans among us. Otherwise we shall be destroyed by their arrogant claims to equal rights, just as have all other civilizations which have bowed to their demands.

The typewriting on the address labels submitted in this case is too limited to definitely classify but closely resembles standards for the typewriter mentioned in the attached report. This determination was made through an exhaustive search of the Typewriter Standards File and in consultation with other government agencies.

For your assistance, it has been noted that the typewriting on the city and state portions of the addresses on the address labels on many of the envelopes submitted in this case is much heavier and is out of register with the name portions of the addresses on the envelopes, indicating that the name portion of the addresses was typed on each label by a separate typewriting operation than the city and state portions of the addresses. Although the significance of this is unknown at this time, the information is being furnished for your assistance.

Results of examination:

Q32, Q34, Q36, Q40, Q42, Q46, Q48, Q50 and the copy from which photograph Qc36 was made, are copies made from the same original utilizing what appears to be a mimeograph type process.

The typewriting on Q31, Q33, Q37, Q39, Q41, Q43, Q45, Q47, Q49 and the original from which Qc35 was made, is on pressure sensitive adhesive backed labels attached to the envelopes.

The conclusion was reached that the typewriter or typewriters used to prepare the typewriting on the envelopes submitted in this case were not used to prepare the typewriting on the master form which the copies of letters submitted in this case was prepared.

The typewriting on the address labels submitted in this case most closely resembles Laboratory standards for a Remmeyer pica type style, spaced ten characters per horizontal inch, and used on Royal Executive electric typewriters. The typewriting on the copies of letters submitted, which is elite type, spaced twelve characters per horizontal inch, is too limited and too indistinct to permit classification as to make.

Each sheet of paper, Q32, Q34, Q36, Q40, Q42, Q44, Q46, Q48 and Q50 bears the watermark "FRANKLIN EDGEMOND HOND 50% COTTON FIBER" which is registered to the HVE Company, Post Office Drawer 311, Wilmington, Delaware. The submitted envelopes contain no watermarks. The submitted items contain no indented writing of significance or other characteristics to aid in definitely determining their source. An eight cent U.S. Postal Service stamp is affixed to each of the submitted envelopes. These stamps were torn from a roll or rolls of stamps.

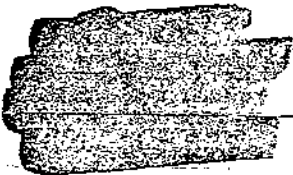

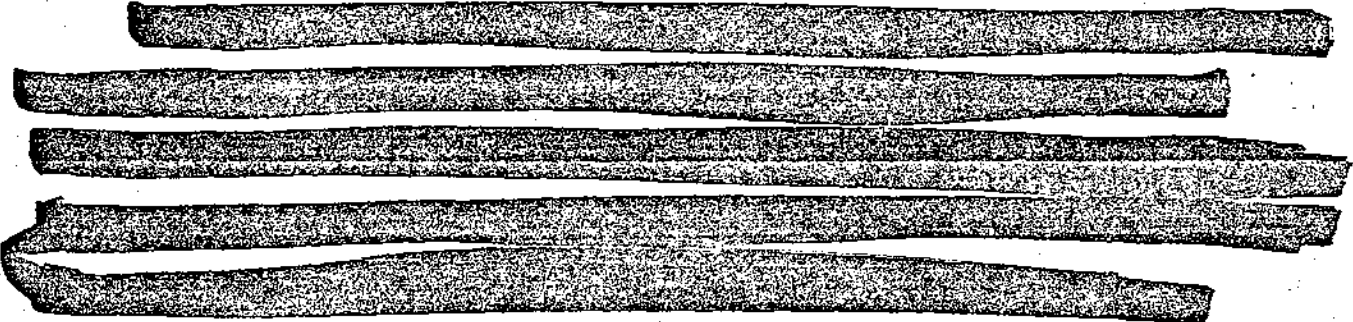

The Congressman asked what progress had been made in solving the Hearst case, registering some disappointment with our apparent lack of success. We advised the Congressman in confidence that the FBI has committed over 150 agents working full-time on this case. We have utilized all available investigative techniques in an effort to solve the case. We pointed out that we had identified several individuals we have every reason to believe are implicated in the abduction but to date we do not have legally admissible evidence in this regard. We pointed out that our posture has been one of doing everything possible to solve the case while at the same time not jeopardizing the safety of the victim. We outlined a number of specific things that we had done and are doing and assured the Congressman that we are leaving no stone unturned. The Congressman asked as to the position of the family and we explained that Mr. Hearst was obviously very concerned about the safety of his daughter and that his reluctance to take a hard line publicly prevented the FBI from taking certain publicly aggressive action such as grand jury subpoenas and search warrants. In regard to some of our investigative techniques, our 24-hour ~~bookout~~ *as outlined as were our unusual techniques* regarding soil and insect samples. At the outset, the Congressman appeared somewhat distant in his approach to us but at the termination of our visit, appeared more relaxed, cordial, and appreciative. He concluded our meeting on a rather confident note, stating he was sure the FBI would ultimately solve this case. He expressed his appreciation for our having given him this confidential briefing.

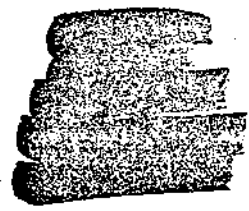





The HEARST family relates that PATRICIA HEARST does not smoke cigarettes and is never known to have been in possession of a silver cigarette case. [REDACTED] does name a [REDACTED] belonging to the group in Portland, Oregon, however, page 41 of the FD-302 covering his interview indicates that [REDACTED] picked up [REDACTED] photograph from a large group and undoubtedly read the name, inasmuch as it was on the front of that photograph.

[REDACTED] is believed to be a resident of East Bay, California. [REDACTED] could hardly have been in contact with JOSEPH REMIRO, inasmuch as REMIRO has been in custody since his arrest on January 10, 1974. The name of CINQUE has been published in newspapers throughout the country and [REDACTED] or any other prison inmate could have been knowledgeable of DE FREEZE's alleged connection with HEARNAP.

San Francisco is of the opinion that the Portland Division should check out the house at 1035 Sixth Avenue in Portland, Oregon where he believes HEARST is held and also make inquiries at the body shop in that city where a panel truck was parked. It is not believed that any further investigation is warranted.



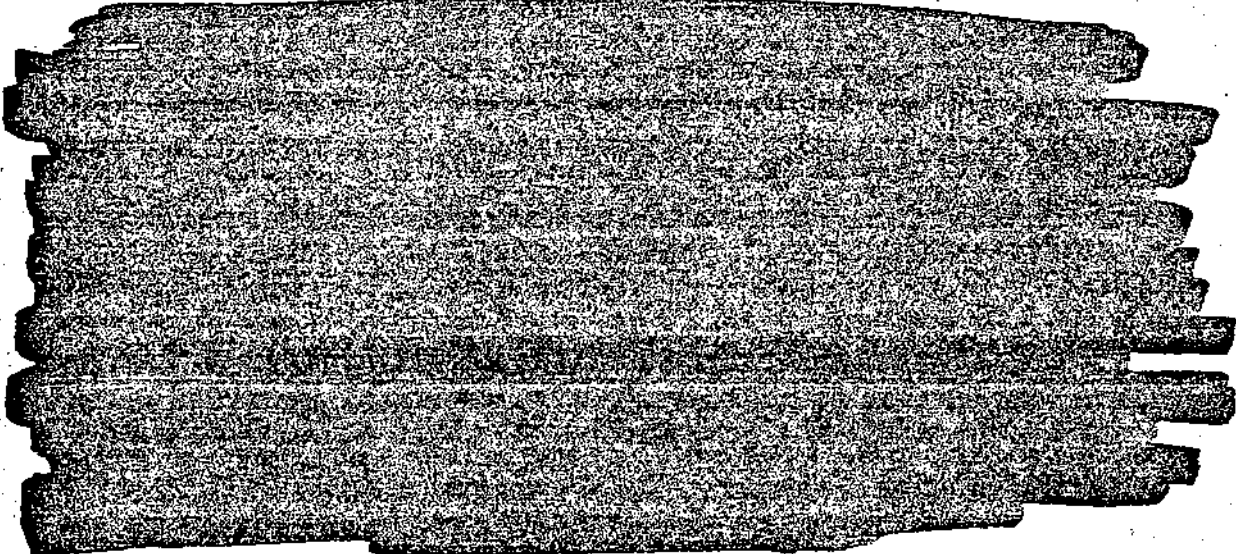



SUBJECT: ELECTRONIC SURVEILLANCE FOR INTELLIGENCE PURPOSES ON THE SYMBIONESE LIBERATION ARMY (SLA) IN THE PATRICIA HEARST CASE

Memorandum from Mr. Wannall to Mr. Miller, captioned as above, dated March 25, 1974, proposes that the FBI prepare an affidavit to support an application for a court-ordered surveillance to be used in the Hearst kidnaping case. In the absence of probable cause to obtain an order under Title III, the memorandum suggests that a Federal court be approached with the proposition that the court has a power and a responsibility to act in the absence of legislation where the surveillance is needed for intelligence purposes in order to solve the kidnaping.

As correctly pointed out in the memorandum, there is no authority in the statutory law to support the issuance of a court order for electronic surveillance in domestic matters other than Title III. The argument presented by the memorandum is that if a court could be convinced of the reasonableness of our need, the issuance of a court order would satisfy the Fourth Amendment and would then be a test case on the question of whether domestic intelligence electronic surveillance is necessary and proper under the law.

As commendable as this effort is, unfortunately I cannot agree with the recommendations in the memorandum. There are two basic flaws. The first difficulty is that while the Congress cannot by

statute expand the Constitution, it can by statute enact more restrictive limitations than are imposed in the Constitution. Such a statute imposing more restrictive limitations than the Fourth Amendment to the Constitution is Title 18, United States Code, Section 2511, which prohibits electronic surveillance except as specifically provided in Chapter 119 of Title 18 which deals with electronic surveillance. This statute, therefore, prohibits electronic surveillance except those which are commonly known as Title III court-ordered surveillances, and consensual monitoring.

The statute does recognize the authority of the President to act in regard to situations where he deems it necessary to protect the Nation against actual or potential attack or other hostile acts of a foreign power, to obtain foreign intelligence information deemed essential to the security of the United States, or to protect national security information against foreign intelligence activities. The decision of the Supreme Court in the Keith case indicates that this exception in the statute recognizes Presidential authority only in regard to situations other than surveillances concerning domestic organizations or groups.

Therefore, the legal conclusion is that while it might be possible to satisfy the constitutional requirements in the Fourth Amendment, we are prohibited by statute from undertaking electronic surveillance of a domestic organization except under the procedures prescribed by Title III.

The second problem with the proposal is a practical problem. I do not agree that a case involving the life of a kidnap victim should be used as a test case where it is very likely that the district court would doubt its authority to issue such an order. The matter would then be reviewed by a court of appeals and perhaps even by the Supreme Court of the United States. This judicial review would generate enormous publicity and would be exceptionally controversial. It seems to me that such action on the part of the FBI could be called irresponsible if it resulted in the increased likelihood that the victim would not be returned unharmed.

RECOMMENDATION:

For the above two reasons, it is my recommendation that the Hearst kidnaping case not be used as a test vehicle to establish the authority of the FBI to undertake electronic surveillance in domestic cases for intelligence purposes outside of the procedures of Title III.





The typewriting on the submitted manila envelopes and letters signed "S.L.A." is a similar spacing and type style to the typewriting on Q41 through Q44, previously submitted; although, due to the limited amount of comparable typewriting and the lack of sufficient individual identifying characteristics, a definite conclusion was not reached whether these items were prepared by the same typewriter.

However, some possible style differences were observed in comparing the typewriting on Q41 through Q44 with the typewriting on the currently submitted items referred to above.

The conclusion was reached that the typewriting on the submitted items was not prepared by any of the typewriters used to prepare other items submitted in this case, the typewriting on items submitted in case captioned "SYMBIONESE LIBERATION ARMY (SLA) EM" or typewriting on items submitted in the case captioned "AUGUST SEVENTH GUERRILLA MOVEMENT (ASGM) EM."

The typewriting on the submitted manila envelopes and letters signed "S.L.A." most closely corresponds to Laboratory standards for a Setag pica style of type, spaced 250 millimeters per one hundred characters, used on Singer portable typewriters. Similar Setag type styles are used on typewriters manufactured under brand names including Calada, Hermes, Japy, Princess and Royal.

The typewriting on the photocopies of literature contained in Q138 through Q141 corresponds to Laboratory standards for a pica style of type, spaced ten characters per horizontal inch used on Underwood and Olivetti typewriters.

The Q138 through Q141 items bear no watermarks, indented writing of significance or other characteristics to aid in definitely determining their source. The eight cent U.S. Postal Service stamps, affixed to the submitted manila envelopes, were torn from a booklet or booklets of stamps.

This statement will be made available to the wire services at 3:00 p.m., Pacific Standard Time, this date.

The text of the statement is as follows:

3/30/74

Greetings to the poor and oppressed people of the world.

Greetings to Comrades Russell J. Little and Joseph M. Remiro, now prisoners in the Tiger Cages of the Alameda County Jail. Your Comrade Death Row Jeff wishes to express solidarity with the communique issued by my comrades Russell J. Little and Joseph M. Remiro on 3/28/74. Your brothers and sisters are truly soliders of the people and are more beautiful than life itself to me. In furtherance to my Comrades communique of 3/28/74, I hereby suggest to General Field Marshal Cinque that it would be for the best interest of the poor and oppressed people to start negotiations as soon as possible with Randolph Hearst, to release the prisoner of war Patricia Hearst. I have been assured that upon the release of the prisoner of war, four million dollars will be placed in the appropriate organization for the purpose of feeding the poor as per the instructions of the SLA. Negotiations should deal with any combat units that may be pinned down in the field.

He realized considerable controversy exists concerning the possibility that both he and PATTY HEARST are in some way implicated in a conspiracy involving her kidnap. WEED denied that he or PATTY HEARST had any prior knowledge about the kidnaping and hoped that all controversies could be resolved as a result of the polygraph examination. WEED explained that he realized that many of his public statements were somewhat radical but he purposely was attempting to straddle the fence between the Symbionese Liberation Army's (SLA) demands and the FBI's investigation. WEED explained that he felt this posture was necessary to help protect PATTY HEARST from physical harm and could possibly expedite her release if the SLA were convinced that neither he nor PATTY HEARST would testify against them.

During the polygraph interview WEED appeared to cooperate to the best of his ability and gave every indication of sincerely wishing to resolve the controversy surrounding both he and PATTY HEARST. He did not wish to restrict the questions in any manner.

Significant emotional responses were obtained to various non-relevant-type questions for comparison purposes. No significant reactions indicative of deception were obtained to any relevant-type question. Based on the overall interview, it does not appear that WEED has guilty knowledge or is a conspirator to this kidnaping.

BACKGROUND REGARDING THE
SYMBIONESE LIBERATION ARMY (SLA)

Date of transcription 3/4/74

[redacted] California, telephone [redacted] was advised of the identities of the interviewing agents. [redacted] was advised that [redacted] was being interviewed concerning the research he had done on the Symbionese Liberation Army (SLA), the HEARST kidnapping, and the threat on his life by two black males that claimed to be members of the SLA. [redacted] appeared quite concerned for his personal safety at the time of his interview. He provided the following information, which is arranged in chronological order as it occurred with [redacted]

[redacted] advised that he is [redacted] and is in [redacted]

[redacted] assigned the entire class a research project on the origin and formation of the SLA. This assignment was to be handled by each class member on an individual basis. [redacted] stated that his research and investigation was considerably more extensive than the rest of the class, inasmuch as they limited their investigations to the various media accounts of the SLA.

After the assignment was made, [redacted] went to Doc [redacted] Bureau of UCB and read all the newspaper accounts of the SLA.

[redacted] then contacted the Oakland Police Department, Oakland, California, and spoke with a Sergeant [redacted] and Captain [redacted]. [redacted] stated that [redacted] and [redacted] did not reveal much about the SLA. [redacted] speculated that the group must be a cold blooded group. [redacted] advised [redacted] that there was no evidence of any prior organization of this kind in the United States. [redacted] advised [redacted] that there may be

more arrests of friends of LITTLE and REMIRO. [redacted] advised [redacted] that there is no logic in killing someone in cold blood, referring to the murder of MARCUS FOSTER, Superintendent of Oakland Schools, for which LITTLE and REMIRO were charged.

[redacted] then contacted the Concord District Attorney's office, Concord, California, where he talked with a Mr. WALKER, Chief Deputy District Attorney, assigned to the LITTLE and REMIRO case. WALKER advised [redacted] that he had no comment by stating, "We don't want to do anything to necessitate a change of venue."

[redacted] then contacted TIM FINLEY, a reporter for the "San Francisco Chronicle" newspaper, because FINLEY had done extensive investigation and reporting on the SLA. [redacted] advised that he and FINLEY exchanged theories and speculations on the SLA. FINLEY suggested that [redacted] look into the Philadelphia Crime Commission and the "Philadelphia Inquirer" newspaper for January, 1970. FINLEY and [redacted] discussed REMIRO's involvement in the drug rehabilitation center in New Jersey while REMIRO was in the armed forces. This was during 1969-70. FINLEY advised [redacted] that RAY SPARKS, another SLA member, was in New Jersey at the time REMIRO was. However, [redacted] advised that his investigation determined that SPARKS had been in prison in California since 1966. [redacted] advised that FINLEY's theory was that the SLA was in fact the Black Mafia. [redacted] felt that FINLEY was on to something, and that he would approach his investigation from the Black Mafia angle. [redacted] advised that black individuals reported as members of the Black Mafia were reported by the "Philadelphia Inquirer" as indicated by the grand jury.

[redacted] began doing background investigation on REMIRO, LITTLE, and NANCY LING, but developed no startling information that had not already been printed. [redacted] advised that neither of the three individuals fitted the revolutionary violence pattern. LITTLE and LING were on dope. FINLEY advised MYLERS that the day before the MARCUS FOSTER killing, REMIRO installed a smog device on LING's car.

[redacted] then checked University of California, Berkeley, records to determine LING's dates of attendance at UCS.

[redacted] then talked to [redacted]

[redacted] advised this was the first of four contacts with [redacted] advised that LING was a good kid and worker, into the movement, and wanted to help people. [redacted] advised [redacted] that LING would use any kind of dope, including heroin, but was not addicted. She could stop dope at any time. [redacted] advised [redacted] that he did not know LITTLE or PEMIPO. [redacted] advised [redacted] that he could contact a friend of LING's, [redacted] through [redacted] a reporter for the "San Francisco Chronicle". [redacted] did not know the relationship of [redacted] to [redacted] advised he was not able to contact [redacted] at this time because the Chronicle advised him she was in Israel.

[redacted] advised his investigation became a little stagnant at this point. He would stop and ask people on the street about their theories on the SLA. This included police, UCB students, and professors, and newspaper reporters, etc. At this point, he talked over things with his journalism professor. [redacted] advised that his professor attended a private party for the ex-governor of Wisconsin, now a Congressman or Senator from Wisconsin and a friend of Professor [redacted] advised that Professor [redacted] evidently became intoxicated at the party and "shot off his mouth" about [redacted] work on the SLA and Black Mafia, which the professor exaggerated. This party was attended by reporters, etc. [redacted] advised that [redacted] of the "Washington Post" newspaper called him at home the day after the party and asked him about the FOSTER killing and the SLA. [redacted] gave [redacted] the benefit of his theories and so advised [redacted] that his work was purely speculation and nothing else.

[redacted] then recontacted [redacted] She came over the next evening and they went to a restaurant on College in Berkeley, which was known to [redacted] and discussed their theories on the SLA and the FOSTER killing. [redacted] inquired with [redacted] about [redacted] did not want to discuss [redacted] and told [redacted] to forget her name altogether. [redacted] stated to [redacted] "Just don't even talk about it, just don't even ask." After their dinner, [redacted] dropped [redacted] off at his apartment. [redacted] advised that thirty minutes later, [redacted] called him to say, "I'm really sorry we mentioned her name [redacted] Please, please, forget it." [redacted] stated that he started to clown around by saying, "Whose name? You didn't mention any name to me," in an effort to reassure [redacted]

██████████ then talked to Professor ██████████ who apologized concerning his activities at the party.

PATRICIA CAMPBELL HEARST was kidnaped at this time.

██████████ telephoned Sam FINLEY, "San Francisco Chronicle", again, and they exchanged speculations on the HEARST kidnaping.

██████████ then went to talk to ██████████ again and asked about ██████████ and how she could be reached. ██████████ advised ██████████ that he did not want to talk about ██████████. ██████████ said ██████████ was in trouble, but would not elaborate. ██████████ advised ██████████ to talk to that ██████████ nick about

██████████ stated he went back to talk to ██████████. ██████████ said ██████████ is in the SIA and is a friend of mine. ██████████ advised ██████████ that he is in on the kidnaping. ██████████ asked ██████████ how he knows so much, and ██████████ advised, "I have brothers who talk to me."

██████████ then contacted ██████████ again during the course of the conversation. ██████████ provided ██████████ with a new telephone number for ██████████. ██████████ advised he recalls that the number was 549-██████████, or some other four digit sequence with a seven in it.

██████████ called the telephone number provided by ██████████. ██████████ was answered, who ██████████ advised sounded black. ██████████ said "Hi, Sam". The black male said, "Just a minute."

A female answered saying, "Hello," and ██████████ said, "I'm a reporter for the "Daily Californian" newspaper (not giving his name) at UCR." The female said, "Why should I talk to you." ██████████ stated "I'm a friend of ██████████ and LING's. The information you give me I'll keep your name out of." ██████████ at this point began asking ██████████ questions, which are set out verbatim below.

Are you in trouble?

No son, we're all taken care of.

Are you part of SLA?

I'm part of the United Symbionese Federated Forces.

What do you look like?

I'm about 5'8", I have blue eyes, blond hair. I weigh about 160 pounds.

(laughing) You don't have to tell me that.

(laughs)

She's talking about a chick who looked like that.

I was there when they ripped her off.

What do you mean?

I was there when they kidnaped that HEARST girl.

Can you tell me about the United Symbionese Federated Forces?

I want to help the people, the brothers, keep them happy.

[redacted] stated that [redacted] not somewhat garbled or historic at this point.

Is there dope involved in the SLA?

How did you know about that?

A lot of people know about that. They are starting to kick that around.

That's how we get our bread.

Can you explain it?

to get our dope from back east. All kinds of dope. We approached the Black Panther Party to help us distribute the dope out here (west). They turned us down and told us to stay out of Oakland.

Do you know anything about the Black Mafia? Is there any connection?

(Silence)

Do you know anything about the Black Mafia? Is there any connection?

Do you know about that?

What people are talking about that. Is it true?

Your office is not part of it isn't.

Can you explain that?

It's how we make our money. They help get it for us, but we do all the rest.

Do you know REMTROY?

He is one of us. He is helping us.

Does REMTROY have a connection back there in Philadelphia or New Jersey?

I don't know.

IS There anything you can tell me about the Black Mafia out here?

No, not really.

You told me this much, why can't you tell me more?

I talk to you when I want to talk!

Calm down. I'm just asking questions.

[redacted] advised that at this point, he tried to calm [redacted] down by trying to get her to talk about herself.

What do you do?

I'm in the Federation. I don't like the army (SLA). They're not part of us. We try to help the people -- Give them what they want.

DE FREEZE any part of it (SLA)?

Yeah, he is a brother. He is leading. He wanted to use it. He wants to make it political and help the people. He sounds good but he is not with the rest of us. He wants to make us into something we're not.

At this point, [REDACTED] starts discussing the differences between the federation and the army and the fact that DE FREEZE is a leader for only a small portion of the total group. [REDACTED] advised that his impression of [REDACTED] statements concerning DE FREEZE was that DE FREEZE wanted to control the whole group, but at this point was only able to control the SLA.

Was he (DE FREEZE) part of the kidnaping?

I don't know. I want to tell you something.

Sure, go ahead.

The SLA isn't really part of the federation. They are more political. They are getting into things we don't want to get into.

Like what?

You'll see!

[REDACTED] advised that there was noise in the background at this point in the conversation, [REDACTED] said:

I've got to get going.

I have a couple more questions.

Anything special?

5: Just some more questions.

6: I gotta go. (At this point, she hung up.)

[redacted] advised that his phone conversation with [redacted] took place on February 11, 1974, around 6:30 PM, and lasted for ten to twelve minutes.

[redacted] advised that his investigation was at somewhat of a standstill at this point.

[redacted] advised on February 13, 1974, at approximately 4:30 or 3:45 AM; he left his apartment en route to his journalism class at UCR carrying his journalism notebook. As he left the front of his apartment building, he noticed two black males leaning against a wall at the veterinary hospital which is across (south) from his apartment building. [redacted] walked east on Haste Street for approximately thirty yards, when he was approached from the rear by the same two black males, who evidently had crossed the street and come up from behind him.

The conversation between [redacted] and the two blacks is set out below:

Black Male #1 (#1):
Black Male #2 (#2):

#1: Hey you [redacted]

#2: Yeah.

#1: We're brothers from the SLA.

#2: Oh yeah!

#1: Did you talk to [redacted]

#2: Yeah.

#1: That's just a bad thing to do.

[redacted] advised that the blacks were approximately three or four feet away at this point. #1 walked up and put his left hand on [redacted] right arm. [redacted] tried to back away and #1 tightened his grip.

#1: You been talking about the SLA?

[redacted]: I've been doing some work on it.

#1: You know about the dope?

[redacted]: I know a little bit.

#1: You had better forget it.

[redacted]: Why?

#1: We don't want you to talk about it. (tightens grip)
If you talk about it, we'll find you and get you.

At this point, #2 reached around behind [redacted] and grabbed his journalism notebook and looked through it page by page, ripped out one page which contained [redacted] number, where to find [redacted] notes from [redacted] phone conversation, and miscellaneous scribblings.

#1: We'll keep this (referring to ripped out page).

#2 then handed the notebook back to [redacted]

[redacted] described the two black males as follows:

[REDACTED] advised that the two blacks departed west towards Shattuck Avenue and crossed Haste Street to pass in front of the Veterinary Hospital. As they departed, black #1 said to [REDACTED] "You better shut up or we will get you." [REDACTED] watched as the blacks turned the corner on Shattuck Avenue towards Oakland.

[REDACTED] advised that he continued to school after being arrested by the blacks. He stopped on the way and bought a cup of coffee. [REDACTED] advised that after he arrived at school he attended his Journalism class, but told no one about the incident with the blacks until a couple of days later when he told [REDACTED] the "Daily Californian" newspaper at the University of California at Berkeley (UCB).

[REDACTED] advised he told no one else until he received a letter on February 20, 1974, which threatened his life.

[REDACTED] advised that the letter was addressed to him at his apartment and was picked up from the mail box by one of his roommates [REDACTED] who delivered it to [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] advised that in addition to himself, his roommates - [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] his girlfriend - [REDACTED] two classmates [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] his Journalism Professor - [REDACTED] Officer [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] of the Berkeley Police Department (BPD), had read and handled the letter.

[REDACTED] advised that no other people knew about the letter. He advised he quit any and all investigation concerning the Symbionese Liberation Army (SLA) and HEARST kidnaping after he received the letter.

[REDACTED] described the letter as a copy of the SLA Communiqué #3, which concerned prisoner or war PATRICIA CAMPBELL HEARST dated February 4, 1974, clipped from the "San Francisco Chronicle" newspaper. [REDACTED] advised the

The letter had individual letters circled in red and when put together spelled out, "Remember February 1948" and the fourth paragraph from the text of the letter was underlined in red pencil, which read, "This court appeals the public and directs all combat units in the world to shoot to kill any civilian who attempts to witness or interfere with any operation conducted by the people's forces against the fascist state." [redacted] provided the letter to the interviewing Agents for processing by the laboratory.

[redacted] was shown the HEARNAP photo album. [redacted] he did not recognize any of the photographs except [redacted] as one of the individuals that accepted him. The following individual names appeared in the HEARNAP photo album:

[redacted] Street, Apartment 203, Berkeley, California, was advised of the identity of the interviewing agent. He was advised that he was being re-interviewed concerning any additional information he may have concerning the Black Liberation Army (BLA) or the HEARST kidnaping. [redacted] provided the following information:

[redacted] was at the University of California at Berkeley (UCB) campus coffee shop, which he thinks is called the Terrace, located next to the student lounge, when he overheard a conversation between an Asian female and a white male concerning JANEY LING's cabin. [redacted] stated this conversation occurred on the same day that he initially contacted the Berkeley Police Department with information concerning the HEARST kidnaping.

[redacted] stated that the Asian female was telling the white male about her friendship with LING when LING was a student at UCB. [redacted] overheard the Asian female say that she and LING often went to LING's cabin. The white male asked where LING's cabin was and [redacted] overheard the Asian female give the following directions:

"Take frontage road which is on the west side of the Redwood Tunnel to Westmoreland Drive until it dead ends. Then walk fifty yards to the right where you should pick up a foot trail for one half mile until you come to four cabins. LING's cabin is the third cabin."

The Asian female said there are always a bunch of people around some of the cabins.

[redacted] advised that he wrote these directions down in his notebook. [redacted] advised that he had never been to or tried to locate the cabin, but had provided the information to the Berkeley Police Department, which they obviously misinterpreted and thought that he had been there.

[redacted] described the Asian female who was sitting down at the table next to him as approximately 22 - 23 years of age, black hair, three inches below shoulders. [redacted] described the white male as 22 - 23 years of age, dark curly hair, two inch beard and mustache, wearing a CPO coat, yellow and green in color.

[redacted] advised that he had no particular impression of [redacted] a reporter for the "San Francisco Chronicle". [redacted] had talked to about the SLA and [redacted] did feel that [redacted] was providing him a telephone number for [redacted] was getting him to do all of her legwork as a reporter. [redacted] did not have any further contact with [redacted]

Date 3/19/74

[REDACTED] was contacted at his residence, East Palo Alto, California, by Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). After being advised of the identities of the interviewing Agents, [REDACTED] was advised that he was to be interviewed concerning his possible knowledge of and association with the Republic of New Africa (RNA) and Swaziland Liberation Army (SLA) organizations.

[REDACTED] appeared to be reluctant to discuss his association with the RNA as he would not furnish any information about the number of persons involved with the RNA at Vacaville State Prison nor would he discuss the names of any of those RNA associates at Vacaville or the philosophy and objectives of the RNA. He stated that the FBI must have read the RNA literature and therefore the FBI should already know the objectives and philosophy of the RNA.

[REDACTED] did acknowledge that he had joined the RNA at Vacaville stating words to the effect that when a person is poor and in prison that person will attempt to seek help from anyone he thinks will help him. [REDACTED] declined to comment as to how he had been recruited into the RNA. He stated that he would again join the RNA if that were possible as he agrees with some RNA objectives. [REDACTED], however, said that he has not been affiliated with the RNA since he was paroled from prison two years ago.

[REDACTED] acknowledged that he had formerly held the position or title of [REDACTED] the RNA Chapter at Vacaville, but he again refused to name any other RNA member or associate that he might have known there. [REDACTED] said that he does not plan to become involved in violent activities or associate with the SLA or any other violence-oriented group as he does not want to return to prison.

[REDACTED] further acknowledged that he had known DONALD DAVID DE FREEZE while both were incarcerated at Vacaville. [REDACTED] stated that he thought DE FREEZE was still in prison and [REDACTED] expressed surprise in learning that DE FREEZE had escaped from prison. [REDACTED] advised that he has had no contact with DE FREEZE since he, [REDACTED], was paroled and he knows nothing concerning DE FREEZE that would assist the FBI in locating DE FREEZE. He declined to furnish any names of individuals who might be associated with DE FREEZE. [REDACTED] stated that DE FREEZE is known as "CINQUE", but [REDACTED] said that three or four other prison inmates at Vacaville had also used that name. [REDACTED] also acknowledged having heard the SLA tape recording which contained the voice of an individual identified as "CINQUE", who is involved in the SLA kidnaping of PATRICIA HEARST. [REDACTED] said that he does not know if the voice on the tape is identical to that of DE FREEZE as it has been nearly two years since [REDACTED] spoke with DE FREEZE at Vacaville. [REDACTED] denied any knowledge concerning the SLA and the kidnaping of PATRICIA HEARST. He stated that he had first learned of the organization known as the SLA as well as the kidnaping of PATRICIA HEARST in reports from the news media. He further denied that he had ever recruited members for the SLA.

[REDACTED] stated that he had formerly worked for the Black Cultural Association (BCA) in Berkeley, California, upon his release from prison two years ago. He advised that nearly every black prison inmate in California has become affiliated with the BCA as this organization offers black inmates one of the few places where they can go to relax and enjoy themselves without fear of being stabbed or attacked.

[REDACTED] advised that he was "shooting" drugs at the time he entered prison approximately four years ago and after serving a two year sentence he had worked for the East Palo Alto, California, Drug Abuse Center, which has closed down due to a lack of financial support.

[REDACTED] stated that he is presently unemployed and on vacation although he teaches reading and English to poorly educated black people at the Nairobi College in East Palo Alto, California. He plans to continue his education as he believes

there are many black people who have gone through school without learning to read and he believes that he can do something to help them improve their reading skills. He stated he is also studying martial arts specializing in karate or Taekwon-do.

[REDACTED] further indicated that his future plans include buying a house with some money that he has in the bank and to get married in August, 1974.

[REDACTED] also known as [REDACTED] California State Prison (CSP) Number [REDACTED] acknowledged that he wrote to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) on February 25, 1974, inasmuch as he had been informed by a Department of Corrections official that he was under investigation as a member of the Symbionese Liberation Army (SLA). He stated this had troubled him a great deal since it was not true and he wanted to clear the matter up.

[REDACTED] informed that he was [REDACTED] Black Cultural Association (BCA) at California Medical Facility (CMF), Stockville.

[REDACTED] He stated that during [REDACTED] outside elements were able to divert the direction of the BCA into thinking along their ideologies of socialism, revolution, etcetera. He stated he opposed this type of thinking and was able to prevent this from happening while he was [REDACTED]

Some of the worst agitators from the outside who attempted to exert their thinking and philosophy on the Black inmates were RUSSELL LITTLE, DAVID GUNNELL, JEAN CHAN, ROYAL STEINER, WILLIAM WOLFE; [REDACTED]

These people attended the BCA meetings at CMF, Stockville, on Wednesday and Friday nights. They almost always singled out a certain group of blacks and engaged them in discussion on class struggles, revolutionary teachings, revolutionary action, socialism, etcetera. Among the inmates involved with this particular group were [REDACTED] DONALD DE FREEZE, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] These inmates would always gather with the aforementioned individuals and discuss their revolutionary ideas. They would change the conversation when he came around because they knew he disagreed with them and he would have taken action to prevent them from decaying the real principle of the BCA.

[REDACTED] informed that he has watched a lot of television news programs concerning the HEARST kidnaping and the kidnaping tapes played. He stated that one individual on the tape, who identifies himself as Field Marshal [REDACTED] of the SIA, is definitely the voice of DONALD DE FREEZE.

[REDACTED]

[REDACTED] stated he knows nothing about the SLA other than what he has heard on television. He has no personal knowledge that the SLA was formulated out of the BCA organization in Macaville, California, but stated that a lot of the same people seem to be involved in both, so he reasons that there must have been some connection.

He stated that he has formed many personal opinions about the SLA. He feels that [REDACTED] and DE FREEZE are on a super-long trip, but are now in deeper than they wanted to be. He is sure that both want out now but do not know how to get out.

[REDACTED] stated that both DE FREEZE and [REDACTED] are cowardly men. He stated in his opinion, neither would be capable of killing PATRICIA HEARST. He feels their ultimate "move" will be to flee the country for asylum in some foreign country. He stated further that if [REDACTED] and DE FREEZE are involved, they would be receiving their financial support from

He would not elaborate but stated he has heard through prison channels that "Death Row Jeff" may have some contact with the SLA.

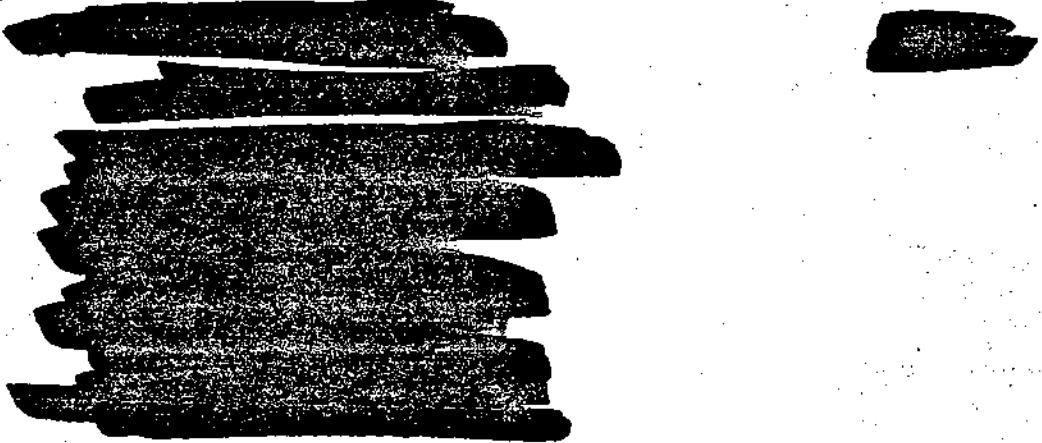
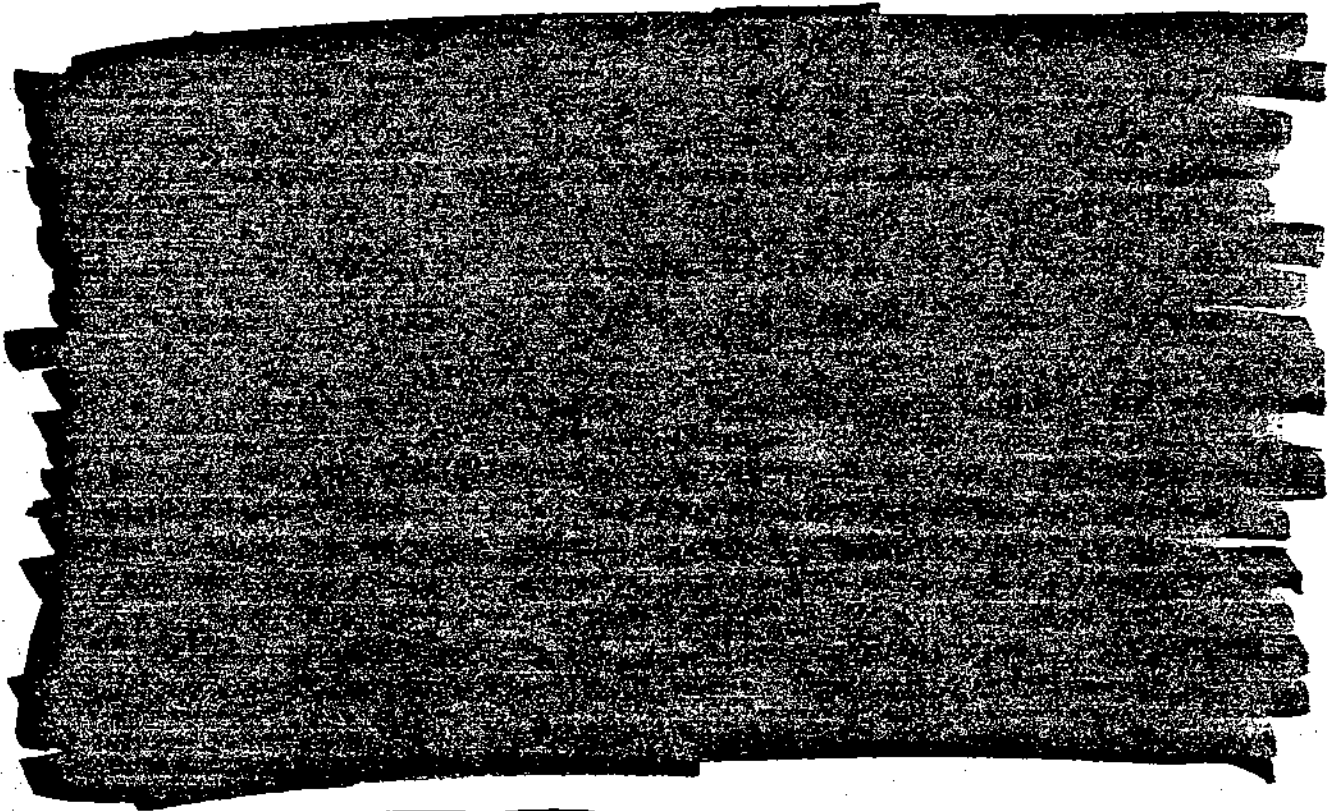

When asked if she had ever lost any identification, [REDACTED] stated that she had her billfold stolen on approximately October 4, 1973. She stated she was having lunch at Sam's Giant Burger on University Avenue, Berkeley, across from the Co-Op Bank where she is employed. She stated her purse was on the floor beside her and that some black males came into the restaurant selling "The Black Panther" newspaper. She stated she was told later by some of her friends that during the time of the selling of "The Black Panther" newspaper, an unidentified black male was seen bending over in the area of her purse. She stated later she discovered the missing billfold which contained the following items in the name of [REDACTED] California Driver's License; Oakland Library card; Kaiser Health card; Master Charge credit card, and other credit cards for Macy's, Penny's and Arco. She stated there may have also been a

[redacted] also has told the [redacted] and [redacted] are very wealthy, and since [redacted] is his only daughter, she will inherit a large estate in money and property at his death.

Relative to his son, [REDACTED], also [REDACTED], he related as follows:

As a child he was interested in athletics, particularly [REDACTED]. He played Little League ball and this interest continued through high school and the two years he attended [REDACTED] College of San Mateo. He was always an excellent student. After graduating, he applied for admission to and was accepted by the University of California at Berkeley (UCB) where he graduated in June of 1973. During his stay at Berkeley, his interests in athletics waned and his grades dropped. While at Berkeley, he met and began living with another student, [REDACTED]. They have lived together for about 18 months [REDACTED] although he does not approve of their "shacking up", he [REDACTED] to visit the family home in [REDACTED] company.

While at UCB, a "change" came over his son, who [REDACTED] was involved in "the protest movement" as well as the "prison reform movement". He could not specifically identify [REDACTED] or organizational affiliations on his son's part, or the names of any persons with whom he associated. When asked if his son was Marxist oriented, he replied more like "influenced"; that his son is a "follower" and to get him away from this influence he arranged to get him a job with the Boys Club in Denver, Colorado, but this did not work out and he returned

to Berkeley. He further described his son as "compassionate" and "not violent". He said his son has resided at several addresses in the East Bay area, including Dwight Way, Channing Way, and just recently moved from 1282 Excelsior, Oakland, and did not know his current address.

His son has always worked and saved his money. He used to work as a busboy in a restaurant in Berkeley and was also employed at the produce yard and up until January of 1974, was employed as a laborer at the Oakland Army Terminal. He is currently drawing unemployment compensation benefits.

His son and [REDACTED] recently applied for passports and wish to go to Europe.

He said his son was coming to the family home on [REDACTED], 1974, for dinner. He offered to help the FBI in any way possible. He said he would talk to his son in private and attempt to ascertain what association, if any, he might have with the Symbionese Liberation Army (SLA). He offered to bring his son into the San Francisco FBI Office for interview.

At about 8:30 a.m., [redacted] telephonically advised that his son, [redacted] and [redacted] visited the [redacted] family home in Foster City, California, during the period March 8 - 10, 1974. He took his son aside for a talk and his son claimed he had no association whatsoever with the Seditious Liberation Army (SLA) and did not know [redacted] or CINQUE DeFREEZE and he knew nothing whatsoever about them other than what he has read in the newspapers. [redacted] said that "I know within my soul as his father" that he is innocent of any involvement with these people. He said the matter of coming into the country had not arisen, but "You can contact him".

Mr. [REDACTED] employee of [REDACTED] California, was interviewed at his place of employment.

[REDACTED] advised that he is the father of [REDACTED]. He advised that [REDACTED] was an honest citizen who, being his daughter, could not possibly be involved in any radical or violent organization. Mr. [REDACTED] said he knew nothing about the Symbionese Liberation Army (SLA) not printed in the newspapers and had never heard [REDACTED] mention the group or discuss any of its activities.

Mr. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] calls home fairly frequently and visits her family every two or three months, usually accompanied by [REDACTED] whom she is living with and whom was employed as a general laborer at a military base. At present, neither [REDACTED] are employed and both have recently moved to either [REDACTED] near Tilden Park, behind Berkeley where they live with [REDACTED].

Mr. [REDACTED] stated that in April, 1972, [REDACTED] had gone to Europe where she traveled around meeting people and sightseeing until September, 1972, when she returned to the United States. Mr. and Mrs. [REDACTED] had gone over to Europe during this time on a guided excursion and met [REDACTED] twice when their paths crossed.

After returning from Europe, [REDACTED] went to work at a French restaurant, the name of which means [REDACTED], where she tried to form a union because the working conditions were so bad. She failed to unionize the restaurant and quit about September or October, 1973.

Mr. [REDACTED] recalled an incident in early December, 1973, when he found out that [REDACTED] had become involved in a prison reform movement and had been going to see a black prisoner in Folsom. Mr. [REDACTED] said that he gave [REDACTED] a good chewing out for her involvement in the prison reform group, after which she quit all activities related to prison reform.

A review of the same directories failed to reflect any listing for GARY DEAN ATWOOD or ANGELA ATWOOD.

On February 15, 1974, [REDACTED], New Castle, Indiana Police Department, advised that a review of their traffic and arrest records failed to reflect any information concerning HARVEY H. ATWOOD, GARY DEAN ATWOOD, or ANGELA ATWOOD.

On February 15, 1974, Deputy [REDACTED], Henry County Sheriff's Office, New Castle, Indiana, advised that a review of their records failed to reflect any information which was identifiable with HARVEY H. ATWOOD, GARY DEAN ATWOOD, or ANGELA ATWOOD.

On February 15, 1974, [REDACTED] advised that a review of their files failed to reflect any references for GARY DEAN ATWOOD or ANGELA ATWOOD.

On February 15, 1971, Detectives [redacted] and [redacted] New Castle, Indiana Police Department, advised that the names HARVEY H. ATWOOD, GARY DEAN ATWOOD, and ANGELA ATWOOD meant nothing to them.

On February 21, 1971, a review of the newspaper files of the "New Castle Courier Times", New Castle, Indiana, was made under the names HARVEY H. ATWOOD and ANGELA ATWOOD with negative results.

The files did reflect that GARY DEAN ATWOOD, while in attendance at Chrysler High School, New Castle, Indiana, was editor of the "Trojan Tribune", a delegate to Boys State, active in the National Forensic League, and winner of a scholarship of merit for drama and due to the fact that he was the winner of the Indiana High School Forensic Association Award.

GARY and ANGELA ATWOOD rented Apartment Number One at 315 West First Street, Bloomington, Indiana, from July of 1970 until August of 1971.

[REDACTED] during the year they stayed at that address they applied for a marriage license.

[REDACTED]

[REDACTED] indicated that the ATWOODS argued between themselves frequently. GARY ATWOOD and ANGELA did not have a car during the full period of time they stayed at 315 West First Street. Numerous strange cars, assumed to be friends however, including vans, station wagons, etc., were parked at 315 West First Street. ANGELA ATWOOD was in plays and theater work in Bloomington, Indiana, and also was believed to be in a play at the Brown County Playhouse in Nashville, Indiana. ANGELA worked as a waitress at the Regulator, a local tavern in Bloomington, Indiana, during part of their stay at 315 West First Street.

When the ATWOODS departed the Bloomington, Indiana area, they were planning to go to California. They left Bloomington in August of 1971 and he reportedly was to serve alternative service as a Conscientious Objector. It was believed that ATWOOD was going to serve his alternative service in California. [REDACTED] advised that ANGELA had an Italian sounding maiden name which she could not recall.

In August, 1971, BILL and EMILY HARRIS began renting Apartment Number Two at 315 East First Street, Bloomington. The HARRISES resided at that address until October 11, 1972.

[REDACTED] Indiana University (IU), Bloomington, Indiana, advised that ANGELA DE ANGELIS received a BA degree from IU in August, 1970, with a major in Speech and Theatre. DE ANGELIS registered with the Placement Bureau at IU in February of 1971, indicating she was seeking employment and would be available in February, 1971.

[REDACTED] indicated that ANGELA's credentials had never been sent to any location where she was seeking employment. They have had no correspondence with ANGELA since the date of her registering with the Placement Bureau. Their files reflected at the time of registering with the Bureau she resided at 315 West First Street, Bloomington, Indiana. Their files also indicated that ANGELA reportedly claimed 13 years of professional dance training, had choreographed several operas at the IU Theater and had directed plays at the Brown County Playhouse, Nashville, Indiana. She listed working and directing productions in 1966, 1968, and 1969 at the Brown County Playhouse and at IU.

ANGELA received honors including being a finalist in the Miss IU Pageant, the recipient of an IU Theater scholarship in 1968 and 1969, and four years of recognition with the IU Theater. On her experience sheet, she indicated she had studied acting with HAROLD GUSKIN, an actor in residence at Bloomington, Indiana. She also had three semesters of voice lessons with the IU Music Department and belonged to a singing club which performed twice on national television in Los Angeles, California.

[REDACTED] advised that ANGELA worked in the Summer of 1969 in a workshop at Montclair State College in New Jersey and danced in various clubs in New Jersey professionally. A referee, Miss ELIZABETH ANN POOLE, a teacher at Hawthorne High School, Hawthorne, New Jersey, advised in a letter to the Placement Bureau that ANGELA, nickname "ANGEL", was well known to her. Miss POOLE indicated in her letter that ANGELA had a sister, ELENA, and a brother, LAWRENCE, JR. The letter

also indicated that ANGELA's mother had died in 1963 and that Miss COLE had been extremely close to the family following that. SNYDER, in evaluating ANGELA's student teaching, advised that she would need to adjust to teaching methods and would always need supervision. He also indicated she had very strong views on controversial issues. The subject of these issues was not set forth. neither his remarks nor ANGELA's responses gave any indication that ANGELA was involved in or in sympathy with extremist or terrorist activities.

[REDACTED] the ATWOODS' present residence, [REDACTED] had not observed any books, papers, or pamphlets which might be termed radical or extremist literature; nor had [REDACTED] seen any firearms inside the home. ANGELA ATWOOD had never mentioned purchasing or owning firearms. [REDACTED] ANGELA [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] had expressed [REDACTED] citizens should not be allowed to own firearms.

During the summer of 1973, ANGELA ATWOOD had taken [REDACTED] back to Indiana where he was planning to go to school. [REDACTED] had no information as to the status of the marital relationship between ANGELA and GARY, but [REDACTED] had the impression that GARY'S return to Indiana may have been more than a temporary and necessary separation.

When asked if ANGELA ATWOOD had taken a boyfriend after [REDACTED] returned to Indiana, [REDACTED] responded that she did not know. She did recall that after work one Friday night [REDACTED] ANGELA had been picked up by a fellow whom [REDACTED] described as "hippi-ish", by which [REDACTED] meant that he had a lot of hair and possibly a beard. [REDACTED] stated that she had not talked with this individual [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] and that at the time she had briefly seen this individual, he was slumped over in a chair in a darkened portion of the restaurant. [REDACTED] stated that this individual was a Caucasian, but stated that he might possibly have been a light-complexed Negro. She was unable to provide any information regarding this individual and did not know whether he and ANGELA were living together.

When asked to provide what information she could concerning ANGELA ATWOOD's activities and interests, [redacted] advised that about a year ago last fall she and ANGELA had enrolled in an extension course in literature at the University of California at Berkeley. [redacted] was unable to recall the title of the course, the instructor's name, or the names of other individuals enrolled in the course, however because she had only attended for one week and then had quit [redacted] also recalled that ANGELA ATWOOD had been involved in theater work and about a year ago last Christmas had appeared with KATHY SOLIAH in a play entitled "HEDDA GABLER" which was presented on the Berkeley campus, possibly under the auspices of the Berkeley Community Theater. SOLIAH had the starring role in this production and ATWOOD had performed a bit part. [redacted] advised that ANGELA ATWOOD was "hung up" on her cats, liked movies, and enjoyed small craftwork such as window pane painting.

[redacted] stated that ANGELA ATWOOD was subject to "highs" and "lows", that is, periods of extreme depression and periods of sheer elation. As far as [redacted] knew, ATWOOD was not on drugs although [redacted] suspected ATWOOD may have smoked marijuana. [redacted] attributed ATWOOD's alternate periods of depression and elation to ATWOOD's vivacity and zest and [redacted] did not believe that these emotional extremes were caused by drugs or indicated mental imbalance.

Regarding ANGELA ATWOOD's background and relationship with her family, [redacted] advised that ANGELA had indicated that she had been a cheerleader in high school and came from an upper middle-class background. ANGELA's mother had died when ANGELA was fifteen. ANGELA had not expressed any animosity toward her father, but [redacted] was given the impression that if ANGELA thought about her father at all it was in terms of her father being financially able to provide for her. ANGELA was very fond of a younger brother she had and also had a married sister. [redacted] recalled that ANGELA had once referred to this sister as the "typical father's daughter". ANGELA had made this remark in a matter-of-fact voice which did not indicate any jealousy or animosity.

When asked if there were any employees at the Great Electric Underground Restaurant who might have been friends of ANGELA ATWOOD, [redacted] furnished the following names: KATHY SOLIAH, who had sided with ATWOOD in her battles with the restaurant management, but who was not as militant as ATWOOD; possibly [redacted] though [redacted]

[redacted] attributed ANGELA ATWOOD's wearing of men's clothing such as overalls and combat boots to ATWOOD's desire for attention and a desire to deny her femininity. [redacted] however, did not believe that ATWOOD was a lesbian or bisexual. Rather, ATWOOD's clothing was an attempt to show her contempt for conventional standards.

[redacted] has not been in contact with ATWOOD, nor has she been contacted by anyone on ATWOOD's behalf since that time. [redacted] advised that she did not have any information as to ATWOOD's whereabouts nor does she have any idea as to where ATWOOD may have gone or from whom ANGELA would seek aid.

When two pages consisting of thirty photographs of suspected SLA members and associates, from these photographs [redacted] was able only to identify the photograph of ANGELA ATWOOD. [redacted] described the photograph as a good likeness of [redacted]

[redacted] stated that should she be contacted by, or on behalf of ANGELA ATWOOD, or should she receive any information of possible value in locating ANGELA ATWOOD, or determining the extent of ATWOOD's involvement in extremist activities, she will immediately notify the FBI.

In this letter [REDACTED] advised that she was returning a severance form to OC at the request of EMILY. The letter was postmarked January 23, 1974.

The file further showed that a registered letter was sent to [REDACTED] at the above address, and it was returned marked no such address.

The file contained a letter from Miss HARRIS' supervisor, setting out that a registered letter, return receipt requested, was sent to Miss HARRIS at 434 41st Street, Apartment 3, Oakland, California on January 28, 1974, and it was returned as not at that address.

The letter stated that the landlord had requested that the post office hold her mail.

The file contained a memo from [REDACTED] dated January 17, 1974, setting out that this employee, [REDACTED] had received a telephone call from HARRIS at 2:30 p.m. on January 16, 1974. In this call she advised that her mother was very ill and that she and her husband had left immediately to go to her parents' home at 419 County Line Road, Champaign, Illinois. She furnished her father's name as FREDERICK SCHWARTZ, she requested that her check be sent to the home of her husband's parents at 313 Woodland Lane, Carmel, Indiana, and gave her parents' phone number as 892-4410.

The file reflected that HARRIS had telephonically called from Champaign, Illinois, giving an address and phone number. In attempts to contact her back at the address determined that this address does not exist, and when she was attempted to be contacted by telephone a person answered saying they never heard of HARRIS or her relatives.

Attached hereto are letters contained in the above file, one dated January 28, 1974 at 10:00 a.m., and a copy of a draft from [REDACTED]

Monday, January 28, 1974
10:00 A.M.

I received a call from [redacted]. She said that she had received a telephone call from Emily on Friday night requesting that the [redacted] sell everything. She said that Bill's father had died and that he was the only one who could take care of his mother and brothers and sisters and that he and Emily would not be returning. The call was made from a pay phone and [redacted]'s description of the voice was that Emily sounded breathless and distrustful, just as she did when she called Evelyn on the 16th. Mrs. [redacted] told Emily that [redacted] had been in touch with me and that our understanding was that her mother was terminally ill with cancer. Emily responded to that by saying, "no, it was Bill's father." [redacted] asked for an address and Emily gave her the Woodland Lane, Carmel, Indiana address. [redacted] then told her that I had called at that address and that Mrs. Bonnell, who answered the phone, and is Bill's mother, said she didn't know that Emily and Bill were anywhere but in Oakland. (Incidentally, it was on Friday that I spoke to Mrs. Bonnell). Emily's reply to that was, well, she didn't know. [redacted] asked for the area code for the Carmel telephone number and Emily said not to call her there, that she, Emily, would get in touch herself.

[redacted] said that she and her husband went through the apartment and that there are many "good" things as well as all their personal papers. There were some tapes, one of which was on the tape recorder. They listened to it and it was apparently a "Tape letter" from "their parents"; nothing of any significance. She did say that the parents' communications came from Florida, Chicago, and Carmel.

[redacted] was extremely upset and said that they now feel that Emily is running. I asked her if they had re-contacted the police. She explained that the police had told them last week that if they didn't hear from Emily by the end of the month (when the rent was due) then they should call again. So she took them literally and has not called the police a second time. However, she has had the Post Office hold all Emily's mail, so our letters probably will not get to the Oakland address at all.

She also mentioned that, apparently, Emily and Bill had others living with them in the Oakland apartment, that there was a great deal of stuff in the "other room", like "someone with a very small apartment had moved in with them". She said that periodically Emily and Bill did have others living there and that [redacted] didn't mind, that they simply rented to Bill and Emily and that what they did inside their own place was their concern.

[redacted] said she was preparing a letter to be sent to Emily requesting permission to sell their things, or store them for a limited period of time. It was to be sent to the Carmel address. I told her that it should be certified with a return receipt requested as, from our experience, the letter couldn't be delivered.

The conversation closed with the agreement that we would keep in touch.

On Wednesday, January 16, you called Evelyn from Champaign, Illinois, to advise us that a serious illness in the family had compelled you and your husband to leave abruptly with no time to notify the Survey Research Center of your circumstances. Since two and one half working days had already passed by then, we were already in the process of trying to locate you.

You gave us two addresses, one at 419 County Line Road, Champaign, Illinois, with the name Frederick Schwartz, and a telephone number, 602-4410, and the second one at 213 Woodland Lane, Carmel, Indiana; you requested that your mail be sent to the second address.

You also stated that, since you intended to remain in Illinois for an indefinite period of time, you felt that you should resign from your position here at the Center. We then contacted Personnel to advise them of the situation and to ask assistance in properly handling this matter; one thing that greatly concerned us was that we could not recruit for even a temporary replacement until we had your signature on either a letter of termination or the University Separation form itself. We therefore sent a collection of documents (see attached) to both addresses you had given us. These were mailed to you on Friday, January 18.

Yesterday we received a Disposition of Accumulations form, signed by you, from [redacted]. We cannot process this form without a formal termination from you; however, I will keep your signed form in your folder until we can get all the red tape straightened out.

Today we received back from Champaign, Illinois, the letter we sent on January 13, with the stamped indication that the addressee was unknown, and that there was no such street. We have not, as yet, had any feedback from Carmel. I have been advised by Personnel that this certified letter be sent on to you, with a return receipt requested. The situation is that, in the event that an employee has not given notice within seven calendar days, the department may notify the employee that they are considered to have quit without notice. The fact that we have been unable to contact you through the address you have given us places you in this category.

In the case where the department places an employee on this status, we advise you that a request for reinstatement can be made by you within 15 calendar days, with a good explanation of the reasons for loss of contact.

Since a voluntary termination is far more advantageous on your employment record than a "quit-without-notice", we are doubly anxious that you respond as quickly as possible. I am enclosing all documents with this letter that were previously sent to you on January 18. If, by some chance, our letters cross in the mail, no response to this letter will be necessary.

There was no derogatory information concerning her driver's record.

On the same date, a search determined that WILLIAM TAYLOR HARRIS, a white male, date of birth June 22, 1945, at [REDACTED] Oklahoma, 5'7", 145 pounds, Social Security Account Number 315-46-2467, surrendered his Indiana driver's license in California on November 17, 1967. He was reissued an Indiana chauffeur's license in 1968, which was suspended August 11, 1970, for failure to appear on a traffic charge. On August 18, 1972, he surrendered his license in Rhode Island and the license is currently in a suspended state and expired. WILLIAM and EMILY HARRIS have two 1973 Indiana disabled veteran license plates with numbers 1272 and 1288. Both licenses are registered to a black 1972 Chevrolet, hard top, Vehicle Identification Number 77B2U329155.

[REDACTED], Bloomington, Indiana, advised that she was acquainted with EMILY HARRIS, nee SCHWARTZ. She stated that HARRIS was an English and French teacher at Benford Middle School during the 1971-72 academic year. HARRIS applied for the position during the Summer of 1971, at that time using the name SCHWARTZ. She indicated she would be married by the Fall of 1971 and, therefore, records were placed in her married name of HARRIS. HARRIS, however, was not married when she began teaching at Benford Middle School at the end of the school year. [REDACTED] indicated that HARRIS was the type of person who appeared very liberal, at least in her teaching methods. HARRIS had great difficulty with the control and handling of students. Beliefs of HARRIS concerning students differed with that of the administration and she had no desire to change her method. As a result, she had numerous problems in controlling her class and essentially refused to discipline any of her students. Despite the fact that this was HARRIS' first year of teaching, she was very critical of how the school operated. HARRIS seemed to be unable to accept structure herself from the administration and did not desire any structure for her students.

[REDACTED] advised that HARRIS related more to the university community in Bloomington, Indiana, than she did with individuals at Benford Middle School. HARRIS taught both English and French while at Benford and included in her lessons poems and literature from contemporary people, some of which were very anti-establishment. HARRIS also did her student teaching at Benford Middle School in French in the summer of 1971. [REDACTED] advised that [REDACTED] was not employed, however, [REDACTED]

According to [REDACTED] HARRIS was an attractive individual who usually appeared in neat clothing, but she wore the dress codes which were established at the junior high school. BILL HARRIS, husband of EMILY HARRIS, frequently visited the school and EMILY's classes. BILL HARRIS was an exact opposite of EMILY in that he was extremely sloppy and paid no attention

[REDACTED] indicated that very early in the school year it was apparent that the views of EMILY's responsibility to teaching were quite different from the expectation of an administrator, [REDACTED] indicated that EMILY and he had a philosophical difference in their view of teaching obligations. EMILY had developed the view that she was a passive facilitator, a reward giver and students' friend, and she did not wish to compromise this view. As a result, she would not impose her views of appropriate behavior on students and felt that over a period of time this approach would facilitate learning the best. [REDACTED] indicated this approach, however, created problems for other individuals at the school. HARRIS had very little class control and her students were disruptive and rude to teachers as well as to other students. The students were rarely corrected by the teacher. [REDACTED] indicated that EMILY had an unwillingness to discipline [REDACTED]

While at Peasford Middle School, EMILY initiated a recycling program which continued after her departure from the school. While [REDACTED] did not feel that HARRIS fit in at Peasford Middle School, he indicated that she might find a public school position in which her philosophy would fit. Although HARRIS was not forced to resign, she did resign from her position after the 1971-72 academic year. She indicated [REDACTED] that they were going to do some traveling as they apparently had saved money while she was teaching. Her husband, BILL HARRIS, was a student at Indiana University and visited Peasford Middle School on numerous occasions. HARRIS indicated plans to travel which would end in California and if necessary, they would stop and work along the way. The HARRISes appeared to be in no hurry to arrive in California.

When Mrs. HARRIS first began her employment, she showed no signs of being interested in any revolutionary or militant political activities, and it was not until about the Fall of 1973 that she showed any signs of becoming an activist in these areas. It was then that she began to show definite personality changes. She became quite domineering. [REDACTED] she was a socialist that she had read the writings of MAO TSE TUNG and also books on the uprisings of revolutionary groups in South America.

Mrs. HARRIS displayed an unusual interest in the Chilean Crisis involving Allende [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] observed a piece of furniture on the desk of Mrs. HARRIS which bore the letters "V.O." (Venceremos Organization). According to [REDACTED] EMILY HARRIS was very competent at composing and did a lot of writing and putting together of documents. She recalled that one day EMILY HARRIS came to work complaining that she was "totally pooped" and stated "We stayed up until 4 a.m. working".

In late December, 1973, Mrs. HARRIS had several visitors at her office, most of whom were males and included some blacks. At that time, Mrs. HARRIS and her husband WILLIAM appeared to be having marital difficulties. She complained that she was spending much of her time at home alone and that she was even at home alone on New Year's Eve. She gave no explanation as for the absences of her husband.

In latter 1973, Mrs. HARRIS told her of taking a trip to San Luis Obispo that she had stopped at Soledad Prison and kissed a black man in view of the guards just for the sake of getting their reaction. Also, Mrs. HARRIS was known to have made a telephone call to the California Medical Facility at Vacaville, California.

From June to approximately September, 1973, [REDACTED] better known as [REDACTED] a student at Alameda College, Alameda, California, and an employee of the University of California, Berkeley, California, at [REDACTED] (department not specified) was provided a place to live by Mrs. EMILY HARRIS in a room at the HARRIS home at 434-41st Street, Oakland, California. At the time Mrs. HARRIS took her in, [REDACTED] was jobless and needed a place to stay. They had become acquainted through mutual political interest. Mrs. HARRIS had taken compassion because [REDACTED] had claimed her house had been broken into by narcotics agents searching for drugs, and Mrs. HARRIS was convinced that she had been mistreated in this regard.

[REDACTED] recalled that at one time [REDACTED] asked her how to say "We shall concur" in the Phillipine language and stated that she needed this information for the preparation of a leaflet or poster.

About September, 1973, [REDACTED] moved out of the HARRIS residence and ROBIN SUE STEINER became the next roomer at the HARRIS residence.

[REDACTED] recalled that in December, 1973, ROBIN SUE STEINER called Mrs. HARRIS at her office and left a message that she would be late because she had to attend a meeting.

[REDACTED] in the summer of 1972 she met IRA and KATHY, friends of EMILY HENNINGUE HARRIS and WILLIAM DAVID HARRIS. EMILY HARRIS was then employed by the Survey Research Center, Berkeley. IRA and KATHY lived together on Howe Street, Berkeley, California, for at least a month during the summer of 1972.

[REDACTED] stated that she could not now recall the employment status of IRA. When specifically asked as to whether IRA was a doctor she responded that she believed he was. She recalled that it had been mentioned by someone that IRA had been on pills and also some mention was made of medication obtained through him. She said that KATHY was employed as a bus driver for a private bus firm which provided tour service. KATHY expressed some difficulty obtaining a chauffeur's license. KATHY mentioned that she had been hassled in her efforts to obtain this license. [REDACTED] related the details concerning an accident in which the other car was wedged in by her bus. KATHY claimed that she had remained cool and collected throughout this experience.

In June or July, 1973, KATHY took approximately seven weeks of self-defense classes with EMILY M. HARRIS, [REDACTED] and another girl named KATHY, at the "Mango", 3713 MacArthur Boulevard, Oakland, California, which was operated by BETTY (Last Name Unknown). BETTY reportedly once worked for [REDACTED] father who operated a grocery store.

It was the impression of [REDACTED] that EMILY M. HARRIS, IRA, KATHY and others were connected with some organization which read books on socialism and communism, including the works of MAO TSE TUNG. [REDACTED] advised HARRIS had been known in the office as a member of the Venceremos. She had been seen typing political literature for the Venceremos, had passed out a prison reform petition, had taken courses in street fighting and had used the office phone to make many telephone calls to Vacaville and other California prisons. [REDACTED] stated that she furnished all of this information to [REDACTED] of the Oakland, California Police Department and also to [REDACTED] of the Berkeley Police Department, along with [REDACTED] UCB Police Department on approximately January 11, 1974.

On January 11, 1974, the Chancellor's Office directed that the personnel file of EMILY HARRIS be sent to the Personnel Office where it is now held.

After HARRIS disappeared unexpectedly, she was declared a missing person. However, some of the property of HARRIS was forwarded to her husband's mother, Mrs. ~~RONNELL~~ HARRIS, in care of 313 Woodland Lane, Carmel, Indiana.

The HARRISEs were disappointed with her because she spent nearly all of her free time watching television and was devoid of motivation.

[REDACTED] was not seen either of the HARRISEs since early October, 1973, and has no information as to their present whereabouts.

Except for hiking trips such as a trip to Point Reyes, California, exact location not known, the HARRISEs seldom did anything together. EMILY was deeply involved in the Women's Liberation Movement and neither showed any signs of affection for each other. They constantly argued over finances and kept track of every cent they spent.

The HARRISEs individually made trips to visit California State penitentiary inmates but made no mention of the names of those they visited. [REDACTED] never heard them mention such names as "CINQUE" or "CIN" DE FREEZE, [REDACTED] and BARRON "LAMUMBA" BROADNAX.

[REDACTED] attended a couple of meetings of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) at 4919 Telegraph Avenue, Oakland, California.

[REDACTED] was a loafer and had no sincere interest in the VVAW meetings where films were shown protesting the U.S. intervention in Vietnam. [REDACTED] gave the impression that he attended these meetings only to please REMIRO and was actually bored with the films. Others who attended these meetings were [REDACTED] CINDY GARVEY. [REDACTED] spoke strongly against the United States involvement in Vietnam. GARVEY and REMIRO indicated that they had been dating.

[REDACTED] was not personally acquainted with "MIZ MOON" and to her knowledge has never met her but she heard the name "MIZ MOON" mentioned. [REDACTED]

The only weapon observed [REDACTED] at the HARRIS residence was a shotgun which had been purchased by the HARRISES at the GEMCO discount store in East Oakland.

[REDACTED] was not acquainted with NANCY LING PERRY and never heard her name mentioned while she was associated [REDACTED] of the aforementioned individuals.
