

A definite conclusion was not reached whether the questioned hand printing on Q1880 was prepared by PATRICIA CAMPRELL HEARST. E32, EMILY HARRIS, E5, E6, E3, E9, E20 and E37, or WILLIAM HARRIS, E45, due to the lack of sufficiently comparable writing. However, mothing of particular significance was observed in comparing the available writing of WILLIAM HARRIS, K45, with the questioned and hand printing on Q1880,



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

This memorandum sets forth current status of recent investigation being coordinated by the Los Angeles Office (LAO) and the San Francisco Office (SFO) in this case.

GRAND JURY MATTERS:

U. S. Attorney (USA) Robert L. Brosio, LA, advised he will appeal the stay granted by Associate Justice William O. Douglas to William Lewis, manager of KPFK Radio Station, LA. Lewis is the individual who refuses to turn over a Symbionese Liberation Army (SLA) tape, container and letter he obtained 6/7/74.

Black Muslims Retimah X, Jamellia Muntaz and Roland Tate appeared before a Federal Grand Jury at SF on 8/22/74, and refused to answer questions relating to possible harboring violations in this matter; they cited their rights under the Fifth Amendment. USA James Browning, SF, has advised the future course of legal action against these individuals has not been determined.

Memorandum Bates to Gebhardt Re: HEARNAP:

FALSE IDENTITIES SURVEY:

A survey designed to detect any individual who applied for a U. S. passport under false pretenses since the SLA shootout (5/17/74) is well underway with the full cooperation of the State Department. State has requested strict confidentiality in this matter.


We continue to review all applicants for the State of California driver's license between the ages of 18 - 35 who have refused to submit to that state's thumb print requirement. Photographs of these individuals are compared with the remaining SLA fugitives. This program was pointed out to all Field Offices 9/26/74, for possible nationwide implementation.

Our Identification Division is searching known SLA fugitives' latents with all unidentified latents received in unknown subject cases as well as screening all incoming fingerprint cards received by special desks in that Division.

FRAUDULENT TELEPHONE CREDIT CARDS:

Survey efforts continue to determine if known SLA sympathizers or individuals contacting them by telephone have used fraudulent credit cards. This is done by comparing the identifying telephone information available regarding SLA sympathizers with information recorded by Pacific Telephone and General Telephone, both of California, pertaining to illegal credit card calls.

DISSEMINATION OF REVISED WANTED FLYER (WF) #475 (A AND B):



Memorandum Bates to Gebhardt Re: HEARNAP:



The 10/4/74, issue of the "FBI Police Bulletin" contains a succinct summary of the SLA fugitives, and the reverse side is a reproduction of WF #475A. The 1,200 major police departments throughout the country receiving this publication are being encouraged to reprint this article in their own journals. Similar coverage is being planned for the November issue of the "Law Enforcement Bulletin."

Identification Orders (IOs) for Patricia Hearst (#4633) and Emily Harris (#4632) have been forwarded to all Offices for distribution.

NATIONAL NEWS COVERAGE:



Currently feature articles are being prepared for national publications in this case, i.e., "National Enquirer" (circularization 4 million) and "Argosy" (circularization 4 million). It is anticipated this wide circularization will serve as a vehicle for relaying more detailed information concerning the fugitives which may assist in locating and apprehending them.

Memorandum Bates 📥 Gebhardt **HEARNAP:**

Intensive efforts continue to fully identify and interview past associates of the remaining SLA fugitives. This aspect of the case has surfaced several suspected associates of William and Emily Harris who have or have had affiliations with radical groups such as: Venceremos: Students for a Democratic Society; May Day Activists at Washington, D. C., 1971; Black Panther Party; Young Social Alliance; and Peace and Anti-Vietnam War Rallies of the early 1970s. The common denominator of association appears to be centered at Indiana University and/or University of California, Berkeley, wherein at one time or another each of these individuals had an opportunity to become acquainted through their radical philosophies.

The Department is being advised of all subsequent developments in this case on a continuous basis.



After dinner, while the Hearsts were en route home, they were confronted at the LA International Airport by LA Police Department (LAPD) Criminal Intelligence Division officers At first, the Hearsts refused to identify themselves; however, once they did so they were allowed to proceed with their flight.

LAPD, advised was interviewed regarding his meeting with the Hearsts, and he advised he was only interested in assisting the Hearsts locate their daughter.

BARBARA: Marilyn has written a story of the Patty Hearst case called "Exclusive" and there is information in it that is new and her own point of view is new. I think we should ask first of all before I sound like a television system, why you, how come you know more than anybody else, the police, the PBI?

MARILYN: There is a simple answer, you said "Investigative Reporter," that is redundant, a reporter should be an investigator but unfortunately we have all copped out, we now will cover press conferences. They were all sitting down at the Hearst home in Hillsborough, you know I didn't really have to be brilliant to figure out that Patty was not there. So I never went to the Hearst home, I went out to look for her.

BARBARA: You went to the places where the (?) were and the FBI and the police didn't?

MARILYN: The FBI was very worried about its public image, the Agents in the street were trying to do a good job but unfortunately, bureaucracy got in the way. The police departments were worried the FBI would get there first. Nobody cooperated with anybody and I ended up with just about everybody talking to me and a lot of help from my son, Jeff. He went into the communes, etc.

BARBARA: What do you know that nobody else knows. What do you know now that we don't know?

MARILYN: Ok. First I know for a fact that Patty Hearst was not only a willing participant in the bank robbery on April 15th but she was one of the leaders. We have some pictures that have never been shown to the public before. This first one shows a man down in the corner on the right hand side of your screen. That is the man that was shot. He was entering the bank. Patty in this particular picture has turned her gun on him she then lunges at him, Nancy Ling comes from around the corner of the door and shoots the man.

BARBARA: Where did you get these pictures?

MARILYN: Never ask sources, Barbara, you know that. OK this is the last picture.

BARBARA: You always have to ask, you may not get answers but you always have to ask.

MARILYN: You can ask but you won't get an answer. This is the last picture. It shows that the last two out of the bank; during the holdup were Patty Hearst and Donald DeFreeze. All the others had already left so if she really wanted to escape; she could have then.

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BARBARA: That are wers the question about could she have gotten out or was she being held.

MARILYN: Right. This last one, which is upside down, there we go, This is very important because at the time that the FBI released photographs they said Patty's right hand was tied to her side and that she couldn't have participated in the bank robbery. They named her a material witness. In this photograph taken during the middle of the robbery, her left hand is clearly up in the air and she is signaling to Camilla Hall to leave the bank. She gave the signals, when they should enter and they leave.

BARBARA: Now the big mystery about Patty Hearst is what made her this way? Is she a girl who has been very washed? Was she always a radical at heart? Who is Patty Hearst? Tell us what you feel?

MARILYN: Patty Hearst is silly putty. She is whatever anybody wants her to be. She was in love with Steve Weed (her fiance) so she left home. She did the big dramatic bit at 17, I'm going out on my own. I'm going to be independent. But in typical Patty fashion, she was independent by taking 6 of Daddy's credit cards to live on. So you know then when the SLA got hold of her, she fell for Willie Wolfe who is a great deal like Steven Weed, you know they are sorta like nothing tablets.

BARBARA: Do you think she does everything when she falls in love?

MARILYN: Yes, she's a very romantic girl, she's very accommodating, she's not strong willed. She will follow whoever happens to be next to her and Willie Wolfe was just...

BARBARA: Even to go into terrorist activity?

MARILYN: If it gets her a lot of attention, a lot of publicity, and Patty has always loved a lot of attention. A very spoiled girl.

BARBARA: People look at their own children and say could this be my child?

MARILYN: I think any child that would be spoiled, any child that would leave home with credit cards, any child who was allowed to change schools whenever she wanted, if she didn't like it, any child that went to a private school where 200 other students were uniforms and she wouldn't and was allowed to get away with it. Yeah, it could be their child.

MAN: What kind of a fellow was Steven Weed? Was he some Swengoli who could mow her or was he a weakling too?

MARILYN: No. Steven Weed reminds me of pablum. And that's about the only way I can say it. Just a total nonentity. Steve Weed was the type that right after the kidnaping, as we go into it in the book, he stayed at the Randolph and Catherine Hearst home for a week and his main complaint to me was I'm going to have to leave, Marilyn, because you know they don't even make their own cookies they have them delivered by a bakery. That was what he was hung up on.

BARBARA: Marilyn, when you talk about the SLA, you say although they had claimed to be a political movement with Black support, indeed they have no black support.

MARILYN: Donald DeFreeze was the house black. That was it. He was the cook.

BARBARA: Most of them were white?

MARILYN: They were all white. There were two black men in on the kidnaping, Thero Wheeler and Donald DeFreeze, Wheeler split immediately after the kidnaping. They went from black neighborhood to black neighborhood. DeFreeze literally went door to door knocking on doors saying, "Hi there, my name is Cinque, would you like to join my revolution?"

BARBARA: So there is not black support?

MARILYN: No there is not.

BARBARA: You also say they are not a political organization that their aims and motivations are not political. What is it?

MARILYN: I think it is nothing but greed. I think it is nothing but attention. You see, I will not call gangsters politicians and therefore I don't think gangsters should hide behind politics. Niether do I think the gangsters in Washington should hide behind politics. These people said that they were political but they did nothing to change the political system. All they did was murder a black educator who did a great deal to help the third world people.

BARBARA: They tried, I'm doing the other side, they tried to get food for the poor.

MARILYN: No they didn't, they set that up in such a way that it couldn't help but be anything but a "rip off" and that is what it was. \$2 million went to pimps and prostitutes. Yes they

were rejected by the radical groups of Berkeley. They were such losers, they tried to go to a lettuce boycott and they went to the wrong store. This was sorta the story of their life, they were losers.

MAN: Do you think ultimately they are going to be losers? What are the chances do you think of Patty Hearst ever showing up again?

MARILYN: Well, Gene, I don't think it's like television and Efrem Zimbalist. I think that Patty probably will get caught. The same way the police and the FBI catch all criminals. They over park or they run a stop light.

MAN: That is how she's going to be found?

MARILYN: Yes, that's how they were found in Los Angeles. They left parking tickets in the van.

BARBARA: It is said that there are nine members of the Symbionese Liberation Army is that . . .

MARILYN: Originally, there were 32 that we thought might be associated or at least fringe supporters, then it went down to the hardcore nine; 6 of course were killed, there are now some others that they feel may be helping them with money. Those others come out of a group called Venceremous that was very much in do with springing prisoners in California. The Venceremous group has at least two women active in it that have sizable trust funds. And they feel that that may be where the support money comes from. One thing that not too many people know, that I will be happy to share with you is the last hot lead that any of us had was the attorney for George Jackson, the late George Jackson, got a phone call from a man who did not identify himself but said I am representing Patty and the Harrises in San Jose and would you find us a place to hide.

BARBARA: When was this?

MARILYN: This was about two weeks ago.

BARBARA: Do you have the feeling that they will be found soon?

MARILYN: Depends how soon they run through that red light, Barb. Police don't track people down, they stumble across them.

BARBARA: What did you learn the most, what's the most important thing that you think we should know from this whole bizarre episode which occupied so much of our lives?

MARILYN: Well, I think that the first thing that we have to deal with is there are changes that are needed in the system and a lot of us tend to ignore that. As long as there is any cause for change in the system, these radicals will get a toe hold.

BARBARA: You say that they are not there that they are really a bunch of...

MARILYN: Yes, there's a limited fringe in every movement, including the radicals, the SLA is their limited fringe. I think the other thing we have to learn from it is the news media. And that the news media has to learn that they can't be victimized and we were. We paid more in ransom than anybody. Prime time television where we aired these communiques and the rhetoric went on for 23 minutes, full pages in newspapers.

BARBARA: What should we have done?

MARILYN: We should have treated them like we treat any other bunch of gangsters. We didn't cover Dillinger that way.

BARBARA: Except it was such a romantic story because it was a girl, an heiress, and so . . .

MARILÝN: Alright. Bonnie and Clyde there was a girl too but we didn't treat them as though they were the second coming of the GOP and that's what we've got to do. We've got to get back to covering gangsters like gangsters, wherever they are.

BARBARA: What are you working on now you nice, delicate lady, what do people have to be afraid of now?

MARILYN: Organized crime in California. It's rather the unknown, unseen factor out there and we have a great deal of it. I just finished doing a special interview with Micky Cohen who has been around for many years and was one of Al Capone's henchmen in which he gets very specific on how he operated in California and more important whose operating now.

BARBARA: Want to name a name or two?

MATILYN: Yes, in fact we did a story last week on KPIX where we showed 3 surveillance film of a testimonial dinner for a moster with our mayor entering and leaving taken by the police department.

BARBARA: I can see why people have mixed feelings about you.

MARILYN: You too Barbara.

The Q1875, Q1876 and Q1877 pieces of paper were reassembled or grouped together in the most likely order. These groupings of items were designated Q1875a through Q1875f, Q1876a through Q1876d and Q1877a through Q1877y.

A definite conclusion was not reached whether any of the questioned writingson the submitted pieces of paper were prepared by any of the writers of the known or purported known writing on items previously submitted S in this case and case captioned "Symbionese Liberation Army (SLA) EM" due to the limited amount of the questioned written notations and the presence of unexplained variations. However, similarities were observed in comparing portions of the questioned writing on Q1875a, Q1876a, Q1876b, Q1876c. Q1877h, Q1877k and Q1877m with the available known writing of NANCY LING PERRY, on Kc4, K10, K13, K22 and K31 in this case and K4, K7 and Kell in the SLA case. Also, similarities were observed in comparing portions of the questioned writing on Q1876b with the available writing of PATRICIA HICHELLE SOLTYSIK, K7, K28 and Kc30. Similarities were observed in comparing portions of the questioned writing on Q1876b and Q1876d with the available writing of CAMILLA HALL, K23, K26, K27 and K33 through K86.

PREDICATION

This investigation is predicated on information indicating the Symbionese Liberation Army (SLA) is engaged in activities which could involve violations of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 2383 (Rebellion or Insurrection), 2384 (Seditious Conspiracy), and 2385 (Advocating the Overthrow of the United States Government).

On February 15, 1974, SF T-1, a confidential source who has provided reliable information in the past, advised WILLIAM TAYLOR HARRIS was possibly a member of the SLA.

An SLA document captioned "Declaration of Revolutionary War and the Symbionese Program", dated August 21, 1973, states "...Therefore, we of the Symbionese Federation of the SLA...Do now by the rights of our children and people and by force of arms and with every drop of our blood, declare revolutionary war against the fascist capitalist class. We support by self-determination and independence within the United States and the world. And hereby offer to all liberation movements, revolutionary workers groups, and peoples organizations our total aid and support for the struggle for freedom and justice for all people and races..." The SLA has claimed credit for the November 6, 1973, assassination of Dr. MARCUS FOSTER, Oakland, California, School Superintendent, and the February 4, 1974, kidnaping of PATRICIA CAMPBELL HEARST, daughter of newspaper publisher-owner RANDOLPH A. HEARST, in furtherance of its revolutionary objectives.

II. ACTIVITIES

A. Venceremos Organization

Formed in December, 1970, the Venceremos Organization (VO), also known as Venceremos, is a militant Marxist-Leninist-Maoist organization composed of third world and white revolutionaries operating in the San Francisco Peninsula area. The publicly stated goal of the VO is to build a united front against the imperialist United States leading to the overthrow of the United States Government by force and violence, armed struggle, and urban guerrilla warfare. The VO has publicly stated that all members must know how to operate and service weapons and have weapons available.


San Francisco Bay Area media on September 28, 1973 quoted Venceremos leaders that the organization had disbanded and was no longer in existence.

Source advised WILLIAM and EMILY HARRIS had been attending Marxist-Leninist-Maoist study groups with individuals who were known to the source to have formerly been members of the VO.

Source furnished a list of names and telephone numbers, which appeared to the source to be a type of telephone tree used by the VO during mid-1973. The names "BILL and EMILY" and the HARRIS' telephone number appeared on the list.

WILLIAM WOLFE and five other individuals, all of whom were identified as members of the Symbionese Liberation Army (SLA), died in a fire following a gun battle with law enforcement officers on May 17, 1974, at Los Angeles, California.

B. Black Culture Association

The Black Culture Association (BCA) was a "self-help" organization formed to assist black inmates to rehabilitate themselves. The aims of the BCA appeared to be bonafide and most members seem sincere in seeking help. There is evidence that attempts were made to infiltrate the BCA on the part of some militant individuals as well as some outside visitors, who came to the prison to attend meetings. Members of the SLA used the BCA meetings to make contact with prisoners.

WILLIAM TAYLOR HARRIS made application to attend BCA meetings at the California Medical Facility at Vacaville, California.

WILLIAM TAYLOR HARRIS visited JAMES HOLIDAY, a prisoner incarcerated at San Quentin Prison, Tamal, California, a total of six times during 1972 and 1973. HARRIS visited O.C. ALLEN, a prisoner at the California Medical Facility, Vacaville, California, six times during the period October to December, 1973. He visited JAMES GARSKE, a prisoner at San Quentin Prison, a total of 35 times during the period May, 1973 to January, 1974.

JAMES HAROLD HOLIDAY, also known as "Doc", a prisoner at San Quentin Prison, is one of the reputed leaders of the Black Guerrilla Family (BGF) within the California Department of Corrections system.

Source advised WILLIAM and EMILY HARRIS were possibly members of the SLA.

RUSSELL JACK LITTLE and JOSEPH MICHAEL REMIRO are presently incarcerated at Oakland, California, awaiting trial on local charges for the November 6, 1973, murder of Dr. MARCUS FOSTER, former Superintendent of Oakland Public Schools. The SLA has publicly taken credit for Dr. Foster's death.


Source advised on January 31, 1974, the Oakland Police Department searched the HARRIS' former residence at 434 41st Street, Oakland, California. The search was conducted in connection with the Oakland Police Department investigation of the murder of Dr. MARCUS FOSTER. Indications

were that the HARRISes had vacated the premises in haste, leaving their personal property in the apartment.



Source advised during August, 1973, at a Chino Defense meeting, BILL and EMILY HARRIS were urging everyone to read a book entitled "The Spook Who Sat Behind The Door". The children, in turn, aid their kidnapers in extorting money from the parents.



The escape resulted in the murder of a guard.





On June 7, 1974, a tape recorded message prepared by one male and two females, who identified themselves as members of the SLA, was sent to Radio Station KPFK, Los Angeles, California. The male identifies himself as "TEKO", and expounds revolutionary rhetoric, and explains the SLA moved from San Francisco to Los Angeles to avoid encirclement by

law enforcement agencies on the San Francisco Peninsula. TEKO advises he was falsely accused of shoplifting at Mel's Sporting Goods Store in Inglewood, California. TEKO concludes by stating, "The military political leader of the SLA and five top cadre have been killed by the fascist, however the SLA is not dead, and will not die as long as there is one living fighting member of any oppressed class, race, sex or group left on the face of this earth. The pig has won the battle, but the war of the free is not over. Our dear comrade HO Chi-minh once wrote from an imperialist prison 'Today the locust fights the elephant, but tomorrow the elephant will be disemboweled'".

INVESTIGATION PERTAINING TO THE SHOOTING INCIDENT AT MEL'S SPORTING GOODS STORE, 11425 SOUTH CRENSHAW BOULEVARD, INGLEWOOD, CALIFORNIA, MAY 16, 1974

At approximately 5:15 PM on May 16, 1974,

advised two individuals entered Mel's Sporting Goods Store, 11425 South Crenshaw, Inglewood, California, at 4:30 PM, and attempted to shoplift. Reports were sketchy, but the two individuals were believed to be white, one female and one male. A clerk at the store had attempted to apprehend the couple, when a third individual fired approximately 50 shots from an automatic weapon. All three individuals escaped, and officers were conducting a search.

Advised investigating officers believed these individuals may have been associated with the SLA.

On May 17, 1974, CARROLL WILLIAM HUET, Co-Owner of Mel's Sporting Goods Store, advised on May 16, 1974, he assisted two fellow employees subdue a suspected shoplifter on the sidewalk in front of the store. He

identified a photograph of WILLIAM TAYLOR HARRIS as being identical to the suspected shoplifter. HUET advised! fellow employee TONY SHEPHARD succeeded in getting a handcuff on one of HARRIS' wrists, and employee GARY MASON was attempting to subdue HARRIS' female companion when they learned HARRIS was armed. HUET succeeded in twisting the gun from HARRIS' grasp. At that time HUET heard a volley of shots and realized someone was shooting at them. HARRIS and his companion escaped as a result of the shooting.

On May 17, 1974, ANTHONY F. SHEPHARD, 11724 Haas Avenue, Hawthorne, California, advised he was working at Mel's Sporting Goods Store the previous day, and had attempted to subdue a male shoplifter and his female accomplice. He identified a photograph of WILLIAM TAYLOR HARRIS as being, identical to the male individual with whom he had struggled, and stated he was 100 per cent sure of this identification. These individuals escaped in a red and white Volkswagen van.

On May 16, 1974, Patrolman Inglewood Police Department, advised a Colt .38 caliber revolver had been taken from the white male suspected of shoplifting at Mel's Sporting Goods Store. This gun had been purchased on October 13, 1973, by EMILY MONTAGUE HARRIS at Siegle's Guns, Oakland, by EMILY HARRIS.

On May 16, 1974, KENNETH CLAUDE PIERRE, 2635 West Imperial, Inglewood, California, advised late that afternoon he and his sister, MARVA LEE DAVIS were driving in his 1970 black vinyl over yellow Pontiac. They were driving south on Ruthelen Street near 115th Street, Los Angeles, when he became aware of a red Volkswagen van which was attempting to pass him. PIERRE permitted the van to pass and then noted the van came to a stop. A white male and a white female exited the van and walked toward PIERRE's vehicle. The male ordered PIERRE and his sister out of the Pontiac stating, "I don't want to kill you". The male then spoke to his female companion stating, "I'm going to kill that son of a bitch". MERRE did not know to whom these remarks referred. The male and female got into PIERRE's Pontiac and the male drove it along side the van. PIERRE then observed one of more pairs of hands pass two pistols and packages from the van to the Pontiac. The male individual was described by PIERRE as being 25 to 27 years old, 5'10" tall, 150 to 160 pounds, with dark brown shoulder length hair and a small goatee.

The female was described as 5'4" tall, 130 pounds, with dark red hair.

On May 16, 1974, MARVA LEE DAVIS, 11522 Ruthelen Street, Los Angeles, related the same account as her brother, KENNETH CLAUDE PIERRE, adding that as the male and female approached the Pontiac, they were armed with shoulder weapons and identified themselves as being with the SLA. She advised a photograph of WILLIAM TAYLOR HARRIS resembled the white male.

On May 21, 1974, THOMAS LEON PATIN, JR., 2049 West 115th Street, Hawthorne, California, advised on May 16, 1974 at approximately 4:00 to 4:30 PM, he was standing with his father in his driveway. A yellow Pontiac stalled in the street in front of his driveway. A white female attempted/ to start the car unsuccessfully, and a white male armed with a carbine jumped out of the car and ran toward the driveway. The male advised, "We're from the SLA and we need a car. We need this car. Give me the key". He was making reference to a 1963 Nova Station Wagon owned by PATIN's father. keys to this vehicle were relinquished, and two white females then approached the PATINS, both armed with carbines. The male and two females then departed in the station wagon. PATIN identified a photograph of WILLIAM TAYLOR HARRIS as possibly being identical to the male, although he had the impression the male had lighter colored hair than HARRIS' photograph depicted. He stated the two females resembled EMILY HARRIS and PATRICIA HEARST.

> ABDUCTION OF THOMAS DEAN MATTHEWS, LYNWOOD, CALIFORNIA, ON THE EVENING OF MAY 16, 1974

On May 16, 1974. THOMAS DEAN MATTHEWS, 10871.

Elm Street, Lynwood. California, was abducted from his residence by individuals identified as WILLIAM TAYLOR HARRIS, EMILY MONTAGUE HARRIS and PATRICIA CAMPBELL, HEARST. The following signed statement was furnished by MATTHEWS, and relates to his abduction:

may be used in a court of law. I understand that the nature of this inquiry relates to my kidnaping on May 16, 1974, from my personally owned vehicle, a 1969 Ford you, California license 75999 L, in Lynwood, California.

Matthews, told me that there was a lady that was looking at my van, a 1969 Ford van blue in color, bearing California license 75999 L. I went to the door and during that time she came up to the door and she said she was interested in buying my van. I recall that she is a white female, 25 to 30 years old, 5'6" tall, medium build, short brown hair, longer in back, wearing dark brown or black shiny leather jacket with hiking boots. I observed a photograph of Emily Harris from a photo spread of approximately 18 photographs, demonstrated by SA Thiel at the Lymwood PD, Lyawood, Caiff., on 5/17/74. I positively identified Emily Harris as being the above described white female who approached me regarding the purchase of my van on the night of 5/16/74.

"She asked for a test drive and I said, 'all right'. We both got into the van, she in the driver's seat and I in the passenger's seat. She started up the van and drove west on Pendleton Street and turned right (north) on Pine Street. She stopped just as she made the turn and said, 'There's two of my friends and maybe they want to come along', referring to the two individuals scated in the vehicle parked across the street which was a 1954 to 1965 light blue four-door Ford Falcon station wagon. The two individuals, a white male and a white female, exited the station wagon and approached the van on the passengers side. The white male was wearing a red waist-length heavy coat, light blue denim pants, and Army boots and his jacket was bulged out on the left side. The white female followed behind him and was wearing green plaid pants, black sweater, brown hiking boots and a black jacket. black hair that was really curly and fluffed out like an afro.

"I turned and unlocked the side door of the van located behind the passenger seat and the white male opened my door. He opened up his coat and showed me a weapon located under his right arm. This weapon resembled an automatic rifle approximately two foot long with a banana clip inserted and a barrel about four inches beyond the stock of the weapon. I feel that the weapon was an automatic because the clip was

inserted. He stated, 'We're with the SLA and we need to borrow your car. He told me to get into the back and both the white male and female get into the back with me. He told me. 'if I did anything stupid, they would have to hurt me'. Then he stated, 'Do you know who this is?', referring to his female partner that entered the van with him. I said, 'No, I don't', as I didn't realize who she was. He said, 'She is Tanya', and they both grinned. At this time, we were sitting in the rear of the van and they were sitting across me on the floor of the van approximately five feet away from me and I clearly recall that the girl referred to as Tanya as a white female, 20 to 25 years old, slender build, blue eyes, small perfect teeth, small mole on right side of chin, wearing a dark brown or black wig, afro type. I knew it was a wig as she constantly shifted the wig on her head.

"I observed a photograph of Patricia Campbell
Hearst from a photo spread of approximately eighteen photographs, demonstrated by SA in an FBI vehicle parked in front of my residence on night of 5/18/74. I positively identified Patricia Hearst as being the white female who entered my van and was introduced to me as 'Tanya'.

"I also recall the other individual as a white male,
25 to 30 years old, 5'8" tall, 155 to 160 pounds, short bleached
blond hair (no part), brown Fu Manchu mustache and goatee,
green dress

long sleave shirt with small birds imprinted on the shirt.

from a photo spread of approximately 18 photographs, demonstrated by SA Thiel in an FBI vehicle parked in front of my residence on night of 5/18/74. I tenatively identified the photo of William Harris as being the same as the above described individual.

."The white male tenatively identified as William Harris asked, 'Will your parents be suspicious as you'll be with us until midnite'. I said, 'Every once in a while I did spend the night away from home without telling them'.

He started talking and I asked, 'What is the SLA really trying to do' and he replied, 'They wanted to overthrow the government'. 'The government had already been overthrown with the assassination of President Kennedy'. I asked, 'Why did you rob the bank?' He replied that they needed the money as it wasn't easy for what they were doing'. He stated, 'They declared war on the United States and were carrying on gorilla warfare to achieve this purpose'.

"The girl named 'Tanya' who I identified as Patty
Hearst stated, 'she was a voluntary participant in the bank
robbery in San Francisco, California'. The fact that her gun
was at her side was that she carries her gun in that position,
and could have used it as any time if necessary as it was loaded.

Also, she said she was not physically restrained in any way from using the weapon. She said, 'They planned out the bank robbery so carefully that they wouldn't have to turn their guns more than a certain amount of degrees'. Harris stated, 'If you have enough people and did it quick enough that they could rob a bank'. Patti then stated, 'that they had to rob the bank within a minute and a half in order away safely'.

"Harris asked Emily if she could find a place where he could get a hacksaw to remove the handcuff which was attached to his left wrist under his jacket. I assumed that we were in the vicinity of a Broadway Store because Emily asked William it he knew if a Broadway Score would have a hacksaw. William replied that he thought that they would. She parked the van and entered the store, exact location unknown, and the curtains were pulled behind the driver and passenger seats and the direction of travel could not be observed. Emily returned with no hacksew and stated that they didn't have one. Emily then started driving around again and Patty Hearst picked up a weapon that was sitting next to her, which I had not observed before and was near her right leg. The weapon appeared to be identical to the one in possession of William Harris when he approached the van initially, that was an automatic rifle about two feet long and containing a banana clip. She picked up the weapon and

empied the chamber by pulling back on a lever and a cartildge flipped cut. The cartridge had not been fired. Then she removed the clip from the weapon and inserted the cartridge into the clip.

"Patty then pulled out a revolver with a brown handle and black barrel and loaded a couple bullets into the empty cylinders. She then showed me one of the bullets and stated, 'We use cyanide bullets and some people say that they are not powerful enough to kill some one but they are very strong and will kill'. Patty then handed the revolver to William and he put it at his right side. Previously, Patty had laid the rifle at her left side.

"Emily then drove the van to another store, location and name unknown, but did not purchase a hacksaw. She then drove to another store, later identified as Zody's as she returned with a paper sack bearing the Zody's on the side and containing a hacksaw, Nestle's Crunch candy bar and one other food item. She handed the bag to William and he removed the hacksaw and set it at his side.

"Emily then drove around and discussed with William when they were to go to the drive in movie. He said it was too early as it was just getting dark and to continue to drive around.

"William stated, 'It was really stupid that we got caught in the sporting goods store in Inglewood for just shoplifting

From a nows broadcast from the radio in the van, they heard that the thing that they had been shoplifting was just & pair of socks. William then stated, 'It was a bandolier that he was attempting to steal. He said he stole the bandolier because it would be too obvious if he were to purchase it. Emily Harris then stated, 'The reason he got caught was because it was a gun store and there was more security and if she knew it was a gun store, they probably wouldn't have entered the store'. William then stated that he shouldn't have let the guy handcuff him and he tried to reach for his gun but was too late and therefore lost his gun. Patty Hearst then stated, 'It was very lucky that she wasn't reading the newspaper curing the struggle in front of the store'. Patty stated when she saw his head pop up, she grabbed the gun and fired over the people's head. She indicated that she fired one full clip of ammunition and grabbed the other gun but didn't need to use it. stated that it was a good feeling to see her two comrades come across the street unharmed. She was proud and thought she did a good job in firing the weapon as she did.

"Patty then started talking and said that it was a boni fide kidnapping when they kidnapped her in February. She said that all the time that she was blindfolded and held captive, she listened to the radio broadcasts of her father's attempts to get her back. She thought that he wasn't doing

everything in his power to get her back. She implied that she had accepted the SLA ways because of her feeling that her father had not done everything possible to get her back.

"Patty stated that it was a bunch of bull shit that her mother wouldn't believe that she had joined forces with the SLA. She stated that in regards to the long SLA tape regarding the bank robbery and her boyfriend, that she was tempted to call her dad a fucker because her father was taking the money from the smaller fund and it was just a tax write-off. The food distribution program wasn't being run properly because they were handing out lower grade food. One instance they were to hand out dried black-eyed peas but it was really hog feed.

"William then instructed me to lie down on the floor and they put a blanket and the pillows over me. We then entered a drive in movie theater location unknown, and once inside they uncovered __ so I could watch the movies which were Tomasina and Bushrod and the New Centurions. We entered the theater at approximately 8:30 p.m. and as soon as we got there, Emily got out and went to the snack bar. She returned with food and said she was the only white in __ place and didn't see any sign of anybody.

"William said the handcuffs were really hurting him and he ____ trying to decide how to cut them. He asked me to help

and I told him that it would be easier to cut the pin out which I did.

"He asked me about school and I told him that I was a baseball player. We talked a lot about baseball. Alternately, Emily and William went to the snack bar at hanf an hour intervals and one time, Patty accompanied Emily. Once it was near midnite, they started to decide on what they were going to do and they decided to stay until one o'clock. Emily and William Harris implied that they were to make a contact with one or more persons at the snack bar around midnite. From twelve to one o'clock, they whispered among themselves as to what they were going to do and where they were going to stay if the contact didn't show. It didn't matter if they met them tonite as they had other rendezvous planned.

"Around one o'clock they decided to leave and Emily asked, 'Are we going to go to the place we talked about', and William replied, 'No, we are going to the other place.' Patty told me to cover myself up which I did and we exited the theater. We drove around for 15 to 30 minutes and Patty said it would be 2 hours before they released me. They got to the other place, no one got out but the conversation between them indicated that they could not stay there.

"We then drove for about 30 to 45 minutes with no freeway travel and came to second place and both Emily and William Harris got out and checked out the place. They returned after five minutes and William said she wasn't home and they couldn't stay there either. We sat there for a couple of minutes and then someone said lets go to the hill and spend the night.

We then drove for about 30 to 45 minutes with 50 per cent freeway travel. They talked about getting another car as they thought that my car was hot. At one point just before stopping, we drove over a rough section of road which I thought was a dirt road. A couple times during the trip Patty tapped me on the head and asked if I was alright of which I replied, yes.

"Once we parked, Patty told me I could take the blanket off which I did and observed a brick wall and ivy along side the van. William told the two girls to get some sleep and the same to me as it was approximately three a.m.

"I awoke at 6:30 a.m. and heard them discussing how they were going to get another car. The girls <u>purposed</u> that they pose as hitchhikers to get another car. Once they decided to act as hitchhikers, he said it was too early as it was only 6:30 a.m. Patty was trying to locate a spot

it in back. At about 6:45 a.m., the two girls got out of the van and checked out the two vans behind us. About 10 minutes later they returned with another car. While they were gone, William wrapped up the two automatic weapons in my beige blanket but removed the clip from one of the weapons. He also wrapped the bandolier which contained about 20 shot gun shells in the blanket. He offered me some gas money but I refused the offer. When the girls returned, they parked in front of the van. He exited the van and said that I was really cooperative and I wouldn't have any trouble getting home. He told me to stay ten minutes after they left.

my home in Lynwood, California. The only time that I really feared for my life was when they first got into my van and William Harris showed me the weapon and said that if I did anything stupid that he would have to hurt me.

"When Patty was loading her gun earlier, William stated that it was a M-1 gun that they had converted into a machine gun.

> ABDUCTION OF FRANK RICHARD SUTTER ON MAY 17, 1974, AT LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA

Between May 17, 1974 and May 25, 1974, FRANK RICHARD SUTTER, 2519 Carmen Crest Drive, Los Angeles, California, advised at approximately 6:45 AM on May 17, 1974, he was abducted by two white females and a white male. He -identified photographs of EMILY MONTAGUE HARRIS and PATRICIA CAMPBELL HEARST as being identical to the females, and a photograph of WILLIAM TAYLOR HARRIS as being identical to the male. The females were armed with handguns, and WILLIAM HARRIS was carrying a .30 caliber machine gun. WILLIAM HARRIS identified himself to SUTTER as an SLA member, and told SUTTER if he gave the group any trouble, they would have to shoot him with their "cyanide bullets". HARRIS spoke of the SLA's political philosophy during the period of SUTTER's abduction, acknowledging the group could not defeat the United States Government. HARRIS claimed the SLA's political philosophy was being heard due to the activities of the group. He further advised the SLA was not bound to violent activity, but would not hesitate to use violence if it served their purpose. SUTTER was forced to lie under a blanket in the back seat of his car for approximately 63 hours while these individuals drove his car. He was freed in the Griffith Park area of Los Angeles, and was informed his car would be left further down the road.

> DEATH OF SIX SLA MEMBERS AT LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA, ON MAY 17, 1974

On May 17, 1974, ANGELA ATWOOD, DONALD DAVID DE FREEZE, CAMILLA CHRISTINE HALL, NANCY LING PERRY, PATRICIA SOLTYSIK, and WILLIAM LAWTON WOLFE, all identified as members of the SLA, were located in a residence at 1466 East 54th Street, Los Angeles, California. A gun battle ensued with law enforcement officers, during which a fire started in the residence. The residence subsequently burned to the ground, and the bodies of the above individuals were recovered from the ashes. Among the items found in the ashes were WILLIAM HARRIS' United States Passport, Number A1351843,


and International Certificate of Vaccination; a Rhode Island Operators License, Number 7210238, in the name of WILLIAM TAYLOR HARRIS, 84 South Angell Street, Providence Rhode Island; and United States Merchant Mariners Document, Number Z1216882-D1, in the name WILLIAM TAYLOR HARRIS. The document was issued on June 4, 1971, by the United States Coast Guard, Chicago, Illinois.





III. PROCESS OUTSTANDING

A. Federal Process

On May 20, 1974, an authorized complaint was filed before United States Magistrate JOHN R. KRONENBERG, Los Angeles,

California. This complaint charges WILLIAM TAYLOR HARRIS with violation of the National Firearms Act, Title 26, Section 5861(d), United States Code, i.e., he knowingly possessed firearms (automatic machine guns), which had not been registered to him in the National Firearms Registration and Transfer Record, as required. Bond was recommended in the amount of \$5,000 Corporate Surety. A federal warrant was issued.

B. Local Process

Alameda County District Attorney's Office,
Oakland, California, advised on that date felony and misdemeanor
warrants were filed in Oakland-Piedmont Municipal Court on
WILLIAM TAYLOR HARRIS. The felonies charged are for violation
of Section 118, California Penal Code (Perjury), and the
misdemeanor charge is for violation of Section 20, California
Vehicle Code (False or Fictitious Names on Documents Filed
at the California Department of Motor Vehicles). Two counts
of felony and two counts of misdemeanor were filed on HARRIS.

On June 19, 1974, Mrs. JUDITH FLIZABETH PRITCHETT, nee Lawrence, 4034 Salem Avenue, Concord, telephone 685-4833, was interviewed by SA who identified 4, himself to PRITCHETT as a Special Agent of the FBI through use of the Special Agent credentials.

PRITCHETT stated that she has no knowledge of how anyone in the Symbionese Liberation Army (SLA) obtained a drivers license under her name or her birth certificate. The San Francisco Office and various other offices across the nation have interviewed acquaintances of WILLIAM and EMILY MARRIS when they were students at Indiana University. These include fraternity brothers and sorority sisters. Also, we have interviewed individuals who met the MARRISes during a European trip, however, while a great many of the people interviewed knew the HARRISes, there was no information as to their present whereabouts.

PATRICIA CAMPBELL HEARST

The San Francisco Office of the FBI and other offices have interviewed friends and associates of PATRICIA CAMPBELL HEARST from her grade school days up to her college career. While many of these people knew her, none of them professed any knowledge of her present whereabouts.



Following the shooting on May 17, 1974 at 1466 East 54th Street, Los Angeles, there was located on CAMILLA HALL's body a letter which was partially burned. There follows a transcription of this letter which is as accurate as possible, due to the condition of the original letter.

"Dear Mom & Dad

*How are you? I've been thinking about you a lot & hoping that all is well with you. I get a lot of strength from our love & it really helps keep me going. I'm sending this through Phil & Candy bec. I know you are probably being watched very carefully by now. My name has been in the papers & TV etc (the FBI missed me by a matter of days in Berk) but we're staying several jumps ahead of them at all times by using our creativity & determination to survive & carry on the business of the revolution. I want you to remember that I'm w/ really good people & that we've trained ourselves in a great many ways bec. we realize the importance of the people's forces surviving & gaining victory after victory (you know I never do anything half-assed). Our attitude is very positive & our courage comes from our love for the people & hatred for the enemy. You know well that I have worked for change all my conscious life. I went through many stages of development, attacking the enemy in many different fronts only to see change co-opted into reformism. I exhausted all the possibilities before finally deciding that this was the only way to actually get the revolution going in realistic terms. It has become increasingly obvious (or rather, I used to be incredibly naive) that the ruling dass & the corporate state have no intention of giving up any power voluntarily (witness the contortions Nixon has gone through to stay in

power) & that the capitalist system is an evil that must be destroyed. We are actively engaged in battling the enemy wherever we find it - the enemy within as well as the enemy without. The "putrid disease of bouregeois mentality" is in all of us & we are constantly working to rid ourselves of it so we can be better soldiers & fighters for the people.

"I don't know what kind of press coverage we've gotten inyour area or what kind of distortions they've been (illegible) people w/, but I strongly recommend that you check into underground news sources to get a better idea of what's really happening. The Barb has published all our communiques as well as people's responses to our actions & it would be very helpful to you in understanding all this to subscribe to it. It's \$10 a year & their address is Berkeley Barb, PO Box 1247, Berk Calif 94701. Ask them to send you all back issues beginning Jan 1974. Have them send it to you at school Dad, rather than to the house. I also recommend that you do some reading on revolutionary struggles around the world & writing of political prisoners in this country. Our support comes from oppressed people (illegible) will notice how so-called radical leaders have stumbled all over each other trying to get (illegible) other side of the fence to denounce us - bec. we threaten their organization & prestige. They have all become reformists, revisionists, & are eager to protect their interests. The truth is that they are scared shitless bec. we have put them in a situation that calls for

action to fulfill the courage of their convictions. Our support is from the people & will continue to grow w/ each victory as we prove to the people that revolution can indeed happen & will indeed be successful. We intend to be around for quite a while & to live to see the victories. I know you trust my sincerity even if you haven't yet come to agree w/ the course of action I have committed myself to. I am young & strong & willing to dedicate that & my courage & intelligence & love to this work. I feel really good about what I'm doing & want you to also.

"I should warn you that the FBI can "bug" you through your phone w/out ever stepping foot in your house - they can turn your telephone into a microphone that picks up even whispers up to 20 feet - even if the phone is on the hook. So you should discipline yourselves to not talk about me in the kitchen or study. Also watch your mail closely to see if any of it is delayed or tampered with. I'm putting scotch tape around this & you should be able to tell if it's been I'm sure you're beginning to understand better messed with. why it is difficult to write you & still maintain my security. Please try to understand that I won't be able to communicate w/ you again for quite a while for security reasons. not only involves me but my comrades. We all face the same problems of wanting to communcate w/ our loved ones but of not being able to do so "for security reasons". So don't feel you're alone - there are lots of other parents & friends & lovers
going through the same thing. I trust your courage & (illegible)
to understand these things & keep them (illegible) your heart.

"Enclosed is a poem I wrote after hearing newscasters talk about my sudden, mysterious, & coincidental disappearance from my quiet little Berkeley bungalow.

"I sent Phil & Candy \$5 & a note w/ this saying that I was on the road & hadn't been able to get anything together for your birthday Mom & would they please buy you some pretty flowers & hand deliver them w/ this letter to you. I'm sorry I can't promise to be able to do this on our special family days but know what I remember them & send you my love on many many more days than just those.

He advised that this was a time when the military had released many weapons, such as carbines, for sale to the public and carbines were selling for about \$30 at that time. He advised he had received a call from ATF about one month ago inquiring into the sale of the above carbine, and he had checked his old records and found that he has no sales records of guns prior to about 1967 and could, therefore, find nothing regarding the above sale. advised he is now retired from United Air Lines after 22 years of service as a lead mechanic and does little gun perused the photographs work other than for friends. of known SLA members and advised that none were known to him. denied ever altering the functioning of any weapons such as conversion to full automatic in certain semiautomatic weapons.

(3) A Rifle manufactured by Remington Firearms Company, semi-automatic .244 caliber, Serial Number 161568:

The Bureau of ATF advised that they had ascertained that on January 15, 1957, the manufacturer shipped this rifle to Sloss and Brittain Company, 100 Potrero Avenue, San Francisco.

The following investigation was conducted by SA on August 22, 1974:

Sloss and Brittain, 525 Bryant Street, San Francisco, California, advised that in 1962, his firm discontinued handling firearms altogether. He advised that in 1970, he moved his company from 100 Potrero Avenue to 525 Bryant Street, and at that time, all records pertaining to firearms were destroyed.

(4) .30 Caliber U. S. Carbine, manufactured by Winchester Company, Serial Number 6608261:

The New Haven Division advised that on August 29, Shipping Department, Winchester - Western Division, Orin Corporation, Winchester Avenue, New Haven, Connecticut, that records available at that company contain no information concerning U. S. .30 Caliber Carbine, Serial Number 6608267.

On this same date,

Winchester - Western, advised there
are no records maintained by Winchester - Western for a

.30 Caliber Carbines manufactured for the U. S. Government.

He suggested that records might be located through the
Rock Island Arsenal in Illinois. He advised, however,
that when originally recorded, Serial Numbers of guns manufactured were not maintained in sequential or numerical order.

By communication dated July 31, 1974, the Springfield Office advised that Customer's Section, Distribution Section, USARMCOM, Rock Island Arsenal, advised that he has no record to indicate that U. S. 30 Caliber Carbine, Winchester, Serial Number 6603261 has ever been reported lost, sold, or stolen. He stated that in 1968, he attempted to coordinate all Serial Numbers of carbine weapons, which totalled over six million bought by the U. S. Government from nine different manufactures, but was unable to obtain a response from Winchester Arms.

advised that military weapons are controlled by the unit currently in possession of the weapon and at this time, there is no central inventory point and no record is maintained of shipments from one unit to another and as of this time, it would be impossible to trace the abovementioned weapon.

The girl he remembered as having short light brown hair and walking directly to his table and purchasing a .30 caliber carbine manufactured by the Winchester Company for \$85.00 said he thought this to be unusual at the time as most people browse through gun shows and "dicker" with respect to the sale price and at least examine the gun before purchase which he does not remember the girl doing. his practice he would have obtained her driver's license number and data therefrom but stated he cannot locate this record after an extensive search of his files.



ment prior to anyone else's arrival. He stated that about 2:00 p.m. on January 11, 1974, he observed a white colored foreign made vehicle pull up in front of the address. The noted that he was positive this vehicle was not a Volkswagen because of his dislike of this make of vehicle.

from the vehicle, and he noted there was a third party who stayed in the car, however, he was unable to advise if the third party was male or female. He said that the females identified themselves as JOANNE JAMES and JUDITH LAWRENCE. He advised after they looked at the apartment, they decided to take it. Specimen Q1614 is an unfired .22 Long Rifle caliber copper coated, hollow-pointed lead bullet. Toolmarks present on the nose of this bullet suggest that it was pulled out of its cartridge case by a serrated-jawed tool, such as a pair of pliers. Specimen Q1614 bears only extremely limited marks of value for identification purposes should a suspect tool be recovered.

Specimens Q1643 through Q1645 are .30 Carbine caliber cartridge cases. The primers of these cartridge cases have not been fired and therefore bear no firing pin impressions. Toolmarks present on the sides of the Q1643 through Q1645 cartridge cases were identified as having been produced by the same tool as marks present on the Q1041 through Q1043 and Q1045 cartridge cases found in the hallway closet at 1827 Golden Gate Avenue. The marks present can these specimens are located on their sides and appear to have been produced by a serrated-jawed tool, such as a pair of pliers. 



Numerous microscopic marks are present on the Q1652 through Q1848 cartridges. However, it cannot be determined if all these markings were produced by the accompanying stripper clips or if some of these markings were possibly produced by the mechanism of a weapon(s). Nothing was found to indicate that any of the above were reloads.

Specimens Q1849 through Q1861 consist of thirteen copper and brass-plated B-B shot which bear no marks of value for identification with a weapon.

All of the above-listed specimens are being temporarily retained in the Laboratory for future comparison purposes.





Personal contact by Bureau Agents of park rangers and park supervisors at various parks within the area, based upon the SLA's apparent interest in such areas.

Quadrant searches in residential areas of Hollywood, California, in an effort to identify an apartment complex described by FRANK RICHARD SUTTER as having been visited by the HARRISes and HEARST on 5/17/74, while SUTTER was their captive. It should be noted that numerous buildings meeting the general description of that described by SUTTER were observed and SUTTER has personally observed each of those buildings and surrounding terrain. In each instance, he has emphatically stated they are not identical to the complex he saw on 5/17/74.

In addition to the above, numerous alleged sightings of the three fugitives have been reported and each one given immediate coverage to determine authenticity.

During the period immediately following the shooting incident at 1466 East 54th Street, Los Angeles, California, several Burcau Agents knowledgeable in the field of black extremist organizations arrived in Los Angeles from various divisions. Investigation was conducted within the black

community in an effort to determine possible harboring of the fugitives by black organizations. Valuable sources within the black community were developed through this operation. All Agents have returned to their respective divisions.



A listing of Indiana University (IU) Club of Los Angeles, California, members has been obtained. Members who attended IU between 1960 and 1972 are being contacted and interviewed by Los Angeles concerning their possible association with WILLIAM TAYLOR HARRIS and EMILY MONTAGUE HARRIS (nee Schwartz) and ANGELA ATWOOD while at IU and their possible knowledge of other individuals who may know the HARRISes.

Formed in December 1970, the VO, aka Venceremos, is a militant Marxist-Leninist-Maoist organization composed of a third world and white revolutionaries operating in the San Francisco Peninsula area. The publicly stated goal of the VO is to build a united front against the imperialist U. S. leading to the overthrow of the U. S. Government by force and violence, armed struggle and urban guerrilla warfare. The VO has publicly stated that all members must know how to operate and service weapons and have weapons available. San Francisco Bay area media on 9/28/73, quoted Venceremos leaders that the organization had disbanded and was no longer in existence.

In October 1972, a corrections guard at the Correctional Institution for Men (CIM), Chino, California, was murdered and another guard wounded during the escape of one RONALD WAYNE BEATTY. Four VO members were subsequently arrested, tried and convicted for their implication in that escape. During the trials of those four individuals, a Chino Defense Committee (CDC) composed of VO members was Chino Defense Committee (CDC) composed of VO members was formed. Four members of that committee reside at 300 North Bonnie Brae, Los Angeles, California. They are ENID MARGOT HUNKELER, MICHAEL ALEXANDER HOLMAN, BARBARA HYLAND and VIRGINIA FALLER.

When RUSSELL LITTLE and JOSEPH MICHAEL REMIRO were arrested for the murder of Oakland School Superintendent MARCUS A. FOSTER, the SLA headquarters in Concord, California, was set afire by NANCY LING PERRY. In the ruins of the fire were located the names of ENID HUNKELER, ALEXANDER HOLMAN and THOMAS DUNPHY. DUNPHY is a current resident of Riverside, California.

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



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






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Arrangements have been made with GEORGE HOLIDAY, Editor of the California Dental Association Journal, to publish an article concerning the three SLA fugitives. That article has been prepared by the San Francisco Division and subsequently approved by the Bureau. It contains a short text, photographs of the three fugitives and known dental charts for them. It appears the article will be printed in the September issue of the publication.

Los Angeles has conducted a survey of driver's licenses issued 8/16/73 and 12/27/73, by the California Department of Motor Vehicles. It is noted EMILY MONTAGUE HARRIS obtained California Driver's License on 8/16/73, under the name DOROTHY ANN PETRI with an address of 1834 Delaware, Berkeley, California. WILLIAM TAYLOR HARRIS obtained

- N -COVER PAGE California Driver's License on 12/27/73, under the name RICHARD FRANK DENNIS, 859-47th Street, Apartment D, Oakland, California. In the past, both EMILY and WILLIAM HARRIS had obtained California Driver's Licenses on the same date. The purpose of the Los Angeles survey of 10,000 California Driver's Licenses was to ascertain possibility WILLIAM HARRIS obtained a driver's license on 8/16/73, and in turn, possibility EMILY HARRIS obtained one on 12/27/73.

Los Angeles is presently conducting a survey of automobiles purchased through automobile dealerships in the Los Angeles, California, area, for a period covering 5/17/74, and 20 days thereafter based upon information supplied by California Department of Motor Vehicles.

On 5/16/74, following a shoot out at Mel's Sporting Goods Store, Inglewood, California, a 1970 red and white Volkswagen van bearing California temporary license 5303850 was recovered by the Los Angeles Office of the FBI. That van was subsequently determined to have been used by WILLIAM and EMILY HARRIS and PATRICIA HEARST. Initially, the van and its contents were examined for fingerprints and other items of an evidentiary nature. Soil samples were obtained at this time from the wheel wells but it was subsequently learned the vehicle had been painted in San Francisco shortly before its ownership by the SLA, thus those soil samples were considered inadequate.

In an attempt to develop information regarding the travels of this vehicle in the Los Angeles area prior to 5/16/74, Los Angeles contacted the State of California Department of Mines and Geology to determine if that agency would undertake a thorough examination of soil samples. Of that agency agreed to undertake such an examination and personally collected soil samples and rock samples from the wheel wells, tires and interior of the van. This examination will be conducted to develop characteristics unique to specific California areas.

It should be noted that during the soil collection, the tires on this van were almost new and bore the Phillip's 66 brand. The San Francisco Division has determined these tires were on the van prior to acquisition by the SLA. Gasoline

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samples were taken from the van's gas tank and were furnished to the Richfield Corporation and the Texaco Corporation for analysis to determine the manufacturer. After chemical analysis, both companies advised that they have been unable to determine the manufacturer but through these tests had determined that neither Richfield nor Texaco have produced the gasoline. Representatives from both companies stated that since the introduction of unleaded gasoline, the metal tracers formerly used in fuel and which were the most reliable gasoline identifiers were no longer available. The samples furnished to Richfield and Texaco substantially depleted the amount in the van's tank and thus no further examinations regarding fuel manufacturer are contemplated.

Contact has been maintained on a regular basis with the Los Angeles County Coroner's Office concerning their findings at 1466 East 54th Street, Los Angeles, California, on 5/17/74. As previously reported, that office has indicated a detailed and all inclusive report is being prepared and the date of completion unknown. Los Angeles will obtain that report upon completion and furnish appropriate copies to the Bureau and San Francisco under separate cover.

the Los Angeles Office almost daily and has been extremely cooperative regarding this investigation. It appears that any information concerning possible location of PATRICIA CAMPBELL HEARST and the HARRISes which comes to his attention will immediately be furnished to the Los Angeles Division.

Since all leads are being set out by teletype or other expeditious means of communication, none are being set forth in this report.

It is recommended that caution be exercised in dissemination of this report since it contains information supplied by

We considered ourselves to be an underground unit, however, the majority of our units' members moved about freely and in the five months we were there we made many good contacts. We decided to move our base of operations to Southern California concentrating on the greater Los Angeles area an with its vast oppressed communities and more favorable terrain. April the War Council dispatched an Intelligence and Recommaissance Team to Los Angeles. Its mission; to make some additional contacts and survey the area. Based on the favorable results of this mission and the concentration of pig activity in the San Francisco Bay area, our unit slipped out of San Francisco and into Los Angeles on May Day 1974. On Thursday, May 16, 1974, three members of the Malcolm X Combat Unit of the

SLA were sent out to buy a number of item needed by the unit. At Mel's Sporting Goods Store in Inglewood, a pig agent clerk named Tony Sheperd, attempting to show his allegiance to his pactionary white bosses, falsely accused me of shoplifting. It was impossible to allow a verifying search by a store security guard because I was armed, and therefore, we were forced to fight our way out of the situation. The pigs originally said that a \$.49 pair of socks were stolen and that this was what caused the shootout at the store. The people found this very difficult to believe when it was pointed out that we had already purchased over thirty Gollars worth of heavy-duty wool socks and other items. This apparently became equally confusing to the pigs who later charged that an ammunition bandolier was the item taken, supposedly to make the accusation more believable The policy of the Symbionese Liberation Army has always been to avoid shoplifting because of the heavy risk involved to the whole unit. We cannot afford to have soldiers busted on humbug charges. However, we realize that the combat and support elements run a great risk of being jammed whenever we move about above ground. The most unfortunate aspect of this situation was that the pigs then learned that SLA elements were in the Los Angeles area. It appears that even with this knowledge the pigs would not have located our comrades if a collaborator named Mary Carr had not snitched to the enemy. On Friday, May 17, 1974, the CIA directed force of FBI Agents, Los Angeles City, County and California State pigs with air

support and receive assistance from the mited States Marine Corps and the National Guard and encircled elements of the Malcolm X Combat Unit of the Symbionese Liberation Army. The risult of the encirclement was that the people witnessed on live television the burning to death of six of their most beautiful and courageous freedom fighters by cowardly, fascist insects. In most cases when an ubran guerrilla unit is encircled by the enemy it can expect to take great losses especially if the enemy has time to mobilize a massive force. Our six comrades were not on a suicide mission as the pigs would have us believe. They were attempting to break a battalion-sized encirclement. By looking at the diagram of where their bodies were found, it is clear that they had split into two teams, moved to opposite sides of the rear of the house and were preparing to move out of the house by force. The heavy automatic weapons fire from the front of the house was a diversionary tactic to force the pigs to concentrate some of their forces in the front. The two dynamite loaded pipe bombs were to be used as fragmentation grenades to clear a path through the cringing pigs who had started the blaze by firing incendiary grenades into the house. Cin, Vicisa, Zoya, Kujo, Jalena and Gopi (phonetic) died of smoke inhalation and burns before they could get outside. The pigs want us to believe that the fire was started by the SLA; that it was caused by SLA molotov cocktails or by accident from pig tear gas grenades This is pig shit. The swat squads, FBI, and LAPD would have have

to go into the house themselves to clear it out. They showed their true cowardice by using incendiary grenades to cause the fire that killed our comrades. For those who don't know incendiary grenades burn at such an incredible temperature that they melt steel and armor plate in a matter of seconds and are impossible to extinguish. The pigs want the people to believe that the bed ass tactics of the SM guermillas drove the fascists to use such barbaric force, but we say the STA is a reaction to fascism. The SLA uses automatic weapons and homemade bombs because the pigs have automatic weapons, artillery, and hydrogen bombs. Pigs want the people to believe that General Field Marshal Cinque en Toomi (phonotic) committed suicide. To this absurdity the SLA. responds by quoting our beloved comrade brother. He often said "We must not fear death for to fear death is to put our fear of pig terror before our love of the children and the people's struggle for freedom." The pigs have historically focused on eliminating Black leaders. Hany have been murdered or For over a year imprisoned in America's concentration camps. the pigs couldn't find Cin to murder him so they attempted to isolate him from the people with pig propaganda. First, they work on the most blatantly racist whites with their traditional crazy Black nigger escaped convict rapist routine. Next, we learned that Cin was a plum wine alcoholic. This obviously was

the white racist liberal answer to the gic that a Black revolutionary leader could order and assist in the assassination of a jive ass pig agent school superintendent. In followed that the white supremacists and bourgeois Black elements of the revolutionary left so-called leadership would . be pimped with ridiculous tales of links between the SIA and the CIA; that Cin was and had been a paid informant for the Los Augeles Police Department and the California Attorney General's Office. If this were true we dare these fools and collaborators to explain Cin's reward for his deeds--a life term in California's concentration camps. White, sickeningly liberal paranoid conspiracy freaks and spaced out counterbultured dopo fiends prove their naivety in amateurish research ckills as they rambled on and on about the California Department of Corrections. Bazaar stories about Cin having been programmed and electrdoes implanted in his brain while at Vacaville began to appear in the so-called underground press. Cinque en Toomi--the name means fifth prophet. Cin was indeed a prophet. The pigs would have the people believe that Cin was just as they would say another dumb nigger. They continuall attempted to undermine his leadership by propagandizing that Cin was being fronted off by whites; that he wasn't smart enough to be the brains behind the planning and execution of

the successful SLA actions. To this diplay of racism, we say go on into the Black community and ask the people on Toomi was not a prophet. Ask the people they think he was being used by whites. The people know that a Black man in America does not need conscious whites to push him into leading a revolution. Racists cannot believe that middle and upper middle class whites and a daughter of a super fascist ruling class family would ever have reason to follow the lead of a beautiful Black genius revolutionary varrior and give their lives for the people. Sick ass racists would have us believe that white women who follow the lead of Black revolutionaries are only mindless cunts enslaved by gigantic Black penises. The cringing pigs who face the fire power of Jalena, Gopi, Vieisa and Zoya know much better. Racists believe that it is impossible for white men to denounce white racism and follow the revolutionary leadership of Black men, but the SLA proved this theory to be a sick delusion. Cinque en toomi was himself the spirit of Frederick Douglas, Gabriel Prothos (phonetic), Denmark Visi (phonetic), Marcus Garvey, the Scottsboro Boys, Medger Evers (phonetic), William E. Burkhart Du Bois (phonetic), Malcolm X, Martin Luther King, Emmett Till, Little Bobby Hutton, Fred Hampton, L. D. Barkley, Johnathan

and George D. Jackson, Mark Essex, and every other Black freedom fighter who come before him. To racists slander the SIA and all the people say "Death to the fascist insect that prays upon the life of the people." And now after our commade brother fought valiantly against a battalion of pigs, a battle witnessed by millions, these same chicken shit pigs are trying to have us believe that General Field Marshal of the Symbionese Liberation Army Cinque en toomi, killed himself. Cin was so determined to kill pigs that as long as his heart was beating and that there was any eir in his lungs at all, he would fight even if his only weapon was his own body. We all know that revolutionaries do not kill themselves. Revelutionaries kill the enemy. Cin was the baddest member of the SLA and therefore our leader. Our five white comrades .who died with him were among his students and had learned well. They too showed incredible determination and courage. Kujo, Jalena, Vieisa, Zoya and Gopi did not commit suicide. The pigs would have us believe. Pigs tell us it is suicidal for whites to join blacks and other oppressed people in making revolution. To this oinking we say it is suicidial for the ruling class and all of its pig agents to believe that they can continue to oppress, exploit murder and imprison an undivided revolutionary army of the peoply White Americans who follow the example of our beautiful comrades and join the fight for the freedom of all oppressed people will not do so because they wish to die, but because they wish to be free. The pigs boast that they have broken the back of the Symbionese Liberation Army, but to do this the pigs would have to break the back of the people. The military political leader of the SIA and five top cadre (phonetic have been killed by the fascists; however, the SIA is not dead and will not die as long as there is one living, fighting member of any oppressed class, race, sex or group left on the face of this earth. The pigs have won a battle, but the war of the flea is not over. As our dear comrade Ho Chi Minh once wrote from an Imperialist prison, "Today the locust fights, the elephant, but tomorrow the elephant will be disemboweled."

Greetings of profound love to the people, to all comrades in arms, to all comrades in the concentration camps of fascist America and to all the children. This is YOLANDA speaking. When we say revolution we do not use the word losely, a revolution meaning violent fight for freedom; freedom that can be gained in no other way than by fighting. People do not fight because they enjoy it, or because they relich the thought of their own death or the death of their beloved comrades. They fight to survive because they understand the violence of fascism, and that violence means germicidal (phonetic) death at the hands of dictators who mass five hundred pigs armed with military weapons, fragmentary grenades and incendiary grenades to burn six people to death. The lurking big brother presence of the FBI, CIA, and their computer files through media propoganda. Fascism tries to tell us we are fools to resist because we will in the end be destroyed. and say that we love no individual more than we love Fight has cost us of the SLA eight comrades, six dead and two in concentration camps as well as the death and imprisonment of our comrades in arms of the BLA, the BGF, and the Weather Underground. We clearly understand that the reality of revolution will include death and imprisonment, suffering and violence, as well as victory. The price is high, but we accepted this reality when we picked up the gun for the first time and nodded yes to freedom, to love, to living. we must endure the suffering does not mean we have any doubt in the beauty of the victory. Our comrades died the way they chose to live, fighting courageously. did not compromise to the hundreds of insects crawling the community who resorted to burning them to death rather than facing in battle the ruthless strength and courage of freedom fighters. Fifty-fourth street is not an end but a beginning. People are gathering on the street, they are feeling the strength of their own bodies. They are clearing the fear and blind ignorance from their

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eyes. CINQUE, FAHEZA (phonetic), ZOYA, KUJO, JANENA (phonetic), and CARBE conquered the fear and will never die in the minds of those who have, who see the monster and know he will be destroyed. All comrades dead and alive, in prison and out, underground and on the streets are calling on all the people to conquer the fear and join the battle, realizing what can happen when five hundred pigs surround a house and then are surrounded by fifty or one hundred or five hundred irate Niggers firing from their houses, alley ways, tree tops, and walls, with a straight and fearless shot, to bring down the helicopter, the SWAT squad, the LAPD, the FBI, the neighborhood snitch. Consider the day when the pig won't even enter the communities of the armed people. We got to make the pig fear for his life, because he knows every eye behind every curtain in the ghettos, barrios, and poor communities is setting down the barrel for peace, ready to pull the trigger at any moment. has been a lot of talk about wasted lives, referring to the six dead bodies of our comrades and to TANJA, TIKO, and myself. The ironies of rascist, fascist, America are

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once again reflected with sickening reminder. are no editorials written for the wasted lives of the brothers and sisters daily gunned down in the streets and prisons. The present uproar of white America over the fate of PATTY HEARST was barely a murnur as hundreds of young men, mostly black and brown, went off to die in Victnem. We of the SLA hate the historical reality that requires young people to struggle to survive and to die violent deaths. We hate the reality in this country that murdered our six comrades, sisters and brothers, and daily continues to murder throughout the world. Because we have this reality we must fight to destroy it by any means necessary. Yes, history might be different if they had lived, but revolution is not made by saying, if only. We do know that the lives of movelutionaries will never be wasted. Right now there are men and women, young and old, black, brown, Asian, Indian, and white, who are filled with fighting spirit of KING, of MALCOLM, of GEORGE, of CINQUE, of

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their mothers, fathers, sisters, and brothers who have died at the hands of the pig. And these are a new breed of the baddest mother fuckers alive. Yes, we hate the pig, and we are at war with the pig, and we will kill the pig as violently as he has killed comrades of ours for centuries. We will do this because we love the people we are lucky enough to know, and we love the people we will never know; the beautiful babies, the angry young men and women, the understanding mothers and fathers, who have seen the rising tides for as long as they have been alive. Our past as middle class white Americans was meaningless. It was truely wasted potential, full of desperate pessimism that could feel the emptyness of capitalist America, even before we could understand it. Our lives now are not easy or full of joy. We may die, but our lives are real because we see the truth in the Right now the people are igniting the sparks of a great prairie fire and the fire fighters will soon be helpless against the freedom fighters because the flames will be far too hot and deadly for their weak world to endure, 9 YA 7-1627 1 /Ikp

and their evil spirit will die with them in the ashes.
Once again, my love to all the comrades.

Greetings to the people. This is Tania. I want to talk about the way I knew our six murdered comrades, because the Fascast pig media bas, of course, been painting a typically distorted picture of these beautiful sisters and brothers. Kujo (phonetic), was the gentlist, most beautiful man I've ever known. Re taught me the truth as he learned it from the beautiful brothers in California's concentration camps. We loved each other so much, and his love for the people was so deep that he was willing to give his life for them. The name Kujo means unconquerable. was the perfect name for him. Kujo conquered life, as well as death by facing them and fighting. Neither Kujo or I had ever loved an individual the way we loved each other, probably because our relationship wasn't based on bourgeois fucked up values, attitudes, and goals. Our relationship's foundation was our commitment to the struggle, and our love for the people. It's because of this that I still feel strong and determined to fight. I was ripped off by the pigs when they murdered Kujo. Ripped off the same way that thousands of sisters and brothers in this Facsist country have been ripped off of the people they love. We

mourn together and the sound of gunfire becomes sweeter. Julena (phonetic) was beautiful. Fire and joy. She exploded with the desire to kill the pigs. She wrote poetry; some of it on the walls of Golden Gate, all of it in the L.A. pit files now, that expresses how she felt. She loved the people more than her love for any one person or material comfort, and she never let her mind rest from the strategies that are the blood of revolution. Julena would have yelled "Fire Power" to the people if there wasn't the necessity to whisper the words of revolution. We laughed and cried and struggled together. She taught me how to fight the enemy within through her constant struggle with bourgeois conditioning. Gabi (phonetic) crouched low with her ass to the ground. She practiced until her shotgun was an extension of her right and left arms; an impulse; a tool of survival. She understood the evil in the heart of the pig, and took the only road that could demoralize, defeat and destroy him. She loved to touch people with a strong, not delicate, embrace. Gabi taught me the patience and discipline necessary for survival and victory. Zoya (phonetic) wanted to give meaning to her name, and on her birthday, she did. Zoya, female guerilla, perfect love and perfect hate reflected in stone cold eyes. She moved viciously and with caution, understanding the peril of the smallest mistake. She taught me, keep your

ass down and bad. Faiza (phonetic) as a beautiful sister who didn't talk much, but who was the teacher of many by her righteous example. She, more than any other, had come to understand and conquer'the putrid disease of bourgeois mentality. She proved often that she was unwilling to compromise with the enemy, because of her intense love for freedom. Faiza taught me the perils of hesitation; to shoot first and make sure the pig is dead before splitting. She was wise and bad, and I'll always love her. Cinque loved the people with tenderness and respect. They listened to him when he talked, because they knew that his love reflected the truth and the future. Cin knew that to live was to shoot straight. He longed to be with his black sisters and brothers, but at the same time, be wanted to prove to black people that white freedom fighters are comrades in arms. Cinque was in a race with time, believing that every minute must be another step forward in the fight to save the children. He taught me virtually everything imaginable, but wasn't liberal with us. He'd kick our asses if we didn't hop over a fence fast enough, or keep our asses down while practicing. Most importantly, he taught me how to show my love for the people. He helped me see that it's not how long we live that's important, it's how we live; what we decide to do with our lives. On February 4,

Cinque Entou (phonetic) saved my life The Malcolm X combat unit of the SLA was a Leadership training cell under the personal command of Ceneral Field Marshal General Ticko (phonetic) was his second in command. Everything we did was directed toward our development asleaders and advisors to other units. All of us were prepared to function on our own, if necessary, until we connected with other combat units. The idea that we are leaderless is absurd as long as any SLA elements are alive and operating under the command It's hard to explain what of our General Field Marshal. it was like watching our comrades die; murdered by pig incendiary grenades. A batallion of pigs facing a fire team of guerillas, and the only way they could defeat them was to burn them alive. It made me mad to see the pigs looking at our comrades' weapons, to see them holding Eujo's .45 and his watch, which was still ticking. would have laughed at that. There is no surrender. one in that house was suicidal, just determined and full of love. It was beautiful to hear Gabi's father. understands. Gabi loved her father, and I know that much of her strength came from the support he gave her. What a difference between the parents of Gabi and Kujo and my One day, just before the last tape was made, Kujo parents.

and I were talking about the way my parents were fucking me over. He said that his parents were still his parents, because they had never betrayed him, but my parents were ; really Malcolm X and Asata Chekeur (phonetic). I'll never betray my parents. The pigs probably have the little old mach monkey that Kuje wore around his neck. He gave me the little stone face one night. I know that the pigs are proud of themselves. They've killed another black leader. In typical pig fashion, they've said that Cinque committed suicide. What horse shit. Cin committed suicide the same way Malcolm, and King, and Bobby, and Fred, and Jonathan and George did. But no matter how many leaders are killed, the pig can't kill their ideals. I learned a lot from Cin and the comrades who died in that And I'm still learning from them. They live on in the hearts and minds of millions of people in Facsist America. The pigs' actions that Friday evening showed just how scared they really are. They would have burned and bombed that entire neighborhood to murder six guerillas. The SLA terrifies the pigs, because it caused all the oppressed people in this country to arms, to fight in a united front to overthrow this Facsist dictatorship. The pigs think that they can deal with a handful of revolutionaries, but they know they can't defeat the

incredible power which the people, once united, represent. It's for this reason that we get to see, live and in color, the terrorist tactics of the pigs; the pigs saying, you're next. This kind of display, however, only serves to raise the peoples' consciousness, and makes it easier for our comrade sisters and brothers throughout the country to connect. I died in that fire on 54th street, but out of the ashes I was reporn. I know what I have to do. Our comrades didn't die in vain. The pig lies about the advisability of surrender have only made me more determined. I renounced my class privilege when Cin and Kujo gave me the name Tamia. While I have no death wish, I've never been afraid of death. For this reason, the brainwan duress theory of the pig Hearts has always amused me. Life is very recious to me, but I have no delusions that going to prison will keep me alive. And I would never choose to live the rest of my life surrounded by pigs like the Mearsts. I want to see our comrades in this country's concentration camps, but on our terms, as stated in our declaration of revolutionary war, not on the pigs' terms. Pataria um muerte. Venceremos. Death to the Facsist insect that preys upon the life of the people.

WILLIAM LEWIS, Station Manager, KPFK Radio Station, 3729 Cabuerga Boulevard, was interviewed in the presence of his attorney, DAVID FINKEL. LEWIS advised that his telephone number at the station was 877-2711. He advised that his counselor's telephone number is 380-6707. LEWIS advised that at 6:30 a.m., June 7, 1974, an employee at this company received a telephone call from an anonymous individual stating that a recording from PATRICIA HEARST had been placed behind a mattress at the rear of the station at this location. The anonymous caller stated that the recording was in a manila envelope and the voice directed that the recording be played over the air.

Date of transcription

LEWIS was questioned whether the voice was male or female and he stated he could not answer at this time. He was questioned as to who received the call and he consulted with attorney FINKEL and was advised that he likewise should not answer this question.

LEWIS was asked to turn the original tape and the manila envelope in which it came over to the FBI at this time and he stated that he had been instructed by his counsel to refuse to release the tape except through court channels by means of subpoena. He stated that after the recording came, it had been recorded on tape and he had a copy of the recording available. He made a copy of this recording available during this interview.

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WILLIAM LEWIS, Station Manager, KPFK Radio Station, 3729 Cahuenga Boulevard West, was interviewed in the presence of his attorney, DAVID FINKEL, in a conference room at the KPFK Radio Station.

After identifying themselves to Mr. LEWIS as they requested the details concerning the alleged receipt of an anonymous phone call and the subsequent finding of a tape recording by members of the KPFK Radio Station. Mr. LEWIS advised that on the advice of his attorney, he would answer absolutely no questions concerning the matter whatsoever. He stated that it was the position of his radio station that sources of information must be protected, and that therefore under no circumstances would he divulge any of the details concerning the above matter.

At this point in the interview of Mr. LEWIS, his attorney, DAVID FINKEL, volunteered that he might recommend to Mr. LEWIS that the station furnish the necessary information to the FBI if they could be assured that the original tape recording which they received and which contained statements by individuals claiming to be PATRICIA HEARST and WILLIAM and EMILY HARRIS would never be subported by the Federal Government. SA Mr. LEWIS that he was not in a position to comment as to whether or not the tape would ever be subported by the Federal Government.

SA specifically requested of Mr. LEWIS to insure that the original tape recording and the container in which it allegedly came, were preserved for later physical examination by the FBI. Mr. LEWIS refused to comment again as to whether or not there was in fact a tape recording, but through his attorney, Mr. FINKEL, he advised that the normal operation of his station involving potential evidence required that the article be handled to the minimum extent.

At this point, the interview was terminated.

AT LOS ANGELES, CALLFORNIA

A neighborhood investigation was conducted in the vicinity of RPFR Radio Station, 3729 Cahuenga Boulevard West, during the afternoon hours of June 7, 1974. During this investigation, all residents of the area, as well as all members of logical business establishments in the immediate area, were interviewed with negative results concerning the placing of a tape recording in a mattress behind Radio Station KPFR on June 7, 1974.

A crime scene search was also conducted in the immediate area of a maturess which was located standing against the wall at the rear of RUFK Radio Station, 3729 Cabuenga Boulevard West. This crime scene search was negative.

Numerous photographs of the area of the mattress, as well as a large number of photographs of the surrounding area were taken.

The following investigation, unless otherwise indicated, was conducted by SA on June 7, 1974:

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Insurance, 3/37 Cabucaga Boulevard, North Hollywood, California, advised he believes he was the last person to leave
the office at 6:00 p.m., June 6, 1974, and he did not notice
any suspicious activity or persons behind the KPFK radio
station.

On June 10, 1974, discussion was had with Assistant U. S. Attorney (AUSA) ROBERT L. BROSIO and AUSA ARTHUR W. VANCE, JR., Los Angeles, California, with regard to issuance of the subpoens to WILLIAM LEWIS, Manager, Radio Station KPFK - FM, 3729 Cahuenga Boulevard West, Hollywood, California, concerning the SLA tape allegedly received by the station on June 7, 1974. Discussion was also had with regard to the earlier receipt by the station of a copy of a three-page "communique" received from the Weather Underground wherein information was set forth that the Weather Underground had bombed the offices of the California Attorney General EVELLE YOUNGER on May 31, 1974, in solidarity with the SLA.

AUSA VANCE immediately took this matter up with the Department of Justice and authorization was received to issue a subpoena duces tecum to WILLIAM LEWIS.

At 2:53 p.m., on June 11, 1974, the below listed Special Agents arrived at Radio Station KPFK-FM, 3729 Catuenga Boulevard West, amounced their identities to the switchboard operator and requested to speak with WILL LEWIS, the Station Manager.

acknowledging his identity by name. He was advised of the identities and official capacities of the Special Agents through display of credentials. A KPFK employee who was recognized through previous contact by SA as being JIM BERLAND was present and held a tape recorder microphone to record the conversation.

prefer talking in private to which he replied that there was no necessity. SA then served Mr. LEWIS with a subpoena directing his appearance before a Federal Grand Jury at Los Angeles, California, at 10:00 a.m., on June 12, 1974. Mr. LEWIS read the subpoena out loud into the microphone, which subpoena directed that at the time of his appearance before the Grand Jury to bring with him the original copy received of a communique from the Weather Underground, entitled same, consisting of three pages dated May 31, 1974, and envelope received therein; and the original of the tape recording which radio station KPFK played at about noon on June 7, 1974, on its station, purported to be a message to the public from PATRICIA HEARST, EMILY MARRIS and WILLIAM MARRIS.

Mr. LEWIS indicated he understood the contents of the subpoena requiring his appearance before the Federal Grand Jury the following day.

On June 12, 1974, WILL LEWIS appeared with his attorney, DAVID FINKEL, on a motion to quash the subpoena. U. S. District Court Judge A. ANDREW HAUK held a brief hearing, denied the motion without prejudice, and directed that LEWIS appear forthwith before the Grand Jury.

Assistant U. S. Attorney (AUSA) ARTHUR W. VANCE, JR., Los Angeles, California, advised that LEWIS acknowledged his identity, acknowledged that he knew the location of the subpoenaed letter and tapes and acknowledged that he had not brought the subpoenaed items with him. Prior to answering virtually every question, LEWIS emerged from the Grand Jury room and consulted with his attorney. He declined to answer any questions concerning the tapes or how he came into possession of them claiming privileges under the First, Second, Fourth, Fifth, Ninth and Tenth Amendments to the Constitution.

At 2:00 p.m., on June 12, 1974, LEWIS was taken before Judge HAUK. Judge HAUK raised the issue as to whether it would have been more appropriate to subpoen the KPFK Corporation rather than LEWIS personally. Judge HAUK ordered a hearing on the motion to quash for 3:00 p.m., June 17, 1974.

The Sacramento Division was requested to determine the status of KPFK Corporation (Pacifica Foundation) and to determine the officers thereof.

No statutory efficers of this corporation are listed since all officers of the corporation are not listed as living outside the State of Colifornia.

On June 13, 1974, AUSA VANCE was furnished the foregoing information. He said that it had been concurred to continue proceeding with LEWIS personally with regard to the subpocna. He also advised that he had requested Departmental authority to grant LEWIS immunity for appearance before the Grand Jury.

On June 17, 1974, at a hearing before Judge HAUK the motion to quash the subpoena was dismissed. The court signed an order granting LEWIS immunity in answering questions before the Grand Jury and he was ordered to report to the Grand Jury on June 19, 1974, and provide the items as requested in the subpoena duces tecum.

On June 19, 1974, LEWIS made the Grand Jury appearance and again refused to answer questions, and refused to provide the subpoenaed items. He was immediately taken before Judge HAUK at which time the Grand Jury proceedings were read to the The court denied LEWIS' motion for a hearing and ordered LEWIS to jail in civil contempt. He denied bail and denied a stay of execution. Judge HAUK further ordered that this matter was not to be discussed with the press by anyone present in the courtroom.

Attorney DAVID FINKEL, on behalf of LEWIS, filed an immediate appeal which was heard within the hour by Judge SHIRLEY M. HUFSTEDLER, Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals, Los Angeles, California. This hearing was held in chambers. AUSA VANCE advised that Judge HUFSTEDLER refused to disturb the order of Judge HAUK relating to the relinquishment of the subpoenaed items. Judge HUFSTEDLER directed that LEWIS remain in custody until he complied with the order to provide the subpoenaed items. She did advise that if he provided the subpoenaed items, he was to be released from custody and a hearing was set for July 1, 1974, before the Ninth circuit Court of Appeals as to whether LEWIS would be obliged to answer the questions presented to him before the Federal Grand Jury which questions he had previously refused to answer.

LEWIS remains in custody.

AUSA VANCE adviced that Attorney FINKEL had raised the issue that the subpoend had arised as a result of electronic surveillance of LEWIS. AUSA VANCE was advised that there was no such surveillance. It was determined from the secretary of the Grand Jury that LEWES furnished his home address as 1625 Sunset Avenue, Santa Monica, California. It was determined from telephone directory assistance that a telephone is listed for WILLIAM LEWIS at this address with number 392-5843.

On July 2, 1974, AUSA VANCE advised that on July 1, 1974, a three-member panel of the U. S. Court of Appeals (USCA) for the Ninth Circuit at Los Angeles adopted the order issued by USCA Judge HUFSTEDLER on July 19, 1974. This order was to effect that WILL LEWIS must stay in jail until he produces the subpoenaed tapes and letter, and that if and when he did comply with that order of the District Court, he would be granted a stay with regard to the issue as to whether or not he had to answer Grand Jury Questions.

On July 1, 1974, the USCA directed that LEWIS must stay in jail until 3:00 p.m., July 19, 1974. Meanwhile, the USCA directed that LEWIS file a brief with the court by July 8, 1974, and the Government file an answer by July 15, 1974.

AUSA VANCE advised that a collateral issue had arisen. On June 19, 1974, U. S. District Court Judge HAUK had issued a "gag order" that neither LEWIS, his attorneys or the Government was to discuss this matter with the press. In further implementation of this order, Judge HAUK had directed Warden JACK WISE, Federal Correctional Institution (FCI), Terminal Island, California, that LEWIS could not have access to the telephone and uncensored mail was to be restricted. On his own initiative, Warden WISE had ordered that LEWIS could not have press interviews on a specific that LEWIS could not have press interviews on a specific basis, this being in compliance with a recent Supreme Court ruling.

On June 26, 1974, LEWIS filed a civil suit against Judge HAUK and Worden WISE to lift the gag order. On June 26, 1974, USCA Judge HUFSTEDLER had granted a stay on the gag order until July 8, 1974, with the result that LEWIS is allowed telephone use and use of uncensored mail. AUSA VANCE advised that the U. S. Attorney's Office will defend Warden WISE in this civil suit. The Department of Justice has not yet advised as to whether or not the U. S. Attorney in Los Angeles will defend Judge HAUK in this civil suit. AUSA VANCE said that it has not yet been decided as to whether or not to support the gog order, and it is presently unknown when an answer will be filed with regard to the civil suit vs. Judge HAUK and Warden WISE. This issue may be decided by the USCA on July 18, 1974, contemporaneously with the other issues. However, the U. S. Attorney at Los Angeles would prefer to segregate the issues, and have a separate hearing on the gag order.

On July 5, 1974, AUSA VANCE advised that on July 4, 1974, Associate Justice WILLIAM 0. AUSA VANCE advised further that on July 3, 1974, U. S. District Court Judge HAUK vacated his previous "gag order" prohibiting communications by either the defendant or the Government with the news media. By July 8, 1974, AUSA VANCE will respond to the previously-filed civil suit against Judge HAUK and FCI Warden WISE, pointing out that the suit is now most in view of the vacation of his previous order by Judge HAUK.

On July 8, 1974, AUSA VANCE advised that Attorney PHILLIP LEHMAN, Reshington, D. G., for the Reporters Committee for the Freedom of the Press, has filed an omicus curiae brief with regard to appeal of WILL LEWIS to the Ninth Circuit concerning the issue of LEWIS' refusal to turn over SLA tape (s) received at KPIK.

On July 22, 1974, AUSA VANCE advised that on July 19, 1974, the Ninth Gircuit Court of Appeals at San Francisco, California, affirmed the judgment of the U.S. District Court in Los Angeles, which held LEWIS in contempt for failure to respond to subpoena duces tecum and to answer Federal Grand Jury questions.

The Ninth Circuit directed that the mandate above should issue on the tenth day following the date of the opinion. AUSA VANCE explained that therefore on July 29, 1974, Judge HAUK can order LEWIS back to jail. However, during this ten-day period, the defendant will be able to file a writ of certiorari with the U.S. Supreme Court, which VANCE assumes he will do. VARCE assumes that if and when the writ is filed, the Supreme Court will be asked to grant a stay until such time as the Supreme Court decides whether or not to grant certiorari.

On August 27, 1974, AUSA PAUL FLYNN, Los Angeles, California, advised he had been informed that date that the Solicitor General had sent pertinent papers to Associate Justice WILLIAM O. 

BARRON CHARLES BROADNAX was interviewed at the California Mcn's Colony, East Facility, where he is incarcerated and assigned prison number B 34157. He was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agents and the nature of the inquiry.

He declined to discuss the degree or nature of his association with EMILY HARRIS. He was shown a photograph of EMILY HARRIS and vaguely smiled but would not comment whether this was, in fact, a photograph of EMILY HARRIS. BROADNAX also would not comment as to whether he had any knowledge regarding the SLA and its reported kidnaping of PATRICIA HEARST.

BROADNAX advised he felt threatened by the fact that he was being interviewed by the FBI. He added that he did not as yet know what his position was with the April 1974 meeting of the Adult Authority which will consider his parole status and his position legally concerning discussion of EMILY HARRIS.

BROADNAX was informed that discussing his association with EMILY HARRIS could reflect favorably on his parole hearing. BROADNAX stated he has to deal with the Adult Authority and the FBI did not really care about his parole situation and could not help his parole status. BROADNAX advised he was not concerned that his parole status could be jeopardized however he would not cooperate in this matter. BROADNAX stated he did not want to create any antagonism nor was he trying to disrupt the FBI's investigation regarding the kidnaping of PATRICIA HEARST, but he stated, "There is nothing I can tell you".

She appeared to be a loner, was soft spoken, polite, did not especially care for men, was a feminist, but did not think she was a lesbian. She appeared to be well educated, probably had attended college and was particularly outspoken in her criticism of the Oakland School System. The Oakland School System was one of the main topics of discussion between and SOLTYSIK believed the bureau-

California, was contacted at his place of employment by SA Following his extensive review of tapes, and transcripts of those tapes, prepared by the Symbionese Liberation Army (SLA), offered the following analysis:

The remaining SLA members have likely gone underground with sympathizers to regroup and gather new members, rather than going off by themselves to purely elude capture. He sees them tieing in with individuals who may already have an organization, or individuals who have credibility with the new left movement (he used the example of someone like JOAN BAEZ, singer and anti-war activist of the 1960's).

He feels that the next time the SLA is heard from it will be via some urban guerrilla-type of tactic, a hit and run situation, in which they will attempt to show that "the men" or the establishment is very vulnerable. An example of this tactic would be the knocking out of a power station or destruction of a building. Random killing of law enforcement officials or the other "enemies" of the SLA is viewed to be an unlikely tactic. They consider themselves the true patriots, the last defenders of the Constitution, and they must fight the establishment to the death.

The rebuilding of the SLA at this point centers around the three original members (WILLIAM and EMILY HARRIS and PATRICIA HEARST) as symbolic leaders, with the deceased members of the SLA as martyrs. He finds no weakness in the remaining three members not feeling guilty about the deaths of the others. Since they do not feel responsible for the deaths of the others, any tactic of law enforcement aimed at working on a guilt will not yield results. On the contrary, they feel proud of the deaths. That is, they feel that their commades have fallen in battle, the most noble gesture, and they will use that as a concept and tactic for retreuchment. In recruiting new members, they will point to the deaths of the other SLA members as an example that

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"the man" is going to kill them in the end and the only thing to do is to fight to the death.

As for PATRICIA HEARST, he is "80 percent confident" that on the first tape she was permitted to talk spentaneously after first being coached as to what to say, but toward the end was hended a document that she was reading (this section pertained to her status as a prisoner of war and the treatment she would be afforded as such a prisoner). He felt she was attempting to communicate that these were not her words.

He is of the opinion that HEARST was not part of the kidnaping, but that her own perconality and thinking was at such a point when she was kidnaped that the SLA members were able to "turn her around" until she got to the point of whetchcarted support for their views. She has now completely identified with the cause and she is now committed to that identity, just as much as the original members.

Were involved much in the writing of any but the last tape, and in that tape, each probably wrote their own part. The philosophic proponents of the SLA (possibly the work primarily of NANCY LING PIRRY) were not the HARRISES or HEARST, and are among those dead now.

Viewing the goals and reasoning of the SLA, he feels law enforcement will best be able to locate and apprehend the individuals through any existing informant system in the counter culture, or by building some people into organizations which are most likely to be contacted by the SLA.

lle suggests that in the future the person transcribing tapes for the Eureau be someone familiar with the jargon of the new left and blacks as he found several phrases which were missed by the transcriber. None of the phrases were significant, in his opinion, but a more accurate transcript might be important if future tapes are released.

Attached is the report of the Medicolegal Investigation Into the Deaths of Symbionese Liberation Army Members, Los Angeles, Part I, prepared by Thomas T. Noguchi, M.D., Chief Medical Examiner-Coroner, County of Los Angeles. This report contains the results of the investigation conducted regarding the circumstances surrounding the death of six members of the Symbionese Liberation Army.

The following is a synopsis of the results of the individual autopsies performed:

- (1) Nancy Ling Perry, cause of death, multiple gunshot wounds. Perry received seven gunshot wounds, three of which are listed as fatal, one of which potentially fatal and three shown as nonfatal.
- Angela Atwood, cause of death, thermal burns and smoke inhalation.
- William Lawton Wolfe, cause of death, smoke (3) inhalation and extensive burns.
- (4) Donald DeFreeze, cause of death, gunshot wound through the head. The report shows DeFreeze received two gunshot wounds, one of which was to the head and fatal, the other to left chest wall which is shown as nonfatal. Of interest, an old bullet was recovered from the right thigh.
- Patricia Soltysik, cause of death, extensive burns, smoke inhalation and gunshot wounds. Four gunshot wounds were received and are shown as nonfatal.
- (6) Camilla Hall, cause of death, gunshot wound to the head. Hall is shown as receiving two gunshot wounds, one tatal through the head and one through the upper left arm stown s nonfatal. REC-93

On October 9, 1974, a person identifying himself as Robert SCAVRON, American citizen, employed by the Interstate Commerce Commission Bureau of Enforcement telephoned the RSO. SCAVRON stated that he wanted to report a man whom he encountered in a Paris bistro in the Latin Quarter on October 6, 1974 at 10:30 PM.

The ten minute encounter took place when this suspicious person struck up a conversation in English. This person told SAVRON that he was an expert is with nitroglycerin and other explosives and had worked for Palestinian terrorists. He expressed admiration for his "friends in California who had blown themselves up, except for the girl who is now in France".

From this statement, SCAVRON inferred that the girl was Patty Rearst. For that reason, he wanted to pass the information on to an American official of the Embassy. SCAVRON's reason for not reporting the information sooner was his inability to use the French telephones.

Further data provided by the suspicious person was his claim of four years service in the Norwegian Army, an arrest and six months in jail in Denmark during the past 18 months for illegal possession of explosives and travel from Mexico to the United States (Chicago, Pittsburg and New York). No additional information was provided.

The Federal Byreau of Investigation is conducting an investigation to determine the whereabouts of Patricia C. Hearst William T. Harris, and Emily M. Harris, whose photographs, dental information, radiographs, and one dental chart appear on these two pages.


A federal warrant charging robbery of a San Francisco bank on April 15, 1974, was issued at San Francisco for Miss Hearst, who was abducted from her Berkeley, Calif, residence on Feb 4, 1974, by a group that has identified itself as the


Symbionese Liberation Army (SLA). The participants in the bank robbery also claimed to be members of the SLA.

Federal warrants charging violations of the National Firearms Act were issued at Los Angeles on May 20 for all three. The trio, who may be traveling together, are known to be heavily armed and should be considered dangerous.

Dentists are requested to notify the nearest FBI office if they have any past or current information regarding these individuals.

The bottom two radiographs are from 1965, and the others are from (bottom to top) 1967, 1968, 1970, and Jan 30, 1974. 



WILLIAM HARRIS'S DENT CHART INTERPRETED

The following interpretation of the dental chart and radiographs of William Harris have been made by George A. Gwinn, a dentist from Noblesville, Ind.

The latest dental chart available was obtained in December 1953. and shows amalgam restorations in the mesicclusal (R) and occlusal (D) surfaces of the upper right first. molar; three amalgam, restorations in the R. D. and F (lingual) surfaces of the upper left first molar; an amalgam restoration in the D surface of the upper right second molar; two amalgam restorations in surfaces D and E (labial) of the lower left first motar; an amalgam restoration in the distoclusa: (S) surface of the second lower left premolar; and an amaigam restoration. in the D and I (mesia!) surfaces of the lower right first molar.

In addition, Dr. Gwinn advised that at age 11, Harris had slight incisal fractures to the upper laft. and right central incisors, he noted that these fractures might not now be discernible.

Any information in this case, and that of course would include Mr. Cohen's information, is carefully evaluated and proper action taken. The matter in a nutshell is that until we have her back safely, we will look everywhere, at any time, and will check out every possibility.





In connection with our efforts to focus greater attention on the Hearnap fugitives, on 10-9-74 Mr. Relley met with Mr. Bert Randolph Sugar, Editor-In-Chief of "Argosy" magazine, and free-lance writer George Clifford. A general discussion ensued concerning this Bureau's search for Patty Hearst and William and Emily Harris. Thereafter, Mr. Sugar and Mr. Clifford were briefed on specific aspects of the Hearnap matter by Assistant Director Robert E. Gebhardt, and SAs Hichael A. Morrow and Elroy Anthony of the General Investigative Division, and Inspector George T. Quinn and SA

Subsequently, the Research Section, External Affairs Division, has been in direct and frequent contact with Mr. Sugar and Mr. Clifford, and has assisted them in the preparation of the Hearnap article.

The resultant article, including a statement by Mr. Helley, has been submitted by Mr. Sugar for our review as to accuracy. Although some minor punctuation and grammar changes may be made, the attached text represents that which will appear in the December, 1974, issue of "Argoff." This issue will be on newsstands in mid-Movember.

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LEAD STORY--ARGOSY MAGAZINE--DECEMBER, 1974

The FRI needs your help.

A young girl is lost, and the FEI's 8,500 Agents--plus thousands of police officers from coast-to-coast--haven't been able to find her.

She is petite--5 feet 3 and 110 pounds--attractive, with a distinctive profile and a mole on the right side of her chin, and she is 20-years-old. She is in extraordinary danger.

Her name is Patty Hearst.

Everyone knows the story of Patty's abduction from her apartment in Berkeley last February 4. That single act gave her captors, a small and previously insignificant band called the Symbionese Liberation Army, more attention than many worthier causes could command.

The next steps in the drama--a tape of Patty's frightened voice pleading for her father to pay the millions for a food program for California's needy; Patty's strident voice on another tape announcing that she had joined the SLA; her participation in a bank robbery: her apparent role as a gunslinger in a petty larceny case; the shoot-out in Los Angeles that killed six of her companions-in-arms; her abrupt disappearance--commanded more attention than the plight of the poor she said she wanted to help.

Now she has vanished. No one outside the tight circle of the revolutionary left knows where she is. As the object of one of the greatest searches by law enforcement authorities in history, she can easily become the prey of unscrupulous people who, for their own ends, may seek further use of her name, her family's position and diminished fortune, and even sacrifice her life.

It doesn't have to be that way.

We know that people on the run often read stories about themselves. For example, Albert Nussbaum and Bobby Wilcoxson, the notorious bank robbers who were the subject of the FBI story in last month's issue, both had copies of an earlier ARGOSY with them when they were captured. The magazine contained a story of the search for Nussbaum and Wilcoxson.

Patty Hoarst is probably reading this article now. There are some things she should know.

Mo matter how many people are with her, she is still alone in a difficult and often hostile world. She can't sleep or eat, or even live, without the constant, gnawing fear that someone will turn her in. And there are people waiting to do just that. Patty's father has posted a \$50,000 reward. It can be tempting, particularly in these times when it is so hard to come by a dollar.

Wherever Patty is hiding, she is, as one FBI Agent put it,
"in her own prison." She can remember the places she used to like
to go, and the people she used to like to see, but all of that is
cut off from her now. Unlike justice in the real world, the sentence
in Patty's private prison has no end. There is no time off for good
behavior.

Patty is unquestionably aware of what happened to her SLA friends in Los Angeles and still may believe the authorities want to kill her, too. She might be, as one FBI Agent put it, "afraid of the, well, 'pigs'."

TEI Director Clarence Kelley has assured ARGOSY that he "absolutely" wants Patty alive and well.

"This is not a situation of good guys against bad guys,'
Kelley said. "It is an effort to bring Patty to justice. We're not
out on a vendetta."

It's highly possible, of course, that Patty and the two people who were with her when she was last seen, William and Emily Harris, believe they are destined to be martyrs. But that's counter-productive. Dead people don't accomplish anything. Even Che Guevara's enshrinement as a hero among many young people in this country passed with the speed of today's fads. Human lives are worth more than that.

And Helley doesn't want Patty's tragedy to bring any more killings--to FBI Agents, to police or to Patty and her friends.

"We just don't want any shoot-outs," he said. "Let's not have any violence."

Patty probably doesn't realize that by remaining a fugitive she is giving indirect assistance to certain criminals across the nation who are supposed to be her sworn enemies. Look at it this way: in the first four months of the search for her, the FBI alone invested 98 Agent years the equivalent of one person's work for almost a century) and an estimated \$2.6 million. Although accountants have not totaled up the additional expenditures, FBI spokesmen believe it has more than doubled in the ensuing months.

This work could have been channeled into other areas, "Kalley said, "such as investigations of white collar criminals and organized crime." So, instead of fighting against corruption, Patty is helping it. That's not much of a revolution. She's wasting her own energy, as well as the FBI's, by running.

Patty has probably learned by now that life on the run isn't much fun. Many of the former members of the FBI's "Most Wanted Fugitives list can attest to that. "Running is a bitch," said Ponald Harvey, who was hiding out to escape murder charges for three-and-a-half months before his arrest last March. John Cooke, wanted on kidnaping charges, said "it is a relief to be caught. I knew it was coming, but I didn't know when." Francis Brannan, another murder suspect, said "I'm tired of running." And John William Clouser, known as "the Florida Fox," said "running is a helluva game."

Patty could probably say it better than anyone. It wasn't so long ago that she had clean sheets, and adequate clothes and good food. But it all probably seems far in the past for her. Now she would probably settle for a day's peace, or a lock on her door, or the ability to say "no" to one of her friends.

The toughest things, perhaps, for a revolutionary in hiding is the loss of a forum. If Patty really believed the things she said—and there is no reason to doubt it—the ideas she learned from her captors in just two months must have impressed her. With her friends dead, and only herself and Bill and Emily Harris left to spread their message, it seems unfortunate that they are now afraid to speak out. If people are willing to die for an idea, others should have the opportunity to hear it, and then decide whether or not to accept it.

An arrest would not necessarily silence Patty and her friends. Other revolutionaries have used courtrooms as effective forums. It was in a court in Santiago de Cuba that Fidel Castro defended his attack on an army barracks and won converts with his promise, "history will absolve me."

Patty probably doesn't even know how the public feels about her. She isn't hated, either by Americans in general or by the authorities. "There is no intensity of feeling against her," said FEI Director Kelley.

The nation, too, is compassionate about her predicament. There is no evidence to indicate she was anything but an unwilling prisoner of the SLA when she was kidnaped, and the Harrises were considered "fringe people" by the FBI. "Before the May shoot-out, we couldn't charge them with anything," an FBI spokesman said.

It seems natural to wonder why, with all these factors and such an enormous effort, Patty Hearst and her two companions are still at large.

Part of the problem, Kelley states, is because part of the public-those key witnesses and sympathizers-have not cooperated with the FBI in this case. Kelley is a big-shouldered man with a square jaw and eyes that are constantly probing behind

his dark-rimmed glasses. He projects the manner of a smart, tough cop, but there is a disarming gentleness in his voice when talks about Patty.

The men who work for Kelley seem equally compassionate. It is almost unbelievable to find people directing a hunt of virtually unparalleled scope and intensity who talk about the target of their efforts with such understanding. It is almost like they are brothers, looking for a lost little sister. It is possible that law officers have never behaved quite like this. It is certain that there has never been a case quite like this.

"This is a crime that fits 1974," one FBI Agent said. "It was the first political kidnaping in this country. In a classic kidnaping, the kidnapers want to get the victim back as soon as possible. The victim is a stone around their neck. It all changed, though, when they made their ransom demand. They didn't want money. They wanted to feed every welfare family in California."

The strange dips and twists of the case have often left Agents frustrated. "There is no rational explanation for some of the things that have happened in this case," said one Agent. For example, it is rare, Agents said, for bank robbers to escape unnoticed.

"With even just two men, they are lucky if they can make the switch (change from their get-away car to another vehicle) without being seen. Usually, there are half a dozen people who see them. But after the April 15th robbery in San

Francisco, nine people--that's the entire San Francisco Giants baseball team--made the switch into two cars. Yet, we could only find one guy, a tradesman making a delivery, who saw it."

Agents are also dismayed by the unevenness of the SLA group's actions. The bank robbery is considered something of a tactical wonder, with five people carrying off the operation—including shootings inside and outside the bank—in two minutes, far quicker than the average time for a bank robbery. Yet Harris's attempt to steal a pair of socks smacked of raw amateurism. Professionals would never risk a confrontation while on the run.

And the absence of any confirmed sightings of
Patty and her friends since early June is another bizarre
turn. Although the FBI has had hundreds of thousands of tips
in the case, and all have been checked out, the people who
have actually seen Patty and the Harrises are keeping quiet.
Hormally, no place is safe for known fugitives. The answer
may be the mystique of the new left, a movement that has
been particularly baffling to the FBI. Daniel Berrigan and
Angela Davis were located with great difficulty, while
other wanted persons, like Bernardine Dohrn of the Weather
Underground, have been able to evade the FBI for several years.

Relley believes that Patty and her friends "really and truly are accepted as folk heroes by some people." He said that it is not uncommon for such fugitives to candidly

identify themselves to the residents of communes and receive sanctuary. "Then," he said, "a wall goes up around them.

Nobody will say anything."

"This is one of the most puzzling cases I've faced in over 33 years in law enforcement," candidly states

Director Kelley. "First Patty Hearst is the victim of a kidnaping and now she is the subject of serious criminal charges. But, with all the unanswered questions, let it be understood that Patty Hearst and the Harrises are wanted fugitives."

Other FDI sources indicated that no theory as to the location of Patty or the Harrises can be rejected. They may have separated, may have gone to Canada or Mexico, or may have remained in the Los Angeles area where they were last seen. They could be hidden in a sympathizer's basement, totally withdrawn from the eyes of a citizen who could report their whereabouts. Until the search can be narrowed down, it will be nationwide.

"We live with this thing day in and day out," an Agent said. "It might be that it'll take us a while to find them, but we'll keep trying."

Current efforts include massive distribution of flyers describing Patty and the Harrises in both English and Spanish, the latter aimed at Spanish-speaking communities in the U.S. and in Mexico. Police are also being circularized. "We'd like every police officer in the country to have one of these in his pocket," an Agent said.

Hany detection aids are also being used, among them dogs trained to the scent of Patty and Hrs. Harris.

But until someone spots Patty, the case is stuck in the same place it was on June 7, while the FBI keeps looking for that one decisive clue.

Maybe that one clue will be yours!

assure you that the FBI is sparing no effort to bring these three to the bar of justice, and will continue to do so. And we will succeed in our search. I can't say where or when, but I can say that we will find Patty Hearst and the Harrises. With full public cooperation in this matter, that day will come ever so much sooner. This is not a new appeal for public cooperation. In fact, much of the credit for the apprehension of the 33,000 fugitives from justice for the twelve months ending in June can be directly attributed to the public's cooperation and concern.

This public cooperation has manifested itself by providing us with literally hundreds of thousands of tips. Two of those once listed on the "Ten Nost Manted Fugitives" list were caught because people coming through the Bureau on its tour recognized pictures exhibited as someone they had only recently seen. We need this sort of cooperation again. I am now asking you, the ARGOSY reader, to contact us if you think you have information which

could assist us in our quest to capture Patty Hearst and William and Emily Harris.

The FEI has built its reputation through sound and solid performance. It was only through this performance that we could hope to gain both your support and that of the media.

We realize we must succeed in the Hearst case and we will. We've already expended much time and effort on this case and will continue to pursue it until that time when we succeed. But in order to succeed I must ask you, the ARGOSY reader, to

cooperate with us as you have so many times in the past.

I would like to ask each one of you personally to help. Study the photographs on the accompanying pages. Have you seen these three fugitives? Reconsider recent unusual happenings—no matter how trivial you think they were. Might they have some bearing on this important case? If you think that you may have some information, won't you either call us or write me directly. You may be the one to help us bring these three fugitives to justice.

February 4, 1974--Patty Hearst is kidnaped from her Berkeley...
California, apartment at 9:20 p. m. by two men and a woman,

February 7, 1974--A letter sent to Berkeley radio station KPFA by the Symbionese Liberation Army (SLA), claims responsibility for the kidnaping, calling it "arrest ang protective custody and, if resistance, execution" and warning that "should any attempt be made by authorities to rescue the prisoner, or to arrest or harm any SLA elements, the prisoner is to be executed." rebruary 12, 1974 -- The first of many taped messages from the SLF. is delivered to the Berkeley radio station, featuring Patty Hearst's voice to reassure her parents and the voice of a spokesman, identified as Field Marshal Cinque, demanding "seventy dollars' worth" of food for a every needy Californian as an act of "Good Faith." February 13, 1974 -- Patty's father, Randolph A. Hearst, says he can't meet the demands of his daughter's kidnapers for a multimillion-dollar food giveaway.

February 16, 1974--In another tape recording, delivered to the Hearst family, Patty's captors ease their demands, saying they will "accept a sincere effort on your part" in meeting their demands.

February 18, 1974--Randolph A. Hearst announced formation of a People-In-Need food distribution program to win the release of his daughter, pledging \$2 million to feed the needy.

February 21, 1974--Another tape recording calls the Hearst offering "a few crumbs" and demands that an additional \$4 million be added within 24 hours.

February 22, 1974--The first food distribution program in the Bay Area breaks down in chaos as thousands fight for food and Hearst puts a limit on the SLA demands, but only if Patty is "released unharmed."

February 28-March 8, 1974--The People-In-Need program distributes \$1 million in food.

Harch 9, 1974--In a tape recorded message, Patty Hearst accuses her parents of indifference to the poor and the SLA demands an expanded food program.

March 23, 1974-An expanded food program gives away another \$1 million in food, completing the program.

April 2, 1974--A communique is delivered to "The Phoenix," an underground newspaper, promising that it will reveal the time and place of Patty Hearst's release within 72 hours.

April 3, 1974--In a tape recording delivered to radio station KSAN Patty Hearst announces that she has "chosen to stay with the SLA and fight for the freedom of all oppressed people" and that she can never go back "to the life I lived before."

April 15, 1974--Patty Hearst is positively identified as ne of five participants in the \$10,000 robbery of a branch of the Hibernia Bank in San Francisco, in which two bystanders are shot. Patty Hearst is named in a Federal indictment as a material witness.

April 24, 1974--In a tape delivered to a San Francisco policeman, Miss Hearst, as "Tania," boasts that "My gun was loaded" and that she was a willing participant in the bank robbery.

May 2, 1974--An abandoned debris-cluttered apartment in San Francisco is raided by the police and FBI only days after it was used as the original hideout for the nine members of the SLA and the possible location of the abducted Miss Hearst.

May 3, 1974--The deadline expires for the \$4 million food ransom offered for the return of Patty Hearst and the offer is withdrawn.

May 3, 1974--The Hearst family offers a \$50,000 reward for information leading to the safe return of their daughter.

May 16, 1974--Two women and a man, subsequently identified as William and Emily Harris and Patty Hearst, get away from Mel's Sporting Goods Store in Inglewood, California, after shoplifting an 39¢ pair of socks and spraying the store with a machine gun to effect an escape in their van.

in the abandoned van, police and FBI Agents track six members of the SLA to a house at 1466 54th Street in Los Angeles, where they ignored the warning to come out and engaged the police and the FBI in a pitched battle. After an hour, the house caught on fire, possibly from a tear-gas cannister striking one of the SLA's bombs and all six died, either by gunshot wounds, burns or smoke inhalation.

June 6, 1974--Patty Hearst is indicted by a Federal grand jury for armed robbery and use of a weapon during a felony with the two charges carrying maximum prison sentences of 35 years.

June 7, 1974--Radio station KPFK in Van Nuys, California, receives a tape in which Patty Hearst, now calling herself "Tania," calls the six slain SLA members her "beautiful sisters and brothers" and vows that her "comrades didn't die in vain" but that she "died in that fire and was reborn."

June 8-November 18, 1974--No further word is received from Patty Hearst nor any substantive lead on her whereabouts supplied to the FEI.

November 19, 1974--The FBI asks that ARGOSY readers assist in locating Patty Hearst and William and Emily Harris.





HEARNAP

The Symbionese Liberation Army (SLA) came to our attention when they claimed credit for the killing of black Oakland School Superintendent Marcus Foster on November 6, 1973. On January 10, 1974, Joseph Remiro and Russell Little were arrested in Concord, California, following a shooting in the vicinity of a house believed to be occupied by Nancy Ling Perry, Russell Little, and at times, Donald David DeFreeze. Little and Remiro have since been charged with the Foster shooting.

At approximately 9:30 p.m., on February 4, 1974, Patricia Campbell Hearst, daughter of Randolph Hearst, was kidnaped from an apartment at 2603 Benvenue in Berkeley, which she shared with her fiancee, Steven Weed. She was kidnaped by two males, at least one of which was black and a white female. These individuals were armed with automatic weapons and in the getaway, shots were fired from these weapons. The SLA on February 7, 1974, in a letter to a radio station in Berkeley, claimed credit for the kidnaping of Patrica Hearst.

In the following weeks, the SLA communicated with the public and the victim's parents by letters and/or cassettes and made a demand for a massive food give-away program. In tapes received February 16, February 20, March 10, and April 3, 1974, the voice of Patricia Hearst was heard on the tapes.

In the April 3, 1974, tape, Patricia Hearst indicated that she had the option of being released or joining her captors, and she elected to join her captors.

Investigation by the FBI determined that in addition to Remiro and Little, the following individuals were central core members of the SLA, and some of them undoubtedly participated in the kidnaping of Patricia Hearst:

HEARNAP

On April 15, 1974, Donald David DeFreeze, Nancy Ling Perry, Camilla Christine Hall, Patricia Michelle Soltysik, and Patricia Campbell Hearst held up the Sunset Office of the Hibernia Bank in San Francisco obtaining \$10,692.51. During the robbery, they fired automatic weapons wounding a number of people in and about the bank. They escaped in rental cars. During the robbery, they apparently had a cover car occupied by four individuals with rifles waiting across the street.

Investigation at San Francisco reveals that the subjects remained in San Francisco following the kidnaping until approximately May 9, or in the early morning of May 10, 1974, when they departed for Los Angeles.

On May 16, 1974, William and Emily Harris, while shopping in Mel's Sporting Goods Store in Los Angeles, begame involved in a scuffle following a shoplifting by William Harris. As the scuffle moved to the street and a revolver was displayed, an individual believed to be Patricia Hearst fired approximately 27 rounds from an automatic weapon from a van parked across the street from the sporting goods store. The three escaped in the van and subsequently kidnaped at least two individuals and ultimately disappeared on the afternoon of May 17, 1974, on the fringe of the Griffith Park area in Los Angeles after releasing their last hostage.

On the evening of May 17, 1974, Nancy Ling Perry, Camilla Christine Hall, Patricia Michelle Soltysik, Angela Atwood, Donald David DeFreeze and William Lawton Wolfe became involved in a shoot-out with the Los Angeles Police Department and the FBI at 1466 East 54th Street, Los Angeles, and all the above individuals perished.

The Harrises and Hearst were believed to have been in Los Angeles on May 19, 1974. Their whereabouts since that date is unknown; however, another tape containing their voices was received by a Los Angeles radio station on June 7, 1974.

OBSERVATIONS

Miscellaneous

With one exception, the SLA hardcore was composed of college educated Caucasians from the East Bay area of San Francisc who lived in a frugal style holding down menial jobs. The group was active in prison reform and directed the majority of their contacts with black inmates.

VEHICLES

The general mode of transportation utilized by the members of the SLA was either rental cars or used vans.

FALSE IDENTIFICATION

Members of the SLA have been known to obtain birth certificates of individuals who are deceased and also birth certificates of individuals who are legitimate living people. They primarily have used identification of living people which was stolen. The Harrises are known to obtain false driver's licenses in fictitious names.

HOUSING

In the Fall of 1973, and up until approximately January, 1974, the SLA members resided in apartments and houses which were middle-income class areas and following the kidnaping of Patricia Hearst, they resided in extremely low-income areas in apartments and houses that were sometimes without water and electricity. They invariably either boarded up the windows or nailed drapes or other material across the windows so that no light was permitted into the dwelling. They also, on many occasions, installed additional security locks. The houses were generally without furniture and they utilized old mattresses or sleeping bags.

CLOTHING

The members apparently attempted to dress in a quasi-military manner. The girls generally wore blue jeans and peacoats or similar-type jackets and hiking boots. Upon many occasions, they wore two sets of clothing. Most of the SLA pads they abandoned contained wigs, indicating that the women could easily change hair color and styling.

WEAPONS

Our investigation indicates that the members of the SLA have practiced at at least one firearms range in the Berkeley area and possessed automatic pistols, revolvers, sawed-off shotguns, and M-l carbines, which had been engineered so as to be capable of an extremely high cyclic rate of fire. When last seen, the Harrises and Patricia Hearst were known to have been in possession of at least two automatic carbines and handguns.

HEARNAP

THE FUGITIVES

The cohesive factors of the SLA in the beginning appeared to be DeFreeze and Nancy Ling Perry. Since these individuals are dead, the possibility certainly exists that the Harrises may have separated themselves from Patricia Hearst. It should be borne in mind that one of the fugitives could be encountered by himself. For this reason, a two-phase fugitive investigation should be conducted; namely, one phase focusing on Patricia Hearst and the second on the Harrises.

PROCESS AND DESCRIPTIONS

The details of the Federal process outstanding for Patricia Hearst, Emily Harris and William Harris and their descriptions, may be found on Wanted Flyer 475A.

INASMUCH AS THE FUGITIVES IN THIS MATTER ARE KNOWN TO BE CARRYING AUTOMATIC WEAPONS, THEY SHOULD BE CONSIDERED ARMED AND DANGEROUS.



Intimations of SLA responsibility for the kidnaping of PATRICIA HEARST were confirmed on February 7, 1972 by receipt of a letter sent to Radio Station KPFA, Berheley, together with a Hobil Credit Card of PANDOLPH HEARST. The letter dated February 4, 1974 and captioned SLA Communique #3 stated that an arrest order had been served on PATPICIA CAMPBELL HEARST by combat elements of the SLA, and she was now in protective custody. If any attempts to rescue PATR C14.

TEARST on horm on annexi any SLA elecents were made, to was stated that the prisoner would be executed. The letter added that further communications would follow.

On February 12, 1974, Padio Station KPFA was the recipient of a second note for RAMPOLPH HEARST. The note demanded a symbolic gesture of the furnishing of \$70 worth of food to all people in California with reliate cards, Social Security Cards, pension eards, food stamp cards, disabled veteran eards, medical eards, panole or probation papers, and fail or bail release stips.

The SIA also demanded that their emblem, demand, aims, and purposes be widely published in their entirety in newspapers and other media. The demand was coupled with a threat that if these demands were not met, no further negotiations would be conducted and Piss HEALST would be executed.

A cassette containing the voice of PATRICIA HEADST accompanied the note to establish the authenticity of the claim she was being held by the SLA.

RANDOLPH HEARST, on February 13, 1974, made a police statement that he would respond publicly to the A demand as scan as he could study the logistics of attempting to distribute such a large supply of food.

Before HEARST could respond with the result of his study of the problem, another rape communication containing the voices of PATRICIA HEARST and CIKOUE, General Field Marshal of the SLA, was received on the afternoon of February 16, 1974.

This tape, delivered through Reverend CECIL WILLIAMS of the Glide Memorial United Methodist Church, San Francisco, was left at the San Francisco Airport bus terminal, Reverend WILLIAMS' church being advised telephonically where a key to the bus terminal locker in which the tape cassette was found could be located.

The tape contained a statement by PATRICIA HEARST to the effect that she was being well treated, efforts to gain her freedom might endanger her life, and the SLA would accept a reasonable attempt by her father to comply with SLA demands as satisfactory. The voice of CINQUE then reiterated the SLA's willingness to accept a reasonable attempt by RANDOLPH HEARST to comply as satisfactory.

attement to the news media to the effect that \$2,000,000, \$500,000 of which represented its own funds, would be utilized in connection with meeting SIA demands. He stated the balance would be provided by the Fearst Foundation and would be delivered to a tax exempt charitable cryanization approved by the Attorney General of California.

On Felruary 19, 1974, PANDOLPH HEARST announced that an organization known as "People In Need" (PIK) had been formed to administer the distribution of food.

RANDOLPH HEARST's statement of February 18, 1974 to the effect that \$2,000,000 would be spent on the food distribution program was responded to by a fourth communication from the SLA on February 20, 1974 in the form of another tape sent to Reverend WILLIAMS. The rape containing the voices of PATRICIA HEARST and CINQUE demanded an additional \$4,000,000 be spent on the food program.

On the occasion of PATRICIA HEARST's birthday,

February 20, 1974, Mr. and Mrs. HEARST made a public

statement to the news media to the effect they felt sure

she was all right and expressing their hope for a further

reassuring communication from their daughter.

The first distribution of food by PIN occurred of February 22, 1974 and was the occasion of unruly enough and attacks on police and distribution centers by recipients of the food. Later distribution was of a more enderly nature.

February 22, 1974 was also the occasion of a press conference by CHARLES GULD, Hearst Corporation executive, at which the contribution of \$4,000,000 to the food program, \$2,000,000 to be released immediately and \$2,000,000 in January, 1975 by the Pearst Corporation was announced.

A prerequisite of release of the money to PIH was the release of PATRICIA HEAFST unharmed. It was noted that if the offer was not acceptable by the SIA, no other funds would be committed by the corporation or Hearst Foundation under any circumstances.

Subsequent to the receipt of the February 20, 1974 tape from the SLA, no further communication was received until Harch 9, 1974, when a tape accompanied by a California State Automobile Association Hembership Card of PATRICIA HEARST was sent to Radio Station KSAN,

In Francisco, California, a telephone call directing them to a woman's restroom at Foster's Pestaurant, Polh and Suzzer Sincets, San Francisco.

The (emale voice on the tape accused the HFAFST empire of distributing poor quality food to the people, of failing to publish all SIA communications and documents in the media in full, and of lying to the people as to the effectiveness of the PIR operation.

The speaker stated that PATRICIA HEARST would be allowed to communicate with her family only after arrangements were made for RUSSELL LITTLE and JOSEPH REHIRO to speak on live television to the SLA and the people relative to the conditions of their confinement.

The voice of PATRICIA HEARST then spoke criticizing her parents, accusing the FBI of Each of regard for her safety, and indicating herparents had not done all within their power to run a proper food distribution program. Two additional female voices spoke for a short period commenting in the usual SLA rhetoric on the aims of the SLA. The voice of CINQUE then spoke urging all oppressed people of all races to arm themselves to wage war against corporations.

his belief the FEI would do nothing to endanger his doughter's
life.

25, 1974, KPFA Radio Station received a letter for release over KPFA from JOSEPH REMIRO and RUSSELL

LITTLE complaining of the conditions of their confirement, that of access to the public, and expressed the hope that PATRICIA HEARST would be released unharmed. The letter was replete with SIA rhetoric and philosophies.

On March 36, 1974, RANDOLPH MEARST released n statement from Clifford Ifffenson, and Treath Rom Joff, a former and admitted SLA member, and the extension innotes of the California State Phison System unging the release of PATRICIA HEARST as in the rest interests of the poor and oppressed.

Subsequent to RANDOLPH HEARST's press release on April 2, 1974, the "San Francisco Phoenix", an underground newspaper of San Francisco, was the recipient of SLA

Communious #7, a letter dated March 29, 1974, stating test within 72 hours further communications regarding the release of PATRICIA MEARST would be made. The letter stated that the communication would set forth the state, city, and time of release.

The hopes raised by receipt of this letter for release of the kidney victim were soundly churhed by the receipt by Radio Station KSAN on repril 3. 1974 of a tape and photograph of PATRICIA HEIPST standing before an SIA flag, dressed in a dungaree uniform, carrying an automatic weapon with a scope.

The tape, commencing with the voice of PATRICIA HEARST, claimed the voluntary nature of her following statement, chiticized her parents and fiance for failing to obtain the release of JOSEPH REMIRO and RUSSELL LITTLE on bail, stalling for time while the FBI attempted to assassinate her and her guards, and the sham of the PIN Program. She stated that she had been given a choice of being released or joining the SLA, and had made her decision to join the SLA and fight, adopting her new name, that of a female guernilla fighter who had died fighting in Bolivia with CHE GEVERA. She stated she now would be known as TANIA.

Other voices then spok praising the leaderslip of C1800E and philosophies of the SLA, followed
by the voice of C1800E thanking those who had aided
in the PIR Propram and prenouncing death sentences on
three individuals accused by C1800E of working with
the enemy. He also stated that in the future, no
further prisoners would be taken, all enemies of the
people would be shot on sight. The tape closed with
C1800E announcing suspension of all further negotiations
for the release of PATRICIA PEARST, incomuch as it was
now a most issue.

identity of the members of the SLA were confirmed in part by the robbery of The Hibernia Bank, 22nd and Noriega Streets, San Francisco. In this obviously well-planned robbery, witnesses and photographs taken by concealed cameras definitely established the identities of PONALP DAVID DE FREFZE, PATRICIA SOLTYSIK, CAMILLA HALL, NANCY LING PERRY, and PATRICIA HEARST, while four unidentified members maited outside of the bank in a protected vehicle. In a spray of our fire, the nine members departed in two rented cars discovered abandoned several blocks from the bank scene a short time later.

The continuing controversy over whether PATRICIA EARST was a willing or unwilking adherent to the Sik was only exacerbated by the robbery as witnesses differed on whether she appeared to be acting as a voluntary participant and photographs were interpreted on the bias of the observers as to whether or not they indicated she was a forced participant in the robbery.

on April 24, 1974, another tape from the SIA was received and made mention of the bank notbery, identifying it as an operation to expropriate funds to be utilized by the SIA in its operations. It contained the voice of PATRICIA HEARST, at which time she stated she was a willing participant in the bank robbery, disassociated herself with family and briends, and indicated she would be engaged in further operations of the SIA.

The death of the six SLA memiers, PONALD DAVID DE FREEZE, PATRICIA "Mizmoon" SOLTYSIK, CANTLLA HALL, ANGELA ATMOOD, WILLIE WOLFE, and MANCY LING PARRY, confirmed previous investigation identifying the handcore of the SLA and the bidnapers of PATRICIA HEARST as eight in number, including William and EMILY HARRIS.

Fugitive investigation is presently being conducted to locate WILLIAM and EMILY MARRIS and PATRICIA

MEARST who were all charged May 20, 1974 at Los Angeles, California with violation of the Patienal Fincarms Act. Bond was recommended at \$500,000 each.

On June 6, 1974, PATRICIA HEARST was indicated by the Federal Grand June, San Francisco, California with one count of Armed Banh Robbers and one count of Possession of Tinearns in Commission of a Federa.

On June 7, 1974, a tape was received by Padic Station KPFK in Los Angeles. On the tape was the voice of TECC (VILLIAM HARRIS) who commented about the shooting on May 17, 1974, and the shoplifting which led up to the shooting. Next was the voice of YCLANDA (EMILY HARRIS) who also commented about the shooting. The voice following was that of TAHIA (PATRICIA HEARST) who commented about the shooting was that of TAHIA (PATRICIA HEARST) who commented about the shooting and who expressed her love for CUJO (WILLIAM WOLFE) and her dissatisfaction with her parents and the type of life for which they stood.

MEMBERS OF THE SYMBIONESE LIBERATION ARMY

PATRICIA CAMPBELL HEARST, aka Tanka

PATRICIA CAMPBELL HEARST, Caucasian bemale, was born February 20, 1954, in Los Angeles, the third of sive daughters to the wealthy RANDOLPH and CATHERINE HEARST. PATRICIA was reared in Los Angeles until 1964 when her father moved to the Eay Area of California to become President of the "San Francisco Examiner". Since that time, the family has resided in Hillsborough, Califernia. PATRICIA attended private, elementary, and high school and in 1970, transferred to the Crystal Springs School for girls. During her junior year, she met STEVEN WEED, a teacher in the school, who she began to date and to whom she later became engaged. During the summer of 1972, she travelled to Europe with a student group from Merlo Park College where she had enrolled. Returning to California for the school year of 1972, she enrolled at the University of California at Berkeley and began to share an apartment in that city with WEED, who was now a anaduate student.

On February 4, 1974, HEARST was abducted from her apartment in Berkeley by members of the Symbionese Liberation Army (SLA). She was next seen participating in a bank robbery of The Hibernia Bank, Sunset Office, San Francisco, California. She has claimed that she freely became a member of the SLA. On May 16, 1974, she utilized an automatic weapon to free other SLA members who were being detained by store security guards in Los Angeles. She is now believed to be in the company of WILLIAM and EMILY HARRIS.

She has been charged with a violation of the National Firearms Act and the Federal Bank Robbery Statute.

WILLIAM TAYLOR HARRIS aka Teco

HARRIS is a Caucasian male, who was born on January 12, 1945, in Fort Sill, Oblahoma. His mother and stepfather reside in Carmel, Indiana, and WILLIAM HARRIS attended high school in that eity. He was a fraternity man at the University of Indiana, attending from September, 1963 to June, 1965, when he entered the United States Marine Corps. He received an honorable discharge in 1967, re-enrolling at the University of Indiana in February, 1968. HARRIS received a BS Degree in Education in 1970 and was awarded a Master's Degree in Education in 1973.

HARRIS married EMILY SCHWARTZ in Late 1971, and the couple travelled for some two months in the Summer of 1972 before settling in Oahland, California. Since that time, WILLIAM MARRIS has been engaged in mainly menial jobs, working for REA Express, a day care center, and for the United States Post Office. He and his wife, EMILY, apparently planned on going underground, and they abruptly deserted their apartment after an Symbionese Liberation Army shoot-out in Concord, California on January 10, 1973. WILLIAM HARRIS was very active with prison inmates and working on prison reform.

HARRIS and his wife are believed to be presently in the company of PATRICIA HEARST.

EMILY MONTAGUE SCHWARTZ HARRIS aka Yolanda

HARRIS is a female Caucasian, who was born on February II, 1947 in Baltimore, Haryland. She attended grade school and high school in Illinois and her parents reside in Clarendon Hills, Illinoit.

EMILY HARRIS entered the University of Indiana in Bloomington, Indiana in September, 1965, and received an AB Degree in English in June, 1969. After graduation, she taught school in Bloomington, Indiana until June, 1972.

EMILY married a former fellow student and Marine Corps voteran, MILLIAM TAYLOR HARRIS, in late 1971, and in the Summer of 1972, the pair travelled for some two months before coming to Oakland, California where the pair made their home until January, 1974. EMILY HARRIS, while in Oatland, worked as a secretary at the University of California at Eerkeley from the Fall of 1972 until the time she went underground in January, 1974. Both EMILY HARRIS and her husband were deeply involved in prison reform and made regular visits to several black inmates. The pair apparently had planned on going underground for some time. EMILY is believed to be involved in the actual hidnaping of PATRICIA HEARST, inasmuch as one of her gloves was found in the car used in the abduction. "EMILY comes from" a well-fixed middle class family and was a sorority member at the University of Indiana. Symbionese Liberation Army members ROBYN STEINER and ANGELA ATWOOP have both lived with the HARRISCS.

EMILY and WILLIAM HARRIS are presently believed to be with PATRICIA HEARST.

PONALD DAVID DE FREEZE aka "Cinoue"

DE FREEZE was a relatively uneducated black male, who, under the name of "CINQUE", was the nominal head of the Symbionese Liberation Army (SLA), an organization whose other members were college educated Caucasians. DE FREEZE was born on November 16, 1943 at Cleveland, Ohio, and has been a delinquent since an early age. When he was 13 he ran away from home and was placed in a detention home. At the age of 14, he stole - from a parking meter in Buffalo, New York and was sent to a reformatory. In 1965, DE FREEZE was arrested in the West Covina Area of California with a gas bomb and sawed-off rifie. He was again arrested in 1967 with a homemade bomb and gun, and in December of the same year, was arrested on suspicion of robbery of guns. While he was being taken to his home, apparently to obtain the weapons, he attempted to escape from officers. He was placed on three years probation for this offense.

DE FREEZE married a woman who already had three children. The marriage resulted in another three children, and the mother and six children remain in Cleveland, Chio. She was attempting to divorce DE FREEZE.

DE FREEZE was again arrested in Los Angeles, California on November 17, 1969, and was found Guilty of robbery in the first degree and assault with a deadly weapon. He began serving his prison term on December 23, 1969, and, for a time, was imprisoned at the California Medical Facility, Vacaville, California, where he was active in the Black Cultural Association and came to know several of the Caucasians who later joined him in the SLA. DE FREEZE escaped from Soledad on March 5, 1973, and made his way to Berkeley, California, where he was harbored by PATRICIA SOLTYSIK.

DE FREEZE was believed to have been involved in the actual abduction of PATRICIA HEARST, apparently directed the robbery of The Hibernia Bank by the SLA in San Francisco on April 15, 1974, and died in the Los Angeles shoot-out in May, 1974.

ANGELA DE ANGELIS ATWOOD aha Gelina

ATWOOD WAS a Caucasian Semale, who was born on February 6, 1949 in Paterson, New Jersey. Her Sather is a Teamster official in North Haledon, New Jersey.

ATMOOD attended the University of Indiana in Bloomington, Indiana, graduating in 1970, with a major in speech and honors in theatries. She has also taken dancing lessons for some 13 years. ATMOOD attended graduate school at the University of Indiana from 1970 to 1971, and married GARY DEAN ATMOOD in Bloomington, Indiana in May, 1971.

The ATWOODS were closely associated with the HARRISES, both in Bioomington, Indiana and in the Oahland-Berkeley area. The ATWOODS came to the Berkeley area in 1971, GARY attending school and ANGELA working as a waitress. The pair separated in Hay, 1972, with GARY returning to Bloomington, Indiana and ANGELA taking up as a girl friend of JOSEPH REMIPO, a Symbionese liberation Army (SLA) member. ANGELA ATWOOD, thereafted, lived with the HARRIS couple and was active in prison freform work and made visits to black inmates. ANGELA went underground immediately after the SLA shoot-out at Concord, California on January 10, 1974, and was killed in the SLA shoot-out in Los Angeles, California in May, 1974.

CANTLLA CHRISTINE HALL aka Gaba

HALL was a Caucasian unmarried female, who was born on Farch 24, 1945, at Saint Peter, Minnesota. She is the daughter of a Lutheran Finister and spent some of her early school years in Africa with her parents and also lived, for a time, in South America.

HALL graduated from Washburn High School, & Minneapolis, Minnesota, in June, 1963. She attended Gustavus Adolphus College at Saint Peter, Minnesota, for a year, and thereafter enrolled at the University of Minnesota. She earned a BA Degree in Humanities in 1967. After graduation, HALL worked as a welfare case worker in Duluth and Minneapolis, Minnesota, until 1970 when she came to the Berheley-Cakland area.

HALL established a lessian relationship with PATRICIA MICHELLE SCLTYSIK, and during this time, worked as an ariist. In the Fall of 1972, the couple quarreled and HALL left California for Europe. In early 1973, she returned to California and renewed her friendship with SOLTYSIK but apparently the couple did not continue their lessian relationship. At this time, HALL worked as a gardener.

HALL was one of the last Symbionese Liberations Army (SLA) members to go underground, not quitting her job or abandoning her apartment in Berheley until the middle of February, 1974. When she went underground,

HALL joined the SLA in the April 15, 1974 reobery of The Hibernia Bank in San Francisco and was killed, along with her former lover, SOLTYSIK, in the SLA shoot-out in Los Angeles in May, 1974.

PATRICIA MICHELLE SOLTYSIK aka Pizmoon Ponioud Soltysik

SOLTYSIK was an unmarried female Caucasian, born May 17, 1950 in Santa Barbara, California. She graduated from Goleta, California High School in 1967, and attended the University of California at Berkeley from 1967 to 1971. From 1969 to 1971, she was employed under the student work program at the Berkeley VICA and after leaving school, like many of the other well-educated Sumbionese Liberation Army (SLA) members, she took a menial job as janitor at the Berkeley City Library.

SCITYSIK was bisexual and interested in the woman's liberation movement. She apparently had a number of male and female lovers, but maintained a close relation-ship with SIA member CAMILLA HALL from 1970 to 1972. SOLTYSIK changed her name to HIZHOON HOVIQUE SOLTYSIK after her lover, CAMILLA HALL, dedicated a poem to her.

After PCNALD DAVID DE FREEZE, aha "Cinque" of the SLA escaped from Soledad Prison in "arch, 1973, be lived with SOLTYSIK in her Berbeley apartment. SOLTYSIK quit her employment in September, 1973, going underground, and it is believed that SCLTYSIK and DE FREEZE were probably residing in the SLA hideout in Clayton, California, prior to January, 1974.

SOLTYSIK participated in the April 15, 1974 SLA robberu of the Hibernia Bank in San Francisco and died, along with her lovers, CAMILLA HALL and DONALD DAVID PEFREEZE, in the SLA shoot-out in Los Angeles in May, 1974.

NANCY GAIL LING PERRY aha Fahizah

PERRY, a female Caucasian, was born on September 19, 1947 at Oakland, California and raised in the small town of Santa Rosa, California. She Wasthe daughter of a furniture store owner. PERRY attended Whittier Callege, and later the University of California at Berkeley, graduating in 1969 with a major in English.

In Occember, 1967, she married GILBERT PERPY, a Negro musician. The couple teparated, but did not divorce.

PERPY previously worked in Derkeley as a telephone operator and in San Francisco as topless black jack dealer. For a time, she was a heavy user of drugs. She later gave up the drug habit and was a familiar figure on the streets rear the University of California at Berkeley working in Fruity Rudy's Orange Juice Stand.

PERRY contributed a good portion of her income to California inmates and was active in the prison a reform. She went underground in the Fall of 1973 and was living with Symbionese Liberation Army (SLA) member. RUSSELL LITTLE in the first discovered SLA pad in Clayton, California. PERRY is generally considered to be the theoretician of the SLA. She was an active participant in The Hibernia Bank robbery in San Francisco on April 15, 1974 and was killed in the SLA shoot-out in May, 1974.

WILLIAH LAMTON WOLFE aha Cujo

February 17, 1951, at New Milkord, Connecticut. WOLFE's family is apparently affluent. MOLFE's father, Dr. LEROY SAMUEL WOLFE, is an Anesthesiologist at Emmans, Pennsylvania, and his mother, VIRGINIA WOLFE, resides in Richfield, Connecticut. WOLFE grew up in Connecticut, attending public high school for two years and thereafter attended the private Hermon Preparatory School at Mount Hermon, Massachusetts. He graduated in 1969, but instead of entering college, WOLFE chose to go to the Marlem section of New York City to reside with a black friend.

In May, 1970, he applied for admission at the Universitu of California at Berkeley and attended that school from January, 1971 to Barch, 1972. Soon after his arrival in the East Bay Arca of valifornia, he moved into a commune in Cakland, Callfornia. That commune consisted of several individuals who later joined the Symbionese Liberation Army. WOLFE continued to reside in Oakland, California despite the fact that he dropped out of school. He worked a very short time for the SKS Dye Casting Company in Ferkeley, California in 1973. He was discharged for excessive absence. He was apparently supported by his parents and received enough money to help support other Sumbionese Liberation Army members. WOLFE made several trips to the East and one to Europe after coming to California in 1971. He was in his parent's home in January, 1974, when he received word of the SIA shoot-out in Concord, California, and the arrest of two of his SLA friends. He immediately left Pennsylvania and remained underground until he was killed in the SIA shoot-out in May, 1974, in Los Angeles.

ADMINISTRATION OF MAJOR CASES - HEARNAP

1. ADMINISTRATIVE AND ORGANIZATIONAL SET-UP

A. Space

- 1. Adequate space should be obtained for supervisors personnel, preferably all in a contiguous area
- 2. Communications
 - a. Sufficient call directors (telephones) for all personnel on staff and direct radio contact
 - b. Technical equipment, such as play-back tape recorders and tape recorders capable of monitoring telephone conversations
- 3. Office Equipment
 - a. Desks
 - b. Tables
 - c. Bulletin boards
 - d. Maps, etc.
- B. Administration of Files and Leads
 - File volumes should be confined to 25 serials per volume
 - 2. Sub-files should be opened on various items such as news clippings, Lab reports, personnel matters, telephone tolls, and so forth
 - 3. Indexing

 A special index should be set up in addition

 to the general index in the file

4. Leads

a. A lead card box should be maintained with one copy filed behind the agent's name, a tickler copy, and also a tickler box for leads for other offices

C. Manpower

- 1. SAC on ASAC should be designated to head squad
- 2. Substantive case supervisor manpower supervisor
- 3. Staff (In the HEARNAP case, it should be noted that in addition to the substantive violation, subvensive ramifications were involved which necessitated utilization of an SA thoroughly familiar with subversive-type organizations)

4. Squad

- a. An appropriate number of personnel should be assigned to the special squad (supervisor responsible for manpower must insure that SAs are selected, not volunteered)
- b. In the event it is necessary to obtain personnel from other offices, an early evaluation should be made and offices furnishing personnel should be requested to supply experienced personnel with at

Least three years of scrvice. In this nespect, specialized personnel may be necessary, depending upon the nature of the case, such as female agents, black agents, Oriental agents, and other individuals possessing some specialized ability.

For example, in the HEARNAP case, we effectively utilized personnel in all the above cateoories

5. In the event it is deemed desireable to utilize the services of supervisory personnel from outside the Division, such as SACs, ASACs, Assistant Directors, this decision should be made early on in the investigation so as to enable this individual to be familiar with the investigation and maintain investigative continuity

D. Equipment

- 1. Automobiles rental cars, cars from other Divisions
- 2. Armament protective vests, special weapons
- 3. Radio Equipment
 - Scramblers should be utilized in delicatetype surveillance work (It is noted that in the HEARNAP case we were monitored by the news media)

- b. Handie-talties
- c. Ponta-mobils. Kelcom transcrivers, executive, dispatchers
- 4. Miscellaneous Eouipment
 - a. High intensity lights
 - b. Bull horns
 - a. Availability of helicopter and fixed-ming planes
 - d. High speed photo reproducing equipment (It may be noted that we produced thousands of photographs in the HEARNAP case and this would have cut our time in half)
 - e. Binoculars spotter scope, starlight scopes, stabilized image binoculars
 - 6. Infrared viewing devices
 - g. Cassette recorders

II. ADMINISTRATION OF INVESTIGATIVE RESPONSIBLITIES 🐉

The ranking officer has the all-over responsibility, makes the assignments to the staff, and in turn the staff reports directly to him. The staff makes assignments to various street supervisors and/or experienced agents who are responsible for the completion of various projects which may arise, utilizing manpower assigned to them. As these projects are completed, the reporting goes in

reverse so that the individual who has the responsibility in essence gets only the end results of the investigation. The point being that somebody should be in charge of the details of each project and report back to a member of the staff when this project is satisfactorily completed.

111. INVESTIGATIVE

- A. Special Units Set-Up
 - 1. Response Units in the HEARNAP case were utilized in guadrants throughout the city to respond to sightings of fugitives and/or victim. Additional Response Units were mobile to back-up these units

2. Blockade Units

a. K-Units were set-up at strategic locations throughout the city to block-off entrances and/or exits to the city should a major incident occur. They could also act as a back-up to the Response Units. In the HEARNAP case, we utilized a helicopter as a K-Unit with all our K-Unit cars bearing designated numbers on the top in mystic tape so they could be readily identified from the air

We found this sixem to be most effective since, at any given time, we had units in service who could respond to any given area in a matter of minutes. It may be noted the Response Units and K-Units were equipped with flah vests, rifles, and shotguns, as well as handle-talkie units, so they could be contacted when not in the vehicle.

IV. EVIDENCE - COLLECTION, PRESERVATION, ANALYSIS, and SUBMISSION

A. Searches

- 1. Assignment of SAs by quadrants

- 4. Sufficient tags and vacuum bags should be available
 - a. For example, at 1827 Golden Gate, the rooms were divided into quadrants and teams of agents were assigned a particular quidrent and responsible for that area

1. Upon return to the office, evidence should be photographed, reviewed for items of prosecutive evidence, and items of investigative lead material Inventory - FD-302s; forwarded to FBI Laboratory

V. RELATIONS WITH LAW EMFORCEMENT AGENCIES HAVING AN INVESTIGATIVE INTEREST

- 1. An Agent should be delegated as being responsible for liaison with involved police department so as to insure investigation is not duplicated and free exchange of information occurs
- 2. Conference between SAC and police officials of outset of investigation and frequent conferences of these officials thereafter to insure harmonicus relations and to avoid duplication of work
- 3. Dissemination of investigative results

VI. UNUSUAL ASPECTS

- 1. Kidnoping without a payoff
- 2. Victim alive but not released
- 3. Subjects' politically motivated
- 4. Subjects converted victim to their ideology
- 5. Organization spawned in California Prison System
- 6. Majority of Subjects had no criminal record, well-educated, and substantial economic backgrounds
- 7. Each of cooperation from associates and community where these individuals resided and where incident occurred
- 8. FIN Program (People In Need food distribution)
- 9. All Subjects violence oriented (gun classes, gun purchases, continually advocated killing)

10. Subjects, with few exceptions, remained secluded and utilized support people and outside contacts

VII. CONCLUSIONS

A. Technical Equipment

- 1. Technical equipment in our approved Title III was inefficient and in some cases, almost worthless, in that we could not understand a what the individuals were saying
- 2. The same applies with regard to the Globe System (heeper) and also the technical audio coverage in an automobile
- 3. While our radio equipment is excellent, we know we were monitored continually, on all channels, by the news media and in some instances, when Response Units went to an address, the news media was already there. It is felt that a scrabling system is essential in radio communication in this type of case

B. Rental Cars

1. We found that the use of low-cost rental cars, such as Pintos, and so forth, was extremely effective, particularly when the individuals operating them were female agents or black agents, depending upon the area they were

utilized. These cans do not give the appearance of the tupical "FBI Car". They were much more economical to operate and could be replaced frequently

C. Investigative Techniques Utilized

1. Although none of the various techniques
utilized resulted in locating Subjects, it
should be noted, however, that under normal
circumstances, one or more of these techniques
would have been successful in determining
Subjects' location. It may be noted that
HEARNAR Subjects lived like "animals" and did
not utilize normal amenities, such as obtaining
utilities (See Investigative Techniques Employed)

D. Administrative

1. The great majority of paper work in this case has been teletype messages. An administrative aid of inestimable value is the maintenance of copies of these teletypes numbered and in date order with the cover sheet indicating 1) the number of the teletype, 2) the office or offices to which it was directed, 3) the office sending the teletype, 4) the date and time of the teletype, and 5) an extremely succinct summary of the contents

The HEARNAP case is now above 160 volumes and when another office references a teletupe that they previously sent out, it is almost impossible to locate the reference unless they give some proper indexing code; however, with the above system, we can immediately locate the teletupe and know its contents.

2. In case of any magnitude, there is an absolute recessity of having a sub-reference that is capable of indexing
