For your information, a warrant of deportation was issued February 12, 1948, against subject Hanns Risler by the Issigration and Maturalisation Service, Philadelphia, after he was afforded a deportation hearing in How York February 6, 1948, following allegations that he was a member of an arganization advocating the overthrow of this government by force and violence. The allegations arose out of Eisler's testimony before the House of Representatives Un-American Activities Committee on September 25-27, 1947. At this hearing he admitted he had made application in 1926 for membership in the Communist Party of Germany.

Below a clipping which appeared in the Washington Post dated 3-26-48, and which stated that Eisler was to leave the United States for Vienna, Austria, on that date, you penned the question "Is he going voluntarily and if so doesn't that give him a "break! so he can apply for return sometime in future?"

Liaison today learned from Mr. Mackey, Chief of the Exclusion and Expulsion Section, INS, Philadelphia, that:

- (1) Eisler left voluntarily but under an order of deportation. The voluntary departure was by stipulation, to any country except those contiguous to the United States, and subject to verification by INS.
- (2) He actually was deported in spite of stipulations agreed upon.
- (3) He can not be re-admitted into the United States except with the consent of the Attorney General. He is excluded under Section 3, Immigration Act of 1917. If he re-applies and is admitted by mistake without the consent of the Attorney General, he is subject to exclusion and/or expulsion. A new deportation order and warrant would have to be issued at that time.

For your information, the Associated Press reported today that Eisler arrived in Czechoslovakia 3-28-48, and said upon arrival he was glad to be able "to breath the air of a friendly and emlightened country."





My memorandum to you of March 29, 1948, explained that Bisler will be though he had been allowed to leave the United States voluntarily was actually deported. He was, as you know, allowed to go to any country where he would be accepted except Canada or Mexico. He chose Austria. You inquired in a footnote: "Do we know why he was handled differently than the ordinary deportee?"

Specifically we do not know but statements of INS officials as carried by the newspapers and as made to us indicate that Eisler was allowed to leave without trial in order to speed his departure and to save the government the expense of the trial, the outcome of which would have been doubtful. While Eisler admitted to the House Un-American Activities Committee making application for membership in the Communist Party of Germany in 1926, he denied having been an active member. We know of no definite proof of such membership and believe INS has none. Possibly considered also was the fact that if deported, Eisler's citizenship would have had to be determined and the country decided upon might deny him entrance which then might necessitate his remaining in the United States.

Prete press reports Hans Eisler, "now a Czechoslovak citizen, arrived here by air March 27 to stay one or two weeks en route to Vienna to teach in music academy. RUDE PRAVO reports further that Eisler was recently deprived of American citizenship. Interviewed, he is supposed to have said "they sentenced me with deportation, and those who worked with me in Hollywood were threatened with dismissel *** French and Italian Governments refused me e visa but the Czechoslovaks gave me one at once. Mrs. KING stated that the immigration and maturalization Service had postponed a deportation hearing which had been set for January 15, 1948, without explanation.

on Jamuary 14, 1948, stated that the deportation proceeding had been postponed indefinitely and that the January 15 date had been set merely as a working deadline.

On January 14, furnished this office a copy of a leaflet entitled, "Keep America Free." This leaflet dealt with HANNS EISLER and the deportation charges against him. Among the statements in the leaflet were: "DOES THE THOMAS-RANKIN COMMITTEE ASSERT THAT FIGHTING FOR THE OVERTHROW OF HITLER IS SYNONYMOUS WITH FIGHTING FOR THE OVERTHROW OF THE AMERICAN FORM OF GOVERNMENT? Mr. EISLER disagrees with them." There was no identifying data on the leaflet which was transmitted through the mails. The copy furnished by the sening retained in the files of this office.

reported that with regard to EISIER's Communist Party activities, he had been informed that the Subject had attended a meeting at the United States CP headquarters in New York in 1946. EISIER's function at the meeting was to instill new life into the group attending the meeting and add fervor to their Party spirit. Said that EISIER was mentioned in a conversation overheard by a former Soviet government employee, who had been in Mexico City in 1945. This conversation overheard by the former Soviet employee was that his superior had just had a very interesting conversation with HANNS EISIER.

By letter dated February 2, 1948, the Bureau advised that a former Soviet employee who had been attached to the Embassy of the U.S.S.R. in Mexico City, one KIRILL M. ALEXKIEV, had furnished the information that he was present at the Soviet Embassy in Mexico City when a conversation took place between a Soviet military attache and another member of the Embassy staff, GREGORY KASPAROV. KASPAROV remarked that he had received a communication from EMSIER which had to be answered immediately, and further stated that EISIER was "our best friend and one of our own."

Jetter from BOHUS BENES to HANNS EISLER which was dated November 28, 1947, and written on the letterhead of the Czechoslovak Consulate, 690 Market Street, San Francisco 4, California. This letter was sent via registered air mail to Mr. HANNS EISLER, 23868 W. Pacific Coast Highway, Malibu, California. In this letter BENES stated that he had received the letter from MISLER, together with the documents and application forms concerning a passport and the check for six dollars. BENES stated that when he had talked by telephone with Mrs. KISLER, he had informed her about the possibility of issuing a Czechoslovak passport to both the Subject and his wife for a period of six months. BENES based his authority to do this on a report from the Ministry of Interior in Prague, which stated that they had no objection to issuing a passport to EISLER and his wife if the Subject had come to

the United States on a Czechoslovak provisional document and if the EISIERs had not become American citizens. BENES went on to say that since he had talked with the Ministry of Interior he had received a more authoritative opinion from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, which stated that the Czechoslovak Consulate in San Francisco could not issue a Czechoslovak passport to the EISLERS

BENES continued that he had written immediately to Prague, informing the Ministry of Foreign Affairs that he had already promised a passport to the EISLERs and asking them to change their decision. BENES regretted deeply that it was necessary for him to change the assurance given to Mrs. EISLER that their passport problems had been settled and that he was now forced by his superiors to change his promise

This document is being transmitted to the Bureau under separate cover, a copy being retained in the files of this office.

On January 23, 1948, the Eureau and the New York and Kansas City Offices were advised by teletype that the pubject was to depart from Los Angeles via Trans-World Airlines, Flight 12, for New York City, leaving Los Angeles at 5:55 p.m., January 26, and arriving in New York City at 6:50 a.m., January 27. One stop at Kansas City was to be made at 1:15 a.m. Kansas City was requested to verify the departure of the Subject. The above information relative to EISLER's reservations was furnished by Passenger Service, Trans-World Airlines, Los Angeles.

The Kansas City Office advised by teletype dated January 27, 1948, that the Subject descended from the plane at Kansas City, went to the airport cafe, where he spent the entire layover in Kansas City. EISLER made no contacts or telephone calls while in Kansas City.

On January 26, advised that EISLER was departing on that date for New York with a Czech passport in his possession and that EISLER intended to stay in New York with KURT ADLER. 1 W. 89th Street. New York City. KURT ADLER is known to be the

This information was furnished to the and New York by teletype dated January 26, 1948.

A surveillance by SAs and and on the afternoon of January 26 disclosed that the EISLER residence was visited by SALKA VIERTEL, who was driving a 1941 black Packard convertible coupe, 1947 California license 9 N 9368. This car arrived at 2:05 p.m. and the woman driving it, identified as SALKA VIERTEL, departed at 3:45 p.m., that date. SALKA VIERTEL has been reported previously in this investigation.





At 3:55 p.m. an automobile with 1947 California license 5 T 5070 departed from the EISLER residence. This car is registered to there is no record of this individual in the indices of this office.

At 4:15 p.m. the Subject and his wife and an unknown woman, believed to be GERDA GOEDHART, previously referred to in this investigation, were observed leaving the EISLER residence in the EISLER automobile. was ordered today to leave the country. The article went on to state that both HANNS and his wife, LUISE, were given a chance to "leave voluntarily," provided they did not go to Canada or Mexico.

On February 18, 1948, Mr. HOGAN of the Internal Revenue Bureau, Los Angeles, called SAC HOOD and stated that his office in New York had called him advising that they were checking the income tax of the EISLERs prior to their departure and learned that they owed the government over a thousand dollars in back taxes.

On February 20, 1948, the New York Office advised the Bureau by teletype and Los Angeles with a copy thereof of the information that the Subject and his wife had one-way reservations to Rome, Italy, via T.W.A., Flight 904, departing from New York on February 25. This information was subsequently changed according to New York teletype dated February 27, 1948. Their new departure date was to be March 1, 1948, on T. W. A. Flight 922.

The Los Angeles Times dated February 28, 1948, carried the information that the bank account, bonds and furniture belonging to the Subject and his wife had been attached under a lien filed by the Federal government to satisfy an income tax claim. This fact was verified by

The New York Office advised the Bureau and Los Angeles by teletype dated March 26, 1948, that KISLER and his wife departed for Vienna, Austria, via Pan American Airways at 4:00 p.m., that date.

Inasmuch as no further investigation remains to be conducted and in view of the fact that EISLER has departed from the United States, this case is being closed.

Confidential informant T-1 reported on Tebruary 1, 1918 that HANS KISLER had been in contact with the New York Office of the Ismigration and Maturalization Service in connection with deportation proceedings against him instituted by that organization.

T-l further advised that HANS KISLER had indicated to the Immigration and Naturalization Service his willingness to execute a stipulation admitting most of what the Government was charging for the purpose of expediting the deportation proceedings.

On February 6, 1968, seconding to the same informant, MARS KISLER appeared at a deportation hearing held before inspector GILHERT ZIMMENIAN of the Immigration and Maturalisation Service. At this time KISLER stipulated, for the record, all of the testimonyregarding his previous Communist activity which had been given to the Committee on Endmerican Activities of the House of Representatives.

Mrs. KING offered no new evidence in rebutial to the Government's charges nor did she object to the stipulation entered by NAMS RISING.

In connection with the same hearing, Confidential Informant T-1 reported that HANS KISLER had indicated to officials of the Immigration and Naturalization Service that he would like to go to Paris, France. It was the Informant's belief that HANS KISLER was willing to leave the United States and had no desire to resist the deportation proceedings.

Information was received by Tehruary 12, 1948 from Edufidential Informant 7-2, to the effect that the Indigration and Maturalization Service on that day had ordered the Voluntary departure of MANS KISLER in Lieu of departure.

On February 27, 1948, inquiry of revealed that HANS EISLER and his wife had scheduled new reservations to depart for Rome, Italy on March 1, 1948. These reservations likewise were cancelled, according to shortly before the EISLERS were scheduled to depart. At this time, said he had been advised by the person who called in behalf of the EISLERS, that the reservations had to be cancelled because of the inability of the EISLERS to secure a visa from the Italian authorities.

It was learned on March 24, 1948, from the Immigration and Naturalization Service, that HANS EISLER and his wife had advised that service that they were planning to depart for Vienna, Austria by Pan American Airlines on March 26, 1948.

On the latter date the departure of HANS and LOWISE HISLER was verified by reference to the Passenger Manifest of Pan American Airlines at LaGuardia Airport aboard an aircraft which departed at h P. L. that day. It was observed that HANS and LOWISE HISLER were escorted to the airport and seen off by GEPHART HISLER, brother of HANS. Also present was ERWHILDE MISLER, wife of GERHART HISLER. The departure of HANS and LOWISE HISLER was covered by newspaper and newsreel photographers.

Subsequent newspaper reports revealed that HAMS and LOWISE ENSIER arrived, in due course, at Prague, Czechoslovakia and subsequently proceeded to Vienna, Austria.

On January 5, 1949, advised during the course of interview that HANNS EISIER and BERT BRECHT are presently in the Russian Sector of Berlin living at the Hotel Adlon on the Unter der Linden.

Informant had no knowledge of the activities of BRECHT and EISHER, but concluded from their mere presence there "eating scarce food" in the Russian Sector that they must be there for some purpose of the Russian authorities. Otherwise, according to informant, they simply would not be there. Informant pointed out that several months ago BRECHT had been unable to get into Germany, although he was trying at the time. Informant stated that she was endeavoring to obtain information concerning the activities of EISHER and BRECHT and will report it to this office if successful.





The man involved was Hanns Eisler, composer brother of Gerhart kisler. The Rockefeller Foundation officials, of course, were innocent victims of Communist wirepulling. Certainly they were not informed that Hanns has served since 1935 as head of the International Music Bureau, connected with the Communist International, the purpose of which was to spread pro-Soviet allegiance among musicians, musical critics and composers the world over. He came directly from that position in the Soviet capital to his labors here.

Shortly after his arrival, Comrade Hanns introduced his "new musical forms" to a secret session of 300 leading Communists and fellow travelers. That was his real goal when he landed on our shores; it had been said for some time (and Gerhart Eisler had emphasized it on more than one occasion) that a comrade who could command the political respect of the Hollywood comrades was needed there. commented that apparently CHAPLIN had not furnished any financial assistance to EISLER in the early stages of his attempts in this regard

recalled in retrospect that he himself had been surprised that CHAPLIN had not furnished such assistance especially since EISLER had indicated that they were on friendly terms.

having been present at the time of his three visits to the Malibu Beach home of HANS EISLER. actually only met CHAPLIN on one occasion; this being at the Uplifters Club in Santa Monica, California. At the time was also present as well as Mrs. CHAPLIN. He had no recollection of HANS EISLER having been there nor had he any recollection of there having ensued any discussion concerning the plight of the EISLERS. The only conversation that he recalled concerned the projected appearance of CHAPLIN before the House Committee on Un-American Activities. There was no political discussion at all and stated that he had no information concerning any Communist connections on the part of CHAPLIN other than his association with HANS EISLER and what he has read in the press.

Concerning AYN RAND who was also mentioned in the above indicated letter from it is noted that the New York files reflect a letter from the Los Angeles Office to the Bureau dated 3/1/48 under the caption "COMMUNIST INFILTRATION OF THE LITERARY FIELD; INTERNAL SECURITY - C" wherein it was indicated that AYN RAND was a well known novelist who had testified before

the House Committee in Washington in October, 1947

In addition the New York files contain information concerning the deportation of HANS EISLER and in this regard it is noted that the report of SA detailed dated 5/28/48 at New York in instant case indicated on page 5 that HANS EISLER and his wife, LOUISE EISLER, departed from the United States via Pan American Airlines on 3/26/49 and that according to the INS. they were destined to Vienna, Austria. The referenced report further reflected that subsequent newspaper reports revealed that HANS and LOUISE EISLER arrived in due course at Prague, Czechoslovakia, and subsequently proceeded to Vienna, Austria. Page 2 of the referenced report also indicated information received from the INS to the effect that INS on February 12, 1948 had ordered the voluntary departure of HANS EISLER from the United States in lieu of deportation.

The New York files also reflect information concerning the association between CHARLES CHAPLIN and HANS EISLER and in this regard it is noted that the report of SA dated November 12, 1947 at Los Angeles in instant case indicated on page 7 thereof that on 8/28/47 a large photograph of CHARLES CHAPLIN was observed in the HANS EISLER residence and page 10 reflects that on 10/2/47 the residence of CHARLES CHAPLIN was called for HANS EISLER five times between the hours of 5:55 PM and 8:30 PM.
