BACKGROUND:

6741 [redacted] telephonically contacted the Director's Office during the afternoon of 10/28/69, and was referred to SA Hauer of the Crime Research Section.

6741 [redacted] advised two FBI Agents, one of whom she identified as Aloysius J. McFall, were at that time interviewing her husband in front of their home in Franklinton. She said this interview was being conducted in connection with an investigation regarding the "Minutemen," and that the Agents were attempting to elicit information concerning her husband's background and association with this outfit since his name had appeared on a list which was seized following the arrest of the leaders of the "Minutemen."

6741 [redacted] said her husband was refusing to furnish the Agents with the information they were seeking, and she was contacting Bureau Headquarters in an effort to have the Agents leave her husband alone.

6741 [redacted] admitted her husband had purchased a book concerning the "Minutemen" after hearing a radio broadcast about that organization. She denied her husband was a member of the "Minutemen," but admitted his name was probably on "a lot of lists."

6741 [redacted] was informed the Agents were merely performing duties imposed upon them by law and the best approach for her husband to take would be to fully cooperate with the FBI. This seemed to upset [redacted] and she commented that if action was not taken to have the Agents leave she would turn her dog loose, and the dog would see to it that the Agents left. [redacted] was firmly counselled against taking any action that would result in her dog assaulting FBI personnel.

b7c-4 Bufiles disclose SA [REDACTED] is a Resident Agent at Covington, Louisiana. He EOD on 1/25/65, and is in GS-11.

b7c-1 By letter dated 11/20/64 [REDACTED] wrote the Director and complimented him on his work and stated, "anyone who criticizes you and/or the F. B. I. automatically becomes my enemy." His letter was acknowledged 11/30/64.

b7c-1 Information was received during 1965 that [REDACTED] was one of some 450 persons to whom literature was mailed from "Minutemen" Headquarters in Norborne, Missouri. This literature was forwarded to persons whose names appeared on membership records of the "Minutemen" outfit. Subsequently, during 1966, information was received that [REDACTED] had paid a \$5.00 initial fee for membership in the "Minutemen" and was assigned membership number [REDACTED]

ACTION:

b7c-1 SAC, New Orleans, was telephonically contacted and advised of [REDACTED] call to Bureau Headquarters and that she had threatened to turn her dog loose on FBI personnel. SAC, New Orleans, stated there had been no difficulty during this interview and the dog had not been released.

[redacted] would not elaborate further, but inferred his visit to FBI Headquarters would concern the Arabian Ambassador and Shirley Temple Black.

b7c-1 [redacted] was anxious to resolve this matter and requested that he be telephonically contacted by an Agent of the Boston office. He furnished his home telephone number as [redacted] and a second number [redacted] where he could be contacted during the evening of 11-13-69. *C*

b7c-1 The Boston office was telephonically contacted and instructed to immediately contact [redacted] at one of the above numbers.

" She refused to identify "they" and when asked if she had consulted the local police, she retorted "They are a bunch of crooks. " *b7c-1* [REDACTED] then terminated the conversation.

SYNOPSIS:

New York attorney named [REDACTED] called today inquiring whether the FBI has an Agent named [REDACTED] stationed in Corpus Christi, Texas. [REDACTED] alleged that such an Agent had talked to a Mr. Collins early this month about payments in a commercial matter. Houston Office advises that no Agent named [REDACTED] is assigned to that office but that SA [REDACTED] is Senior Resident Agent at Corpus Christi. Agent [REDACTED] has interviewed no one named Collins recently and ASAC Hetherington of Houston advises that this inquiry could concern a reportedly stolen B23 aircraft which one [REDACTED] of Muskegon, Michigan, was selling to parties in Texas. Plane allegedly taken from Florida airport to Corpus Christi, Texas, without permission of [REDACTED] and before sale was consummated. One [REDACTED] was arrested by Corpus Christi police in connection with this matter and at request of police department was interviewed by SA [REDACTED] while in police custody. Matter brought to United States Attorney in Houston as possible Federal violation and prosecution declined as this is civil matter which should be settled by parties involved. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were interview by SA [REDACTED] at their request and complained of FBI involvement in matter.

Shortly before noon today a New York attorney named [REDACTED] (not identifiable in Bufiles) called this Section and inquired of me whether the FBI has an Agent named [REDACTED] stationed in Corpus Christi, Texas. I told [REDACTED] that I did not know but that I would be glad to check and then attempted to get from him what he had in mind. [REDACTED] appeared to be rather "cozy" but stated that he understood an Agent named [REDACTED] had talked to a Mr. Collins in Corpus Christi recently about payments in a commercial matter. [REDACTED] intimated that he did not have too much confidence in the veracity of Collins and just wanted to see if we actually had an Agent by the name of [REDACTED]. I pressed [REDACTED] for the date of the alleged interview and the first name of Collins but he hedged and indicated he did not have his papers before him. He understood that the interview took place early this month. I told [REDACTED] that he would be called back.

ASAC Hetherington of the Houston Office advised that while they have no Agent named [REDACTED] assigned to that office they do have SA [REDACTED] (EOD: 7-8-46, last annual efficiency report outstanding) who is the Senior Resident Agent. Hetherington stated he checked with [REDACTED] and that the latter could not recall and found no indication through a check of daily reports that he had interviewed anyone named Collins in late October or early this month. Hetherington stated that the only thing which might be considered controversial handled by [REDACTED] recently involved a Houston case entitled Unknown Subject; Theft of B23 Aircraft, SN 27414; Register No. N-58091-Interstate Transportation of Stolen Aircraft (ITSA). The facts in this case were stated to be as follows:

MRS [REDACTED] and his wife of Muskegon, Michigan, through the J. & G Carlton, Inc., owned the B23 aircraft which is involved in this case and advertised it for sale in July, 1969. Last month one [REDACTED] of Harlingen, Texas, representing one [REDACTED] called [REDACTED] and sent the latter \$1,000 to purchase the plane for \$20,000. On FAC October 25th [REDACTED] went to the Tampa, Florida, area where the plane was stored and met a pilot named [REDACTED] (phonetic) and a co-pilot named [REDACTED] who represented [REDACTED]. On that day [REDACTED] spoke to FIC [REDACTED] on the phone in Texas and [REDACTED] allegedly agreed to send \$10,000 to [REDACTED] home in Michigan and send the balance of \$9,000 in five days. [REDACTED] reported that [REDACTED] and the pilot both understood

that the plane was not to be moved until the deal was consummated since there was no insurance on the plane.

b7c-1 [REDACTED] reportedly visited [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] in McAllen, Texas, on October 28th and they wanted [REDACTED] to go with them to the bank to get the \$10,000. [REDACTED] did not do so because of lack of time but asked that the money be wired to his wife in Michigan and they did on October 29th. On the same date [REDACTED] called [REDACTED] to ask that one [REDACTED] in Tampa release the plane to [REDACTED] the pilot. [REDACTED] reportedly refused to so as the \$9,000 was not paid.

b7c-1 On October 29th [REDACTED] reportedly told [REDACTED] that the plane was taken to the Frank Hill Aircraft Company at Fort Lauderdale as [REDACTED] wanted some work done on it. [REDACTED] got a call from [REDACTED] in Philadelphia on November 3rd, who stated that he had learned from his wife at Fort Lauderdale that according to the Frank Hill Aircraft Company the plane had disappeared and [REDACTED] was suspected of taking it. [REDACTED] thereafter contacted the FBI in Miami and FAA in Muskegon and FAA put out an alert to all stations regarding the plane.

b7c-1 On November 4th [REDACTED] allegedly called [REDACTED] and said that his firm in Texas was being investigated by the FBI with regard to the plane and that he wanted to send the remaining \$9,000. [REDACTED] is said to have declined and to have said that the matter was out of his hands--there was no sale and he [REDACTED] should not have moved the plane. On the same day (November 4th) [REDACTED] got a call from one [REDACTED] who claimed that he had been arrested in connection with the plane and spent the night in jail and wanted him [REDACTED] to accept the \$9,000. [REDACTED] again refused, stating that he and his attorney were following the matter to recover the plane.

b7c-4 ASAC Hetherington advised that FAA learned on the 3rd that the plane was at Corpus Christi, Texas, and also indicated that [REDACTED] was arrested by the Corpus Christi Police Department and at the request of the police SA [REDACTED] interviewed [REDACTED] at the police station while he was in local police custody. On the following day [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] came to the RA at Corpus Christi and stated they wanted to be interviewed in an attempt to get the matter straightened out. These men complained about the FBI's being involved in the case.

ASAC Hetherington stated that they opened a case on this matter on November 3rd based on a report by FAA and that a teletype was received from Miami on the 4th. The situation was discussed with the United States Attorney in Houston who advised that there was no Federal violation apparent, this is a civil matter and should be accordingly handled by the parties involved. Thereafter Houston closed its file on this particular case.

OBSERVATIONS:

b7c-4 It would appear that [REDACTED] merely used the name Collins as a pretext in his call to the Bureau and that perhaps either [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] is complaining about the Bureau being involved in this particular case. It would appear desirable to advise [REDACTED] that while we have no Agent named [REDACTED] at Corpus Christi we do have a [REDACTED] and that if he is thinking of the aircraft matter which occurred recently in Corpus Christi the FBI had every reason to take the action we took as a possible investigative matter within our jurisdiction and that we have no apologies to anyone in connection with the same.

b7c-1 | to put [redacted] up at her guest house that night. At the time she learned that [redacted] had known her son [redacted] Alexandria, Virginia, for several years during her son's employment as an assistant store manager for the [redacted] in WDC.

b7c-1 | During their ensuing conversation that evening [redacted] learned that [redacted] had just lost his wife suddenly through death from poisoning of her kidneys and bladder. His wife, whose name [redacted] could not recall, had been living on the [redacted] farm in apparently good health when she suddenly became ill and died a short time later at Georgetown University Hospital in WDC.

b7c-1 | [redacted] appeared mystified over his wife's sudden illness and he intimated although not in so many words that possibly a female nurse who lived [redacted] with the [redacted] and took care of two children of [redacted] daughter who also resided on the farm, might have had something to do with his wife's death. He did not clarify this statement. At [redacted] invitation she shortly thereafter visited the [redacted] farm with a friend who drove her there. [redacted] met the nurse, whose name she could not recall, who appeared to be in her 30's and by her manner that day seemed to have taken over the operation of the [redacted] household.

The captioned person who would not furnish his address telephonically contacted the Bureau at 10:55 a.m. 1/3/70 advising the Bureau operator that he desired to speak to the FBI on a matter relating to "national security."

b7c-1 [redacted] advised Extra Duty Supervisor George H. Menzel that a commercial aircraft would leave Oklahoma City within the next 24 hours enroute to Washington, D.C., and that this plane would carry explosives for the purpose of immobilizing parts of the District of Columbia. He added he was not aware as to what specific locations were to be damaged. [redacted] refused to advise the identity of persons or groups behind such a plot or the purpose for such action. He stated that he was aware of this matter since he was once a part of it.

b7c-1 Attempts to obtain additional details from [redacted] were negative and it should be noted that he spoke indistinctly as though intoxicated and was belligerent throughout the call. The call was interrupted by the operator who advised that the number to which [redacted] charged the call was disconnected. The conversation was interrupted while the operator checked on charging the call to an unknown number in Little Rock, Arkansas. She subsequently advised that [redacted] was not known at this number and he would have to pay for the call or discontinue same. After being argumentative with the operator she advised that it would be necessary to cancel the call in absence of payment by [redacted].

Subject has been a chronic "nut" caller since 1963. Her contact with this office, always by telephone, has been characterized by fluctuating periods of intensity, during which her calls will vary from a few per day to as many as sixty times during an eight-hour period. In recent years, her calls have become more frequent and persistent. She is irrational in her statements and has no information of interest to the Bureau. She frequently calls at three to four minute intervals and her conversation is entirely one-sided. She rambles on incoherently, ignoring efforts to interrupt her.

On 10/8/68, two Special Agents attempted to contact subject at her home. She did not admit them to her residence and immediately telephoned this office, stating that after calling this office for seven years, she expected that anyone wishing to speak with her would at least make an appointment.

Subject was interviewed at her residence, [REDACTED] San Diego, on 10/11/68 for 1 hour and 15 minutes. It was apparent that she is mentally unbalanced and during the interview it was impossible to correctly define the nature of her complaint. She is obsessed with a notion that there is a national and international conspiracy organized by "people from the South" to destroy the social and political structure of this country.

The problem has been discussed with the Chief Special Agents Office, Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company. They advised that the California Penal Code makes nuisance calls a violation of Section 653 M and that a complaint could be filed by someone from this office, whereupon some appropriate legal steps can be taken.

The Chief Special Agent further suggested that numerous mechanical ways of preventing subject from calling this office could be explored and they would be willing to undertake such an effort at our request.

He claimed these motorcyclists were hazardous to traffic and endangered his life. He advised he reported this to local law enforcement including the State Police and was advised that they did not have enough men to patrol all areas effectively.

b7c-1 [REDACTED] stated he was sick and tired of all these excuses and he wants some action. It was explained to him that this was something that was not within the jurisdiction of the FBI and if he felt he was not getting sufficient action from the local law enforcement agencies he should contact the State Attorney's Office or his local State Assemblyman. [REDACTED] indicated he would do this. [REDACTED] appeared to be highly upset, was belligerent, argumentative and frequently had to interrupt the conversation to yell at his children and/or dogs.

b7c-1 The captioned individual of [redacted] Baltimore, Maryland, at 9:45 p.m., June 14, 1970, telephonically contacted Duty Agent John G. Leggett, Special Investigative Division, and furnished the following information concerning custody of his grandchild.

b7c-1 [redacted] has been caring for his daughter's infant child for a year or more. The daughter, who has furnished no assistance to the child according to [redacted] is now attempting to get custody of the infant and allegedly plans to leave the area with an individual other than her husband. [redacted] claimed that his daughter planned to sell the child although he furnished no details. He stated that he will not surrender custody of his grandchild and will leave with it if necessary to avoid giving it up. He claims that his daughter plans to have him arrested June 15, 1970, in an effort to get the child.

b7c-1 It was explained to [redacted] that the FBI has no jurisdiction in this child custody dispute and would be unable to assist him. He indicated that he had reported the matter to the Baltimore office earlier and said he had been advised that the FBI could not assist him.

b7c-1 No record identifiable with [redacted] was located in the indices.

ACTION:
