MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR.

Mr. Harry Bean, of the office of Congressman Curry, called to advise, confidentially, he stated, that Congressman Curry is planding to oppose the bill to place Honoluly and, in fact, the Hawaiian Islands, under either naval or military government, and that there is such a bill pending in Congress, the committee hearing being scheduled for tomorrow; that the Congressman does not believe that this bill should be passed and he is desirous of obtaining some statistics on crime which would show the actual conditions in Hawaii. He had in mind, Mr. Bean stated, that our statistical division might supply information which would permit comparisons to be made between cities in the continental United States of comparable size with Honolulu.

I advised Mr. Bean that I understood that such a compilation was used by Assistant Attorney General Richardson at the time of the preparation of his report. I ascertained from Mr. Waters that such a schedule had been prepared. I referred Mr. Bean to Mr. Waters and informed Mr. Waters that he might supply Mr. Bean with what information was available. It appears that this information is exactly what the Congressman desires.



The Executive Conference consisting of Messrs. Colson, E. A. Tamm, Lawler, Carson, Nichols, Ladd, Quinn famm, and Rosen considered the suggestion made by Mr. Patterson to the effect that the original of the daily recapitulation sheet of all incoming telegrams and teletypes be retained on file for a period of six months and then destroyed.

It was pointed out that heretofore these sheets have been maintained indefinitely and that they are on file in the Files Division since January 2, 1931.

Mr. Rosen advised that insofar as he knew there had been no occasion to refer to these sheets and the Conference unanimously recommends that they be destroyed at the end of six months, thereby always having available the recapitulation sheets for the past six months' period.

MEMORANDUM FOR MR. FOXWORT

Upon reference from the Director's office spoke by telephone to Mr : Charlotte, North Carolina, residence telephone number who advised that he had information of great value to the Bureau and to the Government. It was immediately apparent that Mr. was intoxicated, and apparently did not realize that he was telephoning to the Bureau prepaid as he kept insisting that the call was being made at the Government's expense. It was impossible to get any information from Mr. as as to the nature of his complaint, and he finally put another individual named Nickory, worth Caroline, on the line who spoke with a German accent and who also appeared to be intoxicated. was that he was German The gist of the information furnished by and could furnish his life story which would reflect conditions in Germany. Neither he nor had any information concerning any sabotage or espionage matter. Mr. insisted he was going to call the Attorney General and the White House after he had completed the call

In view of the very apparent intoxicated condition of it is not believed necessary to send this information to the Charlotte Field Division. The address of the Charlotte Office was furnished to these gentlemen but in their condition it is doubtful if they made a note of it.

A hysterical, apparently demented woman telephoned and talked to the writer in a very incoherent manner and it was impossible to make very much sense from her conversation. However, she did state that she had worked for Mr. Bielaski when he was affiliated with the Bureau of Investigation; that a Mr. Stephens was Bielaski's secretary at that time and that she knew Miss Helen Gandy as well as the Director.

She vehemently stated that she hated the Director; that he was a "dirty rat;" and that she would scratch his eyes out if she had the opportunity.

This woman refused to state her name or address or the specific reason for calling the Bureau and during her rambling incoherent conversation mentioned the names Charles and Jimmy, her nephews who apparently are in the Army and about whose safety she is concerned.

Due to the import of her conversation the writer arranged to have it recorded when he realized this woman was referring to the Director in a threatening, derogatory manner. The writer attempted to continue to engage this woman in conversation while Mr. Jenkins of the Communications Section attempted to have the call traced. However, this woman hung up before the trace was completed and the Chief Operator of the Telephone Company could only determine that the call originated at a pay station 'phone serviced by the local Georgia telephone exchange.

The above mentioned records will be maintained in the writer's file cabinet temporarily pending a determination of whether they serve any purpose.

An unidentified woman called over Republic 7110. She was very incoherent and seemed to be verging on hysterics. However, the operator heard her mention the name " J. Edgar Hoover ", concerning whom she made several disparaging remarks. During this entire time most of her conversation was unintelligible. Because she had mentioned the Director's name, Mr. Hyland, the Night Supervisor was contacted and advised of the nature of the call. He requested to speak with the woman and was connected with her.

At this point a record of the conversation was started. The Bureau operator then contacted the Chief Operator of the Telephone Company, identified himself to her, and requested that the call be traced.

The Chief Operator reported back that the call had been traced to the Georgia Exchange office at which time the connection had been lost by the woman suddenly hanging up. The Chief Operator checked with the Georgia Exchange office and found that shortly after 12:00 midnight someone had dialed the operator and asked for the F.B.I. The call came from a pay station and because it did the operator handling the call did not ask for the person's number. The Chief Operator indicated there was no further way to trace the call.



Supervisor Quigley of the New York Office telephoned on June 18, 1942. He advised me that Detective David A. Wilson of the New York Missing Persons Bureau had contacted the New York Office concerning an individual who had died the previous night at the Knickerbocker Hospital. This girl, named Barbara Lee, alias Barbara hinter, was a drug addict, and the New York Police Department, subsequent to her death, received an anonymous telephone call. This anonymous call advised that Barbara Lee had a brother named Robert Lee working in the Identification Division of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The anonymous caller further added that Miss Lee had a sister named Mary Leska of 118 Chester Street, Boston, Massachusetts. Quigley stated that the New York Police had checked with Boston and there is no such address. He requested that we ascertain whether a Robert Lee in our Identification Division had a sister named Barbara.

I made a check of the employees of the Identification Division and we do not have a Robert Lee in that division. We have some other Lee's working in the Identification Division, but according to their personnel files they do not have a sister named Barbara. We have two Robert Lee's in the Bureau, one a supervisor in the Chief Clerk's Office, who does not have a sister named Barbara, and another, an Agent in Houston, who according to his personnel file does not have such a sister. This information was furnished to Mr. Quigley.

By reference from the Director's Office, the Secretary to Congressman Martin of Massachusetts called the writer and requested to know if an officer in the Werchant Warine had to secure clearance from the FBI before he could take a camera with him on a cruise on an American merchant ship. I advised the Secretary that this was not within the FBI's jurisdiction and that if such a rule existed, it would probably be a security measure adopted and put into effect by the Navy. I offered to attempt to find out for her if such a rule existed, but she stated that she would make this inquiry from the Navy herself and asked for suggestions as to who to call in the Navy. I gave her Rhea Whitley's name and telephone number. She said that if she were not able to find what she wanted,

she would call the writer back.

By reference from the Director's Office the writer accepted a telephone call from the above-named individual, who was in the office of Senator Johnson of Colorado at the time. He indicated that he is engaged in the mining business in Colorado and had voluntarily come to Washington to testify before the Ways and Means Committee concerning to legislation affecting the mining industry. At the conclusion of his testimony about a week ago, he was accosted in the Capitol Building by several individuals who he thought were FBI Agents inasmuch as they identified themselves as government investigators by displaying certain credentials. They questioned him concerning his possession of four gold coins which he had exhibited to the above-mentioned committee, and indicated that he was violating a Federal law by possessing these coins.

Miss Krismer stated she had believed the above was our policy, but merely wanted to check and make certain of this fact before answering the inquiry the Congressman had received.

At 3:10 A.M. on October 24, 1943, while on late duty, I received a telephone call from the subject. He stated that he had Miss Beahm ____ Miss Gandy ____ gone into a beer parlor some place in town and drunk a number of glasses of beer and that when he came out he was minus 640. He stated that he was of the opinion that he had been doped and the money stolen from

I told him that the Bureau had no jurisdiction over this matter and suggested that he contact the Shore Patrol. He stated that he had contacted the Shore Patrol but that they refused to do anything for him and went off and left him. He insisted that the Bureau do scrething about the matter and I again pointed out to him that it was not within the Eureau's jurisdiction. He then wanted to know if the persons who had allegedly doped him had questioned him for information concerning the names and whereacouts and sailing dates of certain ships whether the Eureau would be interested. I told him that the Epreau would be interested in that type of information and asked him whether this had happened. He stated that he did not remember of it having happened but that it very possibly could have happened while he had been doped. I again suggested to him that he refer this matter to the Shore Patrol.

The subject thereupon became indigmant and stated that he would write to the Mayor of St. Louis, his Congressman and the President and tell them that the FBI had failed to handle this matter. I again told him that there is nothing that the FEI could handle and that it was something for the Shore Patrol to handle.

It is to be noted that the subject while conversing over the phone sounded as though he were intoxicated at the time. Several times there was a hull in the conversation when he was trying to find words to express himself and it sounded as though he had dropped the receiver of the telephone on one of two occasions.

Although it was not evident from his conversation that was intoxicated or mentally unsound, there apparently was no reason for his telephone call unless he was attempting to impress someone who might have been listening. As soon as the writer picked up the telephone to say hello Mr. boisterously opened the conversation with the exclamation "Greetings friend," Throughout the entire conversation the voices of other individuals could be heard in the background and it also sounded like several children were crying. It is possible, therefore, that was attempting to impress someone who was listening to the conversation.



Because of the above circumstances, Mr. Dailey had asked Mr. to report to the police at once if the former died suddenly, so that any evidence of foul play might be recognized. Wr. quested that the Bureau investigate the matter.
