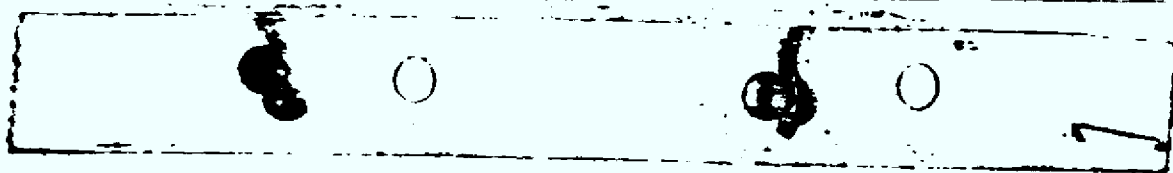

On January 26, 1944, by reference from the Director's Office, long distance operator 36 of Seattle, Washington, advised she had a [REDACTED] on the line who wished to talk with the Director or his Assistant. [REDACTED] wanted to reverse the charges, but this was refused. He apparently then told the operator he would pay the charges, but then changed his mind and refused to come on the wire. He had also instructed the operator not to reveal the place of his call.

However, it was ascertained that he was calling from Seattle, Washington, and in the opinion of the operator, he was "slightly intoxicated".

ACTION TAKEN

A search of the Bureau files fails to reflect any pertinent information.

No further action necessary since complainant was reported as "intoxicated".

On February 7, 1944, the above-captioned individual telephonically contacted the writer and advised that she had received a letter from her father, [REDACTED] who resides in Mexico, requesting her to permit him to secure a United States patent in her name. According to Miss [REDACTED] the patent was to cover a medicine allegedly developed by her father to be used in the treatment of children for malnutrition. She stated that her father was a German national and that she had not seen him for a period of approximately 16 years. Under these circumstances, she stated she did not feel she should proceed with securing the patent without first consulting the FBI. b7C-1

Miss [REDACTED] was advised that the matter of patents was not within the jurisdiction of the Bureau and that, therefore, the Bureau could give her no assistance in arriving at a decision with respect to this matter. She was referred to the United States Patent Office for the desired information. b7C-1

On February 7, 1944, Mrs. [REDACTED] New York City, c/o the [REDACTED] estate, and a resident of [REDACTED] telephonically contacted the Bureau and was referred by the Director's Office to the Interview Room. She complained about eating food which irritated her throat. She stated that she wanted to submit a piece of pie obtained from a local French pastry shop to the Bureau for examination since it was feared she was about to be poisoned. She indicated that arsenic had been placed in her milk also. She was referred to the New York Police Department but went into an harangue about "Jews, Nazis, and Communists dominate that police force." She indicated that she had formerly communicated with Governor Dewey in this matter. She was very belligerent when politely advised of the Bureau's lack of jurisdiction.

b7C-1 Five minutes later, Mrs. [REDACTED] called back again on the phone and advised that she was trying to obtain air tickets for herself and a friend to travel to Palm Beach, Florida, and insisted that the FBI help her. She was referred to her local Office of Defense Transportation and again was angered because the Bureau would not help her although advised we had no jurisdiction.

ACTION TAKEN

None. This woman is apparently a dowager of some social connection but is definitely a crank.

[REDACTED] stated that he was calling from his home at [REDACTED] Brooklyn, New York; that as a result of a family squabble his mother had called the police; that the police came to his home and after talking to him indicated they were sending for an ambulance to take him to a hospital for mental observation. He stated that he desired the FBI to prevent this; that he had just telephonically contacted the office of the Mayor of New York and that of Governor Dewey. He also advised he was going to call the President if no action was taken as he believed the attempt to restrain him was part of a "Fascist" plot. 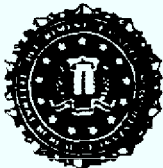

MEMORANDUM FOR MR. BURTON

67C-1 Agent Supervisor Hugh McMillan, Night Supervisor on Mr. Tamm's desk, was telephonically contacted at 6:40 a.m., February 26, 1944, by one who identified himself as [redacted] at the Plaza Hotel, 311 - 1st Street, N.E., Washington, D.C. The subject stated that his residence address was [redacted] and that he was an [redacted] in Washington. [redacted] related that he had some information of great importance to the Bureau that he desired to immediately impart to an Agent, and refused to divulge any of its contents over the telephone. Agent McMillan stated that the informant was very argumentative over the telephone.

67C-1 Following McMillan's relief from duty, he telephoned the undersigned, stating that he had just left the Plaza Hotel where he had contacted the informant. According to McMillan, [redacted] stated that he had information that mines were being floated toward the Washington Airport by our enemy. He was reported as being unable to furnish information as to the source of this story.

67C-1 [redacted] was said by McMillan to have argued vociferously and bragged of his prior contacts with Agents Garfield and Dickenson, of the Washington Field Office, to whom he claimed to have furnished prior information.

67C-1 Agent Garfield of the Washington Field Division was contacted by the undersigned and advised that he was acquainted with [redacted] who was a habitual drunk and had called him up many times during the early hours of the morning.

67C-1 [redacted] advised Agent Dunlap that he did not know [redacted] and that there is no [redacted] operator by that name in the vicinity of Newport News. He expressed the opinion that [redacted] had gained the information concerning the [redacted] from a newspaper account of the engagement of the [redacted] girl to young [redacted] which recently appeared in a New York paper.

674-1 Mrs. [REDACTED] Arlington, Virginia telephoned me on March 6, 1944. She is the wife of former Special Agent [REDACTED] and she related the following story. MR- [REDACTED]

674-1 Her husband is now employed by the Lockheed Aircraft Company and is under the immediate supervision of former Special Agent in Charge, John Hanson, who is said to be in charge of the Plant Protection Department of that Company. On August, 1943, Mr. [REDACTED] was sent to England by the Lockheed Company on what Mrs. [REDACTED] termed a "highly confidential mission". Mr. [REDACTED] was supposed to remain abroad until six months after the expiration of the war. Shortly after his departure Mrs. [REDACTED] took up residence at her present address.

674-1 On February 22, 1944 Mrs. [REDACTED] happened to open a desk in her apartment which she had not looked into previously for about six weeks. This desk contained all of Mr. [REDACTED] personal papers and she stated that it was very apparent that it had been ransacked although nothing was missing so far as she could tell. Mrs. [REDACTED] went on to relate that she took the matter up with Mr. Blake, the manager of Colonial Village, and after an examination of her apartment he pointed out to her certain marks on the door jam which indicated, according to Blake, that the front door of her apartment had been forced open.

674-1 Mrs. [REDACTED] advised that because of the confidential nature of Mr. [REDACTED] assignment she was very much upset for fear that information in his personal papers might get into improper hands. Immediately after discovering that the apartment had been broken into she communicated by letter with Mr. Hanson, and at the time of her call she stated she had just received a letter from him in which he stated that she should report the matter to someone in the FBI and that if she did not do so he intended to report the matter to the Bureau himself. Mrs. [REDACTED] related further that she had recently received a mysterious letter from her husband in which he stated that he was returning to the United States immediately. She expressed the fear that something was wrong because her husband's return was not scheduled until six months after the war. The alleged break-in has not been reported to the police.

674-1 I became a casual acquaintance of Mr. [REDACTED] and Mrs. [REDACTED] when he was assigned to the Indianapolis Office, which, I suppose, was the reason Mrs. [REDACTED] called upon me. In April, 1941, SAC Hood, Los Angeles, submitted the following information which was quoted in the Espionage-G case entitled "[REDACTED] with aliases":

Dr. [REDACTED] advised that he met [REDACTED] in March, 1939, in Berlin and she was a very influential person and very close to Adolf Hitler. He stated he had sent his card to her but she refused to see him, apparently because she did not wish to recognize him in this country. He stated he had dinner with her in Berlin and she attended a cocktail party he gave for high government officials, as he was attached to the Cuban Legation. He stated she was a very beautiful and influential woman. SAC Hood did not believe it desirable that any attempt be made to have this informant obtain any information about her.

On April 26, 1942 Dr. [REDACTED] wrote the Director giving information forth regarding persons in Mexico City. His letter was acknowledged on May 19, 1942 thanking him for bring this information to the Bureau's attention. There was a notation on the original letter reading: "No. Is a Communist."

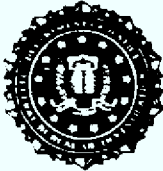

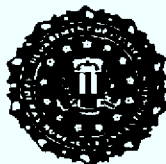

On April 21, 1944, Mrs. [REDACTED] telephonically contacted the writer and furnished the following information:

b7C-1

A school teacher, identity unknown, in Detroit, Michigan, recently wrote a letter to a Dr. [REDACTED] Washington, D. C.. Dr. [REDACTED] desired to send a copy of this letter to a relative of hers and had a woman, who is a friend of Mrs. [REDACTED] make the desired copy. This third person telephonically furnished Mrs. [REDACTED] with the contents which, according to Mrs. [REDACTED] was nothing more than propaganda which if circulated would result in race prejudice. The letter went into great detail indicating the fact that the negroes in Detroit are gaining a dominant hand and that it was their intention to eventually obtain control of the city. This control is already evident in the school system and the motor transportation system. The writer of the letter stated that a white person attending one of the local schools was recently killed by a colored person and the matter was hushed up and no action was ever taken. Colored bus drivers are alleged to be passing up white people.

^{inspired} Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that in her opinion the letter above mentioned was undoubtedly axis propaganda. I inquired of Mrs. [REDACTED] whether she had seen the letter and she replied in the negative. She also stated that she would be unable to obtain a copy of it inasmuch as she had already requested the woman who had read her the contents to make a copy available and was refused. Mrs. [REDACTED] was specifically asked whether Dr. [REDACTED] whom she claimed to know very well, and this third person, whose identity she refused to furnish, were the type to be considered involved in unamerican activities and she stated that in her opinion they were both very loyal Americans and would do nothing which would at all reflect on the country. She added she was merely reporting the matter so that the identity of the school teacher in Detroit might be determined so that it could be ascertained whether she might be subversive in her actions.

^{sent} I told Mrs. [REDACTED] that the information she furnished would be given appropriate attention and it was my opinion that no violation of any statute over which this Bureau had jurisdiction had occurred, particularly in view of the fact that there was no indication that the writer of the letter had asked Dr. [REDACTED] to circularize the letter but intended to merely voice her opinion of existing conditions in Detroit in a personal letter to Dr. [REDACTED]. For your information, Mrs. [REDACTED] is a member of the Speakers Guild in the District and also a member of the Community War Fund, 1101 M Street, N.W. I recently met Mrs. [REDACTED] at a social function at which time it was noted that she has a very vivid imagination and would jump to conclusions if given the opportunity. It is believed no action should be taken in this matter and the facts are being reported so that the call may be made a matter of record.

[redacted] paid each of these ladies \$5.00 a piece to sign the Articles of Incorporation.

Mr. [redacted] was asked if [redacted] had obtained anything of value from Mrs. [redacted] or Mrs. [redacted] and he stated that to the contrary they had both received \$5.00 from [redacted] for signing the affidavit.

I advised Mr. [redacted] that the facts as presented did not appear to constitute any violation within the Bureau's jurisdiction and suggested that he might wish to call this matter to the attention of the Corporation Counsel in the District of Columbia. He was thanked for his interest in reporting the matter to the Bureau.

She complained that certain unknown individuals had apparently damaged some of the voting machines being used in the election and requested that an FBI man be sent down immediately to investigate the failure of these machines to function properly. She had no information which would indicate that these unknown individuals had taken any action designed to effect the outcome of the election.

b7C-1 It was explained to Mrs. [REDACTED] that the facts related did not constitute a violation of any Federal statute and that for that reason no representative of this Bureau would be able to take part in such an investigation. 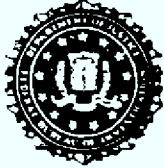

At 1:00 p.m., May 31, 1944, the Director's Office referred a telephone call from the above individual to the Interview Room, 1730. Mr. [REDACTED] related a vague story about suspected sabotage of two convoys wrought by a Mr. and Mrs. [REDACTED] of Baltimore, Maryland. He stated that Mrs. [REDACTED] was a German-appearing woman. Mr. [REDACTED] allegedly has been employed by the [REDACTED] in Baltimore for a period of twenty-seven years. Mr. [REDACTED] believed that their daughter was part of the sabotage plan by virtue of the fact that one evening she introduced a soldier to her mother and father and stated that he had recently returned from overseas. From the general trend of the conversation, it appeared that Mr. [REDACTED] did not have his thoughts well coordinated.

Mr. [REDACTED] advised that on May 30, 1944, he "walked away" from the Perry Point Veterans Hospital and proceeded to the home of his brother in Arlington, Virginia, the telephone number [REDACTED] being that of his brother at the captioned address.

This information as obtained from Mr. [REDACTED] was relayed to Supervisor R. F. Cartwright, Room 5712, in order that he might refer the matter to the Veterans Administration if deemed advisable.

Mr. [REDACTED] was advised that the decision by a particular local board that cantors fall into one of the exempted classes is not within the Bureau's investigative jurisdiction in the absence of fraud or collusion.

67C-1 It was suggested to Mr. [REDACTED] that he recontact the Miami Field Office in the event he found evidence of any collusion between members of the Selective Service Board and the selectees in bringing about deferments under the occupation of cantor.

67C-1 The caller first stated that he was Father [redacted] and stated immediately that he wanted to see the Director at 10:00 a.m. Tuesday. When asked if he were acquainted with the Director, he at first indicated that he was and later stated that he had "met him one time".

The caller stated that he "had something for Mr. Hoover". He refused to elaborate on the nature of what he had and talked in an incoherent manner throughout the conversation. The nature of the conversation indicated that the caller might be intoxicated.

It was noted that when the interviewing Agent would attempt to answer a question of the caller or make a suggestion, the caller would invariably interrupt and continue to talk.

67C-1 Mr. [redacted] stated at various times that he was "an enlisted man in the Navy" and later that he had an honorable discharge. He would frequently go into a raucous laughter, and the entire nature of his conversation and conduct indicated he was not a member of the clergy.

The caller finally insisted on getting the name of the interviewing Agent, and when this was furnished stated that he would call in Washington on Tuesday morning and furnish the information he had to the interviewing Agent. He first indicated that he would like to meet the interviewing Agent "in front of the Capitol" rather than at the Bureau. He was furnished with the address of the Bureau, and any further information which is received indicating that he actually is a member of the clergy or is in any way known to the Director, will be forwarded.

The caller would only state that he was calling from "Southern Maryland". The Communications Section has advised that the call originated in La Plata, Maryland.

b7C-1 At 2:50 p.m. a telephone call was referred from the Director's Office to the writer at the complaint desk. This call was from Miss [REDACTED] who resides at Barton Hall, West Potomac Park, and is employed by the Quartermaster Corps, War Department.

b7C-1 Miss [REDACTED] stated that she believed there was a spy in the White House and that the following is her reason for this belief. She advised that about two years ago she was ill and went to a German doctor in her home at Mt. Jackson, Virginia. This doctor prescribed some pills for her and told her to take eight of them. She advised she took two and became very sleepy and felt that if she had taken the eight would have suffered some ill effects. She believed that this doctor had prescribed an overdose of some sort to her as a result of a letter she had previously written to the President telling him how Hitler could be killed. She stated that she was suspicious in this particular incident because, after all other communications she had sent to the President, she had received an answer and in this particular instance no answer was forthcoming. Miss [REDACTED] was unable to give the name of the German doctor who she stated was in Mt. Jackson for but a few months during 1942. She was thanked for the information and told it would receive appropriate attention.

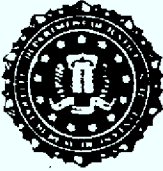

By reference from the Director's Office, Miss [REDACTED] Tampa, Florida, called the complaint desk at 5:05 p.m., on November 4, 1944, and stated she had some secret information she wished to give.

Miss [REDACTED] conversation was almost indistinguishable but was gathered that she appeared reluctant to give this information and she said that perhaps she would give it directly to the Florida Office. During the conversation she hung up three times and it was necessary for the operator to call her back. She concluded the conversation by saying that she guessed she became overexcited and that the call was probably unnecessary. It was impossible to make any sense out of her telephone conversation.
