The caller was informed that Agent had work to perform but would be most interested in obtaining any information she might have concerning a violation within the Bureau's jurisdiction. The caller stated that she didn't know if she had any information but that if she could be permitted to talk she might know something which would interest the Bureau. It was again explained to the caller that Agent had other phone calls and official matters to handle and that he could not engage in lengthy conversation on nonofficial matters.

The caller was very unhappy that she was not permitted to ramble on and the conversation was discontinued when another call was received.

He said that Mr. Ricker or Rickert was known to him about eight years ago from an association in Ohio, that his inquiry was a personal matter concerning clearance of property, and he knew nothing else to identify captioned individual except that he was believed to be about 46 years old.

The Personnel Section was unable to locate an in or out-of-service record on individual names as captioned and attempted several times to contact [redacted] unsuccessfully. [REDACTED] explained that he was a gun collector and that the gun in question was strictly a collectors item which had been purchased at Ye Old Hunter, Alexandria, Va., and rendered completely ineffective pursuant to law. [REDACTED] surmised that his fraternity brothers probably took the gun as a prank and would return it shortly; however, he felt he should make its absence a matter of record. [REDACTED] added that he had apparently mislaid his document containing the serial number of the gun, but that he would attempt to locate it.

However, Bureau files reveal that in 1941 he was the author of a pamphlet on pacifism called [redacted] from which he appeared to have been a convinced pacifist for many years. In 1948 information was furnished from a source considered reliable at that time that [redacted] had never been connected with the Communist Party or its activities, but had been known for many years as a pacifist with close association to the international peace efforts of Quaker groups. It is noted that the [redacted] mentioned above, is described as a Quaker pacifist group. (Department of State Communication, dated April 8, 1948, 40-84238-2)

On [redacted] an Executive Board meeting of the Syracuse, New York, Peace Council was held in Syracuse, at which reprints from the "Nation" issue of July 6, 1957, were distributed. The reprint entitled [redacted] was distributed to all social studies teachers in Onondaga County, New York. An informant who has furnished reliable information in the past advised that the sense of the article was that more and more influential persons in the world are following the lead of the Pope, of Albert Schweitzer, and Nehru against the hydrogen bomb "because it is so definitely wrong" and that all other alleged comments made for the subject as "defense," "deterrence," "bargaining weapon" no longer count with these people. (100-419683-21 page 17)

On October 4, 1960, one [redacted] of Springfield, Illinois, furnished information to the Springfield Division that she had attended a meeting on [redacted] of the Fellowship Group of the Unitarian Church in Springfield. She stated that the speaker at this meeting was [redacted] who advised at the outset of this meeting he was a member of the [redacted]

She gave a very disjointed story about some kind of blackmail among family members resulting in personal fear of life. After explaining Bureau's jurisdiction, she was told her problem was one of local police interest.

SYNOPSIS:

[redacted] who stated he feared a beating by his son-in-law, called to ask for "protection from the Metropolitan Police." He was insistent on protection and stated it was an interstate matter because his son-in-law was coming into the District of Columbia from Maryland for the purpose of beating him up, and the Police Department had told him there was nothing they could do beforehand. On his second call, he stated he did not agree with me that the facts he gave did not constitute a case within the Bureau's jurisdiction, and stated he was going to write to his "Senator in Virginia." At his request, I gave him my name. No action recommended.

DETAILS:

[redacted] stated he resides at [redacted] Apartment 102, Washington, D. C. He also stated at the beginning of the call that he was rational, but scared. He seemed to be excited. He said he wanted someone sent out to "protect him from the Metropolitan Police," and continued that [redacted] an employee of the Federal Housing Administration, was coming from Hyattsville, Maryland, to his residence address to beat him up. He related he had reported this to the Metropolitan Police, but they had told him they could not do anything for him until after he was beat up. He stated [redacted] telephone number is [redacted]. Upon questioning as to the identity of [redacted] he admitted that [redacted] is his son-in-law, the husband of [redacted] in the current telephone directory for the number given, at [redacted].

It was explained courteously to [redacted] that the facts which he furnished did not constitute a violation within the jurisdiction of the Bureau, and that we would not be able to comply with his request for protection. He then became more excited, and said that although he was "physically helpless" he had a Japanese knife from World War II, and asked me to advise him whether or not it would be all right for him to use the knife to protect himself. When I told him that I would be unable to advise him, and that the matter would have to be his own decision, he said, "Certainly I didn't expect you to stick your neck out!" He then hung up the phone. It was 12:42 a. m.

I called the Metropolitan Police Department, and spoke with Sergeant Raminelli, Precinct 14, who said he was aware of [redacted] call to the Police-

At 1:10 a.m., [redacted] Night Stenographer, Division 9, telephonically advised that she had just received a phone call from an individual who identified himself as Bobby Wilson. [redacted] stated that Wilson claimed that he and his girl friend were being held captive at an unknown location in Arlington.

[redacted] received this phone call at her residence from an individual who stated his name was Bobby Wilson [redacted] Alexandria, Virginia. Wilson claimed that he and his girl friend, [redacted] had been walking on South 15th or 16th Street, Arlington, Virginia, during the evening of 12/5/61 when they were abducted by two white males in their early 20's. Wilson alleged that he and his girl friend had been taken to an uninhabited apartment house where they had been bound and gagged and their valuables taken.

Wilson claimed that he had been successful in removing his gag and, although bound, had been dialing seven numbers at random on a telephone which he claimed was located in the room in which he was held. It was through this random call he alleged that he had reached [redacted]. Additional details were furnished by the caller regarding the experience of himself and his girl friend.

An immediate call was made to the Arlington Police Department to Officer [redacted]. As the writer started to furnish the information to [redacted] stopped him and stated "Let me see if I can tell you what you have to furnish." [redacted] then furnished a story identical in detail to that furnished by [redacted]. [redacted] informed that this caller had been active in Arlington in the recent past and that the Arlington Police Department had already, during the night of 12/5-6/61, received a number of phone calls from citizens who had been contacted by the alleged Bobby Wilson. [redacted] informed that the whole matter is a hoax. [redacted] was informed of the comments of Officer [redacted].

The captioned individual of Vienna, Virginia, telephone [redacted] called at 12:35 a.m., 12-10-61, and said that he wanted information as to his wife's whereabouts. He said his wife and two daughters left Vienna approximately thirty days ago in the wife's car and had been variously reported as being in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania; Charlottesville, Virginia and Winston-Salem, North Carolina.

He claimed that the Vienna, Virginia, Police Department had built a wall around him and did not furnish him any information. He also added that one [redacted] had appeared at his house in Vienna some four months ago and made claims that he had a Russian satellite. He said [redacted] had set off several minor explosions in his front yard but did not furnish any details. Scott maintained that he was not insane and there was no domestic difficulty involved in connection with his wife's disappearance.

At 1:52 a.m., [redacted] who stated he was calling from Dallas, Texas, profanely asked if the Agent to whom he was talking (Midnight Supervisor W. E. Assmus) was the (Profane) Agent to whom he had previously talked and who had hung up on him. [redacted] was advised that he was not talking to the same Agent and inquiry was made of Sanders as to what he wished to report. Sanders, in a very profane and insulting manner, stated that he had attempted to furnish information to the FBI but that he had been hung up on. [redacted] stated that although he was a former inmate of a mental institution he had been hospitalized because of his great zeal in enforcing the law.

[redacted] who had obviously been drinking, furnished no specific information but made constant references to the stupidity of Bureau Agents and was extremely profane and insulting in his remarks.

After being cautioned several times concerning his profanity and insulting remarks and being advised that the Agent did not consider it necessary to subject himself to such abuse, the conversation was terminated by the Agent.

Bureau files (66-3182-4790) disclose that on 6/1/57, [redacted] possibly identical with instant caller, called and asked for the Director. He rambled in conversation about the possibility of losing his job with the [redacted] in the near future and sounded as though he had been drinking.

A woman who identified herself as [redacted] called from Pomona, California this evening and requested information concerning missing persons. The Bureau's missing persons program was explained to [redacted].

It was apparent that she was not listening to the explanation and she repeatedly interrupted. Her conversation was garbled. It was obvious that she was emotionally unstable. She then asked to be connected with President Kennedy because she says her life is in danger. It was suggested that she contact the local police.

[redacted] finally volunteered the information that the last time she had been fingerprinted was at the California State Hospital at Norwalk, California. It developed that she either had been or is an inmate there.

Murphy of the Crime Records Division talked with the above captioned individual who was telephoning from Poquoson, Virginia, where she resides at [REDACTED] with her parents. She indicated she is presently home on a three-day pass from Eastern State Hospital, Williamsburg, Virginia, an insane asylum, where she has been a mental patient since [REDACTED]. She talked in a rather rambling and incoherent manner and stated she wanted the FBI to instruct Albert Sidney White, Sheriff of York County, Virginia, not to return her to Eastern State Hospital as he has apparently been so instructed by her parents.

She was informed the FBI could not take this action although she insisted that her return to the mental institution upon her parents order was a Federal case. She pointed out that a few years ago, in connection with applying for a civil service job, she had been given a clear bill of health, both physical and mental, from officials at Fort Eustis, Virginia. She also pointed out that her condition was actually not mental, but physical, and that she had been a victim of enemy warfare, wherein she ate some poisoned food. Because of the statement she allegedly received from Fort Eustis officials and the fact her condition was physical and not mental, she did not desire to return to Eastern State Hospital. Her only hopes were for the FBI to intercede in any commitment order Sheriff White might attempt to fulfill.

[REDACTED] is described in a report of the St. Louis Office dated August 10, 1960, as a "gambler" from Cleveland, Ohio, who visited [REDACTED] in Mexico City, Mexico, on January 1, 1960. He said that during this argument, [redacted] told him he could have 50 men at this office within two minutes and asked [redacted] if he wanted to see them. [redacted] said he would call the FBI if [redacted] called his men. [redacted] expressed disbelief and said [redacted] then phoned someone. A short time later, two men came to the office. He said these men, about 23 to 24 years of age, were acquainted with [redacted] and were invited by [redacted] to have a beer. Then [redacted] told one of the men to stand up, sit down, stand up and sit down. This man, according to [redacted] had an amused look on his face, but did as [redacted] instructed. Then [redacted] asked the men if they were wearing their black belts. One man said yes and the other man said he was not wearing a belt of any type, whereupon [redacted] told him he should always wear his black belt. Again, this man had an amused look on his face. [redacted] then opened a bottle of beer and threw it across the room to one of the men, and the beer bottle smashed on the floor of the office. About this time some employee of this company entered the office and upon viewing the scene, ordered the two strangers to leave. These two men waited outside until [redacted] joined them, then they left. [redacted] continued that a few minutes later, [redacted] phoned the office, attempted to disguise his voice, and made some remarks that [redacted] cannot now recall. [redacted] said he left the office and went home.

[redacted] stated that after returning to his residence on December 22, 1961, he attempted to place a collect call to the FBI at Washington, D. C., and engaged in an argument with the operator in this regard. He said he finally spoke with someone with the FBI at Washington, D. C., and admitted having furnished the information set forth in referenced letter.

Upon being questioned about his remarks as contained in referenced letter, [redacted] stated that he had been intoxicated and apparently had let his imagination run away with him. Wick explained Mr. Hoover's absence whereupon the operator stated [REDACTED] desired to have a conference call set up between [REDACTED] Radio Station KHQ at Portland; [REDACTED] and Wick.

Wick asked why a conference call was necessary. The operator stated [REDACTED] wanted Wick (or Mr. Hoover), [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] on one line because [REDACTED] had something very expedite to handle.

The Portland operator was not able to set up the conference with all the parties [REDACTED] desired on the line until 8:30 p. m., 1-13-62. When all parties were on the line, [REDACTED] said, [REDACTED] this is [REDACTED] I am in Pilot Rock, Oregon. I have been here for three days. I thought it was due for a shake-down. The only reason I am making this call is that I find this part of the country is infested with communist propaganda. They are loading the television and radio stations with communist propaganda like we had twenty-five years ago."

Wick asked [REDACTED] the identity of "they" whereupon [REDACTED] said, "I don't know who is doing it but there is a lot of communist propaganda here." [REDACTED] rambled on for about five minutes concerning radio programs and television programs which he alleged followed the Communist Party line. He said that KHQ is one of the main offenders. Also, he said, several NBC and CBS network programs are received in Pilot Rock and they are "communist propaganda." [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] the latter did not know what he was talking about. [REDACTED] said to [REDACTED] "You are making some serious allegations about my station and you had better be able to back them up."

Both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] that they did not know what he was talking about.

Caller was informed that in order to take any action on his complaint it would be necessary for him to furnish information regarding the officials concerning whom he was complaining. Caller then became profane and stated that all the law enforcement agencies were corrupt and would not act on his complaint and he was fearful for his life if he disclosed his identity. The caller was told to "put up or shut up" regarding his allegations on the part of Bureau Agents which he refused to do and the call was terminated.

At 11:05 PM, 1-17-62, an individual identifying himself as Henry J. White an attorney at Houston, Texas, called Special Agent Robert A. Frazier, who was the Laboratory duty supervisor at that time. White was very incoherent and rambling during his conversation and it was Frazier's belief that the individual was probably intoxicated.

Briefly, Frazier was able to determine that White had been contacted by a prospective client in Houston and asked to initiate a suit against the Peters Cartridge Company because two shotgun shells had gone off in the client's jacket injuring the client. White wanted an official opinion whether or not it was possible for the shells to explode in this manner. Frazier (who is one of the Laboratory's most experienced firearms experts) advised him that he could not give him any opinion in this matter because of the fact that the Laboratory does not give testimony or opinions in connection with civil matters. During the discussion it was mentioned that White might contact the Houston Office today concerning this matter.

As you know, I called the Houston Office at 9:30 this morning and talked with Supervisor Fred Fehl in the absence of SAC Rightmyer to alert Houston to the possibility that White might call the Houston Office today. I told Fehl that under no circumstances should any statement be made to White which could be used in a civil action since this could be a very controversial matter and that Peters Cartridge Company was one of the largest concerns in the firearms business and one with which the Bureau had in the past and undoubtedly will continue to do business. Fehl stated that the Houston Office would be alert for White; that they would make discreet inquiry and advise the Bureau.

Bureau files contain no information which could be identified with White, A former employee, [redacted] was employed as a student fingerprint classifier 4-21-41 and removed from the rolls 9-7-41 because he failed to return to active duty from military leave within the required period. However, it would not appear that this individual is identical with the attorney, White.
