#### DETAILS:

Shortly before noon today a New York attorney named (not identifiable in Bufiles) called this Section and b7c-1 inquired of me whether the FBI has an Agent named in Corpus Christi, Texas. I told that I did not know but that 67c-4 I would be glad to check and then attempted to get from him what he had appeared to be rather "cozy" but stated that he in mind. understood an Agent named had talked to a Mr. Collins in Corpus Christi recently about payments in a commercial matter. intimated that he did not have too much confidence in the veracity of Collins and just wanted to see if we actually had an Agent by the name of I pressed for the date of the alleged interview and the first name of Collins but he hedged and indicated he did not have his papers before him. He understood that the interview took place early this month. I told that he would be called back.

> ASAC Hetherington of the Houston Office advised that while they have no Agent named assigned to that office they do have (EOD: 7-8-46, last annual efficiency report outstanding) who is the Senior Resident Agent. Hetherington stated he checked with and that the latter could not recall and found no indication through a check of daily reports that he had interviewed anyone named Collins in late October or early this month. Hetherington stated that the only thing which might be considered controversial handled by recently involved a Houston case entitled Unknown Subject; Theft of B23 Aircraft, SN 27414; Register No. N-58091-Interstate Transportation of Stolen Aircraft (ITSA). reportedly visited in McAllen, Texas, on October 28th and they wanted with them to the bank to get the \$10,000. because of lack of time but asked that the money be wired to his wife in Michigan and they did on October 29th. On the same date to ask that one in Tampa release the called plane to the pilot. reportedly refused to so as the \$9,000 was not paid.

> On October 29th reportedly told that the plane was taken to the Frank Hill Aircraft Company at Fort Lauderdale got a call from wanted some work done on it. in Philadelphia on November 3rd, who stated that he had learned from his wife at Fort Lauderdale that according to the Frank Hill Aircraft Company the planehad disappeared and was suspected of taking it. thereafter contacted the FBI in Miami and FAA in Muskegon and FAA put out an alert to all stations regarding the plane.

> On November 4th allegedly called said that his firm in Texas was being investigated by the FBI with regard to the plane and that he wanted to send the remaining \$9,000. is said to have declined and to have said that the matter was out of his hands -- there was no sale and he should not have moved the plane. On the same day (November 4th) got a call from one who claimed that he had been arrested in connection with the plane and spent the night in jail and wanted him again refused, stating that he and his attorney were following the matter to recover the plane.

> ASAC Hetherington advised that FAA learned on the 3rd that the plane was at Corpus Christi, Texas, and also indicated that arrested by the Corpus Christi Police Department and at the request of the police SA interviewed at the polic<u>e statio</u>n while he was in local police custody. It would appear desirable to advise that while we have no Agent named at at Corpus Christi we do have a few and that if he is thinking of the aircraft matter which occurred recently in Corpus Christi the FBI had every reason to take the action we took as a possible investigative matter within our jurisdiction and that we have no apologies to anyone in connection with the same.

During their ensuing conversation that evening learned that had just lost his wife suddenly through death from poisoning of her kidneys and bladder. His wife, whose name could not recall, had been living on the farm in apparently good health when she suddenly became ill and died a short time later at Georgetown University Hospital in WDC.

He did not clarify this statement. At invitation she shortly therafter visited the farm with a friend who drove her there. met the nurse, whose name she could not recall, who appeared to be in her 30's and by her manner that day seemed to have taken over the operation of the household.

Approximately a month later was telephonically advised by that he had married the nurse; further that he had been forced to do so although he did not explain this statement. The lost contact with however, about four years ago she learned that he had fatally shot himself while visiting a neighbor's home near his farm.

About two months ago contacted by a real estate salesman b7c-1 employed by Dreyfus Company, Realtors in WDC, a mutual friend of and the family. expressed his interest in selling residence, however, during the conversation he also talked about the family. He intimated that must have confided in about his family situation at home following his wife's death and possibly about the nurse whom he married. that the nurse had taken over informeli property after his death and had been living in the Miami, Florida, area. He also remarked that the nurse had reportedly been subpoensed to appear in the Court handling estate, location unknown, and that she may have traudulently signed over some of the property to herself after her husband's death.





Subject has been a chronic "nut" caller since 1963. Her contact with this office, always by telephone, has been characterized by fluctuating periods of intensity, during which her calls will vary from a few per day to as many as sixty times during an eight-hour period. In recent years, her calls have become more frequent and persistent. She is irrational in her statements and has no information of interest to the Bureau. She frequently calls at three to four minute intervals and her conversation is entirely onesided. She rambles on incoherently, ignoring efforts to interrupt her.

On 10/8/68, two Special Agents attempted to contact subject at her home. She did not admit them to her residence and immediately telephoned this office, stating that after calling this office for seven years, she expected that anyone wishing to speak with her would at least make an appointment.

Subject was interviewed at her residence, San Diego, on 10/11/68 for 1 hour and 15 minutes. It was apparent that she is mentally unbalanced and during the interview it was impossible to correctly define the nature of her complaint. She is obsessed with a notion that there is a national and international conspiracy organized by "people from the South" to destroy the social and political structure of this country. 66-3182-8840

He claimed these motorcyclists were hazardous to traffic and endangered his life. He advised he reported this to local law enforcement including the State Police and was advised that they did not have enough men to patrol all areas effectively.

It was explained to him that this was something that was not within the jurisdiction of the FBI and if he felt he was not getting sufficient action from the local law enforcement agencies he should contact the State Attorney's Office or his local State Assemblyman. indicated he would do this. appeared to be highly upset, was belligerent, argumentative and frequently had to interrupt the conversation to yell at his children and/or dogs.

has been caring for his daughter's infant child for a year or more. The daughter, who has furnished no assistance to the child according to the is now attempting to get custody of the infant and allegedry plans to leave the area with an individual other than her husband. that his daughter planned to sell the child although he furnished no details. He stated that he will not surrender custody of his grandchild and will leave with it if necessary to avoid giving it up. He claims that his daughter plans to have him arrested June 15, 1970, in an effort to get the child.

It was explained to that the FBI has no jurisdiction in this child custody dispute and would be unable 67C-1 to assist him. He indicated that he had reported the matter to the Baltimore office earlier and said he had been advised that the FBI could not assist him.
