SOBLE stated that JACQUES was not an ordinary operative but was extremely competent linguist and engineer or technician and must have been very close to KOROTHOV. SOBLE related that JACQUES had other special assignments in Paris other than meeting SOBLE. SOBLE again mentioned that JACQUES talked to him about being in contact with the German scientists who were working in Russia and who had worked for HITLER in Germany to produce the German rockets.

SOBLE was questioned at length as to his knowledge of agent who JACQUES mentioned named "AMEL" and as to whether he thought this agent was RUDOLPH IVANOVICH AMEL or if he knew if this agent was in the United States. SOBLE claimed that above information was all he could presently recall about what JACQUES had told him in reference to this agent.

Re: LUCY BOOKER

SOBLE still unable to recall what can he introduced to BOOKER. SOBLE maintains that he is not positive if this man was RODERT SOBLE.

Re: ROBERT SOBLE's Contacts

SOFIE still claimed that he could not recall who RODERT's contacts were. SOFIE stated it was possible that RODERT had told him something about these contacts but he could not presently recall any details concerning anything RODERT might have told him about these contacts.

SOBLE stated he now recalled that FITTH attended the forevell party given to ROLERT and himself in Moscow prior to there leaving Russia. SOBLE stated it was FITTN

During the interview it was strongly pointed out to SOBLE that he had not told his whole story and omitted very important details in the areas in which he had furnished information. SOBLE stated that he realized that he had not completed his story but would do so after he had received medical treatment for his "nervous condition."

Warden A.KRIMSKY, Federal Detention Headquarters, NYC, advised that he thought both JACK and MYRA SOBLE would be transferred from the New York area this week.

MYRA SOBLE claimed that if she knew who ROBERT SOBLE had been connected with in his operations for Soviets she would gladly disclose these facts to agents. Mrs. SOBLE claimed she had no positive info that ROBERT had worked for Soviets in the United States.

Mrs. SUBLE stated she did not know if ELIZABETH AMBELLAN or MARSHA SKLARSKY had ever worked for ROBERT SOBLE, as their Soviet supervisor. MYRA SOBLE related it was possible that these people had worked for ROBERT but she did not have any information concerning this.

Re: INVING SCLLINS

MYRA SOBLE stated SOLLINS in her "opinion" could have worked for Soviets but she did not know if he had worked for ROBERT SOBLE. Mrs. SOBLE stated she understood that SOLLING was well connected with the Soviets and knew many important people both here and in Russia. She was unable to be specific from whom she may have heard this. Ers. SOBLE related that she did not know the identities of SCLLINS connections. Firs. SCRLE stated in her "opinion" if SCLLINS had worked for the Soviets he would have had his own connection rather than through ROBERT.

Officials, House of Detention for Women advise as of 4/7/58, MYRA SORLE had not been shipped from New York City.



MYRA SOBLE interviewed 4/8/58, House of Detention for Woman, MYC.

Ers. SOBLE was questioned on numerous phases of the Mocase without eliciting any substantially new information. EYRA SOBLE stated that to her present recollections, she has told all she knows in relation to her own and her husband's espionage activities. Hrs. SOBLE stated there were possibly small details she might recall, if each phase of her activities were gone over again with her.

Mrs. SOBLE stated that she thought JACK SOBLE would be able to furnish more information in relation to his activities after he got himself "straightened out". Mrs. SOBLE stated she was disappointed in her husband's actions since their errest in January, 1957. Mrs. SOBLE stated she hoped that her husband would regain his self-composure, and be able to fully cooperate with the government. Mrs. SOBLE inferred that she knew her husband had more information in his possession, but due to complications involved, such as relatives, he found it very difficult to become open and frank in telling all details. Mrs. SOBLE stated that she thought her husband still was subconsciously adhereing to Soviet discipline in not telling his story.

Ars. SOBLE related that she, personally, never had any desire to leave the US after first coming here, and told her husband so. In this regard, she stated she was disturbed at BORIS BORROS, for she felt that MORFIS sected as a "provocateur" in obtaining letters from Jack after 1952, but bares no real anomosity toward him.

On 5-15-58 Dr. DON RINSLEY, Staff Psychiatrist, Medical Center for Federal Prisoners, Springfield, Missouri, advised subject's progress has been slow and that permission has been received by the brother, Dr. ROBERT SCHLER, to administer electric shock treatments. He stated that permission is also being requested of subject's wife, MYRA, at the women's Prison, Alderson, West Virginia to administer shock treatments. He stated that he feels that the subject is not progressing as fast as he should and that administering shock would facilitate patient's recovery. He stated that at present he expects to give the patient one treatment three times a week for a total of eight to twelve treatm or maybe less, depending upon the results. He stated patient complains of pains in his head, chest, testicles, and tingling in the tips of his fingers. Referenced airtel of 6/20/58 sets forth statement by Dr. DON RINSLEY, Staff Psychiatrist, Medical Center for Federal Prisoners, Springfield, Mo., that JACK SCHLE could be interviewed in two weeks.

It is suggested that to take maximum advantage of interview time with SOBLE that interview be conducted on a full daily basis. As the Bureau is aware, when SOBLE was at the Federal Correctional Institution, Danbury, Conn., he was interviewed for approximately six hours per day in morning and afternoon sessions. A similar schedule of interviews of SOBLE at Springfield would be desirable unless prison routine, or SOBLE's medical treatment would militate against such schedule of interviews. It is requested that Kansas City ascertain in next contact with prison officials whether such schedule of interviews maintained for as many days as may be necessary to obtain maximum information from SOBLE could be arranged.

MYRA SOBLE stated she thought her husband could furnish more information in relation to his activities after he got himself "straightened out".

As the Bureau is aware New York Agents have conducted interviews with SOBLE since inception of interviews on 4/12/57. NY Agents are completely familiar with the voluminous information SOBLE has supplied thus far, his contradictions and retractions. NY Agents are also familiar with SOBLE's complex personality and the various tactics he has used in an attempt to withhold information and minimize his role in behalf of the Soviets. This has been set forth in NY memorandum dated 11/29/57. In order that interviews with SOBLE be conducted as thoroughly as may be possible at this time, NYO recommends that two Agents who have interviewed SOBLE in the past, conduct the forthcoming interviews with SOBLE.

Ransas City is requested to advise the Bureau and NY when SOBLE will be available for interviews as well as any other factors which might interfere with as expeditious and complete an interview as may be had with JACK SOBLE at this time.

Soble, according to Dr. Rineley, is much improved, his depression is gone and he no longer complains of pains as he dids before the shock treatments. Dr. Rinsley advised that Soble is more interested in his environment, is doing some clerical work and that in his opinion interviews with Soble could be resumed in about two weeks. However, he stated that Soble is no longer under his care but is now under the care of Dr. Ernest Bergel, Staff Psychiatrist, who has had little or no contact with Soble to date.
