SCRIE interviewed at US Marshal's Detention Quarters, US Court House, NYC, 10/1/57. SCHLE related that in Spring of 1945, he was instructed by CHOUNDENKO to turn over his contacts to his brother ROBERT SCRIE.

SCRIE stated he now definitely recalled that HAL (FLOYD C. MILLER) had worked for him in behalf of Soviets and that material furnished by MILLER was in reference to Trotskyites. SOBLE claimed inability to recall specific material turned over by MILLER.

SCRLE related that he worked with MILLER for several months and at CHOUNDENKO's instructions introduced him to ROBERT SORIE. SORIE recalled that he also introduced LUCY BOOKER to ROBERT and turned her over to ROBERT. SCRIE claimed he thinks he introduced ROBERT to BOOKER on a NYC street by cannot recall exactly where he introduced MILLER to ROBERT.

SCRIE stated he also turned over ESTHER RAND to ROBERT, but does not think that RAND furnished ROBERT with any information. SCHLE claimed he did not receive any instructions from CHOUNDENKO on ALICE MARTIN and did not instruct RAND to introduce ALICE MARTIN to ROBERT. but ESTHER RAND did so.

SORIE stated that ALICE MARTIN was aware that ROHERT was a Soviet agent, and that she had furnished information to JACK SORIE for the Soviets. SORIE related CHOUNDENED in instructing him to turn over his contacts told him that the Soviets wanted him to meet with a man from Washington, D.C., for another assignment. SORIE stated that his trip to Canada in spring of 1945 had nothing to do with his new assignment. SORIE stated when and if he mentioned that Soviets approached him in Canada on the Washington proposition he was making up the story.

FRANKEL, stated that ALBAN had been persecuted by the Russians and that he was definitely anti-Communist. ALBAN was compelled to become a partner of a group in Russia although he did not want to. FRANKEL stated ALBAN committed no overt acts against the US. He stated ALBAM surprised when he was contacted by BORIS MORROS and fear of Russians caused him to render a report to BORIS MORROS. ALBAM was also fearful for his daughter and brother, who are presently in Russia. FRANKEL stated much can not be said concerning ALBAM for security reasons.

USA PAUL W. WILLIAMS, SIMY, stated the Government takes no position concerning the motion of ALBAM for reduction of sentence.



Federal Judge LEVET heard USA WILLIAMS on sentencing of JACK SOBLE. WILLIAMS reviewed the indictment and counts of indictment JACK SOBLE charged with. He stated SOBLE and family came to the US in 19th pursuant to instructions of LAVESTRI HERIA on forged passports with idea of doing work for the Soviets. WILLIAMS stated SOBLE's activities covered for the past ten years by BORIS MORROS, who was furnishing information to the FRI. WILLIAMS stated SOBLE in 19th became head of a loosely knit ring of American citizens and aliens who gathered information for the Soviets. He stated this information ranged from harmless to that which could have caused grave danger to the security of the US. WILLIAMS went on to state SOBLE became involved in the BORIS MORROS Music Company, which was financed by ALFRED K. STERM. This company was to furnish cover for Soviet agents in the US and South America. WILLIAMS also stated SOBLE acted as peace-maker between STERN and MORROS.

WILLIAMS Stated the S & W Cafeteria, located in bosses, HYC, was opened by JACK SCHLE for the purpose of furnishing a cover for Soviet agents. SCHLE also became closely identified with ALFRED K. and MARTHA DOED STERN, whom he was introduced to by VASSILI ZURILIN, and in turn JACK SCHLE was introduced to GEORGE and JANE FOSTER ELATOVSKI by the STERNS. WILLIAMS stated JANE ZLATOVSKI turned over a report on Indonesia, which she had made while employed by the US Government, to JACK SCHLE.

WILLIAMS stated following JACK SOHLE's return to the US from Europe in 1952, he was less active but did whom an interest in maintaining his Soviet contacts.

WILLIAMS stated when JACK SOBLE pled guilty, he said he would disclose all of the information he had concerning Soviet activities in the US and during the last 6 months, he has been interviewed by FBI agents and has testified before the Federal Grand Jury, NYC. This information furnished by him helped indict the STERNS and ZLATOVSKIS. WILLIAMS stated SOBLE has confirmed information which the FBI had but has furnished little information concerning matters which the FBI was not aware of.

WILLIAMS stated JACK SOBLE has a complex personality and at times has been a victim of psychological maladjustment. WILLIAMS stated before court that JACK SOBLE, during long periods of time, has not freely and readily submitted to interrogation. He said the crime JACK SOBLE was charged with was a heinous one and warrants term punishment. WILLIAMS stated SOBLE has acted and will be required to continue to act as a Government witness. He stated JACK SOBLE has minimized his own role and has continuously minimized the character of the information, as pertaining to the national defense, gathered by him and others who were in contact with him.

WILLIAMS concluded by stating JACK SOBLE has cooperated extensively and has furnished a certain amount of valuable information and this should merit consideration.

JACK SOBLE's attorney, GEORGE WOLF, made a very short statement before the court and the main part of his statement appeared to have been that JACK SOBLE and his wife, MYRA, are dedicated in exposing the activities of the Russian espionage agents in the US and in the future will demonstrate that fact better than he has in the past. He made a plea that no monetary

fine be imposed on JACK SOBLE and that JACK SOBLE's cooperation should be taken into consideration. WOLF stated the eight months JACK SOBLE has been confined and also the long interviews he has gone through with many agents of the FBI should merit consideration.

make a statement. JACK SOMEE replied in a highly emotional state, crying that he deeply regretted the crime he committed against this country that gave him refuge. He stated he fully intended to cooperate with the US Government; that he had had a wonderful opportunity and did not take advantage of it. JACK SOMEE made a tearful plea that he was telling the full truth and that he knew what he had done to the country which gave him refuge.

Judge LEVET stated that any facts not put before him for security reasons which he might consider in passing sentence should be brought to his attention by counsel for JACE SORLE.

Judge LEVET adjourned all matters concerning JACOB ALBAM, MYRA SOBLE and the sentencing of JACK SOBLE until 10/8/57 at 4 p.m.

SOBLE interviewed 10/15/57 at US Marshal's Detention Quarters, US Court House, NYC. SOHLE interviewed in A.M. and constantly complained of nervousness and burning sensations inside his mouth and nose, pains in his chest, and inability to sleep but would continue interview. Could not logically explain reason for such nervousness. Interview was interrupted by SOBLE's conference with his attorney GEORGE WOLF. Re LUCY BOOKER, SOBLE insists that he met BOOKER on street near her apartment while he was in the company of the ZUBILINS. SOBLE relates that the meeting and stop at restaurant took about one hour. SOBLE stated that ZUBILINS told him either prior or during meeting with BOOKER that BOOKER was a devoted worker who ZUBILINS had known for a long time. SOBLE states that he does not recall ZUBILIN mentioning SOPHIE (SYLVIA CALLEN) DOXSEE, but it is possible that ZUBILIN did and also that SOPHIR would bring Trotskyite information to BOOKER.

SOBLE related he knew from either CHALIAPIN or ZUBILIN that SOPHIE worked in office of a JAMES P. CANNON. SOBLE claims after introduction to BOCKER he did not meet with her for about a month. SOBLE stated that his first actual meeting with BOOKER took place at the instruction of CHALIAPIN. SOBLE advised that CHALIAPIN might have also advised him of details concerning SOPHIE. SOBLE claims he did not pay SOPHIE for information on a regular basis, but only when SOPHIE requested it. SOBLE states he cannot now recall details of information furnished by SOPHIE other

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than fact it was material taken from JAMES P. CANNON office and that it dealt mainly with fights and splits in the Trotskyites.

SOPHIE at least \$75.00. SOPHE related that he learned from SOPHIE that her true name was SYLVIA and knew that she used the names of CALDWELL and CALLEN. SOBLE stated that he knew SOPHIE had been married by the name ZALMOND FRANKLIN was unfamiliar to him. SOPHE maintains that SOPHIE requested to be released from work and also that he told "Professor" (CHOUDENKO) about this. SOPHE claims Professor first told him that SOPHIE must continue to work but later allowed him to release her. SOPHE stated that SOPHIE gave only reason that work was making her nervous and she desired her release.

SOBLE claimed he could not recall incident of introducing BOOKER to a second man but it was possible. SOBLE denied that he could recall meeting with BOOKER and 2nd man in "Silver Palms" restaurant. SOBLE stated that if BOOKER said it was ROBERT he would have to agree but he denied he could recall any introduction. SOBLE could not logically explain who he turned LUCY BOOKER over to in Spring of 1945 when he was instructed by the Professor to transfer his contacts to ROBERT SOBLE. SOBLE also denied that he ever transferred SOPHIE to any other superior.

SOBLE interviewed briefly after conference with his attorney. Interview curtailed by SOBLES constant complaints about his nervous condition and his desire for neurological examination.

SOBLE interviewed 10/21/57 at U. S. Marshal's Detention Quarters, U. S. Court House, NYC.

Re "YASNOMAISKY": SOBLE related that he never knew anybody by this name who worked for Soviets either in U. S. or elsewhere. SOBLE stated it was possible that he knew a person named YASNOMAISKY in Canada, but if he did, the person was not a Soviet agent. SOBLE states that the name YASNOMAISKY is a common name in Russian language and he possibly could have known a person by this name.

Re "The Carpenter": SOBLE claims he never had anyone by name of, or referred to, as the Carpenter. SOBLE stated he recalls a secretary to the Mayor in Verberie, France, was named CARPANTIER and he probably reported to Russian that he was friendly with CARPANTIER, but CARPANTIER was not an agent of his. SOBLE related that he does not know anyone who worked for Soviets under real name or cover name of SPRIDENOV.

Re MOLTCHATSKY: SOBLE stated he knew of a GPU man in Russia by name of MOLTCHATSKY, but knew nothing else about him or activities.

Re Agent at Encyclopedia Britiannica: SOBLE claims that if he ever made such a statement he could not recall it, but if he did he never had any contact at the Encyclopedia Britiannica and did not know anyone who ever worked for this organization.

Re RIJCE and JAMES MARTIN: SOBIE relates that he thinks that ALICE MARTIN had some romantic interest with RICHARD LAUTERBACK. SOBIE states he recalls that ALICE MARTIN worked on a Jewish magazine called, "New Currents." SOBIE claims he cannot recall exactly when he first met ALICE MARTIN but thought it was shortly after he met ESTHER. RAND.

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

SCHLE claimed in referring to this man as P rofessor he was using the European termshology of Professor in referring to a doctor. SCHLE claims he does know doctor a name.

Rem JACOB ALBAM. SOBLE claims the term LEVY in relation to ALBAM was familiar to him and it was probably the parol that MISHA in Paris gave him to give to ALBAM. SOBLE denied that he ever arranged contact for ALBAM in US after he left and denice ever meeting any Soviets in US after 1945. SOBLE claimed he could not recall remainder of parol in connection with the name LEVY.

He SOBLE contacts in Switzerland. SOBLE effered that he recalled that he had received two letters or postcards from Soviets at the factory at Verberie in 1952. SOBLE claimed he recalled those letters were signed EDMOND and LIBERMAN. SOBLE stated the younger blond Soviet in Bern told him his name was HIMOND when he first met him in Switzerland and knew when he received the correspondence he knew when name EDMOND stood for Soviets and that name LIBERMAN also stood for Soviets.

Re Soviet Agents in Britain. SOBLE claims he never knew any Soviet agents in Britain including Two More FUCHS', TOMY', contacts in EDEN's and CHURCHILL's offices. Two sons of Industrial was reference to JOHN and PAUL LOWBER who SOBLE believed were brothers.

SOBLE denied knowledge of this individual by name and salksed discussion with MCRROS in name after MORROS trip to Moscow in 1950. SOBLE related this Soviet was referred to by EXATARINA as the "Frofessor." SORLE claims he does not know correct name for Expfessor but also remembers calling him "JACQUES". SOALE stated he referred to this Soviet as "Lig Man" because he came from Moscow. Soule claims Professor was not as high in GPU as KOHOTKOV and KOROTKOV assed JOBL: In Roseon on later occasion if 10311 conted to meet the men who had been sent to Fris to meet him. MOBIE stated Frofessor was in reality an assistant of MOROTKOV. Inconsistency of SOBLE as to time of contact with this individual pointed out to SOBLE.

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

JACK SOSIE interviewed, 10/30/57, at U. S. Marchal's Detention Handquarters, U. S. Court House, Foley Square, NEC.

Re ADJA ROUBINOWITZ, (BEATRICE SPITZ), SOBLE stated that he recalls in 1947, when he was in Moscow, that SUBILIN and PEDOTOV questioned him if he knew ADJA and knew where she was living. SOBLE stated he told them that he had may ADJA with his brother, ROBBER, and she was more a friend of REBERT; then his. SOBLE denied that ZUBILIN or PEDOTOV told him enything about ADJA ROUBLEOUTZ or what she had done for Soviets. Soul claims that he can not recall discussing this with HORSET SCRIE and Comiss that he know that she had furnished meterial to HOMERY SCRIE for the Soviete. SCRIE stated after Soviete asked about ADIA, he was sure she had uncled for Soviete, but never had may personal knowledge of this. SCRIE desired that he saw ADIA on his return to V.S. or was given instructions to contact her.

SCRIE was again questioned on his knowledge of Invinc sollies and readily admits that MEILIN and PEDOTOV, in Moscow, in 1947, questioned him about SOLLINS, but claims this was on a different occasion then when they questioned him about ADJA. stated he get the impression from MBILIN that MBILIN know SOLLING personally, but did not know if MAILIN had seen Sollins in the U.S. SORIE adviced he thought ZUBILIN had known SOLLING whom SOLLING was teaching in Moscow in the 1930's. During interdies SOBLE constantly complained about busing sensation in his eyes, relating that this affliction prevented his from concentration during interview. SOBLE requested he be allowed to remain at Foderal House of Detention for physical exemination on 10/31/57 as the doctor is only there during the daytime.

SORIE's attorney GEORGE WOLF request photographs of SCHIE's femily which were taken at time of arrest to given to him.

AUSA CHRISTY requested that copies of such photos be made so that he could view than and determine whether they could be returned to VOLF. WA. CHRISTY advised that he desired that no material taken at times of arrest of subject be returned and he offinerily would return such material only if attorneys made a court motion.

With MORL on 10/29/57, and ogain strongly painted out to MOLF that the Government wanted to view those articles, written by 90mLE or MOLF based on SOSLE's conversations with MOLF, before any printing. CHRISTY stated that WOLF assured him that such articles would be made available to the Government.


