Request received today from the White House for an investigation of captioned individual, who is being considered for Presidential appointment, position not stated.

A current issue of Who's Who indicates that Chancellor is a former newspaper reporter of the "Chicago Sun-Times" and since 1950 has been employed as a news commentator by the National Broadcasting Company.

A check of Bureau files does not indicate that we have had any contact with Chancellor. There is a reference which indicates that in December, 1964, he was one of six National Broadcasting Company correspondents which that company desired to send to Cuba to film a documentary on that country. In February, 1965, information was received that the Cuban Government denied them visas and there is no indication they actually went to Cuba.

Abe Fortas, prominent Washington lawyer and longtime friend and adviser of President Johnson, today was nominated by the President to be an associate justice of the Supreme Court.

Describing the 55-year-old attorney as his "first choice," President Johnson sent the nomination to the Senate today to fill the vacancy left by the appointment of Justice Arthur J. Goldberg to be U.S. ambassador to the United Nations.

Johnson also announced that Johnson also announced plate he is naming NBC White Couse Correspondent John W. Chancellor to be head of the Voice of America, the government's overseas radio.

Both nominations came as something of a surprise at Johnson's nationally televised news conference in the East Room of the White House.



on August 6, 1965, inasmuch as SA. is supervisor in charge of the Case Review - Civil Service Commission Unit, which unit handles investigations of United States Information Agency (USIA) employees. He stated the White House had informed him that they had requested the Bureau to conduct an investigation of Chancellor and that he had to issue a clearance for him under Public Law 298. (Personnel Clearance Law pertaining to USIA personnel.) SA who had no knowledge of the case, checked with the writer and thereafter told that as he knew, when investigations are requested by the White House, the FBI furnishes the results directly to the White House and consequently his request would have to be made through official channels.

It would appear from the attached memorandum that the President, Marvin Watson and John Macy are under the impression that the FBI is the only one who has knowledge of Chancellor's arrest record. In this connection, the following items are of interest:

He knows that to do this, a letter must be addressed to the White House requesting the information, which letter is forwarded by to the Bureau, and the results of our investigation are returned with the letter to by Liaison. He knows that since he has been refused the results of the Chancellor investigation, there must be something wrong. As pointed out in Mr. DeLoach's memorandum (attached), there have been a number of cases where derogatory information was developed wherein the White House would refuse to furnish the employing agency copies of our summaries. A further example of this would be

presented to the United States Attorney, District of Columbia, who withheld prosecutive opinion until written reports were received. The White House has never permitted the furnishing of these reports to the United States Attorney, and as a matter of fact, they have also refused to authorize furnishing statements in this case to the Department of Defense.

- (3) Information regarding Chancellor's arrests was in the newspapers and continues to be available to anyone who bothers to check the newspaper morgues.
- (4) During our investigation of Chancellor, 68 people were interviewed, 17 of whom volunteered information regarding one or more of Chancellor's arrests. Ten of these 17 persons are present or former employees of the news media. Undoubtedly many others that we talked to had knowledge of these arrests but withheld it during our interview. For example,

- (5) The at the time of Chancellor's arrest on the fire escape in May, 1951, is Chicago, Illinois. He claimed he had "heard stories" from sources, the identities of which he does not now recall, which indicate that Mr. Chancellor "may have" homosexual tendencies.
- (6) Two established informants of the Chicago Office, one a homosexual, reported that Chancellor is known in homosexual circles in Chicago as "one of us and friendly to us."
- (7) After Chancellor's nomination was announced in the newspapers, an unidentified Chicago policeman called our Chicago Office and furnished information regarding Chancellor's arrests.

From the above, it is clear that there is widespread knowledge concerning Chancellor's arrests in the files of other Government agencies, in the Identification Records of the Chicago Police Department, in newspaper morgues, in homosexual circles and throughout the news media. From the above, it is clear that the FBI is not the only agency having knowledge concerning Chancellor's arrest record and as pointed out in Mr. DeLoach's memorandum (attached) the fact that the results of our investigation have been withheld from the employing agency, after having been informed by the White House that they had requested the Bureau to conduct an investigation of Chancellor, immediately arouses suspicion.

Durone files reflect we previously did a name check on captioned Individual. Shortly thereafter, Marvin Watson called me and stated the President desired a full field investigation conducted immediately. He added that the President planted to go aboad and some Chanceller as Director of the Voice of America without walking for the full field investigation to be completed. Watson told me that the Precident was esticited on the bacis of the name check and that the President had personally known Chancellor for years, consequently there was no need to wait for completion of the full field investigation.

I told Watson that the President was readlessly going out on a limb and that it was dangerous business to announce an appointment without having the benefit of a full field investigation. Wather stated that the Procident was edement in his views and that he would not well. A memorandum is in the file reflecting this convergation.

The Director transmitted to Watson by letter dated August 6, 1965. delivered the same date, the results of the full field investigation on Chanceller. (Copy attached.) Our investigation reflects 4 arrests in Chicago, Illinois. Two of the arrests, 3/27/40 and 6/10/40, reflect charges of Grunkenness. Of these arrests, one disposition indicated "discharged" and the second disposition indicated "bond forfeiture." The third and fourth arrests, 2/11/51 and 5/10/51, reflect charges of "discreasily conduct." Chancollor was found on the roof of a local hotel in one of these arrests and the disposition was "discharged." In the fourth and final arrest, Chancellor was found on a fire escape of an apartment building. There was no additional information concerning this latter arrest. While there that no substantive information to indicate homogenuality, it would appear that Chancellor could have been a "peoping tom." One homosexual indicated to the Agents that, "Mr. Chancellor is known in homesexual circles as one of us and friendly to us."

On 8/6/05, I told Waison of the above-mentioned facts and handed him the report. I mentioned that while there was no substantive evidence to indicate Chancellor was a homosexual, his file nevertheless clearly indicated sufficient evidence to reflect on his character.

Watcon stated the President vanted me to find out if the allegations concerning an FBI employee were correct and that, while the President did not want anything to be submitted to him in writing, he varied to know the cutcome of our inquiry into this matter. I told Watcon that I would, of course, immediately check into it and that I would verbally, in accordance with instructions, let him know the results.

Wetcon stated that the President had also instructed him to tell me that I was to sit down and propers an analysis of the Chanceller file indicating that there was nothing wrong with Chanceller and there appeared to be no reason why he should not be continued in his job. I told Watson that While I of course wanted to abide by the President's instructions, that it certainly appeared to be a little out of the ordinary for me to "clear" anyone, particularly in the Chancellor case. I reminded Watson that it was the President's decision to go shead and expoint Chancellor without waiting for the full field investigation to be completed. OBSERVATIONS: It is commonplace for the White House to withhold files from Federal agencies, particularly when there are derogatory facts contained in such files. The 38-year-old reporter and broadcaster succeeds Henry Loomis, the long-time director of the Government's overseas radio, who resigned last March with a charge that the Voice was losing credibility because of an overdose of propaganda.


Being director of the Voice is a \$24,500 a year job of overseeing the writing and broadcasting of news, commentaries and features 800 hours a week in 37 languages over a worldwide network. In leaving N. B. C., Mr. Chancellor conceded he was taking "a substantial" salary cut.

In announcing Mr. Chancel-lor's appointment, Mr. Johnson said that the new director would be the first working newsman to head the Voice agency.

A native of Chicago, Mr. Chancelor quit the University of Illinois in his junior year to work as a copy boy for The Chicago Sun-Times. He joined N.B.C.'s Chicago

news bureau in 1950 and later won a Sigma Delta Chi journal-ism award for a taped broad-cast describing the capture of a man who killed a policeman. Mr. Chancellor made the report lying on his back in the street while policemen and the cor-nered man shot it out over his head.

advised me in strict confidence at 3:20 p.m., 8-12 65, that she had discussed this matter telephonically with Leonard Marks for approximately twenty minutes last night, 8-11-65. She stated that Marks had told her that his was a "regular cop"-- that he had been snooping around the FBI and was now insisting that the Chancellor's file be furnished to him.

Marvin Watson advised DeLoach at approximately 2:20 p.m. today, 8-12-65, that the USIA Director, Marks, had called him a few minutes earlier. The was in Marks' office at the time of the call to Watson. Marks put on the phone. According to Watson, told him that he, was completely satisfied regarding the Chancellor matter and that he no longer desired to raise any issue. Watson stated that the bent over backwards to be courteous and that he had apologized for being "pushy." Marks then came on the phone. He reputedly told Watson that the FBI had paid and a visit this morning. Marks stated that in conversation with the President and Watson he had not meant to infer that the FBI had "leaked" any information. Marks told Watson that the entire matter was settled--that Chancellor was now cleared and there would be no further difficulty.

Watson told me that under the circumstances we should not make any further inquiries. He stated that both he and the President were satisfied, that the FBI had handled this matter in good fashion and there had been no "leaks." I told Watson that we had checked very carefully and had determined that none of our people had given any information relative to Chancellor's morals. I further told him that following his approval we had pinned down this morning and that had unequivocally denied that he had received any information from the FBI. I told Watson that had further denied that he had told Marks that he had received information from the FBI. I mentioned that under the circumstances it definitely and conclusively was proven that the FBI was not responsible for any so-called "leaks."

Watson stated that he agreed and would so advise the President. He told me that Marks, although a close personal friend of long standing to the President, that with respect to the above matter the President had called Marks last night and flatly told him that "if"

He brings to this job his 15 years of experience as a news correspondent for National Broadcasting Company and a brief stint prior to that as reporter, rewrite man and feature writer for the Chicago Sun-Times.

A colleague recalled that John had "gotten the ax" with several others in a retrenchment move at Easter, 1950. He went to work as a leg man for NBC commentators in Chicago.

Before he was assigned to the White House in September, 1964, Mr. Chancellor scored many firsts as a national convention reporter.

Arrested at Convention

His most famous, broadcasting his own arrest, took place during the Republican convention. He refused to move when an assistant sergeant-at-arms ordered the aisles cleared.

"I'm not moving," Mr. Chancellor said. "Are you going to carry me out?"

"We have been instructed to remove you," said a policeman.

Mr. Chancellor looked up at the cameras and said, "The next move in this drama is up to the cops.

"Badge number 38 now has his heavy hand on my elbow. Here we go.

"It's awfully hard to remain dignified at a time like this,' Mr. Chancellor said as he was ushered out.

John Chancellor brings to his assignment as NBC News' White House correspondent a broad background of experience in national affairs as well as in the international field.

During the Summer of 1964 he fulfilled major reporting roles at the Republican and Democratic national conventions and on Election Night he reported the projections and analysis of the election results as NBC News' Electronic Vote Analysis reporter.

In the latter role he contributed additional information from personal observation gathered from his cross-country travels and meetings with key local political personalities in advance of the conventions. Previously, Chancellor had covered every Presidential campaign and all but one important off-year election for NEC News since 1950.

Later that year he spent two-and-a-half months covering the Lebanese civil war. Assigned to the London Bureau, he ranged as far as the Khyber Pass, to Afghanistan and to the Mediterranean. In mid-1960 he was named chief of NBC News' Moscow Bureau, where he covered the trial of Francis Gary Powers and other important stories.

During his Moscow tour of duty, he returned to the United States to work on NEC News' coverage of the 1960 elections. He traveled with the candidates and interviewed them on "The Great Debates," in addition to handling the Midwest Desk on Election Night.

He went back to Moscow, and returned to the U. S. again in July, 1961, to become host of NBC-TV's "Today" program for one year, living in New York. He spent the balance of 1962 analyzing and reporting on political developments in the Far West during the election campaigns. In that role he traveled in six West Coast states, visiting the state capitals, gathering facts on election laws, election trends and the candidates themselves. He was also anchor man for "The Campaign and the Candidates" series of pre-election TV specials and reported developments from the Far West on Election Night.

Chancellor returned to Europe early in 1963 to study the Common Market, and reported on it in a widely acclaimed special, "A Country Called Europe." In July he was named head of the NBC News bureau covering the Common Market in Brussels. He returned to the U.S. early in 1964 to begin preparation for his floor reporter assignment at the conventions.

I told Watson that had requested a name check on Chancellor on Saturday, 7/10/65, and that a memorandum had been furnished to her regarding this matter. I told Watson that while a check of files and a check of the Identification Division had shown no identifiable derogatory information, this, of course, did not mean that a full field investigation would not reflect derogatory information. Watson replied that the President was in a hurry and wanted to name Chancellor as Director d the Voice of America within the next several hours. He asked if I could determine if the full field investigation had reflected anything derogatory thus far. I told him it was too early to determine this, that our leads in this matter had just been sent out. Watson stated that he felt the President would go ahead and name Chanceflor anyhow. I told him this, of course, was entirely up to the President; however, Ly thought it was a dangerous practice.
