

Reference is made to the money found in safety deposit boxes at the Midway National Bank and the Liberty State Bank in St. Paul in the name of Hester/Hinds or Elizabeth Kline, which are \$\frac{409491-934-936}{904}\$ aliases for Mrs. Bessie/Skinner alias Mrs. Bessie/Green.

To make a record of this transaction, Mrs. Skinner alias Mrs. Green stated that in order to avoid the publicity arising from a Court, order, she preferred that the exemination of the contents of those/safety deposit boxes be made upon her written authorization. She addressed a letter to each of the banks and the letters were presented to officials of these banks. Subsequently, Special Agents, in the presence of bank officials, counted and took the numbers of the currency in these safety deposit boxes, as is being reported by Special Agents Hurley and Fortenberry. The numbers were compared with the numbers on the Bremer, Bohn, Hamm, Lindbergh, and the Urschel kidnaping ransom money, and no identification was made in any instance. At the time of Mrs. Bessie Skinner's arrest, she had in her possession a sum, the smount of which has already been recorded, in excess of \$1,000. Her attorney, Mr. Harold Stassen, presented a written authorization signed by Bessie Green in the presence of Special Agents as witnesses, since Bessie Green otherwise was being held incommunicado, requesting that this money be turned over to Mr. Stassen's associate, Mr. Olson; and I presented this matter to the United States Attorney George Sullivan who stated that upon such authorization, it would be proper to deliver this money to Mr. Stassen or to Mr. Olson. Accordingly, this was done, and receipts were obtained · in the presence of Special Agent in Charge Werner Hanni and mywelf the receipts are made a part of the file.

Consideration might also be given as to whether the letter in question is not the work of a crank.



With reference to Division letter of April 25, 1934, there are attached hereto six copies of a memorandum, prepared by Agents J. L. Geraghty and T. J. Donegan, and a picture, covering their activity on Sunday, April 8, 1934, at the time John Dillinger was there, in accordance with admissions of four members of the family, so far interviewed, namely, Hubert Dillinger, Borman, Fred and Mary Hancock.

As will be noted, the Agents were assigned to locate and keep Hubert Dillinger under surveillance, as it was thought he would contact John. Hubert was located and thereafter, by his actions, eluded the agents and delivered to John the new Ford V-8 Sedan, which was used in his departure. The Agents, it is believed, made effort to carry out the instructions, but due to the deliberate actions of Hubert Dillinger and Norman Hancock in the former's car, to deceive them by creating the impression that John was possibly in the car, made their efforts ineffectual, they not knowing this move was for purpose of allowing Dillinger to get away in the other car, which was not identified, at that time.

Also, the fact that they failed to note the appearance of John here, made his escape rather simple, that is, this, together with the fact that they were unable to continuously follow Hubert, who was arranging a contact of John with Mary Kinders

The fact, also that the family, as per statements of those interviewed, had become suspicious of the Agents in passing the house, plus an airplane stunting over the farm, which John believed was watching for him made Dillinger very cautious and facilitated his escape.

The failure to recognize Evelyn Frechetti also simplified the escape. The attitude of the people at Mooresville, Indiana has now changed, but previously, little could be expected in the way of help from them. Should the Agents have done otherwise than they did, that is, if one had dropped off for foot surveillance, the maneuver at the house might have been detected.

It is believed the situation resolves itself into a case where a number of possibilities presented themselves as to covering same, and the igents took one as the logical one in accordance with instructions, which could have been successful in the light of later developments had they not been recognized in following Hubert, this latter presenting a difficult task on country roads.

Agents Conegan and Geraghty started on their work at 11:50 A.M., and first visited the gas station located at New York Ave., and N. Lecalle Siege where Embert Dillinger and Fred Hancock, half-brother and Rephase respectively, of subject Dillinger are employed. Maither Embert Dillinger, nor Fred Hancock were known to either Agents Donegan or Beraghty, but Agents were trying to locate them on the identification of Embert Dillinger's entomobile, the Livelies of which had been furnished to these two Agents by Agent Johnson.

Agents Donegen and Gereghty proceeded to the vicinity of \$.50
Daley Street, where it was observed that furniture was being removed from this
address. Agents kept this address under surveillance until the furniture trunk
started to move, and surveillance of the truck was maintained until its arrival &
at 516 M. Inett Street. Agents reported this information by telephone to Agent
Johnson, in charge of the investigation. Agents Donegan and Georghty then proceeded
to the vicinity of Maywood, in which section Andrey Hancock, the sister of subject to
Dillinger, resides and were unable to locate Habert Dillinger's far in this
locality.

It is further noted at this point that neither agents knew the definite locality of indrey Hancock's home, insofar as the visit made in this locality on the previous evening was made about midnight and land marks could be ascertained, because of the darkness.

Agents Donegan and Geraghty proceeded to the Mars Rill section of the offer, the locality where Rubert Milingar was believed to reside with the father-in-law, a Mr. Harry E. Baugh, whose home is located at 19k1 Semini Argune Reports inde a tour of the Mars Hill district and in particular tept the home of Rerry E. Subject's father's home lays on the side of a small imply, which is formed by a draw; the house, itself, sits in off of the road about 100 to 150 It is impossible to observe the home of subject's father or the yard, except from a position on the highway \$67, directly in front of the home or the entrance therete. The home can be observed while driving an route \$67 for a distance as approximately 100°. Agents, while passing the house maintained an everage appeal of about 30 to 35 miles per hour, in order that they would not attract attention, as it was noted that everybody in the vicinity of Moresville observed closely every car that passed by, probably because of the notoriety arising out of the everybody of Indianapolis.

It was further noted that there were a number of automosiles route 267, which had the appearance of being Sunday curiosity scatters, who were looking at the home of subject's father. Agents tried to maintain an appearance of being Sunday drivers, going along this road, while they were making their surveillance. Upon the first observation of the home of subject's father, Agents drove in the direction of Plainfield from Mooresville. Upon the return trip the Chevrolet Coupe was definitely determined from the license number, 109,83 Indiana, 1934, to be the Chevrolet Coupe of Hubert Dillinger, the half-brother of subject. It was also observed on both these occasions that there were sever women and men in the yard, two of whom apparently were attempting to fly a kith Agents returned past the Dillinger home, going towards Plaintield again, the hope of taking up a position in the read which would permit agents to stand and be able to observe Embert Dillinger's car, whould he leave the farmhouse all subject's father, but it was determined that it would be practically impossible to stand at any point in the road to make such an examination without standing so slose as to be observed by anyone who might leave the farme

MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR.

MR. NATHAN MR. TOLSON

I talked to Mr. Clegg this evening concerning the case, and inquired about the individual named Sawyer, whose name has been linked with that of Dillinger and several others in St. Paul. Hr. Clegg stated that a boy named Pat Riley, described as small, lighthaired, thin and pale faced, a former Mascot of the St. Paul baseball team, is supposed to be travelling with Sawyer. They have plenty of information and evidence with regard to Sawyer and if they are able to locate Sawyer he will be taken into sustody and questioned thoroughly. Pat Riley's sisterin-law, Majorie, is a girl friend of a hoodlum named Tommy Carroll who is allied with Homer Van Meter. Mr. Clegg stated that it would be advisable to check the Division records on Carroll, but he doubted if Pat Riley has a record, however it is known that Pat Riley is Sawyer's man Friday and probably knows all about Sawyer's doings.

Mr. Clegg is going to telephone El Paso and talk to SAC Colvin concerning the wire from there this evening with respect to the cirplanes at Phoenix, Arizona, thought to be owned by Sawyer.

Mr. Nathan is questioning the woman, Bessie, at the present time Mr. Clegg stated, but he, Mr. Clegg, obtained the following additional from her, with respect to the Barker gang. Harry Campbell has a Cherokee Indian girl about 18 or 19 years old for a girl friend. This girl has straight black hair, unbobbed, and is named Winona or perhaps Neona. Fred Barker's girl is Paula Harmon, who, according to Bessie, is a funny looking dame, with flat features, dark complexion, dark brown hair, age 25 to 28, weighs less than a hundred pounds and wears a size 12 dress. She has been going with the Barker since last summer. Bessie stated that she never saw Doc, Barker with a girl, but he is supposed to have a girl in Reno. Kate/Barker, at the present time is believed to be in Chicago with her sister from California, hame unknown. Doc Barker and Fred Barker had a split-up last Christmas. A ivin Karpis has a girl friend named Dolores, age 18, in Chicago, Karpis repts an apartment there for her. Ray Karpis eats quite frequently at an esting place in Maywood, Illinois, just outside Chicago. This place is reached by going north on Washington boulevard to the town of Maywood , turning left to North Avanua in Maywood. The girl Dolores is supposed to stay Chicago, she has light bit of makeup. Marpis also has a wife living in Chicago but he doesn't contact her. Bill Meaver, also a member of the Bremer kidnaping gang, has a girl friend named Mary Eaton, who is his girl friend by force, he often kidnaping her and taking her away against her will

This sister in law runs a chicken eating place which is easy to find and Bessie states that whereever Mary Eaton is Bill Weaver is bound to be close, however he has been back to St. Paul on at least two occasions since the kidnaping. Bessie stated that she understood the Barker gang went to Reno right after the kidnaping, that Bill has returned to Des Moines to serve as a contact man to handle the money situation. In regard to the money situation, Mr. Clegg stated that about the first of December last year. the Barker gang was broke, that they planned the Bremer kidnaping, obtained the ransom money, turned it over to Sawyer, who was to keep it for ninety days, during which time he was to turn it in for good money, and take his cut for the exchange. Therefore it is believed that the Barkers and Karpis are laying low, and are not able to spend much money because of the fact that they have not got hold of the any of the money, and Mr. Clegg stated that Bessie stated that if none of the money had turned up yet, it was pretty certain that it was still being held by Sawyer and that he may be still negotiating through the Kleckmans, who are the bosses in St. Paul, to obtain good money, probably in New York. She stated that it is supposed to be ninety days before the money is turned back to the kidnapinggang, which is probably having just about enough! money to get along. 💠

With regard to the record of Tommy Carroll mentioned on the first page of this memo, I am advised by Mr. Newby that he has already checked up on this man and he is known to be an associate of the bank robbers around St. Paul and is wanted by the authorities at Brainerd, Minn., at the present time for bank robbery.

As stated in our telephone conversation of a few moments ago. I am forwarding to you by letter sertain information which was given us by Mr. Glenn Russelo of Leanington, Ontario, just prior to my telephone call.

Mr. Russelo wrote the President on July 18, 1953, relative to the O'Connell kidnapping case and this Consulate was instructed by the Department of State to acknowledge the receipt of his dommunication, which was done on August 11, 1953. He appears thoroughly same and states he has been examined by his family physician, informing this physician of the dreams he frequently has and the exactitude with which subsequent developments followed all subjects and fields which these dreams cover.

He states he again wrote the President in January of this year relative to the Lindbergh kidnapping case giving a description of the man who was primarily involved therein, stating cartain scars to be present on his sheek

It was found that these scars actually were present on the face of Verne 1 Sankey who committed suicide in his cell in Chicago after being linked, at least in the newspapers, with the Bremer kidnapping case in St. Faul and with the Lindbergh case itself

He further stated that in his January letter he might have sentioned the Stavisky scandal in France, which broke several weeks later, incamage as he at that time had seen in his dreams all events leading up thereto:

Coming down to date he further says that about ten days ago he coming dreamed and saw clearly outlined the headquarters some thirty miles north of St. Paul, Minnesota, which has been found within the last few days were those of Dillenger and his gang.

All of the above is leading up to the information he gave me today which he believes is of current interest to authorities in the United States.
