

EHRLICHMAN Miss Holmes SUBJECT: NEWLY DESIGNATED ASSISTANT TO THE Miss Gandy PRESIDENT FOR DOMESTIC AFFAIRS Mr. Ehrlichman, who has, of course, been Counsel to the President since President Nixon went into office, was today named to a new position which will be roughly equivalent in domestic affairs to the position held by Dr. Henry Kissinger with respect to national security affairs. It has been indicated that as Assistant to the President for Domestic Affairs Mr. Ehrlichman will advise the President on domestic policy and will be responsible for White House operations in all substantive matters which have any bearing on domestic affairs. With Mr. Ehrlichman assuming his new title. the position of Counsel to the President has been abolished. It has also been noted that Bryce Harlow, who formerly had the title of Assistant to the President, and Daniel P. Moynihan, Assistant to the President for Urban Affairs, have been appointed Counsellors to the President and will henceforth have Cabinet rank. Mr. Egil Krogh, who recently was given the title Deputy Counsel to the President, will continue to work in Mr. Ehrlichman's office and will now have the title Deputy Assistant to the President for Domestic Affairs. It has been determined that there will be no change insofar as the Bureau's responsibilities with regard to the White House are concerned, that Mr. Ehrlichman's office will continue to submit name checksand requests for full field investigations, and now will also be seeing that correspondence from the Bureau which has a bearing on his new assignment. Three Top Aides Reshuffled by Nixon

Almost exactly severater his vicetton, President Nixon directed yesterday the first broad reorganization of his White House staff.

Two key assistants, Bryce Harlow and Daniel Patrick Moynihan, were relieved of operational responsibilities and elevated to counselors to the President.

John D. Ehrlichman, a top staff member, was named assistant to the President for domestic affairs. The announcement said he will "be responsible for White House operations in all substantive matters concerning domestic affairs."

Ehrlichman, who was an attorney in Seattle, Wash., until a little over a year ago, had been acting for several months as the staff coordinator of White House operations and policy-making on many domestic problems.

Yesterday's announcement thus makes formal and official his powers in the domestic field, which were described by the White House as roughly equivalent to those Dr. Henry A. Kissinger has in foreign affairs.

Harlow, a veteren of meny years—— Sapitol Hill staffs and eight years as one of President Eisenhower's liaison men with Congress, had been chief of the 10-man White House legislative liaison unit under Mr. Nixon. Harlow will continue "policy guidance" of legislative liaison in his new post, but a new chief will be named for the day-to-day workings with Capitol Hill.

Moynihan served in Labor Department policy posts under Presidents Kennedy and Johnson and is the only Democrat in a top White House post under President House post under President Nixon. Since Jan. 20, he has directed the Urban Affairs Council, which is expected to have a somewhat diminished role under the reorganization.

The reshuffle, which has been under consideration for several months, was triggered by Mr. Nixon's decision to name his present counselor, Attitured Burns, to be timer.

Harlow and Moynihan—like Burns before them—will have Cablnet rank in the counselor job.

Meanwhile, the domestic affairs staff under Ehrlichman will from various temporary "project groups" to study major programs and problems. The groups will consist of department and agency officials as well as White House and Budget Bureau staff aides.

- John C. Whitaker, who has been secretary to the Cabinet, in charge of project groups in natural resource areas.
- Egil Krogh Jr., justice groups.
- Edward Morgan, welfare and education groups.
- Henry Cashen II, urban affairs and Post Office.
- Leonard Garment, civil rights, youth and culture groups.

Flanigan is an assistant to the President. The others are deputy assistants to the President except for Garment, who is special consultant to the President.

Kenneth Cole will be responsible for administration of the domestic affairs staff. Richard Burress will be staff legislative specialist. Both are deputy assistants to the President.





Nixon's Wheels Within Wheels !!

It now appears simost certain that President Nixon will name his trusted assistant, John Ehrlichman, to be attorncy general when John Mitchell moves over to the Nixon re-election headquarters.

Ehrlichman's elevation will be generally applauded because the Seattle lawyer, while sharing blame for frequent bobbles in the White House, has tried in good spirit and with considerable lucidity to make himself and his leader's objectives understood by the Washington community.

He has done this less by being gregarious than by conveying, in rare appearances outside the White House, animpression that he is a decent man with a precise mind and a thoughtful view of the world. He has been part of the beleagured Nixon inner circle but he has managed, despite the defensive atmosphere, to keep his own identity.

Ehrlichman will not, however, carry to Justice any reputation as an administrator. The outside picture of the inside operation of the White House, as painted by the testimony of officials who deal with it, is a swelling hive of intense, humorless young lawyers (known to members of the cabinet as the Katzenjammer Kids). Each flourishes a splintered fragment of White House power but the nive is

strangely lacking, despite constant meetings, in real team spirit and internal communications.

The outside impression is that the situation has grown worse since June when George Shultz and his OBM (Office of B u d g et and Management) were added to the roster. This impression is perhaps unfair because the White House staff serves the President and Nixon is plainly pleased by Shultz. In fact, the feeling at the apex of the White House staff is that their operation has never been uguer.

But lower echelons find Shultz no master at communication. Morale in the Budget Bureau, the heart of the Shultz operation, has sunk very low and the essential relationship between Shultz and the budget director, Casper Weinberger, is uncomfortably stiff. In fact, the stiffness in Schultz' personality, plus his frequent unavailability, have rendered him less than a cohesive force.

The Cabinet was reassured, when Ehrlichman formed the Domestic Council, that the staff would stay small. But now it totals 40 and is growing, a phenomenon which promises slowly to strip autonomy from the departments. Thus federal power is being centralized in Washington while Nixon talks of distributing it to the people. The internal White House

small bore types, slipping edged unbits into gossip columns and kniling associates. Such characters emerge in every White House, but these enjoy a remarkable degree of sanction from Nixon. Recent targets have been Ehrlichman, Robert Finch and Donald Rumsfeld, associates whose personal quality would normally command protection against inside hatchet jobs.

The scene is also complicated by Nixon's wheels within wheels. For example, a firm word was passed to the staff that two men who aroused great resentment by their tactics in the 1970 campaign, Murray Choliner and Charles Colson, would take no part in the new campaign effort. But leading Illinois Republicans who came to a secret stag linner in the White House to exampaign strategy startled to find both on

One danger is that, as the concern with politics deepens, the White House scene will become less communicative and more Machiavellian. His past habits suggest that Nixon will pull further into his shell as the political pressures grow and that key aides will reflect less and less assurance.

This will be too bad because Nixon and his aides have created a monster which will deyour them if they do not give it real readership. Brennan, C.D.
