Synopsis: EC to O&A new 89A matter.

Details: On 12/3/1997, at approximately 6:41 p.m., Stonycreek Police Department (SPD), Johnstown, PA, received information that [redacted] Johnstown, PA, made

verbal threats via the telephone to [redacted] Johnstown, PA. [redacted] is employed as [redacted] by Erie Insurance Company (EIC), College Park Plaza, Theatre Drive, Johnstown. [redacted] was involved in an ongoing dispute with EIC involving the repair of his vehicle.

During the telephone call, [redacted] began to make threats, indicating that he had just bought a gun and ammo and knew where [redacted] lived. [redacted] threatened to kill [redacted] and everyone who worked at the Erie Insurance Office. [redacted] added that when he was done, he was going to Congress Murtha's office and kill both Murtha and his aid, [redacted] further related to [redacted] that [redacted] and Congressman Murtha were the cause of all of his problems.

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On 12/3/1997, at approximately 7:40 p.m., SPD notified [redacted] of the verbal threats toward himself and Congressman Murtha made by [redacted]

On 12/3/1997, at approximately 8:11 p.m., [redacted] was arrested at his residence by the SPD and transported to Conemaugh Memorial Hospital, Johnstown, PA, where he was subsequently committed for observation.

I'm a political prisoner

On Dec. 3, I placed a message on my answering machine saying that I'm a candidate for Congress in '98. That same day, a letter of mine appeared in this forum saying that I was working on a plan to build a stadium for the Steelers and a snowboard and cross-country skiing recreation area in Indiana-Westmoreland counties. The plan also calls for stormwater containment man-made lakes with condos on lake-fronts.

That same day, I was taken out of my apartment and to Conemaugh Hospital against my will. While there, I was told that I had threatened to kill U.S. Rep. John Murtha and I was supposed to admit I was mentally ill and take medicine. I refused. On Dec. 8, a warrant was issued for my arrest.

Since Dec. 3, I've been locked up, mentally abused and had my human rights violated. I've been compared to (Oklahoma City bomber) Timothy McVeigh, who is nothing but a mass murderer.

I'm running for Congress because I don't see anybody out there who has any plans or cares for *all* the people. The top 10 percent have their political puppets, but I'm for the remaining 90 percent - the common folks.

Let my voice be heard, not hearsay. I only love, not hate. Build up, not tear down. Promote life, not death. Care for all, not some. I'm a political prisoner right here in the USA.

Murtha menace to stand trial

A Geistown man will stand trial on charges he threatened to kill U.S. Rep. John Murtha of Johnstown, a Murtha aide, and others.

Donald Lee Fenton, 41, of the 2400 block of Bedford Street, was ordered to stand trial at a preliminary hearing before District Justice Max Pavlovich, Geistown. Fenton is charged by the Stonycreek Township police with making terroristic threats and harassment.

He was returned to the Cambria County Jail in lieu of bail.

The police said Fenton also threatened to kill an employee of a Richland Township insurance company.

Randy Leventry, an insurance adjuster for Erie Insurance Co. in Richland Township testified that Fenton had his vehicle serviced at a garage late last spring. He said the garage removed the oil in the vehicle but failed to put new oil in.

He said the engine was damaged shortly afterward.

He said Fenton made a claim to Erie for the damage and a rebuilt engine was installed in the vehicle. He said Fenton continued to have problems: the rebuilt engine developed problems and the transmission failed because the engine was not installed correctly. He said the insurance company continued to pay for repairs.

He said Fenton called him at his Stonycreek Township home on Dec. 3 and said the engine was leaking oil again and that he was upset about how his claim was being handled.

Leventry said Fenton told him the employees at the garage where the vehicle was being repaired worked for Murtha and, if Fenton went to the garage, he might kill them.

Leventry said Fenton told him that Murtha was behind his problems and it was a conspiracy to ruin him.

According to Leventry, Fenton said he would shoot Murtha, his aide, John Hugva, all the em-

ployees of Erie Insurance and employees of The Tribune-Democrat, the latter because the paper took three months to publish his letter to the Readers' Forum.

Leventry said Fenton also told him that Murtha had stolen Fenton's economic development plans for the area.

Defense attorney Rich Corcoran said the charges should be dismissed. He said Leventry was not terrorized by Fenton's call and didn't immediately hang up and call police. He said he listened to Fenton for 6 to 8 minutes.

He said Fenton was upset over his claim and that one call is not enough to place extreme fear into somebody.

Fenton said after the hearing — just before his attorney asked him not to speak to the news media — that he likes The Tribune-Democrat and that he wouldn't harm anyone.

Murtha said at a press conference when he returned to Johnstown from a trip to Bosnia, that he takes all threats seriously because of a previous incident.

Feds add charges against city man

Already held on complaint of threats

Federal officials issued an arrest warrant Tuesday afternoon for Donald Lee Fenton, a Strongy Creek Township man accused of threatening U.S. Rep. John Murtha's life.

Fenton, 41, of the 2400 block of Bedford St., remains at the Cambria County Jail, where he has been since last month when he was arrested on state charges of making terroristic threats and harassing an insurance agent. The new federal charge of

threatening to assault and murder a U.S. official was expected to be added to those charges.

A federal complaint charging Fenton details the threats he is charged with making.

The complaint says: Fenton threatened to "blow Congressman Murtha's head off" and kill Richard Township insurance agent Randy Leventry and everyone in Leventry's Erie Insurance office on Dec. 3.

In a conversation with Leventry, Fenton said Oklahoma City bomber Timothy McVeigh was his hero and that Murtha was the source of all his problems.

Leventry was handling an insurance claim for damage done to Fenton's truck by Carmen Wholesale Tires. Fenton grew frustrated that repeated repairs had to be made after the garage failed to refill the truck's engine with new oil after removing the old oil.

He accused Leventry of being in a conspiracy with Murtha because of all the truck's problems, the complaint says.

During the Dec. 3 talk, Fenton told Leventry he purchased a gun and a lot of bullets and would be using them, the complaint says.

Leventry told federal officials Fenton seemed focused on carrying out an act of violence. When Leventry asked Fenton if the threats were his way of reaching out for help, Fenton replied, "Tell it to CNN."

In a later interview with an FBI agent, Fenton claimed Murtha, a Johnstown Democrat, and Murtha's aide, John Hugya, placed him under surveillance, stole his ideas about the city's revitalization and carried out a series of "dirty tricks" against him, according to the complaint.

After the interview, Fenton agreed to voluntarily enter a hospital for evaluation. On the way there, he told a police officer: "Murtha won again. It's all about that article in the paper," according to the complaint.

The complaint didn't specify which newspaper story Fenton was referring to.

Fenton, interviewed again Dec. 11 by an FBI agent, said he didn't own a gun or ammunition and doesn't believe in violence.

Fenton will appear in U.S. District Court in Johnstown Friday at 2 p.m. for a preliminary examination, a hearing to assess whether the federal government has met its burden of probable cause. For the charge to stick, a federal grand jury must indict him within 30 days.

On this date at or about 1841 hrs. This officer received a phone call from [redacted] of [redacted] stated that he is an [redacted] with Erie Insurance Group. [redacted] works out of his home at [redacted] Stonycreek Township.

The phone call ended, and that is when [] contacted the Police.

Then Patrol contacted [] and advised him of the threats that were made against him and Congressman MURTHA.

Patrol contacted CRISIS about they situation and the threats made against the people listed. Patrol made plans to meet with CRISIS at the Orchard Hotel.

Patrol then contacted the F.B.I. Agent [] Patrol advised [] of the situation.

Patrol along with other units arrived at the Orchard Hotel, (that is were [] is living) After a short time Patrols went to meet with [] Patrol asked [] if we could enter his room and talk with him. Right after we entered the room CRISIS arrived on scene [] CRISIS spoke with [] in great lengths about why we were all there, and about the threats that were made. During the interview with CRISIS [] stated that he was at war with the Government, namely [] and Congressman John MURTHA. MURTHA and [] are using pysical warfare on [] They are making me crazy. [] stated that when you are at war, people die and people get hurt. When you are at war, you have to protect yourself and do what ever it takes to win, if you have to threaten people then that is what is done. That is what war is all about.

At first [] denide making any threats against anyone, then [] stated that they being Erie Insurance Threaten me first, so when you are at war you threaten back.

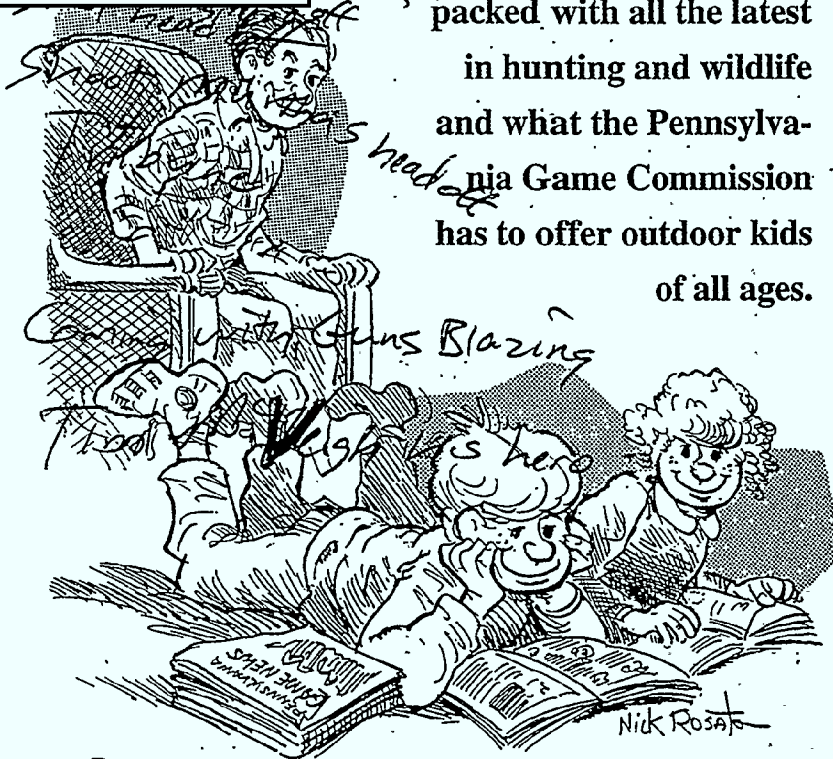

Judge keeps \$25K bond

Fenton facing threat charges

THE TRIBUNE-DEMOCRAT

EBENSBURG — Cambria County Judge Gerard Long refused Friday to lower the \$25,000 bond for a Stonycreek Township man who's in the county jail on charges he made a threatening telephone call to his insurance agent.

The defendant, Donald Lee Fenton, 41, of Bedford Street, also is facing federal charges of threatening U.S. Rep. John P. Murtha's life.

Long said that the bond set by District Justice Max Pavlovich is appropriate despite the contention of Public Defender Richard Corcoran that it is excessive.

Corcoran told the judge that Fenton has only one prior criminal offense — a simple assault conviction dating back to 1980.

In addition, Corcoran said that despite the publicity about the alleged threats against a congressman,

"There's only one alleged phone call here, and Rep. Murtha is not the victim in our case."

Long said that if Fenton is able to post bond, he must be brought back before the judge for bond conditions, including a mental evaluation and possibly having to wear electronic ankle bracelets.

Fenton has been in the county jail since Dec. 11 when he was arrested by the Stonycreek Township police on charges of terroristic threats and harassing an insurance agent.

Federal officials on Tuesday issued an arrest warrant for Fenton on a charge of threatening to assault and murder a U.S. official.

The federal complaint alleges that Fenton threatening to "blow Congressman Murtha's head off" and kill Randy Leventry, the insurance agent, as well as everybody's in Leventry's office.

A federal preliminary examination hearing that was to have been held Friday afternoon for Fenton was postponed, authorities said. A new date was not set for the hearing.

Johnstown man held on charge that he threatened Rep. Murtha

A federal magistrate on Monday ordered a Johnstown man to be held on a charge he threatened the life of U.S. Rep. John Murtha.

Donald Lee Fenton, 41, of the 2400 block of Bedford St., is accused of threatening to murder Murtha while talking on the telephone Dec. 3 with a claims agent for an insurance company.

U.S. Magistrate Keith Pesto issued the ruling following a preliminary examination - similar to a preliminary hearing involving state charges before a district justice - in U.S. District Court in Johnstown to assess whether the government had met its burden of probable cause.

Pesto ruled after hearing testimony from two witnesses for the government.

The witnesses included Stonycreek Township police Officer Kevin Price and FBI Special Agent Paul Wilson.

Price arrested Fenton initially on charges of making terroristic threats and harassing Richland Township insurance agent Randy Leventry.

Fenton is awaiting trial in Cambria County Court on those charges.

During the phone conversation, the federal complaint accuses Fenton of threatening to "blow Congressman Murtha's head off" and kill Leventry and everyone in Leventry's Erie Insurance office.

Leventry was handling an insurance

claim for damage done to Fenton's truck by a local repair garage whose workers failed to refill the truck's engine oil, resulting in the engine being ruined.

Both Price and Wilson testified that their subsequent investigations revealed that Fenton was angry with Murtha, a Johnstown Democrat, because Fenton felt the damage done to his vehicle and other problems in his life were all part of a conspiracy against him by Murtha and Murtha's aide, John Hugya.

Price and Wilson said they learned that Fenton believed Murtha was out to get him because Murtha was aware that Fenton "knew too much about Murtha and Hugya."

Price and Wilson also testified



Fenton

that Fenton was angry with the congressman because Fenton claimed that Murtha had stolen Fenton's economic recovery plans for Cambria County, which included plans to revitalize the Johnstown-Cambria airport, the former Glosser Building in downtown Johnstown and installing a mass-transit system around the city.

Pesto described the case as one of the most unusual he has been involved in.

"This is bazaar," he said.

Fenton was returned to the county jail, where he is being held in lieu of bond on the state charges.

Pesto told the lawyers involved to schedule a detention hearing on the federal charges.

Kenny Meylan died Tuesday at home. He was 58. Meylan suffered a brain aneurysm in a 1981 fight.

In the wake of his injury, the state Department of Commerce's Athletic Board of Control temporarily banned the events. But the contest was revived under stricter rules.

After Meylan's injury and the death of a 23-year-old Marine in Johnstown, after a Toughman fight two months later, tournament organizers began requiring boxers to wear padded head gear.

Man jailed in Murtha threat is released

Donald Lee Fenton, the man charged with threatening to kill U.S. Rep. John Murtha in December, was released from the Cambria County Jail following a plea Wednesday to a federal judge.

"I am taking a risk if I let this guy out and something does go wrong,"

said U.S. Magistrate Keith Pesto, referring to Murtha as "a national treasure."

"But I am going to take that risk," he said after Fenton's mother, brother, landlady of 10 years, and several others testified that Fenton sometimes loses his temper but gets over it quickly.

Following the threats against

Murtha, his aide John Hugya and several others, Fenton spent three days in Memorial Medical Center, then was released to the county lockup, where he remained for more than two months. His trial in U.S. District Court could come up as early as May, said U.S. Attorney John Valcovci.

Fenton, 41, of the 2400 block of Bedford Street, was released on \$25,000 rec-

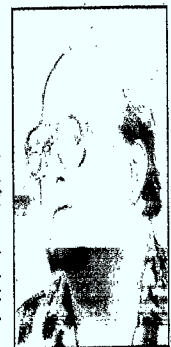
ognizance bond and ordered to look for a job, stay away from people who may be witnesses at his trial, and keep all medical appointments.

Valcovci presented testimony that painted a less-benign image of Fenton, who sat silently in a red and black checkered shirt.

Special Agent Paul H. Wilson of the Federal Bureau of Investigation said a

county jail inmate had told him last month that Fenton promised to "get a machine gun and kill Murtha ... even if he had to drive to Somerset."

The inmate also claimed Fenton said that when he left his home, he would be followed by different cars and that when he returned home, he would dis-

cover things had been moved around.

But Fenton's lawyer, Marketa Sims, questioned the inmate's truthfulness, noting that he expected to receive assistance with his case for helping prosecutors keep Fenton behind bars. Wilson also said the inmate told him Fenton said he had been hit with pepper spray while he was hospitalized as part of a conspiracy in which Murtha was trying to steal Fenton's ideas for

Murtha, a doctor and a black policeman standing over him. He alleged that they showed him a photo of a dead black man hanging in a jail cell and told him that would happen to him if he didn't let Murtha alone.

He claimed in the letter that the men told him they'd "strangle me, hang me," and have a doctor label his death a suicide.

He claimed in the written statement that the photograph of the dead man was shown to him an hour or two after Clinton Mickens hanged himself in a detention cell at the Public Safety Building. Mickens died during the early hours of Dec. 9.

[REDACTED] added as part of the news story [REDACTED]'s picture was shown on the television and, it was at that time he recognized [REDACTED] as the person he saw in the corridor a week earlier. [REDACTED] added he has not had any additional contact with either [REDACTED] and, to his knowledge, both may have since been released.

[REDACTED] advised by way of background, in 1995 he had been arrested by the Pennsylvania State Police, Indiana, PA, regarding the molestation of a five year old child he had been babysitting. [REDACTED] advised following a trial which resulted in a hung jury, he suffered a nervous breakdown and spent four or five days at the Clarion Psychiatric Hospital. [REDACTED] advised in order to put this matter behind him, he subsequently pled guilty to Simple Assault and received two years probation. [REDACTED] further advised in 1996, he was arrested by the Summerhill Township Police Department at the home of his fiancée, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Beaverdale, PA. [REDACTED] currently resides at [REDACTED], South Fork, PA. [REDACTED] advised he was arrested for Indecent Assault, Sexual Assault, and Corruption of Minors, involving his fiancée's 16 year old daughter. [REDACTED] advised he subsequently pled no contest to a charge of Corruption of Minors for which he received a sentence of 6 to 60 months. In addition, as a result of his 1996 arrest, he was also resentenced on the 1995 charges and received a concurrent 6 to 24 month sentence.

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[REDACTED] advised at his initial parole hearing in December 1997 his parole was denied. The parole board recommended [REDACTED] obtain a high school General Equivalency Degree and continue sexual offender classes at CCP. [REDACTED] added his next appearance before the parole board is scheduled for November 1998.

[REDACTED] stated he did not expect to be contacted by the FBI in relation to this incident involving [REDACTED] added that, as a sexual offender, he has to serve a minimum of 85% of his sentence. [REDACTED] further advised he was not asking for nor did he expect to receive anything in return for reporting this incident.

Fenton federal trial date set

Cambria case delayed for picking new prosecutor

Donald Lee Fenton of Geistown is scheduled to go on trial May 18 in U.S. District Court in Johnstown on charges that he threatened to kill U.S. Rep. John P. Murtha, one of the congressman's aides and several other people.

Fenton's upcoming trial in Cambria County Court on charges that he threatened his insurance agent is expected to be delayed for the appointment of a new prosecutor.

Both the state and federal charges stem from a telephone conversation in which Fenton talked Dec. 3 with Randy Leventry, an insurance agent. According to the charges, Fenton threatened Leventry and also threatened "to blow Congressman's Murtha's head off."

Leventry was handling an insurance claim for damage done to Fenton's truck by a local repair garage whose workers allegedly failed to refill

the truck's engine with oil, resulting in the engine being damaged.

U.S. Attorney John Valkovci of Johnstown on Tuesday confirmed the May 18 federal trial date for Fenton. In addition, Fenton is scheduled to be in federal court May 4 for a hearing on several pretrial motions by the defense challenging Fenton's arrest and other issues.

Fenton, 41, of the 2400 block of Bedford Street, was in county court on Tuesday for a hearing before Judge Gerard Long on a motion seeking to have the county district attorney's office disqualified from prosecuting state charges.

The issue was quickly resolved when First Assistant District Attorney Patrick Kiniry said that the state attorney general's office will be asked to name a special prosecutor in order to avoid the appearance of any conflict of interest.

Kiniry confirmed that Assistant District Attorney Gary Jubas - one of the part-time prosecu-

tors - had represented Fenton privately, including making some phone calls for Fenton on the insurance matter. But Jubas did not, as contended by the defense, receive a \$1,000 retainer from Fenton, according to Kiniry.

Because Jubas' prior representation of Fenton "would raise the appearance of impropriety, we will ask the attorney general to assign a prosecutor," Kiniry said.

Public Defender Richard Corcoran, who is representing Fenton, maintained in the petition that Jubas obtained confidential information during the course of his representation of Fenton in the civil matter and that may be detrimental to any defense offered by Fenton at trial.

Fenton's county trial is scheduled for the May term of criminal court, but it is expected to be postponed until July.
