After being advised of the identity of the interviewing agent and his purpose, furnished the following information: stated Abex Corporation then related a business venture in which he came to know Congressman JOHN MURTHA. Abex Corporation has a process to make caste steel railroad car wheels. Sometime after the Johnstown, Pennsylvania flood, Abex Corporation and Bethlehem Steel were in negotiation for Abex to purchase Bethlehem's wrough (forged) steel railroad car wheel plant. Bethlehem's plant was running non-profitably and Abex, knowing it made a superior product at a "lower cost to completion", wanted to fill the void for the railroad car wheels. Bethlehem produced a very good railroad car and along with other railroad car builders in the area, saw the demand in this area. Negotiations fell through because saw Bethlehem's plant located within Bethlehem overall property as being detrimental to Abex's position. During the Summer of 1978, received a phone call from Congressman JOHN MURTHA. felt that MURTHA was put in touch with him through Bethlehem Steel. MURTHA's .b6 position and interest was to provide jobs and opportunities b7C for his constituents. stated that the major banks in the area guaranteed help in financing his project. concluded that Abex purchased land and will be opening a plant in the Industrial Development Park, Queemohoring, Pennsylvania, which is within MURTHA's Congressional District.
stated that all his dealings with Congressman JOHN MURTHA were of the highest level of integrity and honesty. stated that at no time did Congressman MURTHA mention or even suggest any business dealings concerning Arab investments around January, 1980 or any other period. Further, stated that he has not orally communicated with Congressman MURTHA in the January time frame.
then provided copies of all communications from his Congressman JOHN MURTHA file. None of the communications reflected any mention of Arab investments.
During the interview, always referred to Congressman MURTHA as JACK.

He further advised that to the best of his knowledge Congressman Murtha and his family did all of their banking with The Dale National Bank and he knew for a fact that they had two loans with that bank, certificates of deposit there and both checking and savings accounts.

now retired from the Date National Bank, during the late 1960's he was of that bank and In this capacity he did finance a loan for the now Congressman John P. Murtha who was just a local businessman.

Congressman John P. Murtha who was just a local businessman at that time. This loan was for Murtha's car wash business and he did not know Murtha before that time.

He could not recall the exact amount of the loan without a review of the records but recalled it to be a sizeable loan for a small business. He knew of no particular reason why Murtha couldn't have obtained this loan elsewhere but assumed that since he was a small businessman he came to Dale National Bank because it was a small bank.

He did recall that there were periods of time when, because of poor business conditions, Murtha could not meet the loan payments as originally established. On these occasions, Murtha initiated contact with the bank and other arrangements were made so that least partial payments were made on this loan and it was therefore never in default. Conceivably, for this reason, Murtha might feel some obligation to the Dale National Bank.
