

Subject continues to operate gambling establishments in Cicero, Illinois. No indication of any other activities. SUBJECT IS KNOWN TO CARRY GUN AND ALLEGEDLY COMMITTED MURDER IN THE PAST AND SHOULD BE CONSIDERED ARMED AND DANGEROUS.

DETAILS:

advised that JOSEPH JOHN ATUPPA is active in gambling activities in Cicero, Illinois, but does not operate the "big game." He advised that operates the "big game" in Cicero, Illinois.

advised that he received information which indicates that SAM GIANCANA, one of the leaders of the Chicago hoodlums, is being moved down the list of the rulers of the Chicago hoodlums. Explained that a group called the "Young Turks", under the leadership of WILLIAM DADANO, are taking over the Chicago area and that GIANCANA and TONY ARCARDO cannot seem to do anything about it. He further stated that when GIANCANA steps down, he is to assume the position of JOSEPH JOHN ATUPPA in Cicero, Illinois. He stated that AIUPPA will be allowed to run certain locations in Cicero, Illinois, but will not be allowed to expand.

advised he has heard nothing recently regarding the subject other than that he continues to operate a poker game and other gambling activities at the Turf Lounge in Cicero, Illinois.

said that subject's large poker game continues to operate in Cicero, Illinois, and that you can also make a horse bet there. He added he believes that AIUPPA is just one of several hoodlums who operate gambling joints in Cicero, Illinois.



The following is a summary of information furnished by pertaining to JOSEPH AIUPPA:

On 7/30/59, a conversation was held between SAM GIANCANA, FRANK FERRARO and FRANK LA PORTE. This conversation related to new gambling establishments the group was then in the process of opening. LA PORTE stated:

"So, we're supposed to know about today. This over here he's got him under. Well, this guy's been fooling around stealing oil and everything. While I was away, he got in trouble in Cicero and JOE O'BRIEN he squared it away. Told him yesterday, he said listen you (obscene) if you don't give us that place you and I are through, and you're on your own. So it looks like the guy will give it to us."

On 9/22/59, a conversation was held between and MURRAY HUMPHREYS, apparently relative to a pending dram shop action not identified.

"We work under the table with this guy. With the company inspector. The guy who is the underwriter. Like we got JOEY O'BRIEN out there. He was paying \$6,000 for the dram shop. He's got it cut down now in half. Paying \$3,000 and he pays one under the table so he's saving \$2,000."

On 10/15/59, a conversation was held between MURRAY HUMPHREYS, FRANK FERRARO and SAMUEL GIANCANA during which the subject of the Cook County State's Attorney's raid on the Viaduct Lounge was discussed. FERRARO stated:

"You got discharged in Cicero. They still got the money though. Drivers licenses and the money they got. The Judge they got out there, the worst he can do is give them a five dollar fine. Did you talk to JOEY O'BRIEN about the

cop they beat up? What should we do with that guy? The cop that went back to work. Call the Commissioner about him? He's in the automobile detail, 11th and State."

GIANCANA stated:

"He had no --- business there. They oughta fire him."

FERRARO stated:

"Sure. We gotta keep these (obscene) out of there. I told JOEY the next time it happens have him pinched. Take him before the Police Station, book him and fine him. That's the only way to stop them. We had trouble last year with those guys. With the coppers. ---- Listen, they're after us. They're really after us. He's a broken down (obscene) anyway. We can hurt him right through the ---- convicts.

On 11/5/59, FRANK FERRARO and an unknown male held a conversation during which a recent unidentified wedding was discussed. The unknown individual referred to by FERRARO as stated:

"Everybody was there. I didn't see JOE O'BRIEN. You know a guy you never see? POTATOES. No, JACKIE wasn't there either.

The reference to POTATOES is possibly WILLIAM DADDANO, and the reference to JACKIE is possibly CERONE.

On 1/18/60, a conversation was held between FRANK FERRARO and SAMUEL GIANCANA. GIANCANA stated:

"I insulted your friend.

FERRARO:

Who?

GIANCANA:

O'BRIEN. I said listen JOEY what the (obscene) do you think, that we're married to you? You get out of work, you send a gup around, what the (obscene) do you think. We don't owe you anything, we're not married to you. We'll help you sure, but we're not married to you. We're not gonna put anybody out of work

GIANCANA: (cont.)

says, you'll wait until something shows up and I'll contact you. But this coming around every day, every day, that's a lot of (obscene). We don't owe them anything. You don't owe them anything, do you?

FERRARO:

No.

GIANCANA:

We'll help the guy, that's all right, but we're not gonna fire a guy.

FERRARO:

When did you talk to him?

GIANCANA:

Saturday. He came over to the barber shop. I said the minute you guys get out of work you come over here like we owe you something. We don't owe you anything. We don't owe you fellas anything. I said you're 50 some years old, you ought to be able to take care of yourself without going around asking for help here and help there. He said, I haven't got a dime and I haven't got this. I said who's fault is it? It's not our fault that you haven't got anything. What the (obscene). Those guys are making (obscene) nuisances out of themselves.

FERRARO:

That's right. I'll tell him the very same thing."

On 4/1/60, SAMUEL GIANCANA, FRANK FERRARO and held a conversation in which the following was said:

FERRARO:

Get much from JOEY O'BRIEN?

GIANCANA:

Yeah! I didn't do no good at that (obscene) Sportsman. You could make it in there.

The significance of this conversation is not clear, but is apparently related to gambling and horse racing at Sportsman Park, Cicero, Illinois.

On 4/21/60, a FERRARO and suburban "books".

UNKNOWN:

Ah, MOONEY said to check on it. He told me to come out not knowing that was already in the picture. Now MOE don't know that is in the picture.

Well, we better see what MOE's doing.

UNKNOWN:

HUMPHREYS:

Well, he didn't know, the only thing that I can figure is that JOEY O'BRIEN, he's out there. He might have made a request for it.

HUMPHREYS:

Well, if it's JOEY O'BRIEN of course he would come first. But, what are they doing. You go tell-MOE to hold it up til we all talk about it.

TINKNOWN:

Well, I told him I'd talk to you about it.

HUMPHREYS:

The reference to MOE and MOONEY both refer to SAM GIANCANA.

The above possibly refers to some union territorial problem or expansion and HUMPHREYS wants the group to discuss the matter in order that everyone's interests are known before a decision is made.

On 7/19/60, a conversation was held between MURRAY HUMPHREYS.

From the text of the above conversations, it does not appear that AIUPPA rates with much significance with HUMPHREYS and the other top hoodlums who meet with the informant, but rather AIUPPA has a rather insignificant position with this group.

Subject, born 12/1/07, married 10/31/31, Melrose Park, Illinois, has numerous relatives residing in the Chicago suburban area, has resided primarily in western suburban Chicago area. Served one year and one day at Federal Penitentiary, Terre Haute, Indiana, 1957-58. AIUPPA reported to be in control of book making activities in the Cicero area, known as "the strip". AIUPPA was a charter member of Local 450, Hotel Restaurant Employees and Bartenders Union. SUBJECT REPORTEDLY A TRIGGERMAN FOR SYNDICATE HOODLUMS AND SHOULD BE CONSIDERED ARMED AND DANGEROUS.

DETAILS:

Birth Data

According to the records of the Bureau of Vital Statistics, Cook County, Chicago, Illinois, as checked by Investigative Clerk County, Chicago, Illinois, as checked by the birth of the subject was recorded as follows:

JOSEPH AIUPPA, male, legitimate, born December 1, 1907, Birth Certificate Number 23511, which was filed on February 16, 1943. His father's name was shown as SAM AIUPPA, age 23, laborer, born in Fanary, Italy. His mother's name was shown as ROSE GRECO, age 21, also born in Fanary, Italy. The address was given as 2110 Main Street, Melrose Park, Illinois.

There was a notation indicating that this was a first child of this marriage. No physician's name was given and the affidavit, which was filed on February 16, 1943, was signed by ANTHONY P. AUIPPA, brother of JOSEPH, 910 North 22nd Avenue, Melrose Park, Illinois.

Marital Status

The records of the Bureau of Vital Statistics, Cook
County, Chicago, Illinois, as checked by Investigative Clerk
on October 2, 1958, revealed the following:

Marriage Certificate Number 1325243, filed on September 26, 1931, indicated that JOSEPH AIUPPA and Miss ANGELINE ZITO were married in Melrose Park, Illinois, on October 31, 1931, by Reverend BENJAMIN FRANCH, Catholic Priest, 1101 23rd Avenue, Melrose Park, Illinois. On an affidavit completed regarding the above, JOSEPH AIUPPA gave his address as 910 22nd Avenue, Melrose Park, Illinois, and his date of birth as December 1, 1907. It was also noted that it was his first marriage.

The affidavit also indicated that Miss ANGELINE ZITO resides at 139 23rd Street, Melrose Park, Illinois, and give her date of birth as May 26, 1910. It was also noted that this was Miss ZITO's first marriage.

Military Service Record

JOHN AIUPPA, 1836 South 58th Avenue, Cicero, Illinois, registered at Cicero City Local Draft Board Number 3, 2244 South Laramie Avenue, Cicero, Illinois.

had continued that AIUPPA was classified 3-A on February 9, 1942. This classification was continued on March 31, 1943. He was reclassified as 1-A on July 12, 1943, and officially classified as 4-F on October 1, 1943, in that he was not acceptable under the provisions MR-19 with the notation surgical removal infiltrating squamous cell carcinoma of sinuses confirmed. A review of the subject's identification record fails to reflect any fingerprints having been submitted by any members of the Armed Forces relative to AIUPPA.



The Chicago "Daily News" of November 19, 1950 reflected that the Senate Crime Committee investigators caught up with JOEY AIUPPA after six weeks effort when they served him with a subpoena as he was leaving his home at 1836 South 58th Avenue, Cicero, Illinois.

In 1954, the records of the Secretary of State's Office, State of Illinois, reflected Illinois license plate 711-711 was issued to JOEY AIUPPA, 1836 South 58th Avenue, Cicero, issued on a Cadillac automobile.

According to the subject's record at the United States Penitentiary, Terre Haute, Indiana, previously mentioned, the subject was considered by the present psychiatrists as a stable well-adjusted individual to be assigned minimum security and light duty. His medical record showed gonorrhea in 1934. cancer in 1942, and an appendectomy operation in 1936.

caused a search to be made of the records of Pa Pud a Chicago area hospital which reflected JOSEPH AIUPPA had been a patient from July 31, 1941 through August 4, 1941. He listed his residence as 1437 South 58th Court, Melrose Park, Illinois, occupation - clerk, nearest relative as his wife, ANGELINA, and was hospitalized for a sore on the bridge of his nose. record reflected a second period of hospitalization, at which

time, August, 1941, his nasal polyps were examined, found to be malignant with infiltration into other areas of tissue examined which necessitated removal of these areas. In 1943 AIUPPA was again hospitalized, this time listing his occupation as a cabinet maker, his residence as being 1836 57th Avenue, Cicero, Illinois, his nearest relative as his mother, ROSALIE, when he was under observation for an infected tear duct.

advised in 1958 that AIUPPA should be examined by his physician every three months, but that the subject usually visits his doctor every six months. He continued that in 1941 the subject had a milignant nasal growth removed and subsequent treatment had completely eliminated malignancy or trace thereof. In 1957 the subject had an exploratory abdominal surgery at which time a non-malignant mass was removed from the abdominal area. The subject listed his address as 4848 West 25th Street, Riverside, Illinois, business address as 2242 South Cicero, as of 1953.

Oak Park, Illinois Police Department record number 2981 showed that the Berwyn Police Department, on June 17, 1935, arrested AIUPPA as a suspect in an assault to murder, at Maywood, Illinois, and that this case was dismissed. The records further reflected that the subject has no Chicago Police Department number, nor does he have an arrest record at the Cicero, Illinois Police Department.

It is noted that the subject's attorney at the time he refused to testify before the Kefauver Senate Committee in 1951, was GEORGE CALLAGHAN.

According to the Chicago Crime Commission records, Chicago, Illinois, in a "Chicago Tribune" newspaper clipping of December 30, 1933, JOSEPH AIUPPA, alias JOEY O'BRIEN, is listed as an official of Local 782, of the Teamsters Union of Maywood, Illinois, and was one of 35 co-conspiritors, named in an indictment charging 17 persons with racketeering. A mistrial against the 17 persons was declared on November 22, 1934, and on a second trial there was a finding of not guilty on May 10, 1935.

In a "Chicago Tribune" newspapers clipping of June 24, 1945, it was shown that JOSEPH AIUPPA, age 36, Cicero, Illinois, MICHEAL DE ROSE, and SAM CAPLAN were booked as keepers of a gambling house at 4820 Cermak Road, Cicero, Illinois, after a raid, by the Cook County Highway Police. The charge was dismissed.

In a "Chicago American" newspaper clipping of December 24, 1954, it was indicated that the Sheriff's Office had arrested AIUPPA, LARRY RASSANO, and RUTH SINGER, in connection with a dice game at the Frolics, 4813 Cermak Road, Cicero, Illinois.

AIUPPA at that time claimed that he was the manager of the Frolics.

On July 14, 1958, when the subject accepted a subpoena to appear before the Mc Clellan Committee, he was accompanied by his attorney, MAURICE J. WALSEL, 105 West Adams Street, Chicago, Illinois.

The Chicago daily "Sun-Times" of January 1, 1951, reported that JOEY AIUPPA sat quivering with rage Friday, but refused to reply to Kefauver Crime Investigating Committee questions. The article continued that despite AIUPPA's stubborn silence the committee deftly brought to evidence that he was a big time handbook operator on his own as well as a supplier to the equipment needs of the nation's gambling houses. AIUPPA refused to answer at least 50 to 60 questions and in this regard he was cited for contempt.

On February 2, 1952 AIUPPA was found guilty and sentenced to six months plus \$1,000.00 fine and cost. He was released on \$10,000.00 appeal bond which case was subsequently reversed by the United States Supreme Court.

JOHN E. MOORE, aka., Claude "Screwy" Maddox FBI No. 323546, Deceased

The "Chicago Daily News", September 13, 1954, reflected that JOHN E. MOORE was a former CAPONE machinegunner and had been questioned in numerous murder; ranging from the infamous St. Valentine Day Massacre in 1929 to the more recent slayings of FRANK DIAMOND and CHARLES "CHERRY NOSE" GIOE. This item also reflected that U.S. Representative HOFFMAN, Chairman of the House Committee, investigating labor racketeering, accused MOORE of shaking down the Bartenders Union for \$10,000 a month.

The Chicago Crime Commission reported that a list of the license numbers observed at the wedding of CLAUDE MADDOX's daughter, January 22, 1955, Riverside, Illinois, reflected the license listed to JOSEPH AIUPPA, 139 23rd Avenue, Melrose Park, Illinois, along with TONY ACCARDO and PAUL "THE WAITER" RICCA.

Cook County States Attorney's Police at Cook County, Illinois, on August 16, 1935, picked up seven men as suspects who were questioned regarding various holdups of golf clubs in Chicago. Among those apprehended was JOSEPH AIUPPA. While these men were being interrogated by the men assigned to the States Attorney's Office, they were shown no special courtesies until JOSEPH AIUPPA, when asked who he was working for, responded until JOSEPH AIUPPA, when asked who he was working for, responded "You know me, I'm working for Johnny Moore". Within a few minutes AIUPPA and the other suspects were released.
